### Howe says AARP is actively fighting high health care costs

To the Editor:  
The Islander.

My friend George Campbell let me know Dec. 10 issue defending prescription drugs on the detriment of generic nostrums was most brilliant but briefly.

Regrettably he failed to mention generic vis a vis prescription drugs as the culprit. He also cited the American Association of Retired Persons for its alleged inaction on rising health care costs. Yet I was such vocal protests that produced the newly formed alliance of the private health care industry and the Federal Food and Drug Administration to combat rampant medical fraud.

As the legislative chairman of our San-Cap chapter of AARP I can assure George that the association is very actively seeking higher standards, greater availability and lower consumer costs for drugs of both types. A current example of such efforts is reported in the December-January issue of the organization's magazine, Modern Maturity.

That article reports on the pro and cons of both

types of drugs that compete in the American market place. Significantly it concludes with an observation by Congressman Henry Waxman that generic drugs by law must be just as safe and effective as the original drug. The only difference is that generic drugs are less costly.

The above mentioned Modern Maturity is regularly available for reference by the reading public at the Sanibel library. Periodic reports of the progress of the many national, state and local programs chiefly related to the health safety and well-being of the elderly will be found in that periodical if it is available to George also during his frequent research excursions to the library.

Incidentally, for George's gratification among the AARP state legislative committee's dozen major goals for the 1986 Florida Legislature is the defeat of any proposal that would eliminate the exemption from the state sales tax for prescription drugs, doctors' fees and services.

### Concerned Citizens of Captiva president explains goals

To the Editor:  
The Islander.

As president of the Concerned Citizens of Captiva an organization dedicated to achieving beach nourishment and representing 69 percent of the property owners on Captiva I am writing to you to explain why our organization was formed and what our goals are.

On Dec. 2, 1983 Captiva property owners presented 200 petitions to the CEFD's appointed commissioners to call the already approved referendum this winter before permits expire and costs escalate. The CEFD ignored the petitions and refused our request. They also postponed indefinitely consideration of the new financial plan for beach nourishment approved the hiring of an individual property owner and refused to call the referendum on beach nourishment.

We believe unqualified to do a socio-economic study we believe unnecessary ousted the competent dedicated professionals who at the CEFD's best have spent years getting us ready for beach nourishment and refused to call the referendum on beach nourishment.

As a result of these CEFD actions, we have formed

Concerned Citizens of Captiva and have had to hire a lawyer to make our request to the CEFD for a vote of the people or beach nourishment. The CEFD has spent \$675,000 of our tax dollars over the past four years preparing for beach nourishment and has collected from us an additional \$775,000 to pay for full or beach nourishment costs. By delaying our project indefinitely, the CEFD commissioners are saying they intend to waste \$1,450,000 of our tax dollars.

We will continue to get signatures on these petitions for a referendum and for beach nourishment until we have 98 percent or more of the property owners on the Island sign up. We urge all Captivians who have not been contacted and wish to sign a petition to call Mrs. Ralph Friedman 472-2571 or Mrs. Joe Lomax 4-2330.

We are extremely concerned about more serious property damage eroding property values, loss of our education route and possible loss of life.

### Kalvin withdraws from slate for CEFD appointment

To the Editor:  
The Islander.

I have today (Dec. 19, 1983) withdrawn my name as a candidate for a seat on the Captiva Eros on Prevention District board of commissioners.

A letter announcing my decision has been forwarded to Gov. Bob Graham with a copy to Sen. Frank Mann.

There are a number of reasons for my decision. Ever since the Nov. 5 election when two anti-sand pumping candidates were elected to the CEFD board, the situation on Captiva has deteriorated.

Each of the newly-elected members of the CEFD board (with the exception of Hans Wilson) has

been vocal in scene on or threatening phone calls. One board member has been approached and the suggestion of financial rewards in the future made by a representative of the pro-nourishment group. The board member would change his stance on nourishment.

The part time employer of this same board member was also approached and threatened with the loss of business if he didn't get his employee to change his tune. These actions are tantamount to attempting to bribe a public official.

Lawsuits against the new CEFD board were

### Where were Captivians during 'act two' of the CEFD saga?

To the Editor:  
The Islander.

Where were the concerned citizens of Captiva on Friday Dec. 20, 1983?

Butter yet why were there only three people in attendance to the CEFD meeting to witness the anti-second act of the CEFD performance of *It's Our Turn Now* produced by the Loyal Opposition Players and overtly directed by a most loyal CEFD meeting attendee.

