"Life On The Beach"

Mr. Julian Hudson, former County Commissioner will also report on and describe plans for the new "Junior Environmental Library" talked about for this



will be on Sanibel Dec. 29 to demonstrate his creative artistry on the kick wheel, at the Artison Shop. Mr. Wells works with clays to create stoneware pottery with a truly timeless quality. When the pottery is ready for firing, he has it in the kiln at 2400 dégrees and often in a reduction atmosphere, which creates unusual and beautiful variations in surface texture as well as color. Mr. Wells has a life time background in his craft, having received his art degree from Arizona State University, and having pursued graduate studies at the University of Miami. For the past three years, Hadden has been the master potter at Silver Dollar City, a well known craft center in the Ozark Mountains of Southwest Missouri. He was delayed in arriving here by some wintry weather.

It is a pleasure to watch him at work, and he will be demonstrating Dec. 29 from 10:30 until 4:30 at the Artisan Shop, and all are invited to come and see the master at work.







THIS WEEK AT THE SANIBEL LIBRARY by Hal H. Harrison

So you have time to do some reading over the holidays.

OK, let the Sanibel Public Library help you. Most anything that you will want for relaxed reading is yours for the borrowing -- fiction, non-fiction, mysteries, picture books, nature, humor --- you name it and the aides at the library will help you find it.

Many patrons are always interested in the latest books, the "best sellers," in both fiction and non-fiction. The library has them, almost all of them. The top two in both categories are there: "Jonathan Livingston Seagull" and "I'm O.K. -- You're O.K." The No. 2 best sellers in fiction ("August 1914") and in non-fiction ("The Peter Prescription") are in stock too.

Go down the list and you will find that your Sanibel Library is right up to the minute (and sometimes a bit ahead of it). For example, the December selection of the Literary Guild, "Queen Victoria," has been available for the past three weeks at the library. Just arrived this month are these brand new ones: Vance Packard's "A Nation of Strangers," Dr. Eric Berne's "What Do You Say After You Say Hello?" "Fire in the Lake," "O Jerusalem," and Delderfield's "To Serve Them All My Days."

Stop at the library and pick up the only book that has been on the best seller list

for over a year, "The Winds of War" by Herman Wouk.

In non-fiction, "Eleanor: The Years Alone," has seen a bit of wear already and you, too, may be interested in reading about Mrs. Roosevelt's 17 years of life after the president's death. If you have not read "Eleanor and Franklin," the biography by Joseph P. Lash that preceded the present one, it is available also.

Taylor Caldwell fans will like "Captains and the Kings" while those who follow Virginia Holt's great fiction may want to borrow "The Shadow of the Lynx." The library has five other Holt titles including her very popular "The Secret Woman."

For who-dunit fans, how about a new Rex Stout mystery, "Death of a Nude?" Then there are two "cliff hangers," "Hijacked" by David Harper and "The Warsaw

Documents" by Adam Hall.

If you are looking for belly-laughs I can recommend P. G. Wodehouse's new book, "No Nudes Is Good Nudes." If you like Max Shulman you will want to read his "Potatoes are Cheaper." Under humor, perhaps I should include a most controversial book, "Everything you Always Wanted to Know About Sex," by David Reuben, M.D. Read it; perhaps you will list it elsewhere.

There are so many: "Boss-Richard J. Daley of Chicago;" "Tracy and Hepburn;" F. L. Bailey, the famous attorney's popular "The Defense Never Rests;" "The Other"

by Thomas Tryon; and on and on.

SANIBEL-CAPTIVA CONSERVATION FOUNDATION

As 1972 draws to a close the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation looks back on a year of steady achievement toward its primary goal of preserving the islands' ecologically rich fresh water wetlands.

At the year's end the foundation also underwent some major personnel changes, and while these departing will be sorely missed the way is opening for the infusion of new blood and new talent into the organization.

A major wrench is the departure from his full time post as executive director for the foundation of Roy Bazire. In accordance with previous agreements the foundation's board of directors reluctantly accepted Roy's resignation to permit him to return to the real estate business on the islands.

Roy has served the foundation as director, chairman and executive director since its earliest days when, as the Ding Darling Memorial Committee, it was instrumental in establishing the big sanctuary in Darling's name.

