This special night will be one that the IMPACT children will remember for a long, long time.





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

New Years Eve reservations are required for the festivities which will include dinner, entertainment and champagne at midnight. Call 482-9200 for more information.

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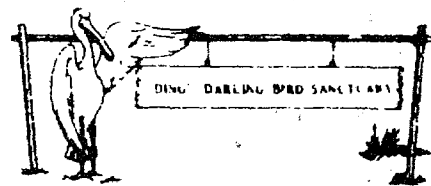

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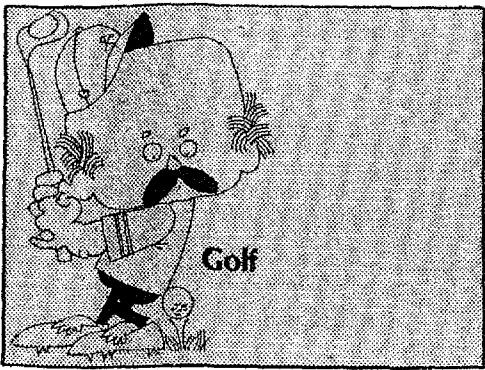
Large lot near beach easement \$22,500

Bob Marye hit closest to the pin on the seventh hole and Stan Condit was the closest on the fourth hole.

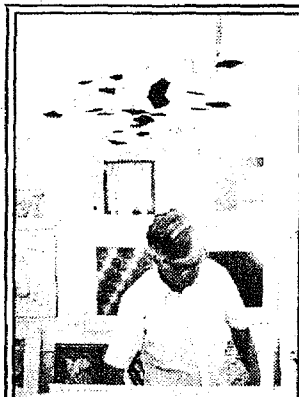
Ira Hartman took the high individual honors at plus five.

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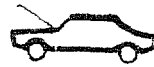
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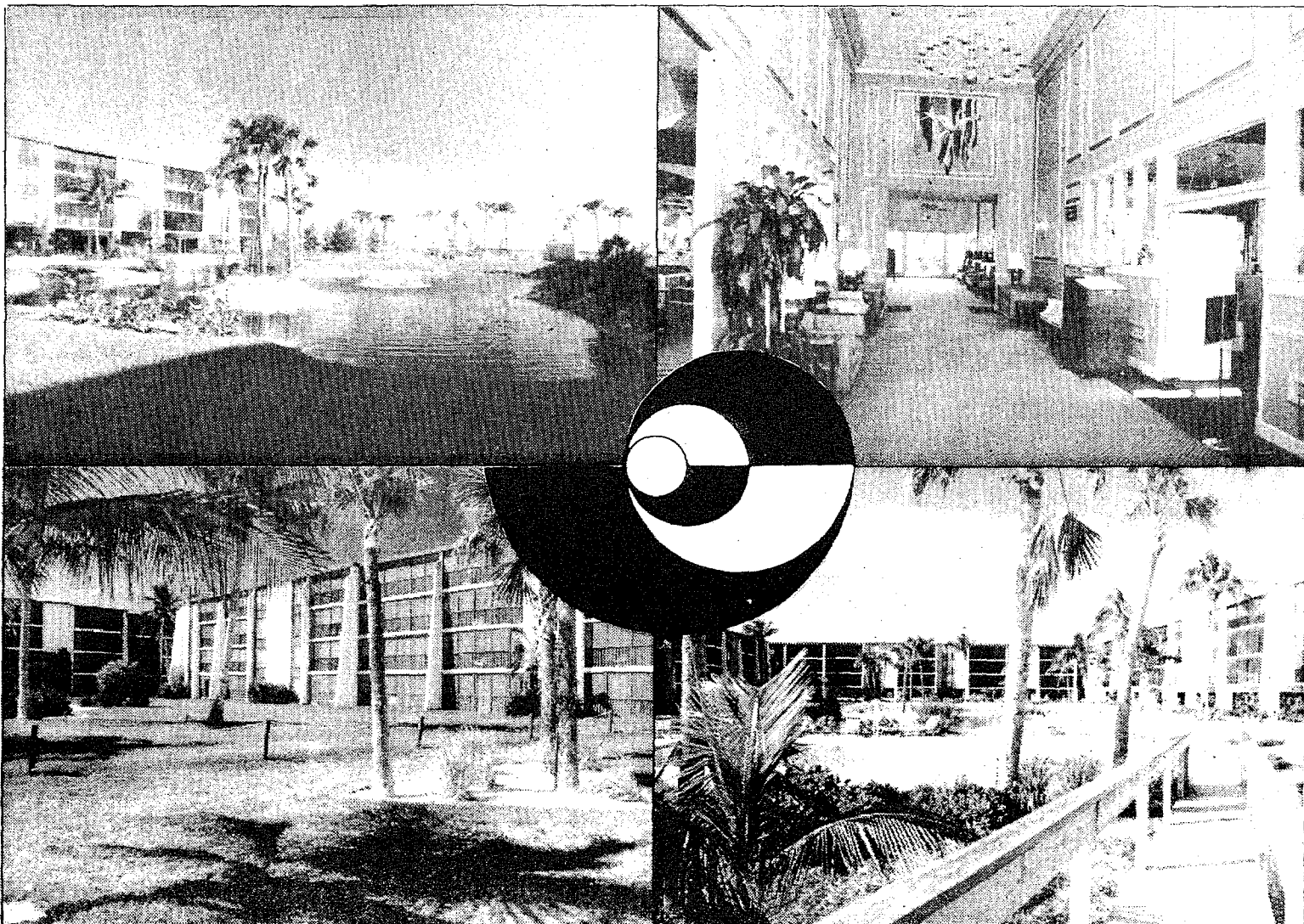
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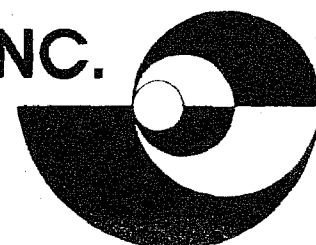
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# On the water