More than 50 of us attended act one in which the newly constituted CEFD board acted against the wishes of the majority in attendance, the majority of property owners (69 percent in the May 1983 poll) and even the majority of the Nov. 5 electorate (Martin and Garvey — Friel Kalvin's anti-sand pumping candidates received 75 of 79 total votes titled — if I am correct — or less than 26 percent to more than 64 percent garnered by the four pro-nourishment candidates). You were there when the board decided all by the same vote of 3:1 to:

- Delay the beach nourishment project indefinitely.
- Hire Scott Rosenberg / Commissioner Bob Martin's hand-picked choice (The Islander Dec. 10, 1983) to study the files at the CEFD office and

pay him \$2,400 (\$3,500 for an "open solicitation for services). He knows nothing about Captiva and what has been going on here," said Martin (The Islander Dec. 10, 1983).

- Terminate beach nourishment project manager Dick Stevens contract as of 1/1/85. The board agreed to enter into negotiations with Stevens immediately to hire the project manager on an as-needed basis (The Islander Dec. 10, 1983).
- Attempt to hire a new CEFD administrator (personally responsible to the commissioners) to replace Kate Good from Stevens' employee.

There was much audience participation (hostile-type behavior to some) and the Island newspaper reporters criticized the entire 4 1/2 hour-long act. One "Why did so few of you attend the 4 1/2 hour long second act?" act two began with basically the same cast of characters and director plus a new character Arthur Learned whose role seemed to be solely to open and read all of the bids even his own! If you had attended the entire second act you also would have learned that:

- A property owners' poll was taken by the board concerning the perpendicular stabilizer project when Ed Olling was on the board.
- The location of the perpendicular stabilizer

project is not the best for a sand study. Hans Wilson stated that it was to trap sand and there are too many obstructions in that location. There is no sand there to gather.

- To my question, "Why did you rush to do this? There was no answer. The truth is that this was the main thrust of act two! Quickly run this project down the throats of the majority while you, the majority, are still so disorganized! And did they follow their noses?"
- The "sand pumping candidates" apparently promised the vocal anti-sand pumping minority that they would all contribute to the fire Stevens (and Goodham) and immediately institute the perpendicular stabilizer project.
- When I questioned the board's choice of location and rush as per above and asked if public patronage dictated the location — I did not hear an answer directed to this point. It died a quiet death.
- Commissioner Wilson questioned "Who here?" and replied to his own question that he was talking to the people who pay for the project can view it better in this location. When questioned further he stated that he would not have placed it there as a first

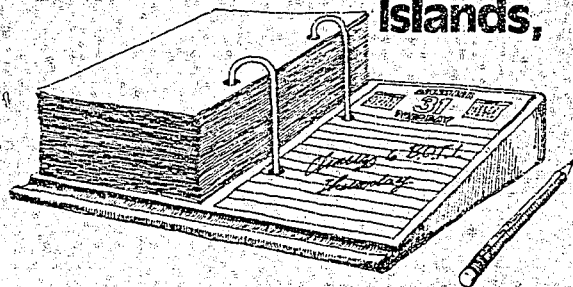

## Council will seek county support for more drawbridge restrictions

The U.S. Coast Guard is offering to restrict the opening of the Causeway drawbridge Monday through Friday between 3:45 and 4:30 p.m. with one opening at 4:15 p.m. as far as it goes. City Manager Cary Price told the City Council at the Dec. 17 meeting.

But it should be extended to include weekends and holidays at least during the winter season, Price added.

The council agreed.

Price said a Coast Guard spokesman told him the hours proposed for the bridge to be closed to boat traffic were exactly what Lee County asked for. But the spokesman added a preliminary inspection of traffic counts across the bridge and across the estuary on through weekends might be justified.

Mayor Louise Johnson said the city originally requested restricted drawbridge openings every day during the winter season.

Price suggested that the council formally request Lee County to ask that the restricted openings be expanded to the weekends. Councilman Fred Vallin suggested that the mayor write a letter to the commission chairman asking for support.

## \$119,000 computer system okayed for Sanibel Police Department

The City Council has approved the purchase of a \$119,000 Motorola KDP computer system for the Sanibel Police Department.

\$17,000 is earmarked in the current budget for upgrading the police computer system. The details of how to finance the balance was left to the discretion of City Manager Gary Price.

About half the balance could be garnered from the reserve account in which the city's auditor has determined to be \$40,000 or \$50,000 more than needed, Price said.

The rest of the purchase price could be covered by a loan from the Florida League of Cities or a rollover loan from Bank of the Islands. City Attorney David La Croix suggested.

At a special meeting today at 9 a.m., Price will ask the council to approve a loan for \$15,000 from Bank of the Islands.

Price emphasized that the Motorola system is compatible with the current police computer system. It is an addition to what we already have, not in lieu of it, he stressed.

The Motorola KDP system will allow the police dispatch desk to communicate with police vehicles by computer. It will still permit normal voice communication when needed.

The system is comprised of the main computer and a switching computer installed at the police

department.

Three permanent mobile terminals will be installed in police vehicles. Two portable terminals will be available for use in investigations, emergency management or repair situations, police Lt. May Rhodes explained.

The switching computer gives the mobile terminals in police cars the ability to access the SPD data base at Florida Crime Information Center and the National Crime Information Center. It also has the capability of accumulating up to six other computer systems in the future.

With the new equipment of officers in the field will be able to check for auto warrants, stolen vehicles, criminal histories, driver's license status and registrations without going through the dispatcher at police headquarters.

The KDP system allows the officer in the field to access both the FCIC and NCIC with no dispatcher assistance. This allows the dispatcher to pay more attention to incoming emergency calls and officers on assignment, Rhodes said.

When the 911 emergency system becomes operative county-wide the KDP system will enable the Sanibel dispatcher to automatically dispatch vehicles, Rhodes added.

## Council says no to San-Cap Road wetlands site for public works maintenance, storage facility

The City Council has turned down a contract to purchase 26 acres along Sanibel-Captiva Road from John and Virginia Sawbridge. The decision was made in anticipation of cries of public indignation if environmental standards for developing in the Wetlands Conservation District were waived to permit the city to construct a public works facility on the acreage.

City Manager Gary Price said the site was ideal for the Public Works Department facility because it is a central location (between the IWA plant and CROW) on a main traffic artery far removed from any residential development and reasonably priced at \$60,000.

But the five or six acres of cleared land that would be required for the storage and maintenance facility is more than double the amount of developed area allowed in the wetlands, Price acknowledged.

In addition, more fill than permitted in the wetlands district would be needed to bring the elevation up to five feet MSL to provide a high and dry site during periods of heavy flooding, Price said.

Several months ago, after the council seemed use of the City Hall site to expand and centralize the public works operation was unacceptable, Price began searching for an alternative.

When presented with the Sanibel-Captiva Road site possibility, Mayor Louise Johnson said

because of this city's objectives of environmental preservation plus the history of the wetlands or otherwise it is very difficult for me to waive almost every regulation to allow the public works facility (on the Sawbridge property).

Councilman Fred Vallin said he shared Johnson's views and would prefer that Price explore the possibility of acquiring a five-acre tract just east of the city Hall property and north of Denslow Road. That parcel is available for \$40,000, he said.

Planning Director Bruce Rogers pointed out that this land though not in the wetlands conservation district is below three feet elevation and would also require considerable amount of fill to provide a high and dry site.

Councilman Bill Hagenup said he strongly favored using the Sanibel-Captiva Road property calling it ideal for the public works operation.

Councilman Mike Klein added that after clearing six acres for the city's use, 20 acres of wetlands would be left as open space in perpetuity.

In the end, Vallin's motion to approve the contract to purchase the 26-acre tract from Sawbridge failed by a 3-2 vote with Johnson, Klein and Councilman Francis Bailey opposed.

But the council by unanimous vote directed Price to negotiate the purchase of the five acres immediately adjacent to City Hall to be earmarked for future expansion but not necessarily for use as a public works facility.

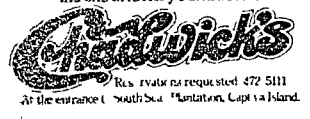

#### City offers \$12,000 for Island Inn Road lots

**Business book review**

**How to obtain world class standards of economy and lifestyle in the United States**

The Zero-Sum Solution  
By Lester Thurow  
414 pp., Simon and Schuster, New York

By Donald Scott

This book makes the premise that the United States wants and can have a world class economy and a world class standard of wages and living for its citizens.

But this prospect is in jeopardy because America is losing its competitive position and living beyond its means without the ever increasing trade imbalance and national debt. Banquet competes successfully in world markets with a net trade balance but that country's low wage standard is not what we have in mind.

The author begins his analysis at the second oil shock in 1974 that brought with it inflation, higher interest rates, dollar inflation, rising dollar exchange value and consequent trade deficit.

An immediate consequence was rising unemployment as monetary restraints were imposed to stop inflation. Other inflationary complications arose when economic slow-downs put Mexico and other commodity export countries on the edge of unacceptable loan defaults. These and the collapse of Continental Bank in Chicago required inflationary injections of dollars which then had to be compensated by further financial restraints and more unemployment.

Next there follows the prospect that when the dollar comes down to which much effort is now directed, there will be renewed inflation, rising interest rates, increasing budget deficits and intense pressure to cut government expenses. These circumstances

can lead to a sharp drop in the American standard of living. Lower oil prices reduce the threat of higher Japanese import prices (increase it).

