## workshop on proposed interval ownership and high impact units held

An informal meeting was held Friday afternoon so the Planning Department and Commission members could receive some public input about a proposed ordinance that would place certain restrictions on interval ownership and condominium units over 600 square feet available for rental.

According to Planning Director Bruce Rogers, the objective of the meeting was to hear various comments on the ordinance and interval ownership so "I may leave here today with a better understanding of what the issues really are."

Mayor Zee Butler, who authored the ordinance, maintains that it tracks the state legislation which is due to go into effect in late 1979 in that it controls the conversion of existing units into interval ownership units without the consent of 100 percent of the condominium owners agreeing.

The Sanibel ordinance also provides however, that any condominium containing units of more than 600 square feet and available for rental for less than a three-month period of time considered "high impact" and that there must be 10,000 square feet of open space for each such unit.

Richard Dennis, vice-president of Finance and Acquisition for Captran, Inc., an interval ownership corporation based in Sanibel, asked, "If the intent of the ordinance is to lower or to change the density, then there is a density change being made without specifically saying so." He pointed out that, as the ordinance now reads, a one-acre parcel of land now zoned at five units per acre, would require 50,000 square feet of open space on a piece of land that only contains a total of 43,560 square feet. "In order to be able to utilize the allowable density of five units per acre, you have to have 9.7 acres," he added.

Councilman Duane White told the audience that he had always understood that even if a density of five units to the acre is allowed under the Plan, the Planning Commission can say that it is too high or incompatible with the area. He also went on to say that nowhere in Sanibel's land use plan is there a definition of recreation. "Section 7 of this ordinance attempts to define recreations and it includes the word 'beach'. 'We take beach to mean to be that portion of the beach seaward of the mean high tide line,' he said, recommending that should be made clearer.

A discussion ensued about the situation where single family homes are rented out regularly or where two or more families purchase a home and whether that qualifies as interval

ownership. Bruce Rogers agreed that it wasn't the ownership of a piece of property that was of potential concern but rather its use.

Mariner Properties president Bob Taylor pointed out that he felt the ordinance should be broken into two pieces of legislation: one dealing with the definition and impact of high impact units and the other concerning interval ownership definitions.

"I have a concern that public bodies need to know what they're talking about before they do it. Interval ownership has been around for years," he added, "but we stayed out if it because we waited for the product to mature." Taylor recommended that, because of the potential of rip-offs by unscrupulous developers and because of the possible national impact of the Sanibel ordinance that more than the usual public hearing should be scheduled, before the final decision is made.

Rogers outlined two potential concerns that he had about interval ownership.

"In the first place, it is likely to have 100 percent year-round occupancy," he said, "and, secondly, the number of persons occupying that unit might exceed the usual.

Taylor disagreed. "One is true and one isn't," he said. "The two-bedroom

## county puts COTI proposal on ballot

At last Thursday's City Council-Planning Commission workshop to discuss the Committee of the Islands (COTI) rate of growth proposal, the City Council concluded that the COTI proposal for limited growth would be a ballot issue in the November election. The Council vote was unanimous.

While many considered the meeting would permit public input, as evidenced by the considerable number of islanders in attendance, City Attorney Neal Bowen advised that the proposal might be invalidated should any changes be made at this time. The initiative petition was signed by 751 registered voters and thus must go before the voters in its present form. As councilman Goss pointed out, however, "City Council can amend it through normal amendment proceedings if it is deemed necessary."

The proposal limits new dwelling units on Sanibel to 180 units per year and the majority of council members expressed their support of the measure while suggesting, however, that the

## island power outage monday

A power outage that lasted from 3:55 a.m. Monday until 10:15 a.m. the same morning sent Sanibel residents into pools for their morning ablutions and scurrying for flashlights.

The outage was caused by a limb from a wild rubber tree falling on a high voltage power line, snapping the line in two, according to Bill Francis, director of operations for Lee County Electric Cooperative. The outage extended, with few exceptions, from the Lighthouse up to Palm Ridge Road.

The lengthy delay in isolating the cause of the trouble was attributed to faulty radio communications and the density of the area where the downed limb lay.

The source of the trouble was traced to a tree next to the Kona Kai Motel on

Periwinkle Way, Francis told the ISLANDER. Because of the foliage and the color of the wires, it was very difficult to see them, he explained.

"Lee County crews are continually at work cutting off tree limbs that might pose problems," Francis said, adding that, in some cases property owners object to having their trees trimmed. "We try to keep up with it by returning more often when this happens, but it sometimes gets away from us."

Francis said that a post-mortem was scheduled for last night when the crews returned to see if any different action could be taken to prevent another lengthy outage. "Hindsight is always 20-20," Francis said, "but this method of review helps in that our crews will be better trained the next time."

## state supreme court sets date for Sanibel causeway refinancing case

The battle that Lee County has been waging for over two years will finally be heard by the Florida Supreme Court on October 19 at 9:30 a.m.

The County is hopeful that the high court will overturn a ruling by Lee County Circuit Court last December that invalidated the proposed sale of \$18 million in bonds, to be repaid by the revenues from the Causeway tolls. The City of Sanibel has entered the case as amicus curiae (friend of the court.).

Each side has 20 minutes to present its case, according to City Attorney Neal Bowen. "Whether or not the city

should take part of that 20 minutes is yet to be decided," he said yesterday.

The projects that the County is requesting the month for include:

- Four-laning McGregor Blvd. from the toll booth to College Parkway.

- Construction of State Road 869 from McGregor Blvd. at the Shell Point Village area through to Cypress Lake Drive and four-laning Cypress Lake from that road to U.S. 41.

- Four-laning Gladiolus Drive from State 869 to U.S. 41.

The City of Sanibel proposes to improve 11 road projects and purchase other property for a total of \$4,055,000.

The Supreme Court decided in May, 1977 that the then-proposed projects did not affect the causeway itself and the monies could not be used for those proposals, with the one qualification that if the County could prove that a significant amount of the traffic on those roads used the causeway, then they would reverse their decision.

The County Commissioners hired an

outside consultant to conduct traffic studies of the traffic on the proposed roads and redefined their proposal to three projects.

Those projects (listed above) were denied in December of last year in Lee County Circuit Court by Judge Thomas Shands and it is the appeal of that decision that will be finally heard this month.

Island.




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# services held for motorcycle accident victim

Services were held on Sunday, October 1 for Bradford Stanley Barry of Sanibel who was killed in a motorcycle accident last Friday evening.

Barry, a partner in Island Resales and Punta Rassa Landing, Inc., was travelling on his motorcycle at what the Florida Highway Patrol (FHP)

termed an excessive rate of speed on Friday evening about 9:45 p.m. on McGregor Blvd. about 3/4 of a mile from the Causeway toll booth. The Highway Patrol said that Barry's cycle left the road, travelled about 600 feet into the underbrush where it struck a cement highway marker. The impact caused

Barry to be thrown from the cycle. According to the FHP report, Barry's two helmets were strapped to the bike.

