## Teen faces homicide charges

WAYNE — The teenage driver of a Jeep that overturned in May, killing two of her friends, was charged with criminal homicide by the county prosecutor's office this week.

Passaic County Prosecutor Ronald S. Fava filed two charges of death by auto against 17-year-old Tina D'Ambrosio in Family Court this week. As reported in May, D'Ambrosio was driving the 1988 Jeep which went out of control on Packanack Lake Drive East and flipped, killing 14-year-old Jaclyn M. Coriale and 16-year-old Paula Jean Antonucci.

The criminal charges are shocking to those close to the D'Ambrosio family, who feel the teenager has suffered enough. The driver's sister was also critically injured in the accident. But officials from the prosecutor's office said an investigation of the incident left little doubt the charges should be filed.

"The death by auto charges indicate that the vehicle was being operated recklessly and resulted in a death," said Sgt. Ed Murphy. "That's what our investigation and the investigation of the Wayne Police Department showed."

Since D'Ambrosio is being charged as a juvenile, it is likely she will receive a probationary sentence rather than serve time in a detention center. No trial date has been set, Murphy said.

On May 25, the Wayne police issued D'Ambrosio summonses for reckless driving, failure to wear a seatbelt and allowing passengers to ride in an unsafe manner outside the vehicle. The two victims, 14-year-old Jaclyn Coriale and 16-year-old Paula Antonucci, were killed when the Jeep they were riding in overturned on Lake Drive East in Packanack Lake on May 14. Police believe an uneven distribution of weight in the vehicle

## Residents, Rotary rally for baby's medical bills

POMPTON LAKES — Three-month-old Nickolas Pardalis has more friends than anyone his age.

The tot, much to the distress of his parents, Marc and Theresa, was born with severe heart defects that have required prolonged hospital stays. To help repair his damaged heart the infant has already required three major cardiac operations. The last was to insert a pacemaker to stabilize the baby's heart rate.

While his parents willingly made every sacrifice to ensure Nickolas had the medical and emotional attention he needed, the financial burden soon began to take its toll on the family.

Due to the infant's medical condition and the constant need to commute to and from New York City, where Nickolas is being treated, Theresa has been unable to

return to her nursing position after her maternity leave time expired.

While Marc has insurance for his family from his job with New Jersey Bell, the complexity and costs of Nickolas's case soon surpassed what the family's insurance covered.

Dyann Schumacher, a friend and co-worker of Theresa's on the Lennox Elementary School PTA, decided that something needed to be done to help the couple. After forming a fund-raising organization, The Friends of the Pardalis Family, Schumacher was faced with a major problem.

"I was unsure, but pretty certain, that in order to create an account for Nicky's aid like I wanted to do, it could only be done through a not-for-profit organization and not a private citizen," said Schumacher.

Paula Kelly, a fellow volunteer worker for the family, suggested Schumacher contact the Pompton Lakes Rotary Club as

a possible solution to the not-for-profit group question. Schumacher met with Ken Snell, an officer in the rotary.

"I really felt what Dyann and her organization was trying to do was a very good thing and something that the Rotary should be involved with," said Snell. "After discussing the project fully with Dyann, I brought it before the membership and we voted to get involved in helping baby Nickolas."

Schumacher and Snell co-chaired a committee to organize a pasta dinner to help the Pardalis family with the child's medical expenses.

"We worked very well together. Dyann and the Friends of the Pardalis Family, handled the advertising, selling of tickets and most of the footwork, while the Rotary arranged for the use of the hall and the caterers," Snell said. "We also handled any contributions that came in for Nicky, as legally this type of fund does have to be

handled by a not-for-profit organization."

Both Schumacher and Snell said they were amazed at how supportive residents of Pompton Lakes and the surrounding areas were. The Pompton Lakes Elks Lodge donated their hall for the evening. The majority of food and entertainment was also donated to the event.

"Whatever costs there were, was covered by the Rotary, so that all the money donated goes to the Pardalis family," said Snell, adding that the effort raised \$10,000.

Schumacher and Snell thanked a number of participating businesses, including: Cousin Bruno Pizza in Wayne, Tony's Pizza in Pompton Lakes, Printing and Fine Express in Paramus, Encore Entertainment in Clifton, Civarrella in Riverdale and The Elks Lodge in Pompton Lakes.

While the two fund raisers are both proud of their achievement, they say that

## Architect will assume design for new library construction

PEQUANNOCK — The Township Council will hire local architect James Cuttillo on Aug. 9 for the job of designing the newly proposed municipal library.

Cuttillo's bid for \$70,000 will include the design and configuration of the 12,000 square foot, one-story colonial style building, with approximately 40 parking spaces. Construction will be established on more than an acre of land owned by the municipality, just south of Pequannock Valley Middle School, known as the "Slingerland Tract."

A commercial architect, Cuttillo designed the addition to the town's firehouse and is currently working on the renovation of the Lincoln Park Library.

The estimated costs of the project will be \$1.2 million, which will cover construction of the building. Additional funds will be needed for bonding costs, furnishings and renovating por-

tions of the administrative building where the present library is located.

"I think that the dollar amounts can be raised for the inside furnishings," said Library Director Nancy Gallo. "Trustees will put some funds together to get the most effective way to raise dollars."

Gallo also suggested the possibility of joining a school grant from the state Assembly for the amount of \$50,000.

Officials agreed with the necessity for the new construction since the current library, originally built to accommodate about 20,000 books, has now exceeded that inventory with more than 76,000 books.

"If we delay our decision the interest rates will only go up," said Deputy Mayor Ruth Spellman, noting that there is no reason to put the project off any longer when there is a critical need at this time.

Approximately 15 years ago, an attempt was made to construct

a new library in Pompton Plains, slightly smaller in size. But the proposal had been voted down on the referendum by the public whenever the issue surfaced and had become rumored speculation amongst residents over the years. There was talk of renovating Pequannock School as the new site location.

At a meeting back in November of last year, the council voted unanimously against renovating Pequannock School as a new library and indicated an intent to proceed with plans for the new construction on the "Slingerland Tract."

The new building construction would free up the space of the current library for better municipal utilization.

Officials say this is the most cost-effective way to solve the space problems existing at the present time at the municipal building located on Newark Pompton Turnpike, which desperately needs refurbishing and space additions.

### Scam artist warning issued to homeowners

• PEQUANNOCK — The Pequannock Police Department has announced that home repair con artists are again in the area. Authorities say the con artists mainly pose as driveway pavers, roof repair workers and other types of home repair. They generally prey on senior citizens, but anyone can be a victim. Normally, such con artists will approach a homeowner offering a good deal on expensive home repairs. For instance, they will say that they were doing a job in the area and had enough material left over to give a good deal on having work done. But reputable contractors do not operate in such a manner and almost never have so much material left over that they can do another job. Further, if homeowners say they do not have enough money at home to pay for the job, often the con artists will offer to take them to the bank. More often than not, a cash deposit is given for work to be done in the future and the bogus repairmen are never seen again. Unfortunately, police say many of these cases go unreported due to embarrassment or the fact that the victim believes nothing can be done. Many such con artists are career criminals and have police records. Authorities often have intelligence files of these groups and many times the description of the vehicles and subjects is enough to identify them. Area residents suspicious of anyone offering to do home repair work, or any other suspicious activity, are advised to call police immediately. Local residents are advised to attempt to record a license plate number from the vehicle or note any signs on the vehicles. For more information contact Patrolman Rick Jennings at 835-1700.

### Accident spurs another crash

Upon impact, Frey was struck by the vehicles and propelled onto the windshield of one of the vehicles. Papania sustained face and head injuries as a result. Frey, as well as two juveniles, were transported to Chilton Memorial Hospital by the Pequannock First Aid Squad, treated and released. Papania was transported to St. Joseph's Hospital, treated and released. Based on the investigation at the scene and at the hospital, Papania was arrested by Sgt. Edward Leonard for Driving While Intoxicated. He was released pending a court appearance.

• PEQUANNOCK — On July 26 at 5:49 p.m., while on patrol of Route 23, Patrolman Christopher DePuyt stopped Kristophe Fox, 20, of Little Falls for an equipment violation. A computer check allegedly indicated that Fox's license was suspended and that there was an outstanding traffic warrant from Wayne Municipal Court. Fox was arrested and transported to headquarters. He was charged with driving while suspended, no liability insurance and overdue inspection. He was released on bail for the outstanding warrant and will have to appear in municipal court for the Pequannock charges.

# McKenzie raises school funding issue

## State system called problem plagued

POMPTON LAKES — Following a New Jersey Supreme Court decision that deemed the state method of calculating education funding unconstitutional, schools Superintendent Joel McKenzie is urging residents to get more involved to make sure legislators tackle the issue immediately.