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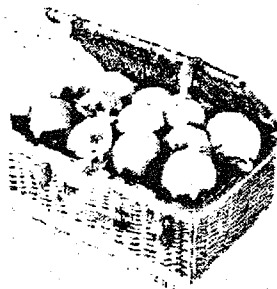
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# Shelling Tips

I never seem to tire of the strange names that people give shells and sometimes I think that the new names are better than the originals.

One of my favorites is the coquina shell. These are those little highly colorful shells which live in the surf line along the Gulf beaches. You can literally find hundreds of them - everyone a different color or pattern - and there's never a shortage of them.

But where do these names come from? The other day a little girl and her mother were out with me on a charter and the youngest one kept calling these shells "butterfly wings."

I had a good laugh, but got to thinking that you know, those shells look more like butterflies to me than they do coquinas!

Not such a long time ago, a woman came back to our boat anchored near a sandbar to show me perhaps her most dramatic find in years. In fact, she was so happy because she had found the largest lion's paw that she had ever seen. It didn't take long to determine what it was.

She had found a large, black oyster. Not a find that a lion's paw would be, of course, and how I hated to have to tell her

of her confusion between the two shells.

It's really not an uncommon thing to get shells confused. There are several dozen collector's shells found on our islands and wouldn't you think that with that many, they wouldn't have to look so much alike?

I think that the poor angel wing shell gets its share of misidentification too. I've had people tell me they have found angel wings when in fact they have pen shells, ark shells and even the lowly coquina shell, (the sheller thought he had found a miniature angel wing).

I can deal with some mix-up in shell names, but when they start making up names, that really gets me confused, too.

The green sea urchins we find along our beaches are often called pin cushion shells. Don't ask me why, you practically have to jump out of a three story building on one to get their blunt spines to dig into your foot.

What do you call those living things inside a shell? I mean the original inhabitants, not hermit crabs? Well, again we have a lot of opinions.

Some people call them "animals." I had a little girl out on a trip once who insisted on calling them "ani-mules." Whatever. Lots of people call them "creatures," as in "creatures from the deep" or something which would make one think that there is indeed, something dangerous about them.

Probably the most mispronounced name in all sheldome is the conch. Now, if you say "consch" you are definitely a rookie and all the world is going to know this. If you say "konk" as in "He conked me over the head with a shell book," then you are a native. "Konk" not "consch," okay?

Good shelling this week and with these strong, cold fronts, beach shelling should be picking up.

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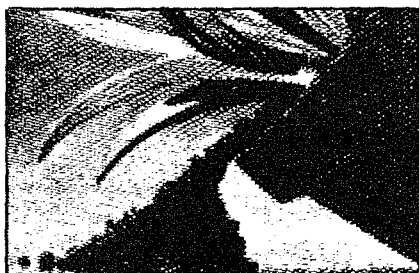


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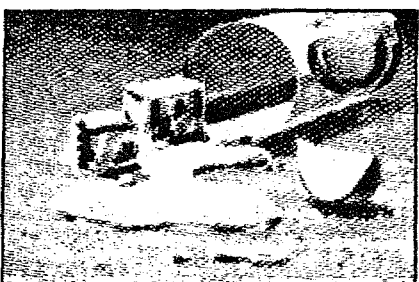
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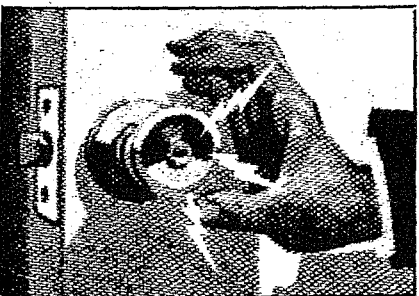
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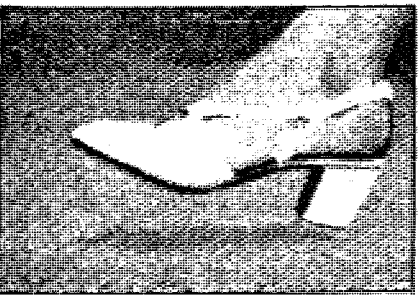
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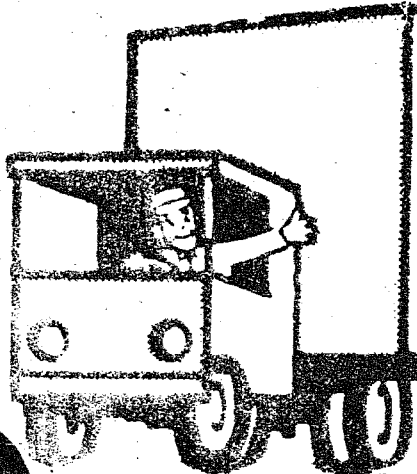
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# Lions News

The next meeting will be at the Sanibel Community Building in January 7, 1981 at 6:30 p.m.