Barry is survived by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Robert Barry also of Sanibel and a brother, Thomas C. Barry of Baldwinville, New York.

The services were conducted in the

chapel of the Kiser-Belcher Fort Myers Funeral Home by Rev. Bruce Milligan. Burial was in Memorial Gardens Cemetery.

The exact cause of the accident is still under review by the Lee County Sheriff's Office.

apartments we sell are not different than any other family vacation use on the Island. It is true that there is likely to be year-round usage, but half the people who live here go away in the summer anyway." He added that an increased influx of people during the summer months was a boon to the utility companies, if nothing else. "The sewer plant has been running at about 16 percent capacity this summer," said Taylor. "The portion of time that we get extra occupants in interval ownership is in off-peak periods."

Dennis said that their first interval ownership development, Sanibel Beach Club, 1, runs at 73 percent occupancy and the average number of occupants in 2.9 per unit.

Taylor objected to the inclusion of the provisions of high impact units. "I don't see how we are going to sneak it through the side door. We ought to go through the front door with it!"

Mariner Properties operates 40 interval ownership units at South Seas Plantation has plans for 50 interval ownership units at Casa Ybel, now under construction.

Planning Commission Chairman Ann Winterbotham suggested that the proposed ordinance be part of the schedule for the October 24 Planning Commission-City Council workshop.

Congratulations to the Captiva Erosion Prevention District for their timidity in proposing a toll on the Blind Pass bridge to our sister island. (They will most certainly incur the terrible wrath of Sanibel's Tom Nix and his Mainland cohorts who have nixed the Causeway bond issue for these past several years.)

It seems only fitting and proper that the Erosion District be granted the use of this revenue - producing device to help restore Captiva's fast eroding Gulf Beaches. It appears equally appropriate that the increasing numbers of tourists and day-trippers that use the Islands' beaches be asked to help local taxpayers in the maintenance of Sanibel's roads that lead to those beaches.

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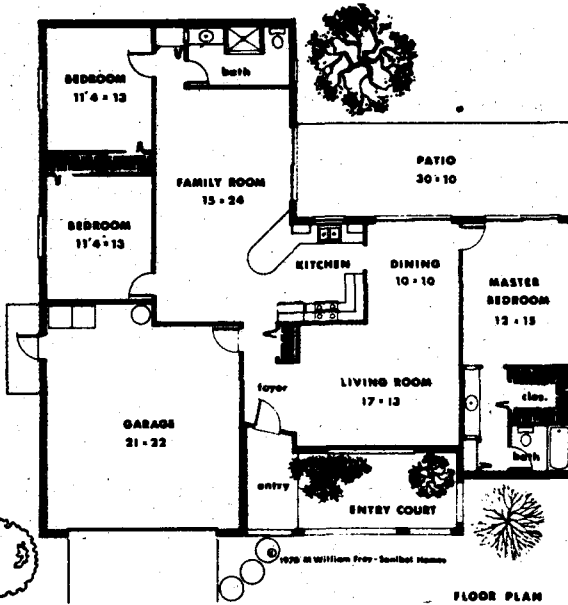
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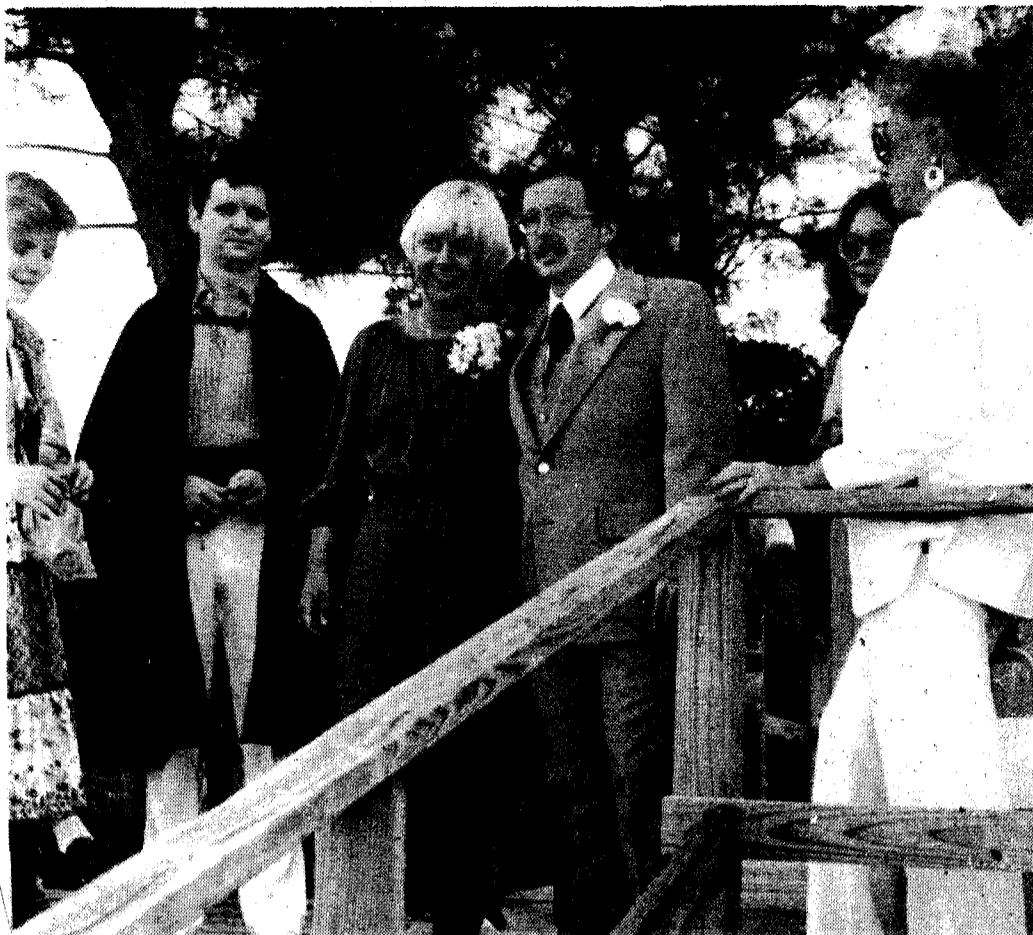