"There are too many good people who are concerned about education for this problem to be prolonged for another year,"

McKenzie said. "We need to urge our legislators to address this problem now."

The funding controversy has been raging since the early 1970s when the state faced its first lawsuit charging that the school funding formula, which relied on property taxes, was discriminatory against poorer districts.

In 1976, lawmakers' failure to

come up with a solution for the disparity forced the state Supreme Court to close public schools for eight days. Since then, lawmakers have grappled with various methods to resolve the dispute without reaching agreement, until finally in July, the state Supreme Court ruled that lawmakers would have to devise an equitable formula by the 1997-98 school year or further unspecified action would be taken.

McKenzie said the Pompton Lakes school district has been an interesting player in the debate because although it is not classified as a special needs district, it has faced financial hardship because its annual aid is based on outdated property tax figures.

The community was re-evaluated after the real estate crash in the late '80s and early '90s, and if the more recent figures were used, the district's actual aid amount would be \$2 million dollars higher.

According to McKenzie, Pompton Lakes has a high senior citizen population with a higher property tax base, but a very low income tax base.

"With this formula, on paper our community seems rich when in fact it isn't," he said.

McKenzie said he was not com-

fortable with the recent court ruling because he has seen how a solution to this problem has been delayed from year to year.

"I'm uneasy," he said. "This is a very difficult time for many school districts and we need to find a solution now."

He said the court did not provide any guidelines for legislators with its decision. McKenzie acknowledged that the system was flawed and said the entire old formula should be scrapped in favor of one which utilizes a combination of property and income tax base figures.

as it rounded a bend caused the Jeep Cherokee to flip. The victims were hanging out of the windows, clutching an overhead luggage rack when the accident occurred. A third girl in the vehicle, 14-year-old Toni Ann D'Ambrosio - sister of the driver, suffered a broken shoulder as well as lung injuries during the accident but has since recovered.

Sgt. William Kussler of the Wayne Traffic Bureau said the

1998 Jeep driven by D'Ambrosio appeared to have no defects related to the accident such as faulty brakes or bald tires. The Jeep does not appear to have been speeding at the time of the accident, Kussler said, and alcohol and drugs were not involved.

Twenty minutes before the May 14 accident, police issued summonses to another group of students driving along Valley Road who were honking the car horn and hanging out of the windows. The beeping ritual was an impromptu pep rally to raise spirits for a high school competition which was scheduled for that Saturday night.

There is no word yet if the families of the victims also plan to bring lawsuits against D'Ambrosio.

sociated himself from the offensive language, not from the apparent anti-Catholic bias.

"It still needs to be made clear to the public, especially to the Catholic community, whether or not the professor agrees with the substance of the disparaging remarks about Pope John Paul II," Rodimer said.

William A. Donohue, president of the national Catholic League For Religious and Civil Rights, had stronger words for the WPC investigation, calling it a "lame response to bigotry."

"President Speert's attempt to resolve this issue is a monumental failure. From beginning to end, this entire issue has been a textbook case of how not to run a college," Donohue said. "The college has not issued one word of apology to area Catholics and has dismissed serious charges against Professor McClean. We will not be appeased by this lawyerly response."

According to Donohue, a male student was offended by the remarks allegedly made during the July 5 class and complained to his mother, who wrote a letter to the college president. Somewhere along the line the complaint letter was given to Professor McClean, who copied it and distributed it to the class.

"This does not even address the issue of having the students identify their religion or the issue of distributing private correspondence," Donohue said of the WPC investigation. "The Catholic League is going to call for a state-wide investigation of the college."

Former and present students in McClean's class admit he sometimes interjects controversial political viewpoints into his teachings, but they also claim he is a fair and qualified professor.

# County casts budget; it's under cap

## Snow removal, state account for only increases

Overcoming costly winter storms and increasing state and federal mandates, the Passaic County Freeholders have approved a 1994 budget that contains a minimal increase in taxing requirements and no reduction in services.

The 1994 local tax levy for the county will be \$131 million, which represents a 4.7 percent increase over last year. Included in the levy is \$909,000 needed to pay for snow removal during one of the worst winters in recent memory.

Freeholder Director John Morley said the county freeholders and administration, "have worked diligently to cut spending wherever possible. This is a tight budget and I want to thank my fellow freeholders and county administrator for their diligent efforts to keep a lid on spending."

