NEW AIRLINE FOR AREA

Island Travel reports that United Airlines filed application with the Civil Aeronautics Board Friday, July 21, for service at Fort Myers. At the same time, United asked the CAB for an exemption to allow implementation of service at the earliest possible date pending Board action on the application for permanent authority.

United proposed two northbound and two southbound daily flights between Fort Myers and the Great Lakes region.

United is the largest carrier in the United States, serving 113 destinations from Miami to Boston and New York to Hawaii, and would provide Fort Myers with on-line connecting service to over 25 major cities on United's system.

United has 365 jet liners serving nearly 20,000 unduplicated route miles and has nearly 50,000 employees.

Those members of the Sanibel Community Association who attended their meeting last September will recall the wonderful treat they had listening to Dr. Gerry Schenelle's report on his trip behind the Iron Curtain when he visited Russia for the United States Government.

Well, they will be in for another treat when he, this time, takes them on a photo-essay or lecture on his trip to Norway.

Dr. Schnelle is Norweigian. His parents migrated to this country from Norway. Gerry has made four trips to Norway since 1961 visiting some of his family's old homesites and relatives. In pictures and words he will give you an insite into that country which he considers "the most beautiful in the world." In addition to being an expert photographer, Dr. Schnelle has a way of reporting on the interesting characteristics of the people and the country that makes you feel that you have been there.





REAL ESTATE NEWS by Betty Davis

Why do some houses sell more readily than others, even though their competition offers similar location, size and price?



Ladies of the world, arise! Lift your eyes from that hot skillet, that dusty typewriter; lay down your mops and martini glasses — go sailing! There is no way, out there on the water, with the wind in your hair and the salt spray in your eyes, with your body keyed to the demands of your boat, that you can feel like a second class citizen, a bored housewife, or an overworked Girl Friday. And you can do it all yourself.

DING'S THINGS

The techniques of wildlike management are varied. In some instances, only protection need be given a group of animals and they will respond via more individuals and healthier specimens. Protection takes the form of hunting regulations, limited public use, laws, and the discouraging of habitat destruction. In other cases, more concentrated specific actions are required. It is these cases, exemplified by activities conducted throughout the National Wildlife Refuge System, that will be the focus of this article for the next few weeks.

Perhaps the best known wildlife refuge in the country is Aransas, the wintering grounds of the endangered shooping cranes. Even though Aransas is not the breeding area of the cranes, it plays a vital role in the reproductive success of the birds.

In 1941 fifteen whooping cranes existed in the world. But many research findings and their applications in the realm of wildlife management have bought more time for the whoopers. In 1967 the Canadian Government agreed to allow researchers to remove a few whooping crane eggs annually from the Canadian nesting area so that they could be hatched and reared in captivity in the event that the wild birds became

extinct. This eggsnitching project has met with moderate success

On the wintering grounds in Aransas several management activities are being utilized. Food patches are planted in the refuge interior to keep the cranes away from a hard-to-patrol inland waterway. These food patches are fenced so that animals which feed on the same food as the whoopers will be kept out. Along this line of food and its manipulation, the refuge staff is trying to determine the crane's favorite food and also to find a food which whoopers like but their sandhill crane cousins do not. The sandhills often compete with the whoopers for food. If these staples can be determined, each year the wintering whooping cranes will fly back to Canada healthier and with a better chance of bringing off a successful nest.

Another area of research that is of interest to cranes is pesticides. Food wastes are analysed to determine kinds and amounts of pesticides in the birds' bodies and also to warn of disease which could wipe out all the whoppers in short time.

Again, protection plays a large part in whooping crane managerment. Visitors are kept away from the cranes as much as possible. They can watch the birds from a special observation tower. So, as seen above, research contributes significantly to successful management. It is a tool by which animals may benefit.



Letters to the Editor

TO THE ISLANDER:

What with the public being "watergated" at the Federal level, and "Adamized" at the State level, are we now to be "red herringed" at the County level by the current court case seeking to stifle the public hearings on the proposed Sanibel-Captiva Comprehensive Plan?

It seems to me that the time has come for our courts to reassign priorities and stick more closely to the role alloted to them in our American system of government that separates the functions of the three co-equal branches. The courts in other days insisted that it was not a judicial prerogative to supplant the legislators' judgement of how best to seek the public's views on solutions to public problems. It is now proper for the court to deny the County Commissioners the benefit of the fact-finding and recommendations on a planning matter from the Planning Commission which they created to do just that? Is it proper, also, for the court to indulge the petulance of a few foot-draggers that can afford to bring in out-of-town lawyers to bedazzle us locals with loopholes created by the sloth and sloppy drafting of our State legislature?

Note that the complaints are against the time honored and normal way of using public hearings to gather facts and public opinions, not the use of the harvest. Public hearings reasonably publicized are in the best tradition of "sunshining" the public business. The old town crier, of course, has given way to the modern news media in alerting the public on the call for a public hearing on matters of general concern. Specific mailed notices are still used primarily where the issue is a narrow one and where these concerned are not likely to be reached by the local media. Mailing costs and delivery uncertainties militate against the latter method.

