No school can operate without an efficient administration and main office. During the 1985-1986 school year, Mr. Pirrello, Dr. Collura, and Mr. Meyer provided the support to keep all of VHS running. They were greatly supported in this regard by the secretarial staff.

One major issue that faced the administration was the problem of declining enrollments. As the number of students at VHS dipped to below 700, courses such as Latin I/II and A.P. Chemistry were dropped due to lack of student interest. However, Spanish and French IV-C classes returned this year, with Dr. Collura volunteering to teach the latter course.

The Guidance Department at VHS does much more than plan students' schedules. They also provide many programs to assist students in their school work, and in developing future plans for college and a career.

The guidance program begins with an orientation program for all Freshmen, designed to help them adjust to VHS. In the junior year, the department administers the PSAT's and SAT's, and counselors meet with all students to develop future plans. Finally, in senior year, the Guidance Department invites college representatives to VHS for interviews, and assists all students in completing applications for the colleges of their choice.

English:

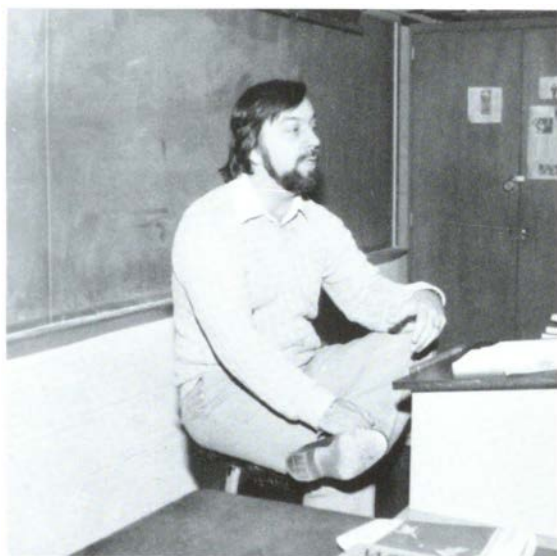
Curriculum Varies From Macbeth to Mass Media . . .

Mathematics is another important element of the VHS curriculum. Although only two years of math are required for graduation, many students take as many as four years, electing to take such advanced courses as Math IV and Math V (A.P. Calculus).

In recent years, the program of the Mathematics Department has been enhanced by the addition of courses in computer programming. Ms. Hutton's Computer Programming and Computer Project Design courses allow interested students to take two full years of computer courses.

The Science Department made several changes in its curriculum this year. Beginning with this year's freshman class, all students are now required to take two years of science in order to graduate. Honors sections were also established for the freshman year Physical Science course. However, the A.P. Chemistry course was dropped due to declining enrollments.

Several of the advanced science courses include extra lab periods once or twice a week. These labs are designed to introduce students to methods of experimentation while exploring concepts related to the courses they are taking.

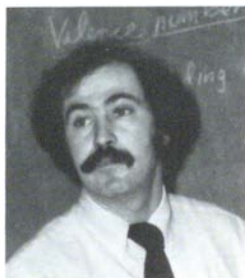

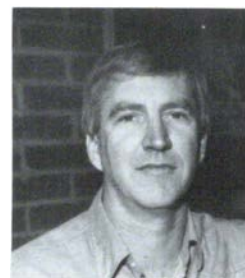

Foreign Language:

French, Spanish, and Italian Provide Diversity . . .

The Foreign Language Department offers courses in the French, Spanish, and Italian languages. Although foreign language courses are not required for graduation, they are required by most colleges, and as a result, most VHS students take two or more years of the language of their choice.

The 1985-1986 school year saw several changes in the Foreign Language curriculum. Latin I and II were dropped due to declining enrollments, but French IV-C and Spanish IV-C returned to the curriculum, due to a renewed interest in advanced foreign language studies.

