The Reverend Gerard Beauregard has announced that a solemn midnight Mass of celebration will be offered at St. Isabel's Roman Catholic Church, Sanibel-Captiva Road, on Christmas Eve, Tuesday, December 24.


On Christmas morning, three Masses will be offered at 8:30 a.m., 10:00 a.m., and 11:30 a.m. The 5:30 p.m. Mass of obligation, formerly offered on Saturday evenings, and on evenings prior to holy days, will be cancelled on Christmas Eve.

The four Masses will climax the month-long preparatory observance of

the holy Season of Advent begun the first week in December with the lighting of the first of four candles adorning the Advent wreath which will remain on the altar until Christmas Eve.

To prepare parishioners for the Christmas Mass, Father Beauregard will conduct a Penitental Rite on Saturday, December 21, at 4:00 p.m., followed by the regular Saturday evening Mass at 5:30 p.m.

Following the Christmas Masses, a seasonal and expanded schedule will be in effect until after Easter: Saturdays, Mass of obligation at 5:30 p.m., Sunday




FOR ALL THE PEOPLE OF SANIBEL:




