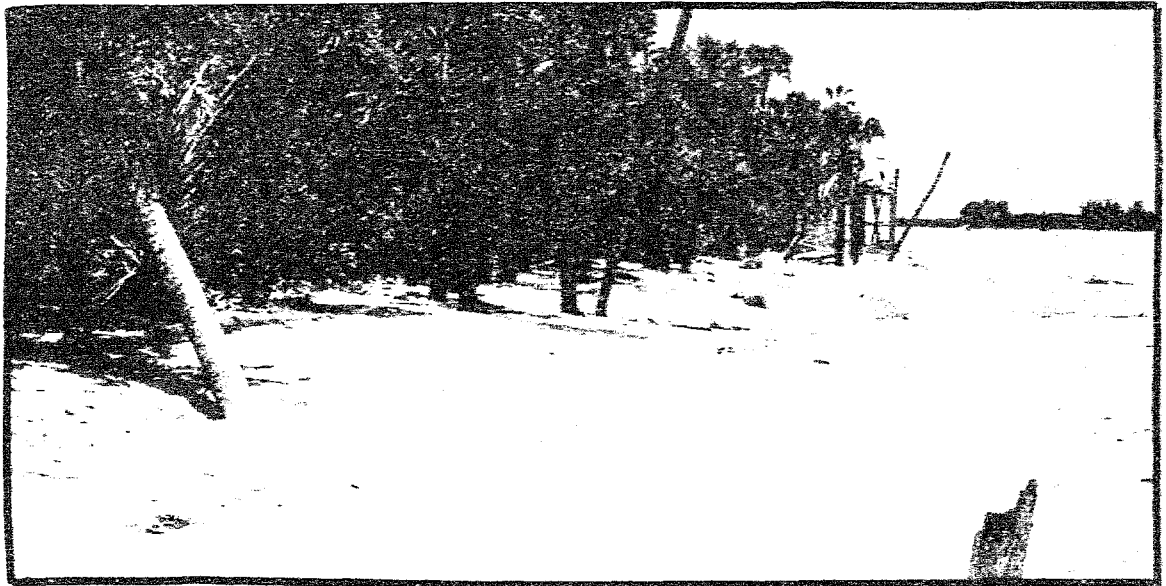

## Out-Island Ferry Service Contemplated



The state cabinet recently agreed to purchase portions of remote Upper Captiva and Cayo Costa Islands, and a newly proposed ferry boat may soon make these beautiful barrier beaches accessible to the general public.

Last week, Phil and Roberta Kinsey of Fort Myers announced their plans to begin operating a ferry service between mainland Lee County and the remote barrier islands in Pine Island Sound between Captiva Island and Gasparilla Island, or Boca Grande.

Their proposal involves a 34-foot long pontoon craft called the Island Traveller, weighing some 17 tons or more. For a round-trip fee of perhaps \$5 for adults and \$3 for children, the Kinseys hope to take day trippers from Bokeelia on Pine Island to Upper Captiva, where the Kinseys have a second home. Cayo Costa, Boca Grande, and back, for a day of fun in the surf on some of the seldom-seen beaches of Lee County.

Other islands being considered for inclusion in the tour include privately-owned Cabbage Key in Pine Island east of Cayo Costa and the northern tip of Captiva Island near South Seas Plantation. At the present time, Upper Captiva, Cayo Costa, and Cabbage Key are accessible only by boat or airplane, and getting to Boca Grande by automobile involves such a long drive up through Charlotte County that few Lee Countyans have ever seen it.

To realize their dream, the Kinseys must obtain a franchise to operate a commercial vessel in Lee County from the Board of County Commissioners. The Kinseys approached the commission with their proposal last Wednesday, at which time the board directed their staff to schedule a public hearing on the matter to consider drafting an ordinance which would grant the Kinseys their franchise. The Island Traveller has already been inspected by the U.S. Coast Guard and approved for a maximum carrying capacity of 40 passengers.



With the recent cabinet approval of the state purchase of portions of Upper Captiva and Cayo Costa under the Environmentally Endangered Lands Program, much of those two islands are soon to become public lands. Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation Director Dick Workman, who spearheaded the Environmentally Endangered Lands purchase, told the ISLANDER last week that he was apprehensive about the initiation of a ferry service to the two islands before the state has time to finalize the purchase and evolve a management program for the property.

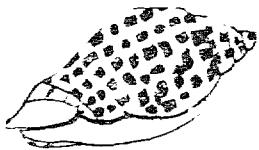
If the Kinseys get their franchise, it will mark the first time since the Sanibel ferry stopped running in 1963 that a commercial passenger transport has disturbed the waters of Pine Island Sound.

## Shands Denies Vested Rights

The young City of Sanibel last week won its second lawsuit since incorporation, as Circuit Judge Thomas Shands ruled that plaintiffs Gordon Tracey and Velna Ridge had no equitable grounds for estoppel of the density allocations imposed upon their 22-acre site by the city's comprehensive land use plan (CLUP).

Velna Ridge and her son, Gordon Tracey, had originally planned to erect a 95-unit travel trailer park, and were on the verge of beginning the work under the old Lee County

zoning regulations when the city incorporated and placed a moratorium on building on the Island while a comprehensive plan to regulate growth within the city was drawn up.

The CLUP as finally adopted on July 19 of this year carried a .3 density allocation for the site, located on Dunlop Road north of Periwinkle Way, a substantial decrease in zoning from the 4.4 density which they needed to effect their plans and which the previous Lee County zoning for the property allowed them. Thus, as they saw it, they had no recourse but the judiciary.

