BEACH CLEANUP

The beaches of Sanibel and Captiva are about 3 tons of trash cleaner, thanks to the efforts of the local Kiwanis Club. "I didn't know how filthy the beaches were," commented Mark McClintock, chairman of the project after unloading several trailer loads of litter.

"The turnout numbered about 40 or 50 judging by the number of hot dogs consumed afterwards," Keith Trowbridge, Chief Chef, said.

The local Kiwanians were assisted in the September 23 cleanup by the Fort Myers Kiwanis Key Club and local Island residents.

According to Jesse Clouse the concentrations of litter were at the public beach access areas. "Some people must have had guilty consciences," Jesse commented, "because they left the area when we came in and started picking up the trash."


The project was very successful and it is hoped that there will be a repeat performance with a little more help from the local populous.


FISHING PIER NEWS

Robert L. Barber, manager of the J. N. Ding Darling Refuge, announces new parking facilities at the fishing pier on Pt. Ybel. The parking lot immediately west of the pier has been enlarged to three times its original size, and the areaadjacent to the old pier has been closed to parking. This area will be revegetated in sea oats so that the erosion caused by former parking practices can be eliminated. In addition, a traffic island has been installed at the entrance to the refuge headquarters driveway in an effort to redirect office and fishing traffic. A trail has also been constructed to connect the pier with rest rooms and the shelling beaches.

Pier users should note that cars are to be driven only on roads and parked only in designated parking areas. Lee County law prohibits vehicles on the county beaches.




MYSTERY SOLVED



CURBING THE CAR HABIT

America is on wheels, driving out of control. This year, 11 million more gasfueled cars will hit the road. They will join lanes with many million more cars already choking city streets with carbon monoxide and spewing out hydrocarbons along three million miles of roads and superhighways.

We have become dependent on the automobile. To our peril. Air pollution is eroding our lungs and lives. And car exhaust is the chief cause of air pollution.

Now the government's Environmental Protection Agency has recommended new controls to reduce our auto addiction: ration gas in some areas;

curtail parking in major cities; require exhaust-control devices on old as well as new cars. Says EPA Administrator Robert Fri, "We are basically attacking the problem by asking people to change their habits, their longstanding intimate relation with the private automobile.

Traffic studies show that 43 percent of all urban work trips made by autos are four miles or less; and in nine out of ten trips, the driver is the sole occupant. In addition to mass transit, many of these trips could be made by bicycle, say the Friends of Bikecology. They recommend building public transportation stations where commuters can store their bicycles and then continue by bus or rail into the city.

According to Friends of Bikecology, there are now 80 million bicyclists in this country. But there are only 16,000 miles of bikeways --- or about 13 inches per rider. In 1972, \$22 billion of our gasoline and property taxes were spent for highways, while less than one billion went for public transportation. And practically nothing was provided for bikeways.

INCORPORATION TALKED



ISLAND GARDENER

This is the beginning of the gardening season in Florida according to the Florida Nurserymen and Growers Association (FNGA(, With the high cost of vegetables it would do well to consider having a garden to supplement your grocery bill. The soil should be tilled thoroughly either with a spade or Rototiller. Add a large amount of organic matter such as compost, peat, decayed leaves, or composted garbage. This organic matter will help to hold moisture and fertilizer. Have the soil checked for sweetness by your local nurseryman or your local County Agent's office. Your local nurseryman or garden supply store will have a large selection of vegetable plants. Some of the things that you may want to purchase are tomatoes, cabbage, broccoli, cauliflower, and onions. There are many seeds available from your local nursery or garden supply store such as beets, radishes, carrots, parsnips, and dozens of others. Later on your nurseryman will probably have strawberry plants, so leave room for these. A garden should be fertilized and watered, as well as tilled or hoed once in a while. Weeds take away the fertilizer from the plants that you want to grow, so keep a green

garden or mulch the rows.

A number of our summer residents are returning from the north to find that many of their plants will need care. Rose bushes, of course, may have suffered from neglect during the owners absence. Black spot will undoubtedly be rampant. It may have completely defoliated most of the bushes. There will be long, leggy growth as a result of the summer showers. Prune back this growth and spray the plants with Benlate. Use a rose fertilizer suggests FNGA for best results.

If you water and fertilize your bushes after pruning they should produce flowers in 5 to 7 weeks. Some of your favorite plants may have died. Check with your nurseryman for replacements. Now is an excellent time to add fertilizer to your spring flowering bulbs such as Amaryllis. Avoid using a high nitrogen fertilizer for this can affect the flowering. Some bulbs may need transplanting says FNGA so do this now.



