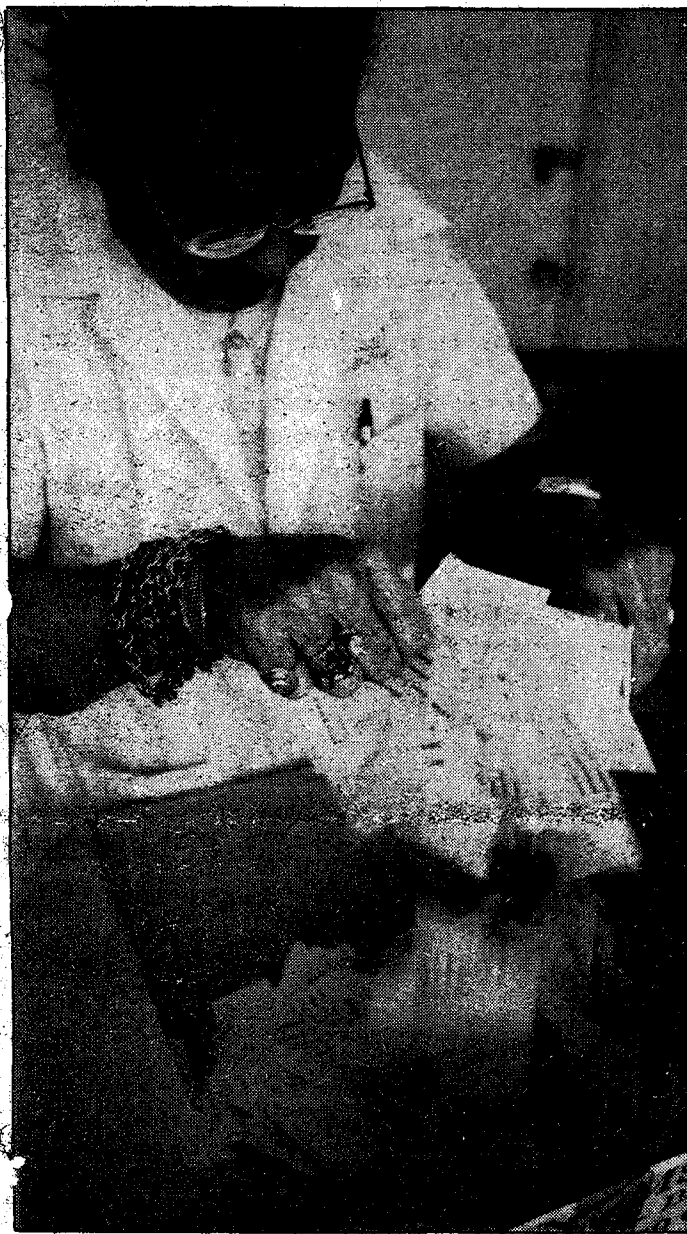

moderate cost housing questionnaire to be distributed this week

The City Council's Moderate Cost Housing Committee last week approved a questionnaire to be distributed to employees and employers on Sanibel. Questionnaires are expected to be available later this week. They may be obtained through your business or at the Library after Wednesday. They are to be returned either where you picked it up or to the Council office by April 13. (Samples of the questionnaires are printed in this issue.)

Dr. Louise Johnson, the committee member primarily responsible for overseeing the questionnaire, expects to distribute about 4,000 questionnaires to employees and about 500 to Island employers. She said at Friday's meeting that the League of Women Voters has not decided to take this on as a project, as had been previously reported, but she was expecting unofficial help in compiling the data from 10 individuals who are members on the League.

interval ownership workshop held

Sanibel's City Council and Planning Commission met in a workshop session yesterday morning to review the provisions of a proposed ordinance which, if passed, will severely restrict the future of "time-sharing units" on the Island.

The ordinance which is scheduled on today's council agenda for a second reading, defines "time sharing" as "hotel or motel units, apartments, condominiums and interval ownership units which exceed 600 square feet and rent for periods of less than one month. The proposed ordinance would limit

conversions of existing property into that of time sharing, prohibit sales offices on the property site, and guarantee 10,000 square feet of open space for each unit."

In an earlier review of the ordinance proposal, the Planning Commission voted five to two for elimination of the open space requirement, elimination of the 600 square foot minimum, and for conversion to be allowed in areas designated for resort use in the land use plan. Planning Commission chairman Ann Winterbotham told the council that the Commission viewed interval ownership units as resort housing and that it was the Commission's feeling all resort housing should be treated the same.

Council member Zee Butler disagreed with the recommendations of the Planning Commission and called upon Commissioner Don Manchester (who had dissented in the Commission vote) to give his opinion. Manchester told the Council, "We have two fine developers handling it (interval ownership) today, but it is growth...I think we should address ourselves to what can happen if we continue to let

resort housing flourish on the Island."

Manchester then produced a chart depicting allowable density and use of resort land under the proposed or-

planning commission allocates permits under rate of growth

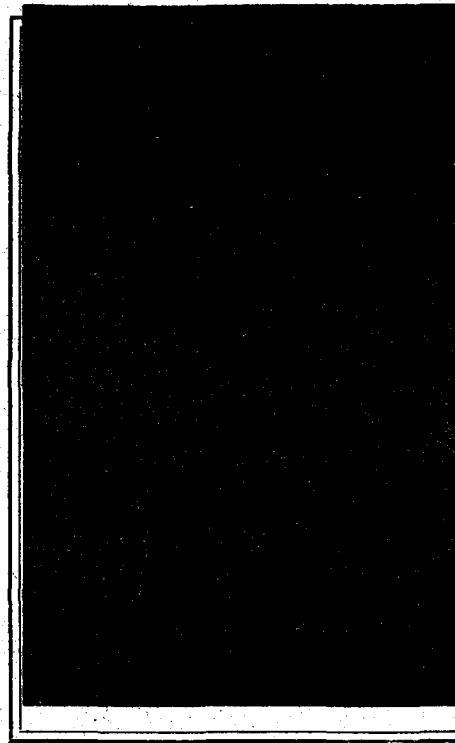

Sanibel's Planning Commission took less than five minutes yesterday to approve the first allocation for dwelling units under the Rate of Growth ordinance adopted by the City last January.

Despite City apprehensions, over administering the growth ordinance (which allows for approval of only 60 dwelling units every four months) the first allocation went smoothly due to the fact there were only 46 dwelling unit applications under consideration.

The Planning Commission voted unanimously to approve applications for 25 multi-family units and 21 single family units. Commissioner Twink Underhill moved for the approval, prefacing her remarks with "On this historic occasion I would like to make a motion..."

The 14 extra permits not applied for will now be turned over to the next allocation period, allowing for a maximum of 74 possible unit approvals at that time.

Hyde, who chaired the meeting in Chairman's Zee Butler's absence, brought up a suggestion that had been proposed to him. "It seems that some condominium owners are becoming disenchanted - income tax rules are cutting into their investments. If these owners can be guaranteed \$3,600 - \$4,800 per year, they might be interested in year-long rentals. The owner would lease the condo to the foundation, for example, and the foundation would lease it out. The owner could then take a tax deductible loss on the seasonal rental he could have expected," Hyde pointed out. Hyde also suggested that many condominiums would be interested in this procedure for security reasons. "Many would like to have one full-time resident," he said.

Dick Workman pointed out that this would also have the advantage of using resources that have already been

committed. Committee member Ray Fenton added that this was already being done in the private sector. "That's how I solve my needs," he said. I rent an apartment from someone for, say, \$4,800 and lease it to an employee for \$2,400. There are advantages both ways." Workman suggested that it might be one of the Committee's tasks to "stir the pot" and bring condominium owners who might be interested together with potential renters.

Fenton then outlined a preliminary scope of work for three committees who would look into putting moderate cost housing on land zoned commercial, resort and residential. Fenton is trying to scatter the housing units across the Island to lessen the impact in any single area.

Residential areas Fenton suggested for examination include those with contiguous lots who are unable to build

on them under the current provisions of the land use plan, partially constructed subdivisions, to see if there is logical developable land for moderate cost housing even if the density has been used up, and new subdivisions, (under clustering provisions) if a small increase in density would facilitate moderate cost housing. One final area Fenton suggested for examination by the committee on residential properties would be whether or not the plan should be modified to allow modular houses and, if so, under what community standards.

Fenton also suggested a committee to look at commercial property to examine whether a small increase in clearance and impermeability on single story commercial developments would permit housing on the second floor or, if there is balance of land unused on commercial property, residential use could be permitted.

For the resort housing committee's scope of work, Fenton suggested that the committee should examine what obstacles stand in the way of moderate

cost housing in resort housing districts and whether or not moderate cost housing would be compatible with resort housing.

Dick Workman present some preliminary thoughts on a scope of work for the eligibility committee. "There should be two areas of consideration," Workman said, "one is employment on Sanibel and the other is that gross family income should not exceed a certain amount." Workman pointed out some of the problems in determining eligibility such as, what the person who doesn't work the entire year on Sanibel, or who only works partly on Sanibel and partly elsewhere. The committee determined that, legally, they would have to declare everyone to be eligible but would assign moderate cost housing on a point system, similar to the idea behind the new Rate of Growth ordinance, where points could be awarded based on an applicant's meeting certain criteria.

The next meeting for the committee has been set for Friday, April 13 at 8:30 a.m. at the City Hall Conference Room.

IWA member objects to election procedure

AN OPEN LETTER TO JOE WINTROWD, PRESIDENT OF THE IWA

March 31, 1979

Dear Joe:

Your letter of March 14 addressed to and summarily disbanding your duly-appointed Nominating Committee was most disconcerting. It was three candidates recommended by the Committee to their embarrassment. I can assure you that the handling of this matter has left a very bad taste in the mouths of many of us loyal IWA members.

It was gratifying, nonetheless, to note from IWA's new Miami attorney's memorandum to the Board, that there is an awareness that the Nominating Committee device is a traditional one successfully used to produce some mighty fine and dedicated Board members for some fourteen years. Article IV of Robert's Rules or Order

sanctions such a parliamentary procedure.

Also noted from the Memorandum was his failure to find in our By-laws, Charter, or County franchise any EXPRESSED... PERMISSION for the use of the Nominating Committee procedure. Neither, I might add, will he find any EXPRESSED PROHIBITION on the use of whatever reasonable and workable procedure the Association members deem appropriate to chose their Board members and implement Article VII, Section 5 of the By-laws. That Section is purposely so written in the general terms of: "The Directors of the corporation shall be elected at the annual meeting of the members. No cumulative voting shall be allowed."