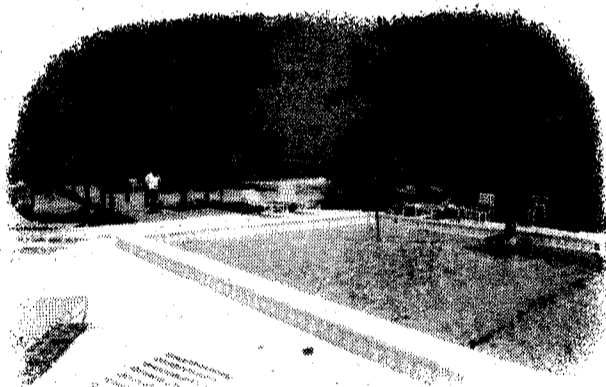


## island nuptials

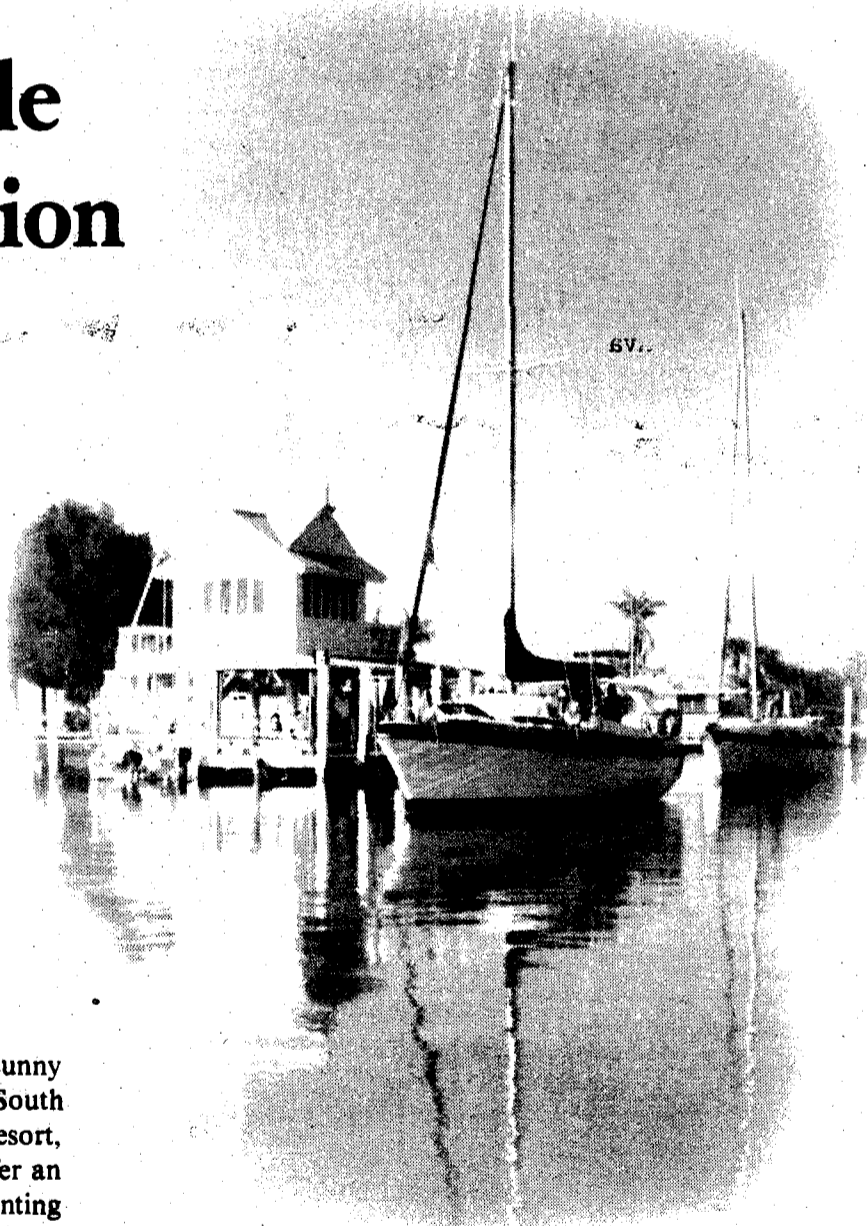

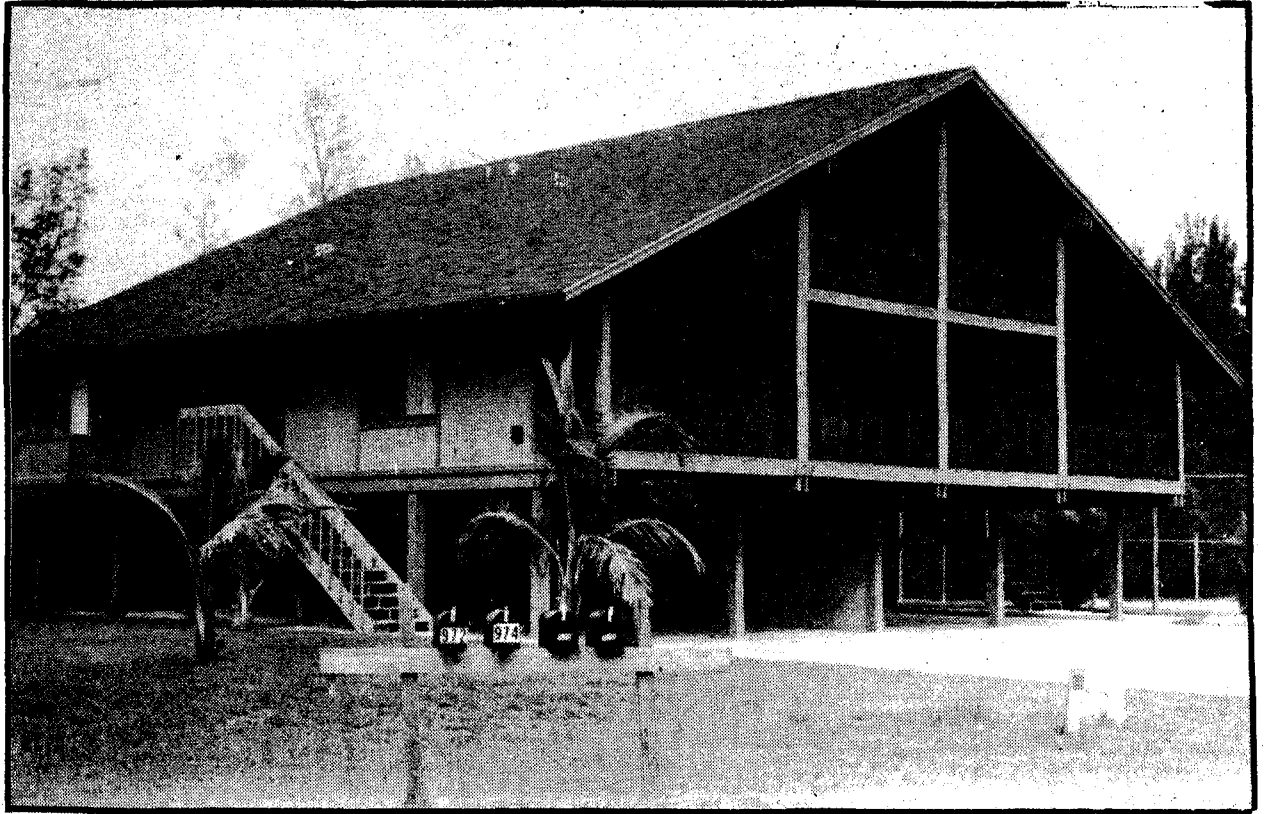

Sanibel Realty, Inc. has begun construction on nine duplexes that will be offered for sale in the Dunes subdivision between Bailey and Sandcastle Roads.

