

Young Artists 2004 at Alliance

The Opening Night Reception for the Alliance for the Arts Young Artists 2004 exhibit will be from 5 to 7 p.m. on Friday, April 30. This annual exhibition is open to the public and displays artworks created by students in Lee county public and private schools.

Sponsored by LAEA: Lee Art Educators Association, Young Artists 2004 consists of two separate art student exhibits. The first, an exhibition of Lee High School students' artworks, arranged by LAEA member, curator Steve Frank, launches with the April 30 Opening Reception and remains on view through May 11.

The second exhibit, arranged by LAEA member Young Artists 2003 award-winning Painting "Smile" by James Milne



Carolyn Gora, is a show featuring works by Lee elementary and middle school students. The Elementary/Middle School show debuts with its own Opening Reception, 5 to 7 p.m. on Monday, May 17 and remains on public display through May 24.

This year, as in prior years, the "Young Artists" exhibit showcases more than 500 artworks created by Lee County public and private school art students, with numerous prizes and ribbons awarded in various categories.

This year again, in addition to the LAEA awards that will be presented, the high school student artist winning the "Best of Show" award will also receive a once-in-a-lifetime trip to France. The gift covers food, lodging, and arts instruction in France, including daily closed-to-the public painting sessions inside Claude Monet's famed garden at the internationally celebrated ArtStudy/Giverny Program founded and directed by Gale Bennett. Bennett, a renowned Cape Coral artist is an Alliance member. The published fee for attending one of Bennett's sessions is over \$3,100, and Bennett's offer includes 50% of the same costs for an accompanying guardian if the winner is less than 18 years old.

Currently in Giverny, Bennett believes, "Of all the kinds of support available to young emerging artists, I'm


convinced that the most beneficial are those providing both personal inspiration and professional instruction. Which is why I'm so pleased to make this offer to the winner of the Alliance's "Young Artists 2004" high school exhibition. No one can visit Monet's garden and home and town without being creatively energized. Most people in the world only get to quickly pass through this place for about an hour or so. This year's winner will be able to absorb and revel in all the positive vibrations that abound here while working at her or his art. 

During their visit, the McCauleys will be ministering at several churches and prayer gatherings. On Monday evening, May 3, their hosts, Erik and Chris Jorgensen, plan to open their home at 7:30 p.m., when Brendan and Angela will speak regarding their experiences with the reconciliation movement plus what they have learned of important cross-cultural issues there and in India. They will welcome questions and also requests for prayer for healing, encouragement and direction.

BIG ARTS Hosts Young Artists' Exhibits


BIG ARTS is pleased to announce the arrival of two highly impressive art exhibits created exclusively by young, local artists!

BIG ARTS AfterSchool Studio Students Exhibit

At the end of each school day a group of tired kids jump off the bus in front of BIG ARTS. After another tough day of school they are ready for something different — something that allows them some freedom and self expression! That's just what they get until 5 p.m. as they participate in a very special art program called AfterSchool Studio. This program is made possible through a grant from the The L.A.T. Foundation. Students not only participate in visual arts classes, but may also choose from the variety of performing arts classes that are offered afternoons at BIG ARTS. Now, after months of hard



work, these young artists are ready to show the community some of the amazing things they have accomplished.

The AfterSchool Studio Students' Exhibit will demonstrate the many skills and talents these young island artist have been working to develop over the current school year. Ably led and inspired by professional artist and art teacher, Mary Ann Czarnecki, the students, aged 6 to 14, are very enthusiastic about how far they have



come and how much they have done. "Art is important for a child's healthy growth development," says Czarnecki as she watches the quiet concentration of some of her students drawing in the sketch books they have been keeping all year as an ongoing project.

With a quick look through a couple of sketch books, it's immediately obvious how much these students have experi-

enced and developed in AfterSchool Studio. They have learned about Seurat, Gaugin and Klee. Their sketch books, paintings, and dimensional art demonstrate their developing knowledge of Realists, Cubists and Surrealists, sculptors and printmakers — a huge range of styles and influences are clearly evident.

When asked, each student has a different take on what was the hardest medium

to work with or the most fun. 'Working on the wheel (clay) was the most fun and exciting," said a 5th grader. "I had to learn to be patient, though. It can be complicated! Others felt that creating their papier mache circus animals was the most challenging project. All agreed that in each different medium it was "cool" to see what they could create when they followed Mrs. Czarnecki's advice, as explained by one first

grader. "To do, like, our own thing!



Chico Fernandez at Backwater Fishing School

J. M. "Chico" Fernandez, world-renowned fly fisherman and author, is joining the Genmar/Evinrude Backwater Fishing School faculty and will headline an advanced fly fishing school for four three-day/four night sessions this year.

The four classes, June 20-24, Sept. 19-23, Oct. 17-21 and Nov. 14-18 are being limited to four students each session "to ensure each student individual and personal attention," says Gordon Houser, director of the school.

The regular Backwater Light Tackle School is held contemporaneously with the stand-alone advanced Flyfishing sessions. Students will share common dining room hours to build camaraderie.

He has written many articles, currently writes a column in Saltwater Fly Fishing Magazine and has just finished a book on bonefishing, due out this summer.



alter past responses. At one time Republicans were opponents of foreign involvement. They were called isolationists in those days.



America is a great nation because it experimented with diversity and political possibilities unknown before. It was will-


that not too long ago President ing to explore directions and Bush chastised. And the Democrats seem institutions that allowed for thoughtful



Kiwanis: Richter on Real Estate... The Word is "Good"


"Retire here? Scores of lucky couples have. Land is still cheaper here than at most other Florida resorts. For \$2,250 you can buy a spacious lot with beach and dock privileges and for \$12 per square foot you can build an elaborate home... Older 2-3 bedroom homes on or near the beach sell from \$12,000. Occasionally homes can be rented from \$75-100 per month on a year around basis... Beachfront lots 600 feet deep, ideal for resort properties can be had for \$175-\$250 a foot front, bay front lots \$60 a foot front."

That was Sanibel, all right, but Kiwanian Jay Richter, who manages a group at Coldwell Banker on Sanibel, was quoting from Utopia is an Island from 1963. As in past years, his annual Real Estate update snapped most Kiwanians back to the present.

Real estate on Sanibel is, in a word, 'good." Last year in February there were 28 sales on the Island. This year there were 71. As he always does, Richter asked, "what do you think performed best?"

Lots were in last place. Units were up a paltry 23%, but the average price went unit sales up 71% over last year with the from \$365,000 to \$644,000. Why? There aren't many left. Expensive ones are selling. "A lot on Sanibel, in fact, is getting to be an old house." Just like Captiva.

Condos were in second place with a 35% increase in units over last year. Gulf fronts were at \$700 per square foot, and the average sale price \$692,000. There is a good supply of expensive condos for sale. Rentals aren't great; taxes are up. A judge in Key West recently ruled in favor of allowing weekly rentals. Will it spread here?

average residential sale on Sanibel-Captiva at \$908,000. Canal front lots are at a premium, and as Cape Coral prices explode, more of their buyers are looking here. Essentially there is nothing good here in the \$400,000 range. Jay's group sold 15 properties over \$1,000,000 in February.

Even Captiva is looking good. Four or five old listings just sold. Unit sales are up 26%, and the average sale there is \$2.6 million.

Off-Island sales are up, with condos leading lots and residential sales. A down-Residential was the big winner with town project sold out in just three weeks.

30% of Sanibel-Captiva Real Estate Board's sales are off-island.

Marco has been outperforming Sanibel 3 to 1, but that doesn't mean things are bad here. Nationally, appreciation is running 4-4.5%. Florida is at 12%, and Sanibel may go as high as 26%. There is still a decent supply. Southwest Florida still leads the country in building permits issued.

The number one reason people buy is family (a lot of second homes), but climate, boomer demand, environment and investment are also strong factors

HOMES ARE SELLING AT RECORD LEVELS

Nationwide sales of the existing inventory of homes are exceptionally high. In real estate history records, there have only been eight other months in which the national rate of home sales reached or exceeded the six million mark, as it did in February 2004, when existing home sales were recorded at a seasonally adjusted annual rate of 6.12 million units.

Economists are saying that the housing market could defy expectations this year. The chief economist for the National Association of Realtors projects that home sales are going to decline slightly, but that home buying and selling continues for now at exceptionally high levels. This is due largely to historically low mortgage interest rates that are enabling millions to obtain affordable mortgage loans.

millions to obtain affordable mortgage loans.

If interest rates persist in this low holding pattern, home sales will probably sustain these record levels, at least until the second half of 2004, when rates are expected to rise. The fact that the demand for housing from a growing population is greater than the current supply of homes should keep prices competitive and sales dynamic, even if mortgage rates increase.







Fit 'n Trim: Praising grazing

If I told you it's possible to lose weight by eating more often, would you think I'm crazy? Well, let's just explore this premise for a moment

You may have noticed that small children balk at big portions. They "graze" — eat small amounts of food every few hours. Like the parents of baby birds, human parents knock themselves out providing their little eaters with tempting tidbits.

It does take extra time and energy to concoct frequent meals, but grazing, like tiny tykes, could help adults manage their weight.

. Most people enjoy the traditional "three squares" a day. They eat a lot of food at one sitting, and may find themselves feeling peckish between meals Grazing, on the other hand, helps keep stomachs from growling.

The hunger feeling is your body's way of signaling that your blood sugar is low. Carbohydrates (vegetables, grains, fruits, sugar) convert quickly into glucose, or blood sugar, once they enter your system. This rise in glucose stimulates the production of insulin, which rapidly suppresses your blood sugar. And when your glucose dips below the minimum that your body needs, you feel hungry.

By eating frequent, small meals, and including protein and fat as well as carbohydrates each time you eat, you can reduce the amount of insulin your body secretes, and keep your blood sugar stable. You may wind up eating the same amount of food as you would in three large meals, but rationing portions through the day helps control your hunger and the tendency to OVEReat if you're ravenous by mealtime.

One of the guidelines of the Fit'n'Trim

weight management program is to eat when you're hungry. Perhaps the best way to manage hunger is to graze. This takes planning, of course, as you need to have plenty of snacks on hand that won't sabotage your weight management efforts. You might try some raw veggies with dip, a handful of nuts, soy crisps with a dollop of tuna or chicken salad, or peanut butter on rye krisps or celery stalks. Also try to eat slowly, stop eating when you're no longer hungry, and save the rest of your meal for when you get hungry later.

If you divide your "three-squares" into many mini-meals, you'll keep your blood sugar even and provide your body with a steady source of energy As a result, you'll manage your weight more successfully and you'll be praising grazing!

Free eye exams for diabetic seniors

Beth Collette's fused glass artistry

"I love glass," exclaims Beth Collette and she has chosen to work in fused glass, the art of "glass forming," which is believed to have originated around 2000 B.C. with the Egyptians and Romans. The technique of "glass fusing" involves joining together by the applica-tion of heat. "I cut the glass, stack the pieces next to and on top of each other, fire them in the kiln. I am never sure what the piece will look like until it is cool and I remove it from the kiln. That's the real excitement. Each

time brings a new design and a new adventure." She adds, "Mistakes are only minor detours on my path of creativity."

After graduation from Oswego State University in Oswego, New York with an emphasis on graphic design, jewelry, metals and photography, Collette headed right to New York City where she began her career in graphic design. During her first four years she worked in a private studio as an assistant to three prominent designers and then spent another two years as a graphic designer for the record company, Def Jam. With her artistic talent, entrepreneurial skills and passion for jewelry making, Collette spent her off-time establishing her own jewelry business, using beads as her

medium. Shops from N e w

York to Florida were placing orders and her jewelry was featured in photo shoots and videos for recording artists.

Ready for a warmer climate and closer proximity to her family, Collette moved to Southwest Florida in 1994 and experimented with something new. "I wanted to make my own beads." She studied

glass fusing, was intrigued with the process and decided, "That's for me." Collette started creating her fused glass jewelry and displaying it on the island. She acknowledges that "The Seaweed Gallery and Linda Boltrek gave me my real start."

As the demand for her fused glass jewelry has been increasing, Collette has expanded her studio space. She is now spending more time creating her unusual pieces, and new designs keep popping into her head. The first

pieces she designed were her pendants. I started with a couple of colors and a couple of ideas." Collette remembers the large, light teal cabochon ring she was


wearing Captiva: it made such a hit that a woman placed a special order for a similar cabochon and a pair of earrings to match!


Her newest creations are her very simple, open geometricshaped pendants in a variety of colors, ranging from the palest to the very deepest colors. These may be worn on silk cord, organza ribbon or thin leather and they allow you to accessorize and create your own look with the same pendant but different chains. Collette explains that one of her best selling pendants — and one of the few pieces that she duplicates — is "Moon Over the Water" using a cobalt blue background.

A thriller in a thriller... with laughs!

