PROPOSED TAX AMENDMENT

On Friday, October 29, 1971, there will be a talk on and open discussion of the proposed tax amendment which comes up for vote on November 2, 1971. The meeting will be held at the Sanibel Community Association Hall on Periwinkle Way, Sanibel.

Arthur N. Hamel, well known for his continuing and sustained commitment to the welfare of Lee Countians, will speak on the "Fables and Facts About the Corporate Profits Tax." After his talk, an extended question and answer period will follow. Prof. Charles C. Fishburne, political scientist, will be the moderator. The seminar is under the auspices of the Citizens For Tax Reform. Since the issue is non-partisan, all citizens, regardless of party or non-party affiliation, are welcome. There will be no admission charge.

SCHOOL MILLAGE NEEDED

"The School Millage coming up for consideration and voting on in the November 2 referendum is not a new thing," said Mr. George Dissette, principal of Sanibel-Captiva School. A recent survey of schools in Lee County showed that an increase of 5,545 pupils will occur by 1973 and 1974. The millage proposal is NOT a new tax, it is merely

SANIBEL-CAPTIVA LIONS RECEIVE INTERNATIONAL AWARD

The Founders Growth Award for membership for 1970-71 was presented to the Sanibel-Captiva Lions Club. Duane White received the award for the group from District Governor Howard Towns for a growth of 55% in membership. Only two other such awards were made in Florida by Lions International, the largest civic organization in the world.

The Sanibel-Captiva Lions are now in the midst of their new membership campaign, and several new candidates are on the new list. They hope this year's increase will equal or better last year's. New nominees are recommended by an individual member, passed on by the membership committee and voted on by the Board of Directors.

Lions have won world renown for their sponsorship of eye programs in sponsoring the Florida Foundation for the Blind and the Florida Eye Bank. Florida Lions have a budget of \$150,000 for impaired vision, eye care and those in need of eye surgery, which they cannot afford. They have been particularly active in eye care for school children and for children about to enter school. Last year they provided over 60,000 pairs of glasses for the indigent in South America, alone. But this year's budget of \$150,000 is earmarked for the Florida Foundation for the Blind, sponsored by Florida's Lions Clubs.

The local unit is sponsoring a sailing and boating class for teenagers, Friday, Oct. 29, from 7:30 to 9 p.m. is the time set for registration at the Pirate Playhouse.

a continuation of the present school tax which has to be re-voted on every two years. "Some of the children that this millage will benefit will be moving into the county, but most of them are here now and will be coming of school age in the next few years," said Mr. Dissette.

"The children will be attending schools and kindergartens, and it would be retrogressive to state that what was good enough for grandfather is good enough for our children, for tests have shown that children who attend kindergarten are better prepared to enter the first grade. Working mothers are on the increase, and it is better to have a child in kindergarten in a learning atmosphere rather than a play school.

Also, of vital concern to the Islands is the fact that some of this money is scheduled for use in air conditioning the school and for repairs and improvements. Have you ever tried to work in a room with 20 hot bug-swatting children?

Our Island children look pretty cute eating out under the trees, but the picture changes somewhat on a cold and rainy day or a hot, buggy day. Someday, the Islands hope to have an indoor cafeteria or auditorium.

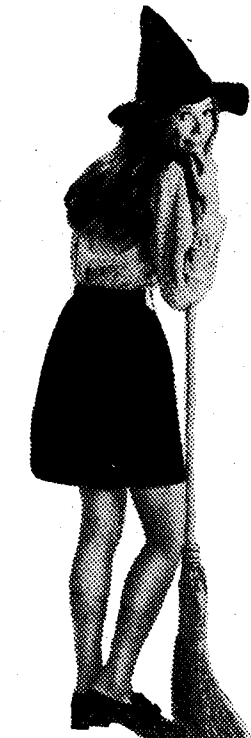

CHAMBER OF COMMERCE MEETS

At the October 12 Board meeting of the Chamber of Commerce, Mr. Walter Shirey, County Commissioner reported that he would like to set up a meeting date with the board members to further discuss the proposed fishing catwalk on the causeway, roads, and the building of the fishing pier and other items of concern to the Islanders.

Mr. John Rushworth reported on a proposed recreation area for the Islands' youth and plans to look into the availability of federal funds for such a project.

It was also reported that Rep. James Haley answered the night letter sent him about the Red Tide in the summer. He telephoned the secretary of the Chamber stating that he had contacted news media in the Washington area for a correction of the information disseminated about the Red Tide, when it was long over.

Under new business, an advertising campaign by the Chamber will get underway and also a membership drive this month will begin. The meeting was presided over by Chamber President, Joe Gault.





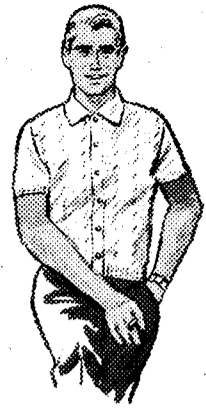

Kontinos is a long-time resident of Sanibel and was one of the leaders in getting a community water system built on the Island.

WILDLIFE REFUGE NEWS

Robert L. Barber, manager of the J. N. Ding Darling National Wildlife Refuge on Sanibel Island, today presented a \$9,713.61 check to Commissioner Walter Shirey. The money represents the annual payment from the U. S. Department of Interior, Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife, to Lee County under the Refuge Revenue Sharing Act.

Public Law 88-523 provides for payments to counties in which National Wildlife Refuges are located. The funds are computed on the basis of 3/4 of 1% of the adjusted cost of all lands which have been purchased in the county for the J. N. Ding Darling National Wildlife Refuge. The county is to use the money for schools and roads.

Anyway, go to the sale on November 6 and we guarantee you will find a real treasure there.

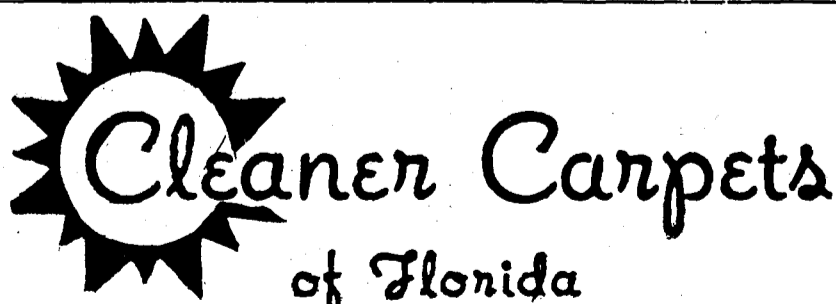
