O'Rourke makes transition from BOE to township council

WAYNE - When Ann Mary O'Rourke left the school board and won a position on the township council, she didn't have to move very far - just four chairs to her left.

Same building, same room. Nothing much has changed as far as locale is concerned but representation, that's a whole different part of town.

Following nearly five years as a school board trustee, O'Rourke knew it was time to experience something new and she hasn't regretted her decision one bit.

"I felt that I had accomplished my goals on the board that I had set for myself. I thought the level of excitement was as far as it was going to go and I wanted a fresh perspective for both myself and my former board members," said O'Rourke.

Though her stint as a school

trustee was challenging and even exhausting at times, O'Rourke felt the need to stay invigorated.

"The council is something totally new to me. And because it's a whole different area, I ask a lot of questions at the meetings and that's what I like about it," O'Rourke said.

Just one of the guys.

O'Rourke is currently the only female on the nine-person male-dominated council. That's a big change from her days on the

school board where at one point there were seven women and two men. To say the atmosphere around the council chamber is a "man's world" would be erroneous as O'Rourke has been treated with only the utmost respect from her fellow colleagues.

"I loved working with women and I often wondered if it would be a huge change but it wasn't. I was surprised how easily I fit in," she said.

Council President Chris

Vergano said that he approached O'Rourke about running because he felt she was bright and articulate.

"I thought she could bring a new voice to the council. And she jumped in with both feet and is doing a great job representing the people of Wayne. I'm glad that she made the decision to run," said Vergano.

Mayor Scott Rumana agreed

Smith exhibits painting at Smithsonian

WAYNE - Kimanne Smith, an artist and resident of Wayne, has one of her oil paintings currently on exhibition through February 2007 at the newly renovated Smithsonian National Portrait Gallery in Washington, D.C. The gallery has reopened its doors on July 1 after a six-year \$283 million renovation. For this exhibition, with the support of Virginia Outwin Boochever, the National Portrait Gallery chose to hold an open competition, asking artists throughout the United States to submit painted and sculpted likenesses of people close to them. The jury saw only one portrait from each artist. From more than 4,000

entries from every state, the jury chose 51 works of art. Smith's work was one of those 51.

The oil painting, "Nala" measures 60 feet high by 36 feet wide. Nala Sallie is the youngest member of the Sallie family. Nala is a confident, proud little girl whose small frame embodies a youngster with a rich family history. Her large, extended family has its roots in Madison, where her grandparents still reside.

Smith states, "Painting comes from a specific visual language of illusion and representation. I embrace this tradition but also challenge it by balancing the gap between the illusion of reality and

the reality of physical paint on canvas." This painting represents something like the highest level of human rights through the freedom in the brushwork and the intuitive painterly approach.

Smith lives in Wayne; and is a master's of fine arts graduate from William Paterson University. She is also a portrait painter and is an art teacher at Bergen Catholic High School in Oradell and also evenings at William Paterson University. saying, "She's an incredible and intelligent person dedicated to helping people in many different ways."

And as being a female voice amongst eight men, Rumana added, "She advocates her position well, she fights for the right reasons with the best of them."

An easy transition can be nothing but beneficial to the township. Mentoring, as she likes to call it, is something that ought to make an individual feel good because in the end, it's all about helping people.

O'Rourke began her political career on the school board in 2001 prior to that she was a member of the Parent Teacher Organization where she and other mothers fought for a bond referendum to build a new middle school, which failed, forcing her to further assess her ideals.

"I could just go away or step up and make something happen. I knew how important and how necessary the new school was. It became a personal goal," she said.

Before, the focus was on the children. Now, it's all about the res-

idents, or the average person in Wayne, as O'Rourke refers.

A perfect example of that was when the school budget was brought in front of the council. It was a totally different perspective, explained O'Rourke.

Important issues such as cogeneration, which O'Rourke was introduced to while still on the board, has her examining from a different perspective as well.

To gain better understanding and to form an educated opinion on the topic, O'Rourke has done her own research on the project, an attribute Vergano finds noteworthy.

"She listens and does her homework about the various issues that come across our table," Vergano stated.

O'Rourke, 42, obtained a bachelor of science degree in accounting from Montclair State University before acquiring a law degree from Seton Hall Law School.

For the past five years though, she has been working part time as an adjunct professor at William Paterson University surprisingly though in the English department.

"I think it's important to have different components of your life. And I love to be around college

kids. Young people's viewpoints about life are interesting and they keep you on your toes," she said.

She also teaches summer courses at WPU and teaches confirmation at Our Lady of the Valley Church in Wayne.

In addition, O'Rourke is active in the Passaic County Republican Organization.

It's all a balancing act.

O'Rourke, who is married with two children, a son, 15, and a daughter, 12, is the representation of the modern, career-oriented woman.

"I'm always juggling between my professional and my personal life, she said with a smile. "Sometimes I have to stop and think where I have to be."

Passionate about what she does, O'Rourke said she thinks she has gelled so well with her council mates for that reason.

