Zoning Board Approves Multimilion Dollar Development On Sanibel

The County Zoning Board approved a multimillion dollar development on Sanibel Monday.

The zoning changes will be considered by the County Commission on October 3. The development on Sanibel will consist of single family homesites west of Bailey Road and East of Dixie Beach Boulevard, with the zoning changed from general use to Residential I.

William Vines, a Naples land developer, will develop the 330 acres into 100-by-125 foot homesites. Also included in the plans are a series of lakes, a recreational area and a central sewer system.

Lester Bulson, representing Vines at the meeting, said that the development will cost over \$1 million.


Vernon McKenzie, representing the Sanibel-Captiva Planning Board, said that the plans had received his board's endorsement.

In other action the board:

-Approved a request for a special permit for six months for one mobile home in

a Residential I zone on Dixie Boulevard, Sanibel. The mobile home is being used by a nightwatchman on land that is presently being developed as a sub-division. The request for the zoning change came from Gulf Islands Development Company, Inc.

-Approved a request by Dale F. Conde to rezone 24.9 acres from general use to Residential I south of the airstrip on Upper Captiva Island. Most of the land will be used as winter residences for the owners.

RECREATION AREA SEEN ON SANIBEL

The State Cabinet moved a little closer Tuesday to creation of a freshwater recreation area on Sanibel Island.

A request for federal matching funds to aid in land acquisition for a project designed to preserve the islands's freshwater wetlands will be resubmitted, the Cabinet decided.

The request for \$281,000 had to be reentered because the state has taken over coordination of the project from the county. The island park idea was promoted by the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation and backed by private donations totalling about \$250,000.

The change in status of the request brought with it a reduction of the number of park areas requested - from 423 to 212. The conservation group plans to use the park as a marine research area and a nature study area.

The Bailey family was notable by their presence and activity. Mrs. Bailey was on hand with Ann Susan, Mary, Pat and Jane.



Beer, soda and kool aid was served in the club house overlooking the race cours. The expert hand of Mrs. Dotty Steams properly inscribed the trophies.




Happy skippers and crews at Sanibel Regatta.