It is regrettable that our attorney has seen fit to stretch so far for analogies. He has reached back into Florida's unsavory past to invoke the discredited "Dillion Rule" of constitutional in-

terpretation. That Rule was often used to stifle the democratic exercise of republican Home Rule powers of local government. His apparent object was rationalization of a foreordained rejection of the Nominating Committees' slate which he dubbed as "unauthorized" and "ultra vires." He offered as embellishment the gratuitous advice that the traditional American and Sanibel Nominating Committee procedure; "may have a chilling effect" on the open elections called for by the above quoted By-laws section; and is in "spiritual conflict" with those open elections.

Our attorney's legal pontifications on a purely POLICY matter have apparently unduly influenced your Board- which is assumed to have approved your March 14 rejection letter to the Nominating Committee. My reading of IWA members' reaction to the legal boombast comes out similar to Macbeth's appraisal of an idiot's

tale, namely: "...full of sound and fury- Signifying nothing."

Finally, and as a nine-year active member and staunch supporter of IWA's objectives and projects, I respectfully request that the Board now substitute the name of Captian Charles W. Stevens for one of those on the Board's slate—all of whom are Sanibliters. Mr. Stevens' election would implement another long-honored I policy of assuring Board representation for our sister barrier island Captiva served by IWA. Mr. Stevens is the choice of the Captiva Civic Association to replace Captivan Marie Kalman who found it necessary for personal reasons to withdraw her name from the slate offered by the disbanded Nominating Committee.

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erosion prevention district goes back to the drawing board for funding sources

The Captiva Erosion Prevention District was to meet late yesterday to decide upon a course of action to take for their proposal to establish a toll on the Blind Pass bridge to fund erosion prevention projects on that island. The state legislature, who was asked to establish a special toll authority for the District, refused to do so because they decided it was the jurisdiction of Lee County and would likely require a county wide referendum. District

chairman Dan Burner is "pessimistic" that such a referendum for the toll would gain a favorable response from mainland voters.

At the meeting of the Captiva Civic Association last week Tully Shelley reported that County Commissioner Harry Rodda had said that County Attorney Jim Yaeger had ruled that a referendum would be necessary. Yaeger, however, said that his opinion was not "a definitive legal statement. I was not asked to render an opinion, I just wrote a memo to the

Commissioners advising them of the Erosion District's request to the state. As far as I knew they had not come before the Board and I thought it was a county decision," he said. He added that the project might not require a county-wide referendum if it were financially self-liquidating, which it is, according to Burner. In Yaeger's opinion the next step would be for the District to ask the County Commissioners for permission to put on the toll.

"That is definitely something we

should pursue," Burner said after learning of Yaeger's statement although he added that they would also investigate other sources of funding. Captivans who are property owners and members of the Captiva Civic Association were recently polled and the majority of both groups do not want to seek federal funding for their erosion prevention program because of the necessity for increased beach accesses, sanitary facilities and parking lots required for government programs.

public properties committee defines guidelines for steamboat land use

The Public Properties subcommittee, established to study possible use of the Algiers property by the City, met last week to further define guidelines for use of the 30 acre Gulf front tract.

Concern over the properties potential for traffic congestion prompted one committee member to say, "I would strongly recommend that the City Council establish a parking authority to eliminate the hodge-podge squeezing in a parking space here and a parking space there... If we consider the Algiers (traffic and parking) problem alone we're just avoiding the whole issue."

Committee member Arthur Hunter

shared concern over the parking problem at the site but also voiced opposition to any island transit system that would allow for mass busing of visitors to Sanibel's beaches. "I've counted 130 to 160 vehicles a time at the Tarpon Bay access," said Hunter, and "I'm absolutely opposed to this high impact use of the Algiers property."

Committee chairman Conrad Lickel agreed with other members that "Traffic is a big problem and we have a responsibility to underline it in our recommendation." "But," he also reminded the members, "the committee's capacity is limited to only making recommendations."

Lickel also told the committee that

City Attorney Neal Bowen would be meeting with Farmer's Home Administration (FmHA) officials and he (Lickel) had several questions about use of the property that he would like Bowen to check into. Those questions included whether or not FmHA loan conditions would permit use of the steamboat Algiers for a City complex and whether or not the City could charge auto fees for parking at the site. Committee member Mike Klein however, objected to questioning FmHA on land use until the loan process was completed. "I don't want FmHA to think we're doing something peculiar," Klein said. "I think we should wait until the deal is completed."

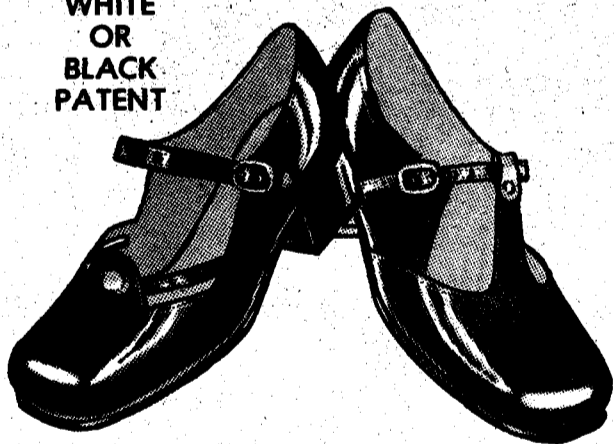
Restricting use of the beach site was also an area of concern to members concerned with the implications of high impact use at the site. Suggestions to limit beach access to residents included making the site a City park or implementing a fee and sticker system favoring island residents. Klein reminded the committee that "when we flaunted this project to the voters...one selling point was that they have another beach access." The terms of the loan agreement also require public access to the site, picnic tables, and public restrooms.

The Algiers property committee will be meeting next Thursday morning at the site to view the property again.



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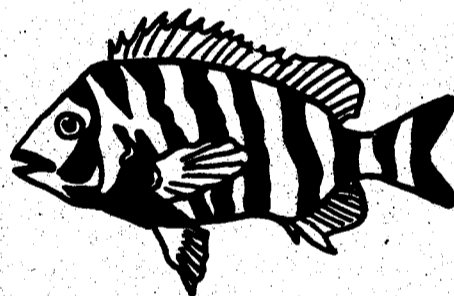

ordinance, in including the open space requirements. The chart allowed for building of three dwelling units on one acre of 20 dwelling units on five acres. Manchester agreed that his chart demonstrated a density reduction.

Butler then asked the Council and the Commission to consider amending the ordinance to provide for a sales office be allowed on the property site until 80 percent of available time was sold. After that, all commercial activity, including resale of the units, would be conducted on commercial property as designated by the land use plan.

Councilman Porter Goss requested a draft be prepared for today's meeting which would include all of the proposed changes from the Planning Commission and Butler. "I see what we're trying to do here," said Goss, "I agree with it in philosophy...but the density change bothers me."

Mayor Duane White echoed Goss' concern saying, "I'm as concerned as anyone else over impact...but I'm also

concerned over the legality, excepting the open space requirement smacks of an arbitrary and capricious action. White then questioned Butler on how she had reached the 10,000 square foot open space requirement. "I didn't," said Butler. "It's an arbitrary figure. White then responded, "That's what the courts will say, too."

Goss concurred with White's concern over legalities adding, "there are some things the city just can't legislate-type of ownership may be one of them."

Mariner Properties President Bob Taylor addressed the workshop and questioned the members as to whether or not any definitive data had been produced since the first reading of the ordinance. "Will there be a rational and legal basis on which this ordinance is based?" queried Taylor. Mayor White responded to Taylor with "doubt it...Our attorney is out of town...My personal opinion is that the ordinance will probably be continued."

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Mariner Properties, Inc., Sanibel, a management firm active in residential, resort and commercial development in Southwest Florida, broke ground on March 14 for North Shore Place, a luxury condominium residence in northwest Ft. Myers on the banks of the Caloosahatchee River.

The \$10 million dollar condominium project, planned for completion in three phases, represents Mariner's first step into Ft. Myers residential development. The corporation has developed condominium communities on Sanibel Island, and currently manages several resorts and hotels in Lee County, including South Seas Plantation.

North Shore Place will consist of 108 three-bedroom condominium homes.

North Shore Place was designed by Fenton-White Architects, Ft. Myers, recent recipients of several awards for residential and commercial design,

including awards for Cypress Square in Ft. Myers, a cluster of specialty shops, and Periwinkle Place Shopping Plaza, Sanibel, both of which were developed by Mariner Properties.

In the first phase of development, 32 residences will be constructed at North Shore Place, along with community amenities that will include a security entrance, heated riverfront pool and tennis courts. Construction Managers, Inc., Sanibel, has been named general contractor for the North Shore project. Approximately \$2.2 million dollars in first phase construction financing is being supplied by the Barnett Bank of Ft. Myers.

Robert Taylor, President for Mariner Properties, officiated at the groundbreaking ceremony for North Shore Place.

North Shore prices range from the low \$90,000's to \$110,000. The community is

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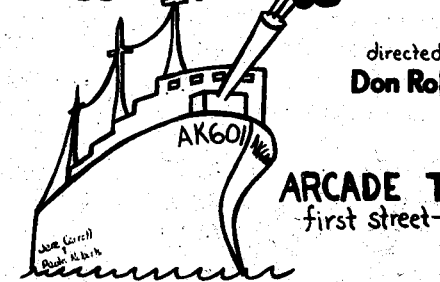
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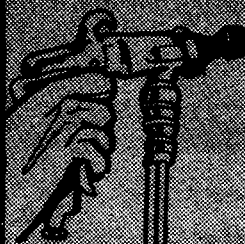

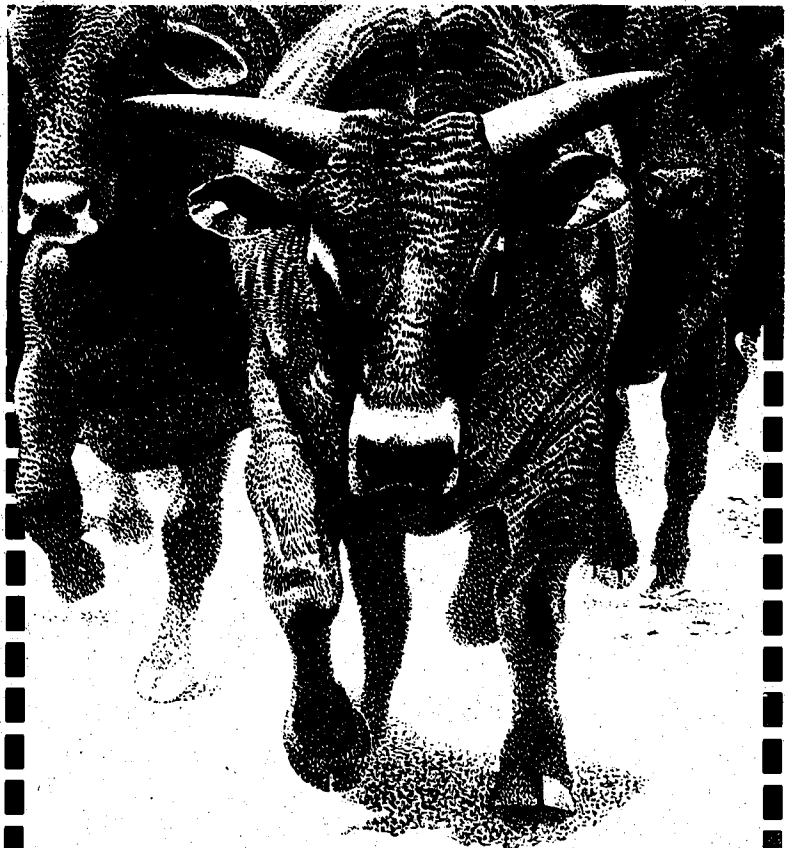

It wasn't too long ago that I wrote about the perils of owning one of the new "anti-backlash" bait casting reel outfits. At the time I wrote that column, I was torn between suing for false advertising and selling the works, but great strides in understanding and using a new type of line has worked wonders.