"The township council is an enthusiastic group of guys.

We may have our differing opinions but the level of respect is always there," she said. "And the best part is when the meeting is over, we all walk out together."

Frank Mobilio trial is delayed to September

WAYNE – A trial that was expected to begin over a week ago in Sussex County regarding a Wayne school principal accused of sexually molesting a 13-year-old girl has been postponed.

The first delay came when the state government shutdown and then until September because of vacation plans for those involved, according to officials. This will lead to a new jury needing to be picked and no specific date has been set for a trial as of yet.

Frank T. Mobilio, 43, was indicted in April 2005 on third degree endangering the welfare of a child and fourth-degree criminal sexual contact. It is alleged that he had sexual contact with the girl at a Jets football game in October 2003 as well as on the trip back home from Giants Stadium. It had been stated that the girl was not a student of Mobilio's.

The accused remains suspended without pay from his position at George Washington Middle School. He continues to maintain his innocence. In addition, his

attorney, George Dagget, has since reportedly prompted an investigation surrounding the victim's credibility that he supposedly wants conducted before the trial starts.

Numerous calls to Dagget's office were not returned by press time.

The new evidence brought to light surrounding the alleged victim was presented to Sussex County assistant prosecutor, Francis Koch. His office is reportedly looking into it.

Based on preliminary testimony, Mobilio may have consumed close to 15 beers while at the Oct. 12, 2003 football game. However, officials say no evidence has proven that information to be true.

Mobilio attended the game with two other area adults, along with the alleged victim and another younger girl. Following a complaint from the victim's mother, Mobilio was charged with allegedly fondling the girl and exposing himself to her in the back of a van while being driven home along Route 23. It is also alleged that the abuse took place inside the stadium. Mobilio remains free on \$20,000 bail.

Sunset Soundz show has been rescheduled

WAYNE - When Sunset Soundz was scheduled to present a free concert in Preakness Shopping Center on July 5, the weather was threatening so the band was asked to come back on the scheduled rain date, July 12. That evening it poured.

Now, Preakness management has found an open date for the group, which will get a third chance to perform on Wednesday, July 26 at 7 p.m. There is no rain date; Sunset Soundz goes on rain or shine, according to Bob Mizrachi, president of the Preakness Shopping Center Merchants Association, which cosponsors the concert series with Hekimian & Co., Inc., the corporate landlord.

It's back to the 1950s, 1960s and 1970s when Sunset Soundz revives the Big Band era for an evening of great dance music.

Sunset Soundz is making its

debut in the Preakness Concert Series. Six musicians and a female vocalist will recall the days of Glenn Miller, Artie Shaw, the Dorsey brothers, and others in a concert that begins at 7 p.m.

The seven-member, Clifton-based group will also play some country Western and some current hits. The musicians include Steve Pizzella of Bayonne and Tony Annacone of Jersey City on keyboard, Richard Massa of Clifton on the drums, Michael Melchione of Belleville on sax, Bruce Johnson of Clifton on guitar and Geri Rogers of Boonton, vocalist.

The concert, free to the public, takes place in the mall's main parking lot under the clock. Cones block traffic so spectators can enjoy a concert in the comfort of their chairs. The shopping center is located at the intersection of Hamburg Turnpike and Alps Road.

Extension granted for property tax rebates

Assemblyman Thomas Giblin is urging seniors and disabled homeowners to be sure to apply for state property tax rebates and reimbursements before the Aug. 15 application extension expires.

"I encourage seniors and disabled homeowners to take advantage of the extended deadlines to apply for programs that can provide them with real property tax relief," said Giblin (D-Essex). "The additional time provided under the deadline extensions for these two valuable programs give elderly and disabled homeowners an enhanced opportunity to seek financial help to alleviate the high cost of owning a home in our state."

The application deadline for both the 2005 homeowner property tax rebate program and the 2005 Senior Freeze program had originally been set for June 1. They were

subsequently extended.

Homeowners who are 65 or older or disabled and have received a FAIR homeowner rebate program application but have not yet filed can file by phone by calling 1-877-658-2972, or at www.state.nj.us/treasury/taxation. For more information on the program, call 1-888-238-1233 during business hours Monday through Friday.

The second relief program, the 2005 Senior Freeze (Property Tax Reimbursement) reimburses eligible seniors and disabled homeowners for the difference of local property taxes paid in their "base year" of program qualification and the amount of property taxes paid in a respective reimbursement year. Funds sought for turf fields at Barbour's Pond

WAYNE - As part of the township's ongoing effort to utilize what open space they have left, officials applied for a grant that would help put turf down on a recreation field at Barbour's Pond.

According to Ryan Edge, supervisor of parks and landscape, a \$837,100 grant is being sought after through the Passaic County Open Space and Preservation Trust.

Currently there is synthetic turf on field No. 3 and this grant would be earmarked for field No. 4.

"Eventually, we would like to put turf down on fields 1 and 2, which now have natural grass," Edge said.

Viewed as a good edition to the

township's widely used recreational facility, Mayor Scott Rumana said it keeps the town from needing to buy up more property when the fields become broken up due to overuse rendering them useless after a period of time.

"We have a huge shortage of field space.

Turf doesn't require maintenance so even in that way we're saving money. Turf can be played on extensively game after game, which also helps out especially when the recreation schedule is so busy.

Confident that the township would be awarded the funding, Rumana added, "It's a real plus any way you look at it. So far, the other turf field has worked out well for us."

Senate approves juvenile tanning restrictions bill

The Senate recently gave final legislative approval to legislation Assemblyman Fred Scalera, Gary Schaer, and Herb Conaway, M.D. sponsored to restrict juvenile access to tanning booths and other artificial tanning devices.

The measure (A-2936) would prohibit minors under the age 14 from using tanning facilities and require minors between age 14 and 18 to present written parental consent before using commercial tanning beds or other tanning devices.

"The rising incidences of skin cancer are a wake up call for young and old alike," said Scalera (D-Essex/Passaic/Bergen). "We need to protect kids who don't fully understand how vulnerable they are to developing skin cancer when they are thinking only of catching rays. There is no such thing as a safe tan."

The bill would require tanning facilities to post a sign in the reception area to make patrons aware of the law. Tanning facilities that violate the act would be subject to fines of \$100 for the first offense and \$200 for each subsequent offense.

The bill would allow emancipated minors to use a tanning facility without parental permission.

According to the United States Food and Drug Administration (FDA), UV radiation from the sun, tanning beds, or sun lamps can cause skin cancer. Sunburn caused during moderate tanning has been associated with skin cancer, damage to the immune system, and premature aging of the skin.

The bill passed 35-0. It now heads to the governor, who may sign it, veto it, or modify it in the form of a conditional veto.

Make time for reading this summer

While summer should be a fun time, children who put aside all of their learning efforts until school starts again in September are hurting their chances of achieving the best grades possible. The often-dreaded summer reading list can be turned into an exciting educational tool.

Parents can watch a movie based on a book with their child, then give the book to the child to read.

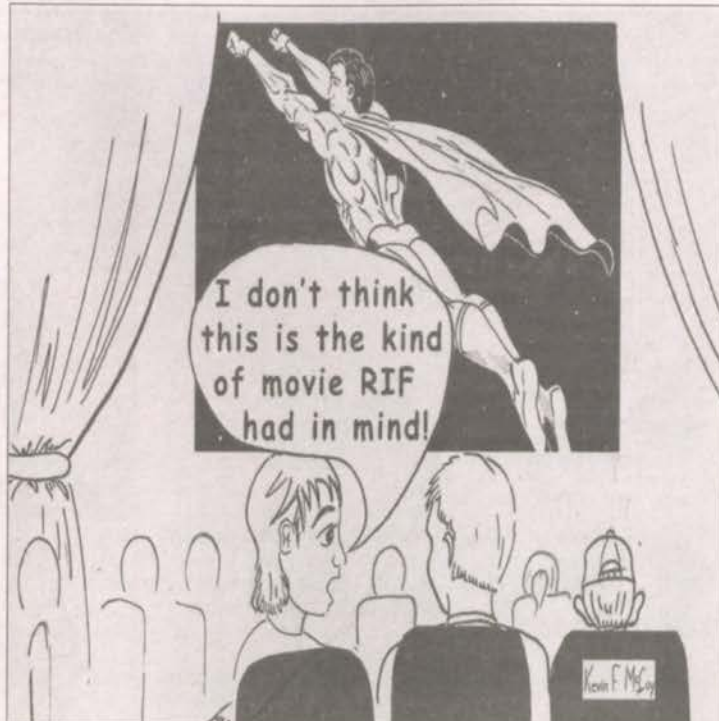
Keep plenty of children's books and other reading materials at home.

Parents can also check out www.njsummerreading.org to find additional age-appropriate book titles.

Don't forget about the local library. Stop in or check out the library's Web site. Most have a recommended list of books for students of all levels, in addition to structured summer reading clubs that aim to make summer reading fun. All spit and no polish

Golfers don't do it. Tennis players don't do it. Neither do football, basketball or hockey players. So, why do baseball players spit so often?

This disgusting habit is not just repulsive to watch but it's also unsanitary. Furthermore, as leaders of the nation's favorite pastime, professional baseball players are held up as heroes to our youth. Spitting is hardly heroic behavior.

George Steinbrenner should prohibit his players from spitting and urge the other teams to stop this horrible

ritual. We'd rather see a beard than a man spitting in public. We'd rather see longish hair than spitting. We'd even settle for public pubic scratching.

We understand that among professional athletes, it's easier for

baseball players to act so rudely. They don't wear helmets with face guards covering their mouths as football and hockey players do. They don't play on a hardwood floor as do basketball players, who would create a scene even more sticky than it already is from the sweat they drip onto the floor.

Professional golfers are noted for being gentlemanly.