The author offers alternatives to the unemployment cure for inflation, i.e. boom-and-bust cycle of the past. The key to this is to increase productivity in value added products for international trade. Ways to do this include:

- Recognition of which are less value added (low wage — agriculture) versus more value added (high wage — finance)
- Increased plant investment in adding investment in a better educated and trained work force
- Stricter control of inflation

The author examines the concept of social attitudes toward work patterns and the importance of feeling fairly treated. He receives much emphasis. For example, he says in the United States the "compensation of managers is relatively much higher than in other countries. The engineer or teacher gets advanced with getting into administration. And when there are layoffs, the new employee ends up with no job while the older one is unaffected. The author addresses the adverse moral effects of this on productivity, and proposes other motivating ways to compensate and level employment.

He also addresses the need for eliminating poor education and rewarding good education. There is discussion of homework and other ways to extend the 180-day school year here compared to 220-240 school days elsewhere in the world.

In the area of investment, attention goes especially to the need for savings and how they are affected by high taxes, low down payments and sales taxes in the government arena. He discusses the deficit and income taxes versus other forms of taxation such as sales or value added.

Essentially the test is the willingness to make present sacrifice for future benefit.

Finally, there is attention to general national industrial policy for financing the economy, providing the commercial research to restore leadership and protecting the people from predatory competition. The goal is a prosperous world class economy and society for the United States.

The author proffesor of economics at MIT has documented his findings and fully developed his thesis. He recommends his book especially to the Democratic Party to make politically feasible social and structural changes which he believes are economically necessary.

Donald Scott has lived on Sanibel for the past two years. Prior to moving to the island he worked for 30 years in the banking industry. He spent 2 1/2 years with Chase Manhattan Bank in New York City dividing his time between commercial banking and corporate staff.

Scott's educational background includes a bachelor's degree in economics from Princeton and a master's in business administration from New York University.

He resides on Sanibel with his wife Florence.

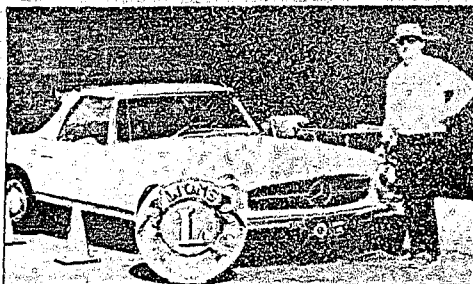

This year it seems to me the city has earned a rest—for a while. We do have the strictest and most admired Comprehensive Land Use Plan east of the Mississippi and south of Canada which will be followed as long as we voters take an interest in what is going on in the city. We might even read the CLUP and learn that a better city comes a building permit because the land is too fragile to build on, the city must buy that land with our tax dollars.

However, for concerned citizens like the Schullers there is always a way to help Sanibel stay greener and beautiful.

Join and support the Sanibel Captiva Conservation Foundation whose policy is to buy islands and keep this land in perpetual wilderness.

So far SCCF owns some 850 acres. Good possibilities include the purchase of more land to keep Sanibel forever free of more development.

Early in 1986 SCCF has planned several meetings to tell Sanibel about its work and to appeal for new members. Old members are asked to invite concerned citizens to attend, listen, join and become active in the organization.

This letter is an invitation to the Schullers to come with us to these interesting meetings.

#### Campbell hopes to clarify his stance on the pharmaceutical business

Dr. Frank Herndon's critique concerning my attitudes and opinions regarding the ethical pharmaceutical business (The Islander Commentary Dec. 21, 1986).

I apologize for the obvious misinterpretation of my views which I shall attempt to clarify. My knowledge of the drug industry derives from more than a quarter of a century experience in 25 countries all over the world. Following are one or two comments which might clarify my position:

1) AARP is indeed the oldest people's outfit. I ought to know I'm a member and I'm old. There are according to my observation darn few college students who are members of AARP—even fewer high school kids "be dentally" for that old timer who can still kick a starap. AARP runs a decent little drugs mail order supply department. It works too and it saves quite a few bucks and dimes. I don't balk anymore because insurance pays it just air it true by cruddy what Mr. Herndon said. Med care and other insurance, pays only part of the total doctor and prescription medicine. Medicare yes but the rest is all as a liability through one or another of the literally hundreds of so-called Med-Gap policies.

2) Regarding pharmaceutical company advertising of ethical real Rx drugs—this is aimed at doctors. If the lay person reads and misinter-

prets this information too bad. Remember what somebody said about a little bit of learning? Actually, doctors depend on this material to keep themselves current with advances in modern medicine. Sometimes a doctor will actually admit this.

