The Guidance Department at VHS provides help for students' development and growth in many ways. The counselors assist in the planning of schedules, school work, and the development of future plans including college and a career.

The Guidance Department begins helping the students of VHS with a freshman orientation. The purpose of this program is to introduce ninth grade students to Verona High School. The Guidance Department further assists the students by helping them prepare for the future. It administers the PSAT'S and SAT'S and also assists in processing applications.

The Guidance Department now has use of a computer to quickly gain access to information about colleges, junior colleges and technical schools. The student's preference to size, location, activities and academic standards is entered into the computer. The computer then prints out a list of colleges for the student to meet his or her needs. The Guidance Counselor, with the aid of the computer, can now help plan a student's future more efficiently.

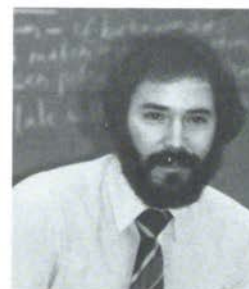

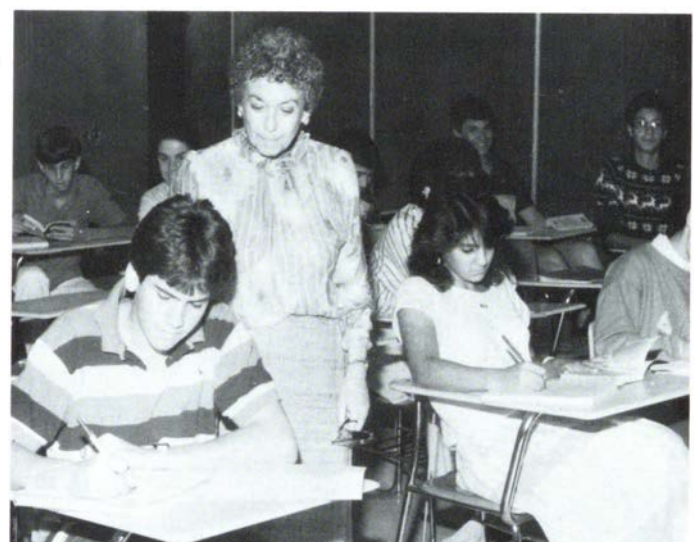

English is a major element in the VHS curriculum. Students are required to take four years of English in order to graduate. Various levels of English are offered, such as Advanced Placement, Honors, Regular, and Basic.

A new state required Writing Lab course was introduced into the English program this year. The Writing Lab consists of a small class size environment designed to give remedial help in English to students that have not passed H.S.P.T. testing successfully.

Elective English courses are also offered such as Mass Media, Speech, and Journalism I and II.

The growing popularity of Journalism I and II amongst VHS students forced the administration to offer a third period of Journalism. This elective course along with the others mentioned add to the enrichment of the students in the area of English at VHS.

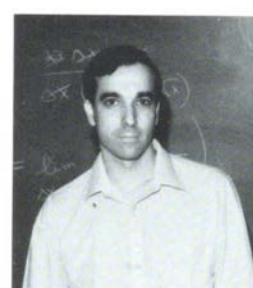

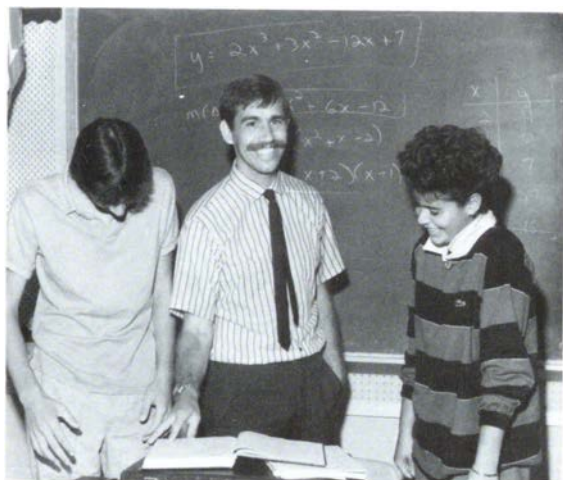

The 1986-87 school year began amidst some change within the math department. Longtime faculty member Mr. Boris Weller retired at the end of last year after 27 years on the VHS faculty. He was replaced by Mr. Gerald Lamb as math department head in September.

New Algebra II and Calculus books arrived, along with a new face: Mr. Kenneth Treitler joined the faculty. Mr. Treitler taught at James Caldwell High School before coming to Verona. He taught Algebra I, Geometry and Math IV during the 1986-87 school year.

When asked of his hopes for the Math department, Mr. Lamb expressed a desire to institute several new courses. He feels that a pre-Algebra course should be provided, so that the transition to higher math might be less dramatic. Mr. Lamb also plans to incorporate a statistics course for advanced students.

Science Department Concentrates on Practical Application of Skills

The Science department is an important part of the VHS curriculum. Although only two years of science is required to graduate, many students elect to take such advanced courses as Chemistry, Physics and Advanced Placement Biology.

This year the AP Biology classes participated in the NASA project, SEEDS. The project involved the study of tomato seeds that orbited around the earth for one year in a Long Duration Exposure Facility Satellite. Identical tomato seeds were kept on earth and placed in a laboratory environment to be used as a control group. The purpose of this project was to determine if outerspace exposure affected seed growth and germination once the seeds were brought back to earth.

Science classes at VHS have always placed a great emphasis on laboratory work. Experiments enable the student to better understand and apply science concepts which have been discussed in class.

The Industrial Arts and Home Economics Departments allow VHS students to develop certain skills in addition to purely academic ones. Some interested students become involved in these areas to plan career moves and others simply to improve various skills.

Graphic Arts I and II is a popular elective among students. These courses provide experience in photography, silk screening and offset printing.

Wood and Metal shop also consists of hands-on experience, but in this case, in the use of various tools and equipment. Students work on a project of their choice throughout the marking period to construct a useful project which has also served as a learning experience.

The Home Economics program provides students with the opportunity to learn cooking and sewing skills. The cooking curriculum is divided into three levels. The first of these is a beginning class which is for learning basic skills. Meal Management teaches students to plan meals and follow balanced diets. Home Economy Shop deals with the making and selling of food products. In sewing classes students apply the sewing techniques they have learned to produce fashionable garments. These projects are featured at the end of the year in a fashion show.

Business and Co-op Courses Prepare Students for Future

The business courses offered at VHS include Typing, Accounting, Computers, and Basic Business Mini courses. The work study programs consist of Cooperative Industrial Education and Marketing Education, or Distributive Education, as it is commonly called. Cooperative Office Education is a work experience program.

Cooperative Industrial Education, CIE, is offered for students interested in entering a trade. CIE students gain experience from various trades, such as plumbing, carpentry, auto repair, and landscaping. After graduation the majority of these students continue to be employed in these fields. Other CIE students attend a trade school for a year.

In Distributive Education students are taught retailing and marketing. DE is an employment experience program in which the students attend classes in the morning and work for corporations in the afternoons.

COE is work experience program for students who want to get on-the-job training in the office field. COE I students learn such skills as resume typing and job interviewing. COE I students also gain experience in the use of business phones. A new phone system with the switch board was installed to further the students' knowledge in this area.

COE II students participate in this more advanced class to become acquainted with the policies of office management.

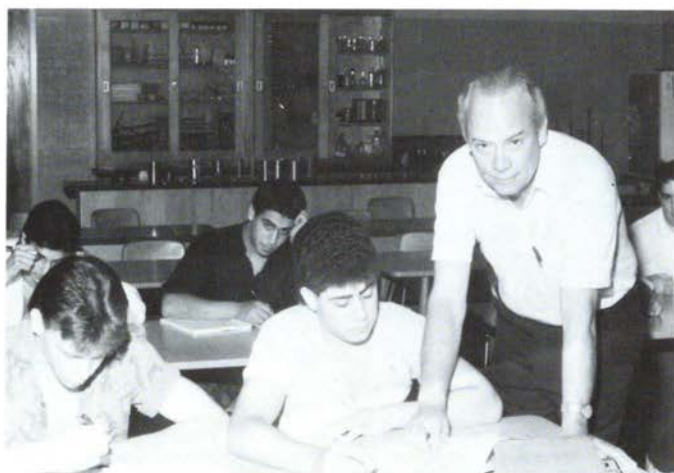

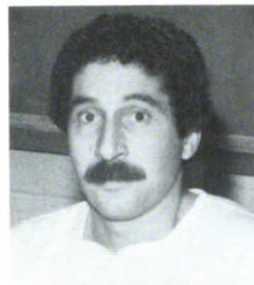
Special Education Programs Prove Valuable



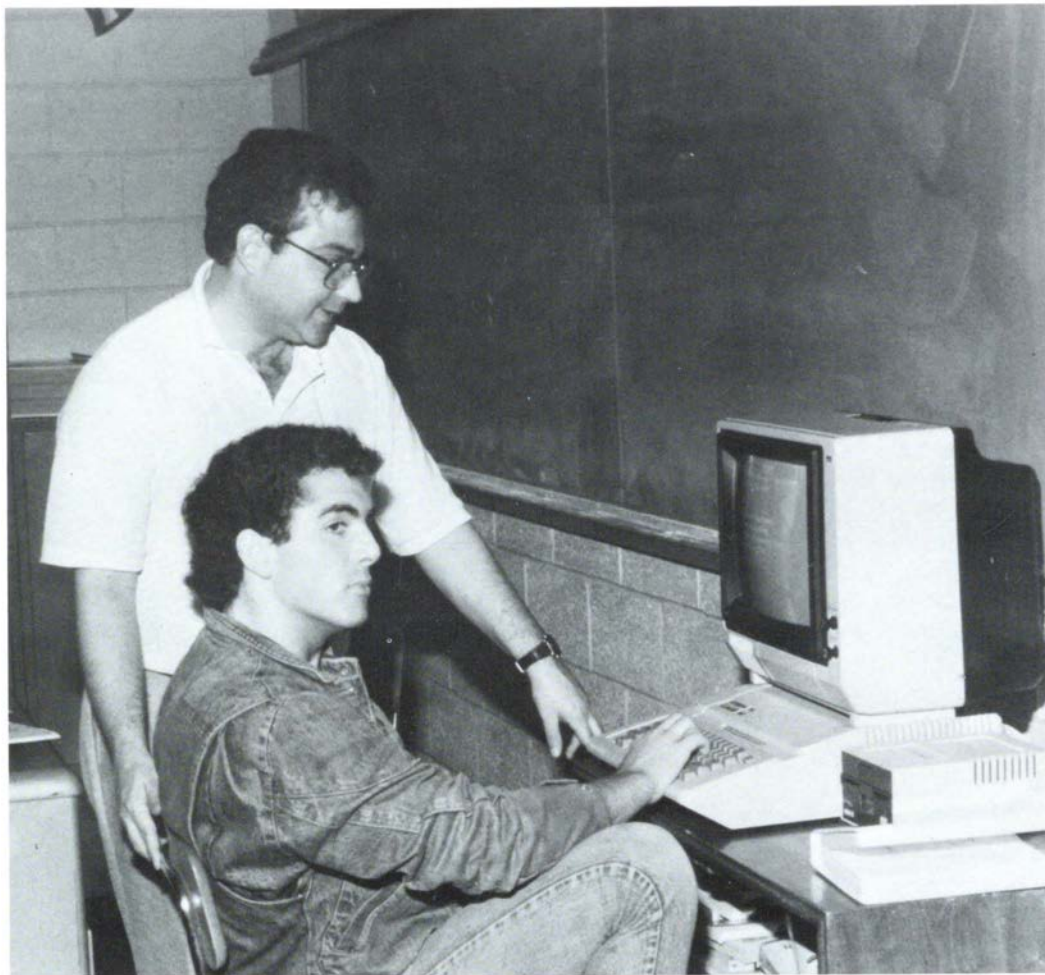

The purpose of Special Education is to help those individuals who have some type of physical, emotional, social or mental learning disability. The goal of the department is to improve upon these particular weaknesses.

The curriculum followed by Special Education students includes the same courses that are required of all V.H.S. students.

In order to help Special Education students overcome their weaknesses, continual emphasis is placed on certain skills. In addition to skills, Special Education teachers reinforce concepts and skills learned in other classes, and prepare students for H.S.P.T. testing.

Computer software has been added this year to the Special Education curriculum to aid in the development of critical thinking skills and to supplement the Social Studies and Math areas.

Phys. Ed. Is More Than Playing Ball

Physical Education is an important part of the curriculum at Verona High School. It helps students to remain physically fit throughout the school year, as opposed to just during a particular sport season.

It is required for all students to take four years of Physical Education for three marking periods a year. For the remaining marking period freshmen, sophomores, and seniors take a health class while juniors take Drivers Education.

Freshmen in General Health learn about nutrition and proper health care. Sophomores take Family Living I which corresponds with Biology.

Seniors who take Family Living II start by doing exercises to help them find out about themselves. They have three weeks to choose a marriage partner or one will be chosen for them. As a couple the two students complete a series of projects. This phase is called 'Make Believe Marriage.' This class is important because it prepares seniors for life on their own and marriage in the future.

Freshman Year (1983-1984):

On September 12, 1983 the class of 1987 entered the halls of VHS as freshmen. We soon got used to the fact that there is only one floor. Our first class elections were held. Sophomore Year (1984-1985):

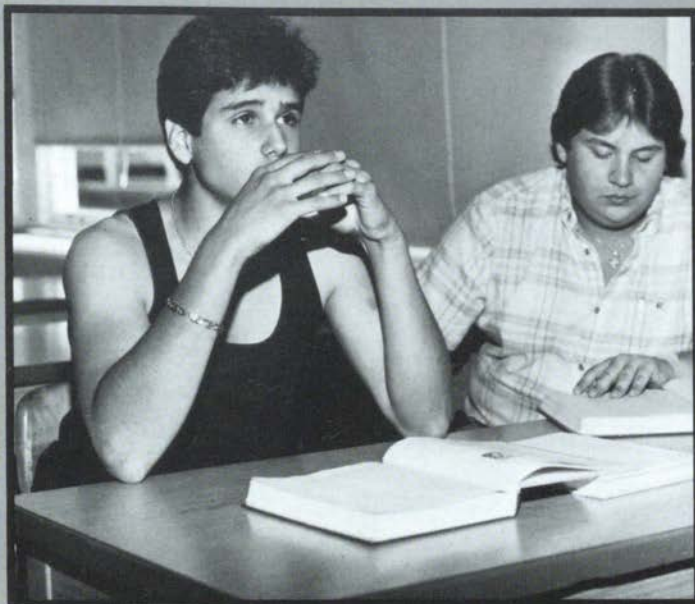

Upperclassmen at last! Anthony Lanzo became the president of the class. He was assisted by Robert Cagnetta and Dawn Zingali, the vice-president and secretary, respectively. In our junior year, Coach Rich SanFillipo replaced Coach Rotella as physical education teacher and varsity football coach. The physical education department also saw the arrival of Miss Joann Rean, who replaced Mrs. Pat Schoenig during her maternity leave. Mr. Joe Refinski also appeared in the halls of VHS as he took over Mrs. Terri Fryer's history classes. Mrs. Fryer gave birth to a baby girl in our junior year. Still another new face of the VHS faculty was Miss Jill Quigley, who replaced Mrs. Maria Clayton. The '85-'86 school year also marked the end of the morning song and the institution of the five minute homeroom period. The annual pep rally had the cheerleaders shouting "Dare Me." These girls also cheered as the varsity football team pounded Caldwell in the traditional Thanksgiving battle by the score of 24-0. Our junior year also included Driver's Education. 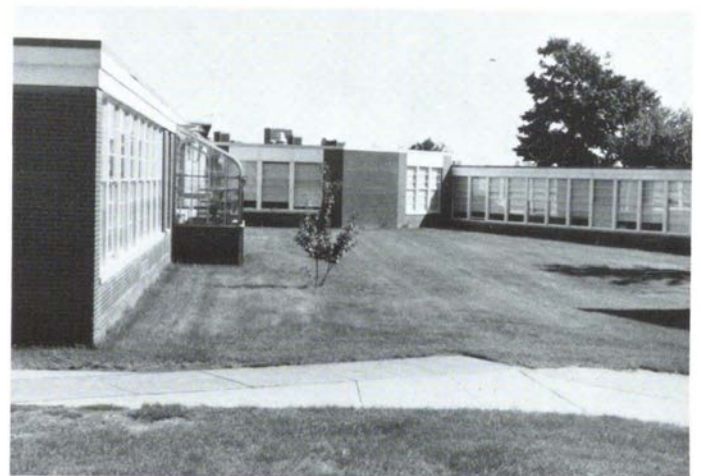

The fall, winter and spring sports assemblies give students who participated in athletics an opportunity to be recognized.