It wasn't long after the column appeared that a couple of readers called with some advice about how to work with a supposedly anti-backlash reel. These are the new generation of reels that have a gismo for disengaging the reel handle for the spool when casing. You probably can recall the old type of baitcasting reels that didn't have this feature and often resulted in truly astounding bird's nests which require a knife to cut out.

Anyway, my first big mistake, as it turned out, was putting monofilament line on the outfit. The booklet which comes with the reel suggested it—don't blame me, I just do what I'm told. So I spooled up with 225 yards of 12-pound mono on my new Penn Model 940. From cast one it was horrendous. No distance, no accuracy and every other cast resulted in a backlash ever worse than the one previous. That's when the outfit went on the market. Good thing no one offered me any money or I might have missed testing one of the most remakeable lines I've ever used.

I had been reading one of the fishing magazines soon after buying the outfit when I found an article on the new braided mono and other braided poly-synthetic lines.

The piece said how these lines were almost perfect when it comes to

eliminating backlashes. On top of this, the stretch factor is so low, compared to regular mono line that I had to get a spool to test.

I finally found some "Web" braided mono line in Fort Myers, but I was shocked at the price. It costs right around \$4 for 100 yards. After getting 200 yards, I said this stuff better be good. I was in for a very fine surprise.

I backed the reel with 125 yards of 20-pound mono and added the front of the line into 100 yards of the new Web line. I adjusted the reel for the lure weight and let fly as hard as I could. The stuff went like a shot for a good 100 feet—and not one backlash problem.

From past experience I figured the cast was a fluke and gave it another try. The second cast was farther than

the first and not even a hint of a backlash.

The secret of this line is that it has no "memory." That is, with regular mono line, it will return to the pre-shaped reel form on the casting spool and once it gets out of the pattern, it backlashes badly.

So I'm now sold on the new braided poly-lines. I don't peddle it, by-the-way, or gain any profits from telling you about it. It's just something new that's really worth trying. I'm going to put a spool on my regular spinning outfit for snook season. The line works on any reel.

Don't get this new line confused with the old braided dacron casting line. This is monofilament and other poly-synthetics such as braided polyester

and nylon, braided into a smooth, thin line.

I'm the last guy to get into prediction business, but I would guess that this stuff is what we will be using within the next few years if no real problem develops from more use over varied fishing conditions.

As with anything new, there is one feature of the line I'm using which I wish could be changed. It's the color. It's too light. I would rather have a clear line, but perhaps at this stage of development, that's not possible. Anyway, there is once again harmony between fisherman and new casting outfit, thanks to a really interesting new fishing line.

Conversion table: The above tides are for the lighthouse point of Sanibel only. To convert for Redfish Pass (north tip of Captiva), add 55 minutes to the time shown for every hi tide, subtract two (2) minutes for every low tide. (NO, we don't know why, but it works. Instructions following are even less sense sical but as we stated, they do work.)

For Captiva Island, Gulf side, subtract 30 minutes from each high tide, and subtract 1 hour and 16 minutes for each low tide.

For Captiva Island, Pine Island Sound (Bay) side, add 1 hour and four (4) minutes for each high tide, and add 52 minutes for each low tide.

In between these points on gulf or bay guesstimate and have good fishing, and/or shelling.

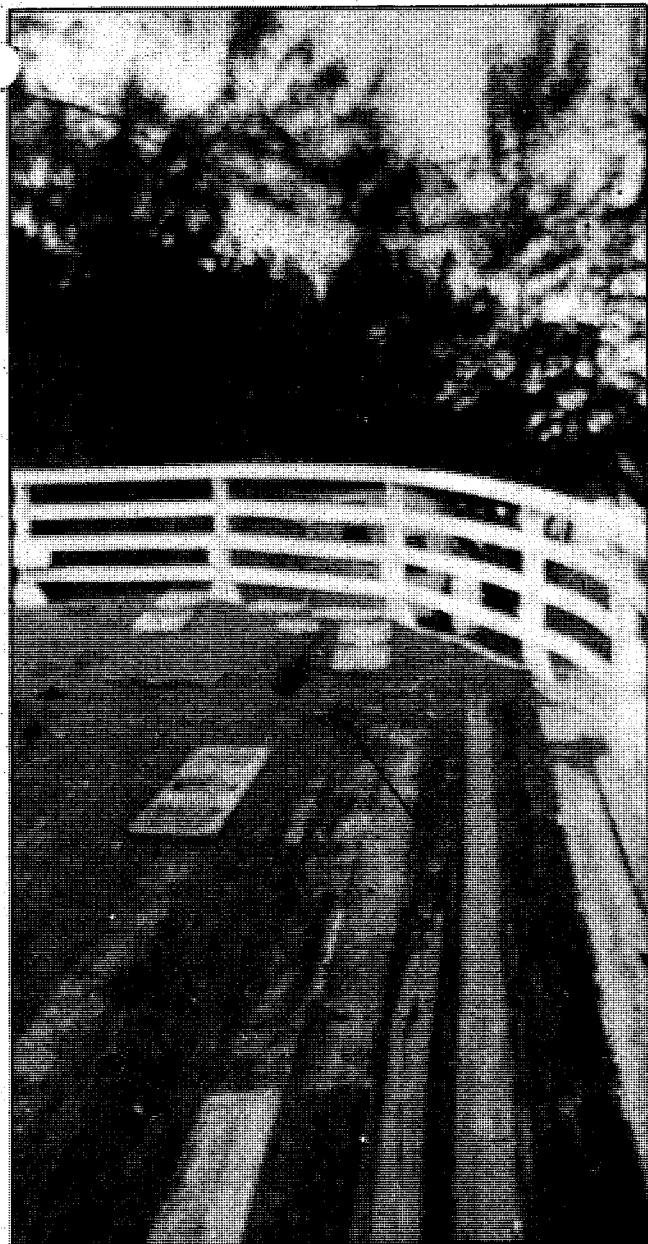

In a daring move on the part of Slim Terms, President of the Tank of The Islands, the Tank took the initiative and set a new prime rate. This shocked

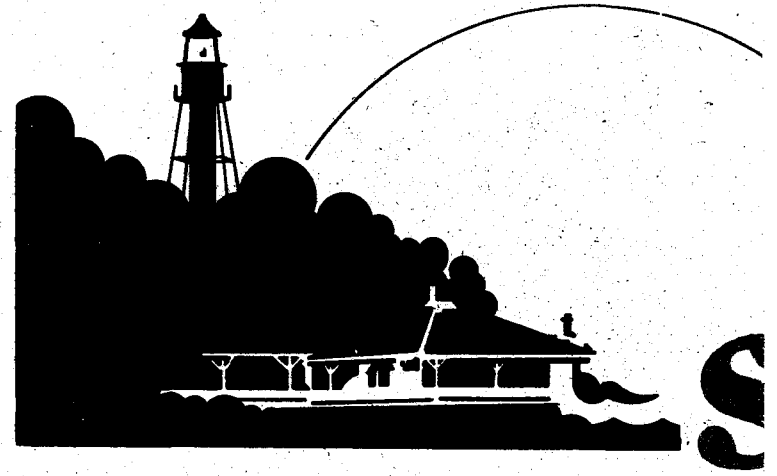

Still Thatcher, head of the First Conferate Leavings and Bones refused to comment on this decision, stating only "I wish to remain still."