3) Social security sure is great for us present day old timers. I like it a whole lot. I feel sort of sorry for the young people who are paying through the nose for our benefit. Sure we paid into the Social Security trust fund (not all of us as was suggested but a lot of us) but we paid darn little compared with what benefit we reap. We paid in huge amounts compared with the few almost impossible burdens our kids have to pay today. And most of them pay cheerfully enough in the circumstance even though they are unlikely ever to reap any benefit themselves. Every time I meet such a generous and uncomplaining young person whose wallet is being lightened so I can spend a few bucks every month I feel both guilty and grateful for their willingness to support me in this way. Any that I have failed to thank let me say thank you here and now.

4) Why do I cite the high price of Detroit automobiles and Sanibel condominiums? I thought the answer was obvious. A \$2,000 car now costs \$12,000. \$14,000. \$15,000 or much more.

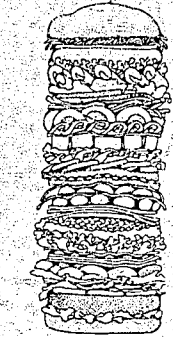

The perpendicular stabilizer project will require at least one year of monitoring, defined locally as "delay the nourishment project another year!"

•6. The CEPD board rejected the low bidder on the construction of the project. My opinion is that they feared any additional time taken to clarify this \$28,000 bid (from a local contractor) would enable someone to awaken the slumbering majority in order to secure a substantial attendance at each three on Jan. 6, 1984. Now they don't care! Act Three can begin with all this monkey business a fait accompli. We're talking about a \$19,500 differential between the board and Learned reduced his bid in order to arrive at \$4,999 under \$5,000 and therefore not requiring the board to take the time to notify the three lowest bidders, over the strenuous objections of the CEPD attorney. Their attorney again made clear his position on this matter, for the record, during the comments from the floor period. He was ignored at times and his opinion disputed at other times. When I alerted the board to the fact that they and Learned should not have discussed and clarified his bid during the opening process, I was ignored, too. I reminded them that they had denied just that privilege to a young man in the audience, who left sometime after Chairman Peg Hofscheider instructed him, properly, not to speak to

the board during this delicate process.

•7. The board refused to open negotiations with Dick Stevens, the soon-to-be-fired nourishment project manager, even though these negotiations were made a part of the successful motion of Dec. 2 to terminate his contract. (See act one, scene three above.)

•8. The board refused to discuss my request that they offer to employ Dick Stevens and/or Kate Gooderham directly (Stevens was agreeable to either arrangement) on a 30-day basis, at least until competent replacements were hired. Chairman Hofscheider offered to "help out at the office" and then suggested that since it could be some time before a replacement was found (my estimate, 60 days minimum) why don't they consider hiring Scott Rosenberg for this job since he seemed to be a nice young man? I remember screaming unclear as to what subsequently transpired. I must have temporarily blanked out, or left, or something. Sorry.

If you happened to read the Dec. 21 Fort Myers News-Press report by Roslyn Averill, you will get another view of the proceedings. Averill sat next to the director during the entire act and was, I believe, the recipient of some written information. My comment here is identical to Martin's

## Audubon Society program series begins this Thursday evening

The winter program series sponsored by the Sanibel Captiva Audubon Society begins at 8 p.m. this Thursday, Jan. 7, at the Sanibel Community Association.

The weekly programs will continue at the same time and place every Thursday, through March 27. The general public is invited to all of the shows.

This year's slate ranges from slide show tours of Alaska and the Caribbean islands to presentations about bald eagles and beavers. A popular favorite is the final show of the season, which is an audience participation color slide show program.

The first program this Thursday will feature Dr. James Layne, who will discuss the "Natural History of the Florida Scrub."

Layne is the executive director of the Archbold Biological Station in Lake Placid, Fla. The station is one of seven field stations of the American Museum of Natural History.

Layne received his bachelor's degree and doctorate from Cornell University. He taught at Cornell, the University of Southern Illinois and the University of Florida before joining the museum staff in 1967. Florida mammals, their ecology, life histories and distribution are his primary concern, with emphasis placed on selected species of smaller mammals.

He has carried out extensive biological field investigations in the upper reaches of the Amazon Rivers as well as in Puerto Ilcen, Illinois.

Florida and New York. Author of many scientific papers, Layne is an active member of numerous professional societies. He is a director of the Florida Audubon Society and the Florida Defenders of the Environment.

The Jan. 8 program will feature Sanibel's own Al Milligan and a revised edition of his slide presentation "Wonderful and Wonderful" about the birds of Sanibel.