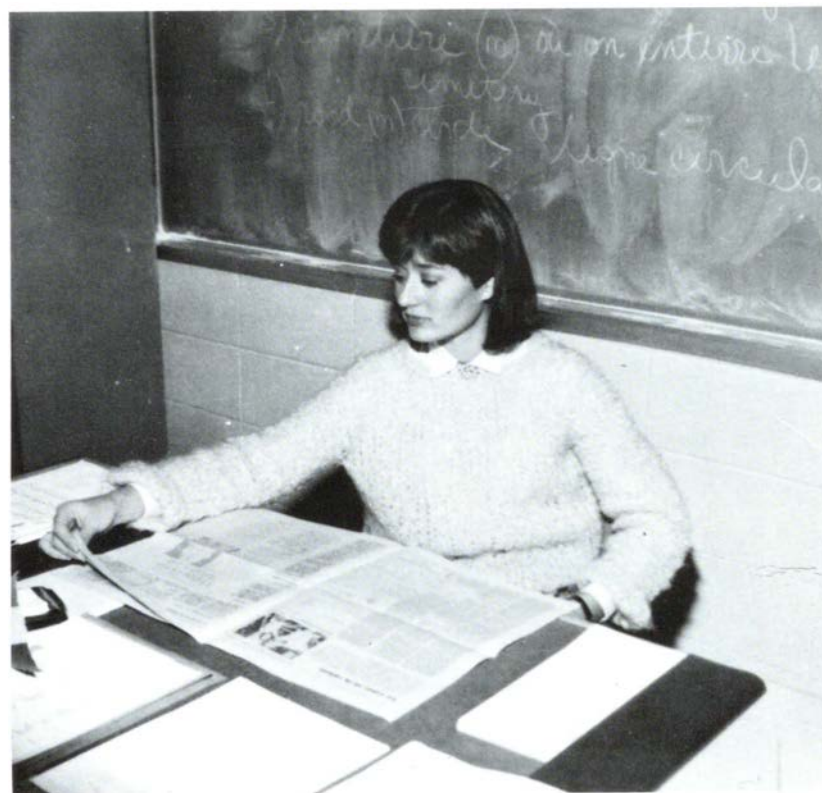

The VHS library is more than a room full of books; it is a full-service library providing both academic and recreational reading material. Librarian Mrs. Maurer and Library Secretary Mrs. Clark are available full-time to assist students in their use of the library. They are assisted in their work by parent and student volunteers.

Students gain their first exposure to the library through an orientation program during Freshman year, and receive further instruction as they learn to do research for term papers and other projects. In coming years, Mrs. Maurer plans to gain access to an on-line data base system to further serve students' research needs.

The department also offers Typing II, Shorthand, and Accounting courses for students who are interested in entering the world of business.

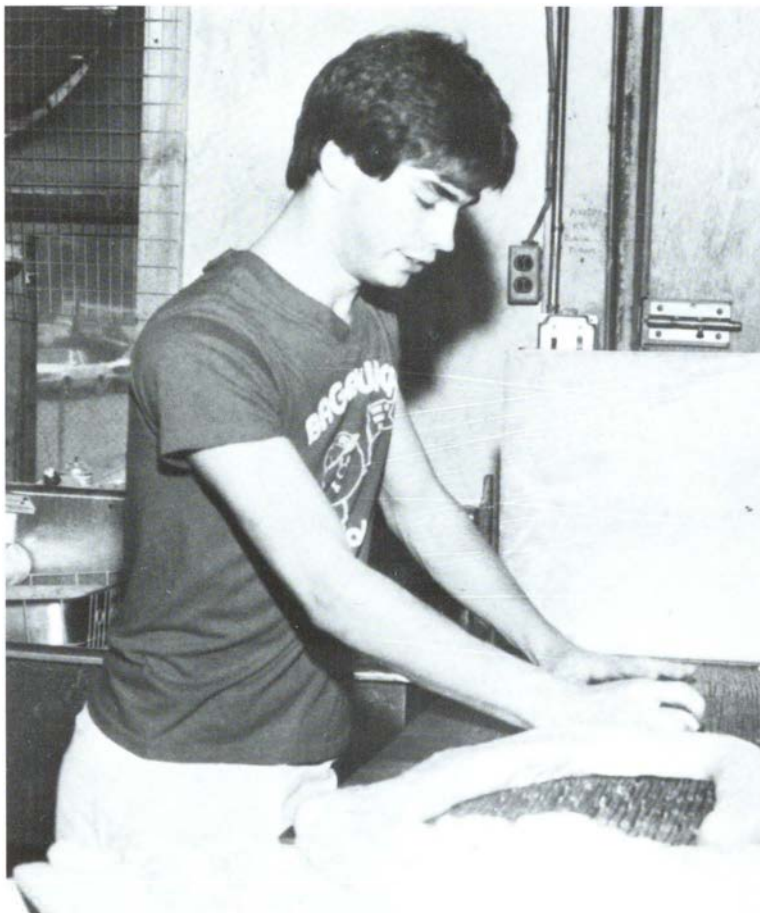

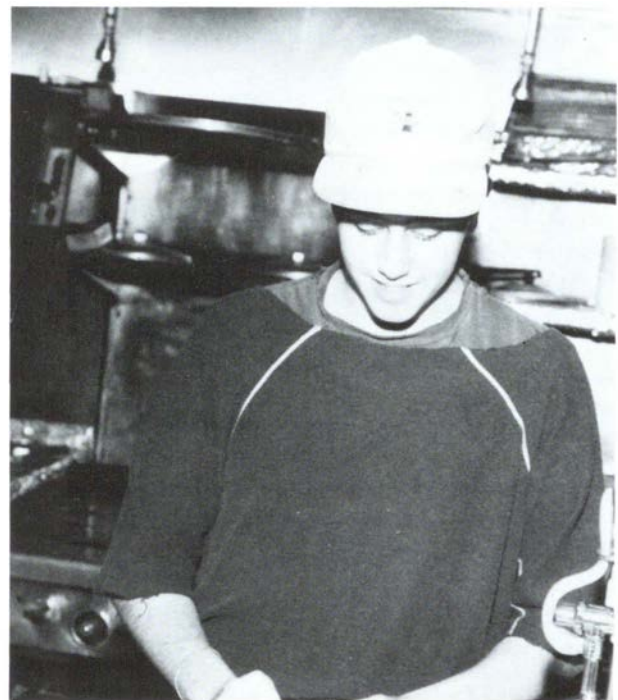
The Cooperative Education Department offers three different programs allowing students to gain vocational training while remaining in high school. Cooperative education students complete their academic requirements in the morning, then go to work to receive on-the-job training. Cooperative Education Area Coordinator Mr. Jack Moran notes, "It's like a classroom without walls."

The Cooperative Office Education program exposes students to many office-related job opportunities. Typical jobs for COE students include being a secretary or clerk-typist, or working in an insurance agency.

Cooperative Industrial Education is designed for students who are interested in entering a trade. CIE students gain job opportunities in such occupations as food services, printing, auto repair, and landscaping.

Marketing and Distributive Education offers students opportunities in the fields of marketing and retailing. The members of the MDE program have formed a club known as D.E.C.A. (Distributive Education Clubs of America), competing in competitions on a local, state, and national level.

Each of the Cooperative Education Programs is accompanied by a classroom course which is designed to complement each student's work experience.

The Industrial Arts and Home Economics Department offers several different programs allowing students to develop their skills in an area of their interest, either in pursuit of their career goals, or simply for the benefit of learning a practical skill.

The Graphic Arts program has always been extremely popular with VHS students. In graphics, students learn many different forms of printing and visual communications. Using the techniques of silk-screen and offset printing, graphics students produce printed products and forms for many different school organizations.

The Drawing courses introduce students to the techniques of mechanical drawing and construction. The program combines instruction with projects which allow students to develop their skills.

In Wood and Metal Shop, students learn to use various tools and equipment by the construction of projects of their choice. The projects provide practical experience, and also a useful finished product.

The Home Economics program offers various electives in the areas of cooking and sewing. In the cooking courses, students learn not only about the methods of cooking, but also about nutrition. In Sewing, students apply the sewing techniques they learn in class to produce fashionable garments.

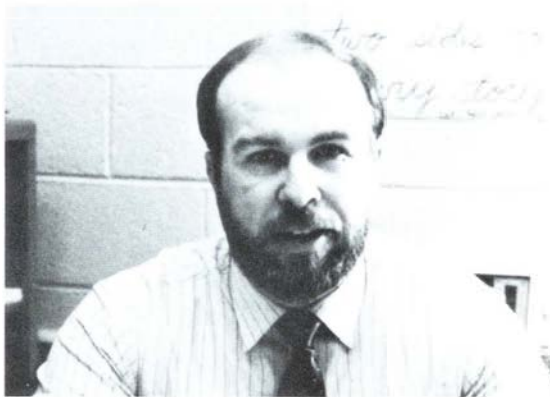
In March, GREASE was the word at VHS, as the annual spring musical sold out three performances.

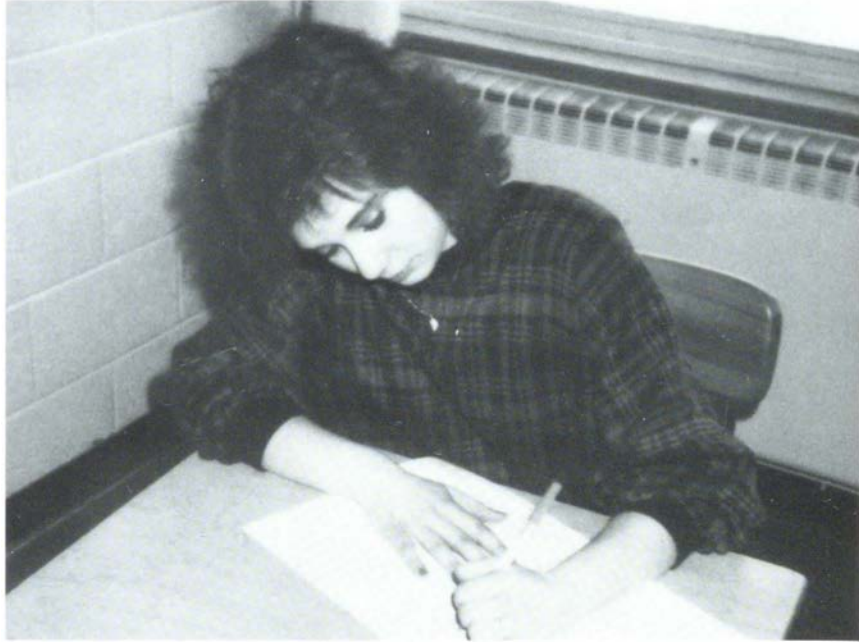
SENIOR YEAR

Nonetheless, many Seniors still found time to enjoy their final year at VHS, participating in many different activities and events over the course of the year.

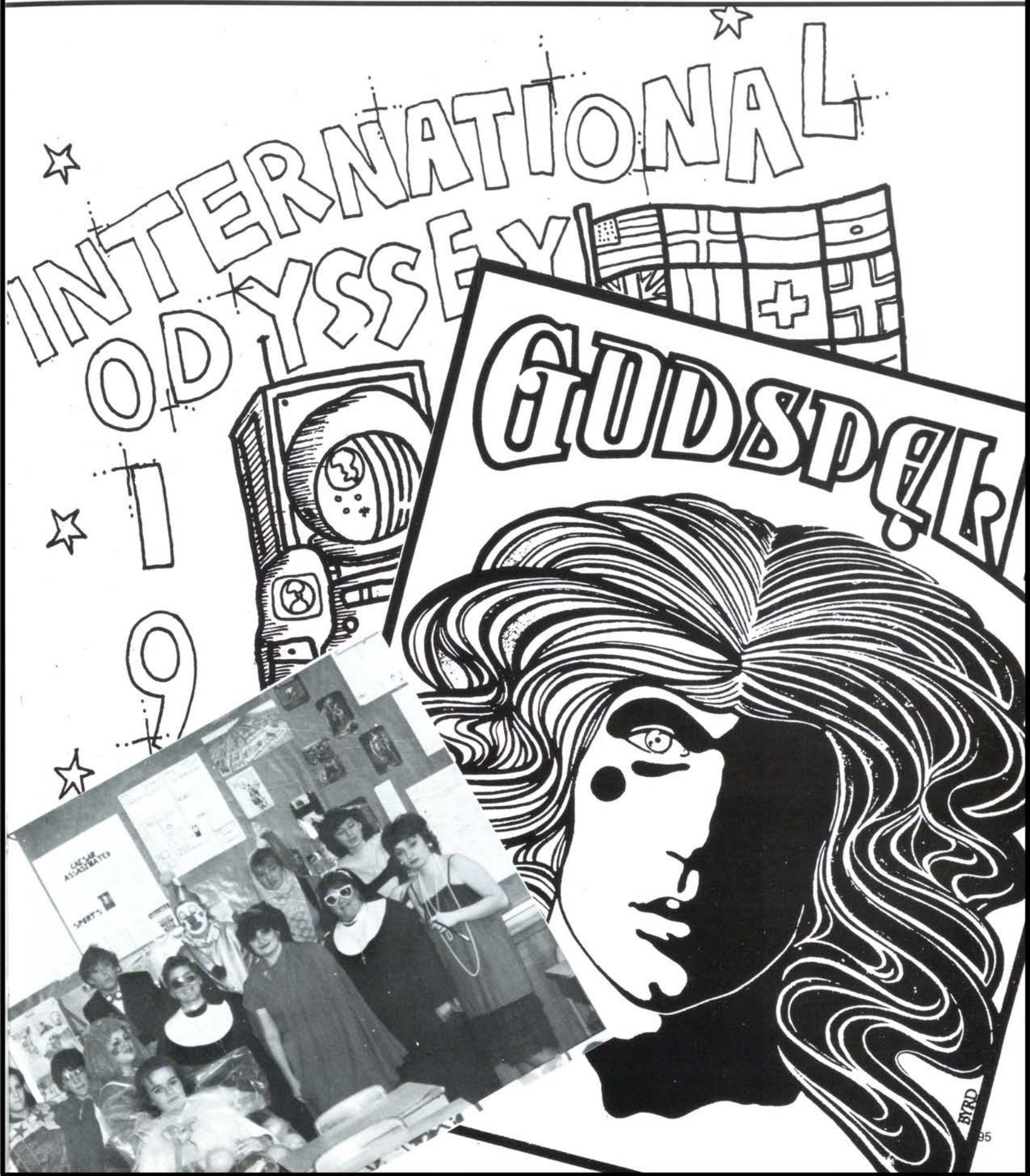

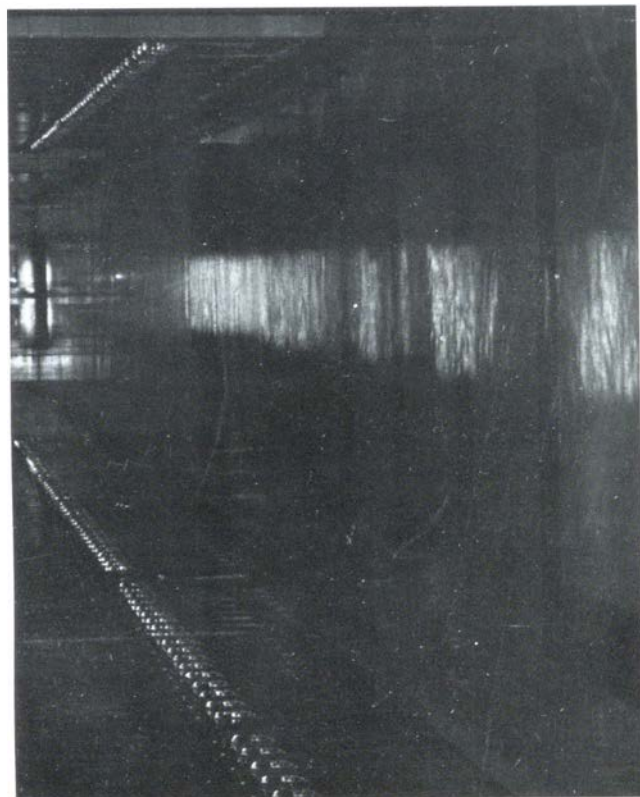

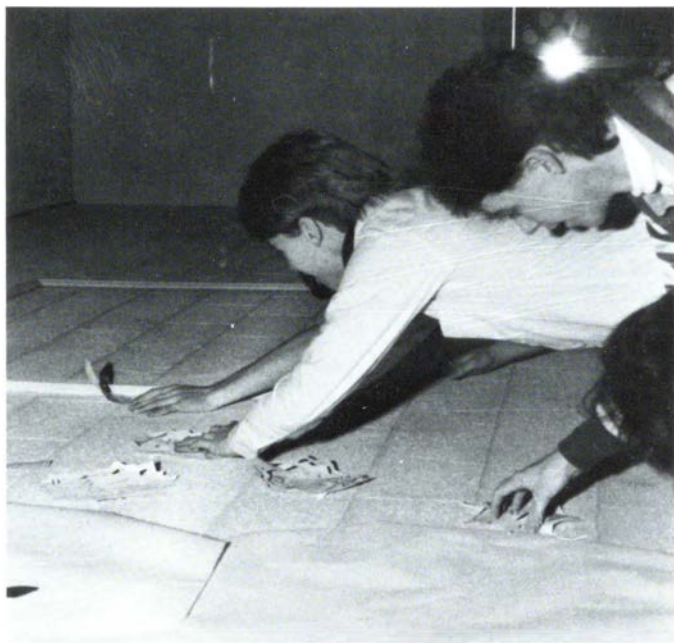

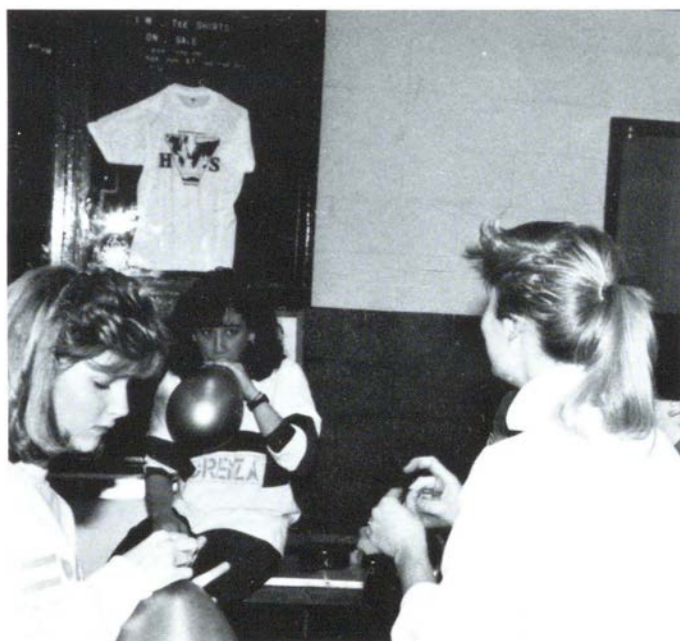

"Music: The Mosaic of the Air":

Jazz Band and Voices Combine for Vancouver Trip



The VHS Jazz Ensemble and Verona Voices combined forces to perform *Music: The Mosaic of the Air*, an original composition written especially for the Verona Jazz program by composer Richard DeRosa.

For the first time ever, the Verona High School Jazz Ensemble and the Verona Voices combined to perform *Music: The Mosaic of the Air*, a piece written especially for the group by composer Richard DeRosa. The piece consists of four contrasting movements written in different styles of jazz and rock music.

The two groups combined for several months of rehearsals, concluding in a number of combined performances.

The highlight of these performances was a trip to the Canadian National Jazz Festival in Vancouver, British Columbia, in May. The festival is one of the largest in North America, and the largest one that either group has ever attended.

In addition to the combined performance of *Mosaic*, both groups performed individually at the festival.

The combination of vocalists and instrumentalists was a new innovation in the program of the music department, and initial reactions from most of the performers have been highly favorable. As a result, works of a similar nature may be expected in the future.

