The goals and objectives of the Planning Division.


The plan itself.

Ding's Things


Not only does the wildlife refuge system concern itself with waterfowl, but game animals profit from areas set aside for their use. The National Bison Range, National Elk Range, Hart Mountain National Antelope Range, and Cabeza Prieta Game Range are examples of refuges devoted primarily to big game species. Each of these refuges has a success story to be told: animals which had once been exploited to the point of extinction have been protected, provided with natural habitats, and guarded jealously from annihilation. The success is that these creatures are living today, natural and wild.

On the Hart Mountain National Antelope Range in Oregon about 2,000 pronghorn antelope live. These are not really antelopes; in fact, they are like no other creatures; they are found only in North America and are the only members of their family in existence today. With physical characteristics similar to both the deer and goat families, the pronghorn is a plainsdweller. Here where few hiding places are to be found, the pronghorns rely on their sharp eyesight and speed as defensive weapons. The "prongs" have been clocked at 60 mph, with a cruising speed of 35 mph. Fences do not stop them, though, unlike deer, they do not choose to leap them but rather to go under or through the barriers. This is often done without breaking speed or stride.

Some zoologists believe that the pronghorn was once as numerous as the buffalo, ranging over 2,000,000 square miles. Others, however, feel this is an over-estimation. Yet, the fact remains that the pronghorns are not as numerous as then. The slaughter of the animal fed settlers, miners, and travelers. Most of the meat was not eaten, however, only the saddle. Some animals fell victim to the market for wolf-poison meat; others were cut off from their natural range. Domestic sheep ruined much feeding range. By 1908 only 20,000 remained north of Mexico.

In 1936 the Hart Mountain Range was established to supplement and complement the work being done on Sheldon National Antelope Range in Nevada. The "antelope" are movers and travel from season to season. They fawn at Hart Mountain; they winter in Nevada.

There are many "life-zones" on the Hart Mountain Range, from desert to cool Canadian vegetation appears over the mountain. Many springs bubble up as watering holes, and from this wealth of vegetation, water, and protection, the antelope are increasing, even to the extent that they are hunted in several states. Without protection they would have disappeared for all time.


"The bill has taken the power from our own local elected officials, and handed it over to Tallahassee, and that seems to me and many others to be unfair," said Sweeney.

and he has received quite a bit of mail which approves of his stand in restoring the power of assessment to the local elected officials. He also received letters, to date, from Senator Thomas Johnson and Paul Nuckles.

As a matter of fact, the Southwest Florida delegation, including Nuckles, Randell, Walker, Lewis, Johnson and Sykes, voted against the bill in the legislature and now other legislators are beginning to see the light. The main supporters of the bill came from the Miami area.

"Now the work to repeal the bill is making some headway," said Sweeney.

TO THE ISLANDER:

A copy of the following letter was sent to the Islander for publication:
Dear Representative Nuckolls:

You are undoubtedly aware of the recurring controversy about the large number of free passes issued by the County Commissioners for the use of tha Sanibel Causeway. Since you are both a lawyer and the State Representative for the area served by the Causeway, it looks like you are the logical one to look to for legislation to correct any abuses that may exist in this free pass situation.

As a non-lawyer, I read Section 347.11 of the Florida Statutes (1965 version) as giving the Public Service Commission the power over franchising such facilities. Under Section 347.14(6) that Commission is specifically charged with making rules and regulations controlling the use of franchise rights including the charging and collection of tolls. It then precisely exempts from such tolls: State and Federal troops; fire departments; police officers on duty; and emergency ambulances. (Clergymen and preachers are not exempted). However, Section 347.19, which seems like a hangover from the last century, provides: "clergymen and preachers of the gospel shall be allowed to pass free over toll bridges and ferries in this state." It is that provision, I understand that is advanced as a justification for the issuance of a substantial number of passes to persons of questionable but little challenged eligibility.

Section 347.19, it seems to me, is partly repetitious of Section 347.14(6) as it relates to troops' exemption, and is of questionable conformity with recent U. S. Supreme Court rulings on the separation of church and state as it relates to men of the cloth. That being the case, some repeal action is in order to remove the ambiguities that create the lack of Public Service Commission enforcement of the law. The elimination of unauthorized departures from the "no free service" provisions of the law and the Bond Resolution that secures the Causeway bonds is needed to restore the public's and the investors' faith in the

operations.

Kindly advise as to your views and plans on this legislative matter. Thank

Thanks to all callers and writers who let me know their opinions on my resident report on the causeway refinancing and the pass abuses. One hundred percent of the callers approved my pass abuse complaint. Some of the callers felt that all churches (including island churches!) should support their own ministers trips over the bridge, both ways, and only tax paid services should be given free access.

A few winter visitors, owning property on the islands, asked me to clarify my opinion as to why free passes for yearly residents only.

Here it goes. The year around resident is not always a property owner but he is a Florida taxpayer, and he has many financial and social burdens spared the non-resident property owner.


The year around resident needs to cross the bridge all year long for social, instructional, medical, legal trips and for everyday life supplies, while the winter resident has few needs off islands during vacation.

While all property owners are taxed alike, the year around resident pays sales tax, license tax, and many other hidden taxes in much higher percentage than the 3 or 4 months winter resident.

Winter visitor who has a second home on the island but does not have residence, cannot contribute his vote or support to vital issues debated in his absence, and the resident is sadly outwitted and outvoted every time.

