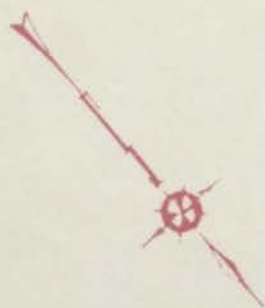
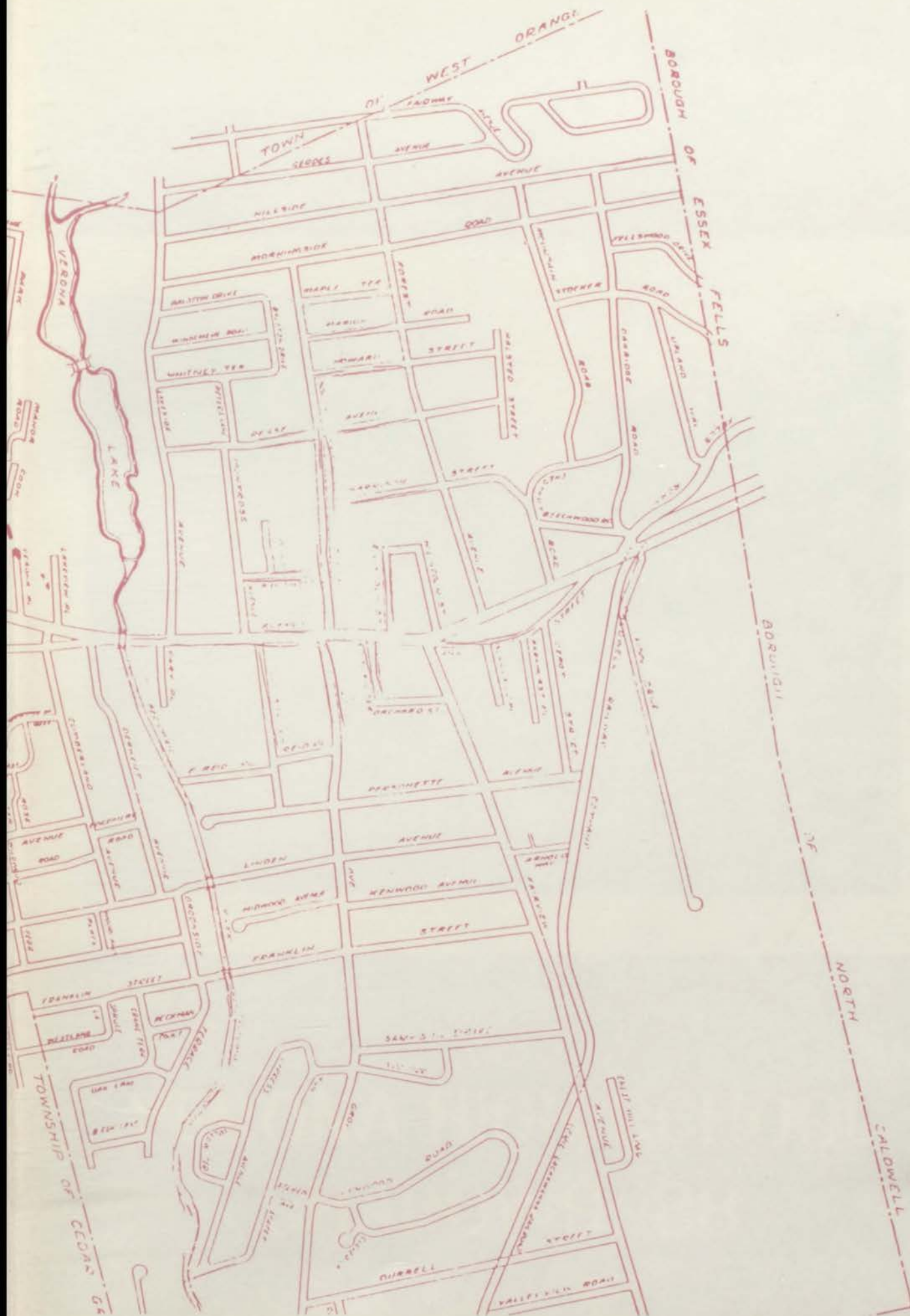
