Conservation Foundation

Attorney General Robert L. Shevin and Mr. Ney C. Landrum, director of the Division of Recreation and Parks, Florida Department of Natural Resources, will be featured speakers at the fall meeting of The Florida Chapter, The Nature Conservancy on Sanibel Nov. 17-19. The meeting is hosted by the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation.

The three-day program will include a meeting of the state organization's Board of Trustees on Friday night, a panel session on "The Wonders of Sanibel" Saturday morning, a panel Saturday afternoon on some development problems in South Florida and what the state is doing to correct them. Scheduled to speak are Dr. John Betz of the University of South Florida, Mr. Joel Kuperberg, Executive Director of the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund and Mr. Vincent Patton, Executive Director of the Florida Department of Pollution Control.

Lee County Commissioners approved water resource studies for Lee County for next fiscal year, including continuation of work on Sanibel, giving the U. S. Geological Survey all that it had requested.

Total of \$21,000 in local funds will be matched by \$21,000 federal funds. Included is \$6,000 for monitoring through next year the system of wells and

measuring devices installed last year by Mr. Durward Boggess of the U. S. Geological Survey's Fort Myers office.

The Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation is providing \$1,500 of the +3,000 county cost to maintain the Sanibel system, the County putting up \$1,500 and the Geological Survey \$3,000.

An extensive hydrological study of Sanibel's fresh water resources was undertaken last year with funds provided by the county, State of Florida, Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation and the federal government.

At the recent budget hearings, Mr. Vernon MacKenzie, president of the Sanibel-Captiva Planning Board and Mr. Roy Bazire, executive director of the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation, thanked Commissioners for their assistance in making the Sanibel water study possible, and expressed support for continuing the Geological Survey's program in Lee County.

Community Assn. To Meet

Colonel Turon is to be the main speaker at the next meeting of the Sanibel Community Association dinner-meeting scheduled for Tuesday, August 1, at 6:30. The general public is invited to attend this main part of our meeting which starts at 8 o'clock.

Colonel Turon has divided his talk into three parts, the first will deal with: "How Soon Can We Expect A Hurricane?" the answer to be based on a government study, released in book form in 1968, telling of hurricanes that have hit this area over the past 100 years.

The second part of his talk will cover "What Type of Damage do Hurricanes Do?" which will be answered in a movie on "Hurricane Camille" and the destruction it caused.

The third part of his talk will be "How to Prepare for Such a Storm." Here he mentions things the average person who hasn't been through such an experience would never think of such as: what to do about food, medicine, clothes. For example, he warns us to wear heavy or sturdy shoes in case you have to wade water to protect against broken glass or boards with nails. 90% of the casualties from Camille, that had to be treated, were foot casualties. Oh yes, and don't forget your blanket and pillow for the public shelter — and remember NO PETS.

Based on historical data, Sanibel is already two years overdue for a storm at least the magnitude of Hurricane Donna. What isn't known is when it is coming, where it will hit, from what direction, and with what force. So we must be prepared.


Since the general public is always welcome at these meetings it is hoped that at least one member of each family now on Sanibel will attend to learn first hand what to do when the warning comes.

The Association, in conjunction with Col. Turon's Department, hopes to have ready for distribution that night a check list of just what Sanibel residents should do.

In recognition of the fine work that is and has been done on this Island by the Volunteer Firemen, the Association is inviting the entire Squad to have dinner with us as guests of the Association.

In that respect all regular members attending the dinner meeting are requested to bring double the normal amount of food they generally prepare and to make it special for these boys who are always on call day or night for your protection. This is just one way we can show our appreciation and say thank you for a job well done.



WATER CONTROL FOR COUNTY

Archie Grant of Johnson Engineering spoke to the Southwest Florida Conservation Clearinghouse last week about overall water management which is badly needed in Lee County. The subject came up earlier, but hurricane Agnes pushed interest aside, and Grant said that the plan should be implemented now before the area is overly developed.

He summarized the plan which was presented to the County Commission in June when 55 major watersheds were enumerated. He said, "The real problem we are going to have to face is the development along the Caloosahatchee River. People build along the river and fill. Then you get more surface fun-off and the small streams can't take it." The report emphasizes the importance of these stream-side zones as potential flood areas. Water management, evaluation and long range objectives and study with establishment of water conservation areas and back-water profiles were recommended.

