## Area senior citizens cope with brutal summer heatwave

**WAYNE**—The recent heat wave that scorched the area wasn't enough to keep local seniors at home as many did their best to keep to their weekly routine.

At the Passaic County Senior Activity Center, located in Totowa, the atmosphere was hopping, the air conditioner was chilling, and Frank Sinatra was crooning on the

stereo where as close to 112 seniors from around the area gathered to enjoy their biweekly lunch and mingle.

An emergency cooling station at the Preakness Healthcare Center in Wayne which was operated by the Passaic County Board of Chosen Freeholders was also open for seniors from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. during the onset of the heat wave for the elderly who did not have air conditioning. Transportation was

arranged through Passaic County Paratransit program.

There wasn't a large turnout at Preakness Healthcare, however Lucinda Corrado, acting director, said many seniors concerned about a power outage called inquiring if they had a generator.

"I informed them that we did have a generator. I think many were wondering where they would go in case of a power outage," Corrado said.

Mary Brightman, 82, and Ray Van Noordt, 101, of Wayne, were the only ones who ventured to both locations despite the wicked temps. After the activity center closed at 2 p.m., they both boarded a bus provided by the county, a ride Brightman said was a bit unpleasant.

"This just goes to show how hot outside it really is. The air conditioning was on in the bus but we still felt the heat," Brightman stat-

ed. Laughing she added, "I wanted to stick an ice pack on myself... anywhere would have felt good at that point!"

The experience at both locations was very enjoyable, said Brightman, who stayed at Preakness with Van Noordt until 6 p.m. at which time the transportation service brought them home.

"It was really cool and there was

## Web site matches up soldiers with pen pals

"My Soldier" is a program that puts politics aside and lets United States soldiers know that someone back home cares.

Sgt. Juan Salas, who served for 14 months in Iraq, established the program with the help of his school, Manhattanville College, when he returned from the war. The goal of the program is to show support for troops serving in hardship areas - Iraq, Afghanistan, Africa - by establishing pen-pal relationships with them. When a person enrolls in the My Soldier program, they agree to adopt a soldier.

The Web site [www.mysoldier.com](http://www.mysoldier.com) allows those interested to register for a soldier to write to. Additionally it contains guidelines for letter writing and care package preparation with some fun themes such as "Taste of Home - A to Z." To participate individually, or with your family, sign up at [www.mysoldier.com](http://www.mysoldier.com) and within one week of registering, all registrants receive e-mail with the name and address of a soldier contact. When a person enrolls, they agree to adopt a sol-

dier. They receive a "starter kit" with guidelines for writing letters to their deployed United States Armed Serviceperson and a "My Soldier bracelet" to publicly show their support for American troops.

Typically, the soldier then replies and direct correspondence begins (about 60 percent of soldiers respond, but 100 percent appreciate getting the letters). Participants may also choose to send care packages, which are greatly appreciated (but not expected) by the soldiers. The program is free, but donations are encouraged.

As the family gets to know the soldier they establish friendships and connections that teach children the values of service and community and the knowledge that one person can make a difference. A wonderful, empowering message for a child is that he or she is important enough to have an impact on someone or something else.

## Auto spa owners work to help environment

**WAYNE** - Global warming is not an illusion or at least not according to Rob Burke, who believes enough to make saving the environment his number one priority.

Referring to it as his "own little science experiment," Burke renovated his Wayne Auto Spa after purchasing it 10 months ago with partner Robert Kaplan. And it is now completely environmentally friendly. Solar panels were placed on the south portion of the roof and well water is used to wash cars, which is filtered, recycled and then flushed into the municipal wastewater treatment plant. This water replaces the soapy liquid that used to drain into the Pompton River. The building's heating system is fueled by used motor oil.

"We had an ulterior motive when we bought this place to do only good things for the environ-

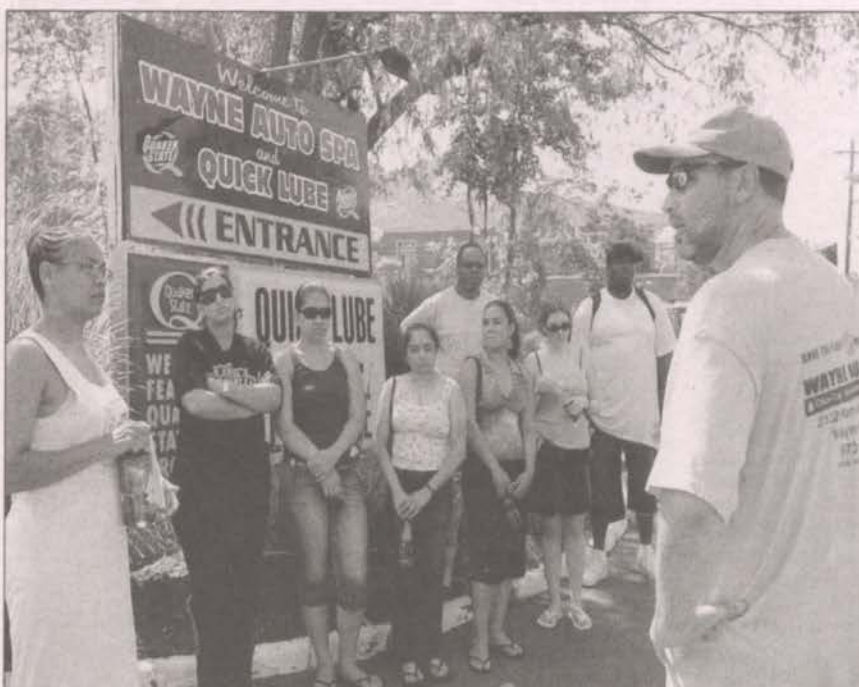
ment," Burke told a group of environmental students touring the facility from William Paterson University. "There's a need for evangelists to help spread the word."

Enthusiastic about the possibilities, Burke was gushing with alternative-energy ideas as he walked around his car wash and quick lube business with the students. Commenting on the breeze that was blowing, Burke pointed to a flagpole located at the front of his lot.

"There's definitely a good amount of wind to substantiate a wind turbine on that flagpole right there. If we can get that to happen, it would help to put Wayne on the map no doubt. It would be a sort of landmark," Burke said.

The township would have to give municipal approval for a windmill, as it would be set higher than the already existent 50-foot

## Clubbing in New York City a common thing for area teenagers

You can't blame area teenagers for wanting to party in the city, what with the skyline ever-so-present from Route 3 - hosting a "Sex in the City" like lifestyle just a half hour from Passaic County. New Yorkers nicknamed this select group of people, Bridge and Tunnelers - teens and 20-somethings that venture into Manhattan for an evening of club-hopping and drinking, then cross the state-line back home.

"I just love to drink and dance," says Pat Wallace, 17, a 2006 DePaul High School graduate, living in Wayne, with his family. Wallace parties in the city once a month, because "there aren't cool clubs in Jersey."

For Jennifer Moore and teenage girls like her, it was all very routine - the primping of eyelashes, and the all-important decision of what-to-wear.

"For me, going to the city was something I would do when I felt that my town was too small and boring. I think of New York as a fun, exciting place, full of adventure," says Lindsay Durr, 20, a 2004 Wayne Valley graduate.

What started off as just another

night of partying in Manhattan ended in tragedy. The body of Jennifer Moore, 18, a Harrington Park resident, was discovered days after she was last seen trolling along the outskirts of Manhattan on the Westside Highway. A preliminary autopsy report was released and noted "blunt force trauma to the head and strangulation."

Moore and her friend, Tara Keenan, 18, ventured into New York City on July 24. They parked the car, a red Dodge Sedan in a "no-standing" zone, and entered the 21-and-up Chelsea nightclub Guest House.

"I got my first fake ID when I was 15," says Wallace. "If you know the right people, you'll get in - with or without ID - no questions asked."

Kelly Pyburn, 18, a 2006 Wayne Valley graduate concurs, "I've gotten bracelets" (that boast a 21 and over visual for bartenders).

For most teens, driving into the city can be bothersome. There's the question of where to park, how much parking will cost, and who will be the designated driver.

"Driving into the city and finding parking is an expensive hassle. I went to Avalon (a Manhattan nightclub that admits ladies 18 and over) after the prom in a limo," says

Pyburn. Moore was denied access to her friend's car after impound attendees questioned her sobriety. Keenan, the owner of the car, passed out at the tow yard and was ushered away by an ambulance and taken to St. Vincent's Hospital. A handful of cops and medics tended to a sick Keenan, while Moore reportedly used the yard's bathroom and then wandered off alone.

Not choosing a designated driver is an all-too common and worse, fatal mistake a lot of teens make. Wallace says, "There is always a designated driver. We take turns."

And underage drinking is a seemingly popular trend.

"Red bull and vodka is a good choice. It gives you a buzz and keeps you awake," according to a 2004 Wayne Valley graduate who prefers to remain anonymous.

Upon wandering off onto the Westside Highway, a strip of road sandwiched between the Hudson River and warehouse property, Moore reportedly phoned her boyfriend, Kofi Boakye, from her

cell phone. Allegedly she told him she was lost and being trailed by an African-American man. He told her to call a cab.

Next, Draymond Coleman, 25, a drifter, who was later apprehended by New York City Police as a suspect in the disappearance and murder of Moore, apparently lured her into a cab by offering her a ride to Weehawken.

"Sometimes girls just do it for attention. Leave with someone. I'd never let any of my friends go off with someone, even if I needed to handcuff them," says Pyburn.

"Guys try to pick up my girlfriends all the time, and sometimes depending on the situation they want to go with them, but I never allow it. There have been times when I've had to drag my friends to different locales just to get away from the guys," says Wallace.

Moore's family reported her missing the next day, after she didn't return home.

"I have a really great relationship with my parents. I can call them anytime, any situation. If I was in Moore's situation, I would

have immediately called home," says Pyburn. Sixteen year-old Meghan Cooke, a junior at Wayne Valley says, "My mom doesn't let me go to clubs. A lot of people I know go to Abyss (in Sayreville). My friends and I opt for movies, hanging out at each other's houses."

Moore's murder bares a resemblance to the case of Imette St. Guillen - the John Jay College graduate student who was lured from New York bar on Feb. 26 and brutally bound, raped, then murdered. In both instances the victims were allegedly intoxicated and ending their respective evenings solo.

"You never think anything like this could happen to you, or to one of your friends. It's simple - don't be stupid. Always have a sober person you can trust. It's not only about having a designated driver, but also a designated friend. You need someone who will come with you to the bathroom, who won't leave you behind, or worse let you wander off," says Pyburn.

## Housing improvement plan offered

**WAYNE** – The Wayne Township Housing Improvement Program is designed to provide funding opportunities for owners of sub-standard housing located in the township to bring such structures up to code standard and provide safe and sufficient living quarters for low and moderate-income households. The program is guided by and complies with the rules of the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

All funding will be made in the form of a "deferred loan" that requires repayment only upon the sale, transfer of title, other disposition of the subject premises, or upon the death of an individual owner-occupier within six years of completion of the rehabilitation. If the homeowner remains in the residence for the six-year life of the loan, it is "forgiven". There are no monthly payments associated with this program.

Homeowners applying must be considered low or moderate-income status as defined by HUD and the Council on Affordable

Housing (COAH). The total combined annual income for the household cannot exceed the levels established by these agencies. Income limits are based on family size and are updated annually. For example, the current limits for a family of four are \$38,821 under the low-income guideline or \$62,114 under the moderate-income guideline for Passaic County. Current income guidelines for other household sizes are available at the Township Parks and Recreation Department.

To qualify, a dwelling must be identified as code deficient by a township construction official. The home can also be in need of non-health, safety, or welfare related items including, but not limited to, storm windows, insulation or other energy conservation measures. All units that are rehabilitated with funds under this program will be made to comply with code standard for existing housing. The construction official will issue a Certificate of Compliance when a unit has met these

criteria.

Examples of the types of improvements that may be funded include, but are not limited to the following: Roof repairs/replacement; window repairs/replacement; stove repair/replacement (if non-functioning); removal of asbestos; interior walls, ceilings, floors, etc.; exterior repairs including siding, drainage facilities, re-pointing, etc.; flood protection measures; stairways, steps, handrails; removal of lead-based paint; structural components (foundation, framing, etc.); utility repairs/replacement including heating systems, plumbing, electrical, gas, septic systems and public sewer hook-up.

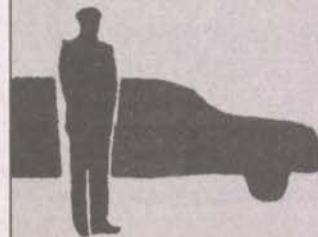

## Be prepared for potential power outages

When summer temperatures rise, so does the amount of electricity we use to stay cool. We generally take that electricity for granted but when the power goes out due to a thunderstorm, hurricane or major blackout, we see how dependent we are on our lights and appliances.

The American Red Cross recommends that every home have an emergency supply kit and every resident an emergency plan for dealing with the situation. Even an hour without electricity can be at least inconvenient and possibly dangerous. Flashlights are inexpensive, come in many sizes, and can prevent people from falling in the dark and being injured. Burning candles as a source of light is not worth the risk of burning down the house.

Test flashlights occasionally to make sure that they still work. A battery-operated radio will provide entertainment when the TV and computer cannot be used and it will keep everyone informed as to what is happening regarding the emergency.