The duplexes will be made of wood on pilings, similar in design to the High Dunes homes. The estimated completion of the first building in January, 1979.

The duplexes, which are listed at \$94,500 per unit, have three bedrooms and three baths each. The main floor of the units contain approximately 1196 square feet, the loft floor has about 590 square feet; there is a closed-in storage area of 240 square feet and a carport that has 500 square feet.

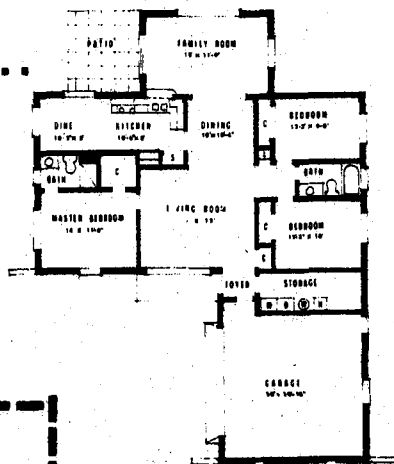

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# on the water by mike fuery

A few years ago, there was a company which put out hypothetical questions (That's a made-up question about something which never has really happened, but could...) concerning hazardous boating situations. It was a popular and invaluable bit of boating advice.

For instance, one of the questions asked, "If you were about to go over Niagara Falls in a barrel, but you see another boater in a barrel approaching the falls from your right and not displaying navigational light, you would: (A) Yield the right of way because his barrel is bigger than yours; (B) Proceed over the falls because you approached the brink first; (C) Advise the Coast Guard that the other barrel was exceeding the "NO WAKE" speed zone as he went over the falls.

contest in the area.



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

Conversion table: The above tides are for the lighthouse point of Sanibel only. To convert for Redfish Pass (north tip of Captiva), add 55 minutes to the time shown for every hi-tide, subtract two (2) minutes for every low tide. (NC, we don't know why, but it works. Instructions following are even less sense-sical but as we stated, they do work.)

For Captiva Island, Gulf side, subtract 30 minutes from each high tide, and subtract 1 hour and 16 minutes for each low tide.

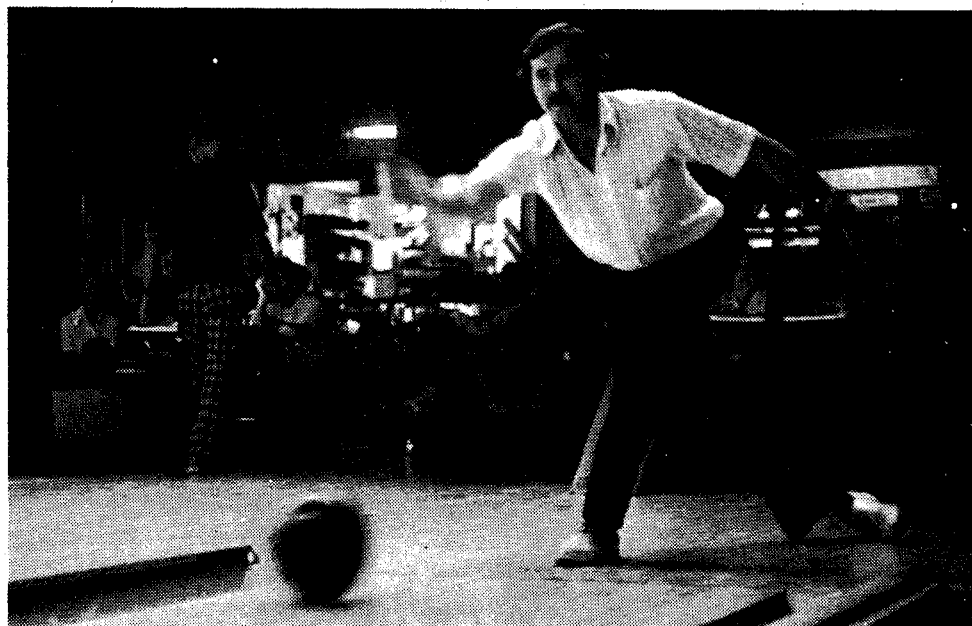
For Captiva Island, Pine Island Sound (Bay) side, add 1 hour and four (4) minutes for each high tide, and add 52 minutes for each low tide.

In between these points on gulf or bay - guesstimate - and have good fishing, and/or shelling.

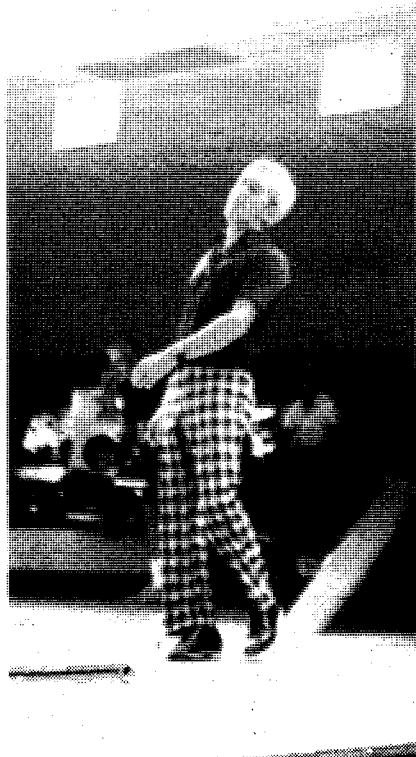

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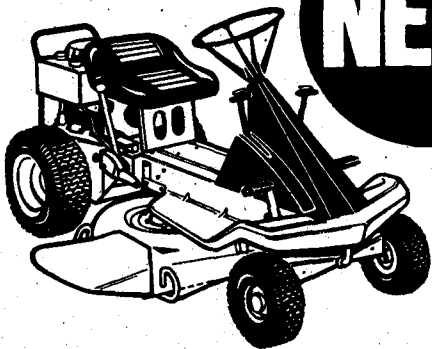

