C.O.E., D.E., C.I.E.

Verona High School offers three different types of work study programs. C.O.E., or Cooperative Office Education, under the direction of Mrs. Byrne, gives students a chance to leave school early and work in office related jobs. C.I.E., or Cooperative Industrial Education, gives students the option of attending classes part of the day and going to work in a local business in the afternoon. C.I.E. is under the direction of Mr. Jack Moran. D.E., or Distributive Education, is under the direction of Mr. Throne. D.E. students attend school in the morning and then go off to work in a trade related job such as a teller or a mechanic. All work study programs require that students maintain a minimum C average and accumulate enough credits to graduate. The C.I.E. students receive 1 credit for every 75 hours worked. D.E. and C.O.E. students receive 1 credit for every 100 hours worked up to a maximum of 10 credits. C.O.E. students benefit by taking a special course that teaches better working habits.