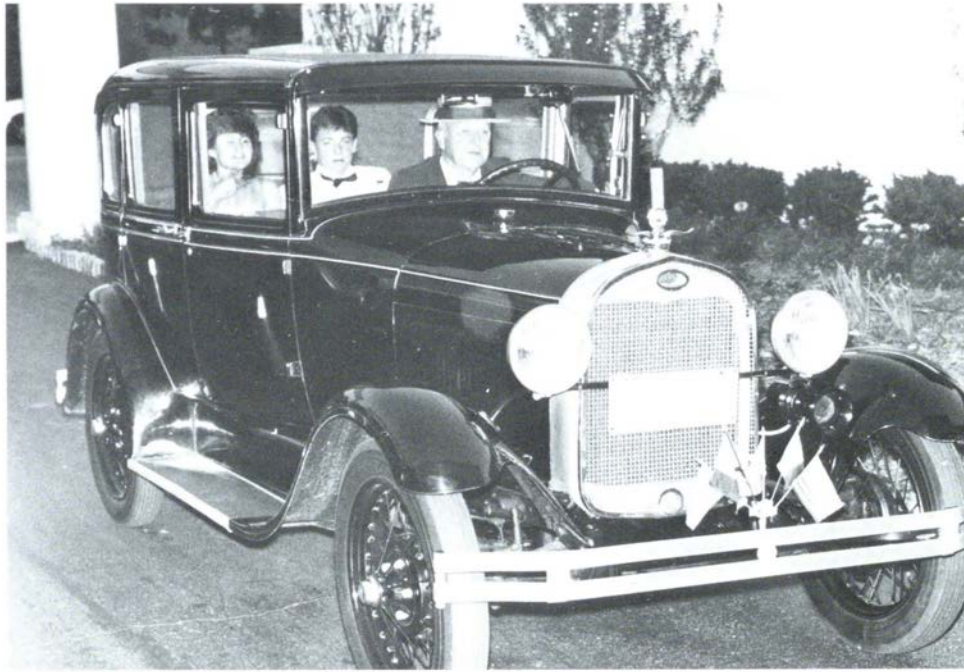

For the second year in a row on the entertainment plate was the band BOYS TOWN and also a D.J., both of whom provided an excellent blend of dance music.



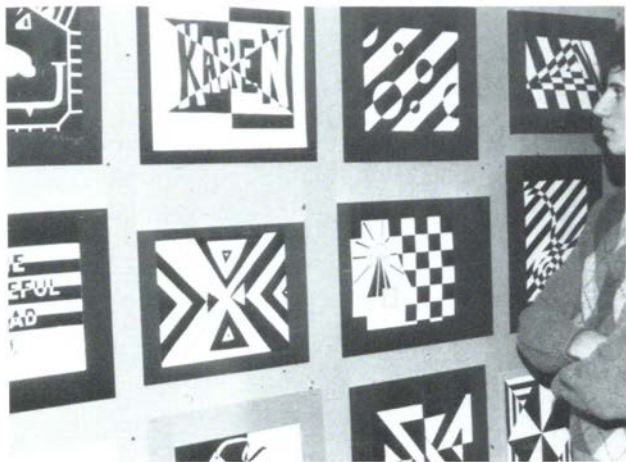

The marshalls at the assembly were members of the student council and the National Honor Society.



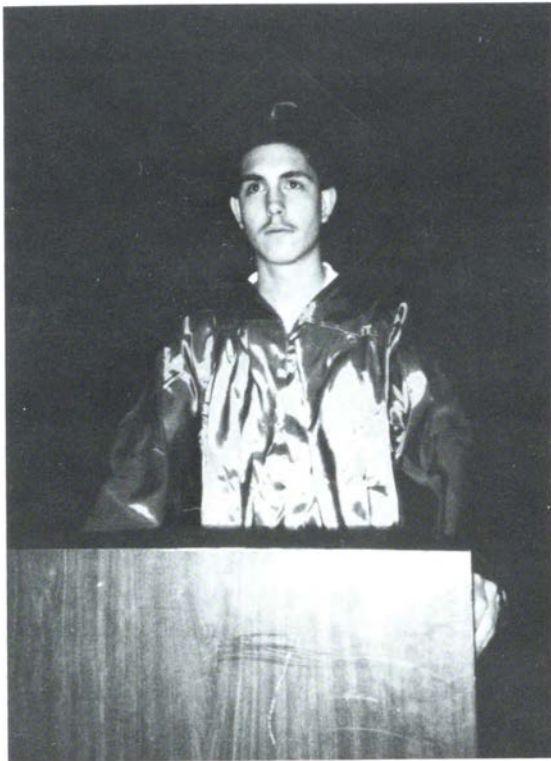

PREAMBLE

We, the student body of Verona High School, in order to promote the general welfare of the same, to establish higher standards of leadership, scholarship, character, service and school spirit, to better our school, to improve student/faculty relationships, and to give practical experience in democracy, do hereby ordain and establish this constitution of The Student Council of Verona High School.

Article I. Name:

1. Insure and promote the functioning of chartered activities of the students of Verona High School.
2. Furnish the students with a voice in the government of the school.