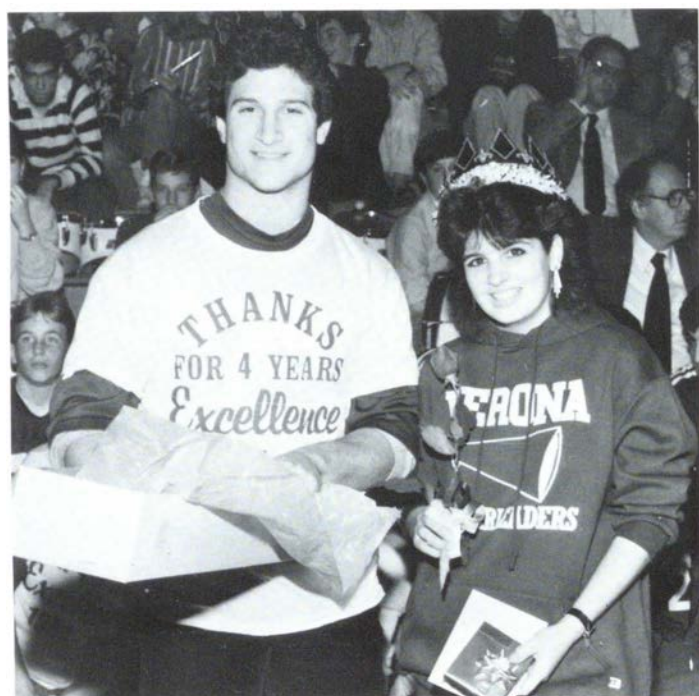

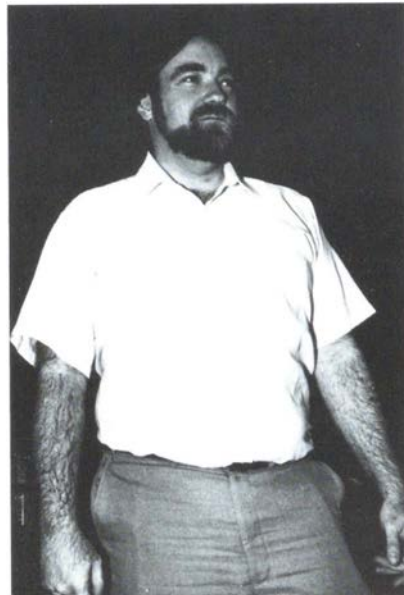

This trip provided many opportunities for the students to interact with band members from other states.