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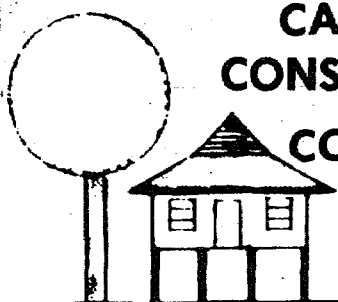
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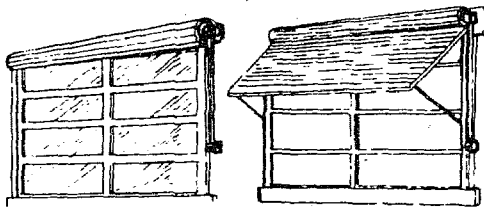
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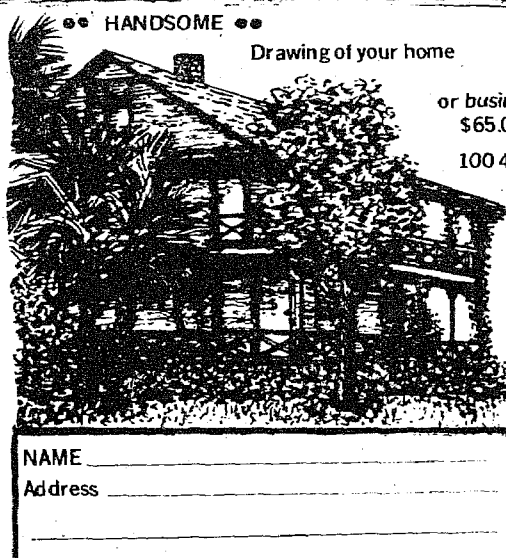
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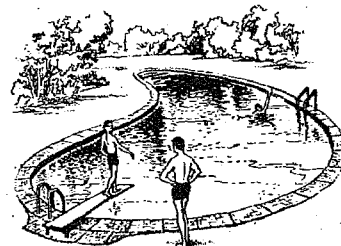
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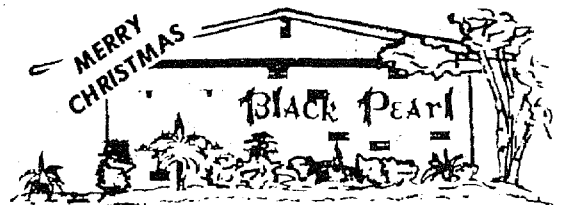
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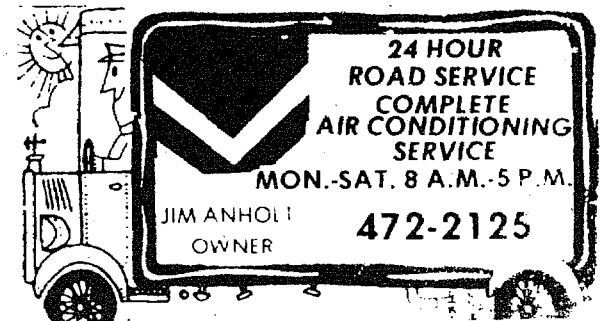

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# Refuge Report

This week's column will be devoted to reviewing the new tour schedule we will be initiating the first week of January. All of the tours will be conducted by refuge personnel. Anyone having any questions regarding the following tours can contact the office Monday through Friday, 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. at 472-1100.

Trips through the wildlife drive will be on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday mornings at 9 a.m., starting from the entrance. The tour generally lasts two hours. Topics

discussed include the variety of wildlife found on the refuge, mangrove ecology, mosquito control and general refuge management.

On Tuesday mornings at 9 a.m. a beach walk will leave from the lighthouse, lasting approximately one hour. Highlights will include a history of the lighthouse and a discussion of beach ecology.

On Wednesday a canoe trip through Buck Key will leave from the "Tween Waters Marina at 1 p.m. The trail winds through

mangroves, past Indian burial mounds and middens. A short walk through a hammock will also be included. Allow two to three hours for the trip. You must furnish your own canoe. Reservations can be made by calling the "Tween Waters Marina at 472-5161.

A bird walk through the Bailey Tract will be conducted on Thursday mornings at 8 a.m. This will be all walking so dress accordingly, bring field glasses and any necessary reference material. The trip will

be approximately two hours in length.

Another trip is planned for canoeists through the Commodore Creek Canoe Trail. The tour leaves from Tarpon Bay Marina on Friday mornings at 10 a.m. Reservations and canoe rental arrangements for the two to three hour trip can be made by calling the marina at 472-3196.

One other tour is scheduled for once a month; a trip to the outer islands by boat. Dates, times and further details will be announced at a later date.