To illustrate his point, Morley said the portion of the 1994 budget actually under direct control of the freeholder board decreased by \$2.5 million over last year. The budget is also \$3.4 million under the state imposed budget cap.

Freeholder Norman Robertson noted that only three areas of the budget totalling \$7.2 million are responsible for the budget increase. They are:

\$2.7 million shortfall in state reimbursement to the county for housing state prisoners in 1993, which has to be made up this year;

backlog of insurance claims payments from 1993 totaling \$3.6 million which must be included in the current budget; and,

he \$909,000 to pay for last winter's snow emergencies

"If not for these three budget items, all of which are beyond the control of freeholders," said Robertson, "the budget would be down by 1 percent."

County Administrator Nicola DiDonna said that while health insurance claims are rising the county continues to enjoy saving from its own self-insured program over what it would have

paid in the old program. To date, he said, the county has saved about \$1.5 million by being self-insured and increasing employee deductibles.

DiDonna said the county is seeking to decrease its payroll by \$1 million over year's end, largely by continuing with its early-retirement incentive offer and by not filling staff vacancies. The administrator added that the county has pared the Social Services budget by \$910,000 over what was originally requested.

### Health Budget Cut

By assuming direct responsibility and control for enforcing the County Environmental Health Act, the county will save \$106,000 over last year, reported DiDonna. Formerly, the county contracted with the City of Paterson for CEHA enforcement services, but under the direction of Freeholder William Bill Martini, chairman of the Health and Human Services Committee, the county has taken direct control of the program.

Aggressive actions taken last year to refinance some of the county's outstanding debt at lower interest rates has resulted in savings that will bring 1994 debt service requirements below those of 1993. The refinancing, he said, has meant the county continues to receive favorable bond ratings from Wall Street analysts.

"Ratings of Passaic County's financial stability from independent appraisers continue to be very positive," said DiDonna. "They like our management initiatives, our staff reduction and our debt restructuring. The financial appraisers also like the county's future prospects for economic growth."

### Mandate Problems

Morley said there continues to be upward pressure on the budget from unfunded or underfunded state and federally mandated programs and programs that the state and federal governments no longer finance. For

instance, the 1994 county budget includes \$913,000 in county funding to pay for the continuation of programs that benefit the elderly, crime victims and the juvenile justice system. These programs, said Morley, were originally funded with state and federal money, which has since dried up.

"The discontinuation of federal or state funding for these programs, especially those benefiting the elderly, poses a real dilemma for us," said Morley. "Do we discontinue the programs that people have come to rely on or do we find ways to keep these programs going? We chose to keep these programs alive and not cut services to the elderly and crime victims."

Overall said Morley, more than half of the county's \$217.6 million budget is the result of either state or federal mandates or contractual obligations.

"Federal and state mandates are clearly out of control and are impeding the ability of local and county governments to deliver tax relief to the local property taxpayer," said Morley. "Nevertheless, I am proud of the job Passaic County has done in crafting this budget under difficult circumstances."

Long range prospects for tax relief are promising, said DiDonna, noting that the state takeover of court related costs (slated for 1995) will remove a considerable financial burden from the backs of local property owners.