Last Friday, however, Judge Shands upheld the use restrictions placed upon their property by the City of Sanibel, saying that the plaintiffs had no vested right to carry out their plans on the basis of what Lee County had allowed them in the past. The trial, in which Sanibel Mayor Porter Goss testified on behalf of the city, was held in Fort Myers beginning last Wednesday.

Veina Ridge had no comment to make following last Friday's ruling, and was reluctant to state whether or not the decision would be appealed. Gordon Tracey could not be reached for comment prior to the ISLANDER's deadline.

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
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# You might well ask

What with all of the last-minute changes, revisions, and refinements that were made in the comprehensive land use plan (CLUP) for the City of Sanibel during those hectic weeks of intensive workshop sessions

on the document prior to its adoption on July 19, it seems that many Islanders are confused as to what they can and cannot do under the plan.

Contrary to certain allegations made against

the city concerning the rights of small lot owners, the CLUP as adopted by the city council allows anyone who owned one single-family lot in a modern platted subdivision on the Island prior to July 2, 1976 to

build a home on their land, with certain presumably rare exceptions. For example, if your lot happens to be entirely under water, or in some other way obviously unsuitable for development, the chances

are slim that the city will issue you a building permit. Permit applications will be handled on a case by case basis as they come in to City Hall, and according to Mayor Porter Goss, the plan is relatively flexible with respect to the owners of one single-family lot. You must, however, abide by all of the performance standards

contained in the CLUP.

So, if you are the owner of one single-family lot on Sanibel and have become alarmed by certain rumors you've heard of late, please inquire of the Building Department at City Hall with respect to the status of your lot before raising your voice in outrage.



Traffic has been slowed on West Gulf Drive crews from Koehler Construction installed new power poles.



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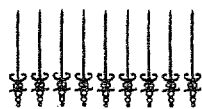
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## police report

# With a pinch of salt. . .

This week while our editor takes a much needed rest, the advertising department decided to get together and come up with a recipe for entertaining friends on a lazy summer day. To start with, I came across some beautiful beef short ribs from Sam's Meat & Provisions. Then I looked around for something that would be a little different, and here are the delicious results.

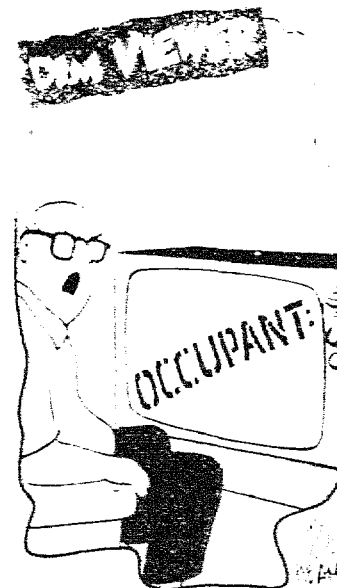
Take 3 lbs. of short ribs, 1/4 cup bacon drippings, 2 tbsp. flour, 1 tsp. salt, 1/4 cup

water, 1/4 cup white vinegar, 1 cup unsweetened pineapple juice, 1 tbsp. soy sauce, 1 cup diced green peppers and 1 cup pineapple chunks, 1/2 cup sugar and 1 cup onions. Cut the ribs into serving pieces and brown in bacon drippings in a skillet. Cover and bake at 375 until beef is tender, pour off fat. Mix the sugar, flour and salt with water in a saucepan until smooth. Add the vinegar, pineapple juice and soy sauce and cook until slightly thickened. Add the onion, green

pepper and pineapple and pour over the ribs. Cover and bake for 15 minutes or longer.

This will feed six to eight people depending on how hungry they are. A nice thing about this is that you can fix it ahead and sit back and enjoy your company.

On a day-in, day-out basis few cocktails can surpass that old Florida summertime standby, the Salty Dog. The Salty Dog merely requires moistening a sour glass and rubbing the rim of the glass in salt. 

# Sanibel Marina Expanding

The Sanibel Marina, located on North Yachtsman Drive at the Island's east end, has undergone considerable renovation in the twelve months since Island visitor Fred Fuhrer and Island realtor Ralph Call purchased it from original owner Bill Way, a character of some renown here on the Islands prior to his departure last year.

Since the final closing of

the deal last July, the marina has been almost completely redone—no trifling matter, according to present manager Russ Mattson. For openers, showers and septic tanks were installed to accommodate live-aboard boaters, the old electrical wiring was wholly replaced, new gas tanks and plumbing were installed, and the old docks were substantially

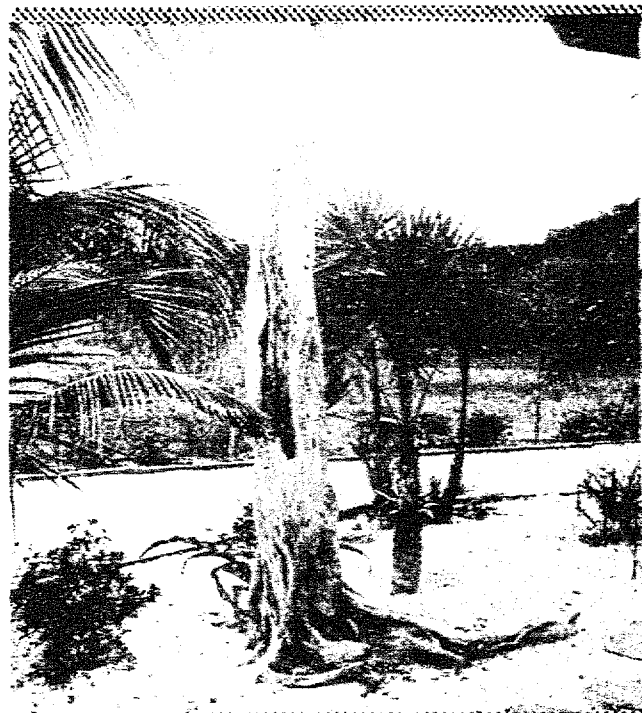
repaired and extended to create more dock space at the marina, which remains the only deep water marina on Sanibel at the present time.

