Wayne Hills Shopping Mall Gets Approval

WAYNE — Location of all buildings and appearances of all was granted the Wayne Hills Shopping Mall on Monday night. The Wayne Planning Board put the stamp of approval on the appearance of the Meyer Brothers and K-Mart buildings while approving the location of 25 others. The newest shopping center in Wayne will be located on Berdan Avenue and Hamburg Turnpike. The center will have access the Church Lane by way of an extension which will run from Hamburg Turnpike to Barbour's Pond.

Experts for the builder A.L. Levine of Paterson said they will be ready to begin construction on April 1 if all approvals are granted. The location of K-Mart, a discount type department store, was changed a distance of 5 feet in order to bring Church Lane Extension through. The interior traffic flow will be settled at future meetings.

The new shopping complex will feature in addition to the Meyer Brothers and K-Mart stores, a bank, a savings and loan association and specialty stores. According to testimony at the hearing, there will be no more than one store of any type in the center.

The center will feature an interior mall extending outward from the Meyer Brothers store and including specialty stores and boutiques. The Paterson Meyer Brothers will continue in operation.

Discussion of the basic designs of the stores was put off to another meeting. Experts for the complex will meet with the Planning Board in conference before another public meeting is held. The next public meeting on the application is scheduled for February 24.

Action on a revised site plan for Hartz Mountain was carried when Mayor Miller noted that the new location of the roadway will place two thirds of the road in Totowa Borough and one third in Wayne. The road will cross Singac Brook and the applicant is to present plans to the township on the new location.

The driveway leading into the property was originally located adjacent to the railroad but it was

moved 450 feet south to tie into Jackson Road. A motion to deny the relocated driveway was withdrawn in favor of a motion to carry. Mayor Miller told the applicant that if a certificate of occupancy is denied the township would be tied up on any action of the West Belt Highway.

Revised plans for landscaping at the Prospect Park Bank were approved by the Planning Board when Planner Don Giles told the Board that the Department of Parks and Forestry had approved new plans for parking islands.

Roof structures for a warehouse and office building for Ottagari Company were approved. The building, located at Hanes and Edison Drives will have all roof structures screened.

Landscape plans for the Ramapo Bank on Willowbrook Boulevard were also approved. Lighting plans for Singer-General Precision on Totowa Road were approved with the stipulation that the mercury vapor lights are to be directed downward in order not to disturb neighbors.

Williamson, Manager, Is Dead

WAYNE — Funeral services were held for W. T. "Pete" Williamson of 15-20 Pollitt Drive, former borough manager, who died Wednesday at St. Joseph's Hospital, Paterson, after being stricken at home.

Mr. Williamson served as borough manager from 1953 to 1960. He later worked as a researcher for the United States Chamber of Commerce before being appointed business administrator in Wayne in 1970. He resigned in March 1971.

Born in Raleigh, N.C., he lived in East Detroit, Mich., before moving here 18 years ago. He belonged to the Van Riper-Ellis Memorial Church.

Surviving are his wife, the former Elizabeth Munn, a son, Michael A. of Binghamton, N.Y.; three daughters, Mrs. James (Barbara) Parrish of Ringwood, Miss Nancy and Miss Terry, both at home; a sister, Mrs. N. M. Jackson of Raleigh and four grandchildren.

Waks Wants to Preserve High Mountain Park

WAYNE — Declaring "We're going to develop ourselves right out of existence" Fifth Ward Councilman David Waks yesterday detailed some of his reasons for proposing the filing of applications for state and federal funds for the acquisition of 765 acres of High Mountain.

Waks said he wanted the application procured so "we can be assured of a number to get in line for these funds for the preservation of High Mountain, whatever the acreage finally determined by the Council".

GREEN ACRES FUNDS

"Since the administration has

not seen fit to file the application for state Green Acres funds, in order that we not be left out in the cold the steps taken on Wednesday were necessary," Waks said.

The new, energetic councilman stated his strong belief that preservation of at least some portion of at least some portion of High Mountain is a necessity, and said he selected the 765 acre figure as that is the area currently zoned residential. "It is topographically unsuited for residences" Waks said, going on to cite the enormous flooding and drainage problems which would occur should High Mountain be developed. "It would primarily affect

the Singac Brook, but ultimately create flooding problems in other areas".

Another reason for Waks' desire to eliminate the residential area proposed for the site is the large numbers of school children the proposal would bring in. "Residential zoning is a negative factor" Waks said, pointing out that in addition to increased school costs, the township would have to provide roads, water, sewers and police services.

NATURAL PRESERVE

Waks envisions the High Mountain Park as a passive, natural preserve with nature trails and perhaps some picnic tables.

At Wednesday's Council meeting, President Thomas Rumana attempted to amend Waks' motion to 265 acres, but this was defeated on a party line vote by Democrats Thomas Elm, Walter Jasinski, James Mingo, Estelle Perry and Waks opposed. Rumana cast the sole dissenting vote on the 765 acres, but said he would sign the application at the wish of the Council, as Mayor Newton Miller has refused to do so.

Policeman Is Injured

In an apparent shoplifting crime, a security guard at Bambergers in Willowbrook approached a man who was crossing the parking lot of the shopping center on foot with a woman's coat slung over his arm.

The guard James Pallouras, told police that he caught up to the suspect as he entered a parked car. When Pallouras attempted to question him and asked to see the receipt for the coat, the man cursed, slammed the car door closed and locked, then took off striking the guard with the door handle as he pulled away.

Pallouras suffered a minor injury to his hand. The police have broadcast an alarm for the assailant.

WAYNE — A house fire was reported at the home of Charles God, 27 Maple Street, this Monday, January 23. Mrs. God said that she didn't know what happened but that the house "was filled up with smoke."

Firemen from three companies reported to the alarm and found that a malfunctioning heating unit was apparently responsible for the smoke. The unit was shut down and the men worked to clear the house of the heavy smoke. There was no damage to the home other than what was caused by the smoke.

Also on Monday a stalled vehical on Route 23, south of the Black Oak Ridge Circle, triggered a chain reaction accident that resulted in the injury of one person and involved five cars.

Driver number 3 in the pile up, Manuel Perez, of Rosell Park was injured in the incident and was taken to Chilton Memorial Hospital by the Wayne Ambulance Squad. He suffered back and neck injuries.

The other drivers involved in the accident were Robert Alcorn, of Newfoundland; James Ayres, of Pompton Plains; Francis Erdman, Butler and Stanley Kling of Newfoundland.

Purse snatching and stolen wallet reports were received by Police in two separate incidents, both within two hour period.

The first report was from Mrs. Marie Lonati, of Valley Road who said that two boys were admitted into the house by her son when they claimed they were selling newspapers. When the boys left the house Mrs. Lonati discovered that her wallet was missing from her purse which had been sitting in the room. She said the wallet contained \$3.50 and some other valuable papers.

The second report was made by Mrs. Patricia Mudger, of Rose Terrace. She said that while she was bowling in a Hamburg Turnpike bowling academy a young girl approached her and asked directions to a bus stop. When the girl left Mrs. Mudger discovered that her purse was missing.

The purse contained about \$22. It was found a short time later in a nearby restaurant stuffed inside the water tank of a rest room toilet, the money gone.

Police are investigating both incidents. In the meantime keep an eye on your wallets.

Also on Monday an auto accident occured on Route 23, near Black Oak Ridge Road. Blamed as the cause of the incident were two dogs which according to the motorist were standing in the slow lane of the highway. In attempting to avoid hitting the animals the driver, Arthur Kistle, 27, of Belleview Ave., Butler, swerved, ran off the road and up an embankment. The car had to be towed away but there were not injuries.

Early Tuesday morning the Police desk received a report of a stolen vehical which was recovered later that day in Paterson. Owner of the car, Steve Haggerty of Cosy Lake Road, Oak Ridge said the the car was stolen from the parking lot of his restaurant on Route 23.

The vehical was not damaged but the radio and tape deck were missing when the car was recovered.

Wayne Firemen were called out twice Tuesday. The first alarm was at the Garden Apartments on Atherton Court where Fire Company 4 quickly extinguished a small fire in the garages of the complex.

The second call was for a brush fire which was burning off of Meadow Road in the Mt. a View section of Wayne. Fire Companies 1 and 2 responded and quickly doused the flames. No damage was reported.

On Wednesday afternoon a police patrol unit which was checking the Saverses kService Station on Hamburg Turnpike found that coin box of the ice machine had been pried off and the the change was missing. It was not determined how much was gone from the box. The matter was turned over to the Detective Bureau.

Not a fire, but not a false alarm, three fire companies, a police unit and an ambulance were summoned to American Cyanamid on Berdan Ave., this Wednesday to aid a man who had suffered a fatal attack.

James Delaney, 45, of Lincoln Ave., Pompton Lakes was the man who suffered the attack. Delaney a telephone repairman, had been working at Cyanamid when the apparent coronary occured. He was pronounced dead at the scene.

SAVINGS ACCOUNT INTEREST TAXABLE?

QUESTION: Thrifty Thad has about \$10,000 in a savings account at his local bank. In 1971 the account earned a little over \$500 in interest, but Thad didn't withdraw any of the interest nor did he have the \$500 entered into his savings account passbook by the bank. Does Thad have to pay taxes on this additional \$500?