The board is happy to announce that Roy's services will not be altogether lost. He has agreed to stay on as part time consultant during the coming year.

Foundation Chairman Ann Winterbotham has also announced the resignation of two long time members of the board, Phoebe Haynie and Hal H. Harrison.

Mrs. Haynie has served for several years in the arduous post of secretary for the foundation. All agree she deserves a respite but she will be difficult to replace.

Harrison, the well known photographer, writer and naturalist who now makes his home on Sanibel, has served as one of the two vice chairmen and his services also will be missed.

Some new names, however, are being added to those who work for the foundation. Appointed by the board to fill a vacancy on the board of directors was William Damroth of Captiva, also a well known writer and photographer.

Named as new members to serve on the Advisory Board were Robert Vartdal of the Sanibel Community Association and Charlotte Shea of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife

Highlight of the Foundation's accomplishments during the year was receipt of a grant of \$260,000 from the U. S. Bureau of Recreation. This was given to match funds raised locally. The foundation also secured an additional line of credit of \$180,000 from the Nature Conservancy. All these funds are earmarked for the purchase of lands.

Even before these grants, the foundation during the year had increased its holdings in the wetlands area from 350 to 460 acres. There are, however, a total of 1500 acres of wetlands believed vital to the ecology of the islands.

Indicating increasing community support for the foundation membership during the year grew from 669 to 1060.



ACCUSED OF \$100,000 DAMAGE

A trailer and pickup truck on Captiva Island were flattened and a man described as being "very drunk" at the time of his arrest has been charged with destruction of property valued at \$100,000.

William Blaufuss, 22, of Dickey Road was released on \$300 bond after he was charged with the incident last

Sheriff's investigator Bill Hess reported that the pickup and office trailer at the construction site on Bowman Beach Road at Sanibel were destroyed and several pieces of heavy equipment badly damaged.

A wheel loader was rammed into the truck and office trailer, flattening both, according to Hess, and another piece of heavy equipment was driven into the water. The equipment was owned by B and J Dragline.



J. N. DING DARLING NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE

Nineteen hundred and seventy-two, as the second administratively independent year of the J. N. Ding Darling National Wildlife Refuge, has proven quite profitable to wildlife, islander, and refuge personnel alike.

Wildlife populations have provided their human relatives many causes for excitement. Waterfowl numbers which were relatively low last January have, this year, increased noticeably, particularly where migratory species are concerned. The latest weekly waterfowl census taken on the Darling tract revealed significant increases in populations of grebe, green-winged teal, blue-winged teal, widgeon, shoveler, merganser, and coot, with lesser scaup expected to increase the numbers within the next few weeks. Our roseate spoonbills peaked in May and June, much to the delight of birders, and apparently a few of the birds have decided that Ding Darling Refuge is worth delaying their trip to Florida Bay. The long-legged waders have continued to frequent the refuge. The antics of reddish egrets have caused particular interest on the part of many refuge visitors. The birds of prey, osprey, red-shouldered hawk, and bald eagle, precipitated excitement throughout the year also with their nesting activities, and swallow-tailed kite sightings became more numerous. Several visitors also reported mangrove cuckoos. Of course, the most excitement occurred when our two flamingos appeared in March. Throughout the summer and fall they put in fairly regular appearances on the dike drive.

The annual loggerhead turtle nestings on Sanibel saw 12 clutches of eggs transplanted to the headquarters hatchery where Charles LeBuff continues his Caretta Research Project. From these 12 clutches, approximately 1,500 tiny turtles hatched. A second cooperative project involving refuge personnel was the annual 'gator census in which 22 alligators were counted.

There were also sightings of species infrequent to the refuge. Two manatees spent some time in Kesson's Bayou in June, and in August two others, a cow and calf, visited Manager Barber's boat basin for a week. Needless to say, that basin saw its greatest amount of public use that month as islanders flooded in to see these mammals. Also in June two avocets were sighted, an extremely unusual occurrence in the summer months.