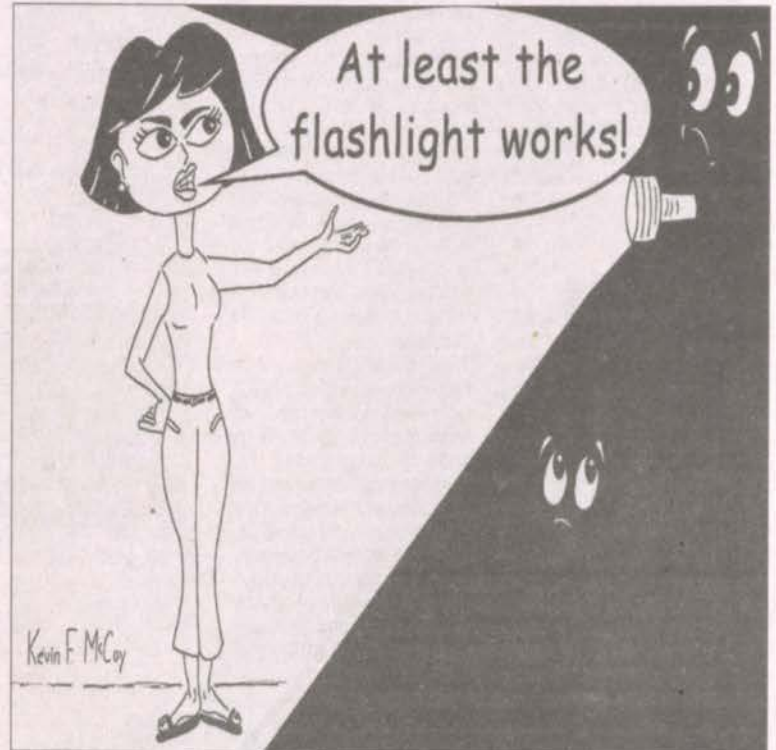
Keep fresh batteries in the house in the sizes required by all the items that they operate.

At least a gallon of bottled water (especially if your source of water is a well and you need electricity to operate the pump) and a small supply of nonperishable food will be appreciated if you are without power for hours. Always have basic first aid supplies handy.

Purchase a few bags of ice at the start of the outage or if a severe storm is predicted. Put them in a cooler to keep some items from the refrigerator cold during the emergency. You can also make ice in small plastic containers and keep them in your freezer. These, like bags of ice, could be used in a cooler or just placed with your food in the refrigerator while it is not working.

Your car should also be equipped for an emergency. The American Red Cross recommends that every car contain some of the same items you should keep at home: a first aid kit, bottled water, non-perishable food (such as peanut butter and a box of crackers), a plastic container with a lid, a blanket, a battery-operated radio and flashlight with fresh batteries, and extra batteries. Flares are also good to have.

Being prepared makes summer emergencies easier to handle.



## Cheat sheet is longer than Pinocchio's nose

The latest flap about cheating in the sports world centered on Floyd Landis, Tour de France cycling competitor, who is accused of drug use. The fact that the arthritic Landis is also a candidate for a hip replacement is immaterial. Rules are rules.

But rules didn't stop other athletes, carefully adjusting almost imperceptible details, but getting caught as well. The infamous list includes baseball's Sammy Sosa and Albert Bell for illegal bats, and the most notorious Chicago White Sox of 1918 with Shoeless Joe Jackson who threw the World Series.

There was also Boston Marathoner Rosie Ruiz, who took a shortcut via the T (subway in Boston) and Little League's Dominican contender Danny Almonte whose age was fudged by a couple of years to make him eligible to play.

Cheating is hardly limited to the world of sports. One look at American politics testifies to that. We have lobbyists paying off elected officials (sometimes caught, charged and prosecuted but often not). We have illegal contributions to political campaigns (sometimes caught, sometimes not). And we have "pork"

pushed illegally into bills after they're passed in Congress. We have a president who circumvents Congress with "signing statements," which create loopholes so he can disregard the will of the elected representatives.

In New Jersey, we have an attorney general who wheedles the way past a traffic summons for someone close to her, bypass-

ing the legal system of which she has sworn to uphold and enforce.

It's not uncommon to find news stories about lying and cheating Medicare. Doctors are reported to file fictitious insurance forms to bilk the system.

Among the biggest cheat scandals this year is the revelation of the millions of dollars misdirected after hurricane Katrina, then mispent by recipients.

Among the cheating on the federal level is the enormous Halliburton empire racking up a fortune from bids obtained for Iraqi projects, most of which have been unfulfilled, though the money is

spent. Cheating is everywhere, not just in sports, business and the government. Spouses cheat on one another. Individuals cheat on their tax returns and students use crib sheets and electronic devices to cheat on tests. Journalists plagiarize. Authors of nonfiction make up "facts" (and make the Best Seller lists as well as win literary prizes).

Honor is becoming an archaic term. Truth is getting harder to pinpoint. It's hard to find an area in which respect, credibility and honesty regularly prevail.

But it's sure easy to find a liar and a cheat, isn't it?

nice conversation at Preakness. I felt like we were at a nice restaurant, it was beautiful. I don't like the heat myself but he (Van Noordt) likes it," Brightman said, pointing to her friend.

For most seniors, companionship beats the heat anytime.

As Helen Vella, 80, who lives with her daughter in Wayne explained, coming to the activity center allows her to meet new people.

"We have air conditioning all through the house, I just like to come here. But I have strict orders from my daughter, who's a nurse, that I am not to go anywhere else

because the heat is dangerous," said Vella.

The story was the same with Emily Roth, 84, of Wayne.

"Just getting to the bus you feel the intense heat. There's air conditioning at home but I feel very lucky to be able to come here as well to cool off and talk with friends," Roth said. "It's the best place in the world."

Many of the seniors as well followed the usual rules a means to staying cool.

"I've been drinking lots of iced tea, lemonade, and of course water and it seems to help. It's what's recommended anyhow so you won't dehydrate. And I made sure to wear light clothing and shorts. It gets to the point where you can't take anymore off without being

indecent," Smith said, smiling.

Down the street at Siena Village, some of the elderly were just taking it easy in the lobby where the air conditioning was on full blast, a welcoming feeling for those coming in from the sweltering heat.

"To tell you the truth, I don't even stick my nose outside. I have air conditioning in my apartment so why do yourself damage but some of the elderly don't listen and they go out," said Nora Degasero, 78.

But for most seniors, air conditioning was not available when they were younger — some were lucky if they had a fan. As well, heat waves with such blistering temperatures were not common back in the day either.

Degasero agreed.

"As a kid, I don't remember it being this hot. It's really bad out there. But when it did get hot we just suffered with it. And there was no swimming pools to jump in or anything. We survived it though," Degasero recalled.

As a kid living in Clifton, Jim Parolie, 84, can remember escaping to Garret Mountain to sleep at night when it was too hot.

"We used to hop the bus to the mountain where it was cooler or I used to sleep on the roof of my house. But it was never as hot as this," said Parolie, a Siena Village resident.

Former Chicago resident, John Aurelio, 90, who now lives at Siena, said although he is used to the heat, he still remains indoors.

"It doesn't bother me, but I just

sit in the lobby and cool off and I have air conditioning in my apartment too," Aurelio said.