I own the land at the end of Rabbit Road at the corner of Gulf Drive. On 135 feet of Gulf frontage I am going to build a home for my family.


I have set aside a walking easement five feet wide for the people who are

DING'S THINGS

From the south of California to the Alaskan peninsula is quite a jump, but thousands of waterfowl make the journey between the Imperial Refuge and the Izembek National Wildlife Range twice a year, flying from their wintering grounds along the Colorado River to the edge of the Bering Sea where they will breed.

Izembek is a large range, established in 1960 and containing nearly 500,000 acres of subarctic-alpine habitat: salt meadows, tidal lagoons, heath, morraines, volcanoes, glaciers, and vast beds of eelgrass in the bays. Most of the land is wilderness, inhabited by bear, caribou, otter, mink, wolf, wolverine, shore birds, ptarmigan, the entire population of black brant, and other ducks and geese


The eelgrass beds and tidal lagoons are excellent feeding areas for the wildfowl, an essential for breeding birds with young to raise. In fact, the range has the distinction of encompassing the largest eelgrass beds in the world. The grass is directly eaten by the birds and is utilized by invertebrates which other birds feed on and releases nutrients into the salt waters to feed commercially important sea foods for

The function of Izembek in the overall flyway scheme is two-fold: to serve as a breding area, and to serve as a feeding and resting area for moulting birds. In the realm of rare and endangered species, the Aleutian Canada geese have become established at Izembek and these birds are being encouraged by the maintenance of the present habitat and by the determination of the birds' requirements. Another range goal is to provide favorable nesting conditions for other species of waterfowl pintail, mallard, green-winged teal, greater scaup, bufflehead, common goldeneye, widgeon, gadwall, old squaw, Steller's eider, common eider, and the king eider. Emperor geese also summer on the Izembek range. The most favorable nesting habitat is the marshy salt meadows, where the birds find food and protection from predators. Shore birds are also encouraged by maintaining the mudflats on the tidal lagoons.






It is the intention of the owners to take an active part in the management and operation of Three Star, which they hope to model to the needs and wishes of the Islanders and tourists.







THIS WEEK AT THE SANIBEL LIBRARY by Hal H. Harrison

In my continuing effort to report to you as quickly as possible the arrival at the Sanibel Library of all the best-selling books, I am forced to neglect news of other books that may be of interest to you — in some cases even more than the top 10 in fiction and non-fiction. Because the list changes often, I sometimes fail even to write about some of the best sellers. At any rate, here is a rundown on some of the books in stock that I have not told you about.

I have been remiss in not announcing "Burnt Offerings" by Robert Marasco. This one has some of the shock of "Rosemary's Baby." It is the story of a young married couple who rent an isolated summer house. All goes well until things begin to change. This stunning horror tale gains momentum as it travels toward its climax.

Daphnedu Maurier, author of the great novel, "Rebecca," has written a novel set in Cornwall and timed for a future era. "Rule Britannia" is a suspenseful satire based on an alliance between England and America which eventually sees the U. S. Marines protecting England. The people of Cornwall resent the Marines and this confrontation leads to sharp action.

You will remember Attorney Louis Nizer and his best-selling "My Life in Court." His new one is "The Imposition Conspiracy." It is the story of the famous Rosenberg case of 1951 well told as a very human encounter.

"Journey to Ixtlan" by Carlos Castaneda is a best-selling account of the author's experiences with a Yaqui Indian sorcerer. It has been described as "among the best that anthropology has produced."

The clash between the provincial mind of a small New York town and a strange, intruding presence is the setting for John Gardner's "The Sunlight Dialogues."

"Blackberry Winter" is the memoirs of a famous anthropologist, author and public figure, Margaret Mead. It is an intimate story sparked with humor.

Marjorie Craig tells of her experiences in teaching a group of emotionally and socially disturbed children in her book, "P.S. You're Not Listening." Mrs. Craig's efforts to get through to them is at once tragic and hilarious.

Women's libbers may not like "The Manipulated Man" by Esther Vilar. In this highly controversial book, Ms. Vilar claims that men, not women, are the exploited sex. You can take it from there.

And finally, for some real excitement, read "Taking of Pelham One, Two, Three" by John Godey. In this thriller, a gang hijacks a subway, paralyzes a city and threatens to murder the passengers unless they get a cool million in just one hour.