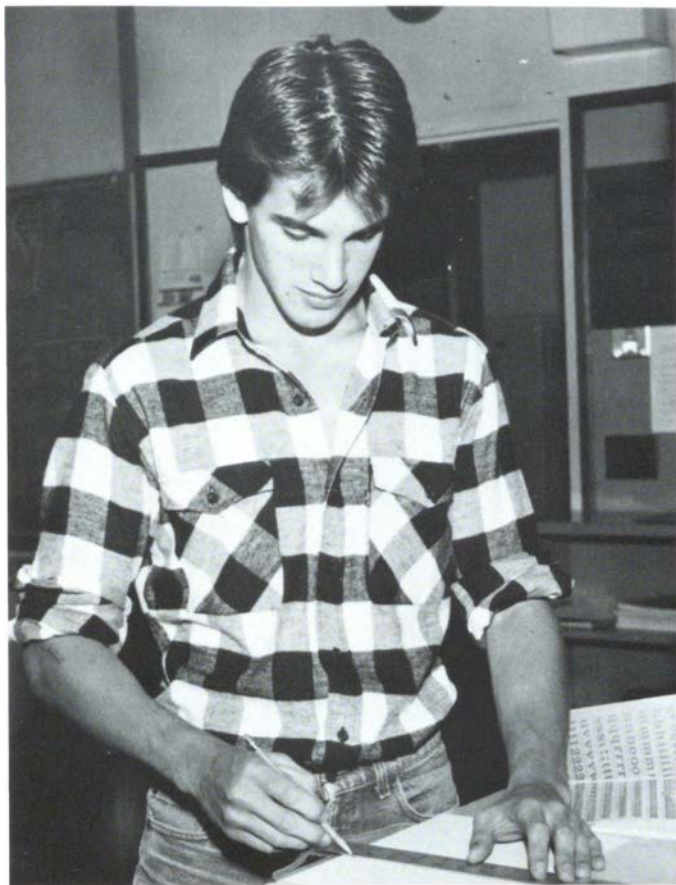

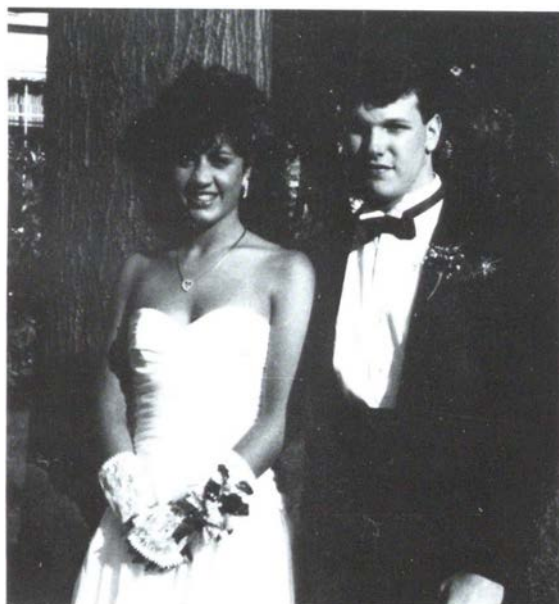

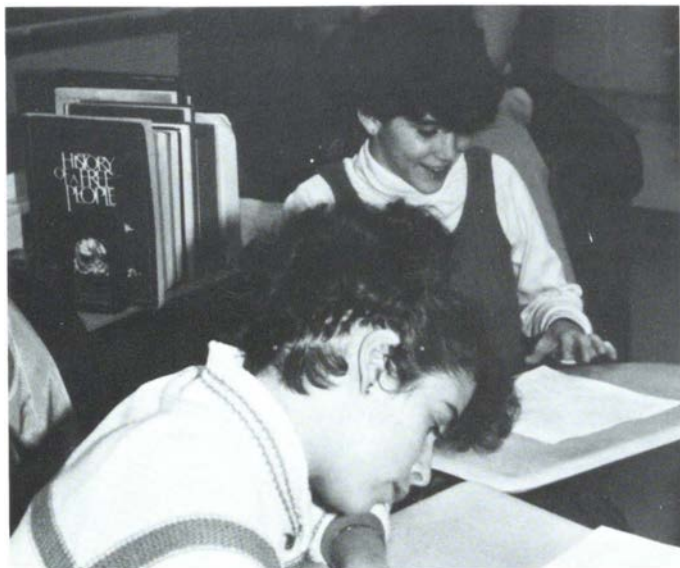

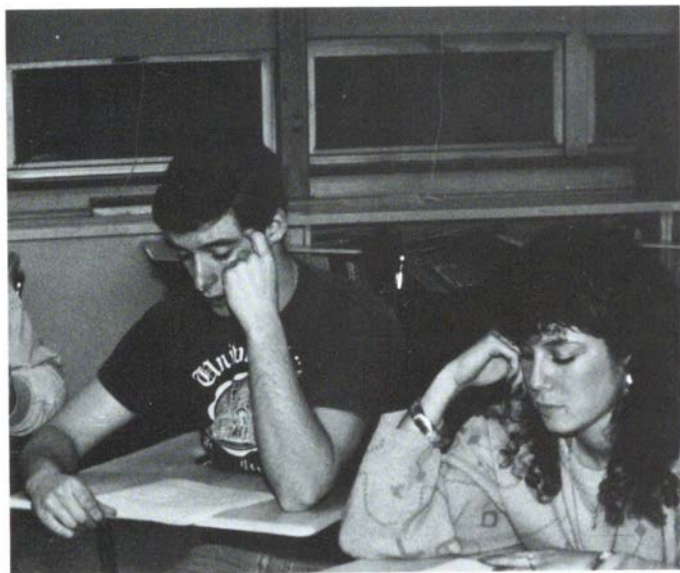

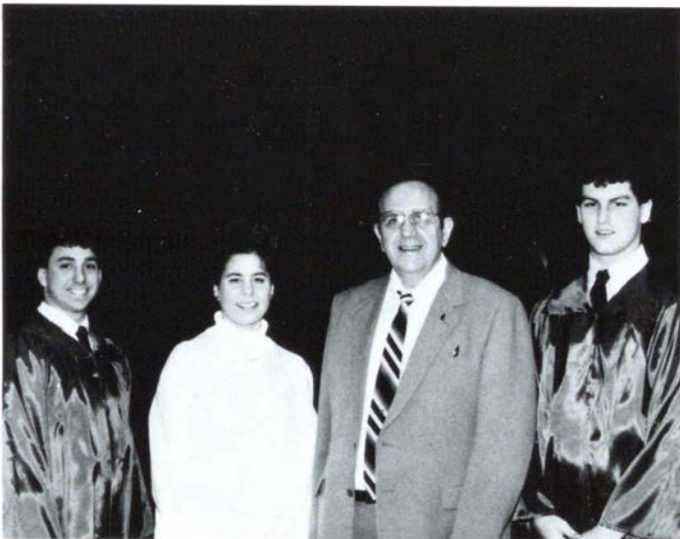