According to Kuzinski, the activity center gained a few extra seniors looking to cool off but they also lost some regulars due to the heat.

"We try to raise awareness among the seniors because they have the mentality that they didn't have air conditioning when they were growing up but what they don't realize is that they were also younger then and many are on medication now too. It's a precaution and not something to make light of," Kuzinski said. "This is very, very intense heat"

# Senator forms gang task force

Politicians, law enforcement, and community organizations are joining forces to address an ongoing menace.

Recently, state Sen. John Girgenti (D-35th) formed a gang task force. The panel – comprised of about 20 members – will make suggestions for combating the root causes behind criminal bands. The forum held an introductory session on July 24 in the senator's office at 507 Lafayette Ave. in Hawthorne, according to Andre Sayegh, a Girgenti aide.

Sayegh billed Girgenti's task force as a "precedent" in confronting the gang problem. He said the senator is suited to lead the initiative, being state Senate Law and Public Safety Committee chair.

In a release, Girgenti said the ad hoc organization is designed to explore and recommend ways of discouraging gang membership.

"Our charge is to not only bring a greater sense of urgency to this issue, but to also make gang participation less attractive. A collective grassroots campaign must be launched to address this scourge in

our community. Therefore, I am announcing the establishment of my gang task force."

Among the organization's appointees are Passaic County Jersey Speziale, Passaic County Prosecutor James Avigliano, and Paterson Mayor Jose Torres. Other representatives include Joe Cheff, Passaic County Education Association president, and Dr. Michael Glascoe, Paterson superintendent of schools.

In addition, the group has a number of Paterson police and community officials, as well as others from Glen Rock, Hawthorne, and Prospect Park.

Among those applauding Girgenti's anti-gang advisory outfit is Speziale, according to Bill Maer, Passaic County Sheriff Department (PCSD) spokesperson.

"He feels that it's great to see the senator using the power of his office to address a serious problem. The sheriff feels that gangs is the major reason for much of the criminal activity that occurs in Passaic County," Maer added the same holds true for many other places, including the New York/Metro area.

According to Maer, Speziale

believes the task force can help conceive strategies to assist law enforcement in countering the aforementioned scourge.

Sayegh said the senator's task force would focus on changing the misconception that some people have about gangs.

"How do we make gangs less appealing and schools more alluring? I think we have to debunk the notion that's it's cool to be in a gang."

The Girgenti aide also said the panel's makeup entails different backgrounds for diverse input.

"We can't have it top heavy with folks dealing with public safety all the time."

Sayegh said the forum's next meeting would be in later this month or early September.

Incidentally, Girgenti is backing a number of bills that will crack-down on gang activity. Among them: upgrading the punishment for illegally conveying a firearm to a minor, and declaring the use of a community gun – a firearm shared among criminals – punishable by five to 10 years in jail, or up to \$150,000 in fines. Another would permit towns to enact anti-gang loitering zones.

restriction on structures. The windmill would help to generate electricity.

Mayor Scott Rumana, an energy saving advocate himself, promoting the idea of cogeneration, is one of Burke's biggest fans.

"The windmill is a great idea. We'll have to look at it with him from a zoning perspective but I'm thrilled with the job they've done there so far. People need to be committed on a whole because you can't put a price tag on saving the environment, Rumana said.

It's not rocket science. Burke and Kaplan installed furnaces that burn used motor oil to heat the facility as opposed to having it picked up and hauled away to be cleaned and reused all for .50 cents a gallon. However as Burke sees it, utilizing the oil himself actually make sense if you think about it.

"The offset is having a big diesel truck driving all around picking up the oil and spewing fumes into the atmosphere. It may not be much but at least its something positive

we're doing," Burke stated.

Burke estimated spending \$200,000 so far on environmentally friendly projects and although they received a 50 percent rebate from the BPU to supplement the cost for solar panels, Burke admits that the economic payback it not a huge reflection as a small business owner.

"Global warming is not a joke and we expect to be here for the long haul. We're not going anywhere soon and energy costs are rising," said Burke.

WPU student Lewis Robinson was extremely enthused with what Burke and Kaplan have done.

"It's very positive. People are too busy to know the reasons the environment is in the situation that it's in. That's why word of mouth works wonders, it's like the domino effect," Robinson said.

Natalie Patasaw, professor for Environmental Studies at WPU, was equally pleased with what she witnessed at the Wayne Auto Spa.

"It's terrific for the students to see what they've learned in books being put to work. It sends a message to everyone that recycling and pitching in to save the environment must be an everyday routine in order for it to be successful.

Hopefully other car washes will pick up on Rob's ideas and make similar changes in their businesses," Patasaw stated.

John Leonhard of American Energy Technologies, which installed Burke's solar-power system, said this project was quite unusual in the way that it's a smaller business.

"As far as I know, this is the only car wash in New Jersey with solar power and for the time being the only one in Passaic County," he said. Leonhard added that his company will be installing solar panels on World Gym located in Wedgewood Plaza in the upcoming months.

As it's true that Wayne Auto Spa's 58 solar panels are not nearly as big an effort as such businesses like Johnson & Johnson, which covered the roof of one of its plants with over 1,000 tiles, but Burke says they have generated over 20 percent of his electrical requirement.

It can generate close to 15,000 kilowatt hours annually, helping to reduce the need for electricity produced by burning coal equal to almost 12 tons of carbon dioxide. And conserving electricity during the recent heat waves can only be positive in the grand scale of things.

Derick Siebs, store manager at Strauss Discount Auto, located

down the street from Wayne Auto Spa, agreed. "Using solar energy is a very good idea. Just the other day during the heat alert we had to

turn down all the lights in the shop."

# Police seek clues on stolen signs

Six markers found in two parks, four are still missing

WAYNE - Authorities are seeking information on some uprooted elegant style park markers. Some of the decorative signs have been found, while others have not been recovered.

According to police, a total of 10 green signs with gold lettering were taken from the township park system. Four were taken during the night of July 11 to July 12, and six were uprooted during the night of

July 31 to Aug. 1, according to Wayne Police Detective Capt. Paul Ireland.

The crimes were discovered by Senior Township Ranger Bob Morgenfruh, while conducting park patrol.

Recently, Ireland said, four of the markers surfaced in Lt. Carey Arthur Park, and two turned up in Rumana Park. The spokesperson said police are checking the retrieved objects for fingerprint/DNA evidence.

According to Morgenfruh, four markers from the following recreational areas are still at large: Froehner Park, Hamilton Park, Shai-Shacknai Park, and Riverview Park.

Ireland said police are giving extra attention to the township's

42-site recreational ground network. The captain said the culprit is using mobile means to carry out the vandalism.

"Whoever is doing it has a car or is being driven around, because the incidents are all over town."

Ireland said it is possible that more than one criminal may be behind the park property purloin pattern.

The captain said police are hoping for the recovery of all markers.

