County Action

The County is planning to insure its buildings with Alexander and Alexander, and appraisal of all county owned property and equipment is authorized, but it will take about six weeks to complete the appraisal. The cost will be about \$6,000 just for the appraisal, as the county owns some \$20 million in buildings, equipment, etc., and it may even be closer to \$35 million according to Lavon Wisher, enumerating the Sanibel Causeway, Cape Coral bridge, plus the County Airport as properties which would increase the valuation.

The Pine Island water rate increase which would effect Sanibel too, must present its new proposal to its own association members. The increased rate was recommended by a Tampa fiscal specialist.

The developers of Sundial Beach and Tennis Club on Sanibel were given permission to put up directional signs to their project. The Sundial has 459 units in a resort type complex, but the Naples developers, Investment Dynamics Corp., will not be permitted to place signs on County-owned right of way, but must get permission from private interests on the island to place directional signs. County Attorney, Frank Pavese, warned them not to "abuse" the privilege.



Commissioner Election

At the time of the general election in November, resident free holders of the Sanibel Fire Control District will be asked to elect three candidates to serve as Commissioners of the district.

The district comprises that portion of Sanibel being east of Wulfurt Road to St. Isabel Point only and voters must be resident free holders.

The candidates must be resident free holders and must file notice of their candidacy with the Clerk of Circuit Court of Lee County thirty (30) days prior to such election and such notice shall be signed by ten (10) registered free holders of the Sanibel Fire Control District. No filing fee shall be paid by any candidate. The Board of County Commissioners of Lee County shall provide a separate paper ballot for the election of said board members.

Candidates for election shall be divided into Group One (1), Group Two (2) and Group Three (3), and the notice of each candidate shall designate the group number in which he qualifies. The candidate receiving the highest number of votes in each group shall be declared elected. The three candidates thus elected shall constitute the Sanibel Fire Control Board of Commissioners.

Members of the Board are elected for a term of four (4) years and shall receive no compensation. The Board, for and on behalf of the District, is authorized to buy, own and maintain a fire department within the district and to purchase, own and dispose of fire fighting equipment and property, real or personal, which the Board may, from time to time, deem necessary or desirable to prevent and extinguish fires within said district.

Members now serving as Commissions of the district are Floyd F. Pflough, Thomas J. Nix and Patrick O. Murphy.

CAR MISHAP KILLS MAN ON SANIBEL

Daniel J. Mahoney, 44, was killed early Sunday morning when he was run over by a car in the parking lot of the Golden Sands Restaurant on Sanibel, He is Lee County's 33rd traffic fatality for the vear.

The accident occurred around 2:40 a.m. when Mahoney, who lived and worked at the Island Beach Club was knocked down and run over by a car driven by Mrs. Sharon Clair Way, 29, of Sanibel. Although there were several witnesses, investigators said they still have not been able to determine exactly what happened.

Mrs. Way was arrested for driving while intoxicated and improper brakes. She was later released from Lee County Jail under \$380 bond.

FAMILY ESCAPES IN CRASH

Four members of a Fort Lauderdale family escaped injury Sunday when their single-engine, six-passenger Beechcraft plane lost power on take-off and crashed in a wooded area just off Casa Ybel Road on Sanibel. The plane, valued at \$10,000, was described as a total loss.

According to Sheriff's investigators, Raymond Dagaro of 2825 59th Court, Fort Lauderdale, has just taken off from the grassy air strip at 4:55 p.m. when the engines of the plane cut out. The plane glided across the unpaved road at the end of the runway, then plowed into a thick clump of undergrowth which sheared one wheel but blunted the impact of the crash. Dagaro, his wife Mary, and children, Chet, 9 and Denise, 13, were shaken but walked away from the wreckage uninjured.

Investigators said the family had landed at Sanibel around 1 p.m. Sunday and was preparing to return home. A team from the Federal Aviation Agency will be at the scene to determine the exact cause of the crash.