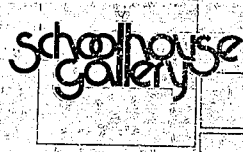

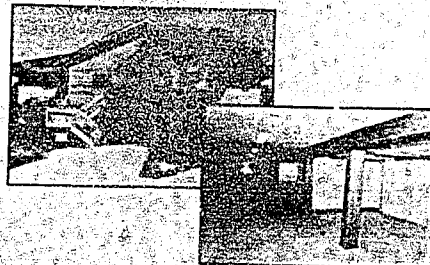

**More birds, fewer species show up for 1986 Christmas Bird Count**

On Saturday, Dec. 31, 1985, 79 members of the Sanibel Captiva Audubon Society reported seeing 12,291 birds representing 134 species on Sanibel, Captiva and adjacent waters.

The expedition was part of the Annual Christmas Bird Count which is held throughout the country every year under the auspices of the National Audubon Society.

This year's figures represent more birds, but fewer species, than last year's bird count on the Islands.

"The recent cold weather caused robins to migrate further south so we counted 3,157 of them compared to the five robins counted last year," reported Dr. K.C. Emerson.

In addition, on the day of the count the cool strong breezes caused most of the smaller songbirds to seek shelter in woods where they could not be

counted," Emerson added. Only the American goldfinches were seen in large numbers, he said.

Usually birders on the count find blue-headed vireos and clapper rails, but these, too, hid from the local bird counters.

The group did have an unexpected sighting of three white-winged scoters on Captiva.

And the count turned up 1,214 migrating crows. A survey during the summer, when the city of Sanibel was interested in the numbers of crows on the island, turned up about 200 crows.

The crows migrate south in the winter from as far away as New England.

The birds counted in the 1985 Christmas Bird Count included the following:

Common loon, 12; pied-billed grebe, 57; horned grebe, 3; American white pelican, 31; brown pelican, 68; double-crested cormorant, 483;

anhinga, 164; magnificent frigatebird, 8; great blue heron, 79; great egret, 150; snowy egret, 70; little blue heron, 191; tricolored heron, 9; red-dish egret, 6; cattle egret, 5; green-backed heron, 63; black-crowned night heron, 615; yellow-crowned night heron, 25; white ibis, 407; roseate spoonbill, 18; wood stork, 31; green-winged teal, 6; mottled duck, 88; northern pintail, 7; blue-winged teal, 224; northern shoveler, 13; Eurasian wigeon, 1; American wigeon,

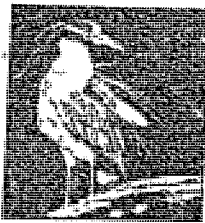

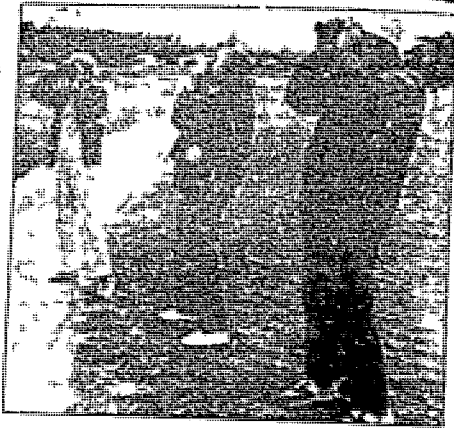

West didn't have to save clubs since if South had led clubs he would ruff them in the dummy. And besides, East's club signal promised the king. If West discarded clubs in order to save at least two hearts, South might well misguess the hearts loss if the grand slam.

#### New Captiva library show opens with public reception this Saturday

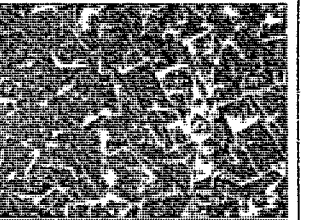

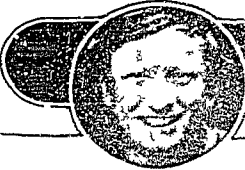

# ON THE WATER

By Captain Mike Fuery

If you are here for the holidays and are doing a little fishing, when time and weather permit, let me catch you up on a few laws that have recently changed or are about to change.

Most marinas and tackle shops are slow to post the new laws. This is unfortunate because few visiting anglers have time to keep up with new Florida legislation.

One of the most altered rules on saltwater fish concerns the redfish. A 12-inch bass, sea bass or spot tails. In early fall the state moved the legal length of red from 12 to 18 inches. This is important for local anglers. I'll talk more about that later in this article.

Also be advised that snook season will close Jan. 1 and remain closed until March 1. In addition, these fish will be off limits during June, July and August. Before you groun you might be pleased to know that the closures have started a positive turn around in snook populations so fishing should be improving for years because of these 9 months. The law does not say you cannot catch snook just that the fish have to be speedily released.

A great many seasonal and winter visitors like to fish for grouper and now as with the reds grouper have to measure 18 inches long to take. The Florida Marine Patrol folks could anchor

their boats in Captiva Pass during any weekend or a harvest of anglers who either ignore the law or are unaware of it.

All common only found grouper — black, gags and reds — have a measure 18 inches. I got a wooden yard stick and cut it in half so I can carefully measure each fish I catch.

Here's the latest news about redfish. First, the Florida Marine Fisheries Commission has just appointed two new members to this very important board. A biologist from Port Charlotte made a motion during his first meeting to make redfish gamefish. The motion carried and it is expected that the state will act favorably on the recommendation.

A couple of different things could happen regarding redfish. That state could put a number limit on reds. During a meeting last fall with some of the commissioners, this point was hotly contested by commercial fishing interests who rely on red fish for a living. Enforcing a number limit of perhaps four per person would eliminate commercial netting for reds.

Or the state could allow commercial netters to take reds in limited numbers during certain parts of the year. The commission wants to keep the fishing pressure off the reds and on mating season.

As it is there is a limit of only one redfish over 32 inches. I doubt that rule will be changed but you should be prepared to face a bag limit if the law goes into effect early next year.

The present law might be altered in one other way. It seems that since the 18-inch limit has been in effect I saw two post few months anglers have had a tough time catching keepers. I've had days when we caught seven or eight reds in the 16- to 17-inch range but all of them had to be released. One of my angling customers got so frustrated that he finally remarked, "I got it now. Reds don't ever grow over 18 inches — do they?"

There is talk in Tallahassee of lowering the limit from 18 to 16 inches. I believe that if they put a bag limit on the fish they should drop that size limit too. We'll see.

In the meantime, remember reds and grouper have to be 18 inches long. Snook have to measure 21 inches long and Jan. 1 starts the closed season for snook. There is no change in sea trout fishing rules, but I expect the length on those fish will move up too.

Good angling. And I hope you don't think all we talk about is the loss of more fishing rights. These changes will provide all of us better fishing in the long run.



# SHELLING TIPS

Here we are about to end one year and start another and you still haven't found that jumbo yet? Right? This week let's take a look at some of the best shelling spots you can visit here on the islands.

You should know that the ends of the islands and points on the gulf side usually produce the most shells.

One of the best points is on the west end of Sanibel at Blind Pass Bridge. There is free public parking on the Captiva side of the bridge at Turner's Beach, but it's always crowded from about 9 a.m. to sunset so get there early.

There are certain restricted parking spots on Sanibel as outlined in the Island Guide section of "The Islander." Some spots require a special car sticker so if you pull into a beach access and find a sign that says restricted parking you will be fined if you don't have a sticker. It's best to walk to those areas or ride bikes.

On the Sanibel side of the Blind Pass Bridge there is such a parking area for cars with stickers. Park on the Captiva side and walk over the bridge to avoid a ticket.

The water really flows under the bridge and things in shells. Don't expect to see a lot of large perfect ones. Most are smaller. Look for

retired olive small lightning whelks, pen shells, ponderous arks, carditas, bubble shells, some alphabet cones, arallops, murexes and perhaps some golden horse conchs. This is nearly all dead stuff.

Another good spot to try is Bowman's Beach. There is a \$2 per car parking fee at this county park but the beautiful beach is worth it. It is wide and long so you can walk a couple of miles while looking for shells. This beach sometimes has sand dollars but heavy waves usually break them up as they wash ashore. Look for many of the karrie shells back at Blind Pass.

Bowman's is sometimes a good driftwood beach too.

One of the best beaches for miniature shells is down at the free public access at the Sanibel Lighthouse at the far eastern end of the island. There are restrooms and a free public fishing pier too.

This is one of the few places on the islands where you can look for — and reasonably expect to find — the wendlerap shell. These are delicate white or light tan colored shells that collectors cherish. They remind me of a small horn of plenty. There could also be coffee bean shells, bubbles, nautica, shark's eyes, augers, murexes

and possibly a sand dollar or two. Walk east past the Lighthouse — and look carefully for these small shells that are an inch long or even smaller. Another good collecting area lies along what local people call the Rocks. It is down on West Gulf Drive but unless you take a long walk from a public access it is difficult to reach. Many people have a nice shelling friend drop them off at those restricted parking spots to avoid a ticket. The Rocks can have a wide variety of shells and for those not afraid of doing a little walking, it is a good spot to look.

Of course you would be wise to plan any shelling trip around low tide times of the day. Check "The Islander" for times. I suggest getting out on the beaches at dawn, no matter what the tide is because the beach has had all night to replenish itself.