What's more, the Sanibel Marina now has a license to sell beer for off-premises consumption, and currently offers all the bait, tackle, and fishing supplies that the complete angler will ever need.

But the renovation is in no way complete as of yet, according to manager Mattson. Future plans for the marina include the rebuilding of the existing boat ramp later this summer and the construction of a boat repair shop and fresh fish market, to be completed by next summer, if all goes well. Eventually, Russ Mattson hopes to carry a line of new boats and motors for sale at the marina.

Prior to the recent renovation of the Sanibel Marina, it was little more than a fish shack. Mattson told us, with just a couch, some magazines, and a small bait operation. The marina was built by Bill Way some twenty years ago or more, although the original building was blown away in a tornado in which the marina clerk of the time lost his life.

Fred Fuhrer of Jamestown, New York, a visitor to the Islands for over eight years now, first got interested in the venture through Island fishing guide Ted Cole, with whom Fuhrer used to fish while on vacation out of Tarpon Bay Marina. Cole knew that Fuhrer was looking for a business on the Islands with which to occupy himself following his retirement,

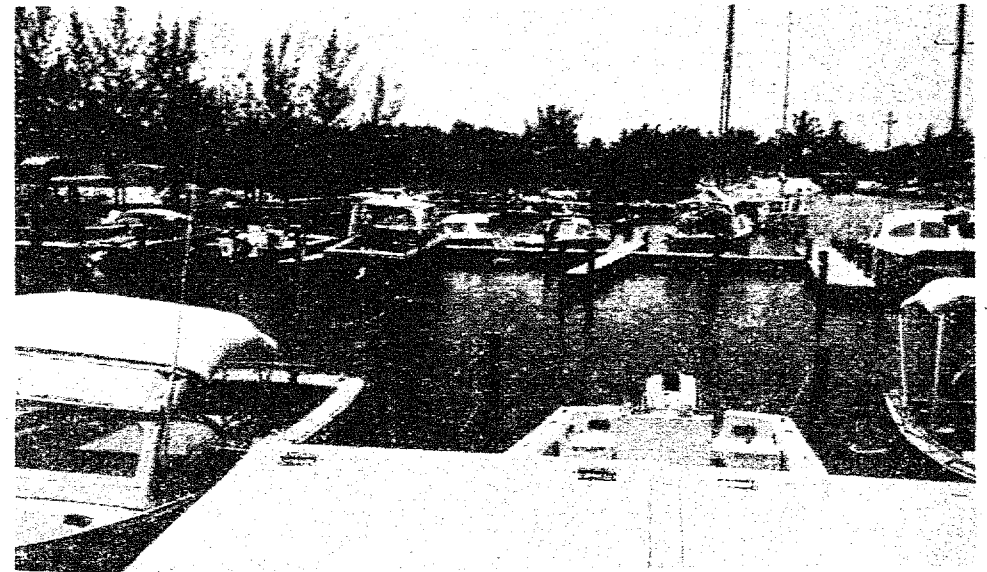

and suggested the Sanibel Marina. With the aid of Sanibel realtor Ralph Call, who became a partner in the venture, the purchase was finalized after lengthy contract negotiations and the renovation begun. Ted Cole, by the way, is now the top fishing guide out of Sanibel Marina.

Russ Mattson assumed the managerial post at the

marina last October and has stayed on to oversee the renovation and expansion of the facilities. A native of the Boston area, Mattson originally came to Florida in hopes of pursuing his favorite hobby, dirt-biking, year round, but since discovering the Islands and the Sanibel Marina, he seems to find very little time for his chosen sport. Russ

now lives on a houseboat docked at the marina, which, he protests, is far more economical than renting an apartment on the Island.

"We plan to keep it a small, friendly marina," said Mattson. "One thing you need if you live on an island is a good marina, and that's what we're trying to make here."

# Interior Wetlands Sought for Preservation

Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation Director Dick Workman was elated a few weeks back upon receiving a phone call from Charlie Smith of the Division of Parks and Creation Land Acquisition Department in Tallahassee with the news that Sanibel property owner John Sawbridge was desirous of selling his 55-acre tract of land across from the Sanibel Elementary School.

The Conservation Foundation, under the Directorship of Roy Bazire, had previously tried to negotiate a purchase of the property back in 1972 with funds from the State and National Audubon Society. On that occasion, the deal fell through because Sawbridge did not want to sell his interior wetland acreage, and \$120,000 of state matching funds earmarked for the purchase was diverted to other uses in Florida, much to the Conservation Foundation's chagrin.

The property offered by Sawbridge is actually in two tracts, a 40-acre parcel located south of the elementary school and another 15 acres, some 53 lots and unplatted areas, in the Sanibel Highlands subdivision in the Sanibel River corridor. The larger parcel abuts the 180-acre Goebel tract of interior wetlands already in State ownership and another 28-acre tract of wetlands purchased by the Conservation Foundation and held by the Nature Conservancy.

Both parcels are important components of the interior wetland system of Sanibel, according to the Conservation Foundation. The 40-acre tract is of special value in that it is relatively undisturbed and includes a natural slough running north-south through the property. The slough has been connected to the Sanibel River by a mosquito control channel, which is navigable by canoe and

provides a unique tour of the interior wetland environment. Narrow shell ridges run through the property near the Sanibel-Captiva Road, providing habitat for cabbage palm hammocks, saw palmetto, and a variety of West Indian trees and shrubs, which diversity of vegetation in turn accounts for diverse wildlife inhabitants and visitors.

The Sanibel Highlands property includes one of the most interesting stretches of the Sanibel River and wetlands and is often used by canoeists because of its natural beauty and abundance of wildlife, even though it is near the densely developed area of the Island. Lying on both sides of the river channel, the property is dominated by mangroves at the water's edge and grades into buttonwood as the elevation increases slightly. The trees in the area provide an important nesting area for herons, egrets, anhinga, and

other bird species, while alligators are also known to utilize the protection of dense vegetation in the area for their nests.

The fact that much development exists in the middle part of the Island already and more is anticipated makes protection of a green corridor along the river even more important, the Conservation Foundation contends. Their report goes on to state that in addition to preserving wildlife habitats, the vegetated corridor will filter and polish runoff from nearby developed areas before it reaches the Sanibel River and water table aquifer.

But now that Sawbridge is willing to sell his land, there are no funds available for the acquisition. Land

acquisition efforts by the Conservation Foundation have already brought about 600 acres of wetland areas under protective ownership, but in so doing, the Foundation has incurred a considerable debt and does not consider it prudent to extend this debt for major purchases of land. Nor do state officials seem to know where the money for the purchase will come from, although the negotiations are proceeding in Tallahassee, according to Workman.

"I'm not nearly so excited about it as I was before I went to Tallahassee," Workman told the ISLANDER last week. "The whole thing seems to be pretty much up in the air."

The Conservation

Foundation is, however, strongly urging the state to make the purchase, as is the Sanibel City Council, which passed a resolution endorsing the acquisition at their last regular meeting on July 20.

"All that we can do now is wait," said Workman.



## Chamber notes

The following are excerpts from a speech given to the Sanibel Lions Club by Walter Klie of the Sanibel-Captiva Chamber of Commerce on the night of July 21. We thought that they might be interesting to our readership inasmuch as they outline the role and goals of the Chamber of Commerce within our Island community:

"What is a Chamber of Commerce? It is a voluntary organization of the business community, uniting business and professional individuals in a central agency to improve business and build a better community. A Chamber of Commerce is people, all people who share the desire to improve their community, and a Chamber of Commerce should organize the energies of those who believe in the welfare of their community. The strength of the Chamber lies in its membership, from which ideas, energy, and finances can be drawn.

"The main responsibility of the Chamber is the community's well being. There are three ways to meet this responsibility: 1) examine the community needs to determine what must be done to make it a better place in which to live and do business; 2) help channel community resources to fill those needs; and 3) organize and develop leadership which will permit the Chamber to become an effective force in the community.

"The economic well being of our community depends on tourists. Thus, if we are to continue to attract tourists, it is essential that we preserve and protect our natural resources that bring tourists to our Islands.

IN this, I refer to the quality of our beaches, our recreational waters for boating, swimming and fishing, and our wildlife and shelling. Without these, there would be no visitors, no business community, and no Chamber. Therefore, it should be very obvious why your Chamber of Commerce is dedicated to preserving the natural resources of our Islands.

"To this end, our ongoing program directs its attention to the following areas: land use planning, occupational license fees, a Gulf Drive thruway, sewage and water management facilities, Causeway toll books, and sign ordinances. Our recently accomplished program called for the remodeling of the Chamber to accommodate the demands of the 1,000 to 1,200 visitors who visit our offices daily in search of accommodations, restaurants, shops, boat rentals, and etc.

"And by the way, the Chamber-supported 'First Island Open Fishing Derby' was a smashing success and will be an annual event hereafter."

The Sanibel-Captiva Chamber of Commerce is currently working on a "Things-to-do on the Islands" brochure, to be included in the Chamber's maps of the Islands, which are distributed free to Island visitors. The Chamber currently sends out between four- and five-hundred such maps each week to those who have requested them by mail.

The Chamber has gained twenty-five new members since June 14 of this year, Walter Klie reports.

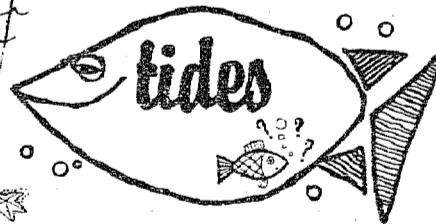
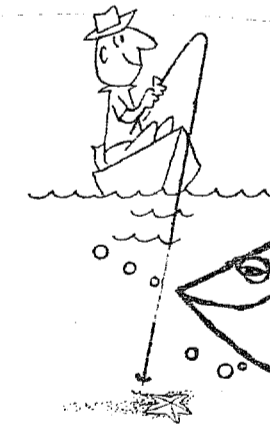

Conversion table: The above tides are for the lighthouse point of Sanibel only. To convert for Redfish Pass (north tip of Captiva), add 55 minutes to the time shown for every hi tide, and subtract two (2) minutes for every low tide. (NO, we don't know why, but it works. Instructions following are even less sense-sical but, as we stated, they do work.)

For Captiva Island, Gulf side, subtract 30 minutes from each high tide, and subtract 1 hour and 16 minutes for each low tide.

