






Dedication

With all the hopes for future years we turn and face the horizon, over which lies our destiny.




National Honor Society

Twenty seniors were inducted into the Waldwick High School's first National Honor Society in an impressive ceremony in December, 1965. The ceremony began a tradition in the school.






Basketball

Coach Lioacono wasted no time in getting the team into full swing, and brought them through a rough season with flying colors.