"I'm told that is approximately \$700 for people to purchase the signs, and donate them to the parks."

Ireland said anyone with information on the thefts is asked to call the Wayne Police Juvenile Bureau at (973) 633-3540. All tips will stay confidential.

# Make safety a priority for all vacation plans

A summer vacation trip can be a very pleasant experience. However, certain precautions can be taken to ensure personal safety and home security while away.

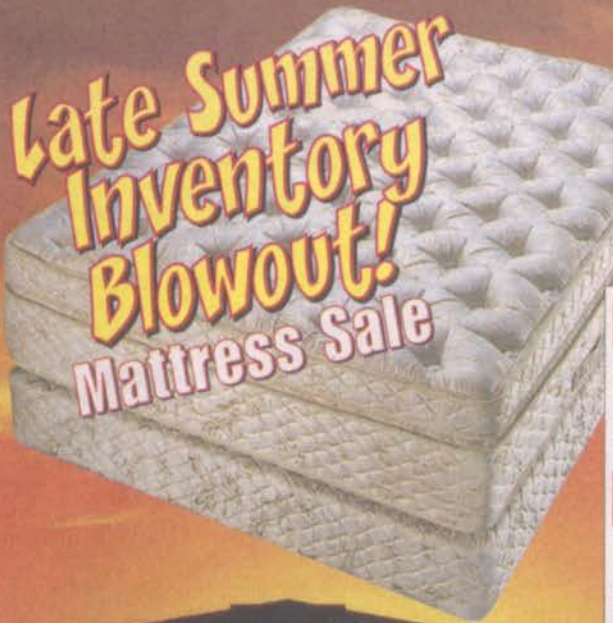

DHSS urges public to avoid dangers of extreme heat

With temperatures reaching 100 degrees or higher this summer, the New Jersey Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS) warns residents that the heat can be dangerous as well as uncomfortable.

"The excessive heat and humidity can cause serious health conditions to develop very quickly - especially heat stroke and heat exhaustion," said Health and Senior Services Commissioner Fred M. Jacobs, M.D., J.D. "Both conditions can be serious and may require hospitalization. Everyone should drink plenty of fluids, spend time in cool places and reduce or reschedule any physical activity."

"And please remember to check on elderly family members and neighbors to make sure they are safe," Dr. Jacobs added.

To avoid health complications from excessive heat:

Drink plenty of water or other non-alcoholic beverages.

Make sure children and the elderly are drinking water, and ensure that persons with mobility problems have adequate fluids in easy reach.

If you do not have air conditioning, spend time in air-conditioned places such as libraries, movies, malls, schools or other public buildings during the hottest hours of the day.

Wear loose and light-colored clothing. Wear a hat when outdoors.

Reduce physical activity or

reschedule it for cooler times of the day.

Don't leave children, a frail elderly or disabled person or pets in an enclosed car - not even for a minute - as temperatures can quickly climb to dangerous levels.

Talk to your health care provider about any medicine or drugs you are taking. Certain medications, such as tranquilizers and drugs used to treat Parkinson's disease, can increase the risk of heat-related illness.

People suffering heatstroke can go from appearing normal to extremely ill in a matter of minutes.

Victims may have hot, dry skin, a high body temperature of 106 degrees or more, an absence of sweat, and a rapid and strong pulse. Victims may become delirious or unconscious. Persons suffering from heatstroke need immediate medical attention.

Heat exhaustion is a milder illness that may take several days of high temperatures to develop. Victims may have pale, clammy skin and sweat profusely. They may feel tired, weak or dizzy and have headaches or sometimes cramps, but their body temperature will remain close to normal.

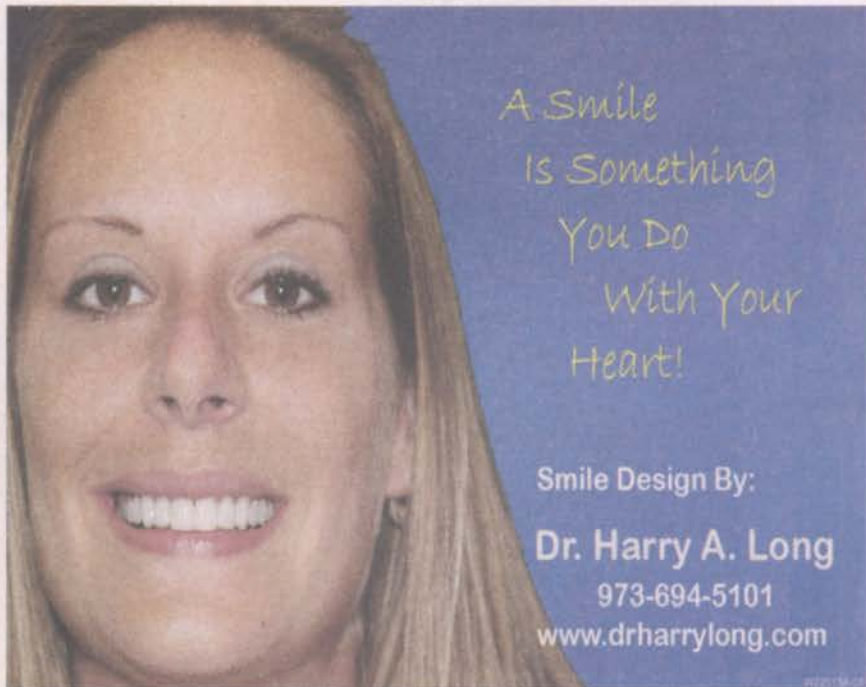

## Dr. Philip Bai first to offer VNS therapy

# BACK TO SCHOOL

## Are this year's college grads ready to start their careers?

This past spring, 1.4 million new college graduates flooded into the job market after receiving their diplomas. The good news is that it is the strongest job market we have experienced in five years. The bad news is that many of these graduates will be unprepared to begin building their careers successfully.

"Career counselors on campus don't necessarily give graduates the tools they need to build rewarding careers," says Wendy Adams, a career coach. "Some predict that we will have the most unskilled, unprepared workforce in professional history. If the individuals entering into our workforce do not feel personally empowered and equipped for success, both they and the organizations they support

will suffer."

Adams, (with co-author and husband Gene Pometto) penned the recently released book, "The Coach Compass, Navigation Tools for Career and Life Success." She makes the point that recent grads need to formulate some kind of strategy before embarking on their careers. "Grads should have a detailed career plan in place," says Adams. "While much of the advice for graduates focuses on landing that first job, unfortunately not enough of it focuses on building a satisfying career."

Her book provides sound strategies that could potentially set today's graduates on a rewarding

career course by breaking down the career lifecycle into twelve potential positions. It gives abundant examples of how each of these positions can be comfortably navigated in positive, growth-promoting ways, and conversely, how the lack of self-knowledge and motivation when overcoming obstacles may eventually lead to apathy, stagnation and disappointment.