Good shelling this week. And please remember the Sanibel resolution of limiting your take to only two live shells per species per person. Many people concerned with the future of shelling urge you not to take any live shells at all.

## Tops in tennis

### World-class players make up field for 1986 PaineWebber Classic at Sonesta Sanibel Harbour resort

The field for the 1986 PaineWebber Classic continues to take on a world-class shape. Andres Gomez, a native of Ecuador and American, Brad Gilbert will join Jimmy Connors and defending champion Ivan Lendl at the Jimmy Connors United States Tennis Center at Sonesta Sanibel Harbour Resort, March 15-21.

The \$315,000 PaineWebber Classic, which will be presented by Volvo Tennis for the second consecutive year at Sonesta Sanibel Harbour as a Nabisco Grand Prix Super Series event featuring 32 singles players and 16 doubles teams.

The left-hander has numerous titles to his credit, including the Seiko Hong Kong Tennis Classic, the D.C. National Bank Classic and the Donnay Open Championships. Three weeks ago he won his second straight Seiko Hong Kong tournament.

Gilbert also reached the semi-finals of the PaineWebber Classic this year. He's best on the tour since he joined in 1981. The former Peppercorn All American won three Nabisco Grand Prix events, the Volvo Tennis Classic in New Jersey, Society Bank Classic and the Israel Tennis Center Classic Bank Classic and the Israel Tennis Classic in 1983. The steady right-hander was runner-up at the Mercedes Cup and the Altech South African Open. In 1985, Gilbert equalled the quarterfinal record in tournaments. He was the champion of the Taormina International Championships in 1982 and 1984 and won the Buckley Boys Ranch Tennis Classic in 1983. Gilbert has posted career victories over Vilas, Gerulaitis, Kevin Curren, Eliot Teltscher and Johan Kriek. The northern California native also has represented the United States in both Junior Davis Cup and Davis Cup play.

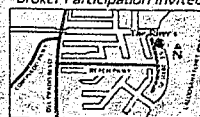

After the cataclysm that terminated the unbelievably successful and dominant groups known as the ornithischian and saurischian dinosaurs 65 million years ago relatively few surviving vertebrates evolved and radiated into the diverse and complex mammal, bird and reptile communities we know today.

There is no reason to believe that surviving vertebrate animals after the nuclear holocaust and war will not be able to evolve into the many aced and new ecological niches. Am I preaching sci fi here? I don't think so.

When the dinosaurs came to an untimely end the rather insignificant mammals blossomed and radiated into all sorts of situations even flight — and ultimately lethal man. There is no good reason to think that ever-plex extensive

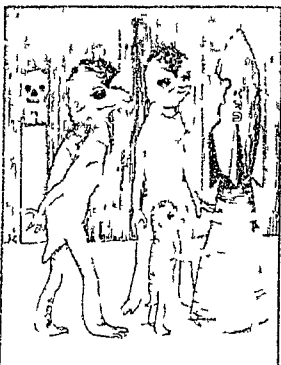
evolution cannot be repeated if Planet Earth "drops back into a near Mesozoic Era" after the coming tragedy. That is what I call backwards to the future.

One paleontologist recently at Harvard and Johns Hopkins universities now living and doing his fossil in the west, has espoused the unique theory that birds are indeed true modern day dinosaurs. Whether he is right about that I don't know. But that birds have radiated into all shapes and forms to fill all habitats is true. Consider the difference between a human, a lizard and an ostrich or a penguin and a parrot.

If a few species of birds survived the cataclysm could they do it again? I think they could. I also think amphibians and reptiles could do it again, too. Among the myriad of vertebrates not only cockroaches for my benefit (even cockroaches) will survive. But the probability is that a number of diverse forms will survive and carry on.

So it seems to be survivors of any group that makes it through the nuclear war has a good chance at evolution. The future might be bright for them on the long pull.

But poor old Homo sapiens will not be there. No second chance for him for he dug his own grave in the late 20th century. He was here by the remote chance of evolution, not by right. He made wrong turns and became extinct by his own hand. But Planet Earth seems to have a good shot at the future.

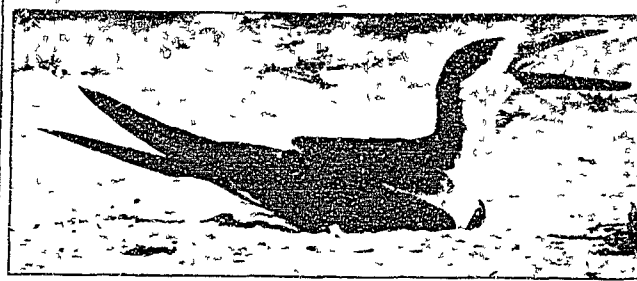

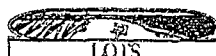