They don't trash-talk one another and they certainly neither scratch nor spit.

Tennis players may have abandoned the old purist custom of wearing whites only on court and may now be rather hirsute, but they do not spit.

In a world where germs are to

be avoided, we point to the spewing of spittle as a germ spreading practice as well as a nauseating sight. We implore George Steinbrenner to look beyond hair and rid the game of this ritual. Let him use his power - insist on the pride segment of his slogan, Pride, Pin-stripes, Power - to demand a more acceptable public behavior by his pinstriped players.

If he doesn't succeed, perhaps baseball's Commissioner Bud Selig should issue a ban on players' spitting as he did with steroids.

It's time for baseball players to close their mouths, swallow hard and act properly in the public arena.

Online gambling ban is a bad bet

Ever wonder what your congressman is doing right now? Is he or she working hard to protect your freedoms as an American citizen? Or is he or she working hard to take them away?

If you like to gamble online, the answer is most likely the latter.

The House passed a bill last week that bans Internet gambling. The legislation forbids credit cards and other forms of payment from being used to settle online wagers and allows authorities to work with Internet providers to block access to gambling Web sites. The bill was passed by the House and now heads to the Senate for additional approval.

But the new bill doesn't target all forms of Internet gambling. Lotteries would still be allowed (as requested by state leaders who collect hefty taxes from public lotter-

ies) and online horse race betting would not be affected (since the horseracing industry successfully lobbied for legislation several years ago to clarify that betting on horse races over the Internet is permitted.) Instead the House bill targets online sports betting, casino games, and card games, like the popular poker game Texas Hold 'em. This isn't the first time such a bill has come before Congress. Many conservatives back the ban on moral grounds saying that online gambling is a detriment to society.

But that's a lie. Your elected officials don't care if you blow your entire paycheck gambling online, empty your bank account, and drive your family to financial ruin. They really don't. The real reason they want to ban Internet gambling is because they're not making any money from it. And they have no

one to blame but themselves.

Trump, Steve Wynn, Merv Griffin, or some other brick-and-mortar casino mogul. But they're not - instead they're run by a bunch of foreign investors based on offshore locations, like the Cayman Islands. My guess is the government placed restrictions on American casino owners years ago pre-

venting them from setting up online gambling sites. As a result, legislators have allowed a \$12 billion industry to slip through the fingers of American businessmen and into the hands of foreign investors. Nice job - so far, so bad.

There also seem to be restrictions placed on advertising gambling sites. You'll see plenty of ads for "play money" gambling sites that end with the extensions .tv or .net. Yet if you go to any of these sites and type .com - the most common web site extension - instead of .tv or .net, you'll find yourself at a site that allows real money gambling. Again, legislators are trying to restrict the growth of online gambling - or at least limit their advertising to "play money" only - and the Internet casinos have found a way around it.

The reason that online gambling

has grown into a \$12 billion a year business is that people WANT to do it. Sure, it might not be the smartest choice, but neither is smoking or drinking and neither of those vices are illegal. They never will be. There are too many tax dollars to be made off the sale these items.

That, ultimately, is the future of online gambling. Congress will kick this political football around, bullying the online gambling industry with empty threats, until some government official finds a way to regulate the industry and skim some of the profits. Once the American government starts taking a cut of the online gambling industry's profits then the declining moral fiber of our country will no longer seem so important to our elected officials.

You can bet on that.



PCSD halts coke haul, gets fugitive kingpin

County police recently made two major narcotic arrests. The first resulted from a double-digit pound seizure made on a traffic stop. The second stemmed from a multi-month drug trafficker fugitive inquiry, in cooperation with federal authorities.

On July 7, a Passaic County Sheriff's Department (PCSD) officer spotted a veering 1999 Ford Expedition crossing a bridge on West Broadway in Paterson. After pulling over the vehicle, the deputy noticed two large suitcases in the rear seat. When asked, the driver allegedly said he neither owned the luggage, nor knew of its contents, according to Bill Maer, a PCSD spokesperson.

A search of both items turned up 53 pounds of cocaine, whose street value is believed to be about

\$1.2 million. Apprehended was Radames Martinez, 25, of Paterson. He was charged with three contraband possession counts: intent to distribute, intent to distribute within 1,000 feet of Paterson Public School No. 2, and intent to distribute within 500 feet of public housing, Maer said.

Martinez was sent to the Passaic County Jail in lieu of \$750,000 bail, pending a pre-indictment hearing.

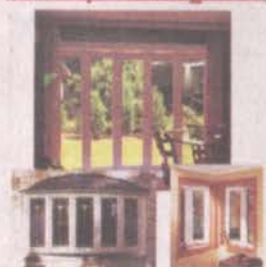
The PCSD did not release the name of the vehicle stop-initiating officer.

In the second incident, county detectives took into custody a wanted Paterson man. He had allegedly fled the city on drug traffic charges. On July 12, PCSD Warrant Squad officers arrested Pedro Antonio Baldi, 25, of Paterson at Newark International Air-

Chain effect accident ends in DWI charge

WAYNE — A local man faces intoxicated driving charges following a midtown chain reaction accident last week.

On July 4 just before 10:50 p.m., five township officers and other first responders went to a four-car collision on Ratzer Road near Karen Court, just west of Alps Road, according to Wayne Police Deputy Chief John Reardon.

According to Reardon, a west-bound 1995 Ford F250 pickup — driven by Gregg Warhurst, 40, of Wayne — crossed the double centerline, hitting a 2002 Jeep Wrangler operated by Kyle McLaren, 25, of Wayne. The impact's force shoved the jeep into a 2001 Mazda Millennium, steered by Susie Macor, 31, of Kearny. The Mazda then struck a 2003 Honda Accord, operated by Hisham Obaid, 19, of Wayne. The Honda then was pushed into a utility pole.

The deputy chief said he did not know the extent of damage to each vehicle. He did say all cars were removed by a police requested tow service. Reardon said Obaid and a front right seat passenger Anton Mazyrko, 17, of Wayne, were taken to St. Joseph's Hospital by the township first aid squad. Both victims, he said, were released after

treatment of minor injuries. At the scene, he added, police discovered that Warhurst allegedly ran off on foot. Reardon said about 20 minutes later, Wayne Police Officer Jim Arnold located a subject in the woods near GAF Materials Corporation at 1361 Alps Rd. He said Arnold noticed the man was allegedly sleeping. Arnold, the deputy chief added, woke the subject up, and discovered the individual allegedly had an alcoholic smell on his breath.

Arnold verified the man was Warhurst, and that he was allegedly the Ford F250 motorist. The suspect was placed under arrest.

Reardon said Warhurst was charged with driving while intoxicated, and leaving the scene of an accident.

The arrestee was also issued a summons on a failure to maintain lane infraction, and released on his own recognizance, pending a court date.

Reardon said Ratzer Road by the accident location was briefly shut down for emergency operations. Assisting in the closure was the Passaic County Sheriff's Department. Supervising police at the scene was Wayne Police Sgt. Keith McDermott.

All accused parties are innocent until or unless proven guilty in a court of law, following due process.

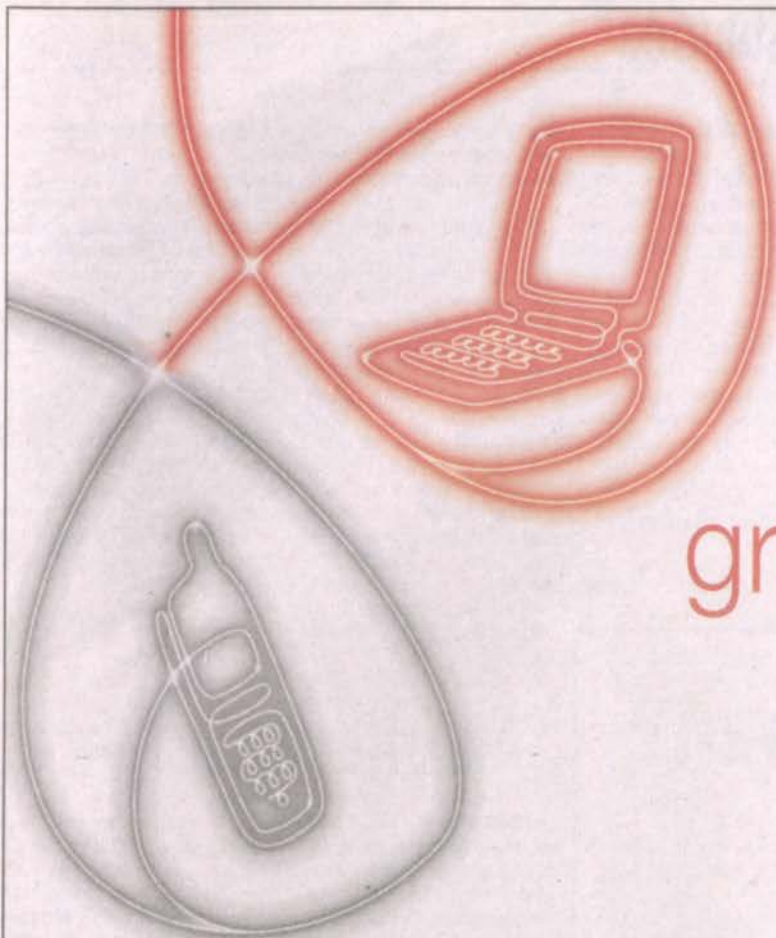

The majority of these sites represent the hard work and commitment of individuals and families providing habitat near their homes, but NWF has also certified more than 2,400 schools and hundreds of business and community sites. Certified habitats can be found everywhere from post offices, hospitals and places of worship to community parks, corporate buildings and municipal facilities. The average habitat is between 1/3 and 2-acre, but certified sites range from urban balconies to thousand-acre areas.