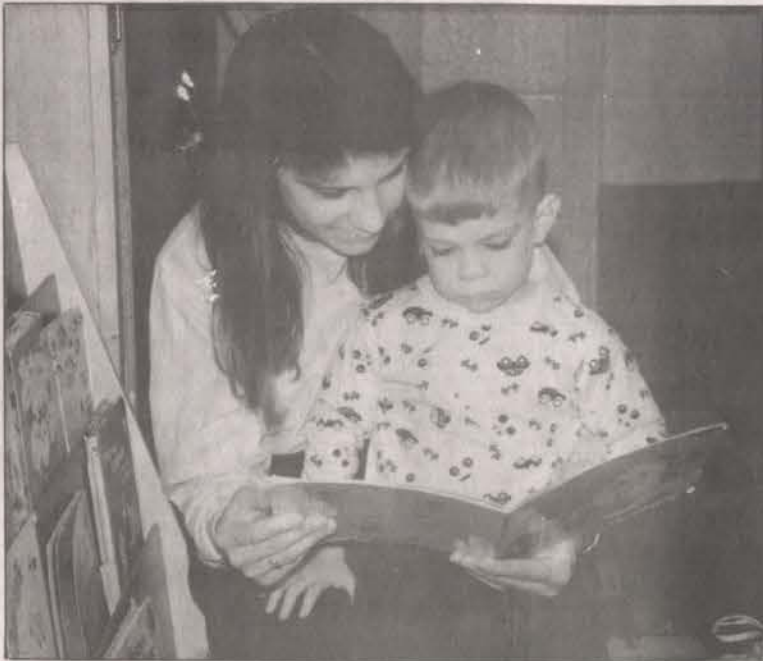

## PV Mental Health Center finds perfect relationship with working companies

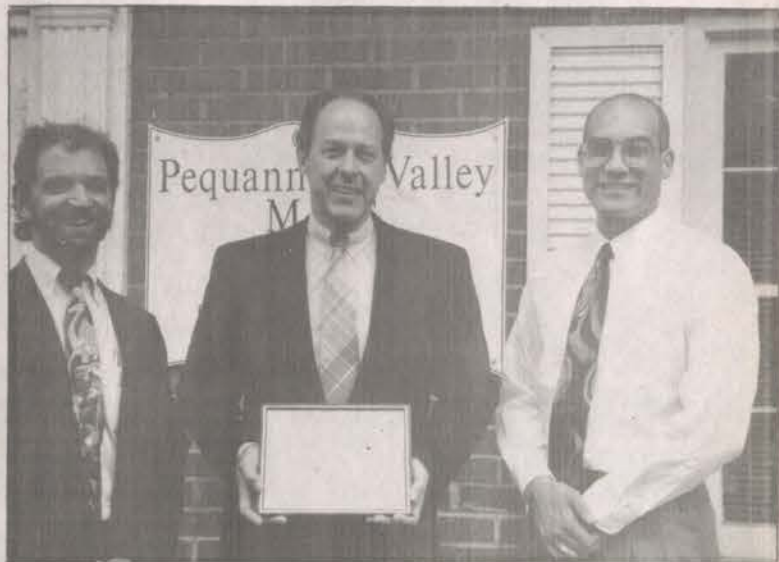

## Empathizing with elderly means better care

POMPTON PLAINS — Chilton Memorial Hospital recently assisted 12 metropolitan area hospitals, health-care facilities, and

nursing schools in the development of nursing staff programs on aging and aging sensitivity. Chilton Memorial's Enid

Topchik, Gerontology Program Coordinator, and Elizabeth Metzger, RN, Nursing Consultant, explained the philosophy and

step-by-step process of their highly acclaimed sensitivity workshop, "Knowing Miss Daisy."

Participants included representatives from Bergen Pine County Hospital, Paramus; Hackensack Community Hospital; Helene Fuld School of Nursing, Trenton; Jersey City Medical Center; the Medical Center of Ocean County, Point Pleasant; Muhlenberg Regional Medical Center, Plainfield; Newton Memorial Hospital; Our Lady of Lourdes Medical Center; Camden; St. Peter's Medical Center, New Brunswick; South Jersey Hospital System, Millville; Staten Island University Hospital; and Westchester Square Medical Center, the Bronx.

"Knowing Miss Daisy" was designed to help nursing staff members examine their own feelings about aging and the elderly and to enhance their understanding of the many components involved in caring for the older patient. Areas explored during the day-long program include feelings about aging, identifying a role model as a positive example of aging, physiological and psychological changes that occur with aging, identifying challenges in dealing with the elderly patient, and identifying the continuum of health-care options for the elderly.

The workshop is divided into seven sessions, including a sensory-impairment simulation exercise in which attendees role play in situations designed to identify and highlight the issues involved in caring for an elderly patient in an acute-care facility. Participants are assigned the roles of nurse, patient, and family members. Through the use of dark glasses, cotton in the ears, and popcorn in shoes, patients' sensory perceptions are altered to simulate physical conditions found in older persons. Meal trays are placed just out of arm's reach.

The remaining audience members are assigned characters with whom to identify. Each character is given certain goals he/she must achieve by the end of the simulation. Following the exercise, the group discusses what transpired and the feelings that arose from individual situations.

Representatives from various hospital departments and outside agencies are utilized to discuss certain aspects of caring for the older patient. A panel discussion introduces attendees to community health-care resources available to the elderly patient and his/her family. The group also reviews a day in the life of a nursing home resident with a director of social and therapeutic services at a local nursing home.

"Knowing Miss Daisy" has been presented at the national conferences of both the American Society on Aging and of the Voluntary Hospitals of America. The program has received a congressional citation for its creativity and excellence. It also has been featured in the New York Times and on national and international television and radio broadcasts. Hospitals and universities across the nation have inquired about the workshop.

# Wayne Lincoln Mercury falls to SB, 2-1

Despite a recent five-game losing streak, the Wayne Lincoln Mercury A's had an opportunity to pull even in the loss column with first-place Saddle Brook in the Met League's National Division if the A's beat the Colonials Thursday night.

Instead, the A's left the field with a six-game winless streak after a heartbreaking, 2-1, loss to Saddle Brook at VanderSande Park, a game the Colonials won in their final at-bat.

The Lincoln Mercury A's (15-14) received solid pitching from righty Mike Jannucci (3-5), who surrendered six hits and two runs (one earned) in picking up the hard-luck loss. Jannucci needed to pitch a shutout in order to outduel Colonial hurler Tony Sarno (6-2) who was superb. Sarno fired a five-hitter, striking out 11 while walking only one batter.

Wayne's six-game slide has frustrated a club which was in first-place at the All-Star break.

"It's real draining," said A's right fielder Ed Mitchell, who had two of the five hits off Sarno. "The pitching has been good, but the fielding has been good, but the hitting hasn't been there. We have to put the ball in play. We had five hits tonight and four hits in our last game," he said.

A's coach Craig Siepe, who managed the A's in place of Russ Purdue, is also frustrated with the losing streak.

"We played a good ballgame, but still came up a run short," a disappointed Siepe said. "This loss hurts a lot, especially when you come down here and give up just two runs on a field (with short dimensions)."

The A's, after striking out nine times in the first four innings, reached Sarno for one run in the fifth, breaking a scoreless tie. With one out, Dennis Daly walked, followed by a high fly ball by Bill Jannucci down the right field line which fell out of reach of the second baseman. That put runners at first and third.

Pat Hoarle then looped a broken-bat single to right, scoring Daly and advancing Jannucci to second. The A's might have scored more runs in the inning if not for some bad base running.

Brian Kelly laid down an excellent bunt down the third base line. Sarno fielded it and nabbed Jannucci, who got a bad jump, on his way to third.

"To be honest with you, I didn't think I had a shot at third, but I knew it was my only play," Sarno said.

"If the third baseman charged on that play, then Jannucci's safe," Siepe said. "Plus, he really

couldn't get a good jump because the ground is so heavy from the rain."

Jannucci then came up big, getting two of his four strikeouts to end the inning. With the skies darkening and the rains threatening, the Colonials ensued the game would not get suspended by pushing across the winning run in the seventh.

Glen Stupinski led off with a slicing double to left center, just out of the reach of a lunging Ray Valente. After Vin Mazzilli was walked intentionally, Mike DiBiase laid down a bunt single to load the bases with nobody out.

## A little luck and dedication take Totowa's Penta to Junior Olympics

TOTOWA — For many people youth can sometimes be cruel, and for Anthony Penta, an 8-year-old from Totowa, he was no different.

As a five-year-old Penta, like many of us at a young age, found himself being picked on by other kids, and it was something that bothered him immensely. He thought about taking karate lessons, something he found interesting at the time, but lessons didn't come cheap, so he managed the best he could.

However, a little luck, along with dedication, sees Penta not getting picked on anymore three years later. Not only that, but he's on his way to the Junior Olympics in Cocoa Beach, Florida, where he and some 500 other children in his age and weight group will vie for a gold medal in karate. Penta leaves tomorrow for the Junior Olympics, as opening ceremonies will take place Wednesday.

To reach the Junior Olympics, the enthusiastic Penta had to place eighth in the Regionals or Nationals to qualify for the Junior Olympics. He finished eighth in the Regionals, placing fifth in the weapons competition, fourth in sparring and sixth in forms. At the Nationals held in Chicago recently, he placed ninth in his age group among some 1,000 entrants.

"The Regionals weren't so tough, but the kids I sparred with at Nationals were killers. Most of them had been to Nationals a few times, but it was only my first time there," Penta said. "I had a good time though. Everybody was real nice."

If it wasn't for a little luck, Penta might not have been a Brown Belt in karate as he is now. Three years ago he entered a raffle, and one of the prizes was six months worth of karate

lessons. Needless to say, he won the raffle, and has been practicing karate ever since.