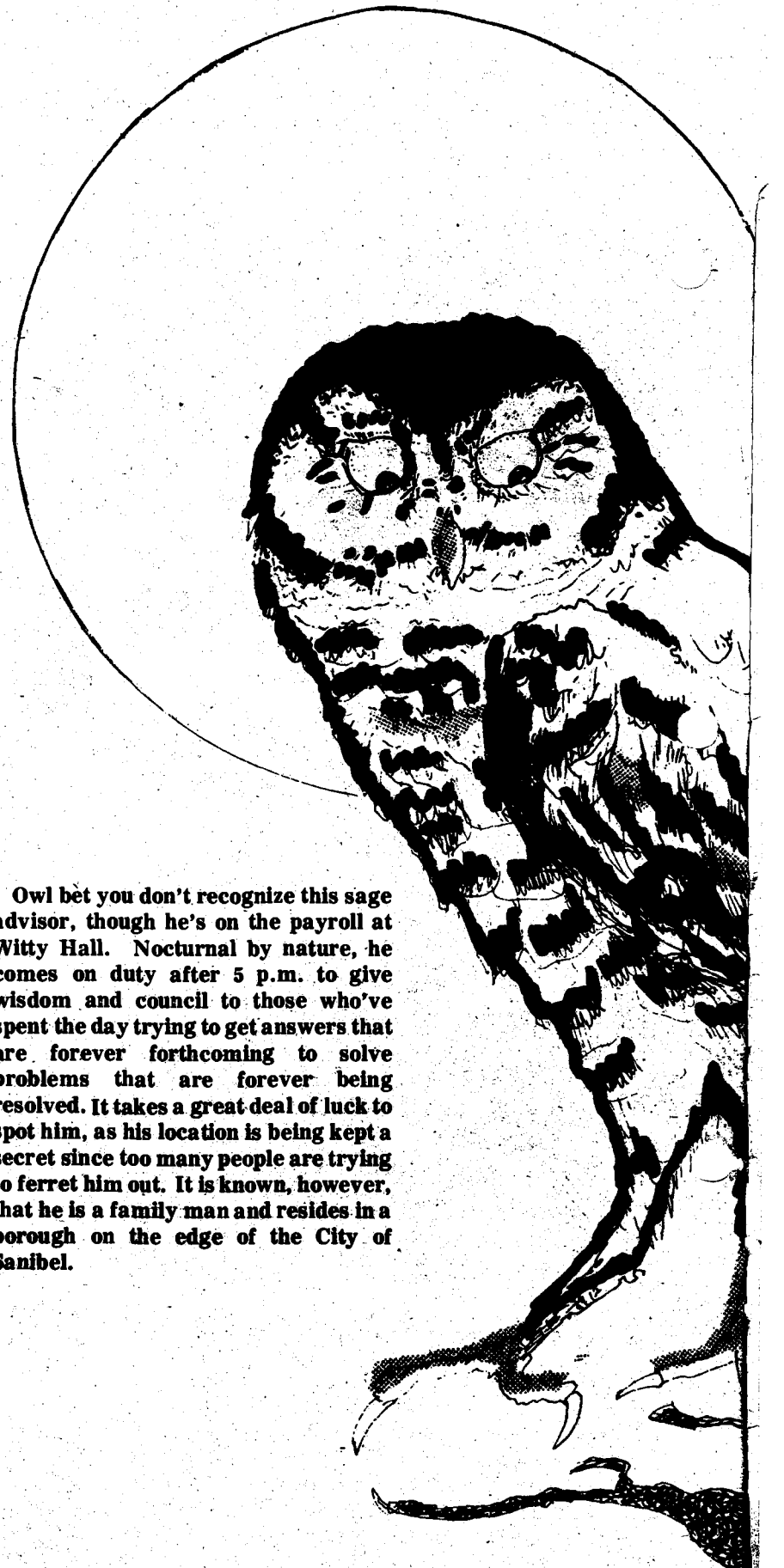

A few good size trout, however, have been reported as usual on the flats, some reds are running around the mangroves in the sound and the sanctuary area.

According to Rick White of Sanibel Marina, the water temperature has got to get to above 75 degrees before the snook will move out of the canals into the passes and sound, at which time the snook will also be easily duped along the gulf beach, especially near the Rocks.

About this time last year, Rick reports, mackerel were kicking up a storm for eight or ten days in a row. So get your gear ready and be prepared to catch some mackerel any day now.

Tween Waters Marina reports some small trout on the grass flats and a few reds in their usual haunts -- mangroves.

While waiting for your boat to be gassed up, relax any Tuesday or Sunday morning over a roll and coffee,

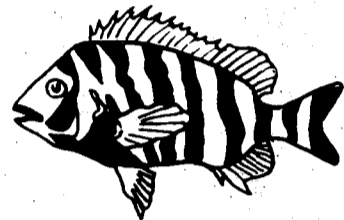


and know that only the plumpest, friskiest shrimps are being hand picked for your fishing pleasure. And the chef might slip a few Danish on board ...

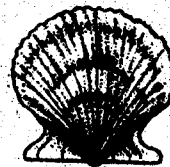

Easter cookies

Since the Easter Bunny is as likely to make cookies as to lay eggs, shaped and decorated cookies can star in this year's Easter basket, and you'll have no trouble about what to do with leftovers.

Making Easter Basket Cookies can be a project for the family to do together. It's easy to make enough to share a basketful or two with people who are special to your family.

If you use refrigerated slice and bake sugar cookie dough, you can concentrate on the fun part of decorating, and you don't need special cookie cutters. Because cookie rolls are uniform in diameter, it is easier to end up with well-shaped bunnies and flowers than when you use your own recipe. The refrigerated dough also puffs up and spreads just enough as it bakes so the shapes turn into fine looking chicks, bunnies and flowers, ready to decorate.

If the decorated cookies are eaten before they reach the Easter basket, you can keep the open dough on hand in your refrigerator for replacements. One roll makes large Easter rabbits or 36 egg, ice cream cone or flower blossom cookies.

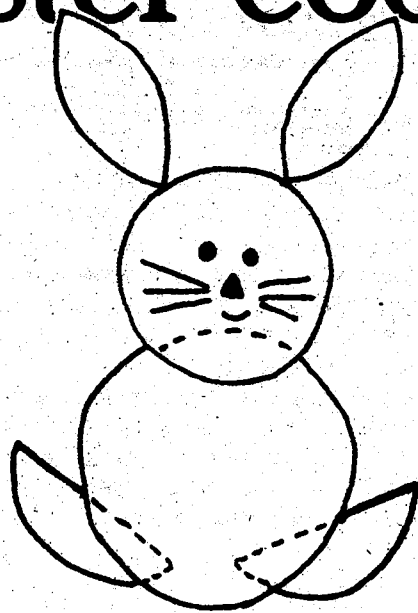
Directions are given for shaping and decorating these four shapes. For directions which include sketches for these and other Easter basket cookie shapes send a stamped, self-addressed business-sized envelope to Pillsbury Easter Basket Cookies, Box 916, Dept. 205, Minneapolis, MN 55460.

What you'll need:

18-oz. roll refrigerated sugar cookies
Ready-to-spread frosting, butter cream frosting, or glaze, tinted to desired colors
Cake and cookie decorators or pastry tube and tips and tinted frosting
Decorator candies, gum drops, jelly beans, tinted coconut and tinted sugar.

General Directions:

For easier cutting and shaping, work with part of the dough at a time and refrigerate rest until needed. Slice cookie dough into one-eighth-inch slices. Combine slices as directed to form any of cookie shapes on ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 350 degrees for 8 to 10 minutes or until light golden brown around edges. (Do not overbake.) Cool 1 minute; remove from cookie sheet. Cool completely on rack before decorating.

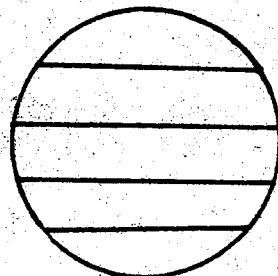
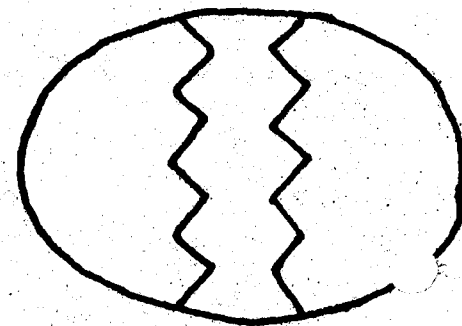
Use 4 slices. Slightly overlap 2 slices to form head and body. Cut remaining slices in half. Place 2 half curved sides out, angled up and just underneath lower body for feet. Shape 2 halves into "petal" shape, place just touching head for ears.

Bake. Cool on rack. Frost with vanilla frosting. Use pink for feet and inner ears. Make eyes, nose with jelly beans; bow and whiskers with frosting using decorator writing tip.

Easter egg

Use 1 slice. Shape into an oval to form egg. Bake. Cool on rack. Frost or glaze. Trim with decorator tip and candies.

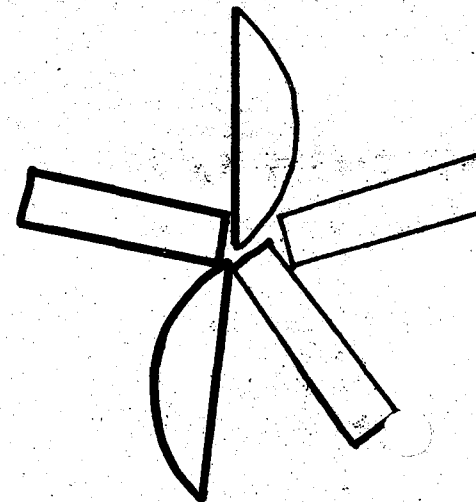
For glaze, combine 16.5 oz. can ready-to-spread frosting with one-third cup water. Mix well. Place cookies on cooling rack over waxed paper. Spread glaze evenly over cookies. Allow to dry for 4 hours or overnight.



Daisy

Use 1 slice. Cut into 5 strips. Evenly arrange strips in spoke fashion to form daisy.

Bake. Cool on rack. Frost or glaze. Trim with decorator tip and candies.

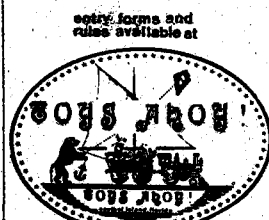

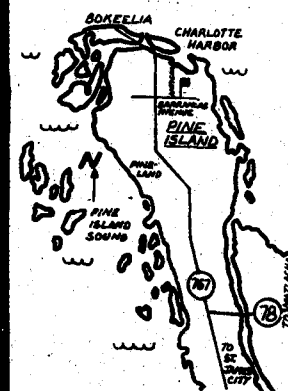

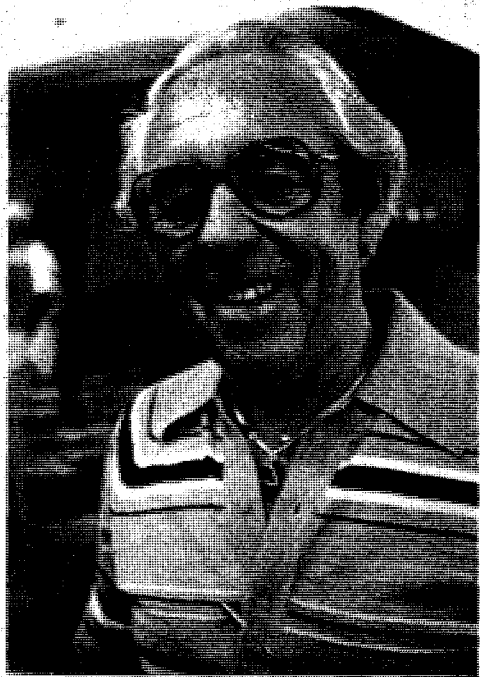

flowering trees of spring



Warm breezes of spring bring forth an abundance of color and fragrance from many of Florida's flowering trees, says Charles W. Dunn, Executive Vice President of the Florida Nurseryman and Growers Association. It is the time of year of beauty and fragrance enjoyed by both visitors and residents. Drive from the northern most part of the state to the tip of Key West and you will find an array of trees in bloom.

As you enter the state, the dogwood and the redbud trees greet you with their beautiful flowers. Look along the sides of the highways, under the canopy of tall pines and oaks for this native resident. There are many shades of white within the dogwood blossom. The size of the bracts also varies. The home owner will enjoy this tree if it is planted in the landscape. A word of caution—pink dogwood does not grow well in Florida. It should also be mentioned that dogwoods (redbuds, too) grow well only from the area north of Orlando to the Georgia line.

Redbuds are like the dogwood—they are a canopy tree and do best when planted under pines. Occasionally, good trees can be seen in open area, but their greatest beauty is often among other trees. The delicate pink color of the redbud blossom adds to nature's natural beauty.

Native plums dress in pure white flowers before any leaves appear. The mahogany color of the bare branches serve to accent the pure white of the flowers. Plum trees grow everywhere. They can be

found along fence rows, in abandoned fields, and yes, even in the home grounds.

As you progress farther down the state, the flowering trees take on a new splendor. There is the giant group of baumias. The Hong Kong orchid tree (a baumia) is still in flower with brilliant purplish red flowers literally covering the branches. It will continue to flower until late April. There are other baumias. Look for the white ones that sometimes appear from a distance to be a dogwood. Many shades of pink flowers adorn other baumias. Some of the trees are giants and grow to a height of fifty or sixty feet. These are not a tree for the dooryard but for parks and other areas. Most of the baumias produce flowers without leaves on the tree.

The exotic African tulip tree stands high above

many of the other trees in the tropical area of Florida. It is a giant. Where it does not freeze, the tree can easily reach a height of seventy-five feet and will be covered with tuliplike bright orange flowers. The dark glossy green leaves serve to accent the orange flowers.

Early flowering Tabebuias brighten the landscape with their intense yellow flowers. Like the other trees, they flower without leaves on the branches.

Enjoy the beauty of spring in Florida. The many flowering trees signal that warm weather is on its way and the beauty is your to enjoy. Make plans now to visit your nursery and purchase a flowering tree for your home grounds. The time to buy is when the tree is in bloom.

