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Despite disagreement, county approves ice rink

A plan to move ahead with developments at Oak Ridge Park was the subject of a rare disagreement among members of the Union County Freeholder Board last week.

Freeholders Angel Estrada and Vernell Wright voted against a measure to award a construction management contract not to exceed \$800,000 to Pinnacle Consulting and Construction Services, based in Newark.

Freeholder Dan Sullivan, who serves as chairman of the county's fiscal committee, acknowledged it is uncommon to see dissent on the board.

"They're entitled to their opinion and their vote, so I respect that," he said.

Chief among the proposed improvements to the park is the ice skating rink projected to cost between \$15 and \$25 million.

Located in Clark, the 90-acre Oak Ridge Park has much undeveloped space. At present, the facility features an archery range, bicycle path, fitness trail and restrooms. There is copious amounts of open space where visitors engage in activities ranging from informal soccer games to kite flying.

The park previously served as the location for the county's annual fair, featuring MusicFest, which was discontinued after 2011 due to financial burdens facing the county. In addition, an investigation by the county prosecutor's office one year ago found the event to be mismanaged, but the county never acknowledged this as a reason for the annual event being canceled, maintaining that MusicFest became a burden on the county coffers which have been stressed from a continued poor national, state and local economy.

County Spokesman Sebastian D'Elia said the county is "leaning toward" the construc-

New stage opens at Union County Performing Arts Center

RAHWAY — The city celebrated the expansion of Union County Performing Arts Center last weekend as Hamilton Stage launched its inaugural season with a series of short performances and a benefit celebration.

The site is owned by the Rahway Redevelopment Agency and located on Hamilton Street, about a block and half away from the main UCPAC building in the Downtown Arts District.

"We're really excited," Council President Samson Steinman said. "Basically the whole

town is talking about it. We sold out tickets for the opening night."

Hamilton Stage was designed by the architectural firm of Farewell Mills Gatsch of Princeton. Construction took just more than a year and cost about \$6 million, an expense bonded by the city about two years ago. Steinman said there is no timeline for paying back the bond, but the city will soon begin "chipping away" at it using proceeds earned from the stage.

Steinman said he is confident this is a good investment, as evidenced by the city recently receiving a National Endowment for the Arts grant to help get the stage's first sea-

son underway. The "Our Town" grant was for \$75,000.

"It's basically programming money for shows at Hamilton Stage, but it will be combined with educational components, including some taking place at local schools," Steinman said.

Hamilton Stage will be home to six Artistic Affiliates this season. It features a 199-seat Proscenium Theater as well as a smaller 60-seat Front Room Theater.

This new building represents a significant expansion of Union County Performing Arts Center.

"This gives the Union County Performing

Arts Center five different performance spaces at the Rahway facility," said Richard Bryant, Managing Director of Hamilton Stage.

Moreover, local officials hope the stage will fill an important niche for spoken theater, dance, and small concerts.

"It allows the arts district to bring in smaller venues without opening the big theater," Rahway Redevelopment Agency Chair William Rack explained. "If you put them in the big center, there's 1,500 seats in there. You don't really need that huge building for some of the productions they are doing."

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New turf field project finally hits its stride

SPRINGFIELD — The long-awaited project to build a turf field in Springfield has begun after the initial round of bids were rejected last month for being too costly. Construction on the \$3.4 million playing field began earlier this month.

Board of Education President Pat Venezia said it was “amazing” to see the process finally begin and it made her think back to the township’s very first turf field committee, which she sat on over 12 years ago.

“This has been the dream of so many Springfield residents for a very long time,” Venezia said. “It’s gratifying to see that perseverance does work.”

The work is being undertaken by Rochelle Contracting Company Inc., based in Landing, N.J. Township Administrator Anthony Cancro said this company came in number two in the first round of bidding in July.

Venezia said the initial rejection of the bids was a bit of a disappointment, but it is not an unusual circumstance to have bids come in too high at first. She expressed confidence in Rochelle Contracting Company.

“This contractor has a good reputation and was obviously motivated to get the job,” Venezia said. “He sharpened his pencil after the first bid and came in with the lowest price.”

Construction began Sept. 7 and is expected to be completed in late Fall of 2013, according to Cancro.

Work has already begun on installing a new turf field at Jonathan Dayton High School in Springfield. The project has been one the district and town have been hoping to complete for a long time, and many are happy to finally see progress on the project.

The completed field will be used for many different sports activities, as it has been in the past. These activities will include tennis, football, soccer, cross country and softball. The project will also

include amenities such as bleachers, a snack bar, five tennis courts, and athletic field lights. A baseball diamond will not be included at the site.

The project received the unanimous

support of the Township Committee. Local officials have stated the field will increase property values as well as community pride. The township has not had a serviceable athletic field for many years, instead paying neighbor Union a fee to use their facility. Cancro estimated these expenses, combined with transportation costs, to be about \$40,000 a year.

Earlier this year, the project faced some uncertainty due to fears the impervious surface of the field may exacerbate flooding in the township. However, the specifications of the project incorporate a hollow underground space designed to safely hold stormwater. Township officials stated they believe the field will not pose any health or flooding-related risks to residents.

The ongoing construction work has resulted in major changes to the drop off and pick up procedures at the school, but Venezia said parents and students are coping with the inconvenience.

“I am happy to say that both parents and students have been extremely cooperative, with very few complaints,” Venezia said.

Committee member Jerry Fernandez said he is proud of the way the township has worked with the Board of Education and the community to set this long-overdue project into motion.

“It shows you what we can accomplish when we work together,” Fernandez said. “All three organizations came together to make this dream possible.”

County offers Take Back Initiative

The Union County Freeholders encourage Union County residents to rid their homes of unwanted and expired medication at the Drug Enforcement Administration’s National Take Back Initiative on Saturday, Sept. 29, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. at Union County Police Department, 300 North Ave. East, Westfield.

Take Back events are a tool for reducing the abuse of prescription and non-prescription medications. The goal of the program is to allow citizens to turn unused, unwanted or expired medications in to law enforcement officials who will dispose of the substances in a safe and non-hazardous manner. During October 2011, Operation Take Back New Jersey collected 9,831 pounds of medication state-wide.

Union County Police Department will be staffed for collection in addition to various municipal police departments throughout the County. County: Renewable energy project 90 percent complete

The Union County Renewable Energy Program is now 90 percent complete, with 28 of 31 facilities already installed and generating renewable energy savings for 15 governmental agencies, Union County Improvement Authority Director Charlotte DeFilippo has announced. The final installed systems size will total 3.37 megawatts.

The last three facilities, scheduled to be opened in Roselle and Berkeley Heights, will be operational by mid-October, DeFilippo added. “Our local governments and public entities who are participating are at the vanguard of the green energy revolution,” said DeFilippo. “This is a generational accomplishment for Union County.”

Freeholder Chairman Alexander Mirabella has agreed.

“Our solar installations are saving taxpayer money on energy costs, creating a renewable energy source and reducing pollution,” said Mirabella. “These are accomplishments all Union County residents can take pride in.” Tioga Energy owns, oper-

ates, and maintains more than 13,800 solar panel modules providing Union County facilities with renewable energy generated from their systems through a Power Purchase Agreement, or PPA. Through the use of PPAs, Union County facilities are able to reduce their cost of energy by approximately \$5 million over 15 years. Tioga’s installation partner, a joint venture between Pro-Tech Energy Solutions and Huen Electric Inc., is engineering and constructing the systems.

The participating governments and public entities are Morris-Union Jointure, Berkeley Heights; Berkeley Heights Board of Education, two pending; Cranford; Garwood Board of Education; Hillside Board of Education; Linden; New Providence Board of Education; Plainfield; Rahway; Roselle, one pending; Roselle Board of Education; Roselle Park Board of Education; Union County Vocational Technical Schools; Scotch Plains; Union County College; Cranford; and Winfield Board of Education.

tion of the ice skating rink. However, he stressed that the county has a master plan in place that features a number of recreational options and improvements the community would desire to see in place at this facility, including a playground, picnic grove, and road, utilities and access improvements.

"Our task will be to analyze these options to determine what will bring the best usage for the community, bearing a final cost in mind," D'Elia said. "Pinnacle is going to meet with county officials and go over the master plan for the park."

The contractor will assist the county in formulating cost estimates and plans for the various items the plan involves. The construction manager will also help the county choose which contractors perform the actual work itself.

D'Elia said the county feels the rink would be in strong demand as a location for playing hockey. The ice rink option is estimated to cost between \$15 million and \$25 million, D'Elia said. Construction could begin in 2013.

To help fund the work, the county plans to use a \$1.3 million Green Acres grant from the state. County officials are also applying for an additional \$9 million from the state.

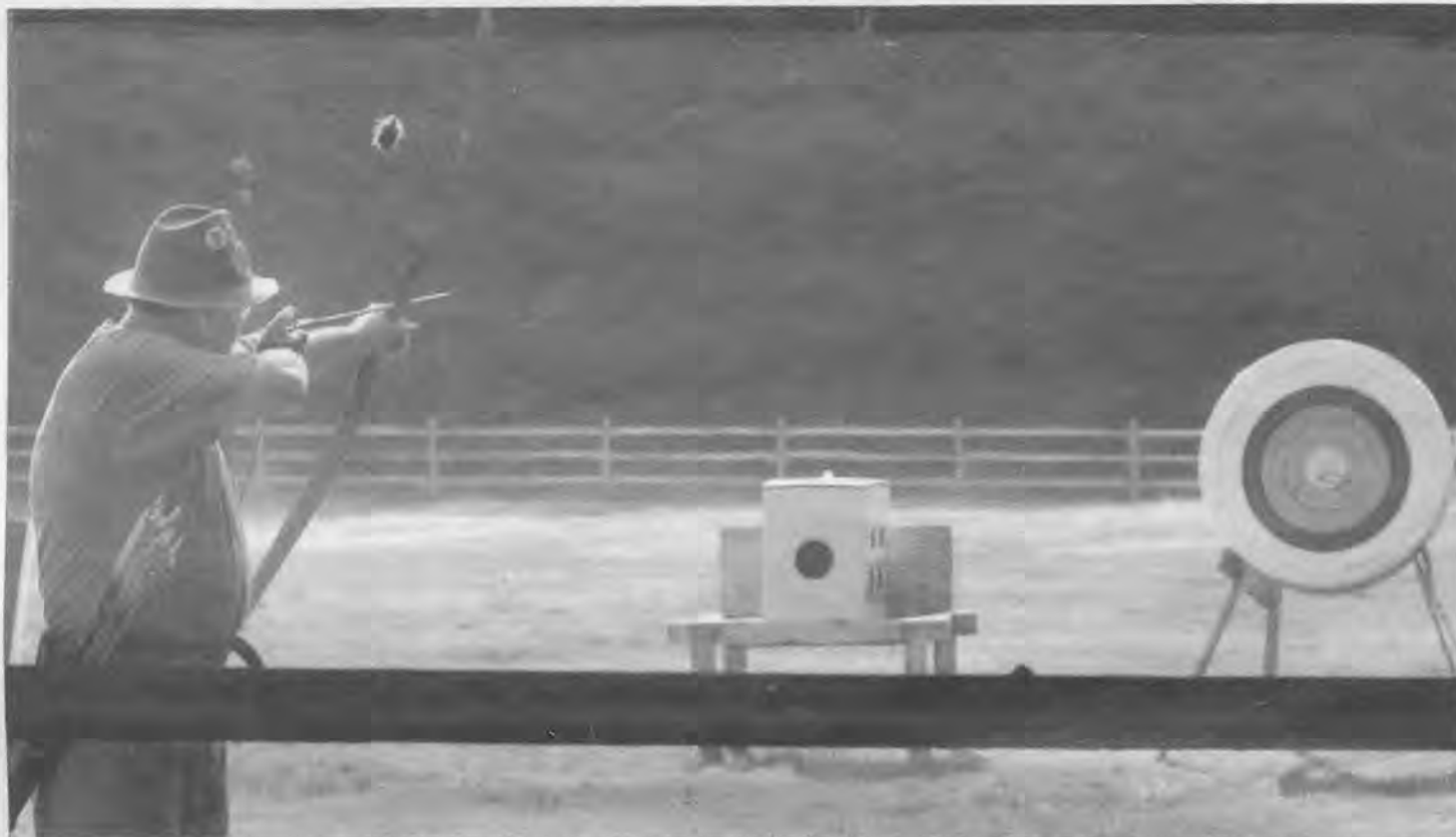
Oak Ridge Park was previously a golf course. In 2009, freeholders closed the golf course, citing declining usage and a \$20 million budget deficit. The change was met with mixed response from residents.

Sullivan said he feels Oak Ridge Park has "a lot of potential," but among the many possible options for the park, the rink is the most appealing to him.

"That to me is what I feel is going to be the centerpiece of the park," Sullivan said.

County officials were looking for a site for a new ice rink before Oak Ridge became an option, due to shortcomings and problems with the existing ice rink located at Warinanco Park, he added.

"The issue of the rink and Warinanco was ongoing for a number of years before we chose to close Oak Ridge as a golf course," said Sullivan.



Oak Ridge Park is currently used for archery. The county is moving ahead with a plan to make the park more 'active,' including building a brand new ice skating rink.

Located in Roselle, Warinanco Park was initially an outdoor, open-air ice rink and the structure was later built around it. Sullivan said there have been major issues with the roof as well as the chiller device that creates the ice.

The facility is still using a temporary chiller.

"It all adds up to the problems we've had there," Sullivan said.

Sullivan said much initial work will probably need to be done at Oak Ridge in order to bring vital utilities like gas and electricity to the site, which is now simply open space.

He said the rearmost portions of the park near the train tracks is partially wetlands and will probably never be developed.

Clark Mayor Sal Bonaccorso said coun-

ty officials made a presentation to the town about three years ago that included the ice rink component. He said the proposal was well-received by local residents and officials.

"I think that would be a great addition to the town," Bonaccorso said.

However, Bonaccorso added that many Clark residents enjoy using the park for activities like jogging and walking their dogs and hope it will not become too developed.

"Right now a lot of people are enjoying

Oak Ridge as a passive park," Bonaccorso said.

Bonaccorso said that as mayor of the hosting community, he is happy to work with the county in the development process.

"If they are concerned about costs, I would be glad to give input about what the town would or would not like, and still keep it affordable," he said.

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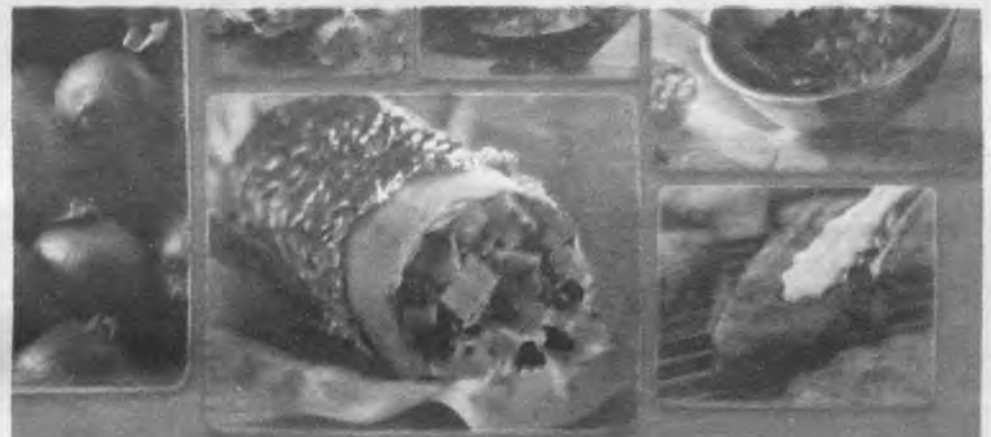

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



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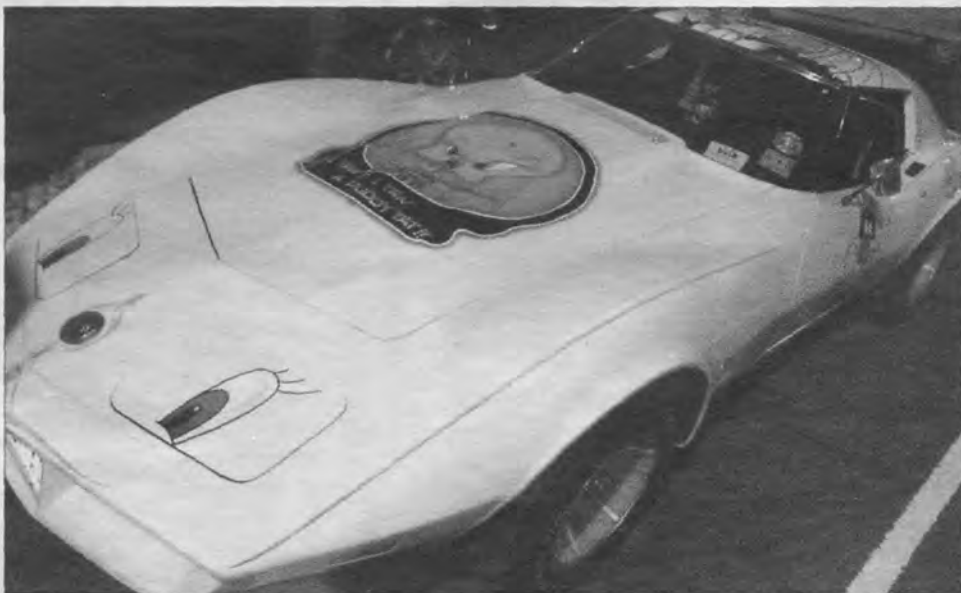

Steinman said the site has been eyed as a possible location for an art component for about nine years.

