
FISH FRY FOR CYPRESS LAKE PANTHERS

All proceeds will go to the uniform fund for the Panther Band and any additional donations will be greatly received.





BARRY M. WEBB APPOINTED GENERAL MGR. FOR SUNDIAL BEACH AND TENNIS RESORT

Barry M. Webb has been appointed general manager for the Sundial Beach and Tennis Resort on Sanibel.

Webb accepted the move to Sundial following two years in administration at the Marco Beach Hotel and seven years in the Bahamas as assistant manager at the Nassau Beach Hotel and the Sheraton British Colonial Hotel. All this expertise is laid on a foundation of training in Paris and London.

Situation on an island tucked into the Gulf of Mexico off Florida's west coast, Sundial is opening additional facilities to accommodate executive seminars, conventions and sales meetings. When completed, Sundial will offer meeting space for more than 900.

Sanibel is world famous for its 15 miles of shelling beach. Half the island has been proclaimed a wildlife preserve.

"Commercial interests and residents both want to maintain this island beauty and strict enforcement of height restrictions means no high rises on Sanibel," he explains. Sundial reaches no more than four stories.

Sundial has seven tennis courts, golf, swimming and fishing off its own private half-mile beach. The resort is easily accessible by car along US 41 or guests may fly into Fort Myers Airport. Shuttle service is provided by Sundial.

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

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A Grain Of Sea Salt by betzi abram



There are a couple of very handsome sailors up in Canada, fantastically intelligent and with superb good taste --- name of Rendall, John and Doris. I've never actually met them, but it's obvious to me that what I say about them must be true because they've written me a great fan letter. And, what is more, with an unerring sense of the way straight to a working woman's heart, they sent a copy to my boss, who was so impressed she's raised my pay 2 sea-biscuits a week.

I'm too modest to tell you exactly what they said --- (hey, don't go way, I'll give you a hint - they used words like terrific, clever, creative!) ooh-hoo-hoo, and I'm just BEAMING.

To tell you the honest truth (before Watergate I never knew there was a dishonest truth, but anyway . . .) their letter arrived just in time to make me hang on a little longer. I was seriously thinking of giving up writing this column (in spite of my fondness for sea hiscuits). Actually, life has gotten just TOO busy for me lately, and when the paper moved its offices and I was trapped in that cardboard box for a week, it was just the last straw. However, their comforting and inspiring letter reached me before I had actually resigned.

Another nice thing about the letter was that in the true tradition of the brotherhood of the sea, Doris has some neat information to share about a helpful booklet she's discovered, called "Meals Ahoy!" She says that it is filled with easy galley fare such as Nautical Nutrition,

Galley 'N Gear, Seafaring Soups, Marina Magic, Skipper's Magic, Navigable Novelties, Dockside Delights, Regatta Day Do-aheads, Galley Wizardry and two all-time mariner favorites Sailor's Gravy and Beach Barbecue Sauce.

Her favorite is Cockpit Chili-ettio for which the ingredients are: ¹/₂ lb. ground beef, 1 small chopped onion, 1 Tb3. shortening, 1 can 11¹/₄ oz.) Campbell's Chili Beef soup, ¹/₅ to ¹/₂ cup water, and 1 can (15 oz.) Franco-American Spaghettios in tomato and cheese sauce.

You brown the beef and cook onion in shortening. Stir to separate meat. Pour off fat and blend in soup and water. Then add spaghettios. Heat, stirring now and then. Makes 2 or 3 servings. It's good served at home as well as aboard, too.

I'll tell you one thing about this recipe. You will never suffer the disaster that came upon a friend of mine who kept insisting that it was possible to make 1-burner, gourmet meals even in a small galley. Finally, someone tired of challenging her and took her up on it. For the great day she decided to make a tantalizing shrimp curry with sour cream sauce and hot rice. With all the necessary ingredients and containers, they took to sea and in a reasonably short time, she had prepared a heavenly smelling sauce, had steamed the rice and was ready to drop the fresh shrimp into boiling water a few minutes before adding them to the sauce.

Meanwhile, a slight wind had come up and a few swells arose. At a crucial moment, she lost her footing and the shrimp scattered all over the cabin. Unfortunately, it was a cabin with little bilge holes to drain out any water that might leak in and naturally, half the shrimp slithered through the little holes into the bigle whence nothing could ever lure them back.

I understand that her friend sold his boat a short time later at a considerable mark-down and stays clear of gourmet cooking to this day even ashore. If you've ever had a dead fish hidden under the spare tire in the trunk of your car (as I have) by some wedding prankstger, you can sympathize with the poor fellow.

As for my friend, I understand she has changed her name and moved to a desert state.


The Community House takes on a new look, with voting booths and ballot box in place.

We, too, are concerned about the condition of these bridges, and you aren't the first to inquire about them, so Department of we contacted the Transportation District Office in Bartow to check on the plans and to see if the projects could be pushed ahead.

Dear J. P.:

We learned, "In your letter you also indicated that you had numerous requests concerning the replacement of bridges along SR 78 at Matlacha and Pine Island. We presently have an item in our budget (No. 114462) to replace bridges 47, 48 and 49 on SR 78. These are the timber bridges in the vicinity of Matlacha.

"We presently have a weight


1975-76 fiscal year as part of our bridge rehabilitation program, however, due to the shortage of funds within the Department caused by inflation of construction project costs and reduced gasoline sales, our bridge rehabilitation program has been greatly curtailed and unless additional funds become available, the referenced projects will more than likely slip to a later year.

"We have presently completed all of the location survey work, however, design on the bridges has not yet begun. Lee County began the design of bridge 48, however, it is my understanding that they have curtailed this activity.

"I promise that we will keep tabs on these projects and do all possible to see that they are started as soon as possible. Thank you for your interest."
