## No Action On Dredging Cases

Sanibel Properties, Inc., which was cited by the Florida Dept. of Pollution last year for causing salt water intrusion into the Sanibel River and no permit to dig, has completed dredge and fill work in The Rocks East. At a public hearing in Miami, the Pollution Dept. took no action. In fact, they received a letter of authorization from the Pollution Control Board last month allowing them to complete their dredge and fill work.

John Barnett, regional engineer for the pollution control department said in Punta Gorda the case was closed as far as he was concerned, because the development firm obtained a permit and complied with all regulations, received the letter of permit even. Tallahassee has confirmed that the Pollution Control Board had authorized the development.

Four other developers received warnings from the Board also. They are Jamestown-Beachview, Inc.; J. P. Carter Co.; J. O. Evans of Fort Myers, and Mariner Properties.

A case against Jamestown-Beachview charging more than \$25,000 damage has been done to Sanibel's ecology is still pending, and no action has been brought against the other companies.

only for the school year, and most all of them work very closely with the school  
teachers in teacher training.

Instructional materials also cut into the budget, and an outline for teachers to  
follow on field trips was inaugurated and implemented. Trips were made by Fort  
Myers students to Punta Rassa and Sanibel, and Sanibel children made trips to  
Koreshan State Park, Shady Oaks, Big Cypress and others. "Who's Who on the  
Beach" was a book used to instruct the children about sea life and the special beach  
ecology.

Students wrote their own texts, called mini-texts, and included in them pictures  
and articles from newspapers and drawings or whatever the pupil wished to include in  
the book to explain whatever subject was of interest to him. The texts are made part  
of the permanent library and Sanibel exchanged projects with a northern school.

Projects for the older age group included working with the environmental  
research program at Gwynne Institute, which held seminars for not only pupils but  
also for adults too, and talks were given to clubs, by staff and personnel, who were  
also instrumental in forming the Citizens Environmental Advisory Council.

This year's program will be to further the environmental studies in schools and  
integrate the program throughout, so that at least 60% will know of the program, and  
more teachers too will be aware through the pilot program and will learn from  
teacher activity guides about it and be able to teach it.

**TARPON BAY MARINA**

Lee County is one of 14 Florida Counties designated disaster areas after hurricane Agnes, as requested by Gov. Reubin Askew. The designation makes residents and governmental agencies eligible for federal relief, including direct grants of money for cleanup and long-term, low interest loans for rehabilitation.

Storm damages in Lee amounted \$40,000 for public properties and \$310,000 for private damages.

A meeting was held Thursday called by the South Florida Area office of Civil Defense, and representatives from Lee and surrounding counties attended the meeting with U. S. Office of Emergency Preparedness officials, at the courthouse.

The Florida Marine Patrol is in charge of issuing emergency permits for damages caused to beach areas.

Workers who were rendered unemployed by hurricane Agnes are eligible for federal assistance, the State Department of Commerce said. Commerce Secretary Tom Adams said his agency is receiving applications for the special unemployment benefits, but proof of unemployment because of the storm must be furnished, in writing. Many also qualify for food stamps and other assistance programs.

Documentation and detailed record keeping of all repair work down as a result of hurricane Agnes will speed federal aid. Publicly owned property damaged by the hurricane will be compensated to local governments. Private aid will include loans from FHA and Small Business Administration.





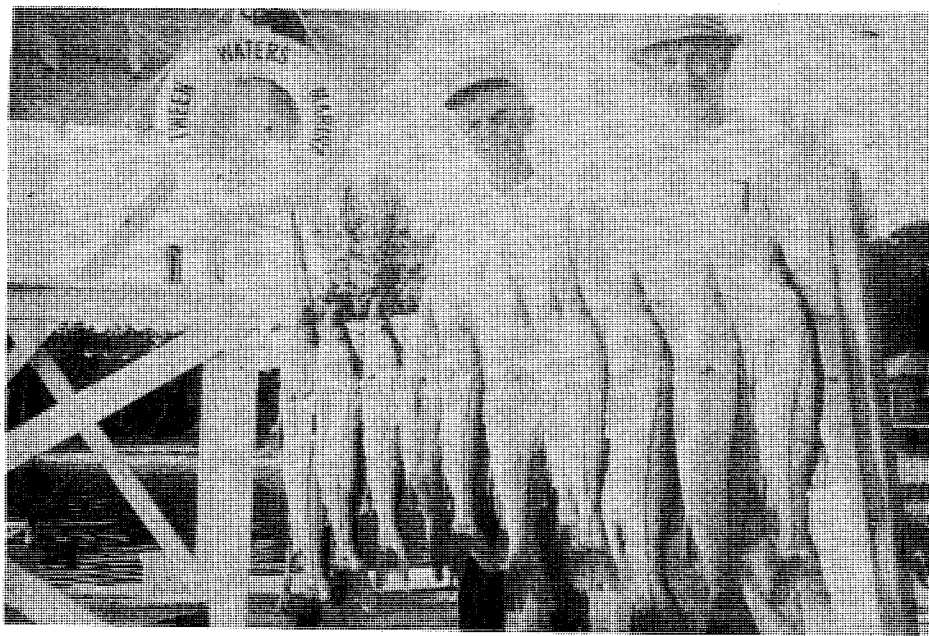

thine.

