### SANIBEL LIBRARY EXTENDS HOURS!


Effective Nov. 1st, the Sanibel Public Library not only will go on the so-called "winter schedule" - it will go open for the public use much more than ever before.

Mr. DENNIS BOLAND spent two weeks with his family at Captain's Walk. Dennis is from Hinsdale & didn't want to return.






LIONS CLUB







#### NEW BOOK PUBLISHED BY CONSERVATION FOUNDATION

An interesting book, Native Trees and Shrubs for Sanibel Captiva Landscaping, prepared by Mada Harrison is just published by the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation, Inc. The book provides the basic information needed to begin a native plant home landscaping program.

The plants described in the book are indigenous to the islands and will thrive in most areas of Southwest Florida; they are receiving greater attention because they can survive the area's wide range in rainfall, from the floods through the droughts, with little care. Once established, the plants require minimal feed and water which, in the face of an energy and thus a water crisis, is an important economical and responsible consideration. In contrast, "exotic" ornamentals require much more care and much water in the dry season—not even to mention that a good salt blow can eliminate the salt sensitive exotics.

The carefully researched booklet has an easy to read section describing the plants with mature size, rate of growth, leaf shape, flower color, fruit and other distinguishing features are all noted.

In addition to the identification section there are sections on why use them, how and where to get them and how to treat them. Some important information dealt with briefly is knowing what to leave on your property before clearing for construction. If a lot is cleared and left, the native plants generally won't return. Exotic plants like Brazillian Pepper, Australian Pine, and sand spurs establish easily in the open ground and grow faster than the natives crowding them out. This disruption of the natural landscape also eliminates wildlife habitat.

Contributions were made to the book by a number of people. Dr. Frank Craighead Sr., associated with the National Geographic Society, wrote a forward. Many local botany devotees offered information, and illustrations were contributed by Ann Winterbotham, Adelaid Bailey and Mrs. Joseph Woods.

# Ding's Things

On the west coast of the United States can be found some of the most beautiful seascapes in the world, and the State of Oregon indeed has its share of these magnificent sights, In fact, the Wildlife Refuge System is in possession of a number of coastal lands which are currently being considered as wilderness areas. The Oregon Islands National Wildlife Refuge, composed of fifty-six islands and in the process of adding twenty-eight more, is one of two refuges on the Oregon Coast. The other is Three Arch Rocks Refuge. Both these refuges were established to protect and manage nesting colonial bird habitat. In 1935, the Oregon Islands Refuge had its beginnings in 21 acre Goat Island, which was designated as a wilderness area in 1970. Since 1935, the refuge has grown to include 459 acres.

In the 1500's European explorers first came upon the islands of the northwest. Here they encountered many Indian tribes that used the islands for food - gathering eggs, shellfish and hunting sea lions. The search for the "Northwest Passage" brought more and more people into the area, and trappers, explorers, sea otter traders, and pioneers on the Oregon Trail finally reached the Pacific. In 1856, a massacre of whites by Indians reportedly occurred on what is now refuge land.

Mammals are scarce on the Oregon Islands. Sea lions and seals make up most of the mammalian populations, though gray whales and sea otter are in the surrounding waters. Colonial sea birds are the most abundant - Leach's petrel, Brandt's cormorant, common murre, western gull, tufted puffin and brown pelican. These birds come in the hundreds of thousands to nest. Many other species of sea birds frequent the islands as do seven waterfowl species, 10 kinds of shorebirds, peregrine falcons, and some small land birds.

Public use on the refuge is generally very limited because of the inaccessibility of the islands. However, trips are made for scientific investigation under strict government regulations.

The islands are exemplifications of places which are successful habitats with no need for overt management. All that man can do for these areas is to protect them from exploitation, pollution, and by biological investigation. Such are the management goals of the Oregon Islands Refuge.

THIS WEEK AT THE SANIBEL LIBRARY

From time to time, the Sanibel Public Library is the fortunate recipient of a generous financial gift from a library patron who is interested in having the library acquire more books, sometimes on designated subjects.

Such a friend is Booth Courtenay, who, with her husband, Bentley, spends her winters at Tahiti Shores, Sanibel. Madison, Wisconsin is the permanent home of the Courtenays. Mrs. Courtenay is an author, photographer, painter and botonist. Her interest in botany inspired her to request that her donation be spent on addition of wildflower and mushroom books to our stock.