For Captiva Island, Pine Island Sound (bay) side, add 1 hour and four (4) minutes for each high tide, and add 52 minutes for each low tide.

In between these points on gulf or bay --- guesstimate --- and have good fishing and - or shelling.

## News & editorial notes

### Williams sentenced

Lee County Circuit Judge James Adams last week sentenced Bret Taylor Williams, 23, of East Fort Myers to serve one year in Lee County jail and pay a fine of \$1,000 for the January holdup of the Casa Del Mama Restaurant here on Sanibel. Williams was convicted of grand larceny early in July.

In June, Sanibel Patrolman Ray Rhodes received the coveted "Lawman of the Month" award sponsored by the Fort Myers News Press for his part in bringing Williams to justice.

### Naves aid accident victim

Sanibel Fire Chief Allen Nave and his son, Chuck, achieved hero status late last week by coming to the aid of nine-year-old William Fowler of Fort Myers, who was struck by a car while riding his bicycle on Marion Street near Shady Oaks Park. The Naves, who were practicing softball in a field nearby, were the first to arrive at the scene of the accident, where they found the injured boy unconscious and the driver of the car, Mary Deriso of Fort Myers, in shock.

The Naves, both of whom had taken advanced First Aid courses, checked the boy for serious injuries and then moved him to higher ground to await the arrival of an ambulance.

The boy's condition was listed as "very serious" by Lee Memorial Hospital officials following the accident last Thursday night.



### False killer whales improving

Sea World officials in custody of the four surviving false killer whales that beached themselves on Captiva and Upper Captiva Islands in the vicinity of Redfish Pass on July 22 reported last week that the mammals were schooling, feeding, and beginning to show signs of adapting to their new captive environment, although the condition of the whales was still listed as "guarded."

Although no conclusive reports have come in to explain the mysterious series of whale and dolphin beachings along Florida's

southern Gulf Coast in recent weeks, scientists are still working on the theory that parasites are responsible for the mammals' disinclination to feed. The stomachs of both the 25 spinner dolphins that died near Sarasota and the one false killer whale that died on Captiva were found to be devoid of nourishment.

Another larger school of roughly 30 false killer whales beached themselves on Loggerhead Key in the Dry Tortugas early last week. Efforts to herd the school back out into the sea by Sea World rescuers proved effective, and the whales were sighted heading out into the Atlantic later in the week.

### White to retire

Sanibel Planning Commissioner Duane White announced last week that he would resign as chairman of the commission within a few weeks. At that time, vice-chairman Ann Winterbotham will assume the chairmanship until such time as a new chairman can be elected by the commission, following the procedures outlined for the planning commission in the city charter.

Although White will be abdicating the chairmanship, he will continue to serve on the commission until his term of office expires in January.

The resignation announcement came as a surprise to very few, inasmuch as Chairman White announced that he would step down following the adoption of a comprehensive land use plan for the city at the time of his reelection to the post last January.

### CLUP Seminar Wednesday

The Sanibel Planning Commission announced last week that they will hold a public seminar on the city's comprehensive land use plan at the Sanibel Community Center on Wednesday, August 11, beginning at 8:00 p.m.

Members of the planning commission, city planning director Sam Shannon, and city consulting attorney Fred Bosselman will be on hand to explain the elements of the plan, explain the Development Intensity Map, Ecological Zones Map and Permitted Uses Map, and to answer questions from the public concerning the land use plan, except for those relating to specific cases.

All Islanders who are in doubt as to what the plan means to them are particularly urged to attend.

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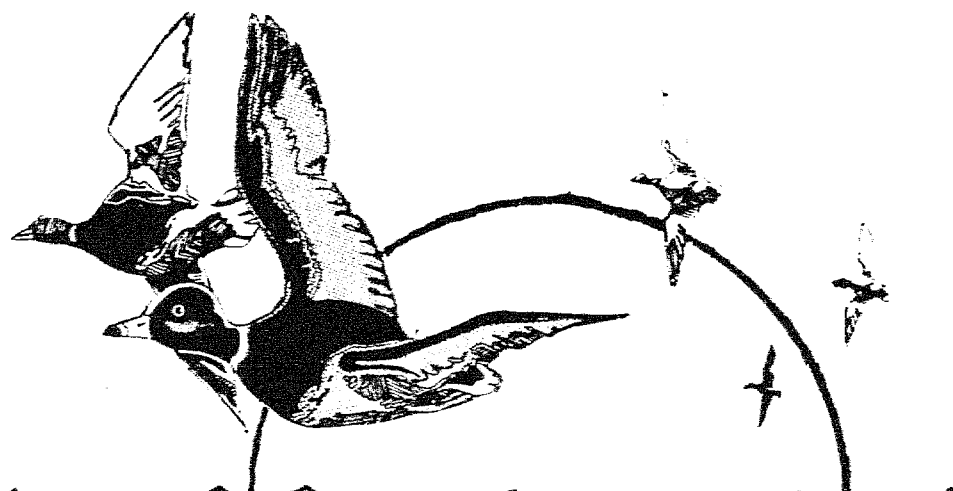