Penta says he's at the Okinawan Karate Institute in Totowa practically every day taking lessons. Bob Herten, his daughter Tracey, Tony Urena and Brian Testino work with Penta and other students, teaching them all they need to know about karate.

"The most important things they teach are discipline and self control. My teachers are great. They teach me how to defend myself, not how to start trouble," said Penta.

Needless to say, Penta doesn't get picked on much anymore, and next year he could earn his Junior Black Belt.

At 4-foot-7 and 76 pounds, he's not big for his age, but his sites

are set on big things. He says he can't see himself ever giving up karate, and he aspires to become a 10th degree Black Belt some day.

"It will take a while, but I'll never give it up. I want to become a karate master of the highest degree," said Penta, who is planning a trip to Okinawa, Japan to take place in a couple of years.

Penta works diligently at his karate skills, whether at home or when taking lessons. He says he likes working with the bow, a long wooden staff that's one of the weapons he works with regularly, but he's equally proficient in karate forms and in sparring.

Penta will have to call upon all of his skills this week at the Junior Olympics if his dreams of a gold medal are to come true. But win or lose, Penta is way ahead of the game.

## Veterans refinance VA loans

Irving Skolnick, Morris County veterans services officer, said despite the current wave of refinancing home loans, the Veterans Administration reports more than 2 million veterans still hold outstanding VA mortgages ranging from 9 percent to 17.5 percent.

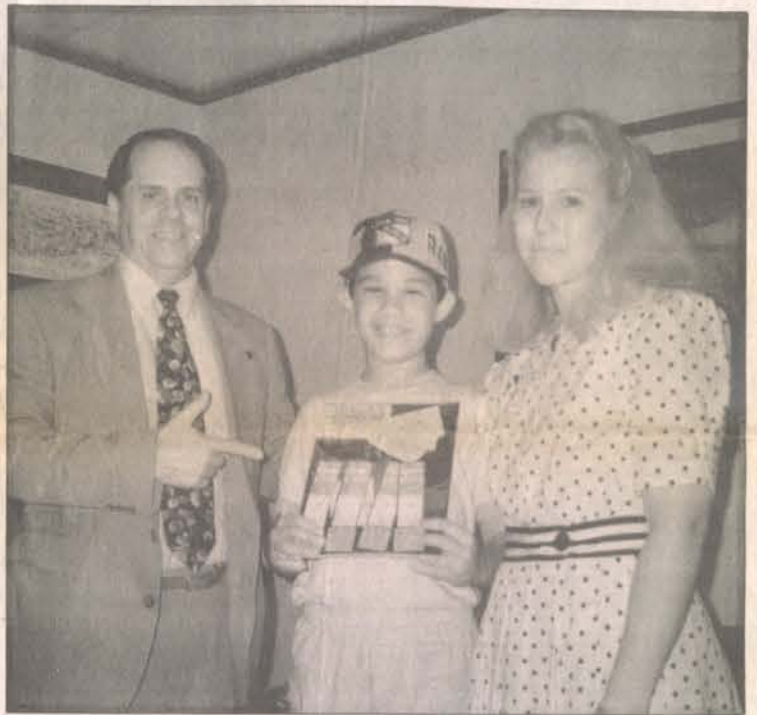
"These veterans have not, for whatever reasons, taken advantage of the opportunity of reducing the interest rates on their home mortgages," said Skolnick. "They continue to pay up to several hundred dollars more per month than would be required if they refinanced their loans at prevailing rates."

Skolnick said the Veterans Administration is sending letters to veterans who currently have VA loans with high interest rates, urging them to apply for the IRRRL's while rates are still low, and realize substantial savings.

Skolnick pointed out that under the VA's IRRRL program, it is possible to obtain such refinancing without being required to pay for a property appraisal, or going through a credit check. He said the program allows a veteran with an outstanding VA-guaranteed loan to obtain a new loan at a lower interest rate with little or no out-of-pocket costs.

Veterans interested in refinancing their VA loan should contact a lender, or call the VA's toll free number, 1-800-827-1000, or call Skolnick at the Morris County Veterans Services Office, the phone number is 285-6866.

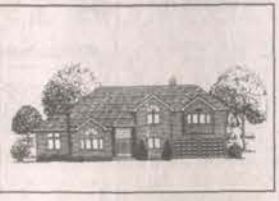
