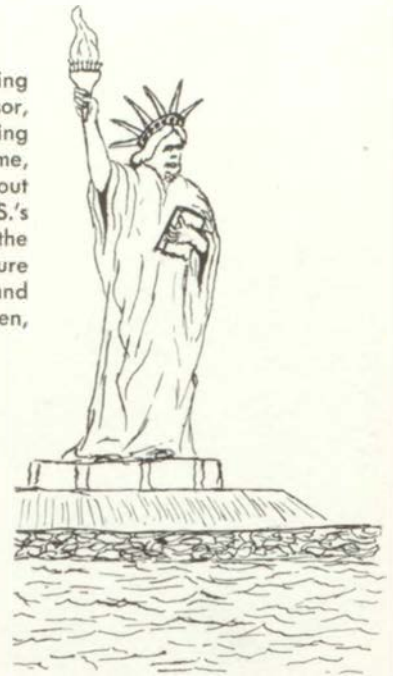


# BICENTENNIAL