Rack said the site previously served as an old telephone repair garage, but sat vacant for many years. However, the original building has historical and architectural significance that the city made a point to preserve, he said.

"The original structure was maintained in the theater. They just added some rooms to it," Rack said.

The inaugural performance last weekend was entitled "Hello Hamilton!" It was well-received, with all tickets sold out. The show took the form of a fast-paced variety show, featuring vignettes by its six Artistic Affiliates who offered previews of the performances scheduled during Hamilton Stage's upcoming season.

The shot should not be administered to persons who have colds, fever or other active infections or those who have hypersensitivity, an allergy to eggs, chicken, chicken feathers or chicken dander.

Let your voice be heard

Too often, things happen to us which seem beyond our control. Gas prices increase or decrease and we are helpless to do anything but find the gas station

with the best price. Young men and women from our neighborhoods fight and die in wars we don't understand against enemies who were once our friends. And no matter how many promises we hear, the taxes keep on coming.

But then the first Tuesday of November comes along and we are reminded that this is a nation "of the people, by the people and for the people." We do have the power to decide who we put in charge and, this year, Election Day carries an additional significance. Recognizing that not nearly enough voters were participating in school board elections when they occurred in the spring, some New Jersey school districts, including 12 in Essex County, have moved their annual elections to the same day as the general elections. Now, you simply can't afford not to go and vote.

But voting is more than just walking into a booth, pulling a curtain and pushing some buttons. If you're going to vote, you need to do so responsibly. Yes, it's your civic duty, but you need to know who the candidates are and what they have said they stand for or intend to do. To vote on your "gut instinct" is about as reliable as closing your eyes and throwing a dart at where you believe the dart board is, hoping it hits something worth a lot of points.

With the approaching election, the first thing voters need to do is register. The deadline to register is 21 days prior to Election Day or Tuesday, Oct. 16, for this year. You must be a U.S. citizen, at least 18 years old by the next election and a resident of Essex County. Each voter must fill out a voter registration form. There are many ways to register. You can visit www.njelections.org/voting-information-voter-registration-forms.html, print the application, enter the required data and mail it to the Commissioner of Registration office, 83 Spring St., Suite 304, Newton 07860. You can also pick up forms from the Division of Elections, the Commissioner of Registration office, located at 83 Spring St., Suite 304 in Newton or from your local municipal clerk. Registration forms are also available at Division of Motor Vehicle offices.

You can also register to vote at the same time you are applying for assistance or service at the following agencies: NJ Medical Assistance and Health Services Program; WIC or

Once you are registered, it's time to educate yourself about the candidates. In addition to President Barack Obama and Gov. Mitt Romney vying to be the next president of the United States, there will plenty more names on the ballot. Get to know them and get to know who they are and for what the stand.

In New Jersey, any registered voter is able to Vote-By-Mail in any election. Applications are available from your local municipal clerk or online at www.njelections.org. To have your ballot mailed to you for the Tuesday, Nov. 6, general election, the Vote-by-Mail application must be received in the Essex County Clerk's Office by Tuesday, Oct. 30. Applications are available in person at the Essex County Clerk's Newark Office until 3 p.m. on Monday, Nov. 5, the day before the election. All Vote-by-Mail ballots must be received by the Board of Elections by the close of polls at 8 p.m. on Election Day.

Time is short and, before we know it, Election Day will be upon us. Take the time to learn about the candidates. Read newspapers, check online sites and watch the news on television, keeping in mind that even purveyors of information might have an ulterior motive. So compare and contrast the information your different sources provide until you can best determine the truth. Then consider where you stand with these issues and candidates and make a decision. In the end, no matter what you're told, the final choice is yours.

President Lyndon B. Johnson said, "The vote is the most powerful instrument ever devised by man for breaking down injustice and destroying the terrible walls which imprison men because they are different from other men." Take this opportunity to do the research, make up your mind and let your voice be heard.

The talk on Evergreen Avenue

Marc Krauss, a Republican Committeeman running for re-election in Springfield, knows, better than most, the axiom "all politics are local." Campaigning last Sunday on Evergreen Avenue in his township, he faced the normal pleas over high taxes, an occasional reference to the township's long-stagnant downtown, and some personal gripes.

Krauss approaches the task for re-election with the precision expected of a long-time military man, something that helps define his life.

At almost every door, his mantra was to remind, or usually inform, residents of the million-dollar-plus savings gained by shopping the township's health plan. He was careful to detail the relatively small portion of residents' tax bill that is actually the local township's responsibility. He

also reminded residents of the big jump in the school district's ratings, according to New Jersey Monthly.

Krauss listened politely to a critic of the local police, and responded with details of the personnel changes in a department that has been in a state of controversy for years.

Another resident spoke positively about a plan to cut down on the recycling days in an effort to save money.

When the county government was the target of criticism for wasteful spending, Krauss readily agreed, but repeated, far too often, that party politics don't play a major role at the local level.

"The truth is that, without crossover Democratic votes, we wouldn't be victorious," he said.

He acknowledged the frequent, positive references to his running mate, Jerry Fernandez.

At each door Krauss was patient. There was not the usual candidate's rush to cover a lot of ground. When a neighbor pitched for a wheelchair ramp, he pulled out his camera phone, promising to raise the issue on Monday.

A retired Army colonel who now works on procurement issues, Krauss laughed easily when asked how a Springfield resident can be a graduate of the University of Nebraska.

"I gained my degree while in the military," he said.

That military experience also included a stint in Operation Iraqi Freedom.

Krauss was poised and ready for that most common of gripes: taxes. It was not a hostile audience, but there were concerns.

"The simple truth is that my taxes have continued to rise while my house value has declined," said one resident.