ANSWER: Yes, even though Thad never actually saw the \$500, he must declare it on his income tax return. The point is that even though he never physically received the money, he had a right to withdraw it at any time and that makes it taxable.

**75 Point Tax Rise
 Increased Sewer Rates Expected**

WAYNE — In the face of a projected 50-point tax rise for municipal purposes, plus an approximate 25 for schools, Wayne residents will be hit with still another increase, that of the sewer fees.

If approved on second reading, rates for residential sewers will clumb from the present \$54 to \$75

per year. The ordinance represents a flat rate and separates the commercial establishments from residences.

Township Business Administrator Kenneth Mahony said the increase represents "the smallest possible operating margin" and that \$300,000 has to be raised for the utility in 1972.

Although the vote was wary and reluctant in some cases, and opposed by Councilmen Thomas Elm, Walter Jasinski and James Mingo, the introduction of the ordinance providing for the increase was approved 5-3. Councilman Harry Rudiger was absent. Councilman Leonard Pine, in moving for the introduction, said he was convinced the sewer utility "is in serious trouble" and saw the increase as a stop gap for two years.

The strongest opposition to the proposal came from Second Ward Councilman Thomas Elm, who deplored the depletion of the \$300,000 surplus which existed in 1969. "Why are we running into such a deficit?" he asked.

President Thomas Rumana took exception to Elm's remarks, noting that it would be politically astute to oppose the change as increased costs of government are never popular.

Rumana went on to cite the \$3 million Mountain View Sewer Treatment ordained in 1970, the \$4.8 million expansion necessary for the General Hospital and the new infiltration abatement program. "Eventually we have to pay for it" Rumana said.

Jasinski said he favored smaller annual increases, but Mayor Newton Miller warned that past history has shown the Council hesitant to approve such action in an election year.

While Pine favored an investigation of incorporating the sewer rates in the tax bills, Rumana opposed this as unfair to those residents not using the sewers.

Warm Waters

Willowbrook Ministries To Offer Three Courses

WAYNE — The Willowbrook Ministries, an inter-religious ministry in the market-place, is offering three courses in adult education for the Spring Term 1972. The series is geared to those who are interested in a deeper level of study for the enrichment of their own lives and yet who are not interested in a degree granting or long term program of study.

The courses being offered are as follows:

AMERICAN SOCIETY AND RELIGION — A lecture-seminar series in which religion will be studied in light of the American Culture. The course will focus on the three religions: Protestant, Catholic and Jew and their impact and interaction on society and culture. The course will conclude with an analysis of the contemporary situation as to what is happening to religion in America. The instructor will be Dr. Will Herberg, Professor of Philosophy and Culture in the Graduate School of Drew University. He is well known as a lecturer and writer in the areas where religion, philosophy and the social sciences overlap. He holds the B.A., M.A., and Ph.D. Degrees from Columbia University and a number of honorary degrees from Park College, Ohio Wesleyan University and Franklin and Marshall College. He is the author of: *Judaism and Modern Man*, *The Writings of Martin Buber*, and *Four Existential Theologians*. His most popular book is *Protestant - Catholic - Jew*.

MARRIAGE ENRICHMENT

Beryl Paul Speaks

WAYNE — Wayne School Board candidate, Beryl Paul, has missed but two public board meetings in the past six years. As an actively involved follower of all educational events in Wayne, she has observed that a lack of coordination and communication between the public and the educational happenings have been a hindrance in recent years.

According to Mrs. Paul, it is the responsibility of the board to see that information is conveyed to the public so that residents do not relinquish their voting rights because they lack sufficient knowledge on important, but lightly publicized issues. Board meetings are open to the public on the second Thursday of every month. Residents who attend are exposed to presentations of new educational programs being offered to their children, as well as educational opportunities in which they could participate. Mrs. Paul encourages residents to attend these public meetings and exercise their right to express their views.

To eliminate polarization within township departments, she proposed better co-ordination between school-sponsored activities and those sponsored by the recreation department. In this way, the activities schedules would not conflict and recreational activities would operate on a more unified, townwide basis.

LAB — Beginning with the conviction that marriage is the most intimate personal relationship of life, this seminar is offered as a means of enriching "good" marriages and for fulfilling the desire for greater satisfaction. The sessions will be oriented to the experiences of each couple. It is called a lab because each couple brings the necessary ingredients from their own relationships to make it function. The major approach is not a series of lectures, but a process whereby the husband and wife are encouraged to communicate and share with one another. A couple only shares with the group what they feel comfortable in sharing. The seminar will include expression of feelings, constructive resolution of tension and conflict, ways to improve communication and listening, building on marriage strengths and some goal setting. It is not intended for marriages with deep problems since the program is not designed for counseling or psychotherapy. The leaders will be Dr. and Mrs. Arthur O. VanEck who have been involved in the Human Potential Movement both as participants and facilitators. Together they have conducted twelve to fifteen such seminars or labs in the past eighteen months. Both are members of the Association of Religion and Applied Behavioral Sci-

ences. A graduate of Hope College and Western Theological Seminary, Dr. VanEck holds his doctorate from Columbia University. He is currently serving as Executive Secretary for Church Life and Mission for the Reformed Church in America.

THE EXPERIENCE OF BLACK THEOLOGY AS A LIBERATION THEME — A series of seminars designed to clarify and to interpret the Black experience in America as it is reflected in the themes of: Black Empowerment and Black Theology. The concepts of Black Theology and Black Empowerment will be examined in relation to the major Old Testament themes of: the Creation Event, the Covenant Event and the Exodus Event. The instructor will be the Reverend Bill Mason, who is a graduate of Temple University and holds the Masters degree in Religious Education from New York Theological Seminary. He is currently the Minister of Celebration and Social Concern for the Paterson Protestant Parish in Paterson, New Jersey. In addition, he is teaching on the faculties of: William Paterson College in Wayne and the New York Theological Seminary. He was recently elected President of the Board of the Paterson Task Force for Community Action, a \$2.5 million anti-

Joe Marino Is Concerned Over School Drug Problems

WAYNE — Joe Marino, candidate for the Board of Education, is deeply concerned about the drug problem in our schools. Even though he finds an improvement in this problem, it is his belief that a full curriculum on drug abuse should be initiated on all levels of education. He said, "I am aware of the many attempts that have been made in drug educational programs throughout the country, programs ranging from a concentration on mere factual presentation to threatening and scare-type approaches. Result — disappointing to say the least. Drug abuse is an act, a behavior, and as such should be fully investigated and understood by the students. Therefore, it should be directed in an educational approach. A student must have identity, he must have a feeling of a purpose in life, and he must know how to relate to other people in society. This, then, is the rationale for the behavioral procedure to drug education."

In the past, Mr. Marino has been active in activities related to the drug problem and has been instrumental in initiating drug programs. This is one of the many programs that he would like to see initiated if he is elected to the Board of Education on Feb. 8.

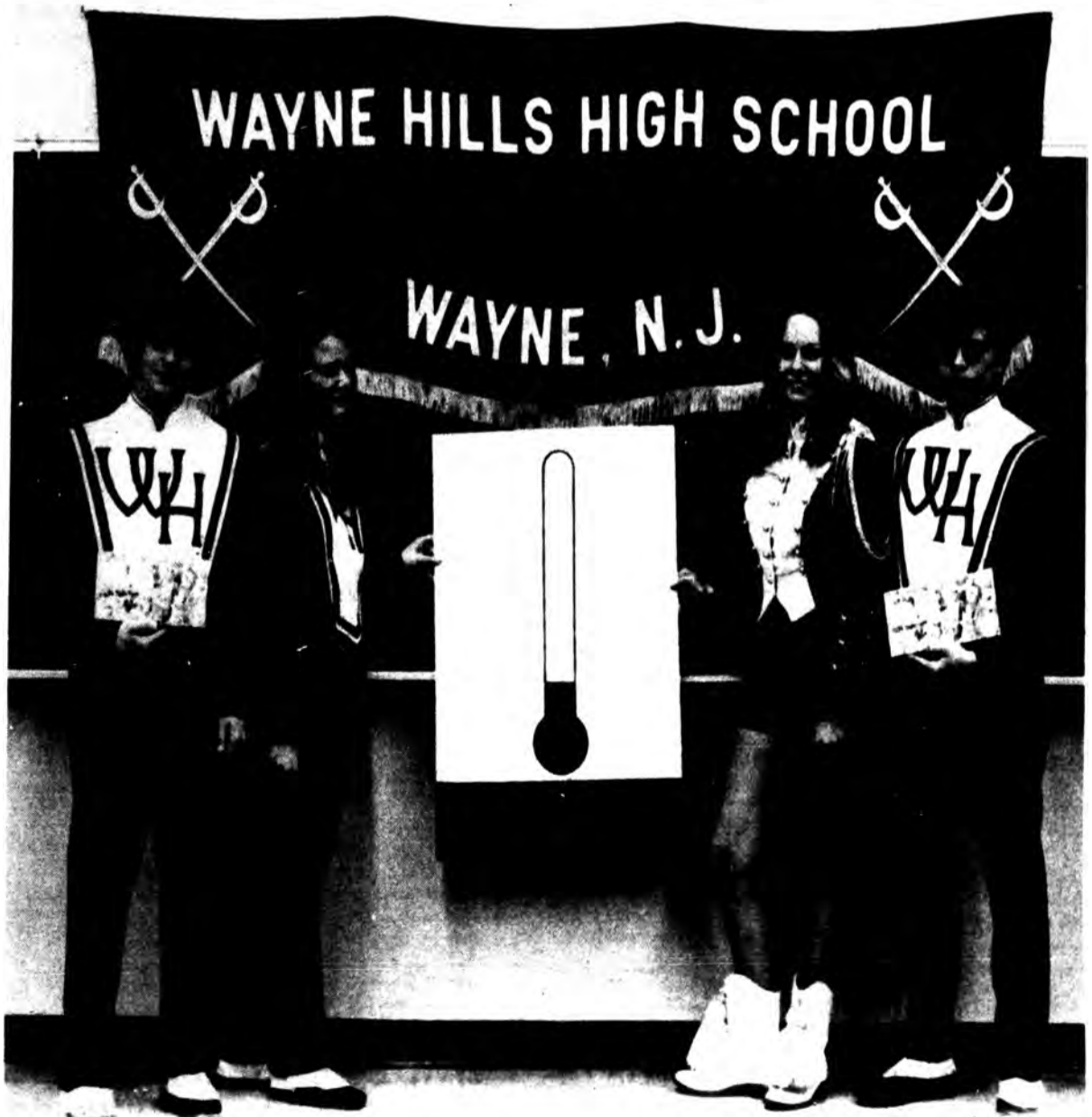
Joe resides at 556 Terhune Drive with his wife, Ruth, a teach-