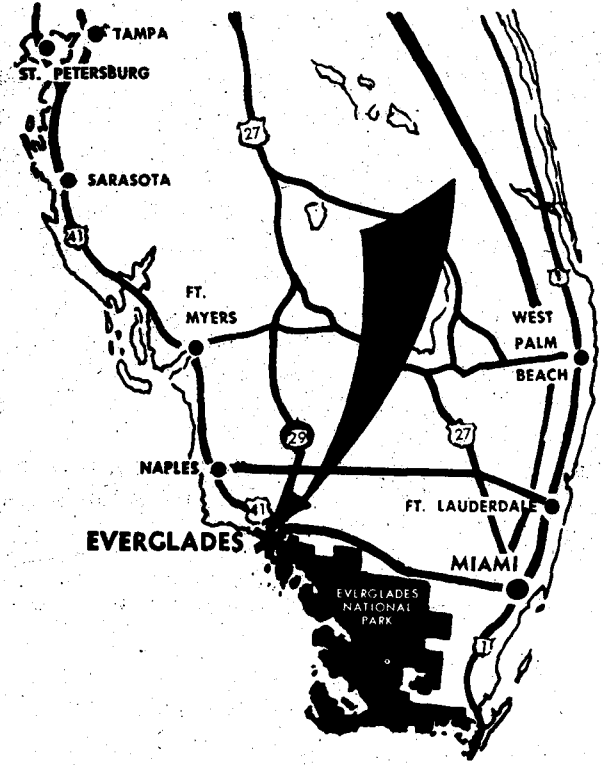

# a day in everglades

Once the Collier County seat, now the Western Gateway to the Everglades National Park, Everglades City is a quiet town basking in the south-west Florida summer sun. The site dates back over 1,000 years to a civilization of coastal shell mound dwellers, whose cultural relics of gold and shell ornaments and unusual carvings have been unearthed in the many shell mounds that abound in the area. It has been suggested these early settlers may have been related to the Maya whose great civilization rose in the Yucatan. Ultimately they were succeeded by

the nomadic Caloosa (whose shell mounds may still be seen in areas on and around Sanibel). The latter were well known to the Spaniards who prowled the area attempting to establish a colony in this region of Florida. Ultimately the Caloosas were driven out and the Seminoles arrived, only to be driven out during the Seminole Wars. One of the last battles of these wars took place not far from Everglades City. Shortly after the Civil War white settlers established an Indian trading post at the mouth of what is now the Barron River. As agriculture grew in the area, much



Departing from Bailey's Shopping Center, the direct 75 mile trip can be made comfortably in two hours via the causeway, straight ahead over Gladiolus to Rt. 41 South, turn right on Rt. 41 South to the Naples Bypass, turn left on Rt. 41 Naples Bypass and continue to Rt. 29, turn right on Rt. 29 to Everglades City.

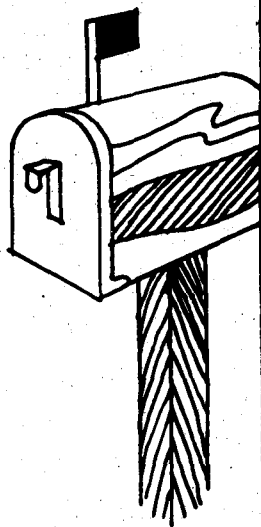
A comfortable days trip may be arranged by incorporating a trip to the Corkscrew Swamp (reported in The Islander September 26) with a trip to Everglades City. Upon leaving the Corkscrew, turn left to Immokalee and then turn right on Rt. 29 to Everglades City. The distance from the Corkscrew to Everglades City is 60 miles and may be traveled in one hour fifteen minutes.



Bank of Everglades

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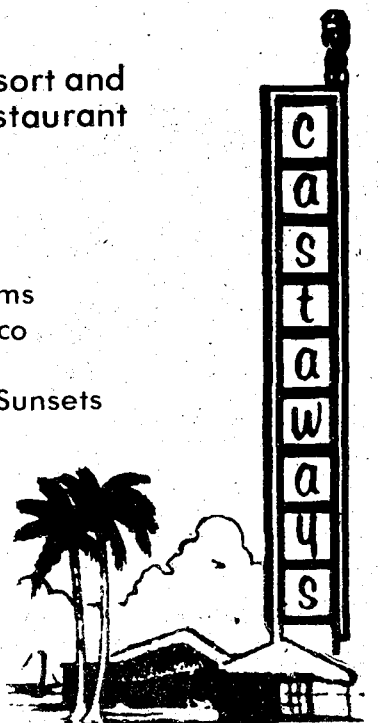

of this region's produce was shipped from the port at Everglades City. In 1889 George W. Storter, Jr. purchased the entire townsite for \$800 and began to expand one of the original homes into what is now the Rod & Gun Club. By the early 1900s hunters, fishermen, and yachtsmen were arriving in considerable numbers for the winter season. A growing influence in this area was Barron G. Collier, who had already purchased Useppa Island in 1912 and established his own personal paradise replete with swimming pool and tennis courts. In 1922 he acquired Storters' holdings and operated the Club as a private hunting and fishing club where he hosted several United States Presidents and a multitude of international dignitaries. Barrow Collier formed Collier County and chose Everglades City to be the County Seat and the center of his expanding industrial empire. Using his own personal resources he established a steamship line, built roads, railroads, and hotels. He also built stores, started a large bus line, and established a bank.

The city was heavily involved in the celebrations marking the opening of the Tamiami Trail in Collier County in 1928. The Collier interests prevailed in the

city until hurricane Donna in 1960, after which they moved and the County Seat was transferred. In 1962 the Bank of Everglades moved to Immokalee completing Everglades City's decline from prominence. Today the city is largely a winter resort, and many visitors stay at the Rod & Gun Lodge.