Any habitat enthusiast can create a certified habitat and learn the rewards of gardening for wildlife. NWF teaches the importance of environmental stewardship by providing guidelines for making landscapes more hospitable to wildlife. Habitat restoration is critical in urban and suburban settings where commercial and residential development encroaches on natural "wildlife areas. In addition to providing for wildlife, certified habitats conserve our natural resources by reducing or eliminating the need for fertilizers, pesticides or irrigation water, which ultimately protects the air, soil, and water throughout our communities.

Habitats can also produce financial rewards for homeowners. Realtors will promote the certified status of homes for sale because they see it as an added selling feature. It's an attractive element to many potential homebuyers looking to share their landscape with Mother Nature. Potential homeowners who are attracted to a house with a certified habitat are also more likely to maintain the habitat once they take ownership.

NWF has received numerous testimonials from program participants who find their efforts to create a habitat not only rewarding, but fun for the whole family. As one participant wrote, "I am a beginner, but judging from the many birds, squirrels, butterflies and rabbits, along with the flowers blooming everywhere in my yard, I must be on the right track." In addition to sites certified in the U.S., NWF-certified habitats have been created in Canada, Japan, Italy, Switzerland, Peru and Puerto Rico. California, Florida, South Carolina, and Pennsylvania have the most habitats here in the U.S.

Few people understand how just one person can make a difference. David Mizejewski, NWF naturalist and host of the Animal Planet series "Backyard Habitat" says, "It's easy to think there is no hope for wildlife in our modern world of smog, traffic and asphalt. But there is hope. Each of us can make our own piece of the Earth a healthy, green space that helps restore the ecological balance. Encouraging your neighbors to join with you can lead to a neighborhood or community habitat that provides wildlife with greater incentive to call your piece of the earth home."

Participants who achieve certification receive membership in the National Wildlife Federation, including a one-year subscription to the award winning National Wildlife magazine with inspiring wildlife articles and amazing nature photography. They also receive a personalized certificate and quarterly newsletters, and are eligible to post NWF's special outdoor sign designating their yard or garden as wildlife-friendly.

NWF now offers the most comprehensive guide to date on gardening for wildlife, authored by David Mizejewski. The 128-page "Attracting Birds, Butterflies and Other Backyard Wildlife" won the Independent Book Publishers Association 2005 award for Best Gardening/Agriculture Book of the Year. It is full of practical how-to information to make your yard a wildlife haven and shows how to have your property officially certified by NWF as a Backyard Wildlife Habitat site. 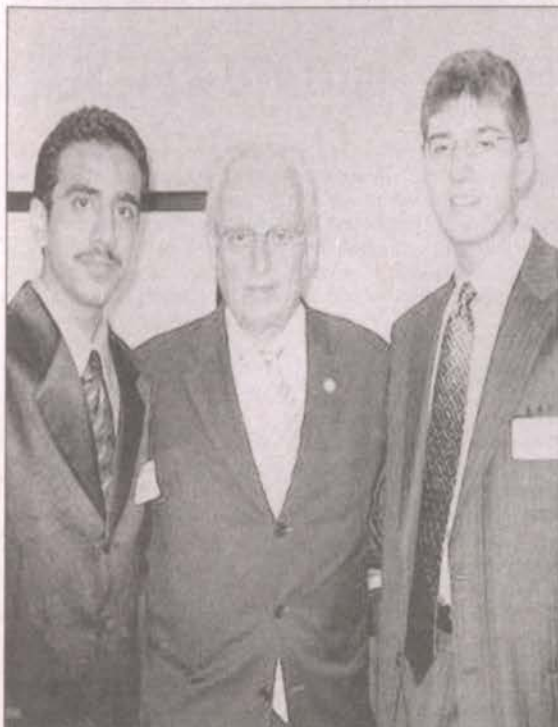

The very talented Steve Solomon is back in AC to reprise his unique one-man show "My Mother's Italian, My Father's Jewish, and I'm in Therapy" at Resorts Superstar Theater through Wednesday, July 26. Ever determined, Solomon abandoned academia and walked away from a prospective pension, and took his act South. In November, he'll take the show to the Little Shubert Theater on Manhattan's West 42nd Street Off-Broadway theater row for a limited six-week run.

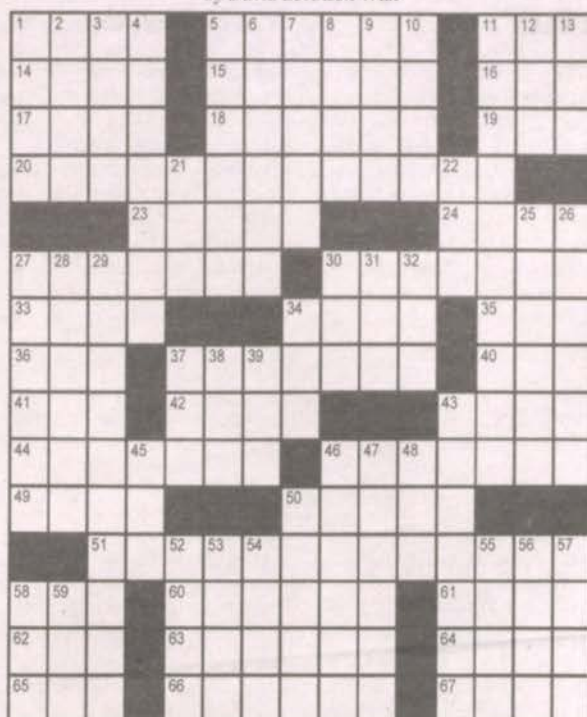

Q: What are some of the techniques that Realtors use to market my home?

