Residents protest being 'shut out' by parking rules

Three park areas designated for restricted parking when the city's beach access parking regulations went into effect July 1 have been officially returned to the public. But not without impassioned protests from a half dozen island residents. Mikie Thomsen, who last week requested restricted parking designations for areas east and west of Causeway Road on the southern end of Tarpon Bay Road (George Christensen accused her of lying about the area for tourism purposes and a mile before the 21 vote with Councilman Mike Christensen and alder Kylo pleaded with the council to keep restricted parking at the Tarpon Bay beach access so Sanibel residents are not shut out.

It was marvelous, Kylo said about the short time the restricted parking was enforced at the Tarpon Bay Road access. The beach was clean and there was always a parking space available, she said.

What do you want to do — give the tourists the whole island? she asked.

Mable Zuber, who lives on Island Inn Road, said Tarpon Bay Road is the nearest beach access and added it is almost impossible to find a place to park there since the area was opened to the public.

Mrs. Zuber said she had not tried to park in the Trost parking lot, also free to the public, farther north on Tarpon Bay Road.

Mayor Duane White said there has been much confusion about the parking signs and an attempt should be made to clarify all signs so visitors know what to do.

We have trouble getting people to understand that Sanibel is a community. Much of the beach is in private ownership. Sanibel is not a holiday live-it-up weekend paradise, White said.

John Ruster, an Ohio resident who owns a condominium at the Tarpon Bay complex, urged the council to remove the parking area from under his windows.

He suggested that the Trost lot be enlarged to accommodate all parking for the Tarpon Bay beach access.

Ruster also urged the city to build the proposed public restrooms at Tarpon Bay Beach.

He complained that beachgoers were relieving themselves in the lobby of his condominium and in the nearby woods.

If you don't protect Sanibel for yourself, you won't have this paradise, he warned.

Klein's suggestion that 10 or 12 of the 25 to

Four survive Gulf plane crash

The pilot and three passengers in a small airplane that crashed off Captiva Island Saturday suffered only minor cuts and bruises in the ordeal — thanks to the quick thinking of the pilot.

Pilot J. Kenneth Lewis of Punta Gorda guided his sputtering Tri Pacer single-engine airplane into three feet of water approximately 50 yards from the beach at South Seas Plantation.

When disabled aircraft hit the water, the wheels stopped the plane and caused the craft to flip over on its nose.

Lewis, 60, and his passengers, Fred Brokmeyer, 61, of Port Charlotte; Olaf Shuka, 2, a 6½-year-old; and Martha Suka, 43, both of West Germany, managed to free themselves in less than a minute. Within five minutes the plane was completely submerged in the water.

Lewis kept the plane under control from the moment the engine began sputtering which his passengers and witnesses to the crash claimed saved the lives of everyone in the plane.

Before crash ng into the water the plane glided within several hundred feet of the South Seas beach renovation project where more than 40 people were gathering shells.

The people along the beach made it too dangerous for Lewis to try to guide the crippled plane to the beach for the crash landing. Landing in the water is considered more dangerous than on landing on the ground because water does not give the ground does.

The green and white 1961 Tri Pacer was considered a total loss. The Federal Aviation Administration will investigate the crash landing.

Precision yields fine detail in lost wax technique

The lost wax technique demonstrated last weekend by Larry Hoff and Linda Ritchie at the Trecheuse Gallery is a precision-oriented craft that allows for fine detail in cast jewelry.
The method dates to ancient Egypt and was popular during the Renaissance.
Aimed with a hot pen to begin shaping a piece with melted wax, Larry and Linda build up the rough outline of a piece as much as a potter works with clay.
A scalpel and dental tools are then used to carve minute detail. Once the wax figure is finished, it is placed in a flask and plaster is poured over it.
When baked in an oven the plaster forms a mold and the wax in its end is lost, which is how the technique gets its name.

Next, molten metal is poured into the cavity and the flask is spun at high speeds. Centrifugal force pushes the metal into the mold, capturing detail in the figure.
Each figure is unique as new wax is needed for every figure produced. The success rate is about 70 percent, Larry says. Not all of them come out, he says.
Larry specializes in pelicans and other island birds. Linda creates jewelry and larger wall size works such as palm trees and island scenes.