The effectiveness of the local news media is alerting the interested public in this case is apparent from the fact that the Complainants have already spoken their minds at several public meetings during the past two years in which the Plan was in preparation. As recently as July 19, they mostly praised the concepts before the County Planning Commission. They also gave an oral preview of a so-called "Alternate Plan" the details of which were kept a carefully guarded secret from the public attending the Commission's workshop session. The duly advertised workshop meeting of July 26 to discuss the official Plan and permit the general public to express their views of the relative merits of the two Plans was scared off by the last minute filing of the perplexing court case.

In my opinion, entertaining a frivolous case in the courts is as dispicable and indefensible as allowing filibusters in the legislative halls. It is particularly objectionable in the docket-chocked courts of today where it could take several years to probate a will, settle a land ownership dispute, put a criminal in jail, or right some other wrong crying out for action.

I urge that we get on with the public hearings on the Sanibel-Captiva Comprehensive Plan so that the rest of the public can be heard.



ISLAND TRAVEL EXPANDS






be called port and starboard? It seems, says Gloria, that on the old ships the rudder was not center stern, but was attached at the back of the boat on the right hand side, which became known as the "steer-board" side --- soon slurred to "starboard." Naturally, so that you wouldn't damage your rudder or lose your steering, you would always "come in to port" on the other side, hence "port side."

The other day we were running in what Gloria calls "strong air and rough water," the wind at our backs. All around us the black clouds circled while on the distant horizon an occasional streak of lightning crackled. The sail filled in a beautiful curve, the rudders bit into the water leaving a white wake in the emerald green water, our butts hung over the edge of the taut canvas as feet braced, hearts thudding with the excitement of the challenge we raced the storm for home.

"Just don't let that pontoon plow under the water," Gloria shouted, her voice nearly lost in the wind as I licked the salt water from my lips and leaned further back than I'd ever thought possible. "A Hobie-cat can tip over," she told me later, "although I've never tipped mine. It's a great little boat. Speeds along like greased lightning, even does well in a light wind. Its only problem is that in heavy air and rough water, it's hard to tack. You have to backwind the sail and reverse the rudder to make it come about."




GIRL SCOUTS TO VISIT SANIBEL



THIS WEEK AT THE SANIBEL LIBRARY by Hal H. Harrison

(This week's guest columnist is George C. Tennery, former McGraw-Hill Publishing Co. executive and presently a Sanibel Library aide and a member of the Board of Directors. He writes on one of his favorite subjects -- crostics).

For the double crostic fan who is unhappy until the last 10-letter word has been identified in the current weekly Middleton or Cameron puzzle, Sanibel Public Library's reference shelves are a boon and a joy. There are books here (and in other sections of the library as well) which will help fit the right word to the most perplexing Middleton definition. These same reference shelves will also provide fact and substance for a high school or college student-researcher faced with writing a tough term paper (or for settling an argument). For openers here are reference book examples that filled-in some recent double crostic definitions for one avid puzle-

The "Encyclopedia of World History," an indispensable tome which briefly records developments in individual countries thoughout the world, named Edwin as the king Northunbria, A. D. 617 to 633. The "World Almanac," probably the most widely used and certainly one of the most respected reference works, revealed that Ruth Gordon (full name) was the best supporting actress in 1968 and that a Triple Crown winner (2 words, 10 letters) might be either Gallant Fox or War Admiral. The Russian novelist and short story writer whose best work is "Envy" turned out to be Yuri Oliosha according to "Reader's Encyclopedia," a handy reference work that will help to identify books, authors, literary characters, artists, historical figures and playwrights.

The library has two copies of that old favorite, "Bartlett's Quotations," which disclosed that the two missing words in the "MacBeth" quotation "all is ----; renown and grace are dead" were, "but toys." Pope Nicholar V was born in Sarzanna, Italy, according to "Webster's Biographical Dictionary," while Stanley Kubrick's celebrated Word War I movie (3 words) was "Paths of Glory" --- so said the "Encyclopedia of World Arts" which covers related subjects ranging from architecture and ballet to sculpture and the theater.

The one all-encompassing source of double crostic information and court of last resort is the "Encyclopedia Britannica" and the library has a late edition with all of the year books to bring it up to date. It was here that the puzzle-solver found that a book by Robert Owen, the Welsh reformer, (4 words following A) was "A New View of Society" and he also learned a lot about one of the early cooperative social movements in this country. The "Oxford Companion to American Literature" told that the hero of a drama by Clyde Fitch (2 words, 10 letters) was Nathan Hale. The last definition was conned from the "Rand McNally World Atlas." The highest mountain peak in eastern Asia Minor is Ararat.

This particular search by no means exhausted the fine reference books on the shelves. Musical questions can be referred to the "Oxford Concise Dictionary of Music" and if medical definitions are required, one has only to refer to "Dorland's Illustrated Medical Dictionary." For the nature lover who seeks further enlightenment the reference shelves are a gold mine of information. There is the 12-volume "Audubon Natural History Encyclopedia," the LIFE Magazine nature series and LaRousse's fine "Encyclopedia of Animal Life." Sports arguments can be settled by referring to the "Junior Illustrated Encyclopedia of Sports." Bird identification is made easier by looking at the beautiful "Audubon's Illustrated Handbook of American Birds," Finally, for synonyms there are two copies of Roget's Thesaurus.

This particular fan's search was by no means perfect. He is still seeking the name of "Simon -----, French leader of the crusade against the Albigenses as well as a 9letter compound synonym for "nuciform."