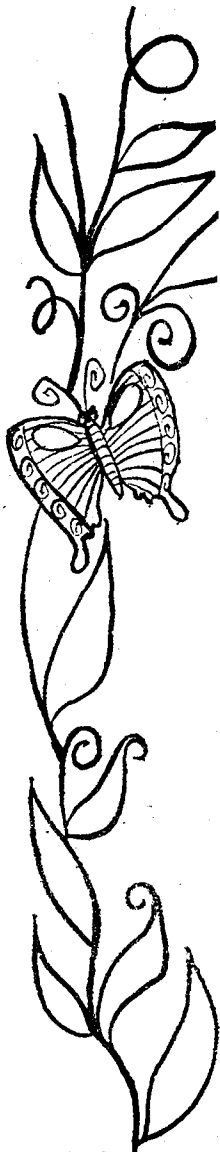

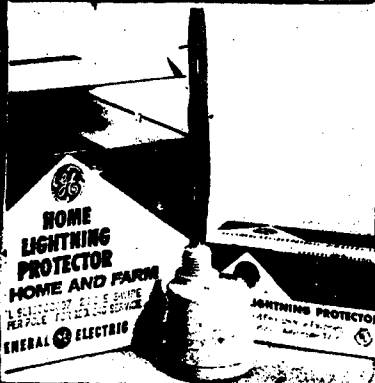

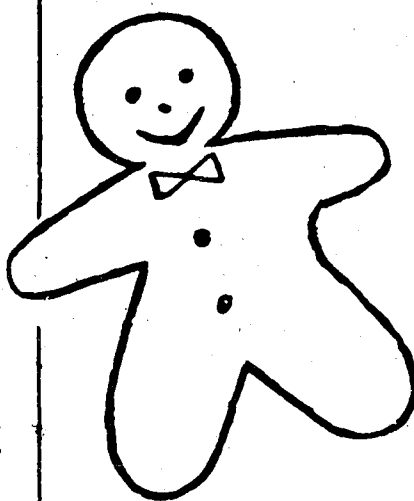

**FLOOD INSURANCE COSTS CUT**

The federal government reduced the cost of subsidized flood insurance by 40% in an effort to induce wider purchases of the insurance for control measures. At the same time, several representatives from Southwest Florida cities and counties appealed to Federal Flood Insurance Administrators for a reduction in the minimum elevation required to obtain flood insurance. Representing Lee County were Doug Taylor, County Building and Zoning Director, Asst. Director Ed Rich and James Gardner, Fort Myers Public Works Director. Bob Nalvin, engineering consultant from Sarasota pleaded Southwest Florida's cause in Sarasota where the meeting was held. Most counties have been notified that if they do not meet the elevated ordinance setting, then the flood insurance will end for them on July 31. Though Lee County has not yet been notified the nagging thought is there.

George K. Bernstein, federal insurance administrator of the Dept. of Housing and Urban Development, announced the reduction in cost for the insurance after having inspected flood damages resulting from hurricane Agnes.

Under these new rates, a homeowner could take out \$10,000 in insurance for only \$25 a year, a reduction of \$15 to the previous cost. Bernstein also said a \$10 minimum commission accruing to the salesman regardless of the size of premium will be set to encourage salesmen to sell the insurance. A homeowner may obtain \$17,500 coverage with \$5,000 additional for contents. The program was established three years ago by Congress for persons in flood areas who were previously barred from the flood insurance.

According to some, Lee County has already qualified by adopting measures to reduce flood risks, but we shall see how this all comes out.

**SANIBEL SITE FOR CONFERENCE**

Sanibel was honored by being selected as the site for a conference of realty experts from offices of the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife, U. S. Department of the Interior from all areas of the country.

Led by William C. Ashe, Chief Appraiser, Washington, D.C., 12 regional office review appraisers and supervisory appraisers spent four days discussing appraisal topics including gross cost estimates of new projects, multiple ownership appraisals, contracts for fee appraisals, condemnation appraisals, and training and appraisal management. The conference was held on Sanibel to relate many of these topics to land acquisition for the J. N. Ding Darling National Wildlife Refuge as a model.

EROSION STUDY**

In County Board action this week, the request for \$25,000 for the Captiva Erosion District study, which is to be supplemented by \$30,000 from Captiva

residents was deferred until the commission determines whether it has the right legally to fund this project. Paul Stahlin, represented the district in asking for the \$25,000, which, if forthcoming, would be included in the Public Works Dept. budget for 1972-73. Stahlin was promised an early answer.