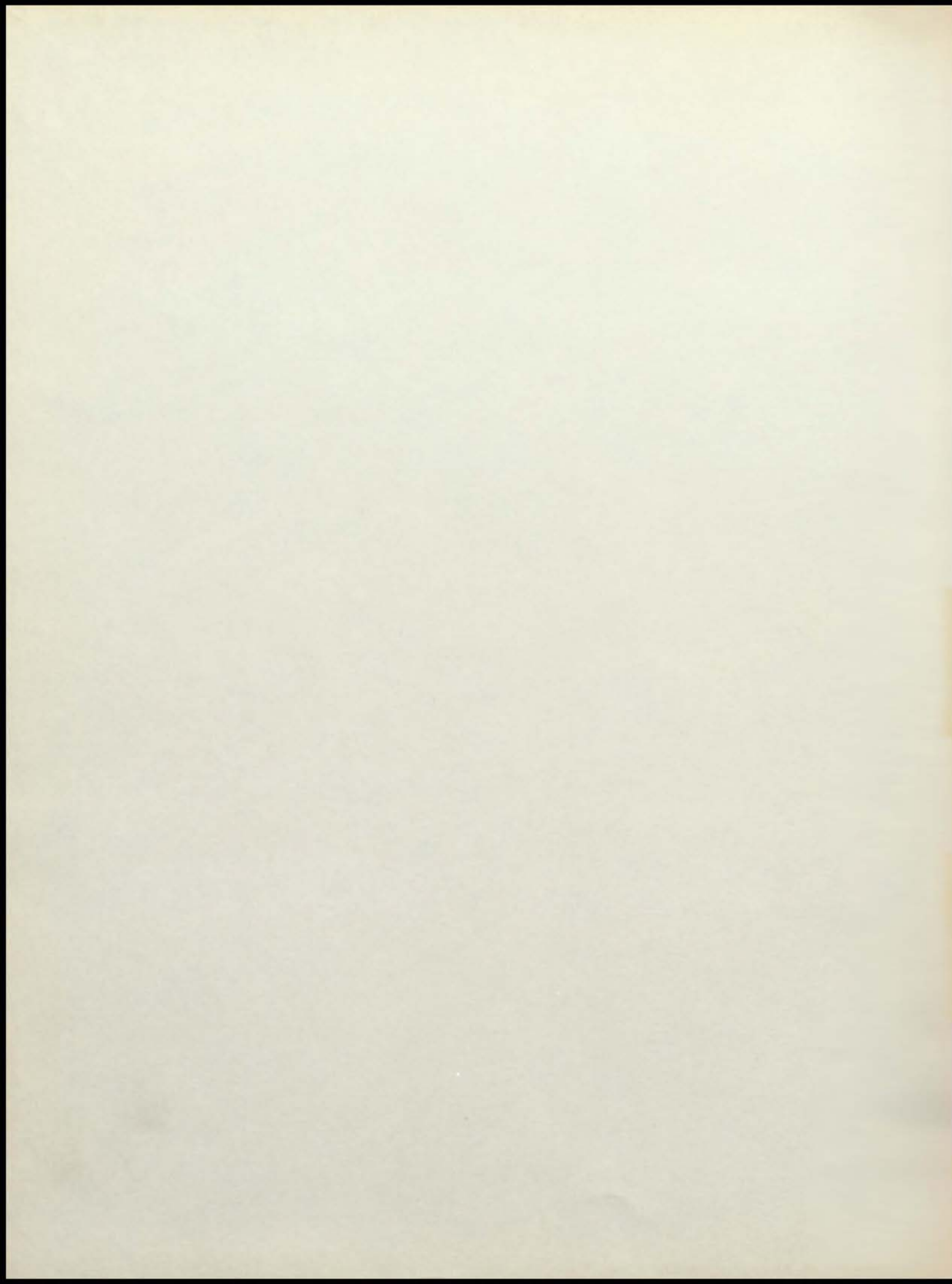

As we walk down life's winding path,



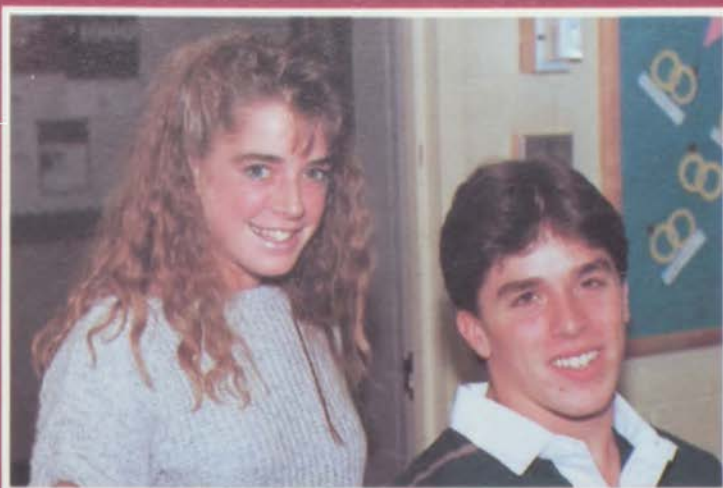
we'll stumble once or twice.

misfortunes cloud the way.



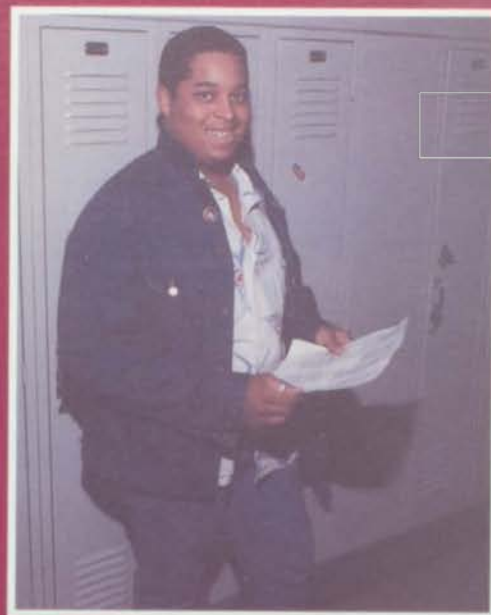

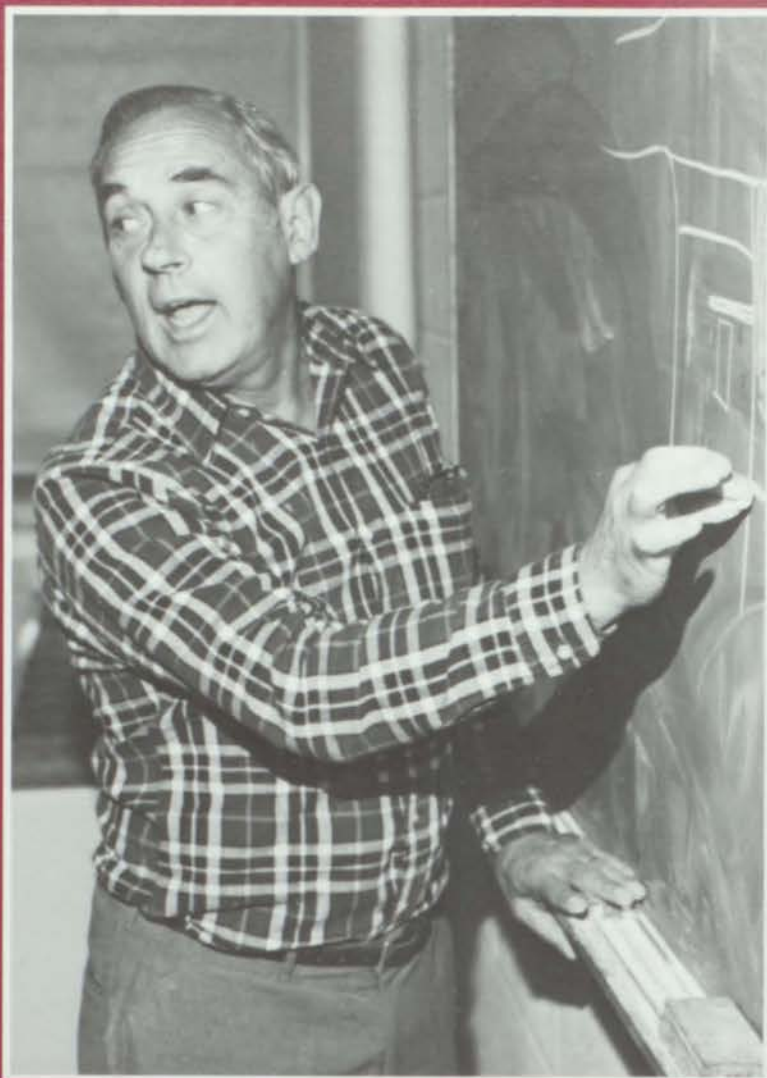


Dedication '88: George Stiefbold

Freshman Year 1984-1985

Mrs. Barbara Kistner, Mrs. Maria Lanahan, and Mr. Ken Treitler replaced Miss Quigley, Mr. Burguillos, and Mr. Weller in their respective positions as Mr. Gerald Lamb took charge of the math department. A new fundraiser — the class competition — took place and was (of course) ultimately won by the junior class. A new four marking period out-to-lunch policy awaited us as seniors, as did the new parking lot rule of seniors with parking stickers only. As Driver Education students took to the roads with their new licenses, many got 10 — 7:30's for forgetting that only seniors could park in the lot. The football team once again shut out Caldwell as the cheerleaders danced to the tune of "Victory" at the pep rally. Another new experience was the town council sponsored "Mayor for a Day" program, as well as the year's highlight; the Junior-Senior Prom, based on the theme "Tender Years" by John Cafferty and the Beaver Brown Band. The parking lot was finally open to us, and most of us got our maroon and white out to lunch cards. Halloween brought out the angel (and devil) in many of us as the school was filled with parading seniors. Leading up to winter season, we flooded the office with college applications, desperate to get them in on time and then waiting anxiously to hear from the colleges. The wheelchair basketball game between the New Jersey Blue Devils and our seniors raised the much-needed money for our class as we approached Thanksgiving. The pep rally helped cheer on the football team, who put out a good effort against an undefeated Caldwell team, scoring 14, more points than the total points Caldwell had against them all season, leaving the score 42-14. This game ended the 49-year traditional battle between Verona and Caldwell as Verona leaves the Northern Hills Conference, leaving Verona ahead 25 to 24. Honor Society inductions expanded the Honor Society membership to a record number, making our class one of the most competitive to graduate from Verona. 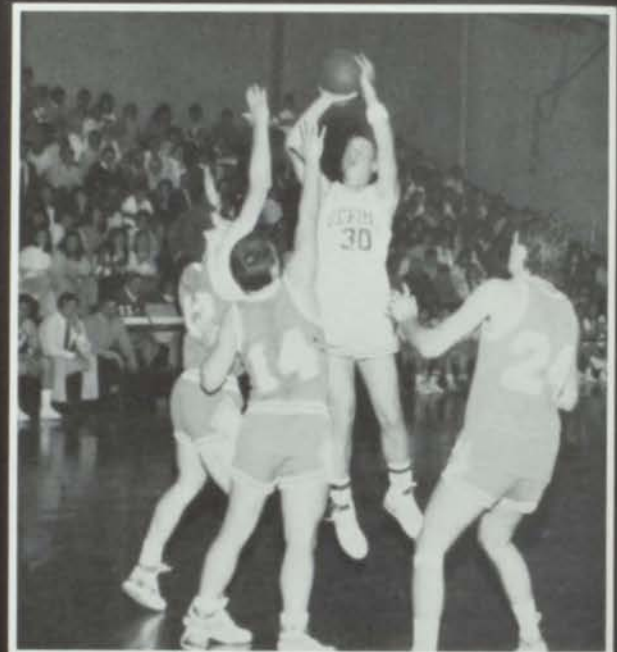

