SENIOR



Just as the world was learning about the Pentagon papers the Class of '74 was learning about being Sophomores. President Nixon traveled to China and the USSR, while the Winter Olympics were being held in Sapporo, Japan. My Lai, IT&T, and Clifford Irving were names everyone discussed. The American dollar was devalued and the Wage, Price, and Rent Freeze, Phase I was put into effect. An assassination attempt was made on Alabama's Governor Wallace. Former President Hoover died, as did Life magazine and the Newark Evening News. The movies featured "The Godfather", music — Don McClean's "American Pie", and fashion - "hot pants." Locally, the Verona Eagles sponsored the "Welcome Weekend" exchange with an Omaha, Nebraska team. Evenson's moved into its new addition. Discussed at Board of Education meetings were the tennis courts, the smoking lounge, and the morale issue. At VHS the smoking patrol and the morale issue were also greatly talked about. A school day made up of seven short segments didn't leave much time for digestion of either food or subject matter. The Sophomores showed their class spirit superiority when they won the Spirit Chain and pulled off the first Sophomore Dance in several years, "Friends". The football team became co-conference champs, despite a few singed Pom-Poms, the day they tied Summit 20-20 in the last few seconds. No one will ever forget seeing "Signal 30", "Night of the Living Dead", the "Peace and Posters" assembly, the GAA Spring Show "Disney", or the Dramatics Club "Harvey". The Don Ellis band came to VHS, the Jazz Ensemble traveled to Montredaux, Switzerland, and the band went to Rockville, Md. Ildieu Campolina and Yoriko Motomuro were the Rotary Exchange students. The Hunger Walk for Bangladesh drew many participants from VHS. 3rd period gym was shared by all 250 Sophomores, even in the winter when they square danced with Mr. Rotella. The Class of '74 will always remember Miss Howell, Mrs. Leonardson, Mr. Falconer, and Mr. Butterworth. In some ways they were like any other Sophomore class - Tale of Two Cities, frogs' legs fights in lunch, candy bars, and ordering school rings. But in many ways they weren't like anyone else. They were unique.

Watergate was the event everyone talked about. But there were other things happening. Names like Mark Spitz and Olga Korbut emerged from the tragic Summer Olympics

in Munich. The POW's came home and Skylab took off. Former presidents Truman and LBJ died, as did Pablo Casals, and Roberto Clemente. There was renewed fighting in the Middle East and continued battle in Ireland. Secretariat and Bobby Fischer were big names on the sports scene. Watkins Glen was the new Woodstock wih over 600,000 people attending. Rising food costs drove housewives to boycott meat. In Verona, the Public Library celebrated its 80th anniversary. There was extensive flooding along the. Peckman River. In the center of town a new park was created on the site of the old Bloomfield Ave. school. A survey was conducted among the Senior Citizens to determine their needs and Rev. John Martin moved from OLL to a new parish in Newark. At VHS the 7 over 9 schedule had some students coming in at 7:50, others leaving at 3:40, and all students with short lunches. Changes included Dr. Whyte and Mr. Procopio's departures and Dr. Rainey and Mr. Iuso's appointments. Volleyball was co-ed, the soccer team was the undefeated Suburban conference champs and the basketball team beat Summit. The magazine drive reached new heights as the Chemistry grades reached new depths, but "Chemistry is a Joy!" The Color Guard placed in several competitions, the band traveled to Toronto, and the Drama Club presented "Arsenic and Old Lace". Although the golf course parties were less formal, they were as socially successful as the Prom, "A Time For Us". No one will ever forget the disturbance the basketball caused with the Fire Department or the "floods" in Mr. Throne's classes. The Class of '74 will always remember Mr. Donnelly, Mr. Cleary, and Mrs. Garoni. While all of us were anticipating Behind the Wheel, silly things like PSAT's, NMSOT's, SAT's, and ACH's had priority. But for many of the Juniors the year ended with the biggest test — the Driver Test.

Senior year was the year of the energy crisis. There were repeated flare-ups in the Middle East and continued battles in Ireland. England's Princess Anne married Mark Phillips. Watergate was still important. Spiro Agnew resigned as vice president and Gerald Ford took his place. While the Oakland A's beat the NY Mets and the Miami Dolphins beat the Minnesota Vikings, Billie Jean King struck a blow for women's lib and beat Bobby Riggs. Gene Krupa, Betty Grable and David Ben-Gurion died. Kung Fu hit the movie industry and Jim Croce hit the music industry. Platform shoes and polished fingernails were the latest fashion. In Verona, the new tennis courts at the HS opened. A town ordinance was passed forbidding the consumption of alcohol on public grounds. Due to the energy crisis, the Christmas lights were not lit along Bloomfield Avenue dimming the Christmas season. At VHS students rejoiced over the extension of vacation but sulked over the lack of gasoline. Instead of riding around, they spent their Saturday nights in the school parking lot, Burger King or the "Star". The soccer team was the undefeated Conference Champs and the football team, although they lost to Summit, were Group II, Section II State Champs. Assemblies covered subjects from Rock 'N Roll music to Hypnosis to Honor Society Inductions. The Model UN Club took high honors at Harvard and the Marching Maroon & White placed in the West Essex Competition. "Oliver!" and the Prom were the two big events of the spring. Official Senior privileges like dressing-up on Halloween, Senior lounge during study halls, and exam exemptions were almost as important as the unofficial ones like out-to-lunch. There were many little bothers like applying to colleges and toe exercises that almost got in the way of going down the shore, but the Seniors still succeeded in going when Spring Fever and Senior Slump arrived. Julie Kenealy from Australia and Fernando Favaro from Brazil were the exchange students. The Class of '74 will always remember all the people who helped them throughout their four years at VHS. The last few days before graduation were a blur of caps & gowns, yearbooks, parties and tears.

We leave four years of growing up behind us at VHS to go out and find new directions.




NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY
