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Home econ course is expanding

POMPTON LAKES — The district home economics staff told the Board of Education on Tuesday that home economics courses teach students positive work habits as the youths learn practical skills. But the staffers went on to recommend improvements for the program.

During the board meeting, middle-school teacher Sandra Bunker said her home economics students learn at their own speed and then apply that knowledge to a variety of projects. The classes encourage pupils to work together and "share" information and come to conclusions as a group with the teacher as only a guide, Bunker said.

"Students move from knowledge to application," she said, adding that, in home-economics lab classes, "the teacher is not the focus, the project is."

She also said a single project can yield several lessons in a broad range of academic subjects. For example, a student following a recipe uses math skills when measuring ingredients and English skills when reading the baking instructions.

High-school instructor Helga Bogardus said, "There is a need for a strong home-economics course in Pompton Lakes and in America," because they reinforce family values and good nutrition.

The Family Relations course teaches the social dynamics in a marriage, stresses proper child-bearing techniques and addresses ethics and morality in the age of the crumbling family unit, she said.

Home economics also teaches students the nutritional benefits of home-cooked meals versus empty calories of fast-food and microwave dinners, she said.

"America is fast becoming home-cooking illiterate," Bogardus said. "The fast-food industry is not focused on nutrition and health, it is focused on profit."

The staff submitted to the board a five-page overview of the program and included recommendations for improving the existing home economics curriculum.

The teachers suggested the purchase of new text books which outline the New Food Guide Pyramid, approved by the federal government, and the purchase of computer programs about formulating diets. The food labs should be renovated, work that would include updating the

Safety bond measures get unanimous approval

WAYNE — The Township Council gave final approval to \$1 million in bonds Wednesday night for items related to the safety of the township.

The two bonds, a \$450,000 bond to replace municipal sprinkler systems and a \$550,000 bond to purchase new radio and communications equipment for the first aid and fire departments, were given unanimous approval by the council. The expenses were given initial approval by the council last month.

The sprinkler system funds will replace the system in the downtown first aid building, which was destroyed by a fire more than 18 months ago. The shell and foundation of the Tay-

lor Drive building are the only parts of the original structure that remain, according to Ruth Leine, commissioner of the Wayne Memorial First Aid Squad.

Leine told the council Wednesday that Brotherhood Construction of Cedar Grove has been awarded a contract to refurbish the building. Final approval of the reconstruction plans is still needed from the township Planning Board, Leine said. The squad hopes to begin construction on the new building this spring and finish the building by fall.

The First Aid Building on Taylor Drive was practically decimated by an August 26, 1992 electrical fire. The blaze caused the township to lose two am-

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Conforth, Wayne's hero cop, notches second act of bravery

WAYNE — Detective James Conforth will report back to work this week. Hopefully things will be quieter than last week.

Conforth was run down by a suspected shoplifter at the Willowbrook Mall on Tuesday afternoon. In an act of unbridled heroism, Conforth clung to the hood of the fleeing car and fired three shots into the driver's side door, stopping the suspect, who was then apprehended.

"Detective Conforth has some severe bruises but no broken bones," reported Wayne Police Lieutenant Donald Buwalda. "We may be back to work as soon as Monday morning."

Shortly after 1:15 p.m. on Tues-

day, April 5, Detective Conforth and his partner Detective Thomas Reimer noticed a suspicious person in the Macy's parking lot at the Willowbrook Mall. The suspect, 27-year-old Shamai K. Seal of Haledon, was seen fleeing the store with a bag of clothes. Seal jumped into an older-model Pontiac Grand Prix just as Reimer and Conforth blocked his escape path with an unmarked police van.

"The officers got out of the van and showed their badges," Buwalda said. "That's when the suspect began ramming the police vehicle."

Seal allegedly rammed the police van as well as a vehicle parked next to his car in the Macy's lot in an effort to escape.

Lincoln Properties' request gets nod on Mt. Laurel change

WAYNE — The Township Council approved another change in its Mount Laurel plan Wednesday night, allowing a developer on Pike Drive to sell low- and moderate-income housing units rather than rent them.

The change, approved 7-1,

switches the term "rentable" to "saleable" when describing the housing units proposed by Lincoln Properties, a developer that has already constructed a multi-unit apartment complex on Route 23 and plans to build 98 units on Pike Drive and 95 units on Nellis Drive.

Council members are often hesitant to give approval to

Mount Laurel legislation since many disagree with the philosophy behind the Fair Share Housing Plan, which forces communities to provide low- and moderate-income housing for residents.

On Wednesday, the council scrutinized the change requested by Lincoln Properties before

Kinnelon school budget ready

\$15.5M proposal is one of county's lowest

KINNELON — Before a packed house at Pearl Miller School on Wednesday evening the Board of Education, by a 4-0 vote, approved a \$15.5 million 1994-95 budget. The fiscal measure will be voted on in the upcoming April 19 school election.

The proposed budget marks a \$225,455 increase over the current 1993-94 budget of \$15.3 million, or 1.47 percent. The fiscal measure is one of the lowest in Morris County and well within the cap limitations of 4.88 per-

cent for top-level schools such as Kinnelon.

If approved, this will raise the school tax rate to 1.53 from its present level of 1.478, or \$142 on a house assessed at \$250,000. Based on projected enrollment for 1994-95 of 1,310 full-time students, 19 shared-time students, and three students from sending districts, this represents a cost of \$11,668.84 per pupil.

Specifically, the proposed budget reflects revenue from Riverdale students no longer being sent to Kinnelon and a \$65,000 reduction in transition

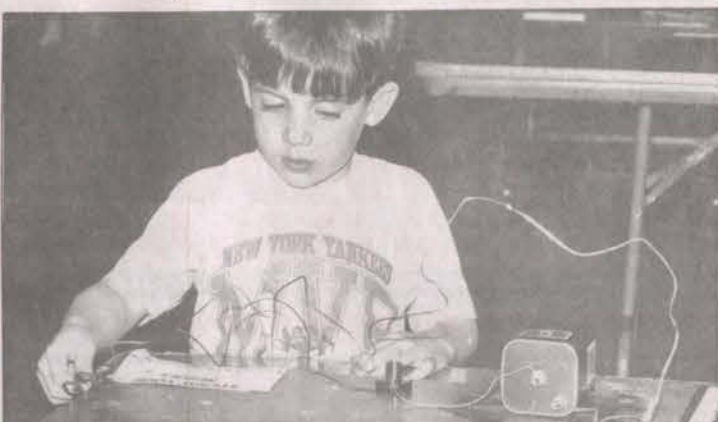
aid from the state. In a cost-containment effort the budget also attempts to reduce staff without sacrifice to quality of teaching.

To achieve these focused economies the proposed budget reduces 7.3 certified staff, 4.5 support staff and 10 department supervisors, and replaces them with the hiring of two administrative assistants.

In terms of program, the budget eliminates the FLES (foreign language) program now offered in grades three and five

Survey reflects school choices

The Ad Hoc Citizens Advisory Committee to the Lincoln Park Board of Education has compiled the results of the community survey sent out in February 1994. There were 811 actual surveys returned for a 20% response percentage.

The preliminary data indicated that the majority of responding residents were not in favor of building a new middle school, but would rather consider a plan to build extra classrooms to the

elementary schools and upgrade the facilities in the middle school.

Based on these results and other findings, the committee has recommended that the Board look into the cost effectiveness of modular units to be added to the Patania School due to the availability of land there and site constraints at Pinebrook School. It also recommends upgrading Chapel Hill School with a new gymnasium and cafeteria.

and decreases the music program. In an offset, the budget contains a 2.5 percent transportation cost increase and no increase in supplies and materials.

In appealing to the public for support of a basically hold-the-line effort, Dr. Lois McGuire, superintendent of schools, focused remarks on the positives that the budget will allow. If approved, the Kinnelon system will have stronger computer programs in both high school and middle school, an SAT course for high school sophomores, and two new AP courses, one in history and one in current problems of government.

Robotics will be introduced through the expanded science lab. Another proposed curriculum innovation will end C-level courses in favor of integrating those students in regular English, math, history and science courses.

In a further commitment toward excellence, McGuire proposed a Student Advisory Committee to assure more student input in program activities and more parent involvement on the secondary level to supplement teaching efforts.

McGuire also seeks to establish a Kinnelon Education Foundation with a Board of Directors charged with dispersing funds to teachers and students who write successful grant appeals for special projects.

Offsetting that effort will be the elimination of stipends for two dozen school sponsored activities; for example, marching band, Ski Club, Chefs' Club, a project fair, German Honor Society, a Dean of Students, a yearbook assistant, and a graphic arts after-school program.

The proposed school budget combines capital outlay so that voters April 19 have only one, YES or No choice. Included in that choice under capital outlay are funds for 24 new IBM computers in the Pearl Miller School, an upgrade in high school computers, repair of high school bleachers, both inside and outside bleachers, a Project Adventure course, air conditioning of a portable classroom at Stonybrook, replacement of maintenance equipment, and purchase of new cafeteria equipment.

The budget, as proposed, includes \$675,348 in debt service, \$244,213 in special revenue funds from state and federal aid, and \$40,000 in tuition leaving a total of \$12.8 million to be raised by local property tax dollars. The budget as proposed also includes state aid of \$1.4 million as part of the general fund total of \$14.6 million and \$100,000 of revenues added to debt service from investment income received from monies appropriated by bond but not yet expended.

In a final motion of the evening, the board also voted unanimously to submit to voters a proposal to reappropriate \$161,778 of the proceeds of bonds remaining unspent and authorized at the Dec. 17, 1991 special election which approved the building of the new Kiel School. These funds will be used to provide furnishings and equipment for the new school.

A passenger sitting in the car parked next to Seal's received minor injuries. In his effort to escape, Seal allegedly pinned Conforth between the front of his car and the police van.

"It's a good thing the detective was able to jump out of the way," Buwalda said. "He would have been crushed beneath the hood otherwise."

As Seal's vehicle broke free of

the blockade, Conforth grabbed hold of the hood and drew his service revolver. He fired three shots into the side door of the vehicle, hitting Seal once in the left side of the stomach. The suspect slumped over the steering wheel and the car coasted to a stop.

Both Conforth and the suspect were rushed to St. Joseph's Medical Center in Paterson. Conforth was released to his home on Wednesday, Buwalda said, Seal

remains in fair condition under police guard. In addition to robbery, Seal was also charged with aggravated assault on Detective Reimer and attempted murder for trying to run down Conforth.

Tuesday's incident was not the first time Conforth has shown extreme bravery in the line of duty. Last year, Conforth was honored for attempting to rescue a child from a burning building in Paterson.

deciding approval would probably be for the best.

The council believes people who own the units will maintain them more thoroughly than renters.

Township Attorney John Fiorello said rejecting the Mount Laurel revision would have caused problems for Lincoln Properties. The financial backer of the proposed Pike Drive development said he would not fund the project unless the units could be sold. Rather than reject the change, and jeopardize a project completion date of 1996, the council voted to approve the developer's request.

"This is not a substantial change in the Mount Laurel plan," Fiorello said.

While a majority of the council agreed, some members couldn't conceal their disdain for the many revisions.

"We should have voted no on all this garbage from the beginning," said Councilman Joseph DiDonato. "There's no end to this."

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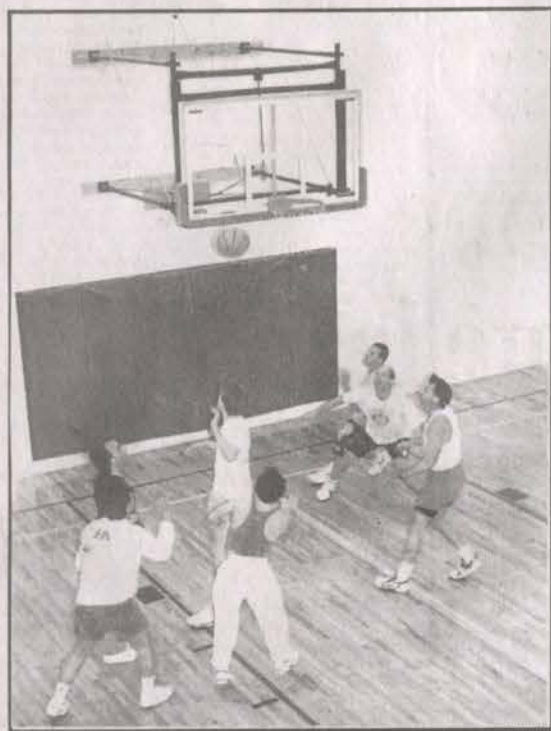

Early detection can halt skin cancer

POMPTON PLAINS — Last year, more than half a million cases of skin cancer were diagnosed in the United States. The most serious type of skin cancer — malignant melanoma — was responsible for 75 percent of all skin cancer deaths.

Fortunately, most skin cancers, including melanoma, can be cured if detected early. Chilton Memorial Hospital physicians will conduct a free skin cancer screening from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m., Saturday, April 23, in the Rehabilitation Services area of the hospital.

At the screening, which usually takes about 10 minutes per person, participants are checked for possible cancerous skin

lesions or conditions. Should a suspicious lesion be found, a written report is given to the participant to direct his or her own dermatologist or family physician for confirmation of the screening's findings, and subsequent treatment.

Since biopsies are not performed at the screening, participants with a suspected skin cancer are encouraged to seek further medical care. In cases of suspected melanomas, this step could be lifesaving.

The American Cancer Society projected 32,000 new cases of malignant melanoma nationwide for 1994, an increase of 4,400 over the 1993 figures. Yet the projected death rate of 6,500

represents an increase of only 200 from the previous year, possibly indicating that more Americans are becoming aware of the danger signs of skin cancer.

The majority of skin cancer cases can be attributed to damage done to the skin by overexposure to the sun. Malignant melanoma also has been linked with exposure to sudden bursts of sunlight and a family history of the disease.

Skin cancer is not just a disease of the elderly. In 1993, 25 percent of those with malignant melanoma were under age 39, partially due to unhealthy tanning habits. Since it takes 10 to 20 years of accumulated sun exposure to

Drive site, approximately 20 of them will be earmarked for low- and moderate-income housing.

"What we'll be doing Monday night is commenting on the conceptual site plans for the area," said township Planner Tim Ferguson.

The conceptual plans have been drafted, Ferguson said, but will most likely have to be modified. Preliminary site plans for the tract should be before the board for a vote next month.

The board unanimously approved the modified Siena Village site plan during a March 14 meeting. The modified plan differs slightly from a plan presented by Siena Village last year.

According to Sister Alice Matthew, planner for Siena Village, the modifications included reducing the size of an auxiliary multi-unit dwelling and phasing in the complete landscaping of the project over a period of five years.

"We've found a better use for the existing building," Sister Matthew said. "We're able to fit more apartments into the existing building and reduce the size of the adjacent building. We won't be reducing the overall

number of apartments though."

Last November the Township Council voted 6-2 in favor of the Siena Village project, a 250-unit housing complex for the elderly. The non-profit complex is being built by the Dominican Sisters of Caldwell, which closed on the property last December.

Siena Village will account for 125 units in the township's affordable housing plan. The project will be financed by state and private grants and Siena Village will make payments on a township bond.

Renovations on the Anthony Wayne School involve refurbishing the building facing Valley Road to include dwelling units and the front offices of Siena Village. A four-story brick and stucco building, holding additional dwelling units, would be constructed adjacent to the main building. There will also be four access routes to the complex, a recycling center in the rear, a water retention pond and landscape buffers.

Sister Matthew said no starting date for construction has been announced, though the work should take 15 months to complete once it begins. To inquire about residency at the senior housing complex, call 226-0730.

Area tennis got off to a fast start last week with opening-day victories Monday by Pequannock, Wayne Valley, and Kinnelon, followed up by a big win for Wayne Valley when they topped Kinnelon, 3-2, Thursday.

In the see-saw Valley-Kinnelon match played in Wayne, Kinnelon jumped out to an early lead as Adam Moskowitz posted a 6-1, 6-1 victory over Passaic County second singles champion Marc Erlichman to win the point at second singles.

Valley came back with the next point to knot the score at one-all

as the Valley second doubles team of Seth Kamens and Dan Anderson took the measure of Henry Gefers and Brendan Moran 6-3, 6-4.

From there the match tightened even further. James Moskowitz dropped the first set to Marti Martin in the first singles match. Moskowitz, however, changed his strategy using a soft approach and a chip-and-charge attack to turn the match around and overcome Martin 2-6, 7-5, 6-1. That put the Colts ahead 2-1 with third singles and first doubles also heading into third-set outcomes.

The more experienced Valley first doubles duo of Jeff Ap-

The Kinnelon loss dropped the Colts to .500 and wiped out opening day momentum gained with a 4-1 besting of Glen Ridge in the

The Valley test for Kinnelon, although disappointing for the team, was a boost for co-captains James and Adam Moskowitz, who remained undefeated after facing the tough Group 3 school.

In other Northern Hills Conference play Pequannock, led by senior captain Chris Ochner, swept Caldwell 4-1. Ochner, proving that off-season tournament play is important, opened his final season with the Panthers with a 6-3, 6-0 besting of Ajit Behlappa.

Golf competition gets tougher for '94 season

The snowfall this past winter has not been kind to local golf courses, therefore, high school golf teams have not had much of an opportunity to get out and get ready for the coming season.

Relegated to gymnasiums and driving ranges, enjoying the benefits of a few rounds of golf on actual courses has not been realized. However, most players will quickly warm to the familiar surrounding of their home courses, and a fine season of golf is in store locally.

The most powerful team on the local scene will be DePaul High School, as coach Richard Bayley returns everybody from last year's 28-0 team. The Spartans claimed a Northern Hills North Conference title, the Passaic County team title and a regional title last season.

In the state tournament, DePaul finished third as a team, with their top four golfers placing no worse than sixth as individuals in state competition. Bayley expects his golfers to be a stroke or two better, as they look to duplicate last year's undefeated season.

"The competition is going to be very strong. Wayne Valley is always good, and Passaic Valley will be more competitive," said Bayley, whose DePaul teams over the past three years have a record of 70-5.

Heading the DePaul squad is Willie Spicer, a senior who finished second in the county last year and placed sixth in the state tournament. He averaged a 39 for nine holes last year, and should be even better this season.

Another senior, Anthony Scelba, placed third in the state last season, and should be improved as well. He averaged 39 for nine holes last season. Jeff Heaney averaged 41 for nine in 1993, and finished fourth in the state, while Peter Spicer, a junior, placed fifth in the state and averaged a score of 40 per nine.

All golf teams can play six during matches, with the top four scores counting. While these are DePaul's top four, Bayley has two other solid golfers who can have an impact in senior Frank Gryboski (43) and sophomore Sean Thomas (45).

DePaul's home course is North Jersey Country Club. The team was supposed to open last week against Passaic Valley and Pequannock, but both matches were cancelled. They're now scheduled to open this Wednesday against Passaic Valley at home, followed by Wayne Valley Thursday, also at North Jersey.

Jay Cody, who has enjoyed a number of successful seasons as the coach of the Wayne Hills basketball team, and Wayne Valley basketball team prior to that, is now the interim head coach of the golf team while Gino Ancora recovers from surgery.

Cody said Ancora should be back to coaching the team in the not too distant future, and in the meantime, Cody has his players playing his brand of golf, which is very similar to his basketball coaching style.

"I keep telling them if it gets late in the match to watch the clock, and go to a four-corner offense. I've been trying to get them to draw the offensive

charge, but they keep telling me they don't have to do that," Cody joked.

All joking aside, Hills returns one of the best players in the state from last year's 12-4 team in Scott Semanchak. Semanchak won the county title last year, as the team finished second to DePaul for the team title.

Playing in numerous tournaments, the senior didn't score higher than a 40 in any nine-hole round last year, and should be better this season. Another senior, Steve Goodman, and two juniors, Craig Fishman and Andrew Silverman, round out Hills' top four. Junior Tom Simone, and freshman John Ayers are in the two final spots for Hills.

"Semanchak is the best kid we have, and he's probably going to be one of the best in the state this year," Cody said. "The rest of the guys are good, too. We should have a good year."

John Campbell, who served as coach in Cody's absence at the team's first match, said the team played well despite less than perfect conditions. The match was against Wayne Valley, West Milford and Manchester at Passaic County Golf Course.

"Scott hit a 43, and that was the best anybody hit. He said it was the first time he hit over 40 in two years," Campbell said. "But he admitted he just didn't play well, and that it wasn't the condition of the course. But for that course in those conditions, it was a good score. Silverman and Goodman also played well. They were both real steady."

Hills beat West Milford and Manchester, while losing to Valley, and are 2-1 heading into play this week.

The Hornets of Passaic Valley finished with a 15-7 record last year, placing fourth in the Northern Hills North Conference and fourth in the Passaic County League.

With only Jen Ariola (now the third golfer on the Rutgers' women's team) lost to graduation, PV should be tough this year, as coach Frank Ariola and his squad look to qualify for state tournament play.

The team will dive right into a heavy schedule this week, as they were scheduled to open with Pequannock tomorrow, before a quad match against Passaic, Wayne Hills and Hawthorne Tuesday. PV then takes on DePaul Wednesday before another quad match against West Milford, Clifton and Kennedy Thursday.

"We're real busy right off, and we have to play Wayne Valley three times, and Clifton, Wayne Hills and West Milford twice each before the qualifying date (May 6) for the states," Ariola said. "We have a good shot at having a better year than last year, but unless you have a couple of guys who can break 40 regularly, you're not going to do it."

Ariola has a couple of players capable of doing that this year, as his top five returnees averaged 41 for nine last season. Senior Dave Sgro, juniors Ryan Melone and Mike Minery, and sophomore Brian Hong are all capable of breaking 40, according to Ariola.

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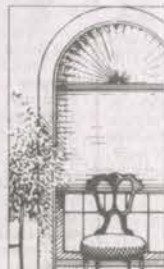

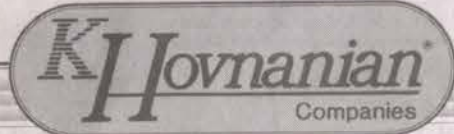