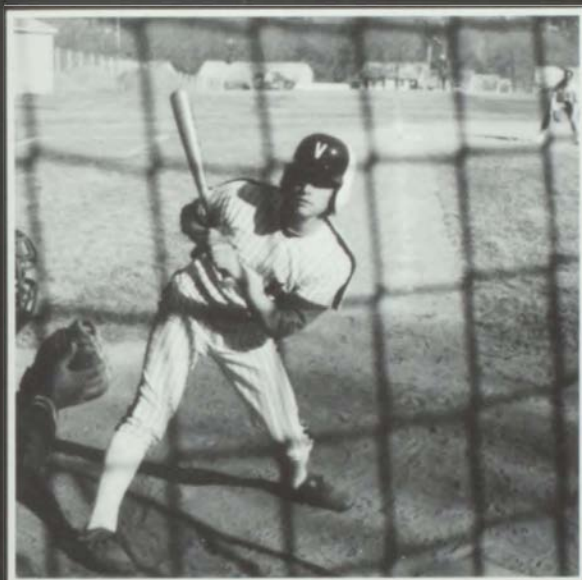

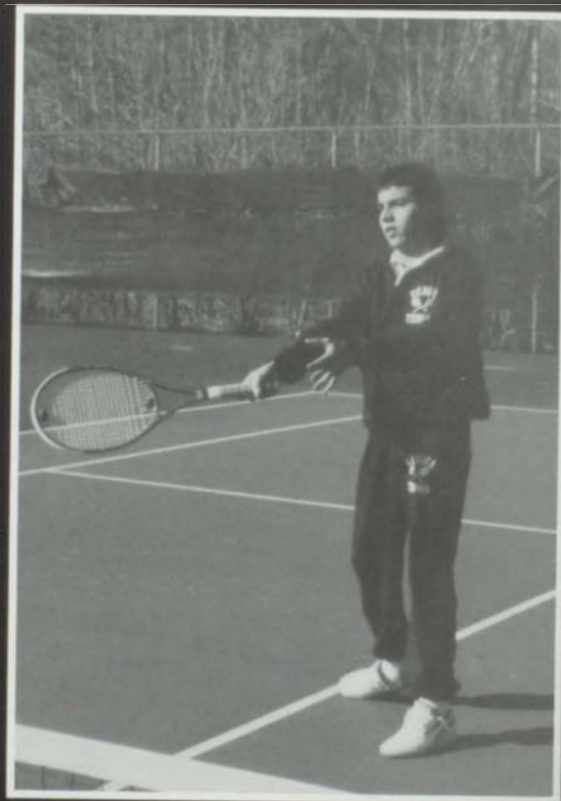

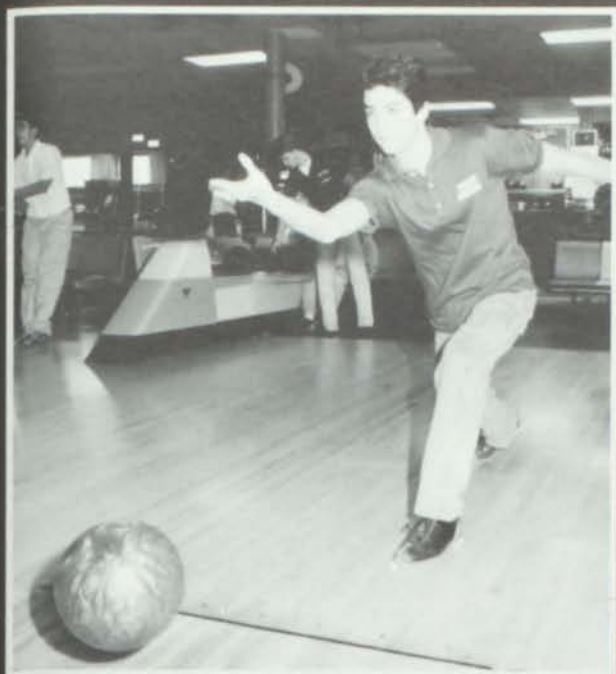


