


## caretta severs ties with Captran by gwen stevenson

Caretta Research, Inc., a non-profit organization dedicated to the study and protection of loggerhead turtles (known scientifically as caretta caretta) has severed its ties with Captran, Inc. which had been supporting Caretta's hatchery program.

The action came as a result of a letter from Captran's environmental specialist, Don Deitlein to Caretta protesting a remark made by Caretta project director Charles LeBuff in a local newspaper that Captran's support helped "offset some of the damage done by development." It was suggested by Deitlein that a letter to the editor

clarifying that LeBust was not referring specifically to Captran development might be in order. Instead, at the direction of Caretta president, Richard Beatty and the Caretta Board of Directors, LeBust returned the Captran donation July 23.

"Deitlein's letter brought a great deal of reaction in Caretta," said LeBuff, "and it was Beatty who insisted that we return the check and break relations between Caretta and Captran." Captran and Caretta have been involved the last three years in the installation of artificial hat-

## council to select city manager today

City Council will today select a replacement for departing city manager Bill Nungester during what promises to be a fairly heated discussion.

According to Sanibel Mayor Duane White, the most recent interpretation of the charter precludes the council's appointment of an "acting" or "interim" manager although they have done that before. "It is our feeling now, however, that when you don't have a city manager, you don't have the right to appoint an acting city manager," White said, adding, however, that today's appointment will be made with the definite understanding that the council has put out advertisements and the appointment will be reviewed by the council after they have had a chance to study the resumes and conduct interviews.

White's best "guestimate" was that this procedure would be completed in "three to four months."

Assistant City Manager Gary Price has been named as the most logical choice to succeed Nungester but Planning Commissioner Don Manchester who recently resigned from his real estate position and IWA general manager Ralph Zeiss have also been mentioned as contenders. Zeiss says that he is not interested in the job. "Nothing could be further from the truth," Zeiss said when questioned about his reported interest in the position. "I believe this city needs a properly credentialed city manager." Manchester could not be reached for comment at press time.

Also on today's council agenda will be discussions about the road program and ad velorum taxes.

## gas stations rotate Sunday openings

In an attempt to forestall the problem of tourists becoming both angry and stranded on the Islands, the Sanibel-Captiva Chamber of Commerce has arranged with Sanibel's three full service gasoline stations to remain open on Sundays on a rotating basis. Three Star will also be open as long as their gas supplies hold out.

Chamber president Fred Valtin held a meeting last week with the owners of the three service stations and Three Star to work out a rotating schedule that began last Sunday with the Exxon station remaining open from 9 a.m. until 5 p.m. The cooperating gas stations have also agreed to monitor their gas supplies during the week and to shut down the station for a half day or more if the station whose turn it is finds themselves running short during the preceeding week.

"I am very gratified at the way this meeting went and most grateful to the station owners for being so forthcoming in their cooperation," said Valtin. "They are doing so at some inconvenience and extra cost to themselves. On behalf of the Chamber of Commerce, the island business community and the island population in general, I wish to express sincerest appreciation."

The action was instituted because the Chamber was receiving calls from tourists in the north and east of Florida who wanted to determine that they would be able to procure

gas for trips homeward after their island stay. That was impossible, according to Valtin, because for several weeks Island garages have been closed on Sunday. "Even Three Star has often had to close shortly after opening," Valtin said, although he added that Three Star owner Jim Robson felt he would be able to increase his Sunday hours because at least one other station would share

the load. The rotation schedule also applies to holidays.

Valtin is also requesting that Governor Bob Graham increase the Islands' gas allocations by 40,000 to 50,000 gallons per month which would return the Islands to their 1978 allocation point. Valtin said that he will point out to the Governor that the Star station allocation system,

while working well for the remainder of the state, does not help a dead-end island like Sanibel. Valtin said that he plans to remind the Governor that the Islands also need the extra gas allocations because of tourism and to ensure that there would be enough gas to evacuate both residents and visitors in the event of an approaching burricane.

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

cheries to protect the dwindling loggerhead population. Caretta moves loggerhead turtle eggs threatened by high tides to hatcheries on higher, drier ground. In addition to the \$700 donation for transplanting, Captran has also provided the sites for the transplanted eggs

The transplanting of the eggs has met with little success thus far because heavy rains have claimed the turtles' eggs. The 18-inch Labor Day rains of 1977 and rainfall last year that permeated the sand at the hatcheries drowned both young turtles and embryoes. This year, the hatchery has moved to Sanibel Beach Club II, which LeBuff felt more suitable, but he said Friday that he had not moved any eggs there this year.

Loggerhead nesting season runs from the first week in May until the first week in August and LeBuff said last Saturday night marked the last regular beach patrol for the season. Beachfront development can confuse the female turtle because, after laying her eggs, she depends on the light from the sea to show her where to go. Illumination from houses and apartments on the shore can lead her away from the water to danger from predators or dehydration inland.

Captran president Keith Trowbridge said from California last weekend that he felt the Caretta's action was a "cheap shot, given what we've done for them." Trowbridge explained that Captran has never requested anything from Caretta in return for their donations and "We felt that we weren't any more responsible for (Gulf-front) development than anyone else and we were responsible for funding Caretta more than anyone," he said. Trowbridge said that he would apply the \$700 donation to another Island cause. Captran has donated \$5000 to the Conservation Foundation and \$2000 to the Children's Center.

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

The following letter was given to the ISLANDER for publication.

The Honorable Bob Graham Governor of the State of Florida The Capitol Tallahassee, Florida 32304

Dear Governor Graham:

This is an urgent appeal for action on your part to alleviate the critical gasoline shortage on Sanibel and Captiva Islands.

As you may know, these islands are confined areas off the coast at Fort

Myers, and their economic welfare is entirely dependent on tourism.

The only access to and egress from these islands is by car via a three mile causeway. Your welcome Florida Travelers Station emergency system does help to get the tourist to the islands, but the current gasoline supply on the islands does not ensure their getting home or to Travelers Stations along the way. This lack of assurance critically affects the islands' business community.

I am most earnestly requesting your consideration of an immediate additional allocation of 40-50,000

gallons per month (over and above the current allocation), to be made available to the gas stations on the two islands. This additional gallonage would only bring the total allocation close to the 1978 level, but it would undoubtedly prove of immense help in ensuring the continued economic viability of the islands.

I also feel constrained to point out that such additional gallonage would offer much greater security to the islands during this hurricane season. Evacuation of the islands by both residents and tourists without an adequate supply of gasoline may well prove impossible.

In view of these circumstances, I respectfully request your immediate consideration of the islands' urgent need for an additional monthly gasoline allocation.

If you and your staff need additional information, I will be glad to have it compiled for you.


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
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## officials file financial disclosure

Sanibel's appointed and elected officials and city employees all met the July deadline for filing financial disclosure forms with Planning Commissioners Ray Fenton, Joe Searing and Judy Workman getting their forms to the Lee County Courthouse on the deadline day of July 16.

Usually, the deadline for filing financial disclosure is July 15 unless. as in this case, the fifteenth does not fall on a regular business day.

Councilman Francis Bailey listed the Sanibel Packing Co., the Santiva Minimart and Bailey, Bailey, Bailey and Muhler Real Estate as the primary sources of his income.A fourth source was illegible. His form was received July 13.

Neal Bowen, who filed May 18, listed no other income than his city position and no creditors.

The Ohio manufacturing concern of Searns and Foster was listed by council member Zee Butler as her primary source of income. Mrs. Butler was cited in a complaint by fired city employee Steve Maxwell last year as failing to file full financial disclosure. The charge was dropped after an Ethics Commission investigation.

Council member Porter Goss, who was also cited in an Ethics Commission complaint by the same individual and who was also completely cleared, listed investment accounts at Pittsburgh National Bank, capital gains from the sale of Casa Turquesa Motel and the Island Reporter as well as trust accounts in the Mellon and Pittsburgh National Banks as the sources of his income for 1979.

Planning Commissioner Ray Fenton listed his architectural firm of Fenton and White, and its parent Ohio company, as the source of his income with three development firms - Mariner Properties, Sanibel, Seago, Fort Myers and Cadwell, Fort Myers Beach as the source of his firm's business income. Fenton also listed a description of the clients that he had represented before the Planning Commission, including Rufus Doddrill, Edward Cooke and the Lions Club.

Council member Charles LeBuff listed no other income other than his U.S. government salary and no creditors.

Commissioner Don Manchester listed Knudsen Realty as his source of income. Manchester last week announced his resignation as president and officer in that firm.

City Manager Bill Nungester listed no other income source other than that of his city salary and a mortgage committment to Gulf Federal under creditors.

