Yes, Money; No, Trailer Park

The Lee County Commissioners made two decisions this week which seem to be favorable to the Islands. Friday, they reversed their decision to deny Sanibel the \$5.4 million revenue from the toll gate receipts. Originally on Wednesday, they had voted not to give the Islands the money if Sanibel voted for incorporation in November.

Friday, on a motion by Walter Shirey, who said the original vote was in violation of a Florida statute which prohibits "Corruptly influencing"voting, the Commissioners on a 3-2 vote, decided to give the money to the Islands come what may --- and Shirey said he may request an investigation of the original vote.

Then, Monday morning, they voted to deny a request, which had been approved earlier by the zoning board, for a 95-unit travel trailer park adjacent to the Ding Darling Sanctuary. The zoning change had been requested by Gordon Gracey and had been opposed by the Sanibel Planning Board, the refuge's administration, the Conservation Foundation and the Community Association. However, the request was denied "without prejudice," which means the matter can be brought before the board again at any time.

At the same meeting, the Commissioners did approve a zoning change on a parcel on Casa Ybel Road near Gulf Drive for condominium or apartment. The request was made by Dan Royal and calls for a density of slightly over 17 units average per acre (instead of the allowed 15) but, since he' is donating a 60 ft. strip of land to the county for a right-of-way, the density works out at 14 units per acre. (Oh.)

It's the kind of trade-off according to Commissioner Shirey, one gets into when the county doesn't have enough money to buy a right-of-way.

What ho, we're moving!

Unfortunately, plans for an office on Sanibel aren't completed yet; but we hope to find a convenient spot by the season.

TELEVISION COURSE SCHEDULED

Edison Community College is doing something new - an open circuit presentation of a course on "Man and Environment" with three college credits.

The course will run from Sept. to December of this year. It's offered as part of the curriculum of the College's Division of Scoial Sciences. QUESTIONS ANSWERED BY REP. PAUL NUCKOLLS

Dear Representative Nuckolls:

We are writing to protest the fact that this area has only one major airline carrier, which is again on strike.

My husband is a heart patient, and it was necessary for us to travel to the midwest. Because National was striking, we have to leave here at 4 a.m. by bus to get to Tampa for a flight to connect us with another flight to our destination, and poor connections caused even more delay and anxiety.

Isn't there any help for us, who are stranded here at the mercy of one airline, which has been out on strike three times in 5 years?

Dear Mrs. C.R.W.,

Our office has encountered many cases where a relative in the north has become seriously ill, and our people cannot get air connections out of Southwest Florida, in some cases, for several days.

First, let me address my reply to the problem of acquiring another major carrier for the Southwest Florida area.

The phenomenal growth here has produced a demand for mobility into and out of Fort Myers, the hub of Southwest Florida activity. Because we have no railroad passage, two bus line routes, one interstate airline carrier, and one intrastate carrier (National), our area is practically crippled by National's latest strike. Even when we have National in service, our people have access only to Eastern Seaboard cities and a limited interconnecting service with other carriers through interchanges in Tampa, Orlando, Sarasota and Miami.

Our office has requested Amtrak to consider adding passenger rail service into our area, but they are experiencing such a severe equipment problem that they cannot request any increased service locations at this time.

The Fort Myers-Lee County Chamber of Commerce, through their Airline Service Committee, chaired by Malcolm Schroeder has done a yeoman's job trying to get another major carrier to serve Lee County, and have been working on this since 1970. Their efforts have been stymied first by the energy crisis wherein no airlines were given permission by the Civil Aeronautics Board for new routes, and then by the National Airlines strike, because governmental agencies may not become involved in new route negotiations when one of the major carriers is involved in a labor dispute. Their objectives are to get another major jet service from Ft. Myers to the Great Lakes states, and another jet service from Ft. Myers to Atlanta for improved service there and for connecting flights to other Southern and Midwest cities.

Another request for an exemption hearing will be filed with the C.A.B. when the National strike is settled.

Congressman L. A. "Skip" Bafalis has been very helpful in trying to get more complete airline service here, as well as joining with the entire Florida Delegation in addressing a request to the National Labor Relations Board that a settlement with National be effected as soon as possible.

Our office was helpful in getting the Public Service Commission to allow expansion of Florida Airlines Service interstate, and these expanded services. may be increased further in the future. Florida Airlines is attempting to alleviate the immediate problems here by providing increased connecting flights to other Florida cities during this strike-caused hardship.

It seems that our most pressing needs could be met by a settlement of National's strike. To that end, we have requested of the National Mediation Board that they make this strike one of their priorities in attempting to effect a






settlement. It may be helpful for our citizens to also write the National Mediation Board, 1230 16th St., Washington, DC, 20572, and make known some of the severe hardships caused by the strike in the hopes that they will press a bit further in effecting a settlement. GAME AND FRESH WATER FISH COMMISSION TO MEET SEPT. 18

Bass tournaments, high water in the Everglades, public hunting and the Florida alligator will highlight the agenda of the Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission meeting scheduled for Wednesday, September 18, near Jacksonville.

The September meeting will be held at the Turtle Inn located at One Ocean Boulevard, Atlantic Beach, immediately south of Jacksonville Beach, and will begin at 9 a.m.

According to Commission Chairman Ogden M. Phipps, the Commission will review a proposal for a permit system for bass fishing tournaments. The permit system, as proposed, will apply only to tournaments offering more than \$1,000 in prizes or those with more than 50 anglers. The permit will not be required for locally sponsored fishing contests or local bass club tournaments.

The Commission will also review the increasing water level in the Everglades and the effects of the high water on wildlife.

Phipps said, "High water in the Everglades can mean trouble for wildlife and especially the fawns and yearling white tailed deer. It is impractical to even consider relocation of a deer herd in an area as vast as the Everglades."

Official action is expected to be taken to establish wildlife management area hunting regulations for the new Three Lakes Ranch area located in Osceola County. The area will be purchased by the state and portions will be open for managed public hunting during the 1974-75 hunting season.

In other action, the Commission will discuss problems relating to the increasing population of alligators. According to Phipps, the Commission is facing a real dilemma with alligator complaints increasing in direct proportion to the population increase. The Commission is fast running out of time to capture nuisance alligators and areas in which to place the captured amphibians.

On Tuesday, September 17, the five member Commission will meet with the administrative and field staff to discuss regular and routine operations. No formal action is taken at the Commission-staff meeting.

According to Phipps, all meetings of the Commission are open, and he extended an invitation to sportsmen and citizens to attend either or both of the meetings.

Meanwhile, our best to you all, and come see us some time.


