Senior Year

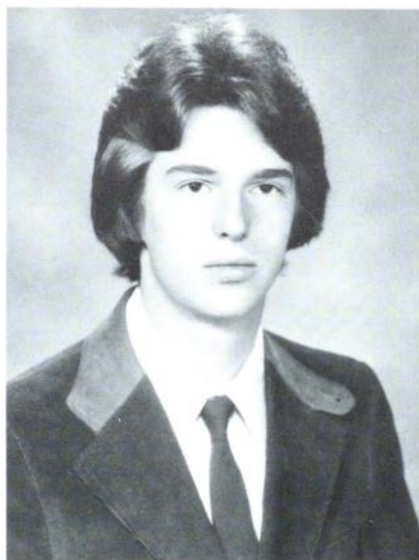

Cafeteria Changes

Many small changes have occurred within the V.H.S. Cafeteria since October, when the effort made to improve the quality of cafeteria lunches. Students complained to the Student Council about the french fries being cold, and about the inconvenience of waiting in line to just buy milk. The french fries are now finally warm, thanks to the new heat lamps, and one no longer has to wait to go through the entire line for the sole purpose of purchasing milk. For the students' convenience, a separate counter was set up outside of the usual two cashiers' lines for the sale of single items. This eliminated the long wait for those who were not buying complete lunches. There is still one complaint still heard on the lunch lines, however, and that is about the high prices of the food.

Returning from Christmas vacation, students were greeted with an increase in food prices due to the problem of theft. It seemed that certain students were taking advantage of the fact that there was no one watching to make sure that they paid for their lunches. Since the beginning of January, however, there has been someone strategically placed facing the two cashiers to make certain everybody pays, and to warn students that eating their food before paying results in the same punishment as stealing. This has seemed to curtail somewhat the enormous theft problem, but a formal check has not been done to see how much money is still being lost.

Students understandably are opposed to the fact that they have to pick up the tab for thieves. Most feel that for the excessive price, the lunches could stand quite a lot of improvement. Since Verona High's lunches are no longer federally funded, the menu choice is more varied, but the food quality still leaves a lot to be desired. Dianna Petrozzino, a senior at V.H.S., thought that the food prices were "ridiculous." The food is terrible for the prices. She, like many of the seniors we asked, is thankful for having "out-to-lunch."

Because our school no longer has a federally funded lunch program, the cafeteria is free to serve whatever the students want. Soft drink dispensers were installed near the cashier, and a new form of the fast food style hamburger is available. Upon entering the line, the student orders the burger. By the time he gets to the cashier, the burger has usually been cooked, or is close to being done. The student picks it up and pays. There is also a choice of cheese, onions, etc. to select to go on top. This system seems to be agreeable to students, but again there is the complaint about the food's taste.

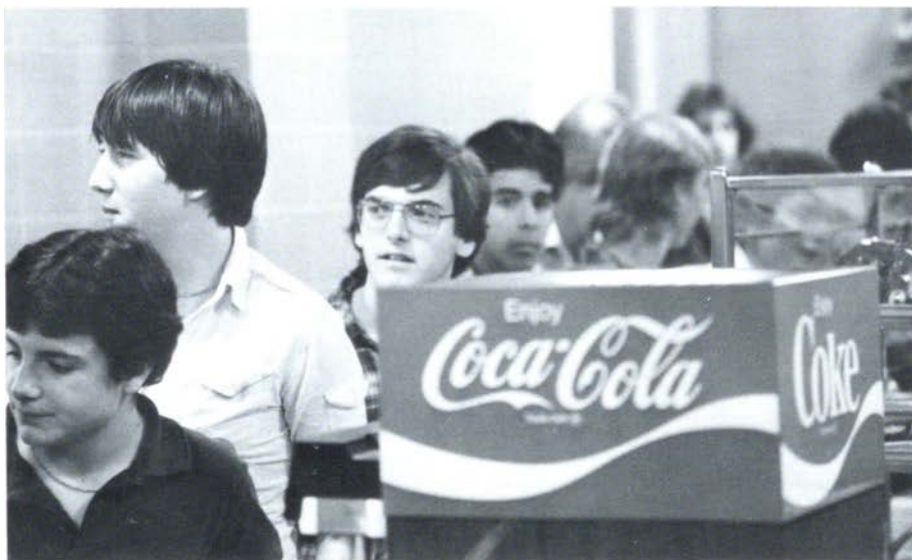
The changes made in the cafeteria are slowly moving in the direction the students' desire, but there is still a long way to go. Perhaps when the food starts tasting better, students won't mind paying the extremely high prices.

This year, the students of VHS began several projects having to do with Senior Citizens. These projects were the continuation of work that was begun with last year's Student Council, which tried to begin a program of co-operation between the students of VHS and senior citizens with a luncheon. While the luncheon was a success, nothing was done as a follow-up.

This year, Student Council members Cara Hudson and Sasha Torres acted as chairmen of a committee which, through the student council, endeavored to help senior citizens. Student Council members acted as guides at the opening of the Joseph Minish House, the building located across the street from the high school, and at an open house held at the same location.

Also this year, Mrs. Patricia Sikorsky's Honors Sociology class, with the help of Mrs. Teri Fryer, embarked upon an intergenerational history project. Students met with groups of senior citizens, and asked them questions about their experiences during the 1920's and 1930's. In this manner, they were able to learn about these time periods from someone who had experienced them first hand.