Planning Commissioner Betty Robinson named social security and Mutual Life Insurance for income and, as intangible property, certificates of deposit in local banks as well as savings accounts in area banks, U.S. government bonds and stock in Standard Brands.

Assistant City Manager Gary Price cited the City of Sanibel and Hillsborough County as the source of his 1979 income. He also named a lot in Los Conchas del Mar subdivision under real property assets. Real property only has to be listed if it is other than a residence or a vacation home and if the official owns in

excess of five percent of the property's recently assessed value.

Planning Commissioner Joe Searing has named a pension from Associated Drygoods, Norwood Associates, social security and the West Wind Inn as his income sources.

Commissioner Twink Underhill cited State of Oregon bonds, stock and notes in the Unpressured Cooker and savings and checking accounts in local banks under "intangible property assests."

Sanibel Mayor Duane White wrote down income from the mortgage and notes on the sale of Casa Blanca Resort as well as stock in the Island Reporter (known corporately as Island Press and Publicity) and a note from the Orlando Sentinel Star for the sale of the Island Reporter last year as his income. White also listed three residential lots located north of Periwinkle Way and west of Ferry Rd. as real property. White's

form was filed July 13.

Planning Commission Chairman Ann Winterbotham listed her income sources as the United States Trust Co. in New York and First City National Bank in Houston.

Commissioner Judy Workman listed revenues from the Unpressured Cooker as an income source.

City Engineer Harold Bassman listed a Sandalfoot condominium as real property while Sanibel Police Chief John Butler cited a Columbus, Ohio police pension fund as an income source. Butler also listed lots he owns all or part of in Matlacha Shores and Sanibel Harbors.

Sanibel Fire Chief Allen Nave listed his income sources as Nave Plumbing and Sanibel Square as well as real property he owns at the corner of Periwinkle Way and Tarpon Bay Road, Fort Myers Shores and Nave Plumbing and Sanibel Square.

#### IWA granted emergency shut-down authority

Island Water Association (IWA) General Manager Ralph Zeiss won the County's authorization to shut down water treatment operations on Sanibel and Captiva in the event of a threa tened disaster. authorization will come from either the Commissioners or their appointed Disaster Preparedness Coordinator.

According to the resolution adopted last Wednesday, a disaster means the occurrence or imminent threat of widespread or severe damage, injury or loss of life as a result of, but not limited to, fires, floods, winds, wave action, explosions, earthquakes, epidemics, contamination, radiation accidents or enemy attacks.

County Attorney Jim Yaeger told the Commissioners that he had no legal objections to the IWA proposal and it passed unanimously on a motion from Commissioner Harry Rodda.


bailey appointed photography director

## Tombstones speak louder than words

John Alex Ilyin (Jan. 24, 1889 - Nov. 11, 1966)


Georgia Johnson (March 7, 1842 - Jan. 10, 1910)




A Woodmen of the World memorial marks the grave of Newton Rutland in the old Sanibel Cemetery. The inscription "At Rest" tells of the family's hope for a better life for the man who lived from March 8, 1892 until October 23, 1915.

Newton's mother Irene had come to Sanibel with her husband in 1896 from West Apopka, Florida. Othman Rutland died in 1897 leaving Irene to raise a family of five children - Pearly, Katie, Marguerite, Newton and Clarence. Irene went into the turkey business after her husbands death and later remarried to Henry Shanahan, a widowed Irishman with seven children of his own.



The double graves of infants Talma and Alma Carter, who lived but for a day, can be found in the Captiva cemetery alongside their parents George and Elizabeth. The Carters were one of the first families to homestead land on Captiva, having arrived in 1900, and eventually made a good living farming vegetables for market and planting citrus on their 160

George and Elizabeth Carter had eight children, three of whom died, and until the 1921 hurricane three of their sons farmed the property. In 1923 the property was sold to Clarence Chadwick who envisioned the farm a coconut plantation. The Carter-Chadwick property was sold again and eventually named South Seas Plantation. The original Carter home is now part of the South Seas dining room.



The story of how Captain William and found his way to Buck Key, a sickly Herbert Binder first came to Captiva has been lost to legend and local mythology. One story claims that Binder, an Austrian, was traveling a German freighter to New Orleans when it was shipwrecked off from Boca Grande. Unable to swim, he clung to ship wreckage that floated him to Captiva where he lived a Robinson Crusoe existance until he managed to build a boat that eventually took him to Pine Island where he found settlers who helped him return home. Binder had supposedly been shipwrecked as a young boy but returned once again to Captiva as a homesteader in 1888.