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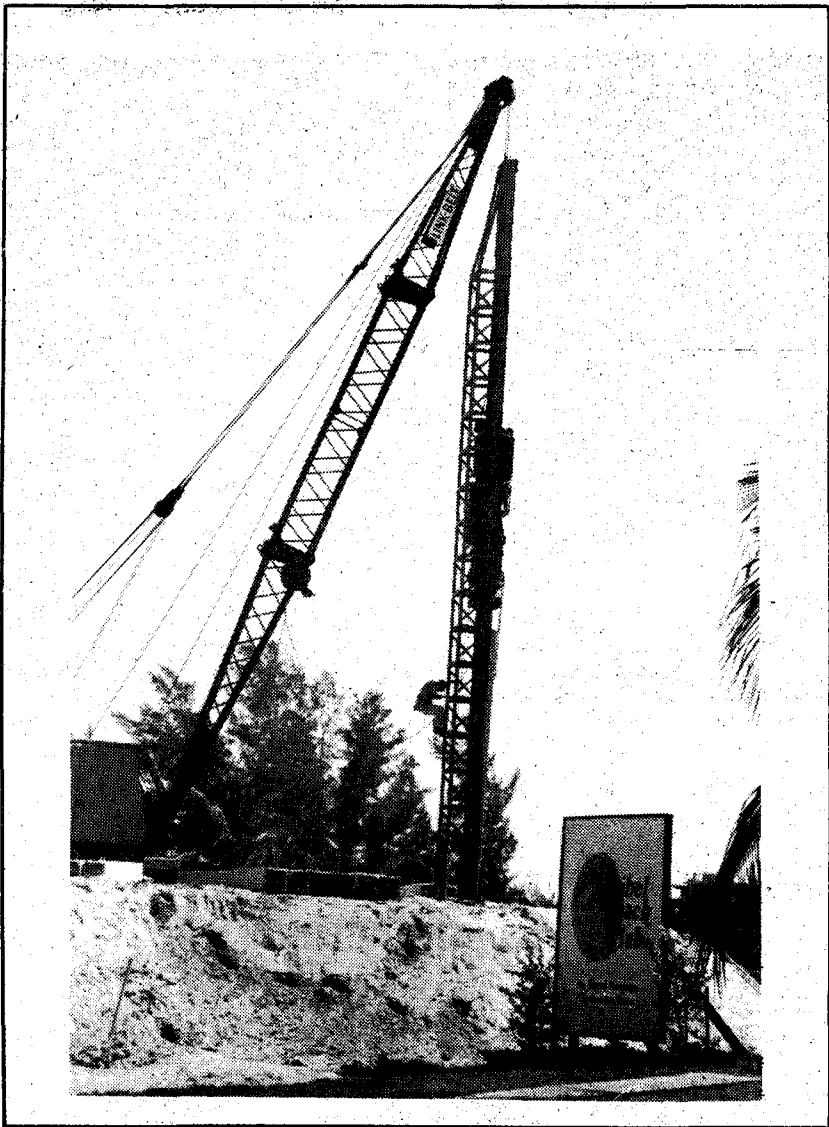

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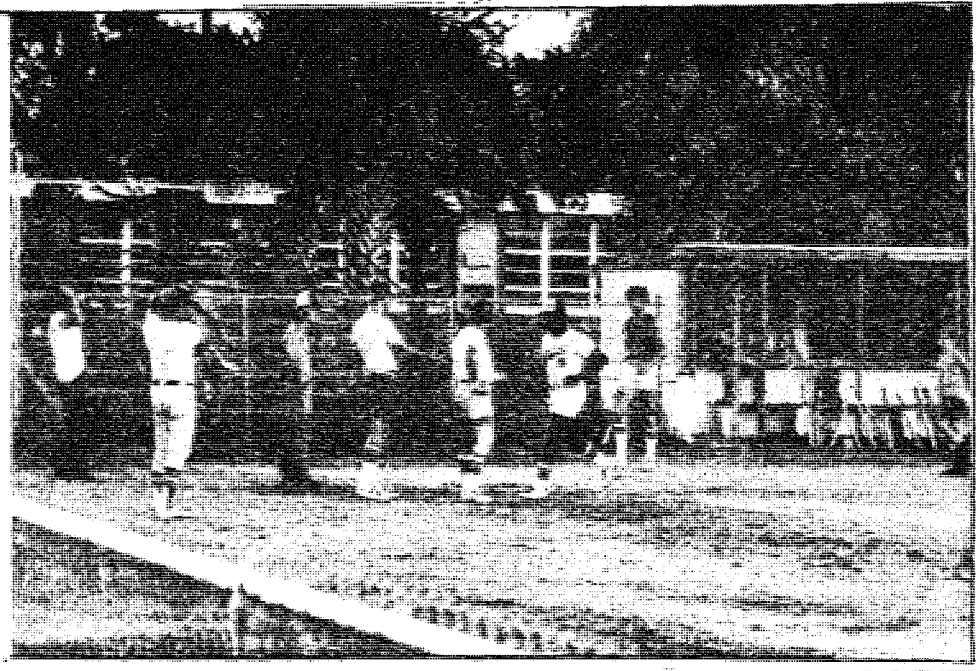

## Duck Stamp Contest Opens

Island wildlife artists take note! The annual "Duck Stamp" contest for wildlife art to adorn next year's Migratory Bird Hunting and Conservation Stamp was opened on July 15.

