Boro couple found dead in murder-suicide

FANWOOD — An elderly couple died in their home this week in what police are describing as an apparent murder-suicide, the borough's first homicide in more than 25 years.

Thomas Sweeney, 81, and Carolyn Sweeney, 76, were found dead at their 86 Coriell Ave. home Monday evening. Both had sustained single gunshot wounds to the head from a .38-caliber handgun, according to police.

About 5:20 p.m. Monday, police responded to a call from a family friend and discovered Carolyn Sweeney's body in

a recliner in the living room. Her husband Thomas was found on a hospital bed nearby, dead of an apparent self-inflicted gunshot wound. The handgun and two spent shells were also discovered in the living room, authorities said.

The Sweeneys' death was the second murder-suicide in Union County within a week. Robert and Ruth Sessler died June 7 at their New Providence home.

"This is a sad, tragic ending to two lives, and our investigation has turned up evidence that a well-liked couple who were devoted to each other are gone from our community," said Fanwood Police Chief Donald Domanoski.

Police did not describe the contents of a

note found at the scene, but an investigation determined that Carolyn had been suffering from numerous health problems including diabetes, a recent hip replacement surgery, a blood disorder and severe arthritis.

Thomas was suffering from a torn tendon in his foot and was also dealing with reactions from steroid medication, according to published reports.

The physical, financial, and emotional difficulty of caring for his wife weighed heavily on Thomas Sweeney, who had lived with his wife in their home since it was first built in the 1950s. He was extremely attentive to Carolyn's needs, authorities said, taking her to church fre-

quently and helping her to get around using a wheelchair and a walker.

Though the couple's difficulties were known to the neighborhood, the Sweeneys did not disclose the extent of their problems, a neighbor said. One nearby Coriell Avenue resident said he was stunned to learn about the incident.

"It's a shocking thing," said the neighbor, who asked not to be identified. "We knew (Thomas) was under pressure and having a tough time caregiving...but people I guess don't want to tell their neighbors about these things."

"It is beyond my comprehension to

Developer proposes three-story, mixed-use building on Central Ave.

Dilapidated structures would be torn down

WESTFIELD — A developer proposing to construct a mixed-use building on Central Avenue will present the project to the Planning Board at a special meeting Monday night.

The developer, CEGR, LLC, plans to construct a three-story building at 430, 500, and 510 Central Ave. The proposed 35-foot high building includes about 10,500 square feet of commercial space and nearly 20,000 feet of residential space, divided between 20 condominiums. The development would include a 31-space underground parking garage and 14 other on-site parking spaces.

The second and third floor condominiums would include one and two-bedroom units ranging in size from 946 square feet to 1,409 square feet. Three first floor commercial units would range from 2,709 square feet to 3,282 square feet, with a fourth, smaller unit measuring 1,211 square feet. A 2,300 square foot atrium is also

planned on the building's ground floor.

Developer Ralph Rapuano holds a 98 percent stake in CEGR, which is currently putting the finishing touches on a pink-hued mixed-use building across the street, at the corner of Central Avenue and Cacciola Place.

To secure board approval, the project requires variances for a shortfall of parking spaces, undersized side yard setbacks, insufficient window area, and a 43-foot high tower. The G1-1 zone does not permit building height to exceed 40 feet.

The 45 proposed on-site parking spaces fall well below the standards of the land use ordinance, which requires 143. The parking spaces would also be irregularly shaped at only 18 feet deep, while state standards require spaces to be striped 20 feet deep.

CEGR, LLC, proposes to demolish two aging dwellings that currently occupy the contiguous 29,136 square foot parcel. Two masonry garages in the rear of the tract would also be razed in the course of redeveloping the property, which is situated in a neighborhood that includes a mix of retail and

office space.

Rapuano did not return a call seeking comment on the project, but the developer's attorney James Flynn wrote that the "application will upgrade the neighborhood and will not adversely affect the zoning or surrounding residences," an application materials submitted to the board.

The property was the subject of a 2002 application to the Planning Board that was approved by a 9-0 vote but has since lapsed. At the time, Rapuano proposed to construct a three-story mixed-use building consisting of about 7,774 square feet on each floor. The developer planned to build a 38-space parking lot on the site, though the zoning ordinance required 78 spaces.

At the time, the developer, planner James Tober, and the existing buildings, a substantial portion of which no longer appear to be occupied, were "antiquated" structures with "cumbrous systems."

"The time has come to replace them," Tober said at second of two board hearings in November 2002. No residents appeared to oppose the development at the board hearings.

SP facilities require expensive upgrades

SCOTCH PLAINS — An architect hired to examine two ailing public facilities told the Township Council last week that expensive renovations, perhaps costing several million dollars, are necessary.

At the council's June 8 conference meeting, architect Tom Potter said the roof and heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) system need to be replaced at town hall on Park Avenue, and the public works building on Plainfield Avenue is in need of major repairs.

As it prepares to undertake the needed upgrades, the council will also weigh whether to build a new public works facility from scratch and add new space to town hall.