Another version of the Binder legend claims that he was indeed shipwrecked and "puny" German speaking Austrian sargeant. So entranced was he with the islands that he chose never to

It is known that Binder had one son, who he seldom saw, and that he homesteaded about 160 acres of what is middle Captiva. His tombstone bears the words "First homesteader, Captiva Island 1888,"but it is a mystery as to whether the words were his wish or that of Hattie Brainard Gore, a long time friend whose family plot Binder is buried in. It is a mystery as to whether the Brainard family or Cpt. Binder was actually the first Captiva homesteader. Binder lived from May 2, 1850 till August 26, 1932.

The B-Hive carries enough brands of beer to inspire great camp songs. Oh, 83 varieties of beer on the shelf, 83 varieties of beer. Take one down and pass...well you know the rest.

B-Hive owner George Kohlbrenner will sell any kind of beer, foreign or domestic that he can get his hands on. He handles all the beers because, "people like the taste of different beers." The variety is also enjoyed by collectors of beer cans and bottles, according to Kohlbrenner.

Even if you don't like beer the names of the beers make interesting reading. 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


#### gault holds one-man show

Dear Madam and Sirs:

We believe that most residents who live on Donax Street or one of it's tributary streets are delighted that the City of Sanibel is moving in the direction of putting a Bike Path along this dangerous street for bikers. The residents of Donax Village certainly approve. We are, however, puzzled as to the placement of the Bike Path on the East side of Donax Street. The East side of Donax Street is almost completely developed with approximately 20 residences, power poles, driveways, mailboxes, and established trees and other vegetation.

The West side of Donax Street is mostly undeveloped, with more clearance in front of existing dwellings, and the rare opportunity to place any new construction a safe distance back from the Bike Path and road. Also, since most of the Middle Gulf Drive bicycle traffic

turns West at Periwinkle Street, a Western placement of the Bike Path on Donax Street would eliminate many bicycles crossing the Donax Street intersection at Periwinkle Street.

We request that full consideration and study be given to:

THE PLACEMENT OF THE DONAX STREET BIKE PATH ON THE WEST SIDE OF DONAX STREET.







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## moderate cost subdivis

Sanibel resident Frank Joyce has joined with Orlando developer William Carroll to design a single family subdivision in the affordable housing range. "I've studied the problem of affordable housing," said Joyce, "and been a victim of it on this island. That gave birth to this plan about seven months ago."

The developers propose a 40-unit subdivision located on Dunlop Rd. across Periwinkle Way from the Sanibel Community Association building. "Most homesites will either be on the lake or situated so they have a view of the lake," Joyce pointed out, adding that prospective buyers may reserve their sites with


a \$250 deposit which will be refunded if the City withholds their approval. The developers are requesting a Specific Amendment to increase the density on the land from the seven units allowed under the comprehensive land use plan to 40. The subdivision will be called Buccaneer Cove.

There will be three models to choose from in the subdivision, ranging in price from \$34,900 to \$44,900. The houses will be pre-cut chalet style homes with a choice of two and three bedrooms. Lot sizes will average 10,000 square feet.

Conditions that the developers plan to attach to the prospective buyers include a priority system for those who have been employed on the island continuously for more than two years, who are not now adequately housed on the island and whose family income is a maximum of \$16,000. The second priority would go to those whose incomes do not exceed \$26,000 or who have worked on the Island for one year.

Restrictions on the resale include no resale for a higher amount than the original purchase price adjusted by the Cost of Living Index, for the Instale years. During the second 10 years, resale prices will be allowed to rise moderately. No remake will be permitted except for reasons of hardship.

Joyce pointed out that Cove was a test case "Cove was a test case don't showcase his homes," he said. It also emphasized that interested buyers should put down their



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


refundable deposit so that they will know for certain if there are buyers for the project. Joyce expects the homes to be ready for occupancy in about seven months, if they are awarded a Specific Amendment and if there are no problems with the City's rate of growth allocations.


No date for the Specific Amend-

ment has been set. Two other moderate cost housing projects that have required Specific Amendments have been recommended by the Planning Commission but stalled at the Council level on the grounds that they are awaiting guidelines from the City's moderate cost housing committee.