In addition to routine physical development and maintenance, 1972 saw the establishment of vegetational transect lines on the Darling impoundments and tidal waters. Assistant Manager Carowan worked closely with Wildlife Biologist Dick Thompson to establish these lines, spending a great deal of time sampling and analyzing aquatic vegetation. An attempt to monitor mangrove growth and to determine the influences of water fluctuation and salinity on this growth was an integral part of their hard work.



Carowan arrived in June from the Mattamuskeet National Wildlife Refuge, Visual Information Specialist Charlotte Shea was added in September, and Maintenance man George Weymouth returned to the staff in November. These additions doubled last year's staff.

Increased manpower and funds have made it possible for the refuge to expand its public use programs. Driving tours were initiated in November, a hike was added in December, and plans are in the offing for an additional hiking tour and canoe trail. These conducted tours are to be complemented by interpretive signing, an example of which has recently been installed by the sea turtle hatchery.

All things considered, the Ding Darling staff sees 1971 as an example of things to come and is looking expectantly toward serving Sanibel and Captiva, South Florida, and the nation in 1973. Manager Bob Barber, Biological Technician Charles LeBuff, Assistant Manager Glenn Carowan, Visual Information Specialist Charlotte Shea, Clerk Edythe Stokes, and Maintenance man George Weymouth wish to extend their holiday wishes and greetings to "The Islander" readers and to invite each of you to visit your national wildlife refuge in 1973.

SANIBEL BOTANICAL NOTES by William C. Brumbach

The story of Tracy's lovegrass is beyond doubt the most unusual and baffling epic in the botanical exploration of Sanibel Island.

To begin with this fabulous grass until 1964 was known only from Sanibel Island in all the world! Then, in 1964 it was found on Longboat Key, Sarasota, Fla. It is fascinating to think that a lowly grass can be so localized in its distribution in spite of its weedy habit.

In my research at the University of Florida herbarium on Tracy's lovegrass I found few early specimens on record until Dr. George R. Cooley collected it on Sanibel in 1954.

At the time I began in 1965 to collect the Island plants this grass was the third specimen I collected when I found it along a shoulder of the new causeway through the Ding Darling Sanctuary. It was not until some time later that I learned the identity of the plant and that it was discovered here on the Island in 1901 by Samuel M. Tracy.

Since that time I have come upon this grass at least a dozen times and have found that it usually appears in newly cleared situations. It never lingers long in any one place, however, and soon disappears only to turn up again

elsewhere when the ground is disturbed. It would seem to merit the name of the will-o-the-wisp of the plant world.

It is a certainty that Tracy's lovegrass will somehow continue to grow here on Sanibel no matter what the circumstances and that some day it will again be found by another observer who will then become a link in the chain of mystery which surrounds it.







WILDLIFE NOTES by Griffing Bancroft

One group of winter residents on the islands seems rather later than usual in arriving this year --- the ducks.

They are at last, however, beginning to show up in about the usual numbers, although some species are still absent or represented by only a few individuals.

As of this writing there are good numbers of blue-winged teal, shovelers, pintails, widgeons and some others, but a noticeable lack of the lesser scaup ducks, or bluebills, which often visit us in huge flocks.

One species which came late but is now here in fair quantity is a most welcome arrival, the red-breasted merganser. These mergansers can be depended upon to add activity and excitement to any duck pond.

They are rather un-ducklike ducks, having long slender serrated bills suitable for grasping the fish upon which, almost exclusively, they feed. And they pursue these little fish with what appear to be complete abandon, racing over the surface or just

under the water at top speed.

Their prey, seeking to escape, dash off in all directions and are, in turn, pursued by a host of other birds, especially herons, ibis, terns, skimmers, kingfishers and others. Things are seldom quiet when the mergansers are around.

But the main peculiarity of the red-breasted merganser is its social behavior. With most ducks, males and females arrive here in about equal numbers. Pairs are formed here on the wintering grounds before the return migrations in the spring.

Not so these mergansers. Virtually every one that gets down here is a female. For the most part these ducks nest very far north, around Labrador and Newfoundland. After nesting, in the fall, both sexes migrate as far south as the New England coast.

Here virtually all the old drakes remain for the winter. The females push on farther south. When spring comes, the females will depart our area, fly back north and join the males.

There, off the New England coast, they will engage in their courtships, pairs will be formed, and then the whole group will depart for the northern nesting areas.