Word of Caution

Surprisingly, the few residents who spoke at the public hearing on the school budget did not condemn the \$1.4 million increase but some questioned the disparity between sums allotted for salaries and those for teaching supplies and equipment. While teachers salaries are increased by \$735,000, the increase for teaching supplies is only \$21,000. And there may be further increases due the teachers as a result of the fact-finding being conducted now.

We would extend a word of caution to the leadership of the local teachers' group. More and more discontent is being voiced around the community with respect to the salary demands and the attitudes exhibited by the WEA negotiating team.

ANNUAL PROBLEM

Not too many years ago, school boards were faced with the annual problem of competing for teachers, as the colleges could scarcely keep up with demands. A growing community such as Wayne was caught in the spiral of building schools and hiring teachers for the 700 new students enrolling each year. This had ended.

The supply of teachers now exceeds the demand. Birth rates have declined. Enrollments have slowed down. Heads of families are out work. Raises have been frozen, and unlike the teachers, there will be no Washington order for the millions in business and industry who have raises due them. But the teachers' demands go on as though nothing has changed.

Wayne residents are facing gigantic tax increases due to the proposed municipal budget. An increase in the sewer rates appears a certainty, but the WEA leadership chooses to ignore these facts, continuing to insist upon unrealistic increases.

AN OBLIGATION

The Board of Education has taken heed of the economic factors and presented what they term a minimal budget, perhaps! But the school board has an obligation as yet unfulfilled, and that is to present the budget in understandable fashion to all the residents.

For the third time in as many years, former school trustee H. Robert Block has criticized the board for not having detailed copies of the budget available for the public. The board's excuse was that final details were being worked out the night before, even though the hearing had been scheduled for weeks.

It is recognized that a light vote will will enhance the passage of the budget, but it is our earnest hope the school board will make every effort to publicize the details of the budget and call attention to the Feb. 8 election.

Death Sentence?

The New Jersey State Supreme Court has set aside its death penalty. The Supreme Court of the United States has before it the abolition of the death penalty for all states. The proponents for its abolition claim it is "cruel and inhuman treatment under the Eight Amendment of the constitution."

But the real question at hand is does the death penalty deter first degree murder? The advocates for the death penalty cannot show that such a law permitting a state to legally take a life deters violent crime. It is this writer's opinion that the majority of violent acts which result in the death of an individual are not premeditated, but rather spontaneous acts of reflex violence. A person who plans a murder does so with the full belief that he is not going to get caught. A person who believes he will be caught will not perform the act. The death penalty—in the mind of the potential murderer—is nothing but an abstract concept which happens to other people. Ask any soldier who was in combat. He always believed physical harm or death was going to happen to the other 'guy'. When he believed it was going to happen to him, he became known as a victim of 'battle fatigue.' In the 1st World War this same casualty was known as 'shell shocked.'

ANSWER IS NO

So the question becomes "should any state have the right to legally take a life." And the answer is no, because it solves nothing. Two deaths do not equal one life.

Life in prison should be punishment enough. But the problem here is that life sentences have a way of being commuted to shorter terms with subsequent 'time-off' for good behavior. This is why the advocates of the death penalty object to life sentences. Perhaps the solution lies in the restructuring of the life sentence.

If we are to progress as human beings, then continual growth as individuals and as a nation is mandatory. For the purpose of civilization is to raise not only the standard of living, but the standard of living together. And murdering one another legally or illegally is not conducive to this objective.



Notes From A Friend

BEING A DEMOCRAT IN WAYNE . . . a couple of years ago was like being a Republican in the deep south during the '30's . . . you just didn't let anybody know your deep, dark secret. You automatically assumed that you candidate had one chance in a million of ever being elected if he were running for a local, rather than county, state or national office, and with a few notable exceptions, you were right.

You went on doggedly voting for your candidates believing that someday in the far, distant, dim future, you might get him elected. You went on faith, and little more. But after all, isn't it true that faith can move mountains?

Then a couple of years ago something new came over the Wayne horizon. It was a group of people, young for the most part, and new to Wayne. They determined to change the face of Wayne politics, but more important, they determined to change the image of the Democratic party from that of a loser to that of a winner.

They were pitifully few in number, without funds and without power. They had determination and the will to see their goals accomplished. They attended every meeting, took on any job, worked twice as hard and twice as much as anybody thought they should. They were labelled subversive and in some instances almost libelled; but they were persistent. In spite of everything, they stuck to their story . . . they were out to reform the party, regardless of personal attacks against any of them.

THE FIRST BIG VICTORY . . . came with a simple point . . . they got the right to have a written by-laws to govern their organization. In those by-laws they spelled out exactly what could be done and how it could be done. Armed with these rules, they continued to follow procedures that had been agreed upon by the membership.

An election came up. It was for the Wayne mayoralty. Three council-at-large seats were at stake also. The party screened candidates. Charges of favoritism were levelled against the reformers. They were charged with running things high-handedly to suit themselves. One of the most popular vote getters in the Democratic Party in Wayne decided to buck the organization.

The Republicans, in the meantime, were even more bitterly split than the Democrats. Here, too,

the most popular vote getter found himself on the outside looking in. The campaign was one of the most bitter in the history of Wayne and when the smoke of battle cleared, Wayne had elected its first Independent mayor and the G.O.P. swept all three council seats.

TO LESSER SOULS THE FUTURE WAS DIM . . . and even hopeless. Attempts were made to bring the dissident factions into the party. Charges were made that compromise was impossible . . . the reformers wanted everything and would give nothing. The split became more pronounced and irreconcilable.

A new election loomed. This time, all six ward seats were open. The badly split parties tried to bring their people together. The Democrats had everything to win and nothing to lose. Again, the campaign was waged. This time, a new factor entered the picture. In five of the six wards, Independents filed for seats. Clearcut victory for either major party seemed impossible.

Then, suddenly, it was election night. Of the six councilmen elected to office, five bore the Democratic label. Victory had been won, at last, and for the first time in a decade, Democrats would be the major party in Wayne. Hardly had the heady smoke of battle cleared than victory seemed to slip away. The party seemed doomed, once more to play a lesser role as rumors circulated of an agreement between the G.O.P. and a Democratic councilman.

Clearly, a bold step was called for and the Democratic Leader, John Mazzacca was ready to take it. In what was almost a mutual move, Mazzacca and his Republican counterpart Charlie Kabbash contacted each other. The two met and wrote out an agreement and Wayne woke to find itself ruled by a bi-partisan group of Democrats and Republicans. An agreement on municipal appointments covering the next two years was made. In some quarters, the agreement is looked upon as back room politics.

Mazzacca smiles and says nothing, except that he has accomplished his goal. Wayne will be the winner in any agreement with the G.O.P., he says, and both parties will be strengthened as a result. More importantly to Mazzacca, his little band of reformers is firmly entrenched in the party. The reform has taken.

No Decision On Tallow Paterson Works Property

WAYNE — The Town Council has deferred action on a proposal to buy 5.75 acres of land for park purposes, pending receipt of a complete capital works program for the coming year.

The land in question is the former site of the controversial Paterson Tallow Works, adjacent to the Little League ballfield and the Board of Education property, once the site of the Dotterweich farm.

Assistant Township Counsel Robert Moraff reported to the Council on Wednesday that a negotiated price of \$109,000 has been achieved, and asked direction from the governing body.

Councilman Walter Jasinski, declaring "this is a bad year", immediately moved for denial, saying "this must not go through now, if ever". Jasinski pointed to the anticipated 50 point tax rise for municipal purposes, adding "This land is being sold at \$19,000 per acre, while it is evaluated at \$10,000." There was no second to Jasinski's motion for denial.

Joining Jasinski, Councilman James Mingo disputed the negotiated price, noting the assessment for the land is \$65,000. "This is much closer to the real price than either the appraised or negotiated price."