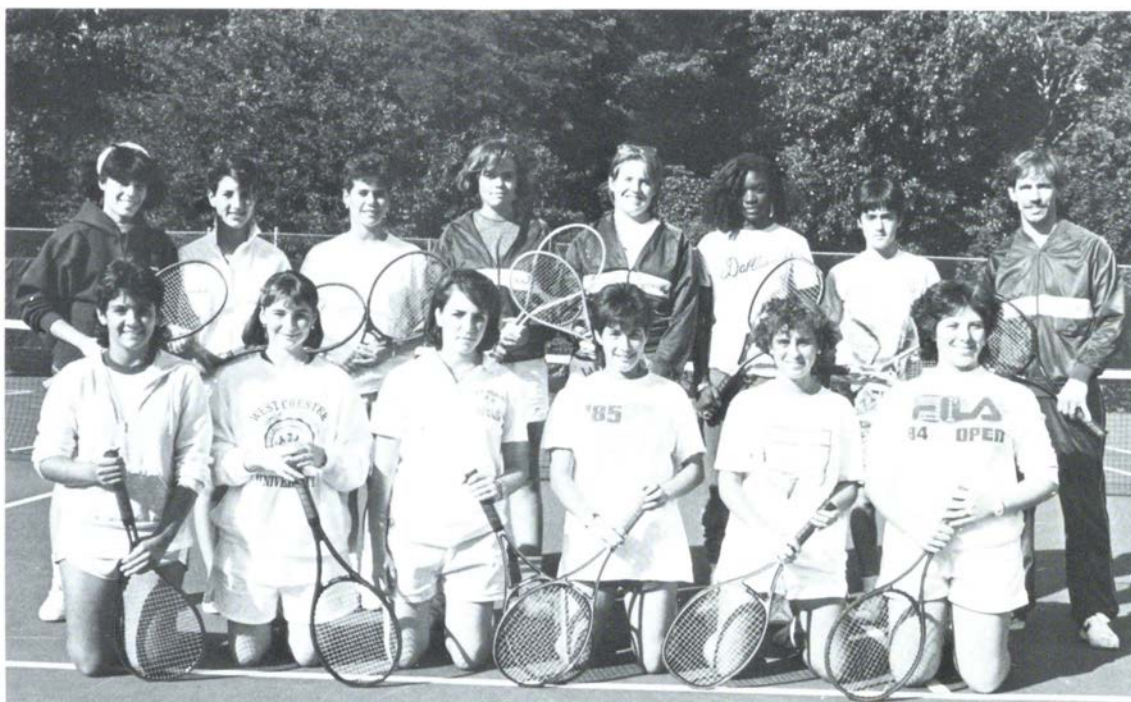

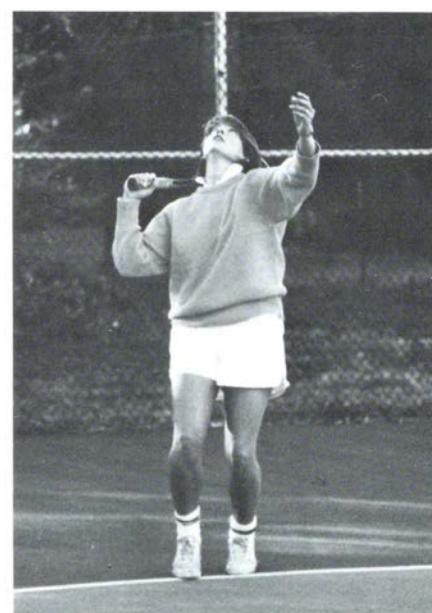

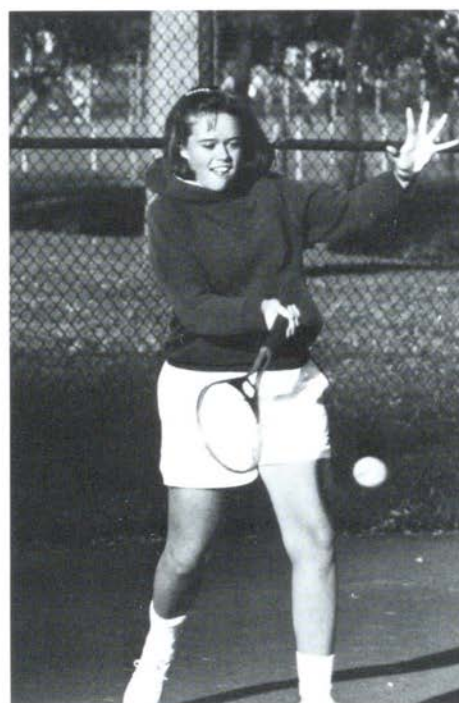