Krauss' response included a description of the complexity of public contracts, and the state-mandated, 2-percent cap.

This was generally received with nods of understanding.

Krauss enjoyed meeting with one family who immediately recognized him from the sports in which both their children participate.

Another witty neighbor opened his door and, without missing a beat, said, "OK, what are you gonna do for me?"

When the lack of improvement in the Springfield's weak downtown is raised, Krauss spoke about new revitalization efforts, including a financial stake by business owners.

One resident asked, "I don't expect Springfield to be either Millburn or Westfield, but could we at least try to compete with Kenilworth?"

Only one resident asked whether there will be any debates. Actually, there will be two debates between the four candidates for the two seats. In their handout, the Republicans list "downtown redevelopment and revitalization" as their No. 1 issue.

In a neighborhood with a mix of older houses — from when Springfield was a farm town — and newer houses, manicured lawns are the common feature. While houses aren't luxurious, late-model imports are parked in many driveways. Garages serve as storage facilities rather than places to put cars.

When Krauss stops to take a water break, he reflects, "You know I really enjoy the public service and the give and take with the people." This is pretty obvious.

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THE "ABCDE RULE"

If you have a brown-colored spot anywhere on your body that seems to be growing larger, it should be brought to the dermatologist's attention. While most brown spots aren't serious, some are melanoma, a potentially fatal skin cancer, so it pays to adhere to the "ABCDE Rule." Concern should be raised if a skin lesion displays Asymmetry (one half looks different from the other half); Border irregularities (edges that are not uniform); Color variation (instead of a consistent brown color, the skin lesion has some brown, red, gray, or white sections); Diameter (6 millimeters or more across); or is Evolving (changing size, color, or shape). The more of these five characteristics a skin spot has, the higher

your concern should be.

The best defense against skin cancer is thought early detection. We strongly recommend you become familiar with your skin and your own pattern of moles, freckles, and beauty marks. Be alert to any changes in size, shape or color. Consult a dermatologist for a yearly skin cancer screening. For additional information call 908-925-887. 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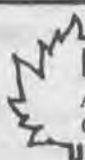


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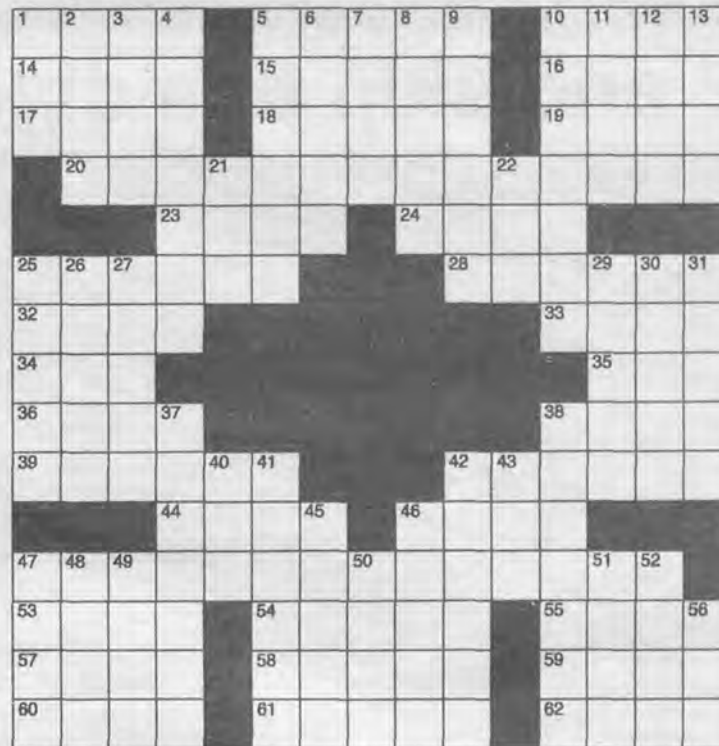

Make the right 'move' and skip this digital ballet

It takes a lot of chutzpah to present a monotonous, repetitive piece of work to a receptive audience. Such an offering was shown on the screen at the "Ballet in Cinema" production at the Cranford Theater on Sunday afternoon.

"Move to Move" was filmed at the Nederlands Dans Theater, The Hague, on May 31, and featured four contemporary ballets. In them, expressionless young men and women danced, in perpetual motion, until the audience was thoroughly exhausted; they twisted their bodies in agonizing movements, their unhappy faces matched their unhappy turns.

It reminded this reviewer of patients in a psychiatrist's office, working off their frustrations with frantic body movements. Actually, during its 168 minutes, several members of the audience simply walked out before the end.

Before the beginning of "Move to Move," the Cranford audience was subjected to repeated shots of people entering the lobby of the huge theater, checking their coats, then of the complicated mechanical elements that allow the production to run smoothly.

The screen also came alive during brief rehearsals in an echo-filled hall, and some background conversation with the choreographers, Paul Lightfoot, Alexander Ekman, Sol Leon and Ohad Naharin. Later, there was a surprisingly loud applause from the filmed audience.

Some of the music, when there was music, was written by various composers, including Philip Glass.

"Move to Move," is comprised of four distinct ballets. The first was choreographed by Ekman, and exhibited a more modern dance pattern than any ballet one has ever seen.

The timing by the group of young dancers was exceptional, and featured originality, but too much rhythm, leaving the performers — and audience — panting with exhaustion.

In "Silent Screen," choreographed by Leon and Lightfoot, featured the strange music of Glass's "Glassworks." The background showed three screens, a couple gyrating miserably, and a little girl who ran in and out of the film, endlessly.

In "Secus," choreographed by Naharin, part of the ballet was notably called "Three." The dancers' body language practically exploded on the screen, much to the dismay of the Cranford audience in a dance language that even its performers appeared not to understand.

The world premiere of "Shine a Light," also by Leon and Lightfoot, combined dance language with set designs.

The most astounding costume was worn by the star performer: a gown that appeared to be made of a theater curtain, which continued to spread across the stage as she walked forward.