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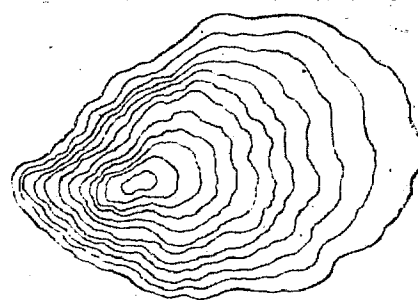


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# Top Bike-A-Thon money raisers announced

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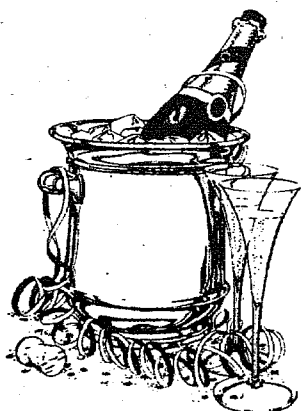
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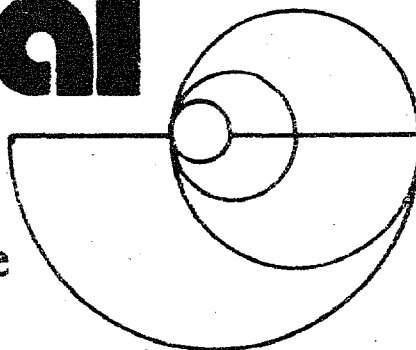

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# Portrait

## Judith Kennedy

**Age:** "Over the hill and jogging up the next mountain."

**Height:** 5' 4½"

**Roots:** Bedford, Ohio

**Pleasures:** "My three wonderful daughters; all my challenging and exhilarating music students; singing and acting, of course; reading; camping and traveling; living in this paradise called Sanibel with so many fascinating and friendly people; also, Venice, Italy."

**Mentor:** "My father - He was a very special person and his life inspires me still."

**Last Book Read:** "The pursuit of perfection - A Life of Maggie Teyte, by Garry O'Connor."

**Wish:** "I wish the nations of our world would direct their energies and resources towards eliminating hunger and poverty and creating peace - a monumental work, but truly possible."

**Words of Wisdom:** "We need to listen well to one another; absence from sound is an important ingredient of the best music."



Judith Kennedy is so musically inclined that even when she laughs, she laughs with a song.

"I knew when I was four that I wanted to play the piano," Judy explains today of how even at that young age she felt she would be a person brimming with music. "My father built me a swing and I was always swinging and singing," she adds with a warm smile of the memory.

Piano lessons began for Judy when she was just five years old, but it wasn't until she was 14 that she seriously began studying voice and singing.

"My parents were very careful with technique and they didn't allow me to be pushed," Judy explains of the danger of singing one's voice out at a very young age. "They got me to the right people at the right time," she adds.

Graduating summa cum laude from the Cleveland Institute of Music at Case Western University, Judy received a bachelors degree in music, specifically in voice performance, while also minoring in piano. "You wouldn't last if you weren't good," Judy modestly says of her musical education success.

What is so fascinating about Judy's exceptional academic accomplishments in college is all of the other things she managed to do while working for her degree. Having married during college and while singing for a local temple, Judy also found time for a full time job as a soprano soloist for the Old Stone Church, "a very sought after job," she says, and she also began giving private music instruction.

"I have worn a lot of musical hats," Judy says today of the diversity she experienced in her field. During college and upon graduation, while singing for the church and temple, Judy also performed in opera concerts on television and radio throughout the Great Lakes area, one performance of which, was aired on the Mike Douglas Show.

Judy's career does not lend itself to chronological order. For much of what she has done has overlapped with several other things. After receiving her degree, Judy continued performing for churches and singing in recitals, concerts and opera performances for the following years.

And another chapeau, heretofore briefly mentioned, was that of serving as a music teacher as she also shared her many talents at the Hathaway Brown School for Girls in

Shaker Heights, Ohio, as well as giving private lessons throughout the coming years.

"I left the school because I was singing more and I had instigated a music therapy program at a psychiatric hospital under a Ford Foundation Grant," Judy says of all that she had going for her at that time.

"To me, it was a very exciting time and I felt that I just might have helped," Judy says of the progress she had made with some of the patients at Ingleside Hospital, explaining how she discovered that, "music can change moods." Her research included "picking and choosing" music, under the supervision of the doctors and psychiatrists, that would help bring catatonic patients to some sort of consciousness.

