Conservation-Community Assoc. Joint Meeting

The next regular meeting of the Sanibel Community Association to be held Tuesday, May 2 at the Community House will be dedicated to the purpose and functions of the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation, it was announced today by John Shepherd, program chairman.

The purpose of this meeting is to learn at first hand what has been accomplished to date by the Foundation, what plans lie ahead, and what part the resident and visitor to Sanibel can play in them.

The meeting will consist of introductory talks by Mrs. Ann Winterbotham, chairman of the Foundation and Roy Bazire, executive director, and a special slide film presentation on an overall view of the problems facing Sanibel and a look at possible solutions.

This special slide film presentation has been prepared by, and will be presented by Bill Hammond, head of the Environmental Educational Center.

You will hear discussed plans for:

Preserving and protecting the J. N. Ding Darling National Wildlife Sanctuary. The creation of a fresh water wetlands.



The establishment of a Nature Center.

Development of a Marine Research Station.

A program of research and education utilizing Sanibel natural resources.

While the covered dish supper meeting starting at 6:30 is for members of the Association only, the above program, starting at 8 p.m., is open to the public and all residents and visitors to the Islands are not only welcome, but are urged to attend.

Following the talks, the meeting will be open to questions and discussion by the public in an effort to learn first hand the great work that the Conservation Foundation is doing.

If you are interested in preserving our Islands as they are, come and bring a riend.

Island LEM??!?



No, it's not a moon rover vehicle but the latest in Sanibel-Captiva's sea turtle conservation project equipment. This unit is to be used by workers of the Caretta Research activities this summer. Primarily for use at the project's six week camp at Cape Romano, it will also be used on Sanibel, Captiva, Manasota Key and Indian Rocks Beach. The vehicle and trailer are portable and can be transported by boat to various islands where sea turtle studies will be carried out.

The trailer has been designed to carry four clutches of turtle eggs per trip, will contain all necessary tagging equipment or related study materials and is radio equipped. A radio communications network has been established within the project area, for the first time, and will be invaluable for safe and efficient operations this summer.

Sea turtle patrols, mostly by jeep, will begin on the Sanibel-Captiva Gulf beaches on May 5 and will continue until early August. Work at other locations will begin about the same time with the Cape Romano station beginning operation in late May or early June.

SANIBEL-CAPITVA CONSERVATION FOUNDATION NEWS

Mrs. Leigh Bair has accepted the position of Membership Chairman of the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation, Mrs. George Winterbotham, chairman of the board, has announced. The appointment was unanimously approved by the board at its regular meeting in April.

This is the first time the Foundation has officially named a Membership Chairman. Mrs. Bair brings to the position her experience in heading up the committee which sought 500 new memberships for the Foundation as part of this winter's membership-fund raising campaign. The campaign ends April 30, and a sum-up report will be made in May.

No fanfare celebrated the first liquidation a few weeks ago of one of its land mortgages by the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation. This final payment was for part of the approximately 150 acre trace the Foundation purchased as the site for a future Nature Center development.

In the summer of 1968, the Foundation's Board of Directors approved the purchase of almost \$170,000 worth of land with \$2,000 in the bank. It had been arranged with the Nature Conservancy for an advance of the down payments and the national organization was to assume responsibility for mortgage installments pending repayment by the local group.

The initial advance was repaid within four months, however, and all subsequent installments have been met in advance of due dates. Upon payment of final installments in 1973 for the remaining tracts of land in the Foundation's anitial land acquisition, title to all three tracts will be transferred to the Foundation by The Nature Conservancy.

These land purchases are apart from the major acquisition project now underway by a federal-state-private conservation coalition to create a Sanibel Fresh Water Wetlands Refuge. The Nature Center operation will be coordinated with the management of the entire area.

Roy Bazire, executive director of the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation, attended a special meeting of officials of the Florida Chapter of The Nature Conservancy in Miami last Sunday April 23. The meeting was called to consult with a top official of The Nature Conservancy's Arlington headquarters on means of strengthening the national organization's relationships with state chapters and local groups, as mandated by the Board of Governors at the annual meeting last fall.





> RAISING TOMATOES ON SANIBEL ISLAND by W. B. Combs

Hope springs eternal in the human breast! Could be a good sub-title for this article. Last November at the Garden Center in Fort Myers they were selling tomatoes in baskets filled with woodchips for about a dollar and a half with the tomato plant already started in the center, but for a dollar and a half more you could buy one that had small tomatoes already started, and we got the more expensive one. Opal nourished it carefully during the winter putting a half gallon of water in the evening and a doze of plant food in the morning. Seven or eight small tomatoes ripened, then the plant gave up and died.

However, we planted some seed of the Big Boy variety in the ground and while most of these plants failed to survive, there were about a half dozen that grew slowly and we are now harvesting the crop. As fast as a tomato began to ripen, a bird was there to sample it. I hung up a tin disc that would swing in the wind, but this did not seem to deter the birds. Then we called on Petunia to help. Petunia is our little stuffed skunk. We placed Petunia near the vines, and also covered some of the remaining tomatoes with cellophane bags. Our prize tomato was picked yesterday and measured 4 inches across and 13 inches in circumference. In all, our crop may amount to one-half bushel.

The Fort Myers News-Press carried an ad for vine-ripe staked tomatoes for \$2.50 per bushel, 3 miles north of Fort Myers on State Road 31, pick your own, bring container. However, to this should be added a bridge toll of \$3 and 90 miles of driving, so all things considered it was probably just as cheap to raise our own and think of the fun and exercise we had in doing it.

Come next November 1973 no doubt we will be raising tomatoes again.

Administrative changes are anticipated following the recent resignation of Mr. Thomas W. Richards as president of The Nature Conservancy.

A State Environmental Land and Water Management Act and a Water Resources Act were passed by the Florida legislature in the waning hours of its recent session. Supported by Governor Askew, the legislation had been buried and appeared dead for this session. Last minute efforts brought the bills to the floor, and pressure from concerned conservationists in the state helped achieve favorable action.

Other proposals passed were a bill calling for a referendum to issue \$240 million to buy environmentally endangered and park and recreational lands; a comprehensive
