Toll Free Calls To Fort Myers To Start

All telephone calls between Sanibel-Captiva Islands and exchanges within the greater Fort Myers Metropolitan area will become toll-free local calls beginning Sunday, April 29, the United Telephone Co. announced.

Introduction of the new calling procedure coincides with publication of a new 1973-74 Fort Myers telephone directory, to be distributed door-to-door throughout the area beginning this week. The directory will become effective at 12:01 a.m. April 29, the company said.

"The important thing to remember," said J. M. Dalton, district commercial manager, "is that area subscribers should no longer dial '1' when calling to and from Sanibel-Captiva starting on Sunday, April 29; only the listed seven-digit number should be dialed." Those who forget to dial correctly will hear a recorded message, he said.

Expansion of the local calling area, said Dalton, means that some 1,200

Sanibel-Captiva subscribers will be able to reach more than 45,000 others on a toll-free basis. Because of this fact, he said that subscribers on the islands would experience an increase in local monthly rates effective May 11.

The monthly increases, according to a rate structure approved by the Florida Public Service Commission, will range from \$1.20 to \$2.40 for residential subscribers, according to the class of service provided. Increases for business subscribers will range from \$1.50 to \$4.20 per month.

Incorporation Report Mailed

The Sanibel-Captiva Planning Board has announced that the mailing of the report on Incorporation to island voters has been completed. Along with the report was a "ballot" requesting each voter to express his opinion about whether or not to pursue incorporation (home-rule) as a possible form of future government for the islands.

The Planning Board noted that the report and ballot were mailed to the list of registered voters as supplied by the County elections office. Recent additions to the voting list may not have been included. Any newly registered or other voters who were overlooked may obtain a copy of the report and ballot from Don Seymoure on Captiva, or Porter Goss on Sanibel.


Copies of the report for non-voting islanders, winter visitors or other interested parties are available from the Planning Board. The views and comments of all persons associated with the islands will be welcome.

A Planning Board spokesman commented that the very early returns of the balloting showed voters favoring further pursuit of some form of home-rule by a 4-to-1 margin. It was emphasized that this reflected a very low percentage of the possible total vote. "The Planning Board urges every voter to give us his opinion," said Board President Vernon MacKenzie. "If the consensus of island opinion is to go ahead, then we will set up as broadly representative a group as possible to handle the next steps."






Miss CHARLOTTE SHEA of the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service was the honored guest speaker at the PEO Sisterhood meeting at the Angel Drive home of Mrs. W. H. KILDOW, Jr. on Sanibel last Thursday. She presented a dynamic plea for the endangered species of wildlife threatened by "progress."

She spoke of the endangered species, such as the brown pelican, whose last nesting stronghold is in Lee County, bald eagles, ospreys, roseate spoonbills, wood ibis, pileated woodpeckers and ivory bill. Among the threatened animals are the alligator, Key Deer, and manatees which live in Southwest Florida, in a last ditch stand against man, the predator.

Miss Shea pointed out that in the Ding Darling Sanctuary many of these endangered animals and birds are being preserved successfully, and she stated that "When man starts destroying wildlife breeding grounds and life patterns, man is on the way to destroying his own life by upsetting the balance of nature which is necessary for mankind to survive."

AROUND THE ISLANDS

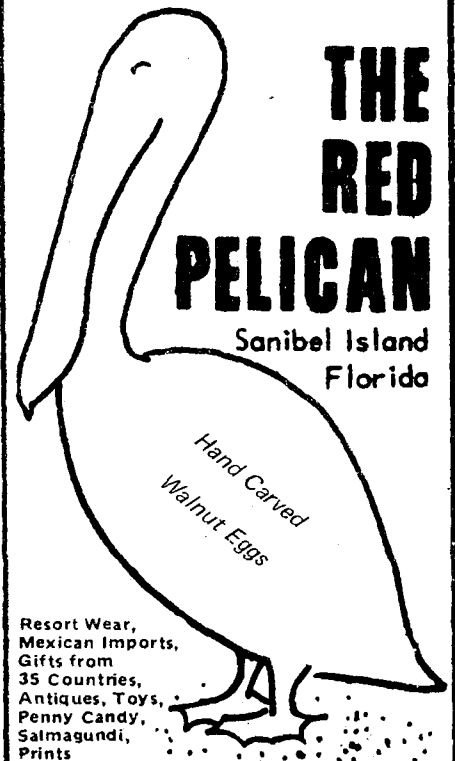





Britain and British writers are very much in the book world news these days; and, as you would expect, the Sanibel Library is up to date on all the important books emanating from London and published in the United States.