The costume was designed by Leon with Joke Visser and Hermien Hollander. Tom Bevoort provided the light design, which was dismal.

Accordingly, for the first time in the history of filmed ballet productions in Cranford, the tiny audience walked out, disappointed. In fact, the "move to move" out of the theater and into the sunlight was a sheer necessity.



At the Cranford movie theater on Sunday, audience members were hoping to be treated to a pleasure-filled afternoon of ballet. About a dozen turned out to watch 'Move to Move,' but a few decided they had better things to do, and walked out of the 'monotonous' production.

**Spinach and Cheese Egg Strata**

Looking for a crowd-pleasing brunch recipe? This dish can be made ahead and simply placed in the oven before guests arrive, eliminating morning stress. It is also a great way to use stale bread and leftover cheese.

Ingredients

- 1 10-oz. package frozen spinach, thawed, water squeezed out, and finely chopped
- 1 1/2 cups finely chopped onion
- 3 Tbsp. unsalted butter
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1/2 tsp. black pepper
- 1/4 tsp. freshly grated nutmeg or already ground nutmeg
- 8 cups French or Italian bread crumbs in 1-inch cubes
- 2 cups coarsely grated Gruyere or Swiss cheese
- optional: 1 cup coarsely grated Parmigiano-Reggiano cheese
- 2 3/4 cups milk, heavy cream or half and half
- 12 to 13 large eggs
- 2 Tbsp. Dijon mustard

Method

In a large skillet, saute the onion in the butter over moderate heat, stirring, until soft, four to five minutes. Add 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/4 teaspoon pepper, and the nutmeg. Cook, stirring,

for minute.

Stir in the spinach, and remove from heat.

Spread one third of the bread cubes in a buttered, 3-quart gratin dish or other shallow, ceramic baking dish. Cover with one third of the spinach mixture. Sprinkle with one third of each cheese. Repeat, ending with a cheese layer. Whisk together milk, eggs, mustard and the remaining 1/2 teaspoon salt and 1/4 teaspoon pepper in a large bowl and pour evenly over the strata. Cover dish with foil. Chill for at least eight hours.

Preheat oven to 350.

Allow strata to stand at room temperature 30 minutes.

Bake, uncovered, in the middle of the oven until puffed and golden brown, 45 to 55 minutes. Check it by putting a fork in the center; if the strata is still runny, cover with aluminum foil and continue baking until cooked through. Allow to stand 15 minutes before serving.

Summit continues to find ways to win regular season games, so there is nothing new there.

The Hilltoppers saw a 15-point lead disappear in the final five minutes at Cranford last Friday night only to come back and beat the host Cougars on a 42-yard field goal by standout senior placekicker Mike Badgley with less than a minute remaining.

Summit's 30-27 Mid-State 38 Conference-Raritan Division victory at Memorial Field was its 30th straight regular season triumph, which is a school record.

The Hilltoppers are one of only three Union County teams still undefeated. Summit, Elizabeth and New Providence are all 3-0.

Summit and Elizabeth were defeated in state championship games last year, while New Providence fell at home in a sectional semifinal.

New Providence now has Union County's longest winning streak at four games, while Summit and Elizabeth are next at three.

Cranford, which is now 2-1, had a five-game winning streak snapped.

In contrast, for the first time since I can remember, as many as six Union County teams are 0-3 heading into Week 4.

Those squads include Brearley, Dayton, Governor Livingston, Hillside, Westfield and Plainfield.

Brearley will tangle with Dayton tomorrow night at 7 at Union's Cooke Memorial Field, while Hunterdon Central will play at Westfield Saturday at 2 p.m. in two 0-3 vs. 0-3 matchups this weekend.

Hunterdon Central lost its first two games by one point - including the first one in overtime - and then lost at home to Elizabeth 24-17 last Friday.

GL will next play at Rahway (2-1) and Hillside will host Warren Hills (1-2) on Saturday, while Plainfield plays at North Hunterdon (2-1) tomorrow night.

Can Summit extend a regular season winning streak to 31? Will attempt at North Plainfield tomorrow

CRANFORD — Can the Summit Hilltoppers - after consecutive close calls - continue their school record regular season winning streak this weekend? Summit has now won 30 straight regular season games.

Summit is preparing for a North Plainfield team it will face tomorrow night at 7 at North Plainfield's Krausche Field on Route 22 East.

North Plainfield is 1-2 and coming off a 28-12 home loss to Somerville last Friday night.

Summit opened with a 41-7 home win over Somerville on Sept. 8 and then came back to beat Johnson 17-13 at home seven days later before topping a 2-0 Cranford squad 30-27 last Friday night at Cranford's Memorial Field.

This will be the second matchup between Summit and North Plainfield since the formation of the Mid-State 39 Conference in 2009.

North Plainfield is 1-2 in the Raritan.

Summit's last regular season loss was a 37-12 setback at West Essex on Nov. 7, 2008 in Iron Hills Conference-Hills Division play.

The visiting Canucks, still coached by Robert Lake, fell to 2-5.

Green excelled for Cranford with an outstanding game

So when he lined up for a 42-yarder to give Summit the lead once more with just 26 seconds left, he was completely confident he was going to put this one clearly through the uprights.

"I wasn't thinking much when it came time to kick it," Badgley said.

Long snapper Nick Liberato got the ball perfectly to holder Andrew Masterfano and Badgley then came through with his second field goal of the season to lift visiting Summit past Cranford 30-27 Friday night in a Mid-State 38 Conference clash at Memorial Field between undefeated Raritan Division squads.

To put an exclamation point on the victory, Badgley - on the game's final play - intercepted a pass at the 50-yard line.

The game-winning field goal was set up by a return of a squib kick to the Cranford 45 by Masterfano, who is the holder for Badgley on all of his extra points and field goals.

Badgley gained three yards on first down and then the ball was moved to the Cranford 27 after the only Cougar penalty of the second half, which was a face mask call.

