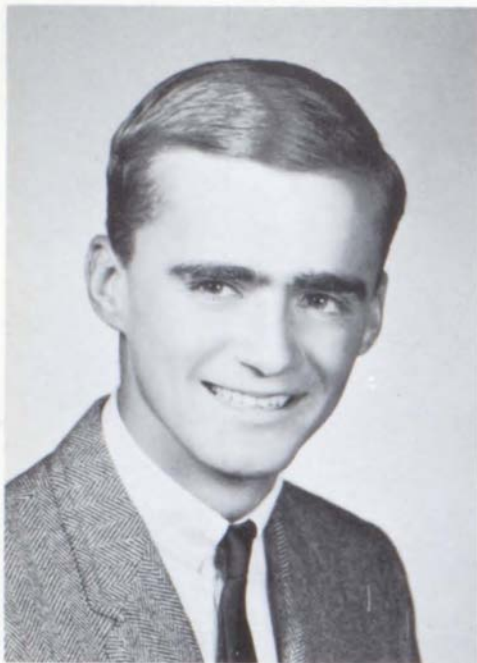
JOE STIVALA

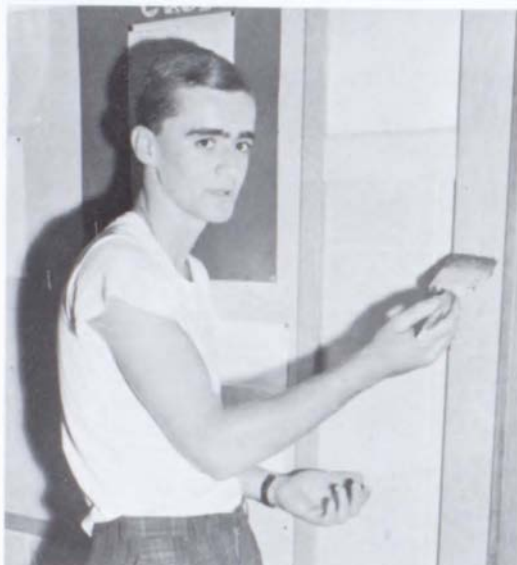

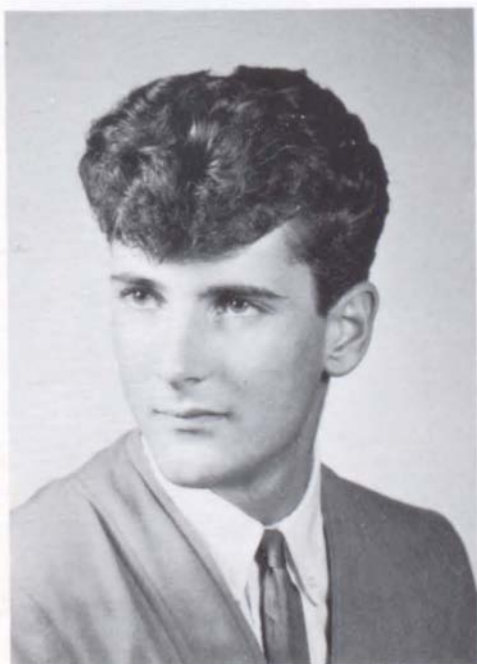

To Bob, graduation means carrying his own responsibility. Bob has been active in many sports. His ambition is to do something constructive.

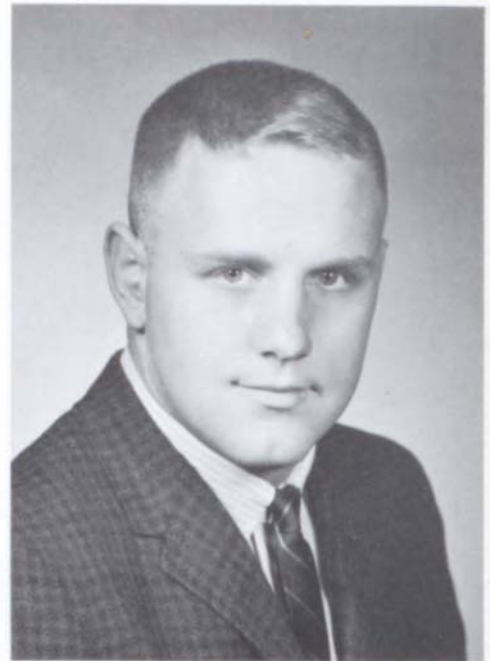

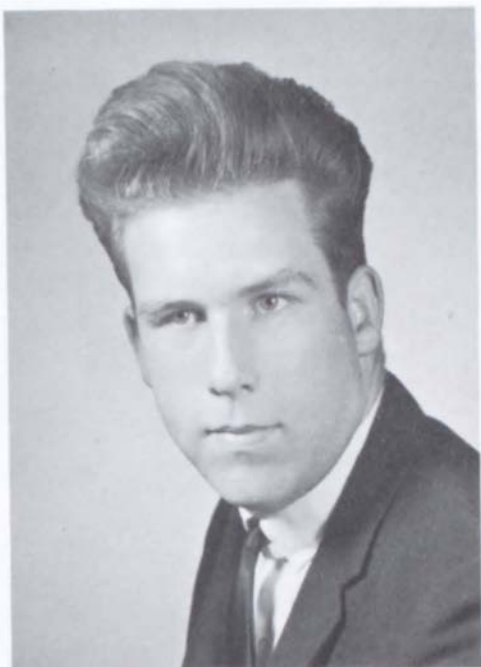
CHARLES F. COVELLO