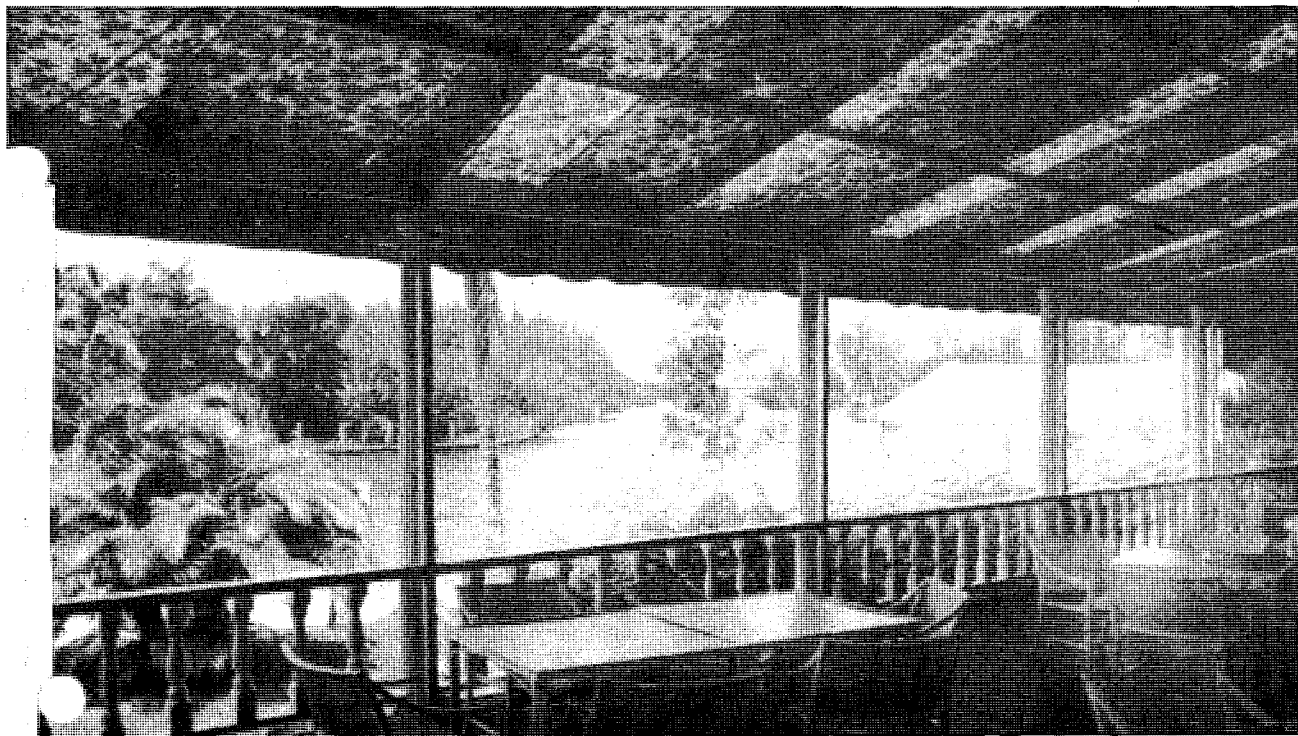
The Lodge is open to the public year round and offers such amenities as a heated pool, screened and covered veranda, cocktail lounge and dining room. As it is accessible by water, a full service marina is provided. In addition, the Lodge has an airstrip with a 2,500 foot lighted runway. While many guests arrive by boat and live aboard, the Lodge boasts 17 double rooms in cottages on the grounds with rates varying from \$24 double occupancy May 1 - December 19 to \$28 December 20 - April 30.

Of general sightseeing interest in the community are the abandoned bank building, City Hall, the Everglades Inn (now largely given over to a drug store and cafeteria) and the Women's Club building which housed the town laundry. A few miles from the city, at the end of State Rt. 29, lies Chokoloskee Island, a 147 acre Indian shell mound where one may visit the old Indian trading post opened in 1906. The nearby Park Ranger Station is the starting point for boat tours of the mangrove wilderness or a longer tour of the Ten Thousand Islands. As boating conditions vary in this area, it is advisable to make boat tour arrangements in advance. For those who enjoy fresh seafood, it is also advisable to take a cooler along as local fish houses market many varieties of fresh fish, shrimp, stone crabs, Florida lobster, and even frogs legs.



Porticoed Entrance to the Everglades Rod & Gun Lodge

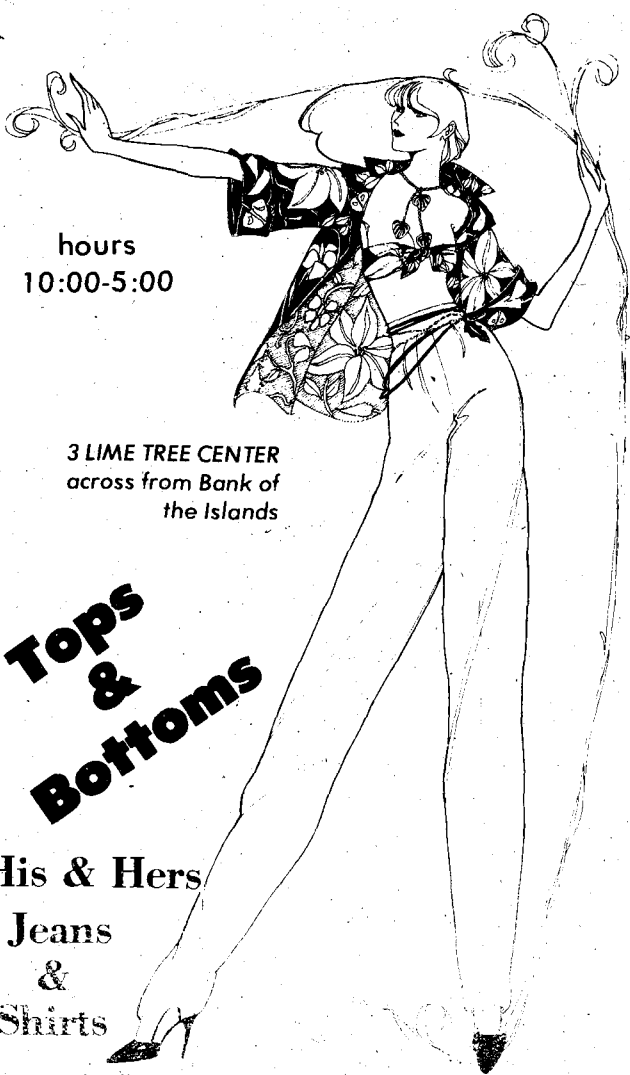

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# refuge report

by del pierce

This week's column will be directed towards status reports of various proposed or on-going projects.

The firm of Mayes, Sudderth & Etheredge, Inc. has received the architect and engineering contract for designing of a new maintenance area and a visitor center - office complex. The maintenance area site is proposed for west of the school property on the Sanibel-Captiva Road. It will consist of equipment buildings and maintenance shops.

The site for the visitor center and

office complex had been proposed for the area in the vicinity of the right side of the entrance to the wildlife drive.

Another site about 1.5 miles out on the drive is being seriously considered at this time, however. The latter site would pose some problems insofar as utilities are concerned but would be a more attractive area away from highway traffic, water tower, etc. Final recommendation for siting will not be made until we have some preliminary cost figure or other feasibility data.