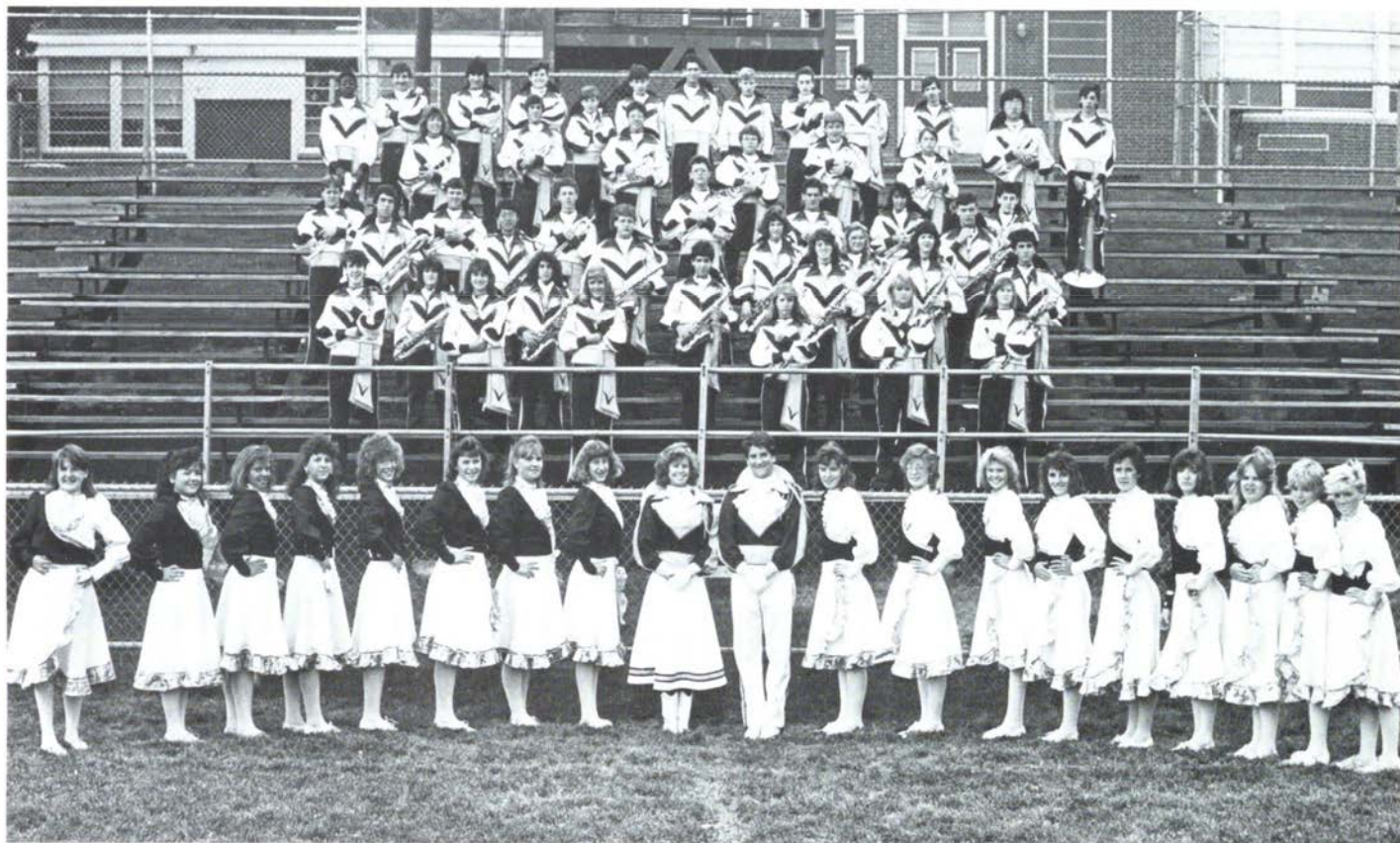

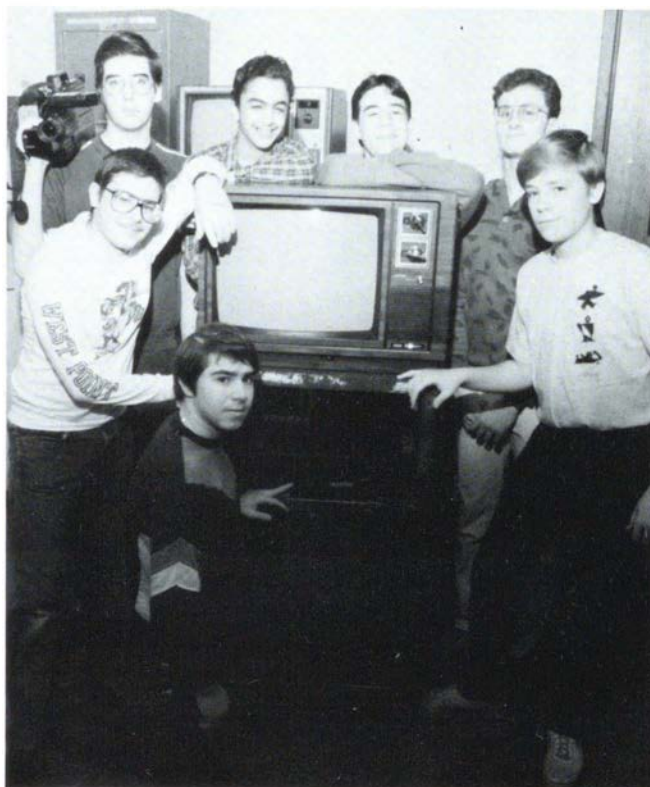
A.V. Squad Assists Teachers

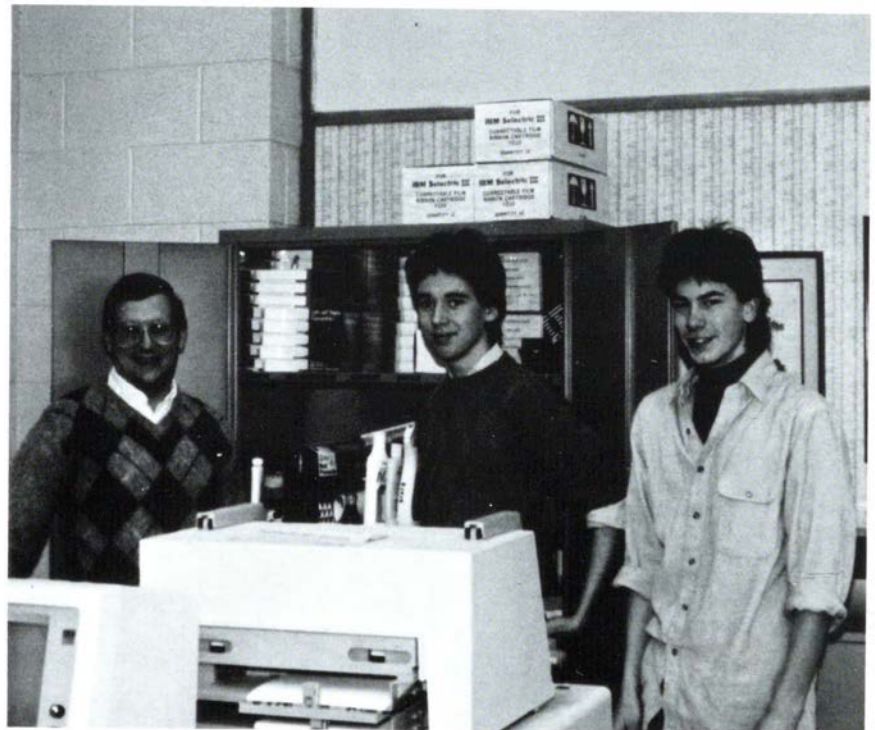

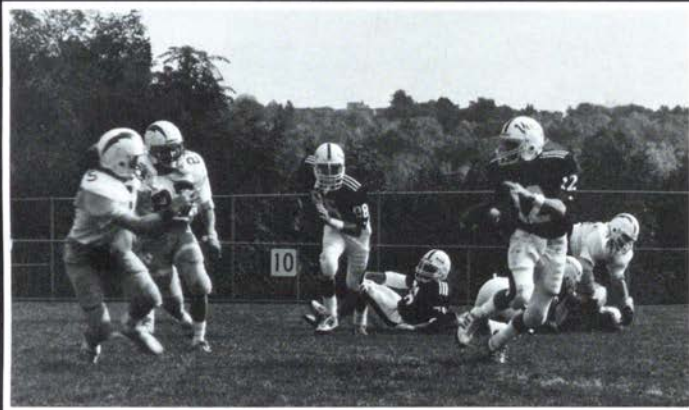

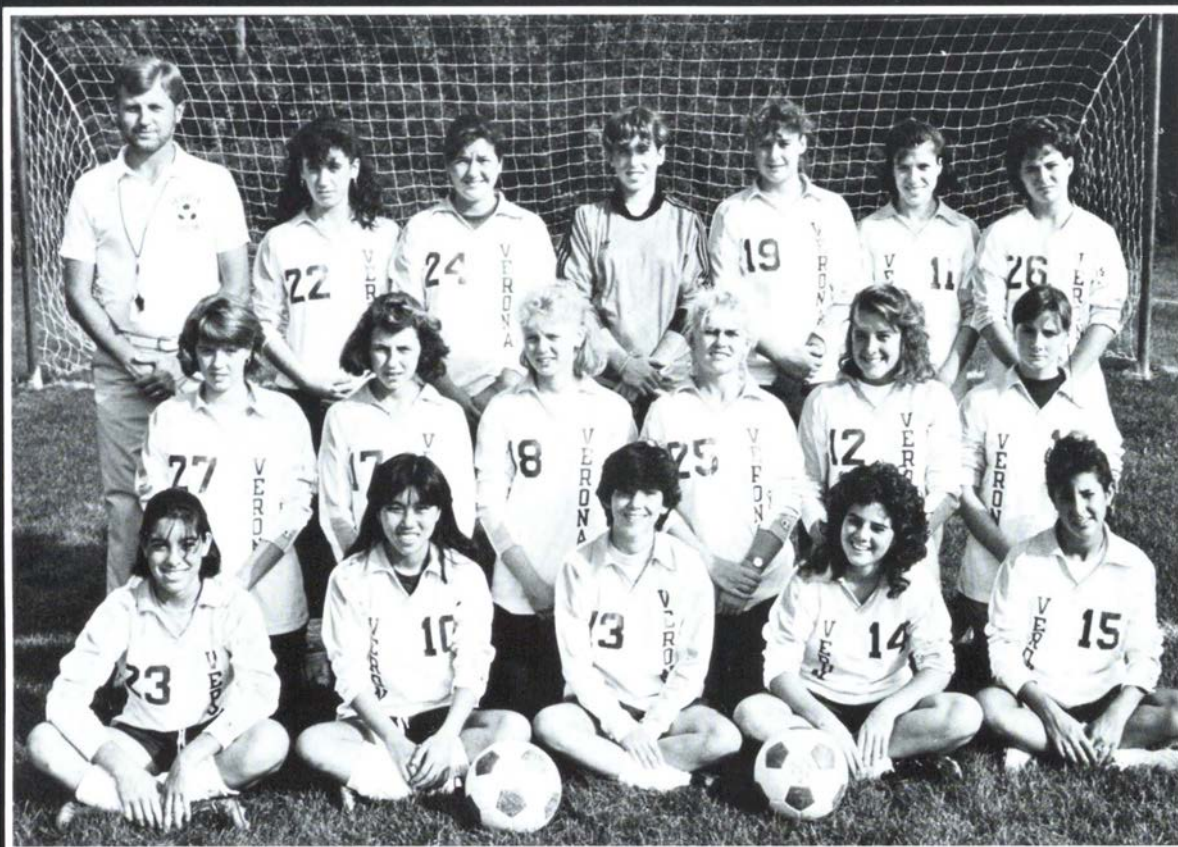