The listing proposal also contains a list of comps (a list of comparable properties that have sold in your area during the last 6 months), the agent's biography and track record, an outline of the services that will be provided by your Realtor and her/his brokerage firm; an agency disclosure form (details the seller/agent/brokerage firm relationship) and the listing agreement. Once you receive listing proposals from a few agents, how do you choose which one to partner with? Review the listing proposals, ask the agent for references, but most important, consider your ability to work with the potential agents. Because a home is one of the largest investments most make in a lifetime, you'll want to be sure that the Realtor you select is someone that you trust and someone who you feel understands your needs and goals. A: Sue, landscaping does indeed enhance the curb appeal of your home. It also can add a significant amount of value. The key is selecting the right plants and taking care not to overdo it. The first step I would recommend is to contact a professional landscaper, gardener or nursery worker. If you're not sure where to go, ask your Realtor. Why a professional? To maximize your investment, the quality of the landscaping should match the quality of your house. This is what I mean by not "overdoing" it. Most homeowners are not experienced enough to undertake such a project. Landscape designers can create a design that is both attractive and fits your home and neighborhood. They can also help you select the right plants for our region and for your specific property. What about the actual planting? If you are an experienced gardener and the landscape designer provides a detailed plan noting the spacing between plants, you may choose to do the planting yourself to save money. However, it is often best to leave this process to the experts. Doing so will help ensure that your investment pays off. The last piece of advice is to ensure that the upgraded landscape is properly maintained. This includes keeping shrubs and trees neatly trimmed, beds mulched and free of weeds, and growth pruned away from housing surfaces.

estate appraisals use a Comparison Method, which compares your home to similar homes that have sold to come up with an opin-

ion of value. A residential appraisal gives summarized and concise information about your house and is not the same as a home inspection.

Request a copy of the appraisal. When you bought your house, you paid for an appraisal.

If you didn't request a copy of the appraisal at the time, go back and request it from your lender now. It is your right under federal law to obtain a copy of the appraisal report. Make sure you get one from your lender.

Before you think about selling, review the appraisal report that was created when you bought your house. Look for things in the appraisal report that had a negative adjustment.

You may want to look at updat-

ing or remodeling those areas. Get your house appraised before you put it on the market. In a market that is fluctuating quickly, you may want to get an appraisal before you put your house on the market.

That will help you price it and help ensure that the house will appraise for your asking price. Many sellers are shocked when their house appraises below the asking price and, either their deal falls through, or they have to reduce their asking price.

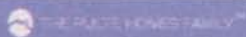

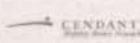

Should homeowners relocate their elderly parents with them?

America's graying. By 2010, one of every five Americans will be over 65. And with the transient nature of life these days, many of us are facing or will face a potentially painful decision: whether to relocate elderly parents with us or provide for them long distance.

According to the May 1997 issue of *Mobility Magazine*, more than half of homeowners age 65 and over have lived for 20 plus years in their home; three out of 10 for 30 plus years. These deep-rooted seniors generally prefer to stay put, having developed networks of friends and professionals within the community. Uprooting seniors from a known, stable environment to an unfamiliar locale may not always be the best plan. Many people appear to agree: The *Akron Beacon Journal* reported that seven million Americans are caring for elderly relatives long distance.

What should you do? Consider enlisting help from family and close friends since you'll be coor-

inating your move as well. These suggestions should help guide you through the process.

Start with an honest discussion with your relatives and family. List the possible scenarios. They may include staying in the current home with support; staying in the same community but downsizing from a home to an apartment; moving to a retirement community or nursing home; moving to the new locale and living with you; or moving to the new locale and living in suitable housing nearby.

Explore your financial situation. Can your parents afford the move? If your company is transferring you, talk with the relocation manager. You may be eligible for elder care assistance.

Research the new locale. A real estate professional is an excellent resource. Request area maps and information on cultural and recreational resources as well as materials written for senior citizens/retirees. Ask about trans-

Consider your parents' health. Would the locale be appropriate? What sort of medical resources are available there?

Talk with your spouse and children about the ramifications of your parents moving in with you. Would everyone get along? Is there enough space to ensure privacy? How will the household be effected?

How will your parents' social needs be met? How will the family budget be impacted? If the health of one of your parents

begins to fail, how will it be handled? Does the new locale offer senior transport? Would shops and social activities be within walking distance? Is there an extensive network of public transportation should your parents eventually give up driving?