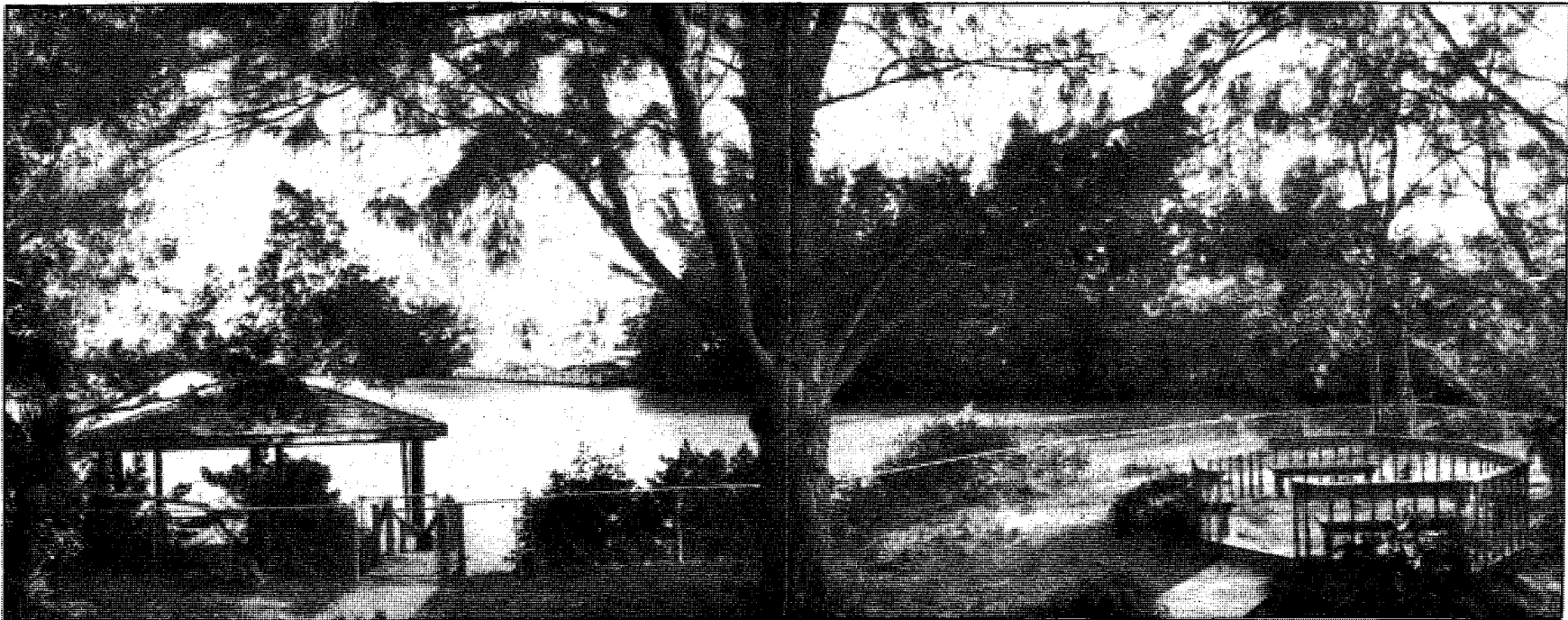

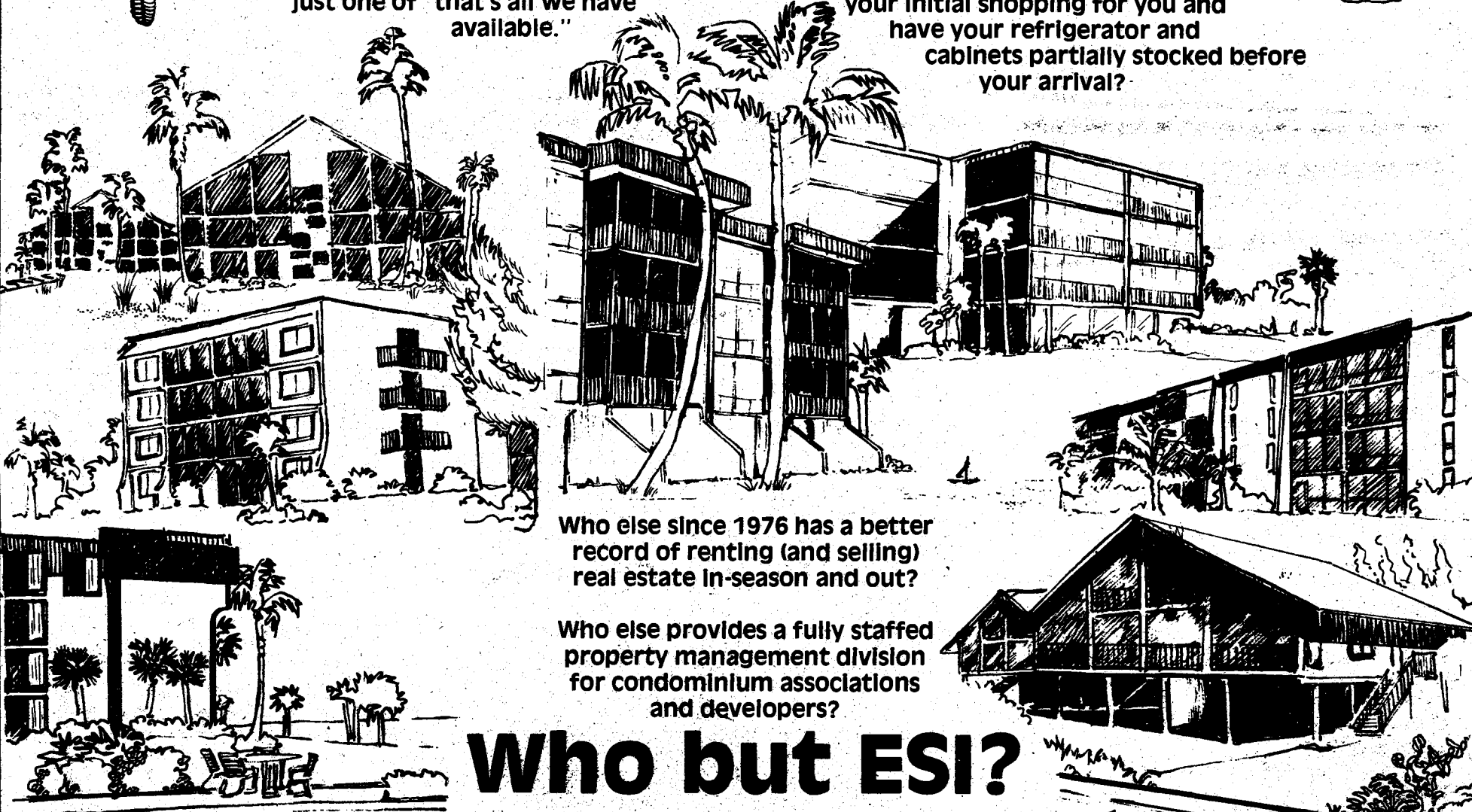

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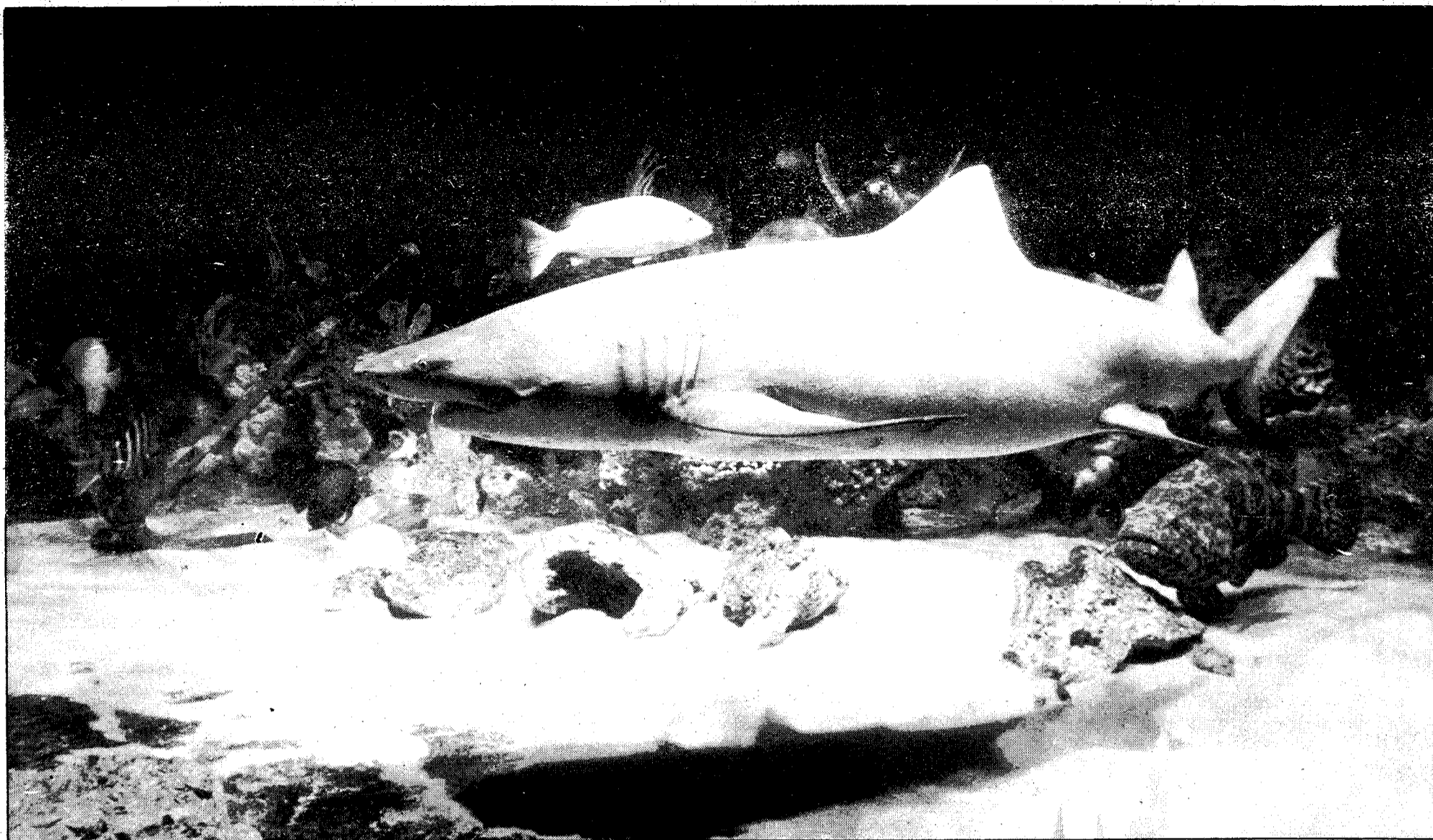

LAYTON (Long Key), Fla. (Dec. 31, 1978) — Sea World Inc. today opened to the public the grounds of its collecting and research center called Sea World's Shark Institute. Located in the Florida Keys, the Institute is the fourth marine life park to be established by the San Diego-based company. It will be managed by Sea World of Florida, itself located in Orlando, near Walt Disney World.

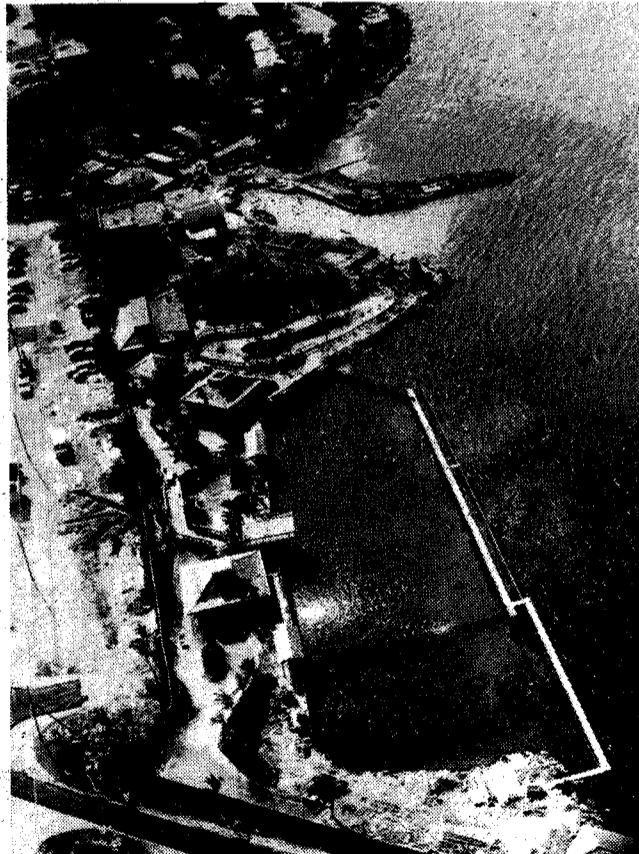
The Institute, developed at a cost of \$1.3 million, is sited on a 6.5-acre parcel of which 3 acres are submerged lands. In the major display basin, the Shark Lagoon, such shark species as lemon, bull, tiger, nurse, brown and bonnethead are exhibited. The 300-ft. long natural cove is bordered by wooden docks and an elevated lookout point called the Shark Watch. Daily feedings by Institute curatorial staff are scheduled to allow the public to observe animal health and maintenance procedures.

Onshore, in a protected, serpentine moat called the Shark Shallows, smaller (though not necessarily less aggressive) species of sharks, rays, skates and sawfish are displayed. Crisscrossed by a series of wooden footbridges, the Shallows was designed to allow the closest, yet safest possible viewing of the shark and his cartilaginous kin.

Because the Shallows is built of a highly porous material, its water level would ordinarily be governed by tidal action. And since low tides would mean unacceptably low water levels in the Shallows, Institute technicians have installed a pump which pours 2,500 gallons of fresh seawater into the Shallows each minute. In addition to maintaining the water level, the pump enhances natural filtration processes by aerating water as it is discharged over a series of spillways. Daily tests of water quality are made to assure toxic animal wastes do not upset natural chemical balance.

In the 10,000-gallon aquarium known as the Coral Reef, anemones, crabs, turtles and the brilliantly colored tropical fish which personify the coral reefs of the tropics are displayed. The exhibit, in fact, is a re-creation of just such a reef. Here, as elsewhere on the Institute grounds, Seamaid or other narrators will detail such phenomena as the aquatic food chain, adaptive coloration or territoriality.

Nearby, at the World of the Sea, smaller aquariums house fish representative of the world's oceans. Called jewel tanks after the exotic fish and invertebrates which inhabit them, these smaller aquariums feature marine life ranging from the tiny seahorse to *Octopus vulgaris*, the common octopus. Many guests will

recognize from visits to other Sea World parks such species as the pink anemone, clownfish and the intimidating moray eel.

Estuarial marine life, too, is featured in a re-created Caribbean Tidepool. Similar see-and-touch exhibits at the three other Sea Worlds have proven immensely popular in the company's education programs. Starfish, crabs and other invertebrates may be examined in the Tidepool at very close range.

Because of different husbandry requirements the Tidepool and all aquariums are on separate filtration systems. Water in the major display basins, the Shark Lagoon and Shark Shallows, is filtered naturally and is also cleansed by tidal action and aeration. In addition, the mechanical aeration assures uniform water temperatures in those basins, a critical factor in the display of sharks which tend to settle to cooler, bottom waters.

Access to Sea World's Shark Institute is through an entrance plaza housing ticket offices and a gift shop. A food and beverage pavilion is located just inside the main gate.

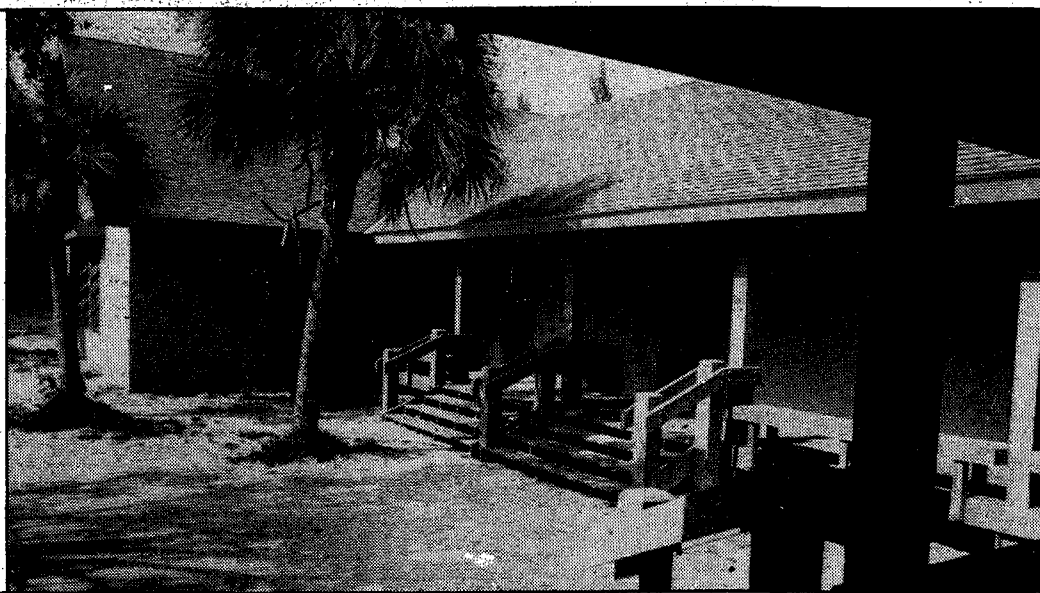
Guests who have visited other Sea World parks will recognize the landscaping expertise which characterizes those properties. Grounds Superintendent Martin Schwerthoffer and his crews have planted nearly 3,000 trees, shrubs and ground cover plants, importing nearly 300 tons of topsoil to enhance growing.

Because saltwater intrusion is a major consideration in plant maintenance, all plants were selected for their resistance to both airborne and subterranean sea water. In addition, grounds have been left in as natural state as possible. Where in the Orlando park, for example, concrete or asphalt sidewalks present no problem relative to freshwater ground level, wooden decks or gravelled pathways have been built at the Institute to assure minimum disruption to the absorption process. Moreover, the site was selected (after consideration of 15 others) because it could be developed with minimal disturbance to the delicate ecological balance of the Keys.

Under consideration for future development are an above-ground shark aquarium (similar to that completed earlier this year at Sea World

Sanibel community church will dedicate new building April 8



Sanibel Community Church achieves a milestone in its 62-year old history when the new all-purpose building is dedicated on Sunday, April 8. The public is invited to attend the dedication and the open house which follows.

Reverend Bruce Milligan will open the dedication ceremonies at 3 p.m., with Philip Johnson, chairman, chairman of the Building Committee, and Jerry Wierman, chairman of the Church Council, participating. Tours of the recently completed building and expanded and renovated existing facilities, and refreshments will follow the dedication.

As the first formalized church on Sanibel, the Community Church congregation originally received pastoral services from visiting ministers. The non-denominational congregation grew and ultimately decided that a permanent church building should be erected. In 1917, lumber was brought over to the Island by barge from the mainland. Mule teams hauled the building material from the landing at San Carlos Bay to

the church's present site on Periwinkle Way. The church members themselves--many of whom were homesteading--actually constructed the building.

That building still comprises the main part of the sanctuary of Sanibel Community Church. Transepts were added later on, in 1972, the sanctuary

was enlarged and several small classrooms included.

The original wood paneling on the inside of the church still remains, with the new portions echoing the same finishing.

As the Island population continued to grow, a need was seen for the ex-

pansion of both facilities and services of the Church and, in 1975, plans were started for the new all-purpose building. Finally, in the summer of 1977 plans were completed and the actual construction began in January, 1978.

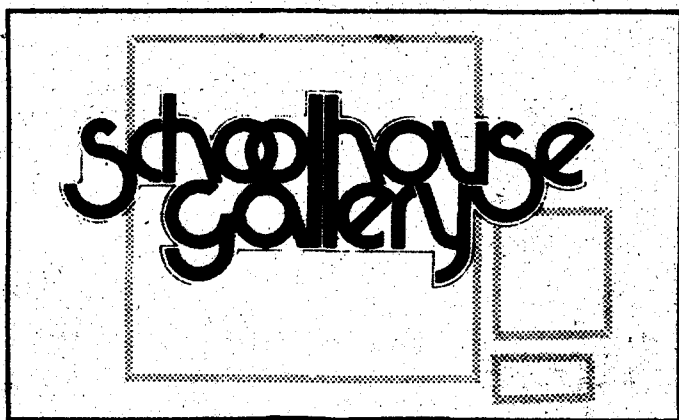
The new all-purpose building, which is connected to the sanctuary by a covered deck, contains a large general meeting room, children's area, classrooms, and kitchen. Renovated facilities will provide a church office, pastoral study, and an additional classroom.

New lighting fixtures, carpeting and other fittings have been added to the sanctuary. In both the new and old buildings, the architecture and materials were planned to complement the natural, rural atmosphere of the original church building.

Sanibel Community Church has become familiar place to many of the Island's visitors and part-time residents; and the church officers and congregation invite the community to share in the special occasion of this dedication.

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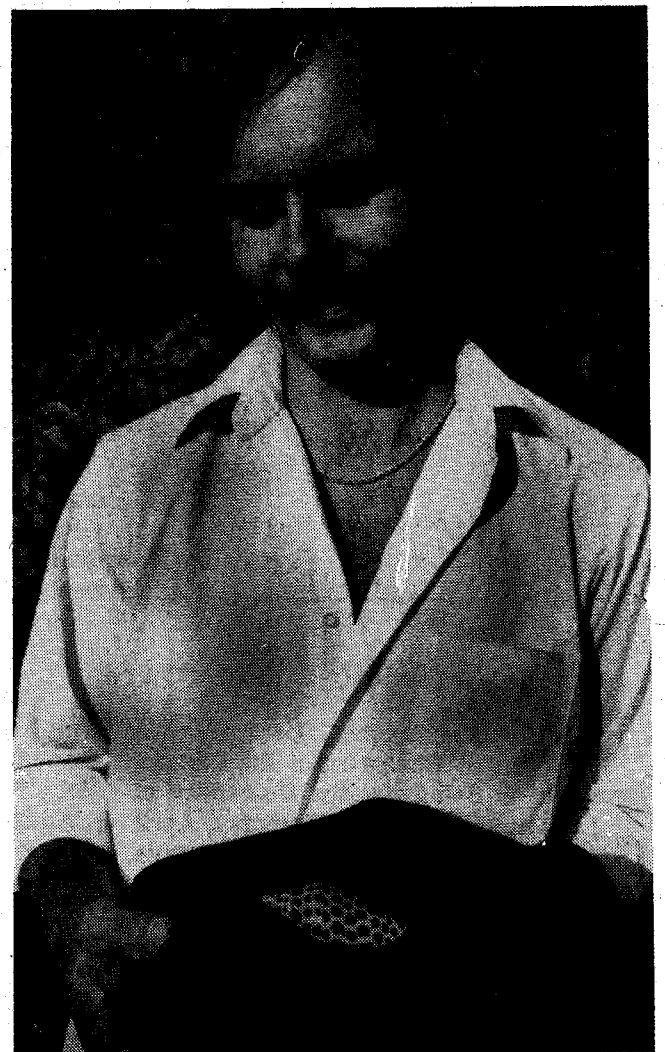
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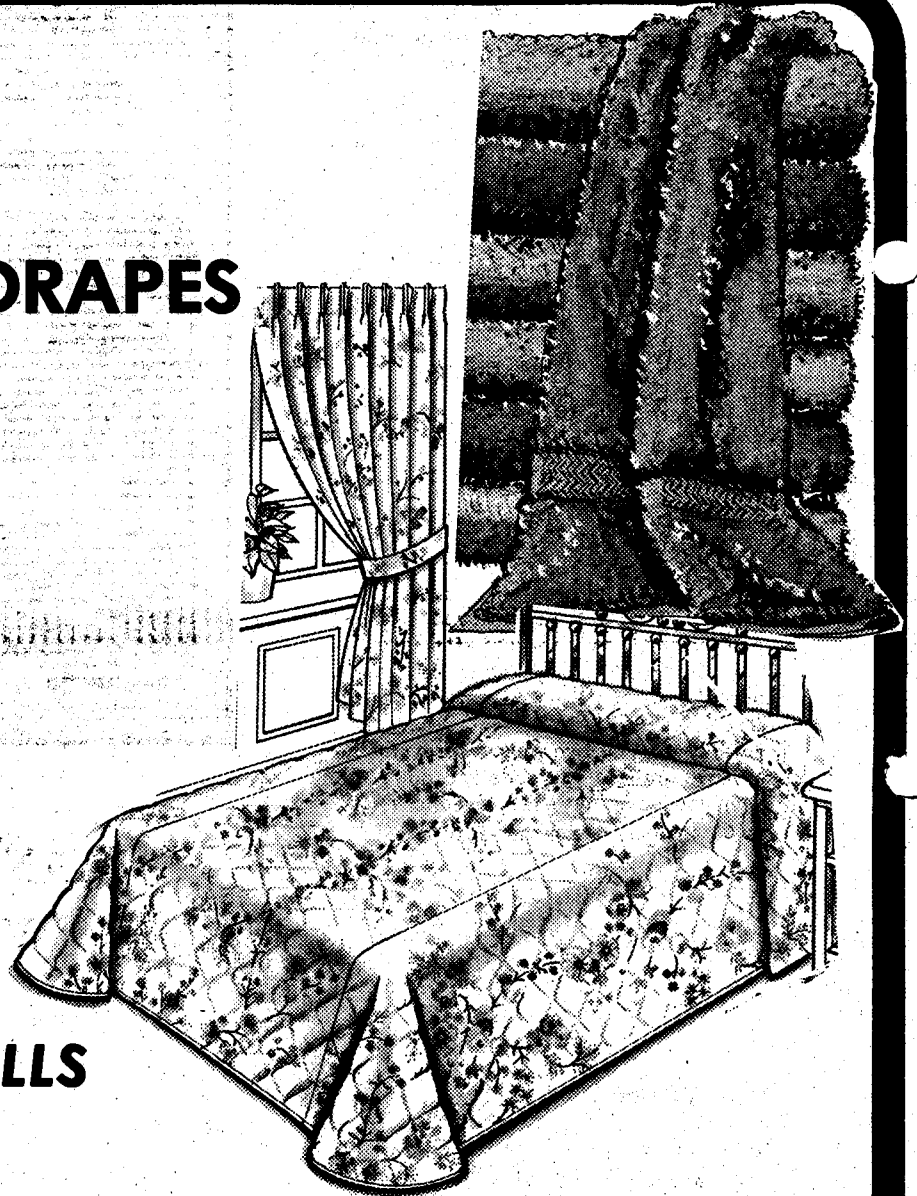
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Debbie McQuade becomes bride of Brad Gleason

South took the ace of clubs, drew trumps, cashed the ace of diamonds and lost a diamond finesse to the queen. East returned the ten of hearts, and South had to lose either a heart or a diamond. Down one.

ODD FINESSE

South should take the ace of clubs, two trumps and a club ruff. Then he leads the deuce of diamonds from dummy.

Quick Knitted Shawl

Many of my customers want to make a shawl for evening wear but lament that they can't crochet. Well, cheer up, because this shawl, even though it looks like lacy crochet, is knitted. And it is knitted on large needles making a fast project. The edges are crocheted with easy chain stitches. Perhaps a friend could edge it for you if you can't crochet, or I'll teach you how in 15 minutes.

Any yarn is suitable. It's fun to experiment with different colors and textures. You need approximately 4 ounces. I used light blue mohair for the one in the picture. Sparkle yarn would also work well. As you knit, write down the row number which you are working and COUNT YOUR STITCHES AT THE END OF EVERY ROW! There should be two more stitches each time. If you make a mistake, pull out the stitches to the purl row and carefully pick up the right amount.

Beginning at lower back, cast on 7 stitches, with size 19 needles.

Row 1: Knit 2 together, yarn over (as if you were going to knit), knit 3, yarn over, slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over — 7 stitches.

Row 2 AND ALL EVEN ROWS: Purl across increasing in first and last stitch.

Row 3: Increase in first stitch, Knit 2, yarn over, slip 1, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over, yarn over, knit 2, increase in last stitch — 11 stitches.

Row 5: Increase in first stitch, knit 1, yarn over, slip 1, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over, yarn over, knit 3; repeat from * end last repeat with knit 1, increase in last stitch — 15 stitches.

Row 7: Increase in first stitch; repeat from * in row 5 and end the last stitch with an increase — 19 stitches.

Row 9: Increase in first stitch, knit 2 together, yarn over, knit 3; repeat from * in Row 5 to within last 3 stitches, yarn over, knit 2 together, increase in last stitch — 23 stitches.

Row 11: Increase in first stitch, yarn over, knit 2 together, knit 2; repeat from * in Row 5 to within last 8 stitches, yarn over, slip 1, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over, yarn over, knit 2, knit 2 together, yarn over, increase in last stitch — 27 stitches.