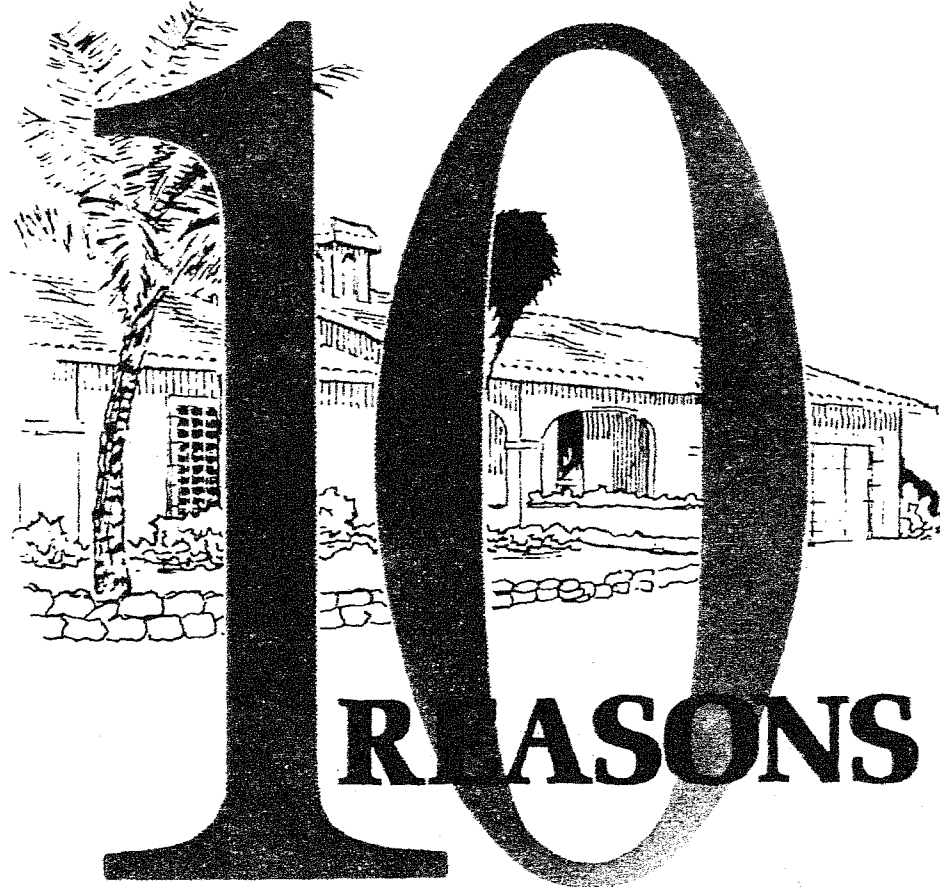
The Migratory Bird Hunting Stamp was authorized and was required by the Migratory Bird Hunting Stamp Act of 1934. The stamp's name was changed last year to include the word, Conservation. Popularly known as the "Duck Stamps," they are sold through post offices and must be carried by every migratory waterfowl hunter

over 16 years of age. All of the stamp revenues, beyond printing and handling costs, are used solely for the acquisition of additional habitat for ducks and geese.

Prior to 1949, wildlife artists were commissioned to provide the design for the annual stamp. Since that time, the design has been chosen by a contest open to all artists who are residents or citizens of the United States. The prestige of winning the contest has enhanced the reputations of established artists and has elevated otherwise unknown artists to public acclaim.

Artists interested in submitting an entry should write to the Director, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, ATTN: Audio Visual Office, Washington, D.C. 20240 for copies of the contest rules and an entry form. The regulations describe the technical specifications for designs created for the contest, the procedures to be followed in submitting an entry, the qualifications and selection of the judging panel, the criteria to be used in scoring the various entries submitted, and the voting procedures to be employed by the judging panel.

Entries will be accepted from now until no later than midnight, October 15. Only one entry per person will be accepted.

## "For the dead travel fast"

... from Burger's "Lenore"

As unaccustomed as I am to indulging myself in this way, I cannot contain my indignation at the fact that one of the great lesser masterpieces of horrific cinematography was aired in Lee County for a full week without receiving even the least mention from local art critics and journalists. Let alone the acclaim which it so justly deserves. By this, I am referring to what was perhaps the most prominent low-budget horror classic to be produced in the mid-sixties, "Night of the Living Dead," which appeared last week at the Southside Drive-In on Cleveland Avenue in the company of three other would-be celluloid shockers of lesser repute.

For those of you (and I know there are many) who might think the art of horror movies a more fitting topic of discussion for children and paranoid spinsters than for serious minded journalists like myself, let me be the first to say to you "nay." No self-respecting student of the human psyche can afford to overlook the dark areas of man's subconscious mind, and what is a horror movie if not an artistic representation of one man's innermost hidden fears and cultural or archetypal phobias come to life. The horror film is in essence the world of nightmares superimposed upon the world of reality, and it is perhaps this nightmarish quality of science fiction or monster movies that has so captivated modern movie-goers ever since the release of the silent classic, "The Cabinet of Doctor Caligari," in the 1920's.

Who among us has not seen Lugosi as "Dracula," Karloff as "Frankenstein," or Lon Chaney as "The Werewolf" and not enjoyed the performances despite himself, and despite the obvious preposterousness of the characters which they portrayed? In literary circles, the tale of terror has been an accepted genre ever since E.A. Poe published his macabre fantasies, symbolic of the dark, hidden recesses of the soul. Over the centuries, other artists have dabbled in

the same vein with lesser or greater degrees of success and excellence, among them authors, painters, poets, film-makers and dramatists as diverse as Lord Byron and Roman Polanski. In fact, so much occult art has been produced over the years that the last few decades have been witness to the introduction of courses in Gothic art at many reputable American colleges and universities, such as Brown and Harvard, for instance.

"Night of the Living Dead" was a very, very low-budget production, filmed on location in the rural areas surrounding Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, of all places, and as such, it escaped the sort of over-production that characterized many of the horror films which have come out of Hollywood in recent years. For openers, the film was shot in black and white, rendering it more stark, more gruesome, and even more realistic than it would have been in color, especially when one considers that virtually all of the action takes place at night.