Outstanding is the Literary Guild's selection of the month, "Queen Victoria" by Cecil Woodham-Smith, who previously authored "Florence Nightingale," "The Reason Why," and "The Great Hunger." Mrs. Woodham-Smith's "Victoria" is the first of two books. It follows the Queen's life until the death of her prince consort, Albert, in 1861. In the hands of this capable author, the life of Victoria is a delight to read. While writing an engrossing love story, Mrs. Woodham-Smith's reconstruction of history is a rich and rewarding biography. Kings and queens are not always interesting people, but Victoria, during her 63-year reign, was a towering monarch who dominated every aspect of the era. Her personality was so intriguing, and her life so long (she was served by no less than 10 prime ministers) that her palace became a stage for world events.

Royalty is the subject of two other new books just received at the Sanibel Library. "The Life and Times of Elizabeth I" by Neville Williams is a beautifully illustrated book of 16 color plates and 100 other illustrations. It is the biography of the first English monarch to give her name to an era and the story of her reign, which was one of the most glorious in English history.

"Murder Most Royal," by Jean Plaidy is a novel about Henry VIII's two murdered queens, Ann Boleyn and Catherine Howard. The publisher claims to have given us a "savage, exciting and deeply moving story." In the light of what history has taught us about sanctimonious, hypocritical, shrewd, ruthless and amorous Henry VIII, one can believe it.

English history is very much a part of Christopher Syke's "Nancy, the Life of Lady Astor." This biography of the Virginia girl who married Waldorf Astor spans two countries and more than 70 years in the world of politics and social affairs.

England's R. F. Delderfield manages to write at least one best-seller every year and the Sanibel Library has his 1972 novel, "To Serve Them All My Days." In 1970, Delderfield's ever-growing reputation in America was crowned by his engrossing novel, "God is an Englishman." This was followed in 1971 by "Theirs Was the Kingdom," a companion volume. All of these are available at the Library along with four others, including "For My Own Amusement."

Another English author very popular with Sanibel readers is Victoria Holt. Among the seven books by this author in the library is her latest, "On the Night of the Seventh Moon." In this new Gothic romance, a young English girl is swallowed by a mist on the infamous night of the Seventh Moon, when, according to legend, the God of Mischief is abroad in the world.

COPIES OF SIGN ORDINANCE AVAILABLE

Copies of the full text of the Sanibel-Captiva Sign Ordinance have been printed and are now available from Ms. Roberts at the Chamber of Commerce office, 472-1080. Anyone who owns or plans to install or build a sign, is urged to get a copy and study it. The ordinance includes a provision for "the right to petition the County Commissioners for relief therefrom."

New business owners and managers in particular are urged to read the ordinance before ordering or building their signs. Each new business (opened since 2/1/61) is limited to one on-site sign, the total face of which may not exceed 100 square feet and no one dimension of which may exceed 10 feet. For example, a single-faced sign may be up to 10'x10'; a double-faced sign may be up to 5'x10' on each face. Animated signs and flashing lights are not permitted. It is unlawful for rental facilities to post room rates.

The County discovered a need to alter seawall design due to a "pumping action" through holes. The earth had to be removed first. Said a county spokesman, "We just let mother nature do our work for us," pumping out the material with high wave activity during storms. Costs for the whole causeway are expected to total \$85,000, paid through toll revenues.