Keep in mind that should your parents move, especially out of state, it may be very difficult to move them back if they do not adjust well. If possible, visit the new location with them prior to making a decision. A real estate professional can plan a "sightseeing tour" that will give them a better sense of what living there might be like.

Because this can be a very emotional time, you'll want to discuss the issues with sensitivity. Seek input from your parents. Listen to their concerns. And encourage

them to make as many of the decisions as possible.

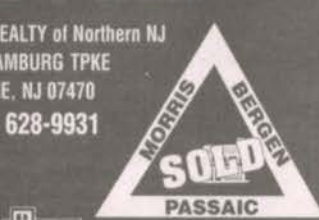

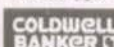

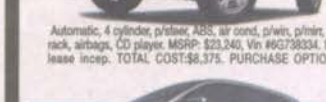

Volvo's small car, the S40, is a kick with T5 sports pack

There seems to be Volvo engineering ethic that getting there in style is half the fun. The other half is getting there with the T5 sports pack.

Volvo's smallest car in the United States, the S40 sedan (partner to the V50 wagon) is small and efficient with high-quality components that define "durable" luxury.

The S40/V50 has about 40 percent shared components with the Mazda3 and European Ford Focus - without looking or driving like an economy-class Ford or Mazda. The sedan competes with the Acura TSX, Audi A4 and VW Passat, with trade-ups from midsize sedans such as Honda Accord, Toyota Camry and the previous-generation VW Jetta.

Sold in three trim levels, the S40 2.4i has a starting price of \$24,450 and comes with a 168-horsepower, five-cylinder engine and five-speed manual transmission or optional five-speed Geartronic automatic transmission.

The sportier T5, today's test car, starts at \$27,310 and turbocharges the five-cylinder for 218 hp, which has a six-speed manual behind it.

The topline all-wheel-drive S40 T5 is \$29,085. Prices for each are up by about \$500 from 2005.

The S40 and the V50 wagon came out new in early 2004 and changes for '06 are minimal, including redesigned wheels, improved cup holders and a pushdown function to engage reverse gear on the six-speed manual transmission.



VOLVO S40 - Volvo's smallest car in the United States, the S40 sedan, has high-quality components that define luxury.

The EPA's Green Vehicle Guide (www.epa.gov/greenvehicles) gives it a rating of 9.5 out of 10 for air pollution score and 6 for greenhouse gas. The turbocharged engine drops to a combined score of 6/6.

Stepping up to the turbocharged model satisfies the performance demands and gives better fuel economy than the non-turbo engine. The T5 automatic is rated 22 mpg city and 30 highway, using 91 premium, versus 22/29 for the base car with five-speed manual shifter.

The car's suspension, steering and brake response are European refined and balanced.

Performance was most responsive when I was aggressive on the throttle.

Volvo says the throttle response intentionally lags slightly

to reduce engine torquing when the throttle is mashed.

I think Volvo can trust the Americans to know what to do with the power. They've given this market most everything else it likes in its cars.

The cabin is quiet on the highway up to 65 mph. Above that threshold, wind noise beats at the outside mirrors.

The interior has a distinctive Swedish influence, a no-frills but iconic styling that many Americans have become familiar with from shopping trips to Ikea, not Sweden.

The center dashboard console is a graceful flat panel that sweeps down to the gearshift console. The unique design uses a thin panel with open space behind and a small storage area.

Instead of the typical solid fas-

cia for air conditioning and audio controls, the trim panel, with satin silver surround, helps create open space in the small cabin, with a particularly snug back seat. Sightlines for the driver are good, despite the fast slope of the roof line. There are numerous useful storage areas.

The S40 takes a hard-nosed approach to safety - literally. It has four grades of steel for frontal impacts, and there are side air bags, dual-stage front air bags, a side-impact head curtain and whiplash protection.

Unlike larger midsize sedans, the S40 is more of a lifestyle choice. The average buyer will value its style and safety.

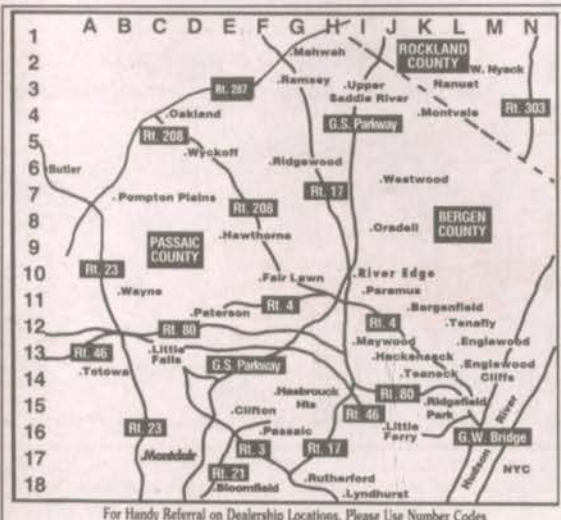