While Mayor Newton Miller said he "doesn't go for postage stamp parks" he recommended Council approval of the purchase as it "rounds out" the Township-owned land in the area. Miller noted that if money were the

problem, he would recommend taking five acres from the anticipated High Mountain purchase instead.

Councilman Leonard Pine, often at odds with the Mayor, declared he agreed with the Mayor's logic, noting the owners of the property "have been bounced around for a number of years". "The Town couldn't wait to get rid of the Tallow Works, and it finally burned down." Pine said following the fire, the owners of the land tried to obtain approval for the construction of townhouses, and

then for garden apartments, both rejected by the Council. Admitting the property presents a topographical problem, Pine also noted the land is "in the middle of park and school property. They just might beat us in court." Pine further stated his belief that the Township has an obligation to those who have been paying taxes for years.

The motion to carry was made by Councilman Estelle Perry and passed 7-1 with Pine opposed and Councilman Rudiger absent.

Troubled Intersections To Undergo Improvements

WAYNE — The long-awaited traffic improvements at four major trouble spots were launched by the Township Council on Wednesday night through the adoption of a resolution providing for the work to be done by the state.

Control devices, road widening and improvement of channelization are scheduled for the following intersections: Riverview Drive, Totowa Road, French Hill and Valley Roads; Hamburg Turnpike and Black Oak Ridge Road; Alps and Ratzler Roads; and Hamburg Turnpike, Pompton and Ratzler Roads.

The total cost for the projects will be borne by the state and Federal governments. Following receipt of the council approval, the contracts will be given to con-

sulting engineers hired by the state, who will do the final design work, obtain easements, prepare the bids, and perform all other functions necessary for completion. "We will not be involved at all" Business Administrator Kenneth Mahony told the Town Council on Wednesday, adding that the work must be under contract by June 1, or New Jersey will have to forfeit all the Federal funds allocated for the highway projects.

Mahony said yesterday the funds were made available through the TOPICS program instituted in 1970. According to Mahony, \$7.5 million in Federal Highway funds were diverted into the TOPICS program by Governor Cahill for improvement of such traffic problems.

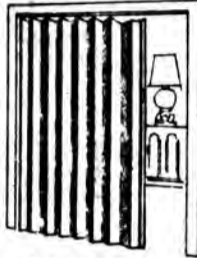

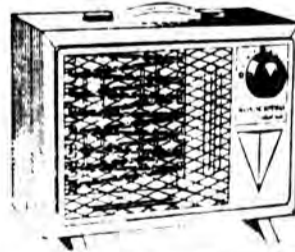

Spanish Fluency Opens Many Job Doors

J. T. of ...
Dear J. T.: Most jobs available to persons fluent in Spanish fall into two broad

categories: 1) those in which knowledge of the language is the primary job skill, and 2) those in which Spanish is used but is secondary to other occupational specialties. The first category includes

jobs for teachers, translators, and interpreters. Requirements vary. For example, elementary and secondary teachers in public schools must generally have at least a bachelor's degree and required courses in education. Teachers at the college level generally need advanced degrees. Interpreters and translators may need to know more than one foreign language. At the United Nations, for example, they must know at least three of the five official languages: English, French, Spanish, Russian and Chinese.

A wide variety of possibilities exist for persons who wish to combine fluency in Spanish with other occupational skills. For example, the federal government and some private companies offer positions in Spanish-speaking countries. Such jobs may be in professional,

technical, managerial, skilled, secretarial or sales fields.

At home, fluency in Spanish may be an asset in jobs requiring contact with Spanish-speaking people. Again, such jobs vary greatly. A few possibilities are professional health occupations, restaurant jobs and social work.

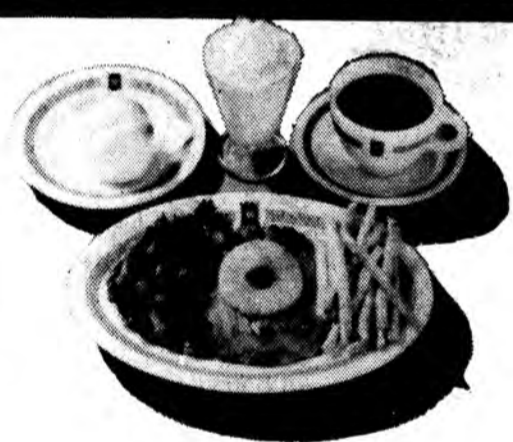
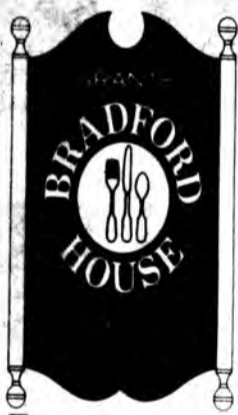

DO-IT-YOURSELF

You Can Install New Light Fixtures

By **MR. FIX**

Light fixtures don't wear out, they just become outdated. With a room newly decorated an old fixture that goes back 10 or 20 years may be something of an eyesore.

No matter what the fashion in light fixtures, they are installed pretty much as the older ones were. If you are simply replacing an old fixture with a new one there is no reason for not doing the job yourself. The wires and the outlet box are already there.

Rule one, always, is to make certain the power is off. Turn off the main switch for that circuit or remove the fuse.

Sometimes an outlet box

may also have been used as a junction box for other wires. So it's best to play safe.

Your new fixture already has a pair of wires attached to it that you connect to the two wires in the box. But before you disconnect the old fixture and try to hook up the new one determine how it will be mounted.

Loosen the old fixture and see how it was mounted and what hardware you might need for the new fixture.

The simplest fixtures, the kind found in basements, bathrooms and kitchens, are usually held to the outlet box with a pair of screws.

There will be round holes with narrower slots to the side. This allows you to slip the base over the heads of

the bolts and then hold it in place by twisting it slightly so that the bolts go through the narrow slots which the heads cannot go through.

Another type of fixture mounts on a metal strap that is in turn mounted on the box. There are threaded holes in the strap through which you run machine screws that hold the base in place.

In the most elaborate mounting a nipple or threaded pipe passes through a threaded hole in the metal strap. The wires pass through this to the fixture. The pipe passes through the base of the fixture. A threaded fitting tightens the base in place.

Making the connection is a matter of fastening white



wire to white, black to black. If there is a red wire in the box, connect it to the black wire in the fixture.

Connection is made with solderless connectors, sometimes supplied. These are fittings, plastic on the outside and threaded brass on the inside. The two bared wires are inserted in the connector and the connector is then twisted in a clockwise direction. Twist the two wires before inserting. The connector will lock the two wires together.

Once the connections have been made, fold the wires carefully back into the box so that the fixture can be fastened to the box.

No Good Way To Grow New Hair

By Lawrence Lamb, M.D.

Dear Dr. Lamb—How does a man go about growing hair on his body? Some of my friends and I are hairless, but not hopeless. We have heard that using special creams, cheeses and even eating certain herbs will produce a massive crop of hair. Our problem is that no one seems to know the complete procedure. We would like your advice. We are all in our 20s or 30s so we can't expect nature to do too much more on its own.

Dear Reader—I presume your main concern is hair on your head. The simple truth is there is no good way to grow hair on the head

when you have your problem. There are a large number of men who have baldness very early in life. The claims for special creams, cheeses, foods and any number of other claims are not successful. About the only thing they will do is cost you money. I have yet to see a bona fide, successful way of growing hair on a bald head. My best advice to you would be not to be taken in by any charlatan putting out false advertisement with such claims.

There have been a few reports of producing a few scraggly hairs on the top of the head by application of cream containing testoste-

rone, the male hormone. This has not been sufficiently successful to suggest it to anyone for practical application. In fact, most people feel that testosterone is a significant factor in inducing baldness. At least you might as well adopt this explanation and claim to have a high level of virility.

Transplants of hair follicles to the scalp have been done. This is a long, time-consuming project where hair follicles may be transplanted from the chest to the scalp. This assumes that one has hair on the chest to transplant.

Another approach has been to place underneath the scalp a synthetic or plastic type material with little attachments that stick through the skin which enables one to anchor a hair piece down solidly. Such a hair piece can be worn while swimming or engaging in any other activity and look like a normal

head of hair. This procedure is very expensive and I suspect there are only a few places where you could have it done safely.

My best advice is to learn to enjoy it. Just think of all the problems you have escaped. If you are disturbed because of the present emphasis on hair, maybe you should think about starting a new style. Yul Brynner did it in a rather big and finan-

cially successful way.

I would like to add that if and when someone is successful in correcting baldness, it is going to be a very well-known achievement and you won't have to ask where to go to get it done. Men and some women have been searching for cures for baldness for generations.

Answers to Employment Questions by Secretary of Labor James D. Hodgson

Spanish Fluency Opens Many Job Doors

J. T. of Joplin, Mo., asks: "What types of jobs are available to people who are fluent in Spanish?"

Dear J. T.: Most jobs available to persons fluent in Spanish fall into two broad categories: 1) those in which knowledge of the language is the primary job skill, and 2) those in which Spanish is used but is secondary to other occupational specialties.

The first category includes jobs for teachers, translators, and interpreters. Requirements vary. For example, elementary and secondary teachers in public schools must generally have at least a bachelor's degree and required courses in education. Teachers at the col-

lege-level generally need advanced degrees. Interpreters and translators may need to know more than one foreign language. At the United Nations, for example, they must know at least three of the five official languages: English, French, Spanish, Russian and Chinese.