Potter's life demands determination, discipline

The life of a potter requires determination and discipline as the owners of A Touch of Sanibel Pottery, Dave and Barb Hoggatt, can testify.
It's a full time job plus some. Barb said as her fingers carefully molded a handle for an oil lamp.
The Hoggatts have been a team for 10 years and potters for eight years. It's something we can do together, Barb said.
That was our initial goal.
Initially the young couple wanted to start an antique business but while visiting an antique shop in Indiana they spotted some hand thrown pottery and became interested in learning the art. Barb spent three months of lessons, the Hoggatts consider themselves self taught potters.
When A Touch of Sanibel Pottery opened for business on Oct. 5 the shop will be the island's only retail pottery outlet with production right on the premises. The Hoggatt studio is located adjacent to their shop which was formerly potter Mark Heiman's shop, The Wheel.
We feel it's really important to be next to our work, Barb said.
The Hoggatts specialize in making functional items from clay but also like to

create one-of-a-kind pieces. Their inventory includes oil lamps, vases, pots and drinking vessels.
Acric is really excited about opening the new pottery shop, Dave said. It's a whole new adventure for us.
The island chose us, Barb said. We were here in March to visit friends and decided to stop in The Wheel to see what a business would go for on Sanibel.
By coincidence, Heiman's business was for sale. After returning to Indiana, the Hoggatts made a bid on the business and five months later, here we are, Dave smiled.
Her day pieces take nine hours to bisque fire in a kiln at 1700 degrees Fahrenheit. After the pieces are glazed they are fired at a 300 degree Fahrenheit.
You can relate it to the temperature of Mount St. Helens, which was 2100 degrees Fahrenheit, Dave said.
The Hoggatts said they find the people and the atmosphere in apt up for the bugs on Sanibel. It's totally different down here than in the small town we're from, they both agreed.
I don't think we'll be bored, Dave said and joked. We'll probably be worked to death.

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Special election set for canal maintenance

The Board of Governors of the Shell Harbor Canal Maintenance District has selected the date for a special election for unaffiliated voters in the special taxing district.

The voters will appear or disapprove a millage rate increase to fund the maintenance of the proposed dredging and maintenance operations for the network of canals in the Shell Harbor area in 1981-82 fiscal year.

Just before three city councilmen sitting on the Board of Governors last Tuesday unanimously approved a resolution calling for the referendum they learned Mariner Point Condominium Association has filed its long threatened lawsuit against the district and the city of Sanibel.

The suit seeks removal of the Mariner Point Condominium from within the district's boundaries on the basis that the condominiums will derive no benefit from being included in the taxing district.

The suit filed by Attorney William Hasenfeld also charges that the millage rate levied within the district must be approved by the electors of the district. It enjoins the Shell Harbor Canal Maintenance District from collecting any ad valorem assessments until the millage rate is approved.

Under this taxing method the suit claims Mariner Point Condominium will be unjustly forced to finance approximately 20 percent of the costs of maintaining the district even though the association's property comprises less than 3 percent of the total canal frontage in the district.

The suit maintains a more equitable plan would be to charge all property owners on the basis of linear footage fronting the canals to be maintained.

Because the association has its own active navigable canal maintenance and recon-

struction program it will not benefit from the district's proposed program the suit claims.

The suit points to other similar properties condominiums in Shell Harbor south of Gulf Drive and the Sanibel Marina that were excluded from the district despite the fact they will benefit from the district's maintenance and dredging program and calls Mariner Point's inclusion unreasonable, arbitrary and capricious.

The suit asks the court to issue a mandamus injunction compelling the Board of Governors to exclude the association's property from the district or reformulate its method of cost allocation in a more equitable manner.

City Attorney Neal Bowen has been authorized by the board to defend the district and by the City Council to defend the city in the Mariner suit.

Representatives from the Lee County Elections Office will be on Sanibel on Tuesday Aug 25 to register first time voters or make changes in registration records.

The voter registration van will be beside the Island Cinema in the Island Shopping Center from 10 a.m. until 1:30 p.m. and from 2:30 until 6 p.m.

A spokesman for the Elections Office said the registration drive is scheduled so that Islanders can register or change their registration records in time for the Oct 6 special election for the Shell Harbor Canal Maintenance District.

I scream, you scream for Italian ice cream

Giuseppa created the talking boy Pinochio but Arthur Partington and John Bartis created Pinochio ice cream. In February Partington and Bartis opened southwest Florida's only homemade Italian ice cream shoppe on Sanibel.