The pump proposal for water

management of the freshwater area of the Darling Unit is still undergoing review by the Corps of Engineers and Florida's Department of Environmental Regulation. Two requests for denial of the permit have been submitted. Both of these requests have indicated preference for returning the waters on the left hand side of the wildlife drive back to estuary condition and to not try to manage them as brackish or fresh water areas. The refuge's position is that without this habitat diversity we will have less wildlife diversity and eliminating the brackish water areas would eliminate much of our alligator and otter habitat. Also, we would not be able to develop nesting islands that could be of tremendous wildlife value. We agree

that the original pumping plant proposed might well use some modifications but the basic idea of managing for habitat diversity remains the same.

The Bailey Unit pond development has been slowed by pump break-downs and vandalism but the mangrove head pond being worked upon is expected to be done by January. At this time we do not know when work on the five other ponds included in the refuge - city agreement will be started.

In a recent meeting between refuge and city planners it was agreed that there might be room for compromise in regards to the proposed bike path along the Sanibel-Captiva Road. Although final details have not been worked out, the basic layout planned will be a trail that is located entirely or almost entirely on the present road right-of-way with little or no infringement upon trees or brush. Final decision of any proposal will still be that of Regional Director Kenneth Black.

The proposal to hard surface the wildlife drive has been changed to a proposal for improving the wildlife drive with no specifics recommended at this time.

# food for thought

## the restaurant association's \$2 blue plate specials

A complete meal for just \$2 — including everything from a Rum Runner frozen cocktail to tray after tray of unlimited hors d'oeuvres.

The soup course was vast and ranged from a delicate lobster bisque to New England Clam Chowder, with everything from French onion soup to bouillabaisse in between. No limits on portions.

Entrees were even more staggering, from "airlines type" Salisbury steak with brown gravy, to stuffed cabbage rolls.

Bread, rolls, spreads abounded and when it came to the dessert course it was like a huge Viennese sweet table. Everything from cream puffs to pies to frozen yogurt to cheesecakes.

For drinks it was possible to choose from good old plain black coffee to the most elegant espresso (it reminded me of garnish).

This elegant repast was available to any member or employee of the restaurant, hotel or food business in any capacity (over the age of 16) who bothered to trek across the Tamiami Trail to the Miami Beach Convention Center.

A meal like this for \$2 in Miami Beach? It went on all day this past Saturday, Sunday and Monday; thousands of people partook.

The occasion was the eighth annual show at the Miami Beach Convention Center of the Florida Restaurant Association.

Although the event held in Broward County attracted a great number of people involved in the operation of the more than 2,500 food establishments there, food service personnel from throughout Florida and the nation were well represented.

"I believe that the flourishing restaurant business reflects a national trend," an association official said.

"People are spending more on food away from home than ever in history. More wives are working and people are going out to lunch more instead of brown bagging it."

Other comments heard repeatedly at the show were "The way we have it figured out with portion control and convenience foods, it will soon be cheaper for most small family units to eat out rather than fuss with the preparation of food at home."

"Fast food techniques account for more than 75 percent of the food industry with the number rising steadily."

"Even so-called custom restaurants and steak houses rely heavily on fast food techniques and food that is purchased in at least a partially prepared state."

The era of the great chef with his second-in-command who terrorized the kitchen staff and insisted on perfection may become, sadly, a thing of the past.

It seems the place for an aspiring chef today is at one of the pre-prepared food companies, trying to add a bit of taste to the American diet of the future.

If I were to give a personal commentary on the state of the food industry, it would be this:

I am sure the food companies are giving their customers what they think they want. The customers are in turn passing on to the consumer what the demand is thought to be.

I still feel there is a place for quality and start-from-scratch cooking.

I do not argue with ultra-modern gadgetry that enables a job to be done quicker.

I am in favor of microwave, and any other speed and quality saving device (such as food processors, electronic potato peelers, conveyor belts).

What I am not in favor of is the overall sameness that results from mass production. Mediocrity.

As a final example, I give you my vote for the worst new product at the show. General Mills has come out with an imitation carrot cake mix with imitation cream cheese prepared frosting.

Even if the taste is superb, is this what you really want?

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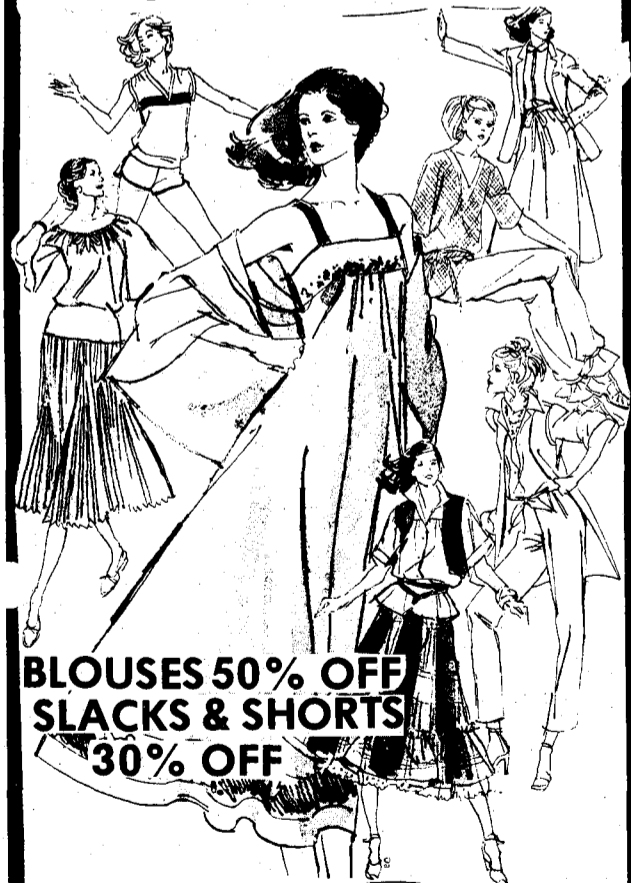

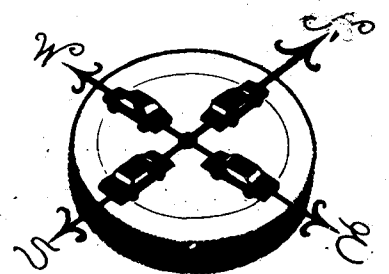

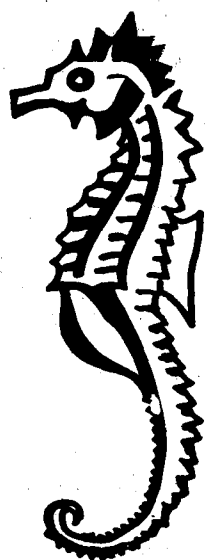

# SECOND ARTIFICIAL REEF COMPLETED

A reef, teeming with undersea life is a haven for tiny sea animals that are the beginning of the food chain for the sea world.

The plentiful fish produced around reefs has spurred the completion of the second artificial reef in waters near Fort Myers Beach.