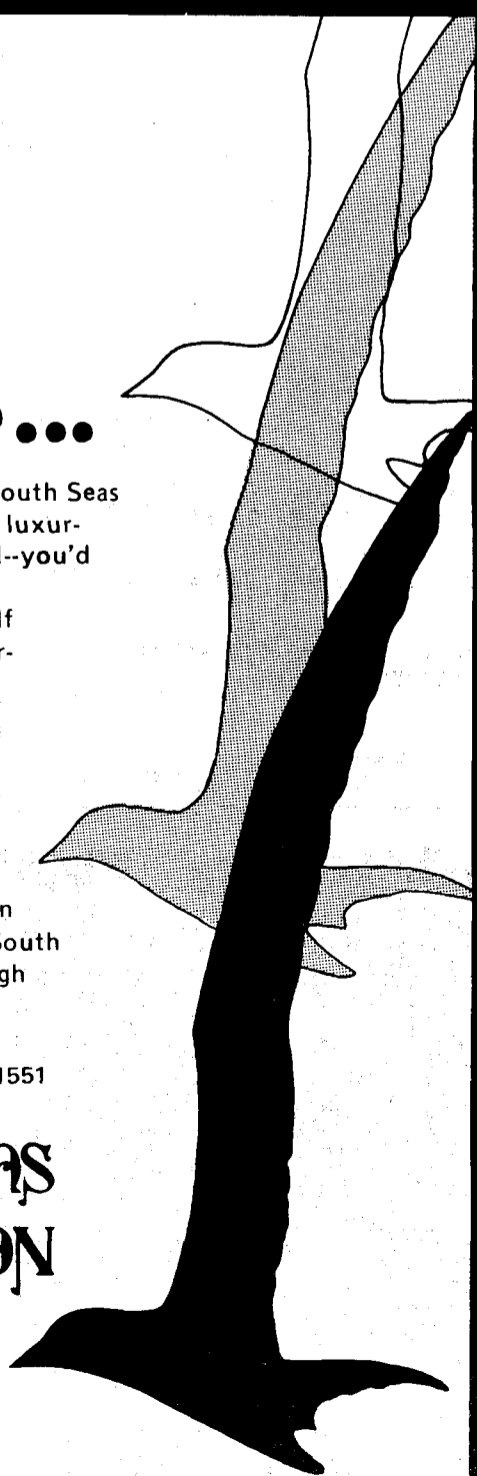

FINAL MEETING OF CAMERA CLUB HELD

The final meeting of the Camera Club for the current season was held Tuesday, April 10, at the Sanibel Community Association building. Some 26 people attended, about one third of whom were visitors to the Island.

Mr. Wilbur Tusler of Morend, Minn., gave a very instructive talk and demonstration on the technics he employs to photograph insects, frogs, flowers, etc., indoors. He uses three different types of tripods in the process plus special background colored paper which he prepares himself. He also uses natural lighting with the help of aluminum reflectors. One trick, which Mr. Tusler revealed, was in photographing wild flowers to preserve them until you are ready to photograph them put them in the refrigerator for several hours. This will not only preserve them but when taken out they will keep fresh for 3 to 4 hours. He also has built a special planter stocked with natural plants to keep his insects and to form a setting for photographing.

Following his talk Mr. Tusler showed some of his slides using these technics. One other trick he revealed was when taking pictures of flowers and you would like a bee in your picture, pick your flower, set up your camera then when you are ready for the bee put some honey on the flower to attract the bee.

Mr. Shepherd announced the appointment of a special committee consisting of Harry Borchers, Ben Pickens, and Arthur Hunter to draw up a plan this summer for possibly a more permanent organization and ideas for next winter's programs. This is the third year the camera club has been holding meetings without an organized body to run and supervise it.

Mr. Shepherd, who has been acting as chairman for the group, pointed out that there is a definite need for such a club on the island. These meetings have been attended by from 25 to 75 people he reported. Many of those attending,

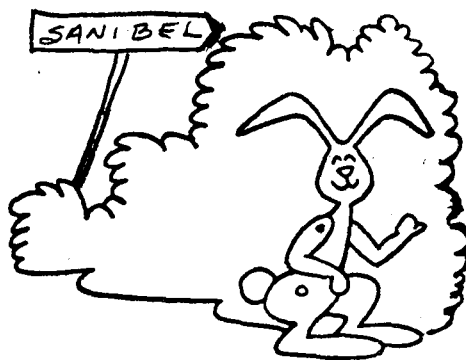
some times as high as 50% have been visitors to the island and generally they have been outstanding photographers and have put on some unusual programs. It is hoped that with a more carefully thought out plan that officers might be elected or appointed, memberships established and possibly bring the club into or under the banner of the P.S.A.

The next meeting of the club will be set for October. In the meantime the committee will be busily at work. It is hoped they will be able to contact some of the winter visitors either before they leave or by mail for any ideas they may have.

Members of the MacIntosh travel group will visit Switzerland, Austria, Yugoslavia and Italy in September, departing from New York via Transworld Airlines.

They will fly direct to Zurich. A private deluxe motor coach will await them to continue on a leisurely overland tour that will include Lucerne, Innsbruck, Bled, Venice, Lugano, Zermatt, Montreux and Interlaken. A multi-lingual tour director will accompany them throughout.

This will be the seventh successive annual tour for the group which had its beginning in 1967 with a tour to Portugal and northwest Spain. That year a total of 18 persons made up the group. Now there is need to limit the number to 32.