The idea to open an Italian ice cream shoppe came to Partington when he was visiting his farm in Laly Partington's neighbor suggested the newest venture because he had the machines.

"That's a great idea" Partington exclaimed. And so before he left Italy Partington learned how to make Italian ice cream.

Partington chose to open his new business on Sanibel as the island has been his favorite vacation spot for years. Partington moved to the island in December and the ice cream machines arrived in January. Then we found out much to our chagrin that we didn't have three-phase electricity. Partington said. Once the problem was solved Pinochio's was open for business.

Italian ice cream is made with fresh milk and cream. Partington said. The original formula was only half the cream I doubled the cream he added.

Though Partington and Bartis try to create unusual flavors of ice cream like mango the favorite is still chocolate.

I love chocolate. Partington said. And that's your biggest seller.

The ice cream takes Partington about three hours to make. First the cream, milk and sugar are combined and placed into the cooker which pasteurizes the mixture and brings the temperature down to zero degrees Fahrenheit.

Then the milky substance is poured into the batch freezer. When the timer buzzes the ice cream swirls out of the machine into a waiting cold tray. Partington then adds the fresh fruits, chocolate chips or flavoring needed to create Pinochio's ice cream.

Doing it this way is not the cheapest way to do it, but it's the most fun, he said.

Before coming to the island Partington and Bartis worked in the professional theatre for more than 20 years. Partington taught jazz ballet and tap for 11 years at Choate Rosemary Hall, a New England Prep school. A back injury caused Partington to look for a new adventure.

Partington says he doesn't miss teaching at all. I'm having a great time, he smiled. The best part of the whole thing is meeting all the people.

When only commissioners Larry Simon and Don Manning appeared at Blackbeard Hall for a special meeting called to discuss seven elements of the Comprehensive Land Use Plan, Mrs. Wierzbicham called off the session.

Four members of the seven-member commission are needed for a quorum, she said.

Commissioners Don Manchester and Louise Johnson are out of town on vacation. The agenda has been scheduled for next week, Mrs. Wierzbicham said.

White said he telephoned Murphy in New England where he is vacationing after rumors that he had been offered the post were confirmed.

He assured me he had turned down the job and would be back, White said.

Murphy has served as Sanibel's chief administrative officer since December 1979. He is scheduled to be back in his City Hall office on Aug. 31.

First reading

An ordinance that would require property management businesses to obtain additional occupational licenses, for services offered that are not a part of the overall management contract was heard on first reading by the City Council last Tuesday.

The ordinance is the result of a council directive, Mayor Duane White said.

With Councilmen Fred Veljan and Dieter Goss absent the ordinance was declared a first reading without comment.

Final action is scheduled for the Sept. 1 council meeting.

CLUP amendments heard

The City Council last Tuesday declared first readings for three requests for specific amendments to the Comprehensive Land Use Plan. All three requests were recommended for approval by the Planning Commission.

Mr. and Mrs. William Dopatka who purchased property in Sanibel Shores in 1979 without knowing it was unbuildable, will be able to build a single family home for their own use if the council approves the Dopatka's request for a specific amendment in second reading Oct. 6.

The Dopatkas earlier request for a variance to the Residential Densities section of CLUP was denied by the City Council and the clerical couple was advised that their only recourse was to seek redress from the seller through the courts.

But Mrs. Dopatka said an attorney told them that although they might win the case it would be impossible in getting their money back.

"These people are the victims of an impossible situation," Mayor Duane White said last week. They have been taken an advantage of.

They have a 10,500-square foot lot and as long as they meet the performance standards of CLUP, I will vote to allow them to build, he added.

Prior to the adoption of the land use plan a triplex was built on one lot held in

common with the lot the Dopatkas purchased. This exhausted the density assigned by CLUP in 1977 for both lots, 2.5 units per acre, rendering the Dopatka's property unbuildable.

All three councilmen present expressed sympathy for the Dopatkas, plight the first time in seven years.

William Miracle who needs a specific amendment to install a swimming pool and patio at his home in Water Shadows might not have to remove the visqueen cover on the surrounding yard a condition for approval imposed by the Planning Commission.

The City Council, on hearing Miracle's request for a variance for the impermeable surface average on first reading last week, tended to agree with assessments by George Tenney and Gordon Kidlow that surface water in that subdivision will drain into salt water canals and will never reach a fresh water aquifer.

While said he saw no reason for denying the variance there are circumstances after cases.

Walker Simmons, who represented his son in law before the council, offered to take up the variance equal to the coverage of the pool and patio.

The final decision will be made on Oct. 6.

Lions hear Officer Dick Noon

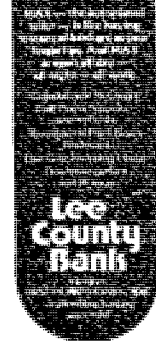

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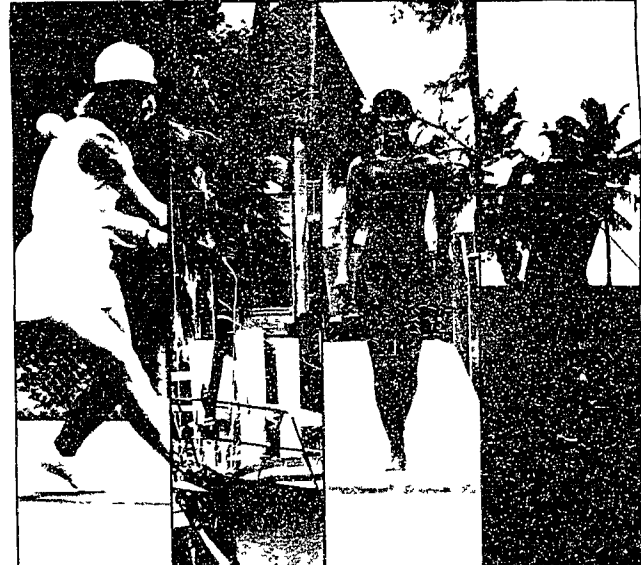

Florida leads in brown pelican population

The brown pelican is an endangered species over its entire U.S. range, albeit it is quite common in Florida. In Southwest Florida, a traditional brown pelican stronghold, the birds seem to be as common as the saltmarsh mosquito extended from the Texas Gulf Coast across the coast of Louisiana. In which the brown pelican is the state bird of Florida and up the Atlantic Coast to South Carolina and North Carolina. Oddly enough, they have never been recorded breeding in Alabama or Georgia. Presently Florida and South Carolina — in that order — are the only states with sizeable nesting populations. The decline of this bird in Texas and Louisiana occurred very rapidly. Although it is thought that chemical pesticides were primarily responsible for the bird's general decline, there has been no concrete evidence to prove that this is definitely what happened in the Texas and Louisiana population. An adult brown pelican can weigh up to eight pounds and have a wing span of seven feet. The pelican is rarely found away from salt water. At Bird Island (Pinellas National Wildlife Refuge) the nesting population of brown pelicans for 1981 was about 1,300 birds that produced an estimated 2,000 young pelicans. At Upper Bird Key and Lower Bird Key (Matlacha Pass National Wildlife Refuge) an estimated 100 and 250 young respectively were produced. At Tarpon Key (Pinellas National Wildlife Refuge) an estimated 1,600 young were produced in 1981 — this represents a slight decline in production from last year. On the west coast of Florida the brown pelican seems to be at historical population levels. The population today may even be above historical high levels.



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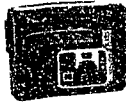
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Juanita Hermes named Priscilla Murphy VP

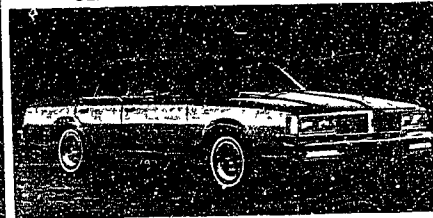

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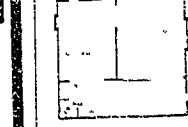

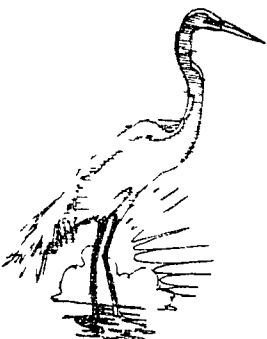

Anne Hill's clear blue eyes sparkle and dance as she takes time out from sipping drinks at the Putting Pelican to talk about her Sanibel friends.

I don't have customers, she says with a smile. They all seem to become my personal friends.