Row 13: Knit 1, yarn over, knit 3; repeat from * in Row 5 to within last stitch, yarn over, knit 1 — 31 stitches.

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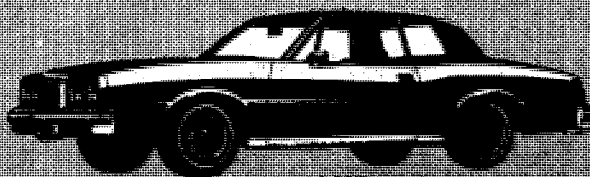
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Row 15: Increase in first stitch, knit 2, repeat from in Row 5, end last repeat increase in last stitch — 35 stitches.

Row 17: Repeat Row 5 — 39 stitches.

Row 18: Repeat Row 2.

Repeat rows 7-18 for pattern until there are 97 stitches on the needle; end with a purl row. Bind off loosely as to knit.

EDGING: With right side facing, work 1 row of single crochet loosely with a K hook, across the bound-off edge. Do not tie off. Work ruffle on the side edges as follows:

Row 1: Chain 5, double crochet in edge of last row of shawl, chain 3, double crochet in edge 3/4" from last double crochet; repeat from along both edges.

Row 2: Chain 7, turn, double crochet in first chain space, chain 4, double crochet in next space; repeat from along both edges.

Row 3: Chain 8, turn, single crochet in first chain space, chain 5, single crochet in next chain space; repeat from along both sides. Tie off.

Donation for the catered meal will be \$12.50 per adult and \$5.00 per child up to age 12.

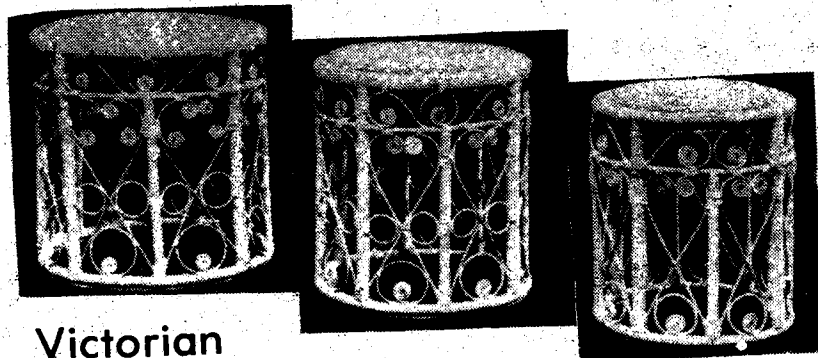

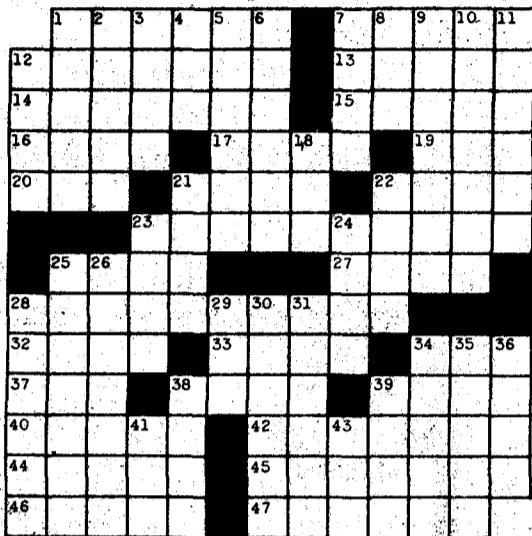

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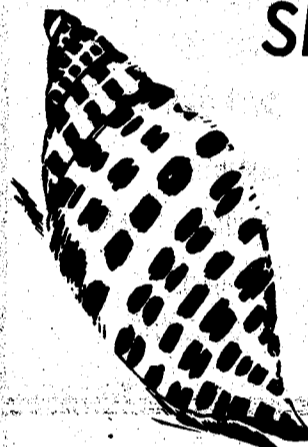
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TAX TIP OF THE WEEK

QUESTION: Each year at Christmas I give my customers ballpoint pens with my name printed on them. The pens cost me a total of \$100. I am a car salesman and am paid on a commission basis. Can I deduct the cost of the pens if I do not itemize on my income tax return?



ANSWER: Sorry. Since a car salesman does not qualify as an "outside salesman" (one who does his selling away from the employer's place of business), your entertainment and income-production expenses are not permitted as adjustments to income. But the cost of the pens, if they otherwise qualify is deductible as a miscellaneous expense if you itemize.

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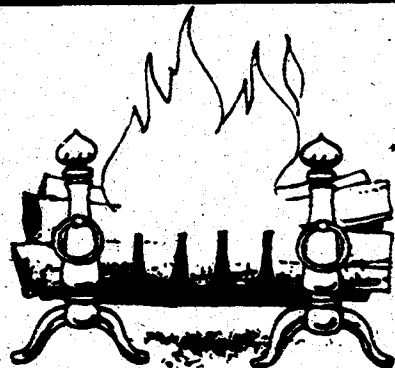


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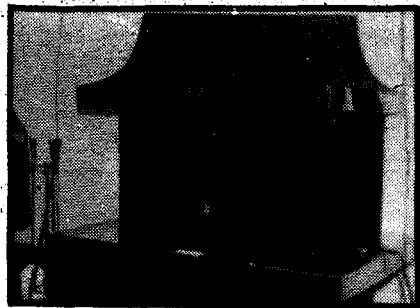
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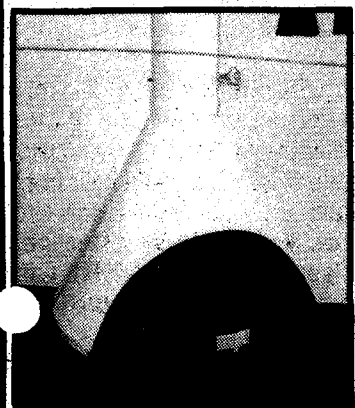
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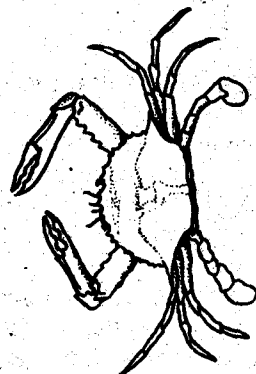
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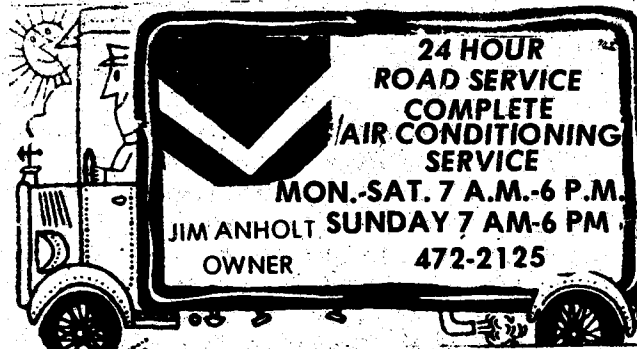
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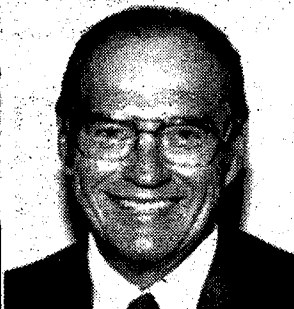

# shelling tips

by capt. mike fuery



Probably the most widely known and easiest recognized shell on the Sanibel and Captiva Island beaches is the sand dollar, but careless handling and poor processing after this shell is found often spoils this specimen.

This week, let's look at where to find these strange shells and how to process them so you have a well preserved shell for many years.

First, as with any shell you might come upon on the beach, the sand dollar is found on all beaches at all times of the year. However, some beaches seem to have more than others. The Bowman's Beach area, a few miles south of Blind Pass, seems to have as many as any. The middle, gulf beach on Cayo Costa Island is another dependable beach for these shells.

You who like to walk in waist deep water often come upon live dollars. Don't wear shoes because you'll need your toes to dig into the sand to locate sand dollars. Often, on the insides of the islands, a person can see a sand dollar's outline just under the sand and of course that makes it much easier than blind wading off shore.

I personally have never found a live

sand dollar smaller than say a quarter coin size. But, it's not so unusual to locate a dead, perfectly bleached sand dollar the size of a dime. These are very valuable as collector's shells and break with the slightest touch, so be careful.

When I find a live sand dollar, I put it in an old bucket and cover it completely with Clorox bleach. Let it stay in there for several hours and you have a pure white shell. Then I brush on a solution of half water and half Elmer's glue. That gives it a little strength and a slight sheen.

At one time, a couple of years ago, Sanibel was going to shift its entire economy to sand dollar currency where you bought everything from gas to groceries with sand dollars. This idea was later abandoned because with inflation, the sand dollar isn't worth what it used to be.

Good shelling this week and be careful with those sand dollars. They make an interesting addition to your collection.

## MAP OF SANIBEL & CAPTIVA



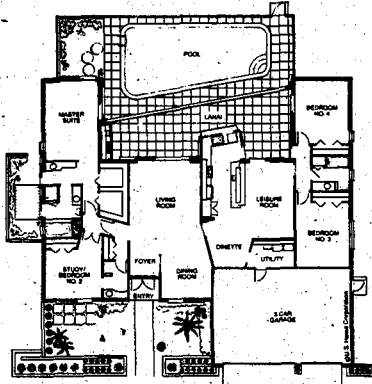


of San Diego and to that scheduled for construction at Sea World of Florida in 1979) and a marine mammal research facility. Sharks for the San Diego aquarium were collected by the Institute aquarium staff, then flown to California in what was the largest shipment of sharks in history.

In addition to stocking research and display basins, the Institute staff will collect sharks for qualified zoos and aquariums and educational and research institutions around the world. Laboratories and dormitories for use by visiting research teams are available for incidental or short term use.

Sea World President David M. DeMotte said development plans for the Institute, originally conceived only as a collecting facility, were first broadened to include research activity, then again to include public viewing. "Essentially, we'll adhere to the same principles we've followed in our Orlando, San Diego and Aurora (Ohio) parks whereby revenues from public

admissions are used in part to underwrite the research side of the Institute."

Sea World's Shark Institute is 68½ miles north of Key West and 90 miles south of Miami, both major tourist destinations themselves. Hours are 9 a.m. to dusk daily. Admission is \$3.50 for adults; \$2.25 for children 4-12. Parking is free.