MacIntosh, who operates the bookshop, has travel experience going back to 1946 and South America where he operated a travel agency with offices in Quito and Guayaquil Ecuador. He organized and conducted his first group tour in 1949 when he led a contingent of Latin-American Rotarians to their international convention held in New York that year.

In 1950, the last Holy Year, he headed a pilgrimage of 59 Ecuadorians to Europe and Rome. Accommodations were hard to come by in those days for a large group especially in Spain which was still digging out from the agony of their civil war. Nowadays airline travel to Europe costs less than it did 25 years ago. It's the best bargain around.

Of the 30 who will accompany the MacIntoshes this year, only one is a newcomer. He points out that the success of the tours is largely because they are set up especially for his group. "We are simply not interested in covering a lot of territory and we don't like one night stands," he said.

"We now have a really fine group," he continued, "they are experienced travelers and they enjoy each other all of which makes my job as tour organizer and director not only easy but enjoyable most of the time."



We think the county government is doing a good job now that (1) plans are well underway for a county-wide zoning master plan; (2) a department of recreation and parks has been implemented; (3) the county Sheriff's office is now tackling the problems of law enforcement and crime prevention and detection in a much more scientific way.

In light of these and other constructive activities by the county, we feel very strongly that we here on Sanibel and Captiva should drop any further consideration of possible incorporation and give the county a chance to demonstrate that their new and constructive approach to their responsibilities will get the results that will be best for Sanibel and Captiva as well as for the county as a whole.

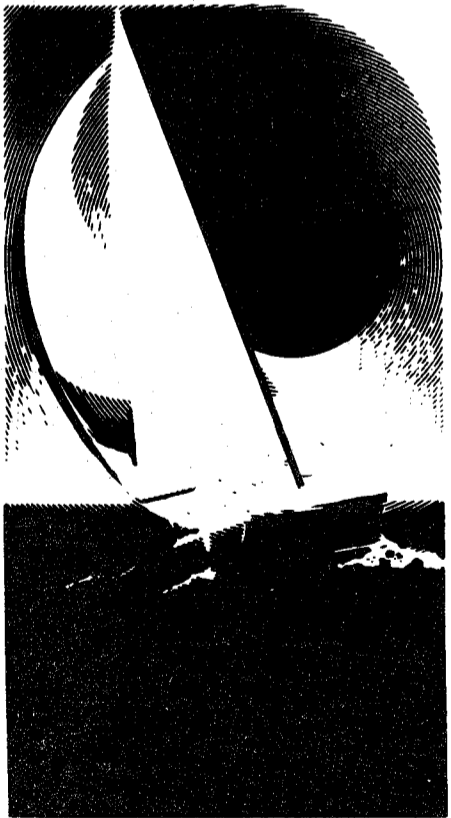
J. N. DING DARLING NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE

Among the first vertebrates to become adapted for life on dry land were the reptiles. These creatures dominated the earth before birds and mammals attained their respective positions. On the J. N. Ding Darling National Wildlife Refuge or these mammoth reptiles finds a home -- the American alligator. This animal is the most exciting wildlife species to be seen in Florida to many people.

The Gulf Coast of the United States was once prime 'gator habitat, and all the coastal states had their populations. The reptiles are still found in these states, though in lower numbers. Even on the Atlantic Coast as far up as North Carolina, alligators will be found in fresh waters. The Mississippi River has served as one of their migration routes to even the interior states of Arkansas and Oklahoma.

Once each year female alligators build their nest mounds and deposit their eggs, the numbers of which vary greatly. The usual number of eggs is between forty and sixty, although one survey of nests found as few as four eggs in a nest while another had 85. Unlike many reptiles, mother 'gators are very protective souls. An active nest is constantly watched by the female, and her behavior is very aggressive. She guards her young for two years after their hatching, protecting them from the solitary and cannibalistic bull 'gators.