Throughout that time Judy had continued on with her private music lessons and after finishing her time with the hospital, she began performing short comic operas with a baritone for the Music School Settlement. "We went through the school system of Cleveland and performed for children who really never heard music," she explains of the program's objective.

And so, Judy's life revolved around her singing performances, her teaching, and of course, her three daughters. Just prior to her move to Sanibel, however, Judy returned to the Cleveland Institute of Music at Case Western University to study for her Masters degree in private voice instruction. That experience was short lived, however, for Judy and her daughters found themselves battling bronchitis and pneumonia too often while living in Ohio.

Visiting Sanibel as a very young girl, all Judy could recall were the "pine trees" and "the magic." Knowing that she would look for a warmer place to move, Judy had vacationed here before and she says of her eventual move in 1975, "I, as everyone, really love Sanibel."

For Judy, now, there are all sorts of things going on. She has recently taken to the organ and has become the organist for the Sanibel Congregational United Church of Christ, and is "loving it," she adds.

A member of the Music Teacher's Association of Fort Myers, Judy performs occasional local lecture recitals along with her accompanist, Juliet Miller. She sings the

songs and lectures on the lives of such music greats as Cole Porter, Rogers and Hammerstein and Victor Herbert.

And since her arrival on the Island, Judy has become to many, the music teacher of Sanibel. She jokes that she has had requests to teach everything from the guitar to the trumpet, although she concentrates mainly on teaching voice and piano.

Judy's music students range from pre-elementary age to adults. "Teaching is a learning experience in itself," Judy says today, as she finds herself continually learning from her students' own life experiences.

For Judy, it is a joy to see her adult students come in and say that they had played the piano when they were young but have forgotten what they had learned. She is often amazed to see how much they already know and to see them rediscover the joys of music once again.

As far as the youngsters are concerned, Judy believes that the Island environment has much to do with the receptive attitude of her younger virtuosos.

"They soak up knowledge like sponges and they are all open to learning experiences," she explains of the innate musical talent of her pupils, adding, "I'm excited about what's happening in music education."

In voice education, Judy notes that the responses are much different from those of teaching piano and that she finds herself instructing with images.

"You're dealing with intangibles," Judy explains of the techniques of voice performance, adding, "each voice is very different. My philosophy in teaching voice is to fit the needs of the individual. The images in the mind changes what happens between the brain and the vocal chords."

"I have enjoyed this life here," Judy says today of her fulfilling hours spent on Sanibel. With her eldest daughter now out on her own, a large part of Judy's present lifestyle is devoted to her two other teenage daughters.

"They need a mother," Judy says, adding, "I value my childhood and I had beautiful parents and I would like to give Anne and Heather that."

A devoted, giving mother, a woman rich in artistic experiences; all of those who come to know Judith Kennedy will surely come to share the many songs in her heart.

## BEACH ACCESS

Sanibel has miles of public Gulf-front beaches, any one of which is only minutes from your lodging. Lighthouse Point is a stretch of Federal land on the Eastern tip of Sanibel Island, and from there, the Gulf beach is accessible again at the end of Donax Street, at Tarpon Bay Road, at Bowman's Beach Road (off Sanibel-Captiva Road) and Turner's Beach, which is located at Blind Pass, between Sanibel and Captiva Islands.

On Captiva Island, public beach access can be found at Turner Beach (which has public facilities) or further north, just past the entrance to South Seas Plantation.

**NOTE: STATE LAW PROHIBITS NUDE SUN-BATHING ON ALL FLORIDA BEACHES. VIOLATORS WILL BE PROSECUTED.**

## CAMPING

Camping on the beach is prohibited and while everyone enjoys a beach fire, the Sanibel Fire Board has signed into law an ordinance prohibiting open beach fires. Prior to the ordinance, a permit was necessary for a beach bonfire, but as of July 18, 1980, it is now illegal. An exemption to the ordinance is a fire in an approved cooking container (not to exceed 48" X 24" X 12" deep with an extruded metal grill) for non-commercial food preparation. This type of container will be allowed on the beach without a permit. After you have had your beach party, it is recommended that you assume the responsibility for the cleanup of any debris or litter in your area.