Anne has mixed and served drinks for Islanders for more than seven years, first at the Coconut Grove and since last March as assistant manager at the Putting Pelican on the Beachview Golf Course.

A delightful combination of bartending expertise and friendliness has earned her a following that extends from numerous city officials to a host of regular tourists with whom she exchanges Christmas and birthday cards.

Anne's friends enjoy not only her drinks but also her homemade jellies—kuava key lime, mango grape and green pepper—which are graciously and generously dolled out to new and old friends alike.

People have suggested that I market and sell my jellies, she says with a note of disbeliever. I say there's no way I could ever do that. My jellies are for giving to my friends.

Last year she mailed a case of mango jelly to Dr. Woodbury, but all but one of the jars broke en route.

I send a lot of my jellies away, she says. When my friends come back to the Island they bring the empty jars.

Anne has worked in the hospitality business since she was 16 years old. She married when she was 18 and she and her new husband opened a small restaurant in California. The couple owned the Big Pin Inn in Low Mar, then in the Florida Keys for several years before they moved to Sanibel in 1974.

The Island didn't offer enough for the three daughters, however, and the Hill's moved to Cape Coral in 1977. Anne could easily have found a job in Cape Coral after the family moved but she chose to keep her Island job as a favor.

The people here, my friends, are what kept me coming to Sanibel, she says, adding that the 23-mile commute every Monday through Friday is well worth the effort even on busy tourist seasons.

Even on the weekends when she is not standing behind the bar, Anne comes to Sanibel for the beaches and for her social life. I feel very much like Sanibel is my home, she says.

Anne gets as much out of her job as she puts in it which keeps both her and her customer friends happy.

She stopped working for a year or when the Hills left their business in the Keys. It was when she didn't work that she

developed a heart condition, she says. The job at the Coconut Grove proved the perfect treatment for her poor health and she hasn't had a bad report from her doctors since.

It just proves that I have to keep running around, she says. It's easy if you work for and with good people like I do.

When Anne's daytime job precludes most of the evening and night drinkers that usually frequent bars, it might be the best way of dealing with the occasional drinker at the bar.

When someone is drunk and I don't know it, I tell them to go home, she explains. I don't tell them the second time. And the third time they're out the door.

Her kind and unobtrusive handling of the occasional drinker for many of her customer friends. I don't think I've ever had a customer who has been drunk when I've served them.

Do people take advantage of Anne's willingness to help? Anne gets as much out of her job as she puts in it which keeps both her and her customer friends happy.

classrooms to be full, especially the kindergarten.

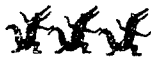
The staff, composed of six full time teachers and part time teachers and a full time librarian, welcomes Dave Crandall, a new second grade teacher.

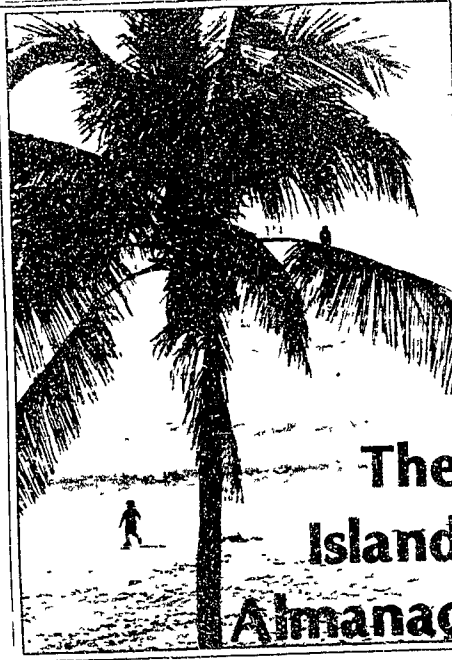

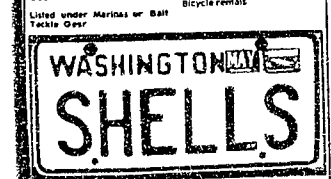

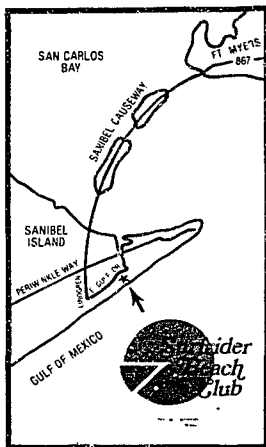