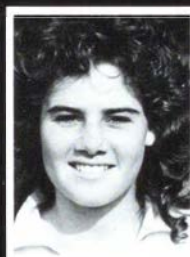

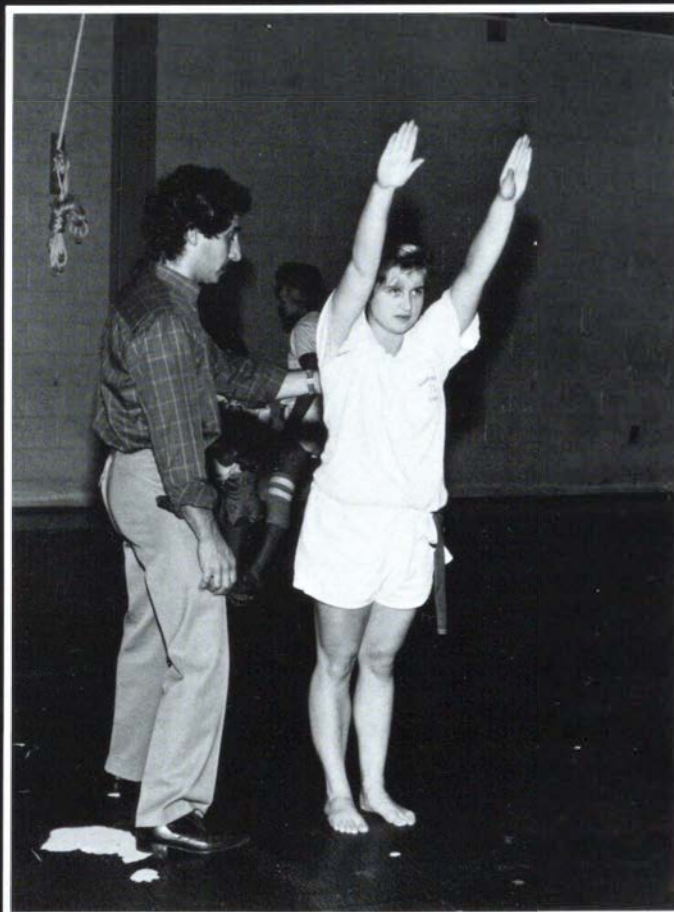

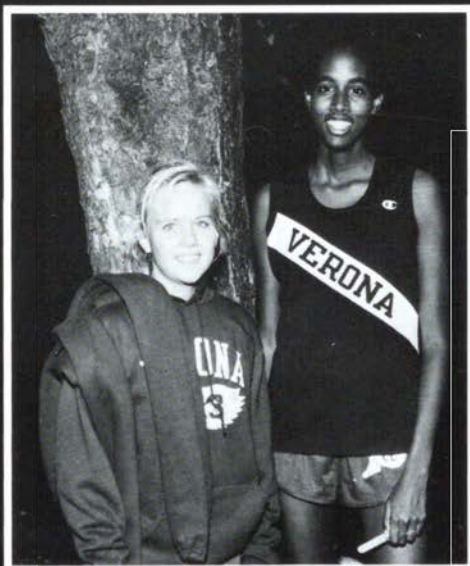

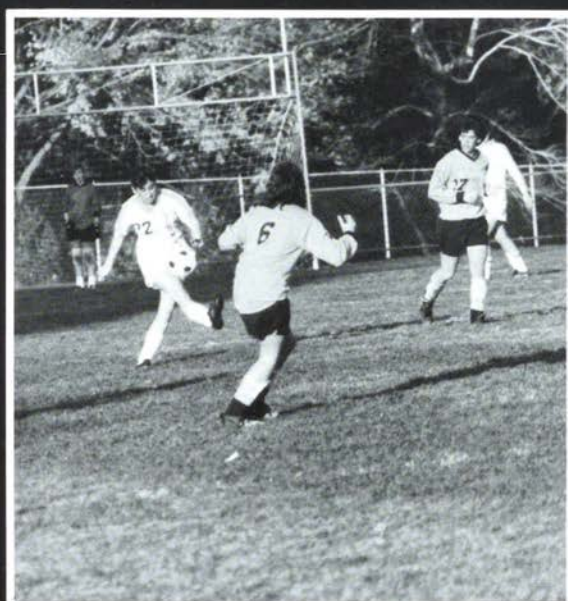

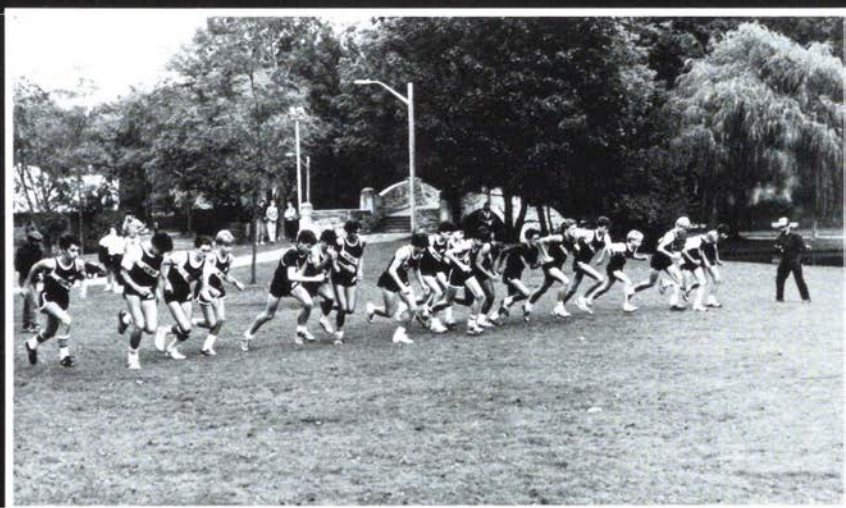

Coach Bob Graham was proud of co-captains Maureen Milano and Barri Pollner, and the team's overall "never say die" attitude.



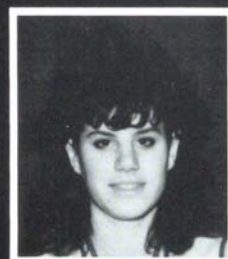

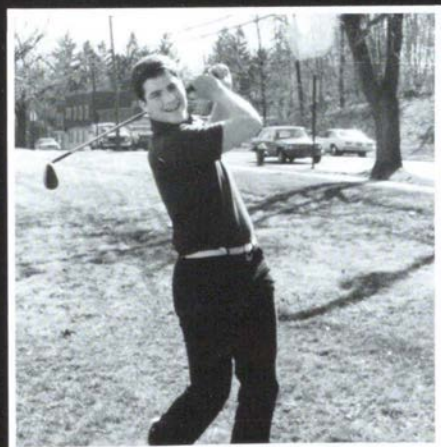