Florida Repertory Theater's production of Ira Levin's *Deathtrap*, currently playing at the Arcade Theatre, walks the fine line between building suspense and twisted comedy. The play vacillates deftly between these lines and comes up as a crackerjack Producing/Director Cacioppo originally directed *Deathtrap* in 1990 at the Old Schoolhouse

Theatre. Then, as now, the cast consisted of Carrie Lund and Michael Marotta as Sidney and Myra Bruhl. The ensuing 15 years have served these two actors well in playing their roles... whereas, 13 years ago, they needed makeup and gray hair color to portray age, they are now perfectly cast, emotionally stronger, more mature and natural. This recent revival is a far superior production to the original (which was


itself first rate). According to Cacioppo's statement ... "audiences are intrigued by this play because it is like a game. It keeps the audience guessing and re-guessing right up until the final curtain." The other characters are well served by new members to the cast Ryan Gilreath as Clifford Anderson (the part originally played by Maurice Schlaffer), Carol Provonsha playing Helga ten Dorp (originated by Dianne Spencer), and John Newton as Porter Milgrim (can't recall who that was in 1990).

The minute you enter the Arcade, you know you are indeed looking at a really fine Deathtrap set, this one designed by Ray Recht. The set is crowded with vintage and antique guns, knives, maces, handcuffs, crossbows — even a couple of battle axes all hanging on the walls. Under Cacioppo's clever direction Levin's comic mystery is done justice, even though the cast is having a lot of fun with this thriller which makes fun of thrillers while still being thrilling.

The first is a story of a woman trying to understand her mother's past in order to determine her own future. There Is Room For You by Charlotte Bacon,




published by Farrar. Straus n d Giroux, is a beautifully wrought story of w o women and two cultures: a mother a n d daughter and India n.

America. Anna Singer attempts to deal with two great losses in her life: the unexplainable death of her father and the death

of her marriage. In order to do that, she travels to India, the birthplace and childhood home of her English mother, Rose. Rose raised her two children with a certain distance and, while Anna knew of India's importance to her. Rose never really shared her childhood with her children. Rose is not anxious for Anna to visit India, but when she insists, she gives her papers in which she has written about her own life there. Anna reluctantly takes the papers and goes off to India to try to figure out what to do with the rest of her life. Through her mother's papers, she discovers unexplored territories of her mother's life which explain her mother and her own childhood in ways she never expected.

The book is beautifully written, filled with descriptions which capture both the essence of India and the personal relationships of the family. Anna's story is juxtaposed with her mother's story which places two distinct time periods next to each other. This gives depth to Anna's experience in India by showing the reader how some things have changed and others have maintained an almost eternal aspect of "India-ness". This quality is also balanced by Anna's and Rose's remembrances about their lives in America. There are times when Bacon could take an easy way out to tie up ends or make her characters more likeable, but to her credit, she doesn't. For Anna, her trip to India is a real growth experience. At first, she is taken by the tourist's overwhelmingly sensual impressions of India and its

Chamber Annual Meeting

On Tuesday, April 20, the Chamber of Commerce held its annual meeting at the Sundial on Middle Gulf Drive. A large turnout of members heard Chamber President Ann Joffe and Executive Director Steve Greenstein review the accomplishments of the past year and recognize some who have made considerable contributions to the community. Also recognized for their special efforts were the staff and volunteers who received warm and sustained applause from an appreciative membership.

Four awards have been made regularly each year to recognize members for certain contributions, and a fifth award was added this year. This year's winners are:



Walter Klie Lifetime **Achievement Award -Erick Lindblad**

How many people do you know who race cars (and repair them), roller-blade, drive snowmobiles, windsurf, install (and repair) electronic gear, run a ski-lift at 11,000 feet, serve as a scuba instructor and address such subjects as the growth patterns of plankton, fire control, sea turtle nesting habits and habitats and interior wetlands restoration?

Among the more familiar figures around these islands is Erick Lindblad, executive director of the Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation for the past 18 years and, at the recent Chamber annual meeting, Erick Lindblad was awarded Sanibel and Captiva's most honored award, the Walter Klie Lifetime Achievement Award. Devoted to the been instrumental in the acquisition

of more than 1,190 acres of land on and around Sanibel

and Captiva for wildlife preserve areas.

He arrived here in 1986 in response to a message left on his desk at Newfound Harbor Marine Institute at Seacamp on Big Pine Key where he was the director. He and his wife, Ellen had been married 10 years and had two kids about ready to start school in a system that, at the time, wasn't the greatest. After working his way to the top of the heap at Big Pine, he felt his job had lost some of its challenge. He came for an interview, he returned for a second interview, this time with Ellen... and the rest is history, as they say.