BLIND PASS COTTAGES



precious day I have been part of the untamed beauty around me.









SANIBEL-CAPTIVA LIONS CLUB

Wednesday, July 19, at the Island Beach Club there was a very gala affair. Lights, music, decorations, banners, flags, long tables with snow white cloths, and soft sweet music provided by Mrs. Mary Clark at the organ. The decorations were under the guidiance of the clever hands of Charlotte White, wife of the president.

The occasion? Oh, yes. The installation of the officers for the coming year for the Sanibel-Captiva Lions Club. There was a delightful social hour beginning at 6:30 p.m., then at 7:30 p.m., President Duane White called the affair to order and Lions

DISCUSS ISLAND ZONING AGAIN

The Art Center on Donora Blvd. on Fort Myers Beach was crowded Friday night when another meeting of the Citizens for Environmental Quality chaired by Clarence Naas was held with Dr. Vernon McKenzie of the Sanibel-Captiva Planning Committee also speaking.

Dr. McKenzie explained the importance of planning for the use of land and facilities. Community development was important and what was needed, he said, was a master plan for the islands in Lee County. "We need an organization to serve as a voice of the people who live here and are most concerned."

He also said that he felt Adley Associates had never been given the opportunity to draw up a real master plan and he felt the two new zoning classifications RU4 and 5 needed more explanation. He went on to say that what was needed was political action; that the people must go before the Commission at their meetings and fight for what they thought was best.

Many people said Clarence Naas did not realize that a mounting population meant ever increasing taxes.

The Sanibel-Captiva Planning Board's aim, McKenzie explained, was to preserve the natural beauties and the subtropical atmosphere of the islands as well as pure air and water and the preservation of the region's wildlife. Dues for membership were \$15 for the individual and \$25 for organizations and at present, he said, they had around 460 members.

It was two years ago that the County Commission enacted the 35 ft. height limit and put a moratorium density of 18 for apartments and 22 per acre for motels. He said that in spite of the height and density provisions on Sanibel and Captiva, noboby, but nobody had lost money or property on that account.

In closing, Naas recommended that all interested persons should attend the Wednesday, July 26 commission meeting to express their opinions.


This invitation to be our guests is extended to all members of the Department and their wives. Will you please make this known at your next meeting?

COUNTY BOARD ACTION

Mrs. Lavon Wisher brought up the matter of refinancing the Cape Coral and Sanibel bridges to tired County Commissioners after a long hard day at the office. She said the refinancing would bring in some \$15 million for lowering bridge tolls, providing funds for another bridge across the Caloosahatchee and other needed road projects. Other items not in this year's budget are for the Sanibel fishing pier, plus some new expenses for the County Airport and money for a referendum in five sewer districts, including Sanibel-Captiva. These items would have to be taken into account in next year's budget, and Walter Shirey proposed the inclusion in this year's budget money for the Sanibel pier. He said modifications could be made so that the 16 foot pier could be built for the original \$10,000 earmarked for it.

In other board action, a new public hearing on the Greater Pine Island Water Association's revised rate schedule, as proposed by a Tampa fiscal consultant will be held at a later date. This hearing will be open to the public and they will ask for an increase in rates to cover mounting expenses.

A new Florida law was summarized allowing the imposition of a one cent tax by the county on every gallon of gasoline or fuel if such tax is approved at a referendum vote.

Sarasota County Administrator Edward S. Hoyt spoke to the County Commission about the Dept. of Housing Urban Development and government subsidized flood insurance. Federal guidelines of 13.5 feet elevation on Gulf frontage and 10 feet elevation inland have been adopted in Sarasota and "anyone wishing to build at lower elevations must obtain a variance which recorded and warns anyone purchasing the property that it would not qualify for the lower rates of federally subsidized insurance," he said.

Hoyt also discussed computerized printouts which Sarasota, along with 35 other counties, will receive about what to expect from various kinds of hurricanes. He said that a county would be able to take from their files a disaster plan for the particular type hurricane approaching and be prepared to deal with it according to previous experiences in such conditions. Interest was generated by Hoty in Commissioners in having Lee County join in the computer setup.