Coincidentally, one of the first books acquired was Booth Courtenay's own publication, "A Guide in Full Color Wildflowers and Woods." Her co-author is James H. Zimmerman. Although this text is not written specifically for the southeast, many of the flowers and weeds discussed and



photographed occur in our area. However, a unique approach to identifying wild plants, explained in the introduction, will be of particular interest to botonists and wildflower enthusiasts. More than 650 color photographs many by Mrs. Courtenay, illustrate this valuable book.

Two magnificent volumes entitled "Wild Flowers of the United States, The Southeastern States," by Harold William Rickett, were acquired by the library because of Booth Courtenay's gift. This text covers nine states. including Florida, and treats about 6,000 species of plants of which half are wildflowers. These two volumes are considered reference and cannot be taken from the library but are available always for perusal and study.

Another beautiful and useful publication included in the Courtenay gift is "The Native Orchids of Florida" by Carlyle A. Luer. Of the 170 species and varieties of orchids in the United States, 102 have been found in Florida. The author and photographer, who is a practicing surgeon, has completed the monumental task of photographing in color all of these 102 species. There are 85 plates representing 600 separate photographs. Chapters in the book include "The Fahkahatchee Strand," "The Everglades," "On the Conservation of Orchids," "Morphology of Orchids," "Classification of Orchids," and "Key to the Genera." This, of course, is another reference book.

One book on mushrooms, "The Mushroom Hunters Field Guide" by Alexander H. Smith, has been acquired with the Courtenay gift. This is a revised edition of a foremost handbook on mushrooms first published in 1958. It is a practical and authoritative guide on hunting and collecting wild mushrooms. This revised edition with 89 new color plates and over 200 black and white photos has been enlarged to include descriptions of 188 species. The photographs are superb. This book may be borrowed.

Several botanical books acquired previously include "Growing Orchids at Your Window" by Jack Kramer, which includes directions for growing 200 orchids from aerides to vanda; "Florida Landscape Plants, Native and Exotic," by John V. Watkins; and "A Dictionary of Tress," by Walden.

At the next meeting of the Sanibel Community Association November 7th, all members are being asked to concentrate on bringing their most economical dish that they have made during this period of high prices, and the recipe with it. This will be in keeping with the theme of the meeting itself, which will be on "How to Save on Food" dur-

ing this period of extremely high prices.

"I'm sure," says "Patsy" Simmons, who is a member of the Community Association Program Committee and who is pulling this program together, "that many of our members have found delicious ways to stretch the budget by preparing unusual dishes. Now we are asking them to prepare such a dish for this next dinner meeting, let us sample it, and bring the recipe. These dishes can be ways to stretch meat and I don't just mean by putting it with Hamburger Helpers. We all are more original than that. One lady I know has worked out a method of mixing it with oatmeal to make it go further. In fact, she has made it for the last two meetings and the group ate it up. Of course, her secret is in the seasoning. I know of others who have ways of using chicken. Fish recipes would be most welcome. This idea applies to vegetables, cheese, casseroles, salads, even dessert pies for example. I feel it can be fun, original, stimulating, challenging as well as very helpful."

"These recipes will then be collected and reproduced in some form and distributed to our members. Also, says Patsy, "we are trying to see if we can't make some kind of a contest out of it and award a prize for the most inter-

esting dish.

"Also," Patsy continues, "we would welcome recipes that include the use of native plants and fruits. For example, I know of a lady who makes jelly from seagrapes, then uses the pulp to make jam. 

TALLAHASSEE (AFNS) . . . We have learned previously that the first thing to do is to get your boat properly registered, and numbered. Next you will need to furnish the boat with the proper equipment so it can legally operate on the water. The law requires certain minimum equipment to be aboard your boat, and that equipment depends upon the class of your boat. So, let's consider each piece of equipment individually.

If your boat has a gasoline inboard or inboard - outboard engine it must be equipped with an acceptable means of backfire flame control. This usually means you will need a Marine Patrol approved Flame Arhave an outboard engine, a flame arrester is not required.

a "Personal Flotation Devise". There are many things which may be used as general life-saving devices in emergencies. Perhaps a good example of one would be the beverage cooler which most skippers carry in their boat. The important difference between these and PFD's is that a Personal Flotation Device is designed to keep an individual afloat in the event of an emergency.

The state law requires that each person aboard must have access to his individual Personal Float Device. All PFD's are not certified approved, and they should be purchased according to size with the same care you'd use in selecting a rester for the carburetor. If you mink coat for your wife.