## GATORS

Feeding alligators anywhere within the Sanibel City limits is not only illegal (violators of the law are subject to a fine of up to \$500 or up to 60 days in jail, or both), but can be extremely dangerous. Alligators can run 45 m.p.h., so if you're close enough to feed an alligator, he's close enough to feed on you. An alligator fed for fun loses his natural fear of humans and becomes a potential threat to children and pets.

## WARNING! SAFEGUARD YOUR VALUABLES.

In order to protect your valuable possessions from theft, it is recommended that you TAKE THEM TO A BANK OR HOTEL VAULT FOR SAFEKEEPING. Do NOT leave them in your room or car.

## SPEED LIMITS

There are varying speed limits (20-30 m.p.h.) as one comes across the causeway, and there is a very good reason for them...to preserve the bridge supports from strain and stress. This speed limit is strictly enforced with the use of radar on a 24-hour basis by both the Sanibel Police Department and the Lee

## County Sheriff's Department.

Driving or parking a motor vehicle or moped on the bike path is strictly prohibited. Violators will be ticketed.

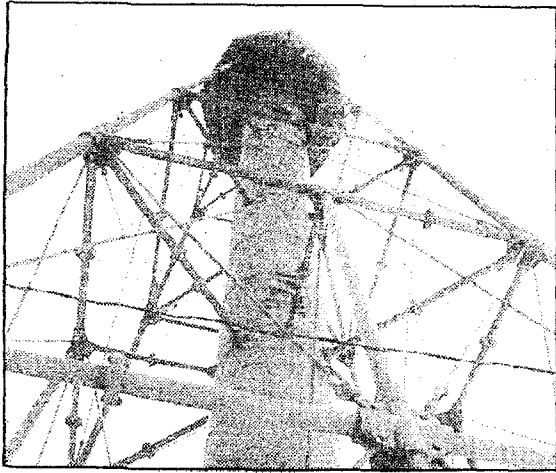

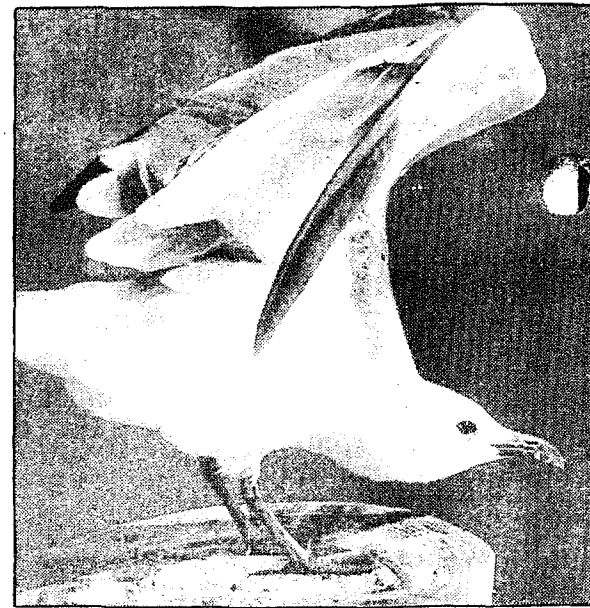

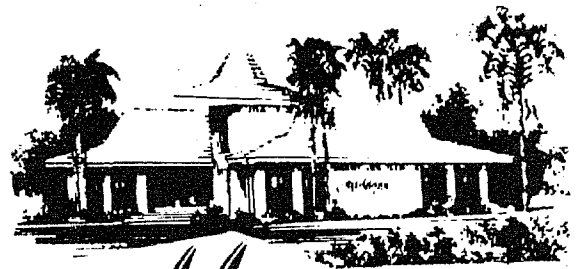
