



ECC STUDENTS EXCAVATING ON SANIBEL ISLAND

ECC students in George Huggins' anthropology classes are assiting in excavation of shell mounds on Sanibel Island just north of the J.N. Ding Darling Sanctuary. The Calusa Indians probably built the shell dwelling mound which is rich with shells, pottery shards and other artifacts and which have not been fully evaluated, according to instructor Huggins

Huggins also stated that the Calusas would eat the shellfish, then pile up the shells, and build their houses on the mound which was a protection against high tides.

Excavation work began in early April and will continue through the summer.

INCORPORATION CLOSER TO VOTE

Last Thursday, the Florida Senate unanimously passed Sanibel's incorporation measure and residents will be voting in November, barring a veto from the Governor.

Only registered voters will be allowed to vote on home rule in November and not all landholders.

Governor Askew could veto the local bill since his past record has shown him in opposition of more new Florida cities.

Before the bill was introduced into the legislature, about 400 Sanibel residents voted to pursue incorporation.

THIS WEEK AT THE SANIBEL LIBRARY By Hal H. Harrison

In our continuing effort to "feel the pulse" of our members, the Book Selection Commiftee of the Sanibei Library is launching a bit of experimental research. For some time we have been wondering about western fiction. We know there is a big market in America for books on cowboys, outlaws, bounty hunters, gold prospectors, frontier towns, western sheriffs and marshals, but we do not know how much demand there is on Sanibel for these adventure books. So, we have decided to find out. We are going to buy new and old western fiction and make it available to you. If these books circulate, we will know that we have an audience. If they do not, we will forget about them in the future.

To start our experiment, we have just received four new westerns. The first is by one of the most popular writers in this field, Max Brand. He has a long list of books to his credit and his new one is "The Outlaw of Buffalo Flat." This is an action-packed story of a man who lived at the point of a gun, hunted by the law, by his enemies, and even by those who wanted to be his friends.

"Maverick Marshal" by James Wesley is the story of Marshal Lance Weaver who was out to restore law and order to the Calverado Range. Weaver is the Gary Cooper type who never quits.

Cripple Creek was a roistering gold town where many dug but few hit it big. "Strike at Cripple Creek" is the story of one prospector who did hit it big.

Paperback fans will welcome Louis L 'Amour in his first original hardback book, "The Californios." It's an exciting story of Spanish California of more than a century ago when Americans were just beginning to settle the rich and gold-filled land along the Pacific.

Finally, we have a book of non-fiction, a book of great art and myth-shattering history, "The AmericanCowboy" by Harold McCracken. This luxury-size collector's edition has more great masterpieces of Western American art, many in full color, than ever before in a book about cowboys --- Remington, Russell, Catlin and many others. There are 148 paintings, drawings and photos plus a fascinating history by a top authority.

In the field of "Biography," we know we are on safe ground for our members lean beavily upon this department for their reading.


For those patrons, we now have "Departing Glory, Theodore Roosevelt as Ex-President" by Joseph L. Gardner. Roosevelt was the youngest man ever to leave the White house, an ex-president at 50. The years ahead were filled with flamboyant travels and adventures and eventually a return to politics. This is the first book to

concentrate on Roosevelt's life after the White House.

"Edward the Uncrowned King" by Christopher Hibbert is a magnificent pictorial record of the life of the Duke of Windsor. In nearly 300 photographs, his life is followed from an Edwardian childhood to his love for Wallis Simpson, through the year of the abdication crisis and on through the final years.

Those who enjoy history and Floridiana as well as biography will be interested in "Osceola, the Unconquered Indian" by William and Ellen Hartley. Here is the story of the great Seminole leader who resisted removal of southeastern Indians by the government to Indian territory west of the Mississippi, a resistance that led to the second Seminole War in 1835 which actually never ended in a formal peace.

This disclosure could very well lead to a vacancy in the commission, which I am sure the dentist could "fill!"



Educational training under the GI bill is not limited to classroom type learning says W. B. Mackall, director of the State of Florida's Division of Veterans Affairs.

There are many good paying jobs for which specialized skills are required, so the GI Bill offers a program of apprenticeship and on-the-job training. While you are learning, you are also earning, and receiving Veterans Administration payments to supplement your income.

For instance, if you are single and take on an approved program of apprentice training, the Veterans Administration will pay you \$160 a month for the first six months. In addition, your employer will be paying you regular wages for that job. Together they add up to a program of on-the-job training that is hard to beat. If it has been less than eight years since you left the service, and your GI Bill entitlement has not been used, you may be eligible for up to two years of on-the-job training or an unlimited trade apprenticeship.