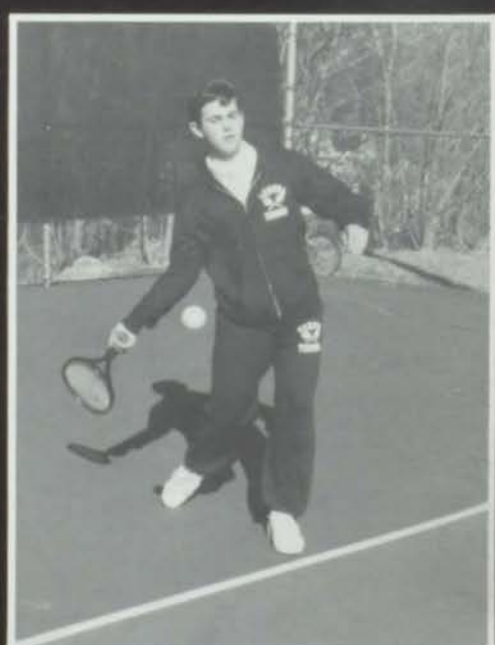

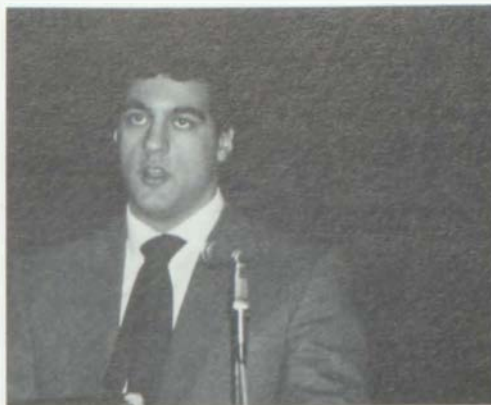

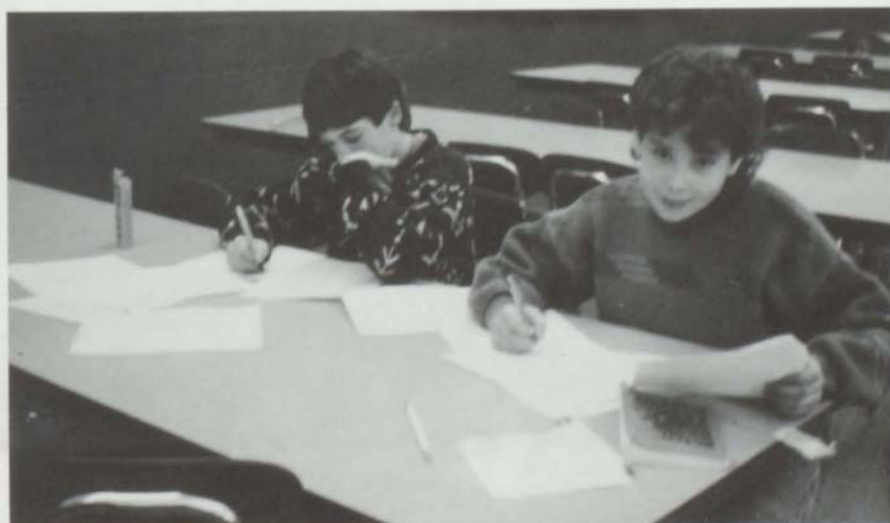