The town hall facility has been suffering from roof leaks for some time, and employees have resorted to setting up a network of buckets to catch water that drips throughout the facility following heavy snow and rain. The township has attempted to patch leaks to the metal mansard roof of the 30-year old building, but Potter said stopgap measures aren't enough to solve the problem.

"The bottom line is that the roof needs to be torn off and the insulation needs to be replaced," Potter said at the meeting.

Replacing the roof would give the township a 20-year guarantee, protect the building's interior, and provide savings from reduced heating costs, Potter added.

Potter said the building's HVAC system is "at the end of its useful life" and should be replaced at the same time the roof is renovated.

In a report submitted to the council, Potter suggested the cost of replacing multi-zone rooftop units and basement air handlers and making improvements to the boiler system would cost about \$342,000. A new pad-mounted air cooled chiller would cost another \$187,500, and replacing wall-packaged units would cost \$43,100. Installation of new electronic controls is expected to carry a price tag of \$118,750.

Replacing the electrical system would cost \$268,000, though that expense may not run as high depending on the scope of renovations the council decides to pursue. Structural work to the building and chase construction for chiller piping and a mechanical room would cost about \$150,000.

When the township performs the roof and HVAC replacement, other optional work could be done, Potter said. At a cost of \$100,000, the exterior brick masonry needs cleaning, water-

User fees may pay for turf at Sid Faye field

WESTFIELD — After expressing unanimous support for a user fee system to be paid by local athletic organizations, the Town Council Tuesday night agreed to lay artificial turf at Sid Faye field this summer.

The grass field, which is situated off Lamberts Mill Road, lies adjacent to Houlihan field on the town's south side. Houlihan is currently being converted into an artificial turf field, and the town is planning to install lights to extend use of both facilities into the evenings.

The town budgeted \$1.1 million to pay for lights and turf at both fields in 2005, but rising construction costs forced the council to abandon the plan to put turf on Sid Faye, estimated at \$300,000. However, at a recent Finance Policy Committee meeting, the Recreation Commission suggested the council fund the project out of the town's sale of assets account. The commission agreed to reimburse the town for the project by installing a \$10 user fee per athlete, per sport, per season.

Committee chairman Peter Echausse said the council cannot tap into revenues from the sale of asset account until 2006, but he explained that the town could fund the project through its special projects account. The money would be transferred back to the special projects account from the sale of assets account during the 2006 budget cycle, he said.

The \$300,000 cost would be paid back to the town over the next few years through user fees, Echausse explained. He said that among participants in local soccer, lacrosse, baseball, softball, and PAL football leagues, the town has 6,000 participants and could raise \$60,000 each year. And the soccer and lacrosse associations have agreed to pay their user fees up front, he said.

Echausse said the Finance Policy Committee endorsed the user fee concept because it would allow the town to complete the full project this year, which will allow for some savings. Also, the system limits taxpayer contribution to the project and "lays the groundwork" for future recreation projects funded by user fees, Echausse said.

Other towns are shifting to user fee systems, Echausse added. Summit currently charges \$20 per athlete, and Clifton is in the midst of establishing a similar system, he said.

Councilman Larry Goldman, a member of the Finance Policy Committee who opposed erecting lights at the facility, endorsed adding turf to Sid Faye if each town athletic association is willing to commit to paying the annual fee.

"We need to get some kind of support from each of the leagues before this gets the go-ahead," Goldman said. Council members also added the town should make sure athletic teams understand that contribution of user fees does not entitle them to an ownership share of the facility.

The council will likely introduce an ordinance authorizing the user fees shortly. The turf and lights installation at Sid Faye and Houlihan is currently underway, and the entire project should be finished by the end of August, said Town Administrator Jim Gilden.

Fire talks headed to arbitrations

WESTFIELD — Negotiations between the town and the firefighter's union are headed to arbitration after union members rejected an agreement drafted in mediation, Town Administrator Jim Gildea said this week.

Gildea said members of FMBA Local #30, which represents 38 of the town's 41 firefighters, recently failed to ratify a deal crafted dur-

ing mediation. The contract was supported by the Town Council, Gildea said.

Now, the council is preparing a proposal for an arbitration hearing, said Gildea, who added that a date for arbitration has not been scheduled and in fact could be months away. A final decision may not come for months after the hearing, so the issue is likely to extend into 2006.

The recent mediation was conducted by the same official both sides have accepted as an arbitrator, Gildea said.

The FMBA and Westfield have been without an agreement since their last contract expired Dec. 31, 2003. The firefighters' union also rejected a contract offer by the town in November.

Negotiations on the previous contract went into mediation but did not progress to arbitration. Gildea said the current dispute centers around economic issues such as salary increases, the amount of an EMT stipend, and health insurance carrier.

Under the most recent contract, the first-year salary for firefighters is set at \$29,175. Six more pay steps range from \$34,655 to \$65,482; the lieutenant's salary is \$73,002, and the captain's salary is set at \$79,557.