A wide variety of possibilities exist for persons who wish to combine fluency in Spanish with other occupational skills. For example, the federal government and some private companies offer positions in Spanish-speaking countries. Such jobs may be in professional, technical, managerial, skilled, secretarial or sales fields.

At home, fluency in Spanish may be an asset in jobs requiring contact with Spanish-speaking people. Again, such jobs vary greatly. A few possibilities are professional health occupations, restaurant jobs and social work.

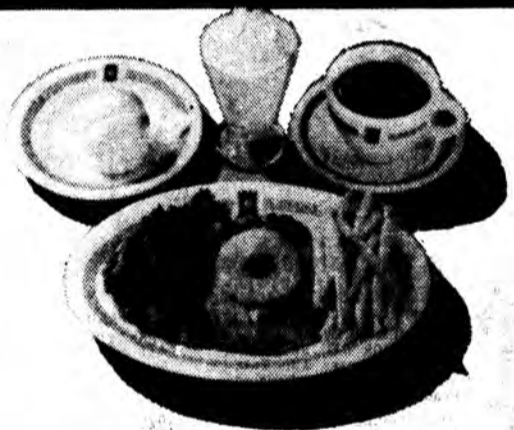

WORLD OF WORK

H. W. of Richmond, Va., writes: After taking a test to qualify for a switchboard operator position, I was complimented by the firm's personnel manager on my high score and other qualifications for the job. Naturally, I was puzzled when the younger girl got the job. The manager admitted that while the younger girl had not scored as high on the test and had less experience, she was hired because of his firm's unpleasant experience involving high absenteeism among older employees. Can the age discrimination law protect me from such treatment? I am 52.

Dear M. W.: Many employers found violating the Age Discrimination in Employment Act justify their actions with outdated myths concerning the work habits of older people. However, employment studies show that older workers' are less prone to change jobs; output of older persons in production jobs compares favorably with that of younger workers; in office jobs, there are minimal differences in output; and learning ability does not decline significantly with age. Armed with these facts, the Department of Labor is attempting to remove prejudices against older workers through enforcement of the age discrimination law. To find out how the law applies to your case, contact the Wage-Hour office in Richmond.

Classified Advertising is your biggest bargain, giving you a receptive audience for employment, homes, automobiles — almost all products and services.

**IT'S WHAT YOU SAY AND
HOW YOU SAY IT**

Copy is the vehicle by which you communicate with your prospect. The right choice of words can encourage, stimulate, and entice a reader right on the spot. Every ad should:

- 1—Attract Attention
- 2—Arouse Interest
- 3—Create Desire
- 4—Inspire Confidence
- 5—Induce Action

Be concise—Don't waste words. Be brief and to the point in your description, but do.

Be exact—the abbreviation which may save lines and money is often unreadable and discourages your prospect before he has a chance to find out what you have to offer.

Be convincing—Your accurate and honest description, without trite cliches, goes a long way toward making the reader believe in you and in what you're trying to sell.

Tell the whole story—Give the reader as much information as possible. List the outstanding features and advantages and identify yourself. If you offer cash discounts or any other purchase terms, include such information in your ad.

In copywriting for Classified ads, choose words carefully and make each one do a selling job. One story, destined to become a legend in Classified copy writing concerns a woman whose ad for Siamese kittens ran for days on end, with no results at all. Two words brought an avalanche of calls. She simply changed her copy to read "Box Trained." That's an advantage, a selling point, the small-but-mighty difference between making a sale and not making a sale.

Finally, use this checklist before you release any ad.

1. Is the copy complete?
How many benefits have you listed?
(The one you omit might be the sales point)
2. Is the ad accurate?
3. Use as few abbreviations as possible.
4. Have you identified yourself?
5. Can your prospect get in touch with you?
(Make appointment details clear)
6. Do you mention price, if possible?
7. Have you invited him to see and buy?

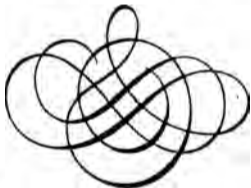

how to make your classified advertising more effective

Classified Advertising is your biggest bargain, giving you a receptive audience for employment, homes, automobiles — almost all products and services.

IT'S WHAT YOU SAY AND HOW YOU SAY IT

Copy is the vehicle by which you communicate with your prospect. The right choice of words can encourage, stimulate, and entice a reader right on the spot. Every ad should:

- 1—Attract Attention
- 2—Arouse Interest
- 3—Create Desire
- 4—Inspire Confidence
- 5—Induce Action

Be concise—Don't waste words. Be brief and to the point in your description, but do.

Be exact—the abbreviation which may save lines and money is often unreadable and discourages your prospect before he has a chance to find out what you have to offer.

Be convincing—Your accurate and honest description, without trite cliches, goes a long way toward making the reader believe in you and in what you're trying to sell.

Tell the whole story—Give the reader as much information as possible. List the outstanding features and advantages and identify yourself. If you offer cash discounts or any other purchase terms, include such information in your ad.

In copywriting for Classified ads, choose words carefully and make each one do a selling job. One story, destined to become a legend in Classified copy writing concerns a woman whose ad for Siamese kittens ran for days on end, with no results at all. Two words brought an avalanche of calls. She simply changed her copy to read "Box Trained." That's an advantage, a selling point, the small-but-mighty difference between making a sale and not making a sale.

Finally, use this checklist before you release any ad.

1. Is the copy complete?
How many benefits have you listed?
(The one you omit might be the sales point)
2. Is the ad accurate?
3. Use as few abbreviations as possible.
4. Have you identified yourself?
5. Can your prospect get in touch with you?
(Make appointment details clear)
6. Do you mention price, if possible?
7. Have you invited him to see and buy?

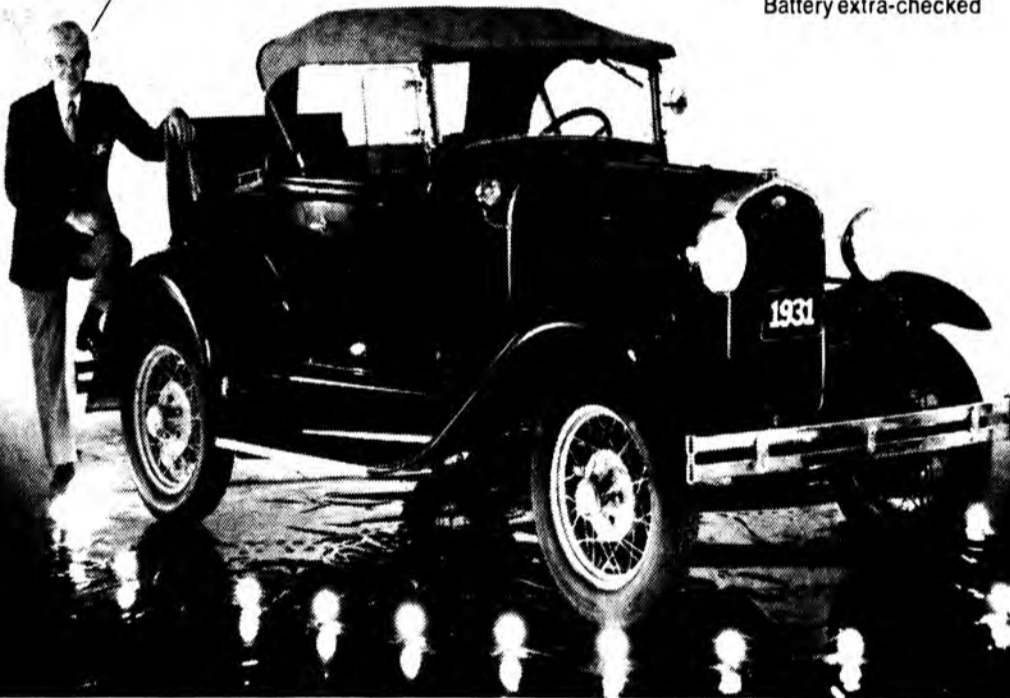

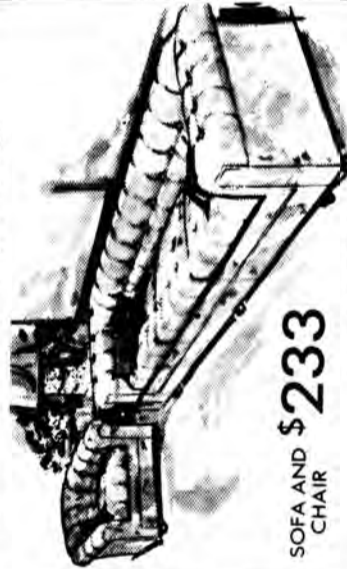

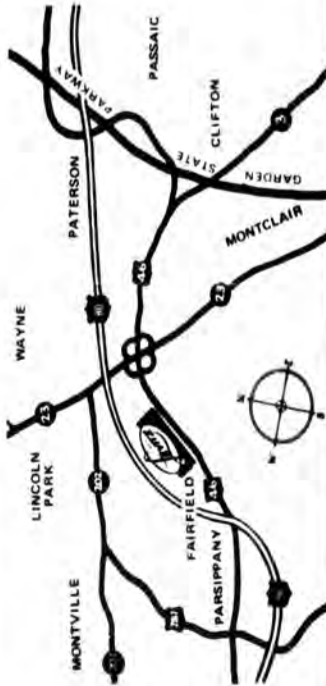

Have a Heart--- No Cold Shower

By DON OAKLEY

A heart specialist has thrown cold water on the idea of cold showers as a health tonic.

Especially after exercise, cold showers can trigger heart attacks, says Dr. Roderick W. Childers, associate professor in—take a deep breath—the Cardiology Section of the Department of Medicine in the Division of Biological Sciences and the Pritzker School of Medicine at the University of Chicago.

"Cold showers cause rapid changes within the body," he explains. "The blood vessels near the surface contract to reduce the amount of heat being lost through the body's surface. Soon afterwards, the pulse rate increases. Meanwhile, the blood pressure is sharply elevated. This results in an increased work load for the heart."

Although there is no data to prove a cause-and-effect relationship, Childers notes that Scandinavian countries, where taking cold showers and ending a hot sauna bath with a plunge in the snow are popular, have the highest coronary death rates in the world.

But for those addicted to cold showers, he has one slightly cheering thought: If you survive the shower, you can be reasonably sure that your heart is in good shape.

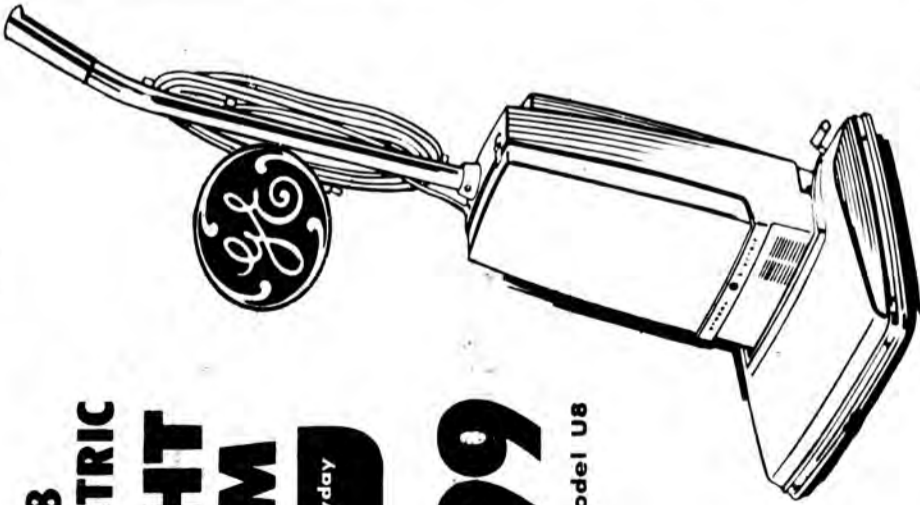

median length of time men work without interruption for the same employer is double that of women." (It's 4.8 years for men, half that for women.)

For reasons like this, and a variety of others, it's difficult to make exact comparisons. It's not easy to measure "equal" skill, effort and responsibility as applied to a given job and, Buckley points out, attempts to do so have produced various interpretations, in the courts and elsewhere. So it's a complex problem, maybe impossible, to determine how much of the disparity between men's and women's pay is due purely to sex discrimination.

There's no doubt in this author's mind, though, that there is such a thing. "Experience in implementing the Equal Pay Act," says Buckley, "indicates that some discriminatory practices do exist."

almost closed. For three classes of tabulating-machine operators, for instance, women were paid only 4, 5 or 6 per cent less than men in the same jobs—when both men and women were employed in the offices. In women-only offices, however, the women received 13, 14 and 16 per cent less than the average male wage.

It's fairly obvious why the gap tends to close in the coed offices. It's pretty hard for an employer to justify pay differences when men and women are working alongside each other at the same jobs. To pay the woman less is almost like hanging a sign on her reading: "She gets less because she's a woman."

Economist Buckley does point out, though, that some legitimate factors—not simple discrimination—can explain why men's earnings may average out higher in statistical surveys.

Job tenure, for one, isn't taken into account when the calculators simply add up pay check figures. Higher pay because of length-of-service increases is more likely to be enjoyed by men because, says Buckley, "the

A study of the Bureau of Labor Statistics — which confirms the frequent distaff complaint: That in general men are paid more than women for doing the same job—shows that there's less disparity in pay when men and women are working alongside each other.

The pay gap is widest "when earnings of men in firms that employ only men are compared with the earnings of women in firms that employ only women," reports BLS economist John E. Buckley in the Monthly Labor Review.

Women payroll clerks, for example, earn \$1,040 more a year, on an average, when working in an establishment that employs both men and women. Average weekly earnings in women-only offices were \$108. In offices where both men and women were employed, weekly pay averaged \$128.

That still left the women underpaid by 13 to 25 per cent, compared to the earnings of male payroll clerks, but in other jobs the gap

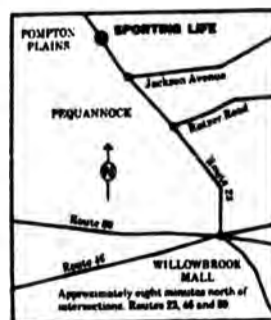

Dilution of No-Fault Benefits

The concept of no-fault insurance is fairly simple. If you're injured you don't have to go to court to prove that somebody else was at fault, so you can collect from him—that is, from his insurance company. Regardless of whose fault the accident was, your insurance company takes care of your medical bills and other economic losses, in the usual case.

Under our present go-to-court-to-collect system, most accident victims bear a good share of the losses they suffer. The average injured person, according to a definitive federal study, bears 57 per cent of the cost of the injuries. The average economic loss in permanent disability cases was put at \$78,000; the average collected is \$12,556.

Many legal authorities, economists and insurance executives maintain that no-fault insurance is a better way to do it. (The American

Insurance Association, speaking for many of the major auto underwriters, has been a pioneer supporter.) Yet the concept can't seem to make it in the state legislatures. It was either rejected, or simply buried, in 30 states last year. Why?

The most vocal and most powerful opposition to no-fault insurance has come from the American Trial Lawyers Association. It's understandable. A study by the Federal Judicial Center of 220,000 auto injury cases in one year showed that lawyers collected in fees and expenses \$700 million—almost exactly the same amount as received by the accident victims. It's a billion-dollar-a-year business for personal injury lawyers.

Massachusetts, the first no-fault state, has seen insurance premiums reduced 42.6 per cent in a year. Fine for the motorist—but it's been a year of bleak depres-

sion for lawyers specializing in auto injury lawsuits. The current president of the Trial Lawyers' Association has said he was elected on a platform of opposing no-fault, and that's what he's going to do.

State legislatures are, of course, heavily larded with members of the legal profession. No-fault insurance was defeated in California, primarily by lawyer-legislators, even though the state bar association felt called upon to go on record pro-no-fault.


We foresee a dim future for no-fault insurance at the state-legislature level. In two or three states, it's been adroitly disposed of by passing bills labeled no-fault, which in fact invite just as many lawsuits as before. One top expert has predicted these bills will actually increase insurance costs.

The alternative is a uniform, federal no-fault plan for all states, as provided

for in the Magnuson-Hart bill now pending in the Senate. Again, there's powerful opposition: the considerable weight exerted by the trial lawyers' lobbying, plus an administration position that things like this ought to be left to the states to work out. (Like workmen's compensation laws, perhaps; it took 37 years to get them passed in all the states.)

There's likely to be a no-fault bill in your state legislature—again—during its next session. Will it be genuinely no-fault—or does it leave the doors as wide open as before to lawsuits and the adversary system? Find out, and let your representative know where you stand. Ask your U.S. senator for a copy of the Magnuson-Hart bill, and any relevant material he can send you. Then let your two senators know where you stand.

Or just do nothing. After all, it's your money.

Attitude at Home To GIs on Drugs?

By DON OAKLEY

A psychiatrist sent to Vietnam at the request of the Defense Department has come back with a disturbing report.

There is no social taboo against using heroin in the minds of U.S. troops in Vietnam, says Dr. Norman Zinberg of Clark University in Worcester, Mass. Because of this, he writes in "Behavior Today," a weekly newsletter of the behavioral sciences, the Army's "evangelical zeal" to wipe out the use of the drug has actually been counter-productive.

"Soldiers who don't leave Vietnam immediately often return to heroin," he says. "Mainlining (direct injection into a vein) has increased since the crackdown."

Contrary to the U.S. drug scene, says Zinberg, heroin use in Vietnam is a social activity among friends and not the habit of a deviant loner from a deprived urban background.

"The typical user would fit many people's idea of the healthy, all-around American boy. He is often from a small town in the Midwest or South, is in good physical condition, has used virtually no drugs before joining the Army, and shows no evidence of character disorder."

What happens when these healthy, all-around American boys return home to the small midwestern or southern towns where heroin use is not socially acceptable and where heroin can only be obtained illegally?

Zinberg calls for "reasonable social control rather than a frantic attempt to suppress the drug totally."

Which means more or less permanent maintenance of drug addicts by society. Whether in Vietnam or in the United States, it is not a prospect which calls for celebration.

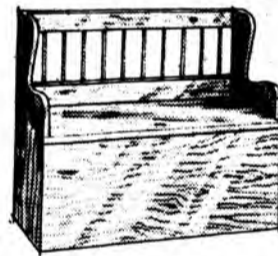

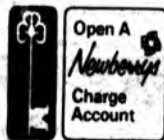

The Art of Buying Art

It has been repeatedly pointed out that investment in art can outperform (not to mention the bonus of pleasure) an investment in stocks and bonds. Fine. But can a person of modest means afford really first-rate, "investment-grade" art?

You probably wouldn't have bought Louis Valtat's "Children's Games" when the oil painting sold in Paris, about three years ago, for \$33,000. But a few weeks later you might have bought it at auction, in New York, a small Valtat drawing for \$50—and owned the work of a major artist.

The recent top price for an oil by Paul Signac was \$125,000. One of his drawings was auctioned, in a recent year, for \$64. An oil by Serusier sold in Geneva, three years ago, for \$20,930. Six months later one of his drawings went at auction for \$32, and a watercolor for \$220.

The examples are drawn from an extraordinary book,

just published: "Encyclopedia of Modern Art Auction Prices," by Michele Berard. The big atlas-size tome covers 282 artists—virtually every modern painter of any significance—listing the sale price of every piece of their art sold at auction between 1951 and 1969.

Mme. Berard, a young Parisienne who's as pretty as a picture herself, is an authority on modern art who counsels in a ny major collectors on what to buy, and for how much. Her answer to the question, "Is there a place in the average family's budget for investment-quality art?" is an emphatic "yes."

She begins with the thesis that almost any work by a major artist is going to appreciate in value. "The signature itself has value; even an inferior work is a fairly good investment." But, she goes on, you needn't be a collector of second- and third-rate work. Many fine works are to be found, at budget prices, among these artists' drawings and watercolors—and "a fine watercolor should always be preferred to a poor oil."

But how is the amateur to know which artists' works are "investments in a signature"—and how much to pay? Mme. Berard agrees

it's a major stumbling block. "It is too often ignorance of the financial value of paintings and fear of blundering that prevent the art lover from starting a collection."

A good deal of that ignorance and fear can be dispelled by browsing through the encyclopedia. There's an answer here to "which artists?" since each of the 282 listed, and given a short biography, is an important modern artist. And by scanning the year-by-year listings of sale prices, the beginner can get a feel for what a "right price" would be. More, he can see which painters have been increasing in popularity and demand, as their prices climb (or zoom) from year to year . . . and whose prices have leveled off, or started skidding.

While the encyclopedia is undoubtedly aimed at the serious collector's library, and the professional's desk, it can be highly educational for the amateur or beginner. Put in some study time here, and you can sally forth to the galleries and auctions with confidence in your ability to spot an investment.

Granted, at the publisher's price (Arco Publishing Co., N.Y., \$45), you'll probably head for the public library rather than the bookstore.

Exercises Lead to Shapely Legs

WEST MILFORD — Hot Pants haven't disappeared. They're just peeking out under skirts that open at the front or sides. And warm pants (the longer version) are still big on the scene. But you have got to be in your best fighting trim to wear them well.

If you already have shapely legs, count your blessings. If not, here are a few simple exercises that will help.

They're designed to slenderize your thighs, whittle away hip bulges—and they work. They're taken directly from the exercise curriculum of the famous Barbizon Modeling School.

If you're just a beginner, don't go overboard with these exercises all at once. Cultivating beauty of line requires gradual growth in muscle tone. Do each exercise for a count of eight to begin with and then increase each day until you reach 16.

SITTING HIP ROLL: This exercise is designed to whisk those unwanted inches off the lower hips and the area where hips and thighs meet. It's what the school calls a compression exercise because it utilizes the weight of your own body to compress and break down fatty tissue.

Sit on the floor, legs extended, knees straight. Roll over on your right hip as far as possible, maintaining balance by placing your right hand on the floor directly to the right of your hip. Do not place your hand behind your hips. Roll to the left side, placing your left hand directly to the left of the hip. Make sure you are sitting com-

pletely upright throughout the exercise and that you do the movements smoothly and slowly.

OUTER THIGH SCISSORS: Lie on your side, supporting your upper body on one elbow. Extend both legs together, slightly off the floor. Move legs in scissors motion, alternating one leg forward and one leg back. When you have finished, repeat the exercise on the opposite side.

INNER THIGH SCISSORS: This exercise is designed to tone muscles and get rid of fatty tissue on your inner thighs. Lie on your back with your arms extended to your sides. Extend both legs in the air straight above your hips. Open your legs to the sides and then cross them alternately in an open-and-close pattern, hitting your inner thighs together as you cross them.

FANNY THUMP: Sounds horrible, but it works. If you have a very firm, overmuscled hip development this exercise is for you. It goes right to the base of your figure problems. Lie flat on your back, arms outstretched at shoulder level, palms up, right leg stretched on the floor. Bend your left knee, bringing the foot close to your buttocks on the floor. Roll over on your right hip halfway between hip bone and spine. After you have located the fattest spot on your hip, raise the hip from the floor about two inches then return it to the floor with a thump on the fatty spot. Reverse the position of your legs, repeat the exercise on the fattest part of your left hip for the same number of times.



BODY BUILDER — Inside every woman is a more beautiful body waiting to get out? It's your body at its very best — the best weight for your body structure, the best possible muscle tone, the best clothes for your type of figure. One way to liberate you from the body you're stuck with now and get the beautiful one inside your mind's eye out where everyone else can see it is to exercise.

For a start, **GLAMOUR Magazine's** beauty editor suggests you start with this marvelous one for just about every part of you, especially your stomach, upper thighs and arms.

1. Lift yourself up, pushing with arms and legs.
2. From this position raise and lower right leg ten times without letting it touch the ground. Repeat with other leg.

1 (1 pound) can tomatoes
1 bay leaf

½ teaspoon oregano
2 tablespoons chopped canned green chiles*
1 cup canned pitted California ripe olives
½ lemon, thinly sliced

Preheat oven 350° degrees F. Season chicken with ½ teaspoon salt. Heat oil. Add chicken and brown slowly in oil. Peel onions. Cook onions in boiling water, covered, for 5 minutes. Drain well. Remove browned chicken pieces to baking dish. Pour all but 1 tablespoon oil from skillet in which chicken was browned. Add garlic and flour to remaining oil. Stir in tomatoes, bay leaf, oregano and remaining ½ teaspoon salt, and heat, stirring constantly, until mixture comes to a boil. Add green chiles, onions and olives. Pour mixture over chicken. Top with lemon slices. Cover and bake for 30 minutes. Uncover and bake 30 minutes longer, or until chicken is fork tender. Makes about 4 servings.

acidity. Everything I eat gives me a burning sensation. I have acid reflux and stomach ulcers. I have consulted several doctors, I have

even had an X ray of my stomach and gallbladder. They found nothing and the doctors prescribed nothing. Can you help me, Dr. Lamb? I

have just about given up hope of being able to eat like other people. Very depressed.


Dear Reader—I can suggest a few things that may help:

1. Stop drinking coffee, tea, colas or anything else containing caffeine.
2. If you are smoking, stop.
3. Avoid acid foods, such as

fruits and fruit juices. If you do this for long you will need to take vitamin C tablets to be sure you don't get a vitamin deficiency.

4. Avoid all spicy foods.
5. No alcoholic beverages.
6. Do eat good cereals like homecooked oatmeal, well-cooked vegetables of all varieties, which includes green beans, corn and most people can tolerate fried tomatoes.





Constantino Named Head Football Coach

"We'll be coming up with something new for every game, according to the team we're playing. And at half time we'll come out with a different look, too. We're going to start with a complete physical fitness program at Pope Pius."

top slot that they held very briefly for one week. Butler was one game ahead of the top leg-

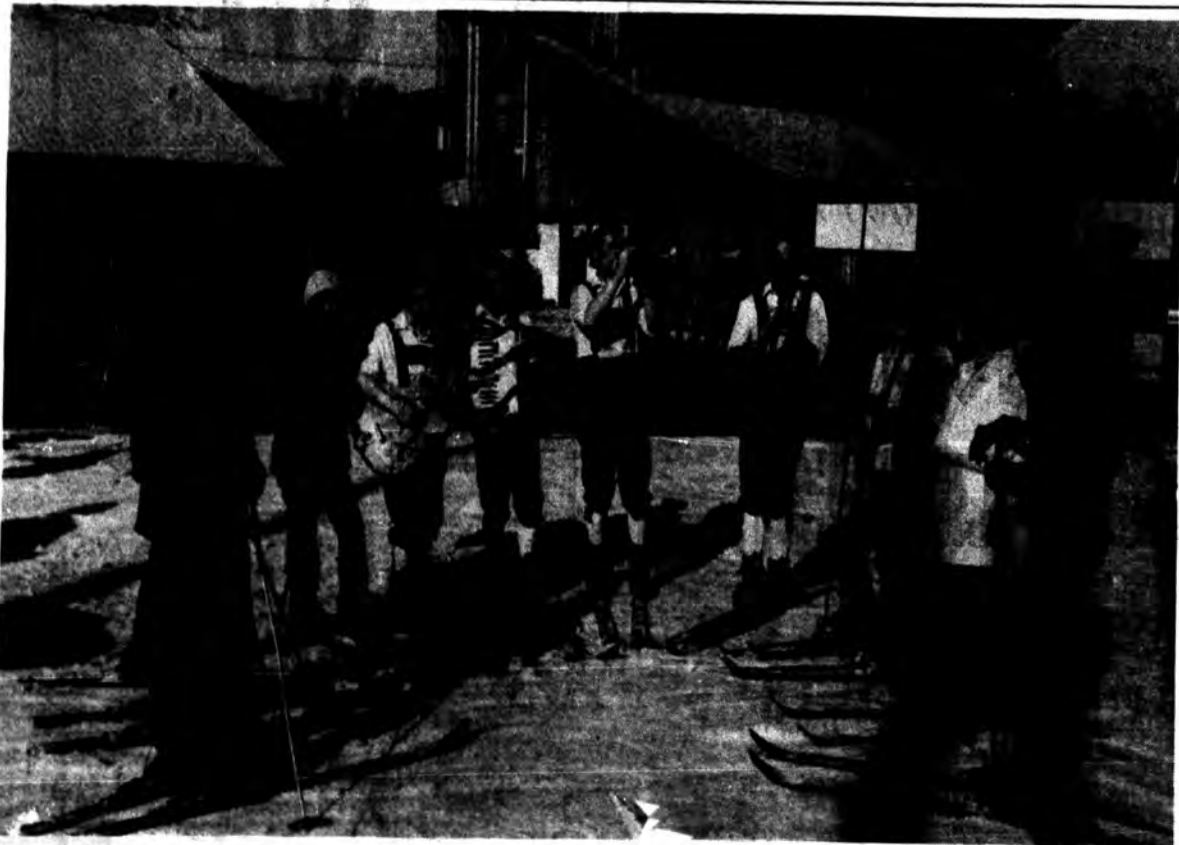
lers from Valley and will have to keep pace with them in order to meet them in a showdown at the last week of play when "Position Week" forces one final shot at the league title.

Prepare For Fitness Program

Thousands of high school students throughout New Jersey and the New York metropolitan area are shaping up for the annual United States Marine Corps Youth Physical Fitness Program to be held June 17th in Washington, D.C.

Post Cereals of General Foods Corporation supports the program, which is conducted in more than 1,500 high schools across the nation to encourage youngsters to get into top physical condition.

The New York athletes participating in this year's program will come from New York City, Nassau, Suffolk, Westchester and Rockland counties. They will compete in a regional elimination meet on April 14th at Kings Point Merchant Marine Academy on Long Island.

Athletes from New Jersey will be from schools in Essex, Monmouth, Bergen, Passaic, Sussex, Middlesex, Union, Somerset, Morris, Ocean and Hudson counties. They will participate in a state meet at Newark State College in Union, N.J. on April 13th.

At both meets, and in events leading up to them, the youngsters will be tested on their skill and stamina in performing a series of five exercises actually used by the Marine Corps to test and train recruits — sit-ups, push-ups, standing broad jumps, pull-ups and a 300-yard run.

Top scoring teams from the two states, which make up a portion of the First Marine Corps District, will be pitted against young athletes from the rest of the district, which includes up-state New York, Connecticut, Rhode Island, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Vermont and Maine.

Teams that come out on top in the April elimination meets will get a chance to compete at the finals in Washington. Panther Bulldogs Share Skyline Lead

The Pequanock Panthers have a good chance of sharing the top perch with the Butler Bulldogs, however as the Panthers proved, the records of teams in the Skyline Conference don't mean a thing, you have to beat each and every one of them and they have the bluish to prove it.

Pequanock who topped Kinnelon 79-66 in the Skyline Jamboree earlier in the season proved it was so false as they practically duplicated the effort, this time on their home court with a 79-60 win. It was a 29 point fourth quarter which pulled Pequanock to a commanding lead and dropped the Colts out of the Conference lead.

No one dominated the scoring in the big fourth quarter as David Budd (24), Bill Jacob (19), Bill Munson (13, and Don Van Lenten (11) all had a hand in the success.

The Panthers did a good job of holding two of the top scorers in

the league when they brought down Kinnelon and Fair Polo with 11 and 16 points respectively.

The Butler Bulldogs, led by Bob Gagg not only maintained their lead on first place with an exciting 62-63 win over Sparta, but they also avenged the 28-9 loss the Spartans handed them on the gridiron this past fall. Dropping Sparta down into fourth place with a 4-4 mark. The 27 point, 11 rebound performance by sophomore forward Bob Gagg was enough to spark the Bulldogs to victory.

In JV action West Milford topped High Point 63-60 with Costanza high man for West Milford with 19 points. Lakeland came off with a split as the junior varsity picked up an impressive 63-57 win, and Butler's jayvees topped Sparta 65-52.

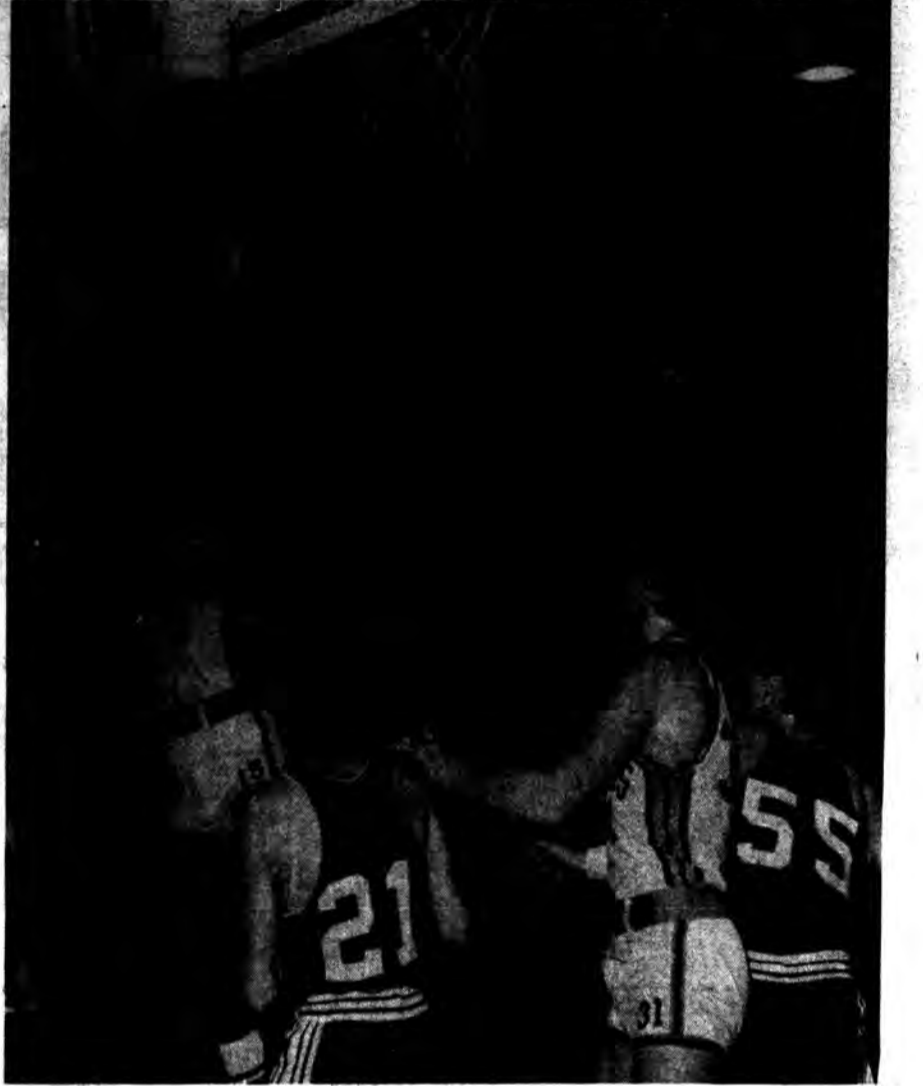

County Sport Happenings

Two Ice Fishing Derbies slated for this past weekend had to be canceled due to unsafe ice conditions, which is a rarity at this time of year. The Jefferson Township Kiwanis has rescheduled their Derby for the weekend of February 5th and 6th conditions permitting at Lake Hopatcong. The other Derby cancelled was sponsored by the Ramsey Outdoor Stores and was to be held at Greenwood Lake, a call to their coordinator advised the new date was February 13th.

The question of why the lakes don't get more ice, even when the temperatures range around freezing all the time during the month, and certainly drop many times overnight can be answered as follows. Ice flats, but why? A piece of led, heavier than water sinks. Water is not the same density, weight, from surface to the bottom. Water cools until it is the heavies (most dense) at four degrees centigrade and then settles to the bottom. This process

continues until the whole body of water is (four degrees). From four degrees as the water continues to get colder it expands and at zero degrees the expansion is the greatest and the water turns to ice. Thus we have the water at the bottom of the lake at 4 degrees and the water at the frozen surface zero degrees or 32 degrees fahrenheit our usual household temperature scale.

In an ice-fishing contest (not cancelled) at Lake Shawnee in Jefferson, Mr. Treadwell Jr. and Danny Dougherty were victors in the adult and junior divisions at the lakes first ice fishing contest held for residents. Both took honors with pickerel, Treadwell's was 18 $\frac{3}{4}$ " and Dougherty's was 18". They received a purse obtained from entrance fees. Second prize was a wool jacket donated by a local sport shop and won by Joe Budzinski. Forty-two contestants competed.