Though the animals seem much like armored submarines, they are vulnerable to



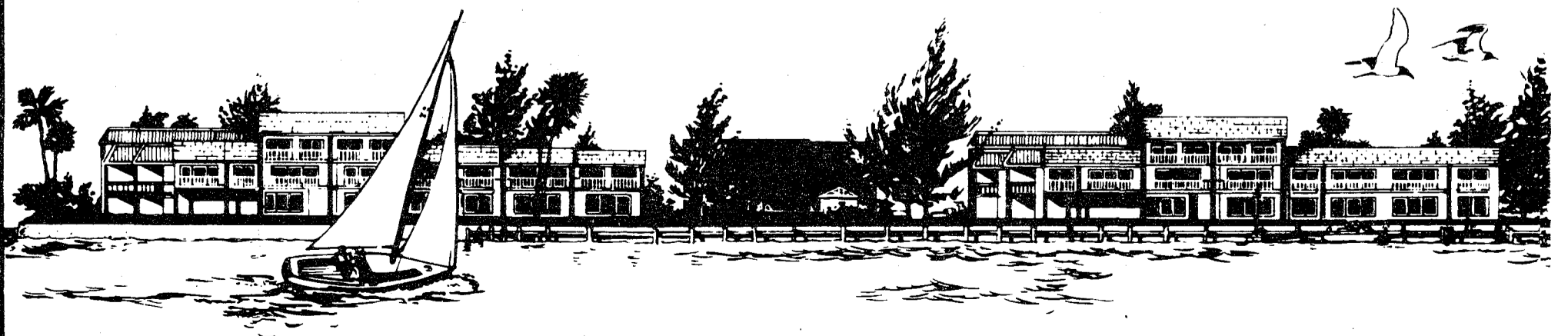

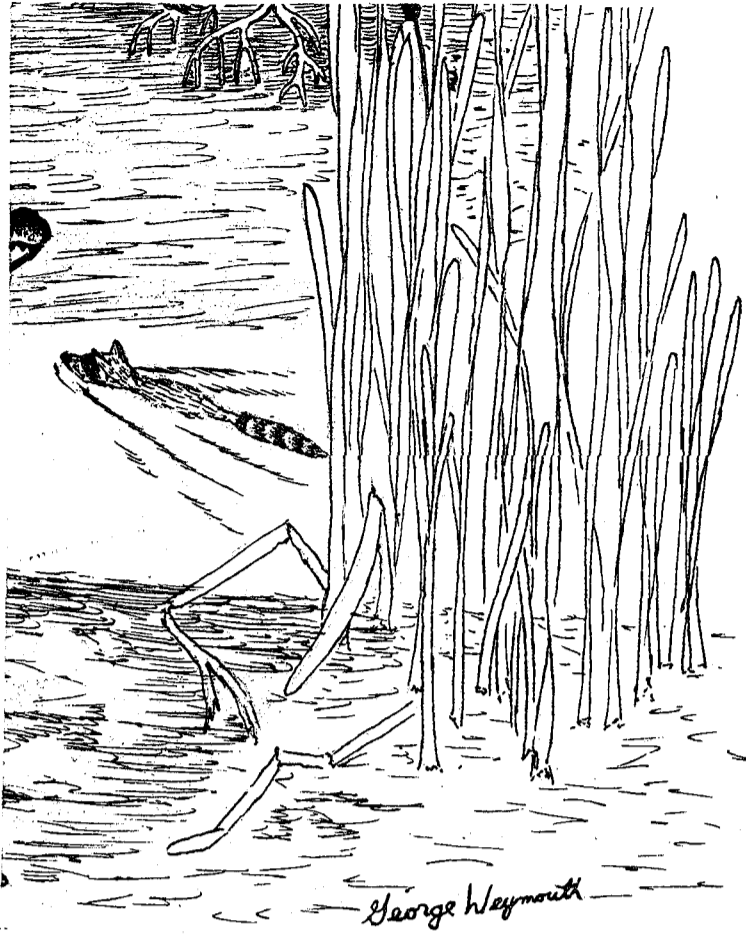






certain environmental conditions. Hurricanes, drought, diking, and poaching all take their toll on the numbers of these crocodilians. These four conditions alone accounted for the 98-99% decreases in the pre-1960 alligator populations. Another factor which is becoming significant is the removal of young by souvenir hunters. The population of young of the year may be decimated by these unthinking people.

Alligators are protected by law in every state where they are found. But protection of endangered species is not an entirely satisfactory solution for the 'gator. A number of individuals known as the American Alligator Council are interested in the survival of the reptile. As a result of their meetings, discussions, and studies, the group has recommended further measures to protect the species. Desirable and beneficial to their survival are the elimination of markets for 'gator hides, additional funds for law enforcement, more reserves and management areas, increased public education concerning the problem, increases in species research, strengthened legislation, and the establishment of a central clearing house for information on alligators.

One technique used successfully in alligator management is "farming." The animals are raised in the areas to be used for restocking in depleted areas. Their reproductive potentials are very good in captivity, so that this measure may be used to restore and replenish alligator numbers.