Erick often represents Sanibel at regional and national seminars concerning development and its relationship to natural systems. "Some of the most fun I have is at conferences where someone asks me about Sanibel or I'm supposed to talk about Sanibel," he said once. "People listen in disbelief when I talk about volunteers doing water quality testing or building boardwalks, landscaping our public places or teaching courses. Everyone else pays staff to do those things. They are stunned when I talk about The Sanibel Report, the city's stated goals and its adherence to those goals. It really makes me feel good about being from Sanibel.'

He is also extraordinarily active and dedicated within the larger community in many capacities — on the City of Sanibel Wildlife Committee (two years as chairman), the J.N. "Ding" Darling National Wildlife Refuge Conservation Council almost since ts inception, the City Budget Review Committee, the board of the International Osprey Foundation and the Charlotte Harbor National Estuary Program Technical Advisory committee.

He is a member of the Caloosahatchee River Citizens Association, the Lee County Conservation Lands and Stewardship Advisory Council, serving on the Land Management sub-committee, and Sanibel-Captiva Rotary, where he was treasurer of the Rotary Trust Fund Board.

Ellen and he have been married now for 28 years and she serves as executive director of the CREW Land & Water Trust. Their two children — Lars and Jenny — are now 24 and 20, respectively.

Islands of the Arts Award -Maurice Oshry

Long-time islander, Maurice Oshry, retiring Sanibel Music Festival's PR man par excellence, was awarded the Chamber of Commerce's Islands of the Arts volunteer award for 2003/4. Since he planned to leave for the summer before the Chamber's Annual Meeting, he was presented his award at the Festival's final concert.

'Maurice was a very innovative marketing director who worked tirelessly for the Festival for 18 years," former Festival President Nancy Clark said. "He developed our beautiful brochures and advertising, got us recogni-

tion in the papers, both on the island and area-wide - even The New York Times... all Maurice's doing!'

"He is a tireless, persistent and creative marketing and public relations person," said former Festival Artistic Director Mary Jaqua, who worked with him for the entire span of the Festival. "An idea man - it just doesn't stop!

"Maurice simply doesn't take 'No' for the final answer. He appeals to people with great charm and aplomb - charisma, if you will - and has a gift for making people comfortable enough to see the value of signing on.

Jaqua who also had served as Festival president, continued, "The connections he makes are legendary - an

amazingly productive person.

"He told the board 12 years ago he wanted to take the festival national ...to which we said, 'C'mon, Maurice, how are you going to do that?' Well, it was his resourcefulness that made it possible for the concerts to be broadcast by NPR all over the country. He did it with his phenomenal creativity and the linkages he, personally, established. Maurice sees a possibility and makes it a reality."

A native of Cincinnati and a graduate of the University of Cincinnati, Maurice served in the Air Force in World War II, then worked for an advertising agency for 25 years where, as he puts it, "I learned the creative end of PR and marketing." Oshry has had a life-long interest in antiques, particularly Russian icons and art, and English furniture and, in the '60a and '70s was a partner in the hugely successful Wilmar Antiques in Hyde Park, Ohio.

After visiting Sanibel a couple of times, in the early 80s he built a house in Tradewinds, which he eventually sold, and has rented "winter quarters" on the island ever

In addition to his fall and winter (and summer, actually) commitment to the Festival for close to 20 years, he has served as a volunteer with the Cincinnati Art Museum, chairing countless special events and receiving numerous commendations. He also volunteers with the Playhouse in the Park and, prior to the Cincinnati Museum, devoted his energies to the Taft Museum. This spring he was elected to a three-year term on the board of the Cincinnati Chamber Music Society which is celebrating its Diamond Anniversary this coming season.

Islands of the Arts Award -Danny Morgan

Singer, songwriter, visual artist, bandleader— when it comes to the arts, Danny Morgan has it all covered. Morgan began as a visual artist, winning an award for drawing in the first grade. Throughout his school years, music and art remained his primary focus. He played in a band throughout high school, and enjoyed enough success with his music to enable him to enroll in Eastern Kentucky University's arts program. Morgan was able to support himself throughout his college years with his music, playing at a number of the major midwestern colleges. He graduated top in his class in 1969, and won the "Who's Who" in American Colleges award for art.

This lead to a teaching post with the Cincinnati public school system, and gallery representation in the city's 4th Street arts district. Morgan's days were spent teaching, with weekends devoted to painting and music. In the early 1970's, a summer job playing every week night in Colorado led to a priority shift, with music becoming the paramount occupation.