Fifteen hundred tons of used, broken concrete has been dumped in the ocean in a haphazard fashion, making up the second of a seven reef program, according to Mike Yakubik, president of Beach Reefs, Inc.

The reefs begin a new ecosystem. Microscopic sea animals attract tiny fish; tiny fish bring bigger fish and fishing abounds.

"Sea critters, crustaceans, plankton, diatoms, and algae are all swimming around," Yakubik explains. "When you throw a chunk of concrete in the water, they all attach themselves looking for a home. They want a home where they can propagate."

"By dropping the concrete in a helter-skelter fashion, it forms nooks and crannies providing shelter and a haven for spawning."

Thus the food chain begins.

"The purpose of life in the sea is death," Yakubik said. "Eat and be eaten."

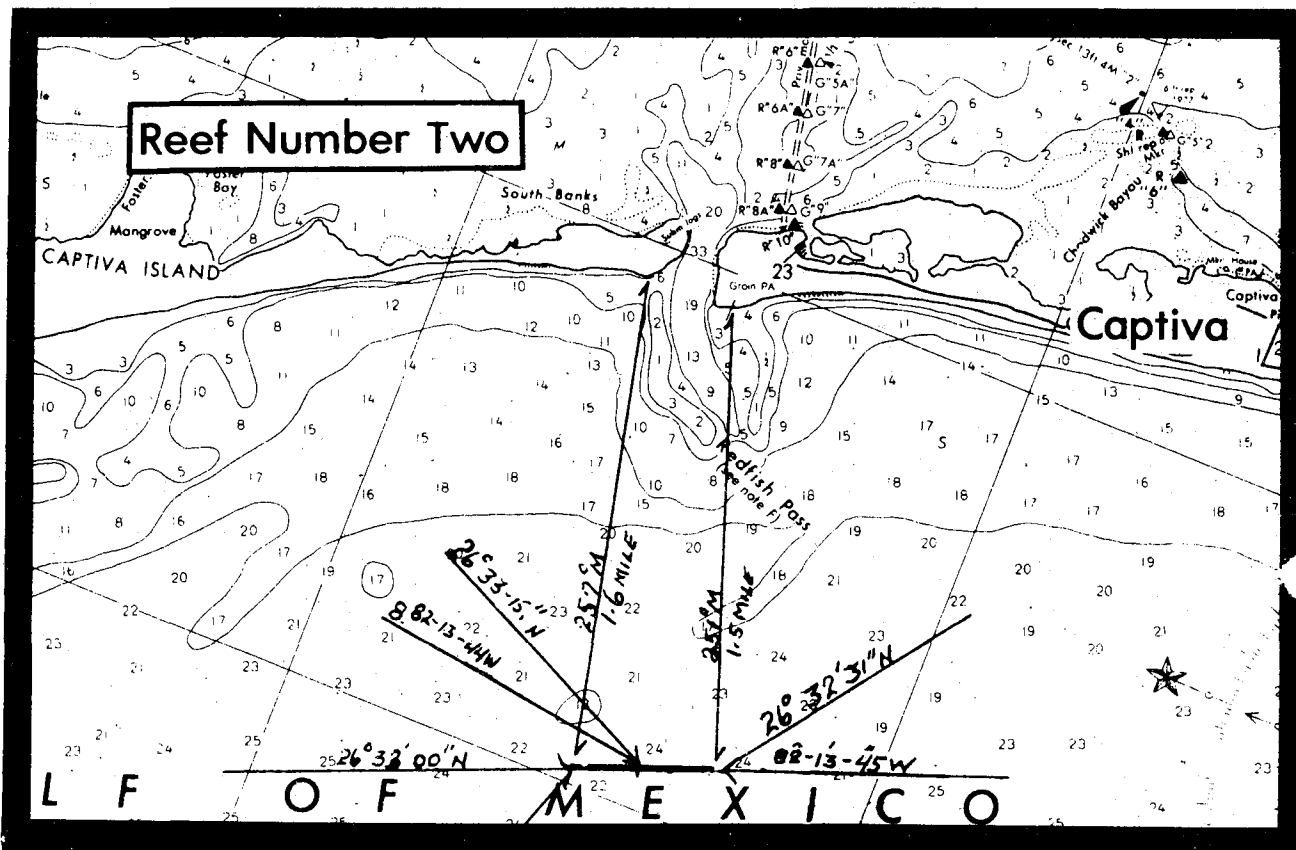
Reef placement involves a consideration of several factors, such as a minimum clearance standard.

With a minimum clearance requirement of 10 feet at low tide, Yakubik placed reef number one and two at a depth of 20 feet. Although a 10 foot depth clearance leaves quite a bit of area to choose from, the narrowing down process goes on.

Accessibility is one of the main objectives of the reef developers. Reef number two is the same distance from St. James as Bokelia, Yakubik said. Reef number three is planned near the Sanibel Lighthouse and will be equally accessible to St. James, South Pine Island, Sanibel, Fort Myers Beach and Cape Coral.

In addition to accessibility, the reef makers want the reefs placed as close to shore as possible for safety.

When the artificial reef idea was in the making, Yakubik and former Beach Coast Guard Chief Thurman Smith discussed the need to discourage small boaters from traveling far from shore for better fishing. Smith performed 1,500 search and rescue missions for small boats and one boat drifted 30 hours before being found, according to Yakubik.



As the choice of artificial reef placement is narrowed down, the Department of Environmental Regulation must be consulted. The first spot chosen for reef number one was ordered changed. Archeologists advised Yakubik that three ice ages ago the area was 380 feet deep and the reef could possibly cover remaining artifacts.

The reefs also must not infringe on the territory of the shrimpers or commercial fishermen.

The process is intricate, but once the magic spot is defined, construction begins.

Loaded with two to three tons of broken, used concrete and a bulldozer, a large barge makes its way to the buoy marking the spot. The bulldozer then pushes the heavy material into the ocean.

Reef number one, located off Big Carlos Pass at the south end of Estero Island, is one mile long and built of 7,000 tons of concrete and 150 tons of old warship remnants.

Recently completed reef number two located 1.6 miles from shore off Redfish Pass is a half mile long. Reef number three will also be a half mile long and is marked at 1.2 miles off shore of the Stack and Sanibel Lighthouse.

The next four reefs will be 500 feet square, two to three miles apart and placed in progressively deeper water. The idea is "something for everybody" Yakubik said. He plans reefs close to shore for the small boater and further out for charter boats and scuba divers yet Yakubik wants all the reefs to be easily accessible from shore.

Reef number two was completed in two months, Yakubik said. The amount of time needed to complete each reef depends on the availability of materials. Reef number one is made from the remnants of the Peace River Bridge. The fate of the swing bridge has already been claimed by the Beach Reefs Inc. Construction on reef three is underway.