A free pass to a year around resident, a reduced commuter ticket available to non-resident owner and full toll for visitors seems in my opinion a fair deal. I may have overlooked some facts in the favor of the out-of-state owner, so please state your point of view. Solutions comonly from open discussion not from apathy.







THIS WEEK AT THE SANIBEL LIBRARY by Hal H. Harrison

The setting for Philip Roth's new book, "The Great American Novel," is America in 1943 --- a nation in the midst of a war with its people at home searching for diversions to keep their minds off the events on the war front. Roth presents such a diversion in the form of a group brought together under the guise of professional baseball. They are known as the Mundys of Port Ruppert, New Jersey. The book follows the Mundys throughout their season, but it spotlights the adventures and misadventures of players and their followers. Philip Roth is probably best known for his best seller, "Portnoy's Complaint" (sorry, we do not stock it). The library has "When She Was Good," another Roth book well received a few years ago.


Dorothy Uhnak's best seller, "Law and Order," which was a spring selection of the Literary Guild, is a story of the O'Malley family's three generations of New York policement. Mrs. Uhnak, who once worked as a policewoman for the Transit Authority, writes convincingly about law enforcement agencies. The book is a warm and intimate family saga with action and excitement woven into the plot. It has been

compared favorably with "The New Centurions."

Speaking of cops, the library has two more excellent books on the men in blue: 'Serpico, the Cop Who Defied the System," by Peter Maas and "The Super Cops, the True Story of the Cops Called Batman and Robin," by L. H. Whittemore. "Serpico" is the brutally honest story of Frank Serpico, the policeman who caused the biggest shake-up in the New York Police Department. "The Super Cops" is a story of two lawless officers known as "Batman and Robin." The fact that they were "a law unto themselves," may make for exciting reading, but as a purported true story it makes one wonder about the ethics involved.

Doris Lessing's best-seller, "The Summer Before the Dark," is a penetrating novel that should appeal to a large feminine audience. Kate Brown's husband and children are gone for the summer and Kate faces the most dramatic decision of her life. As in her earlier success, "The Golden Notebook," Ms. Lessing presents infidelity as the theme of her book, yet there is nothing erotic in the text. I have the feeling that a TV soap opera fan would be enchanted with this book. The library also offers "Briefing for a Descent Into Hell" by the same author.

No one can write novels faster than Victoria Holt. No sooner do I mention a new book than I see that we have one more on the library shelves. The latest is "The Curse of Kings," a tale set in 19th century Egypt. Not long ago, I told you about her book, "On the Night of the Seventh Moon." In addition, we have six other novels by Ms. Holt for you to enjoy.







A Grain Of Sea Salt by betzi abram



Shrimpers are fascinating men, self-reliant, rugged, filled with pioneer spirit, and like the prophets of old often unappreciated in their home town. Naturally, they're not all alike. I once met a Captain who was an ex-priest and graduate of Notre Dame but Chris Borgerson, captain of the Carol B, is much more typical to my mind. Taciturn but smiling, self-assured, he reminds one of a Scandanavian Gary Cooper, and indeed he was born in Norway, of which delightful traces remain in his rolling syllables.

Standing on the Carol B, admiring the thick, sturdy decks, the powerful "doors" that swing out and drag the shrimp nets, the deep insulated hatches, and the complicated, electronic instruments you are filled with admiration for the man who can take this 72 foot, 84 (more or less) ton monster, guide it safely through stormy seas, fill it full of elusive little shrimp, and bring it home to set it down between two docks as gently as a butterfly sets down on a milkweed.


Perhaps he's from a long line of sailors and fishermen, with years in a maritime school studying electronics and navigation? "Not at all," says Chris with a laugh, "most of us were raised on farms." And though much formal schooling is not required, there are three basic requirements: brains, brawn and experience. Since there are usually only two or three men on a trip, they work very hard, sometimes 24 hours at a stretch, and even with the most sophisticated machinery in the world, nothing will take the place of the human mind that has to interpret all those beeps, pulses, squiggles, or whatever the machine gives off.

Considering the price of a shrimp boat, about \$100,000.00 new with minimum equipment ready for fishing,

it's remarkable that as many men own their own boats as do. And just to buy fuel, oil and food for the usual 10-14 day trip costs around \$700-750! So you see one can't afford to make very many goofs. Shades of big business. A captain even has to have a cost accounting system, a bookkeeper and pay unemployment insurance for his crew.

However, financially staid as it may become, shrimping is still not a career for the cautious. Chris tells of one captain sitting at the wheel about 4:30 one morning waiting for dawn and trying to keep awake while the crewman, a young white fellow, slept aft in his bunk. Suddenly peering through the window was a big, unfamiliar black face. In a split second, he would have been out the other window if the man had not said, "Hold on, Cap'n. It's not what you think," and then proceeded to relate how he had fallen off his boat in the dark, and unable to catch up with it, had seized onto a net of this boat, climbed up the cable and across the extended arms to drop down on the deck. Just fancy doing that for exercise folks, let alone if your life depended on it!


Asked if he'd ever been seasick --after years in the Norwegian merchant marine, about 20 years fishing out of New Bedford, and eight years as a shrimp boat captain, Chris laughed without the slightest embarrassment. "Yoost once," he says in that wonderful fijord-flavored accent and you can't help but laugh with him. "I started on little boats as a boy, then into the big steamships of the merchant marine and was never sick until I returned to the little fishing boats after that. It lasted for about two days and then I was all right. Never bothered me since." And you know that a man who can laugh so heartily at being seasick not only has a great sense of humor but is really hooked on the sea.