Furthermore, "Night of the Living Dead" employs one of the most popular, fascinating, and universal of horror motifs: the motif of the animated corpse (or vampire, in most cases). Historians have found a belief in the "undead" and some sort of vampire myths in almost every primitive society, which has led some experts to theorize that all human beings have such innate beliefs on the subconscious level even to the present day. In his "Natural History of the Vampire," Anthony Masters says of the phenomenon: "Its origins are rooted at the beginning of time and almost all of them are founded on superstition, later swelling to massive proportions with the advent of Christianity." He goes on to call this superstitious belief "one of the most demonic outbreaks of mass hysteria ever to sweep the world."

At any rate, "Night of the Living Dead" takes the vampire myth one step further by coupling it with the age old taboo of cannibalism, such that its revitalized cadavers leave their graves not only to feed upon the



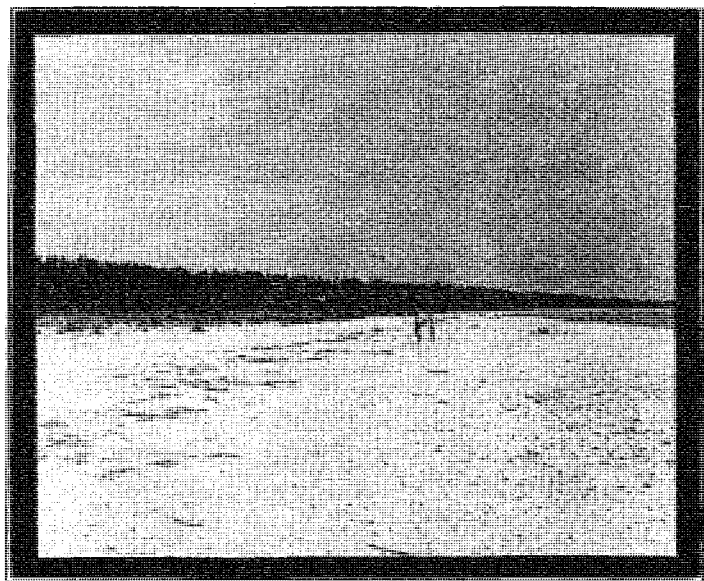
blood of the living but to devour their entrails as well. It was this aspect of the drama more than anything else which made the film so shocking, and hence, popular, when it was first released. In "Night of the Living Dead," the cannibalism is not merely implied, or suggested, but revoltingly explicit, and the brave viewer can see a gruesome array of zombies in their cerements munching lustily on remarkably lifelike pieces of human flesh, if he cares to watch.

In the era of "The Exorcist," it is hard to believe that simple flesh-eaters in black and white could shock anyone, but in the late sixties, many people thought it an outrage. Needless to say, "Night of the Living Dead" was, and still is, repulsive, a sublimely repulsive film, and may have been in part responsible for turning the trend in horror

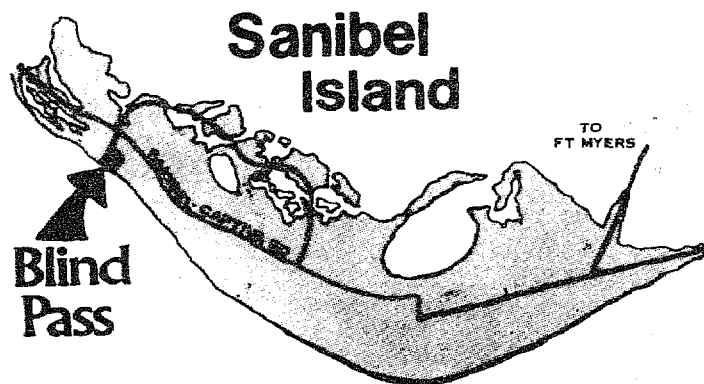
movies away from the tired sort of melodramas that proliferated in the wake of "Frankenstein," "Dracula," and the other first generation horror classics.

For one, can only wonder why the appearance of "Night of the Living Dead" in the Fort Myers areas was not more fittingly heralded in the local media, and why the directors of the Southside Drive-In gave it bottom billing with such vapid efforts as "2000 Maniacs Crazed With Blood" and "Children Shouldn't Play with Dead Things." Am I to understand that Lee County film entrepreneurs can do no better than this by their resident Gothophiles, who only desire, in the immortal words of Frank Zappa, "a little more cheapness, please!"?

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# Continuing Escapades of CR-1718



For those who read our story, "A Trip With Caretta's Paul Zajicek," in the July 20 issue of the ISLANDER and were sympathetic to the lot of a loggerhead turtle known as CR-1718, we have good news for you.

CR-1718, as we were told and as we reported to you, is a turtle that has been observed on the Island since the late 1960's. Time and time again she has attempted to nest on Sanibel beaches to no effect, inasmuch as her lack of a rear flipper and part of her carapace, presumably from a shark bite in her youth, has rendered her incapable of laying eggs. Or so we thought.

But by the grace of God, Mother Nature, or whatever local numina you prefer to worship, we are more than happy to be able to publish a

correction to the sad saga of CR-1718.



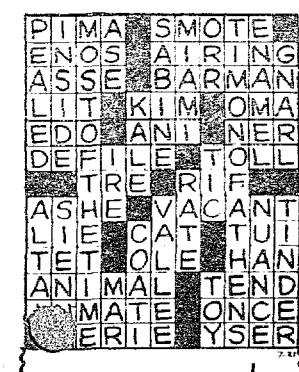