Another more spontaneous way in which VHS students attempted to get to know senior citizens was during the Christmas holidays, when a group of Seniors went Christmas caroling in the Joseph Minish House. The participants were rewarded for their efforts by the lovely letter which Mrs. Cummings wrote to the **Verona-Cedar Grove Times**.

The progress made this year by VHS students toward understanding and appreciating the elderly has been small compared to what may be accomplished in the future. This year's progress — acting as guides, studying the history of the '20's and '30's, and beginning a tradition of Senior Christmas caroling, are small steps toward the goal of establishing a tradition of mutual help between VHS students and the elderly.

"Drop Everything and Read"

For a week, twice a year, VHS students are asked to "drop everything and read" for twenty minutes a day. Mrs. Maria Clayton, the program's supervisor, says that one of the purposes of the program is "to awaken students to an awareness of reading as a recreational activity." She feels that too few students read for pleasure regularly, and that while the academic emphasis on analyzing literature has its place, it too often overshadows reading for its own sake. Mrs. Clayton said that the DEAR program is important because it "stresses the importance of reading through a school-wide activity, the only school-wide activity, other than the magazine drive, in which all the students participate."

Ideally, the DEAR program would be run as follows: the schedule would be kept secret so that students would carry a novel all day. This would allow students to know what their peers, teachers and administrators were reading and thus be exposed to a greater variety of reading material. Additionally, classroom time would be dedicated, in all subject areas, not only to the prescribed amount of reading but also to allow for discussion of reading material and to influence book selection and reading interest.

Realistically, however, DEAR is not completely successful. The schedule is almost always common knowledge by Monday afternoon, so students do not have to carry their books all day. Perhaps the most important problem is teachers' attitudes toward the program. As Mrs. Clayton pointed out, "if teachers take the program seriously, kids react well and can get something out of it. If they treat it as a joke, or a waste of time, then kids react to that, too."

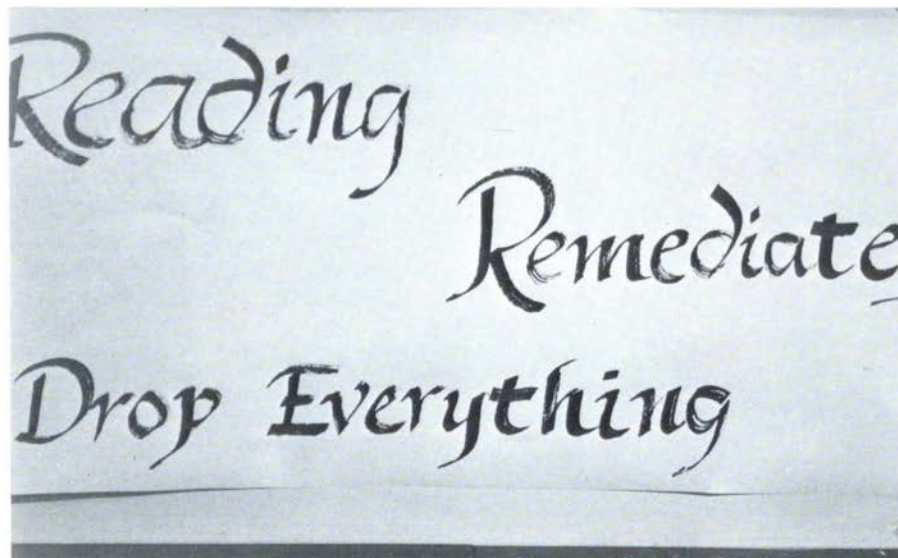
Despite its problems, many students feel that the DEAR program is worthwhile. Senior Diane Post stated, "I think DEAR is good because it allows those students who seldom read an opportunity to do so. Maybe if they start a book, they'll become interested enough to finish it." Perhaps if teachers are more enthusiastic, DEAR will become even more successful.

This year, the privilege of a senior lounge was denied the class. The main reason for cutting the lounge, as agreed upon by Mr. Pirello and several members of the senior class, is the great amount of vandalism caused by a very small percentage of the class. According to Mr. Pierllo, "it was closed because of vandalism, expense to the class, expansion of the Industrial Arts facilities, and the fact that less than 15% of the senior class use the lounge."

Reactions of students varied greatly. Many felt angry that one of V.H.S.'s semitraditional senior privileges had to be ended. At the same time, others agreed with the reasons given for cutting it. In the past, the lounge has repeatedly failed due to the actions of a few students. While seriously taxing the class treasury, the lounge would not benefit the entire class, rather a small minority of it.

The extra space made available is presently being used as a storage room for books and supplies. Plans are being made, however, for the much needed expansion of the Industrial Arts facilities, including graphics and shop, to be carried out in two years.

Library Security Tightens

1981 and '82 brought changes to the VHS library. Perhaps the most obvious of these was the installation of a security system which is designed to prevent the stealing of books. The theft of library materials had escalated to the point where something had to be done, and the security system was purchased to combat the problem.

Another change has been that this year, Mrs. Maurer actually collects passes for study hall. Students not only must have a pass, but it must be yellow, and it must be from a subject area teacher. Teachers who give passes to students who misbehave are asked to refuse these students passes. This system makes some teachers understandably reluctant to issue passes, and, at times, it is difficult for students to get passes even if they have legitimate reasons for wanting to use the library.

The tighter security has resulted in a library which is generally quieter than it has been in the past, though it is also less accessible to the students.
