
Mrs. Hayford Of Captiva Named Chairman Of United Way







Sanibel Causeway will have to stay a toll bridge to support is maintenance when paid, but it should be toll free for bona fide residents and Lee County is welcome to the surplus revenues or refinancing the Golden Goose, IF it uses a fair share of these monies for Sanibel-Captiva, improvements of beaches and parks.

It should become free now or at least greatly reduced to the residents. Lee County does not pay anything for the Causeway, maintenance, salaries or repairs. The toll pays itself and way over, and since the Causeway goes nowhere it is we residents who are paying for it, and without us, there would be no tourists, accommodations, or business for anybody in Lee County.

A few years ago our college and high school students threatened to lay across the bridge until some pass or reduction was allowed to them. They pointed out that no pedestrian or bicycle is allowed across and this makes it mandatory to be over 15 years old, have a drvers license, a car and \$3.00 or hitch hike to go home from school or work.

The toll went down to \$2.00 for anybody shelling; \$20 for 10 tickets, valid two months. Our children have the right to come walking home without having to beg a risky ride at the toll booth. Our toll has earned enough surplus money to build a fishing walking way over the bridges.

Let's join Cape Coral residents in the fight for a fair deal in the refinancing of both Causeways they are so hell-bent to do, with or without our consent.

INTERNAL REVENUE SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT

The Internal Revenue Service announced that Winn-Dixie, Inc. has agreed to roll back the price of a number of grocery items.

Mr. A. J. O.Donnell, Jr., District Director for Internal Revenue in Florida, said that the firm, headquartered in Jacksonville, has made price reductions in all their stores. Winn-Dixie has 877 stores in Florida, South Carolina, Georgia, North Carolina, Alabama, Tennessee and Kentucky.

"Winn-Dixie officials have agreed to modify pricing procedures and to make the necessary price adjustments in order to comply with the Economic Stabilization Program," according to Mr. O'Donnell. He also emphasized that the IRS would continue to monitor prices at Winn-Dixie and other retail food stores.

The investigation was initiated in response to consumer complaints received from throughout the southeast. "The IRS audit of Winn-Dixie was one of the first of 23 national retail food chain investigations to be completed by the Internal Revenue Service, acting as the enforcement arm of the Price Commission," added Mr. O'Donnell.


TO THE ISLANDER:

DAMAGE RELEASE STICKER NEEDED BEFORE CAR REPAIR

Vehicles involved in accidents after October 1, 1972, must have a damage release sticker attached before repairs are made in order to comply with the State Uniform Traffic Control Law said the Florida Highway Patrol today.

Colonel Eldrige Beach, director of the Patrol said, "The Florida State Legislature amended the accident reporting law requiring a damage release sticker be placed on all damaged vehicles by the investigating officer before repairs are made."


A damage release sticker is required when a vehicle is involved in an accident, struck by a bullet or involved in the commission of a crime.

Persons in charge of garages or

repair shops, when receiving damaged motor vehicles that do not have a damage release sticker must report to the local police department or Florida Highway Patrol office within 24 hours after the vehicle is received, giving the license number, make, model, and the name and address of the person in possession of the vehicle.

"Owners of damaged vehicles which do not have a damage release sticker should expect repairmen to notify their local police department or Florida Highway Patrol office before repairing a vehicle," concluded Colonel Beach.
