SOS

The Conservation Foundation is sending out another SOS to Save Our Shells. Resorters and visitors have been noted taking live shells from the water, particularly at Turner Beach. This land is under federal surveillance as a conservation area, and it is a crime to take the live shells from the water. If you see any live shells, return them to the deeper waters. So scarce have live shells become due to ravages of the Red Tide last year and storm Agnes this year, they are on the endangered list.

This means there may be no shells in the future on the Islands, unless some of the species are allowed to propagate. So please help to make sure our Islands retain one of their chief assets, a wonderful shelling area. Make very sure you take no live shells from the water or even on land. Return them to the Gulf and Bay for propagation.



To Pier Or Not To Pier

Revised specifications for the proposed Sanibel pier are to be reviewed by Assistant County Engineer Ben Pratt, Mrs. Wisher and Commissioner Walter Shirey.

Shirey presented an alternate set of specifications for consideration Wednesday afternoon. He said the new plans would permit construction of a pier eight feet wide instead of six feet wide which would permit the pier to be constructed from the land out and accommodate construction equipment on the pier while it is being built. Such a method, he explained, eliminates the need for a barge. He suggested that contractors be allowed to bid the job on either the new plans or the present ones.



CAPTIVA RESORT, ACREAGE PURCHASED FOR 3 MILLION

The purchase of the famed South Seas Plantation resort at the north end of Captiva Island was completed last week in a more than \$3 million transaction by a group of Northern Ohio investors and Mariners Properties,

Robert Taylor, president of the Mariner group which owns other property on Sanibel Island, and spokesman said the ownership change will have no immediate bearing on the day-to-day operations of the resort and its facilities.

The resort will continue to provide accommodations for the public, but a refurnishing and expansion of some of the facilities is planned.

The purchase includes the 60-acre resort proper at the very tip end of Captiva as well as a large amount of adjoining properties which altogether comprise approximately 300 acres. Much of the land has frontage on the Gulf of Mexico as well as on Pine Island Sound.

The purchase was made in the name of The South Seas Plantation Company from The Captiva Island Company which was headed by W. Walter Watts of New York City. For the last few years the resort has been managed by Mr. & Mrs. Otto Sifert who have agreed to continue in their posts for a period of time under the new owners.

Taylor's group will handle executive management details for the new investment group.



WATER SPOUT HITS SANIBEL TRAFFIC

Traffic was stopped on the Sanibel Causeway for nearly 15 minutes last Thursday evening as a huge water spout whirled through San Carlos Bay and hit the southeast corner of Sanibel Island. Some mangroves were uprooted but no other damage was reported.

Deputy Dave Wooster said he watched the spout as it formed near Cape Coral, came down the Caloosahatchee River and swept across Fishermen's Key.

"It looked like it was going to swing across the causeway so I had traffic stopped until it hit Sanibel near Woodring Point and Dixie Beach Blvd.," Wooster said.

The water spout was one of several funnel clouds spotted during a thunderstorm that hit Lee County around 6:30 p.m. Thursday.

Fillet the pompano as soon as possible, rinse in cold lightly salted water and keep chilled and covered until cooked. Blend and keep warm over low heat a sauce made from juice of two limes, one lemon, two tablespoons of butter, a dash of onion salt, a dash of paprika, a good pinch each of salt and pepper, and a good slosh of dry white wine. Dot the fish with butter and broil skin down 6-8 minutes, not too close to broiler, basting with sauce when nearly done, and serving immediately with additional sauce.

If the pompano keep coming, watch this column for the Alberts' version of pompano en papillote, still being perfected.

As we go to press the record catch of pompano by the entire Segunda family for a single day occured on the 16th, when something over 45 were caught before we lost count.

TO THE ISLANDER:

A copy of the following letter was sent to the Islander for publication: The Honorable Reubin Askew Governor of Florida Tallahassee, Fla. Dear Sir:

It was with consternation that I read about your appointment of Attorney Charles B. Edwards to the recently vacated post held by Bruce Scott on the Lee County Board of Commissioners.

Are we to assume that your advisors failed to tell you that Attorney Edwards is a principal member of the Fort Myers law firm of Allen, Knudsen, Swartz, DeBoest, Rhoads, and Edwards? Also, that two other principal attorneys (George Allen and Art Knudsen) have been in the forefront of several successful attemps of land developers to destroy the "unique and scenic" character that the residents of the County's island and beach areas have long nurtured?

Although the appointment is only for the interim until the November elections, that period is the one during which many residents of these areas are away on vacations and coincidentally zoning hearings are scheduled by the Commissioners. Too often the hearings on zoning changes and enactments have produced environmental devastation—but large and quick profits for hit-and-run land speculators from outside the County.

It seems a fair assumption that your appointment places Attorney Edwards in a position where he will be clearly exposed to that grevious contagion "conflict of interest" that is the scourge of all honorable professional men. It also has the appearance of continuing the loathsome practice of "putting the fox in charge of the henhouse."

If he doesn't turn down the appointment, may I suggest that you publicly request him to refrain from voting on or participating in such zoning cases during his short tenure?