Morgan's move to Florida has resulted in opportunities for both music and painting. His tenor voice can be heard at many island events, and he's one of the most sought after musicians for local weddings. He has three CD's out, with "Beach Life" ranking as the most popular

ranking as the most popular.

His paintings were featured in a solo exhibition at BIG Arts in October of 2001, in a recent group show at the Captiva Civic Center, and at Art Miami this past January.

"T'm very thankful for all the support all of the locals and visitors have given me through the years," Morgan said. "I feel very blessed, and very lucky. This is a tremendous community — I love this community, you just couldn't live in a better place. It's a great place to be creative."

Citizen of the Year -Robbie Roepstorff

"You don't do it to be recognized, you just do it," was Robbie B. Roepstorff's response when asked why she contributes so much time and effort to a number of organizations throughout Lee County.

Roepstorff was honored Tuesday as the Sanibel-Captiva Chamber of Commerce Citizen of the Year.

Overwhelmed by the honor, Roepstorff

said she would have never dreamed of even receiving a nomination for the honor. "It takes you back when someone does say you really are doing the right things for the community," Roepstorff said. "That's where the 'feel good' comes in, but I assure you we don't do it to be recognized."

Roepstorff is no stranger to community service on the islands. Since moving to Sanibel in 1993, Roepstorff has continuously involved herself in countless community projects and fund raisers. One major project Roepstorff has been involved in is the "We Love Our Island's" campaign. The campaign sponsored by Bank of the Islands, where Roepstorff is president, raises funds for many island organizations that may not have the resources or staff to hold fund raisers. you stop and say how much more could I be doing."

Born in Florence, Alabama, Roepstorff has lived in SW Florida since 1977. Her husband, Geoffrey, is the CEO of Edison National Bank. Their son Matthew, is a graduate of Bishop Verot High School and is completing his freshman year at Jacksonville University.

Eighteen members of the Sanibel Bicycle Club and 350 other bikers from around the country participated in the annual Bike Safari April 17-22 in northern Florida. The six-day event is sponsored by the Florida Freewheelers Club in the Orlando area. Harris Gilbert, a member of both bike clubs, convinced a group of local Club members to join him again for the Safari. The group had a great time and came home tired but injury-free and in better shape. Those weekly



sights, sounds, smells and tastes, but as her eyes clear and her mind is filled with knowledge of her mother, she understands herself and India. For readers, it is a similar experience as they get to know the souls of the characters and the country.

The second novel, Useful Girl by Marcus Stevens, published by Algonquin Books, also tells a story of existence on two planes. Erin is a seventeen-year-old girl who has recently lost her mother. She and her father try



to figure out a way to live together around the hole her mother's death has created. When the bones of a young Cheyenne girl are found on a road building site supervised by her father, Erin's life changes as she and a young Chevenne worker try to give the bones the respect they deserve. Erin finds her grandfather's old journals which tell the story of his adventures as a Captain in the Army that destroyed the remaining Cheyenne after Little Big Horn. Meanwhile she and Charlie White Bird, the young worker, fall in


love and she becomes pregnant. Rather than facing her father or the baby's father, she runs away. Soon the parallels and confluences of her life and the dead Indian girl become more intense. The author is able to run the threads of the two stories together until it becomes clear that the present must resolve the issues of the past. Through Erin's child, there is a chance that that might happen. As in the previous book, this novel is filled with physical details of its location, giving the reader an understanding of the plot which could not happen anywhere else in the world.

In both of these novels, the authors use a journal or writings to give the women an understanding they would not have had without them. Although the settings and the plots are very different, the message is the same. One

must understand the past to create a future.

As an addendum, I recommend th book When Smoke Ran Like Water by Devra Davis. It is an extremely readable book about the threats of pollution to our world. Davis is a Ph.D. researcher and Public Health expert who has been involved in national and international boards on environmental threats to our health and future. Her family lived in Donora, Pennsylvania during one of the worst air pollution events in history and her scientific work has

lead her to fight against environmental pollution on a very broad scale. She writes about how lead additives to gasoline have caused untold numbers of deaths, how CFC's have depleted the ozone layer, how mercury has caused birth defects, how global warming is affecting us all, how chemicals have caused breast cancer and how industry and government have either ignored warnings or subverted attempts to rectify



the situation. Because she has been involved on a personal, political and scientific level, what she says rings with truth. Like the message of the fiction I reviewed, this book cries out that one must understand the past to create a future. To Custonie S