"It's important for recent grads to realize that a job is not a career and should not be viewed as such," says Adams. "A common mistake is that graduates focus too much on the job, while overlooking the essential elements that could lead to a more fulfilling career. Focus on the whole and not just one of the parts. You can really choose how successful you want to be, by clearly defining who you are, what you do, and what you want. It's not what happens to you, it's what you make happen!"

Adams advises graduates to pursue a career that makes the best use of their talents and passions. "As you ponder the next big step in your career, weigh it in terms of how it satisfies you both personally and financially," says Adams. "The most meaningful work is work that allows a person to express his or her authentic self." She offers some suggestions for recent graduates:

- Decide what you want out of your career and draw up a plan "on paper."

- Articulate and map out what you have to offer potential employers.

- Use your personal connections with professors, business associates, and even your parents' friends in order to promote your value and expand your reach.

- Continually emphasize your potential.

To the question "How successful do you want to be?" Adams and Pometto say: "You decide." The future is literally in the hands of our graduating students and it will be up to them to decide where they want to go from here. "While parents, peers, teachers and mentors may have had to opportunity to encourage you to develop to certain preferences, skills and interests, you are ultimately the one that will need to address the barriers that prevent success from happening," says Adams.

Spartan coach Greg Komeshok was pleased to have both back this year.

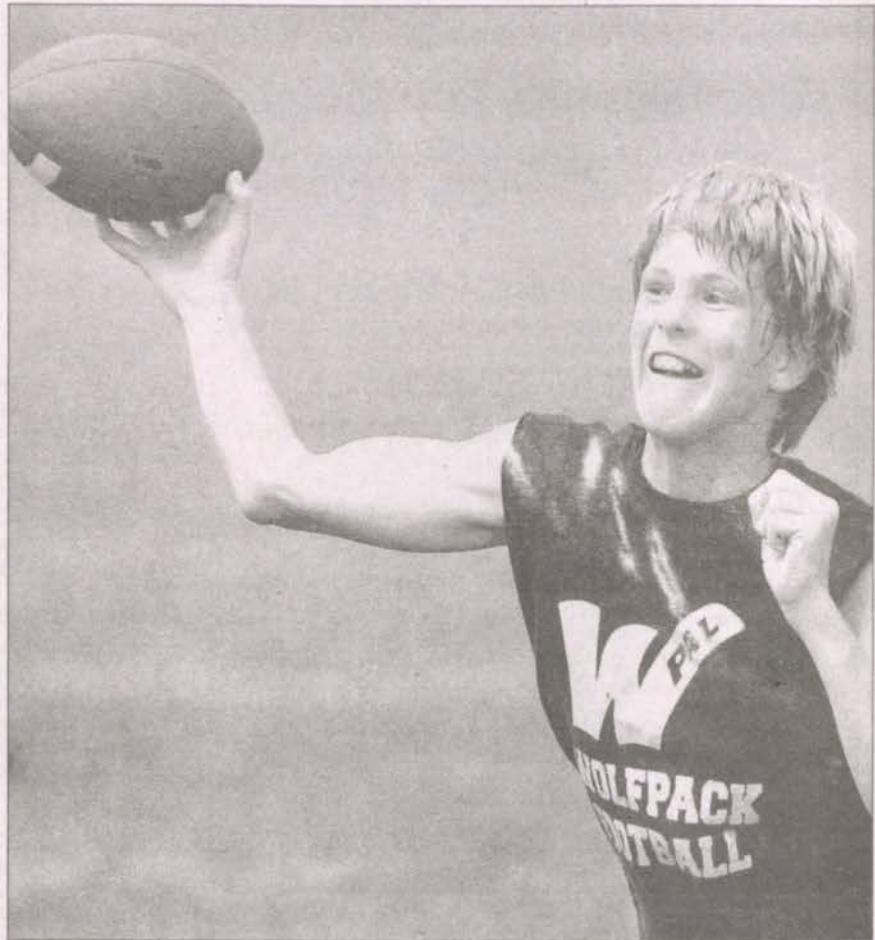
"They're both excellent leaders," said Komeshok. "They prepare themselves well and always come to play and will do anything or play anywhere you ask to help the team win."

his freshman season prematurely. Fully recovered, Cavanaugh then made the baseball squad as a walk-on.

"The coaches are very supportive of my playing the other sport," said Cavanaugh. "They might like to have you all year for their sport, but they understand as long as you're doing everything you can to work on the other. I would like to continue with both as long as I

Ted was inspired by Lennie's knowledge and teaching methods. Studying with Lennie allowed Ted to learn to stretch out and develop into a real improvising jazz musician.

Ted's recording career started in 1956 with Ronnie Ball and Kenny Clarke. In 1956 he also recorded 2 albums with fellow Tristano student and tenor saxophonist, Marsh, plus his first LP as leader with Marsh and Art Pepper titled "Free Wheeling."

In 1976, Ted resumed studies with Tristano and recorded again with Konitz. In 1985 and 1987 Criss Cross Records signed Ted for two albums: one with Jimmy Raney, Hod O'Brien and Buster Williams at Rudy Van Gelder's studio and the other with Hod and Dutch bassist, Jacques Schols in Amsterdam.

Just before his 75<sup>th</sup> birthday in 2002, Ted recorded another CD for Steeplechase titled "Preservation." Blue Jack Jazz Records of Amsterdam will release in 2006 a recording of Ted with Hod O'Brien. Ted has been dedicated to the art of jazz improvisation for

over 60 years and continues to pursue that ambition.

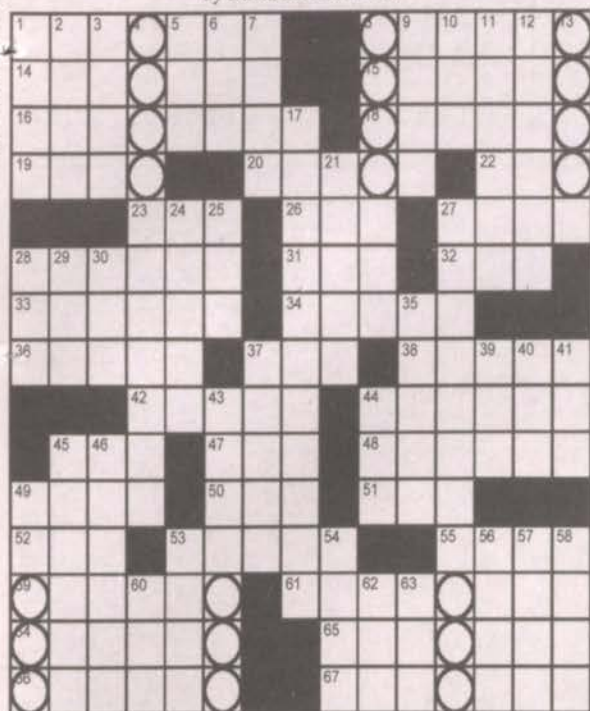

## Joe Piscopo headlines at The Hilton

Following a series of Saturday night specials at the Sands earlier this year, Joe Piscopo now comes to the Hilton for a week of comedy and music. He'll open next Monday and run through Thursday, with showtimes at 7 p.m. each evening.

"I'm so excited about the new show we're putting together for the Hilton gig," he declares. "This will be different from anything I've done before." Piscopo will be backed by a smokin' jazz sextet under the direction of Vinnie Falcone, long-time pianist for Piscopo's idol Frank Sinatra. In addition to Joe's comedy schtick, he's put together a program of classics from the Sinatra songbook. "I'll get to play the drums, piano, even a classical flute piece," he enthuses. "We'll have a blast!" Showtimes are Monday through Thursday, August 13-17, at 7 p.m. Tickets are \$25.

The building excitement continues here in AC, with the groundbreaking this week for the new, \$250 million hotel tower at the Trump Taj Mahal Casino Resort. The new tower is planned to add 786 rooms to the Taj Mahal, which currently has 1,250 rooms in the existing hotel tower. Standing 40 stories high and 450-feet tall, the tower's rooms include 716 generously apportioned standard guest rooms and 70 suites with ocean views. The new tower is scheduled to open summer of 2008.

Meanwhile, of course, there are two soaring towers under construction over at the Marina. Earlier this year Harrah's broke ground for their fourth hotel tower. The centerpiece of the expansion will be a 964-room, 47 story, 557 foot hotel tower, featuring 13 super-suites and 183 suites. Upon completion the new tower, scheduled to open second quarter 2008, will increase Harrah's hotel capacity by almost 60%, bringing the property to 2,594 rooms. Incidentally Harrah's new tower will be the tallest hotel casino in Atlantic City and the second tallest building in New Jersey. (Record-holder is the Goldman Sachs tower in Jersey City.)

Borgata, which opened its fabulous \$2-billion hotel casino just three years ago, reports construction is now well underway for their new \$325 million Water Club. ## Experts suggest homeowners to give their roof an annual inspection

The next time you step outside, take a good look at the roof over your home. Are there trees touching it? Do you see loose or damaged shingles? Are some of them covered with black streaks? If so, your roof is well overdue for a maintenance checkup.

"Inspecting the roof for signs of damage is something homeowners

should do every year, but in my experience not enough people do it," says Connecticut builder John Provenzano.

Most asphalt roof systems are designed to provide useful service for about 15 years. Slate, clay, tile and certain metal systems can last longer, but only if well maintained. Here's a roof inspection checklist

Provenzano recommends you follow."

Trees can cause a myriad of problems for roofs of all types. Branches leaning on the roof will scratch and gouge roofing materials when they are blown by the wind; falling branches from overhanging trees can damage, or even puncture shingles and other roof-

ing materials; and falling leaves can clog gutter systems causing water to backup into the attic or living spaces, or to run down behind the fascia.

If you have streaks on the roof, it's an indication that you have a problem with mold, algae or fungus. They readily grow during periods of high humidity, especially on

north facing roofs and on roofs that stay in the shade for long periods of time.

Trimming back nearby trees to reduce shade and improve air circulation could help with the problem; but for permanent protection, it's a good idea to install zinc strips,

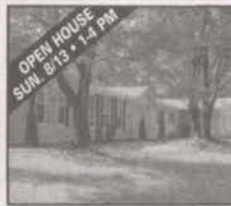

# Owning a vacation is more affordable with tax benefits

Tax breaks can make owning a vacation home more affordable. If you're looking to claim the most tax breaks possible, you need to carefully track the amount of time you and your family spend at your vacation home. According to the New Jersey Society of Certified Public Accountants (NJSCPA), there are three basic scenarios of vacation home use, and a different tax treatment applies to each.

The tax treatment of your vacation home depends on the number of days you rent it at fair market value and the number of personal use days. In addition to the days you use the home, you must count as personal use any part of a day that the residence is used for personal purposes by a relative and by any individual who rents the residence for less than fair market rent. In addition, any day that your vacation home is used by your parents or grandparents, children, grandchildren or siblings is count-

ed as personal use - even if the family members paid fair market rent.

Alternatively, days you spend working on your vacation home are not counted as personal use days if they are primarily spent making repairs or getting the property ready for tenants. For tax purposes, a second home can be a boat or even recreational vehicle as long as it has permanent sleeping, cooking and toilet facilities.

**Scenario 1: Use Often, Rent Seldom**

If you rent your home for less than 15 days during the year, any rental income you collect is tax-free. You don't even have to report the income on your tax return. You can still deduct property taxes and mortgage interest whether or not the property is used to produce income. However, you cannot deduct any rental-related expenses.

**Scenario 2: Use Seldom, Rent Often**

If personal use of your vacation home doesn't exceed 14 days a tax year or 10 percent of the total number of days it is rented out at fair market value, whichever is greater, your vacation home qualifies as a rental property. As the owner of a rental property, you must report the entire rental income you receive. However, you may qualify to deduct expenses related to renting, such as depreciation, utilities, repairs and property management fees.

If you end the year with a net profit from the rental income, you may deduct all your rental expenses. However, if you had a net loss, your deduction will be limited by the passive activity rule. A passive activity involves the conduct, trade or business in which you are not materially participating. An exception applies if you actively participate in managing rental activities. In such cases, you can deduct up to \$25,000 in rental losses against

other non-passive income, such as wages. This deduction begins to phase out when your adjusted gross income (AGI) exceeds \$100,000 and disappears completely when your AGI reaches \$150,000. The passive activity loss cannot be carried forward to future years.

**Scenario 3: Use Some and Rent Some**

If you and your family personally use the home more than 14 days a year or, if more than 10 percent of the number of days it is rented to others is at fair market value, your vacation home is treated as a residence. You must report all rental income on your tax return, and you may be able to deduct your rental expenses, but only up to the total amount of rental income.

You cannot use the excess rental expenses to offset income from other sources. You can, however, carry the excess expenses forward to the next year and treat them as

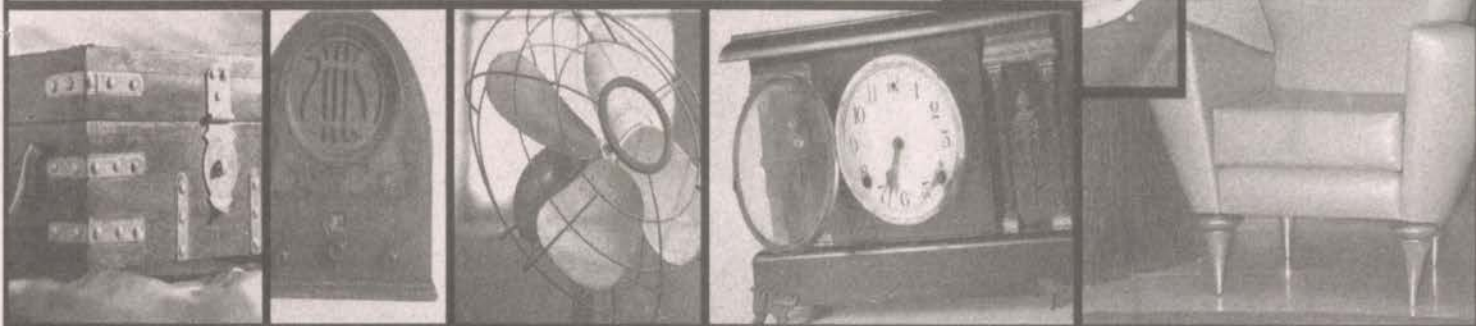
rental expenses for the same property up to the amount of rental income for the year.