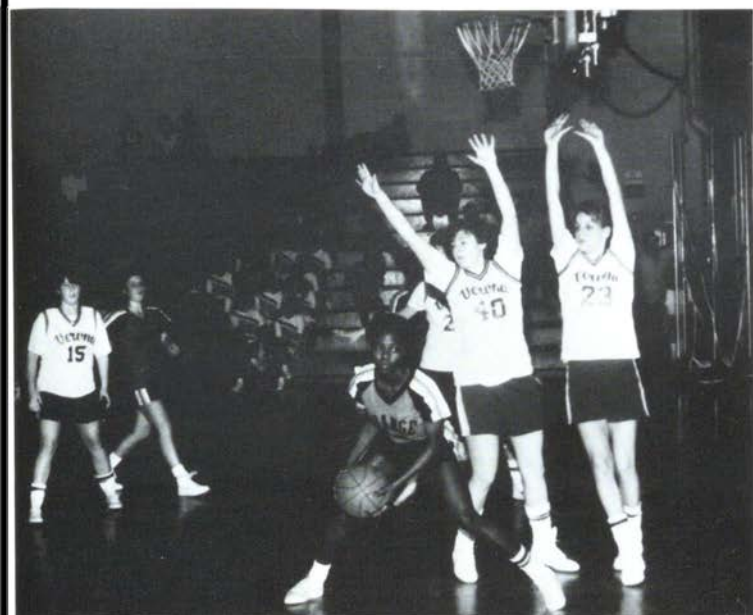

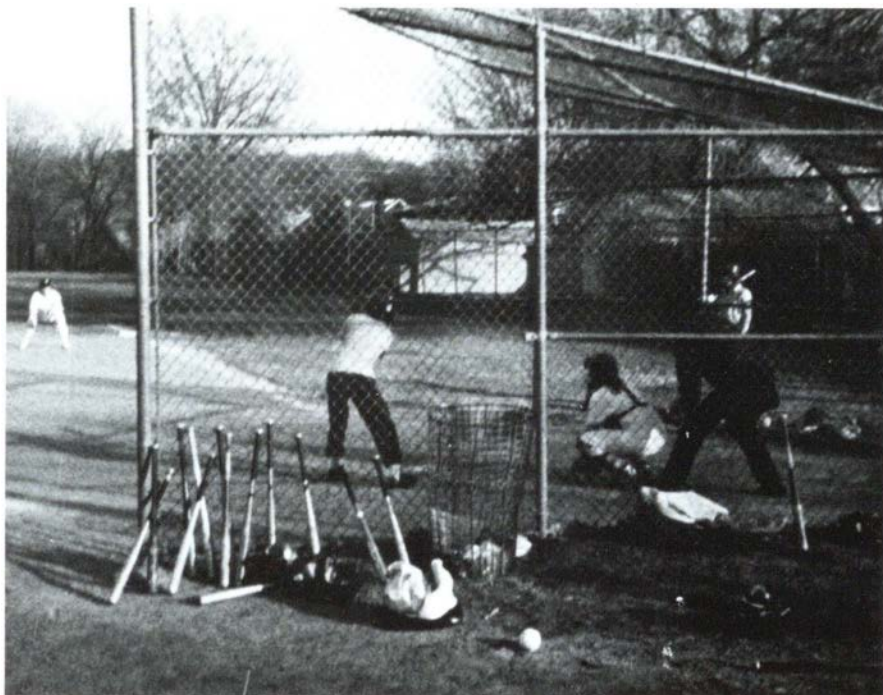

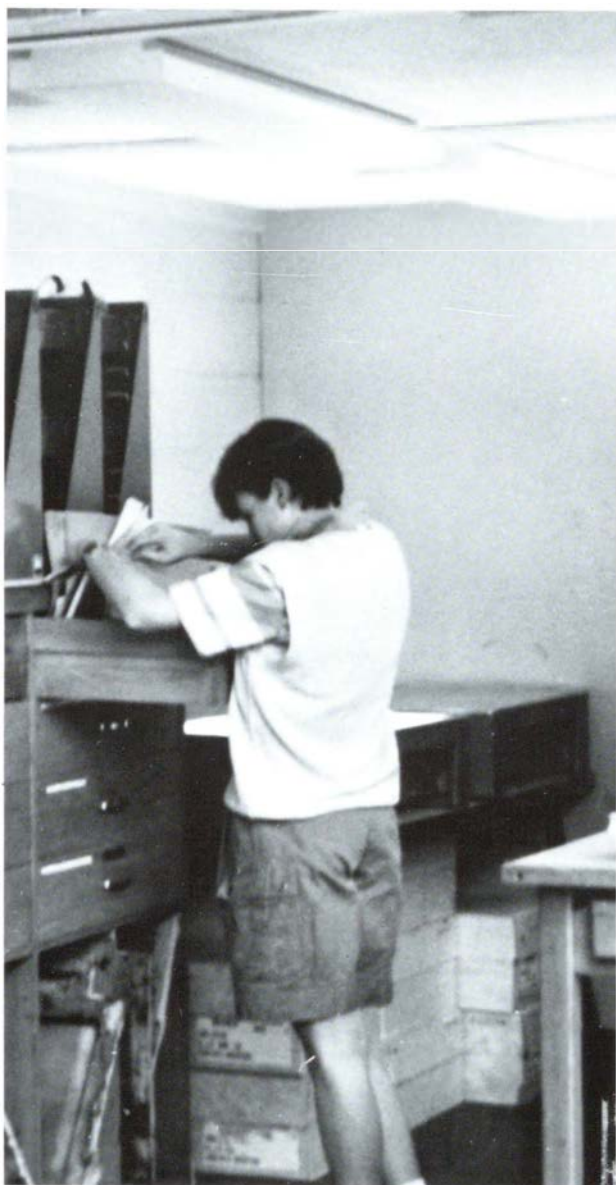