Two plays later, Badgley gained two more yards before Summit and then Cranford called timeouts. Badgley made his kick on third-and-nine from the Cranford 25.

Badgley, who this time next year could be kicking field goals 3,000 miles away, set the Summit single season record of most field goals with seven last year. Two years ago in a 17-13 come-from-behind division home win over Cranford, Badgley kicked a school-record 49-yard field goal to extend his team's one-point lead.

Summit improved to 3-0 overall and 3-0 in the Raritan Division. The Hilltoppers have now won 30 straight regular season games - which is a school record - and could be on their way to a fourth consecutive division championship.

Four of Summit's wins in the streak have come over Cranford.

Cranford had Union County's longest winning streak snapped at five games and is now 2-1 overall and 1-1 in the Raritan Division. Since winning the final game of their 2010 season, the Cougars are 13-2, with both losses coming at home to Summit, including last year's 52-21 setback.

In addition to Badgley's heroics, the game featured dynamic performances by seniors A.J. Iarussi of Summit and Reggie Green of Cranford.

The Colgate-bound Iarussi, who was held to 38 yards on 12 carries in the first 24 minutes, finished with 150 yards on 26 carries and three third-quarter touchdowns.

"This was a tough game," Iarussi said. "Both teams really went at it."

"He's a beast," Summit head coach John Liberato said. "He's very hard to tackle once he hits the hole."

Green, who in the first half rushed for 67 yards on 13 carries including a 20-yard touchdown run in the second quarter, finished with 227 yards on 29 attempts. He carried 16 times for 160 yards in the second half, including a thrilling 84-yard TD run in the third quarter and an equally exciting 10-yard scoring run in the fourth.

"Six times we had him bottled up and then he changes direction," Liberato said. "What's even better about Reggie is that he's a great kid."

Green, who has not given a college a verbal commitment yet, also completed a 45-yard touchdown pass and an ensuing two-point pass both to senior Chris Folinusz when Cranford made a valiant comeback attempt late in the fourth quarter to tie the game with 15 unanswered points.

Cranford turned the ball over four times - twice on fumbles and twice on interceptions - in the second half and had five turnovers for the game. Recovering two fumbles for Summit was senior linebacker Austin Carbone, while Badgley and senior defensive back Will Shamm picked off passes.

Coming up with an athletic, one-handed interception of a Badgley pass in the first quarter was Folinusz.

Summit played the game minus the services of senior quarterback Tyler Carbone and senior running back-punter Kyre Negron, who were out with injuries sustained in last week's come-from-behind 17-13 division home win over Johnson. Liberato said that Carbone (ankle) and Negron (shoulder) did not practice at all this week and that he hopes to have both of them back for Summit's division game tomorrow night at North Plainfield.

Summit's only completed pass of the game was thrown by junior Charlie Terry and it was a big one. The third-quarter pass - thrown perfectly over the shoulder of Austin Carbone, who came down with it against single coverage - was a 37-yard reception to the Cranford 3.

On the very next play, Iarussi followed with the second of his three third-quarter TDs.

For Summit, it was a second consecutive victory that was produced very late in the fourth quarter.

"The field goal was very satisfying because we faced adversity again and found a way to win once more," Badgley said.

Liberato predicted that Badgley would make a game-winning field goal the way he did.

"I knew it," Liberato said.

Liberato also said that he would have attempted a field goal of a maximum 50 yards.

"Cranford is well-coached and you have to give them credit for the way they came back," Liberato said. "We also showed that we have the desire to play hard until the end."

NOTES: Cranford junior placekicker Troy Kettler could not have kicked a better onside kick to help give Cranford the ball back with 4:52 left.

He kicked the ball from the right side of the field to the left, with the ball bouncing high up in the air and actually hitting off the helmet of a Summit player.

Cranford senior Robert Kessler recovered the loose ball, giving Cranford a first-and-10 at the Summit 45.

Kettler also made two tackles on Summit kickoff returns and tied the game at 27-27 with his only extra point when Cranford decided to go for the tie instead of the win with a two-point attempt.

In essence, Cranford went for the win with Kettler tying the game with his extra point. First Cranford wanted to tie the game and then hope to make something happen in the final seconds of regulation or overtime.

Bost has a big day for Rahway football Lifts Indians to dominating triumph over Scotch Plains

RAHWAY - There wasn't much of anything that Rahway couldn't do offensively vs. Scotch Plains last Saturday afternoon.

The Indians, led by junior quarterback Jeff Bost and junior running back Gabriel Gross, scored on their first four drives, averaging 74 yards.

It was text book offense.

Rahway received the necessary blocking, with running backs Gross, senior Michael Stradford and senior Justin Becker gaining chunks of yardage.

Then when a pass was called to either side of the field, Bost completed them to Becker, senior tight end Colin Quinn, junior split end Thorne Roberts, Stradford and sophomore Majid Abdur-Rahman.

Bost was outstanding, completing 11-of-13 passes for 146 yards and one touchdown and carrying the ball eight times for a game-high 124 yards and one TD, which was an electrifying 69-yard sprint.

Gross carried 19 times for 117 yards, including two first-half touchdowns where he blitzed his way up the middle for runs of 14 and 34 yards.

Rahway's defense allowed only one touchdown.

From the second quarter on the game was more like a scrimmage for Rahway as the home team Indians cruised to a dominating 39-14 Mid-State 38 Conference-Mountain Division triumph at Veterans Field.

Rahway, which defeated Scotch Plains for the fourth straight season, improved to 2-1 overall and 2-0 in the Mountain Division, while underdog Scotch Plains slipped to 2-1 overall and also 2-1 in the Mountain.

"Our line really played well, with Stephan Watkis-Davis, Ruben Pierre and Austin Jackson providing the pancakes (blocks)," Bost said. "They just kept pushing."

After scoring on their first three drives and then defeating division rival Hillside 39-6 at home two weeks ago, Rahway traveled to non-division foe Delaware Valley last week and was upended 27-20.