With proper planning and professional advice, you can maximize tax benefits and your personal enjoyment of your vacation home. A CPA can help you determine the best strategy.

like Shingle Shield Roof Protector strips, along the ridge of the roof.

If you have a new roof, just the strips will suffice. If you're installing them on a roof with streaks, Provenzano says you'll need to first clean off the vegetation.

When shingles are missing or torn off, a roof structure and home or building interior are vulnerable to water damage and rot. Weakened shingles or tiles are easily blown off, torn or lifted by wind gusts. Since a deteriorated roof system only gets worse with time, once you discover a problem, you should take steps to repair the damage immediately.

"The key to a roof system's effectiveness is complete protection," he says. "Don't leave your roof's integrity to chance. Make a point of doing an annual inspection. You'll be glad you did."

**Q:** I have recently listed my home with an online company who puts your home in the Multiple Listings for the area you are selling it in. It seems now that I have my listing all set up with them, I have had zero calls on my home and there has been no Realtor interest. I know the market is slower, but I thought I would be getting some inquiry on the home. Should I now list with a traditional Realtor? What would you advise?

Carol Kinnelon

**A:** Carol, you raise a few issues, so let's begin with the first - lack of consumer interest. There are a number of things you should consider to help increase consumer interest in your home. The first thing you may want to look at is the price - one of the most critical factors in selling a home. If your home is not priced correctly for today's market conditions, this alone could explain the lack of interest. How did you establish your listing price? Did your online listing company provide you

with a local market analysis including listings of comparable houses that recently sold in your area? Comps, as they're called, can provide a good basis for establishing a competitive selling price. The next thing you may want to look at is the company's marketing services. How is your online firm marketing your home to consumers? In addition to the online listing, an open house, placing newspaper advertising, or creating property brochures and sell sheets might be appropriate. Now, onto your next issue - lack of Realtor interest. The issue here may be one of the following: Are there showing instructions clearly outlined for Realtors to follow? Showing instructions typically provide the homeowner's phone number so Realtors may arrange a showing. Is there a lockbox that Realtors can use to show your house? Realtors utilize a keypad issued by the Multiple Listing Service to gain access to listed properties. If you did not receive a lockbox or post showing instructions, this could explain it as these factors are important to Realtors. Additionally, as mentioned above, the price could also be causing a lack of interest from Realtors. One last thing I would recommend is to call your listing company and ask if they offer services that you may not be taking advantage of - including some of those mentioned above. If they do not offer additional services, you may want to consider calling another Realtor. But before you do, be sure to check the terms of your listing contract.

**Q:** We're selling our home, and recently began moving our furniture out. Then it dawned on me - is it better to show the home furnished or doesn't it matter?

**A:** Steve, generally, houses show better furnished. Why? Furniture can help in creating the sense of home. Empty rooms can seem cold, uninviting and echoey - turning off many buyers. In fact, many Realtors today employ various staging techniques that can help enhance a home's appeal. These staging techniques can include strategically placing fresh-cut flowers, plants, candles, art and more. In addition to creating an ambiance, furniture gives buyers a frame of reference when evaluating room size. Empty rooms often appear larger or smaller than they actually are. I suggest leaving the furniture in place. Your Realtor will help you with additional suggestions for making your home more inviting to buyers.

**Q:** What services do Realtors provide for buyers? Can't I just search for properties on my own with an Internet connection?

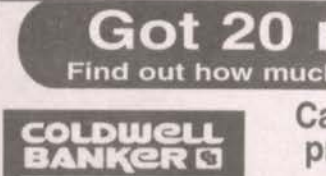

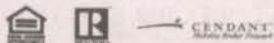

## Mitsubishi's Spyder offers more, including a trunk

I just spent a week in the 2007 Mitsubishi Eclipse Spyder and it is easy to live with.

Sold in two trim levels with two engines, the base GS starts at \$25,974 with a five-speed manual transmission. Add \$900 for the four-speed Sportronic automatic with manual-shift mode.

Fuel economy is rated 22 mpg city, 29 highway for the manual and 22/28 for the automatic.

The GT with 3.8 liter V-6 and six-speed manual transmission starts at \$28,854. It goes to \$29,754 with the five-speed Sportronic automatic. Fuel economy is rated 19/26 for the manual and 18/26 for the automatic.

It's got a fair price, is cheap to fuel and has good features, including a power top, remote locking, air conditioning and a floor-vibrating 650-watt, nine-speaker Rockford Fosgate audio system that MP3-capable. An 8-inch subwoofer resides between the two rear seats.

Conveniences such as power windows and locks, remote locking, cruise control and an up-level Monsoon audio system are all optional. And by the time you add just items or packages, the Solstice price can speed past \$25,000.

There also might be an additional price coverage by some dealers because the Solstice is still hard to get. (And the upcoming Sky will be just as tight on deliveries).

Cars are in such short supply that some dealers don't have one available for a test drive. Whatever gets shipped in gets sold.

That's ideal supply and demand, but it also creates an

opportunity for Mitsubishi, which will build as many Spyders as it needs, hoping to top 3,000 a month, which was the outgoing model's sales rate.

And while the styling of the base Eclipse is not as dramatic as Solstice, Mitsubishi offers an optional body kit that turns it into a street-savvy stunner.

And the trunk is a decent 5 cubic feet, even when the top is down, which it often should be.

The top - lined and insulated - motors back in 19 seconds, Mitsubishi says, which is enough time to get toless at a traffic light. The process includes a finished look

with a hard tonneau.

The Spyder looks good top up or down, its curves ripped from a Japanese comic book. In base form, the body still looks a little too big for its chassis, even with 18-inch tires.

But the dealer-installed aerodynamics kit adds concept-car glamour, right down to spider-fang points at the front spoiler.

The lower-body trim treatment has a recommended price of \$1,890 (though dealer charges may vary). It does not include the upgrade cost for 18-inch wheels and tires, which the dealer will be happy to provide. But add the

two-tone terra cotta leather interior and the price is around \$30,000.

One issue with the aero kit could be an increased turning circle, which is already obscenely wide at 40 feet. The Solstice is great at 35 feet.

Mitsubishi will only win friends with its well-equipped Spyder, including a few Solstice intenders who'd like to drive their new convertible for a weekend getaway.