Determined to bounce back immediately, Rahway was too quick and physical for a Scotch Plains team - which is trying to improve - to handle.

"Our play action was working and we were getting guys open on the flats," Bost said.

"Their corners were bailing and we took advantage."

Pierre, a 6-1, 250-pound senior tackle, was also all over the field defensively, bottling up Scotch Plains running backs all day.

At one point late in the first half, Rahway had more points, 26, than Scotch Plains had yardage, 20, which all came on the ground. Scotch Plains only completed one pass in the game, which was for exactly no yardage.

"I think we could have played better," Pierre said. "They didn't see us coming."

"We should have wrapped up more."

Rahway held Scotch Plains to just 113 yards of total offense - all on the ground. Scotch Plains had 39 in the first half and 74 in the second.

Linden senior TJ Santiago, a starting varsity pitcher for the Tigers since his freshman season, will continue pitching on the collegiate level at Adelphi University in Garden City, N.Y.

Santiago, with a career varsity record of 11-6 and an ERA this past season under 2.00, gave the Division 2 school a verbal commitment Friday.

Santiago plans on signing his letter-of-intent during the first month of the signing period in November.

TJ are not initials that stand for two names. Santiago's first name is simply, TJ. He does not have a middle name.

"The coaches were very welcoming and had a lot of nice things to say," said the 5-10 1/2, 150-pound hard-throwing right hander.

Santiago, who will turn 18 in the middle of his senior season on May 3, went 5-4 for Linden this past season after fashioning a 3-0 record his freshman year and a 3-2 mark as a sophomore.

Santiago said that Adelphi first saw him pitch this summer in a tournament he pitched in at Baseball Heaven in Long Island. The team he played on participated in five games, with Santiago earning a complete-game victory in the only contest he pitched.

"I had a very good outing," Santiago said.

About a week or two later Santiago said he received a call from Adelphi head coach Dom Scala.

"He said to come down," said Santiago, who took a campus visit right before school started.

"It's a small campus, but really nice," Santiago said. "It's also not that far from home, which I like as well."

Santiago, as a member of the New Jersey Tigers travel team, next competed in a tournament in Staten Island earlier this month. Scala and Adelphi assistant coach Bill Ianniciello saw Santiago pitch again and this time they offered a scholarship.

"Adelphi's a high Division 2," Santiago said. "Playing at a Division 1 or Division 2 school, you can get drafted from either one, it doesn't make a difference."

Santiago is the second scholarship player in the past four seasons from Linden's program. Kyle Frazier, a 2010 graduate, is now a junior at Division 2 West Chester University in West Chester, Pa.

Frazier was one of three catchers on West Chester's first Division 2 national championship squad this past spring, with the Golden Rams finishing 46-10.

As a Linden senior, Frazier caught Santiago during Santiago's freshman season.

"TJ's work ethic makes him as good as he is," said former Linden head coach Pat Migliore. "That's the most important thing with him."

"We tried to instill in him, going back to his freshman year, to have a stronger work ethic than anybody else on the field if he wanted to be a successful pitcher. He took that and rolled with it."

Back on March 31 on a cold and rainy Saturday afternoon in Hudson County, Santiago began his junior season in fine form. On Opening Day he tossed a complete-game four-hit shutout in blanking host Hoboken 7-0.

While Hoboken senior lefty Kenny Roder, who went on to earn all-state honors, struck out 16 in 6 and 2/3 innings, Santiago struck out 13, walked just one and only allowed four singles. Santiago was perfect in one inning, struck out the side in three and of his 101 pitches, 75 were strikes.

"I put in a lot of hard work during the off season," said Santiago, who earned Second-Team All-County and First-Team All-Conference honors. "I didn't have a great junior year, but I was satisfied with what I did."

Santiago said his fastball topped out at 89 mph this summer.

"I'm going to continue working on that," Santiago said. "My off speed pitch, my splitter, is my other go-to pitch."

Santiago will work with a trainer this winter.

"I'm looking to put on some weight and hoping to get my fastball to 92 by the spring," Santiago said.

For the last three of the four seasons he was Linden's head coach, Migliore - a fine pitcher himself on the high school level at Elizabeth, who during his senior season pitched the Minutemen to the 1991 Union County Tournament championship - had complete confidence every time he sent Santiago to the mound.

"He pitches like a 25-year-old man in an 18-year-old kid's body," Migliore said. "I wouldn't say that we did a lot with his mechanics, they didn't really need work. It was more cerebral work and that's what the Adelphi coach liked the most. He found TJ to be a very smart and knowledgeable pitcher."

"For example, when guys came up to the plate in certain situations, it was TJ learning how to throw the pitches needed to get those batters out."

Those pitches - explained by Migliore - include a fastball, a curveball, a very hard split finger fastball and a very good changeup.

"TJ really listened and adopted a lot of things that we told him would work," Migliore said.

"He took his work ethic - on his own - to a whole other level. I've never seen a kid work like the way he does."

Also an excellent batter, Santiago hit .400 as a junior. He became a switch hitter his sophomore season and this past year started his junior campaign batting second before moving up to leadoff.

"The team is looking pretty good for next year," Santiago said.

Although he will be playing for a new head coach, Santiago was thankful for the guidance he received from Migliore, who was 37-50 in four years.

"He always gave me the opportunity to show what I have," Santiago said. "He also always helped me out if I was interested in a school and which coach to contact."

NOTES: Migliore said he was let go of his position as Linden's head baseball coach at the end of June. Before that, he was an assistant coach at Linden under Dan Mondelli, who is now the head coach at Holmdel.

"Steve Yesinko (Linden's Athletic Director) said he wanted to go in a different direction," Migliore said. "He said he didn't feel the baseball program was making the improvements that he wanted."

Migliore is a physical education teacher at Linden's McManus Middle School. He will be coaching basketball there this winter for the 15th year.

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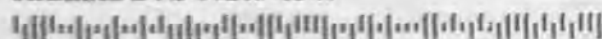