The fire chief and two deputy fire chief positions are not covered by the FMBA contract negotiations.

FMBA president John McCormack could not be reached for comment.

understand how anyone under these circumstances could take the life of someone he purports to love," said Union County Prosecutor Theodore Romankow. "He obviously needed help and didn't get it."

Thomas was an avid deep-sea fisherman and until recently owned property on the shore, said Ted Trumpp, chairman of the municipal Republican Party. Sweeney was an active member of the municipal committee until he submitted a letter of resignation last week, Trumpp said.

"He was a very kind and loving man, and he was a completely friendly, outgoing person," said Trumpp, who last saw Sweeney when he voted in the June 7 primary. Sweeney was limping and mentioned that his wife was bedridden and her health had taken a turn for the worse, Trumpp said.

"You could tell that he was in a lot of pain," Trumpp said. Thomas Sweeney served in the Army during World War II and was a graduate of Michigan State University. He was employed as an office manager with Mary Kay Cosmetics in Piscataway before

retiring. Earlier, he was employed as traffic manager with Costa Ice Cream in Woodbridge.

Carolyn Sweeney was born in Elizabeth before moving to Fanwood. She was a member of the Junior Women's Club and had a lovely singing voice, friends said. During her 50 years in Fanwood, she tended to the couple's split-level home. She was a congregant at Terrill Road Bible Chapel and frequently cooked meals for ailing members of the church.

The couple had two children, Joanne Wolf of Scotch Plains and Thomas Sweeney of North Plainfield, and four grandchildren. Thomas is survived by a brother, James Sweeney of Westport, Mass., and a sister, Helen Costa of North Carolina. Carolyn is survived by a brother, Joseph Drosdick of West Caldwell, and a sister, Dorothy Van Dyke of Mountainside.

Funeral services will be held at the Terrill Road Bible Chapel, 535 Terrill Rd., Fanwood at 10 a.m. Saturday. Calling hours are scheduled at Memorial Funeral Home, 155 South Ave., Fanwood from 7-9 p.m. Thursday and 2-4 p.m. Friday.

proofing, and repairs to caulking and cracking. At the same time, the council could consider expanding the second floor over the single-story police department area. An additional 4,700 square feet could be added for

about \$850,000 to \$950,000.

At the Plainfield Avenue building, the council may elect to completely tear down the facility and construct a new 12,000 square foot building at a cost Potter estimated would range between \$1 million and \$1.5 million.

Renovations are possible to a building that dates to the 1950s or 1960s, he said, but could cost about \$750,000. The structure consists of a series of additions that were pieced together over the years, Potter said, and the "overall condition of the building is a concern." The building needs a roof replacement and new HVAC system, upgrades to the electrical system and structural work, Potter said.

The building's exterior is in poor condition, as a four-inch

wide crack has allowed 20 percent of the front brick facade to sink into the ground. Though the building needs to be stabilized, Potter said, "It is not in imminent danger of collapsing."

The structure has a poor ventilation system, which is a concern in a building that houses both heavy equipment and office space. A new building would boast a column-free interior and with better use of space could give the township 1,000 square feet of additional room.

Both projects could be done in less than a year under normal circumstances, Potter said. Preparing plans and specifications would take two months, while construction permit review would take another month. Sending a project out to bid and awarding it would take another two months, and the construction phase for both projects would take about six months.

The governing body did not engage in extensive deliberations following Potter's presentation, but council members said they may consider hiring a clerk of the works to oversee the construction phase of whatever project the council decides to pursue.

Township Manager Tom Atkins, however, said the cost of renovating the DPW building could be unreasonably high. A new building that would cost \$1 million to \$1.5 million would not be a "Taj Mahal" structure, he said, but would meet the township's needs.

"My gut is that we should start again," Atkins said. "\$750,000 is a lot of money to spend on that facility."

After the meeting, Councilwoman Paulette Coronato said the council was "digesting" the architect's report and would likely deliberate over the summer and delay any final decision until as late as the fall. The township's professional staff will be examining the Potter reports and making its own recommendations.

"The work is definitely necessary, but we want to cross our 't's' and dot our 'i's' before we make any decisions," Coronato said, adding that the council has known it was facing major looming facilities issues for several years. The council is currently in the midst of a separate \$825,000 renovation to the township library.

"These needs have been put off for a long while, but now we must address these issues because we're now at a point where we can no longer ignore them," Coronato said.

Marks acknowledged that many in the business community would like to see town hall relocated out of the Park Avenue business corridor and the public facility converted to commercial use, but said such a move is "extraordinarily unlikely."

"There is a big difference between the cost per square foot of new construction versus what- ever renovations we need to do," Marks said. "... We're talking about a multi-million dollar project just to get a new building of the current size," and finding a suitable piece of property on which to build would cost millions more, he said.

How to care for the caregivers?

The county's twin tragedies of the past two weeks — the murder-suicides of first Ruth and Robert Sessler of New Providence and then Thomas and Carolyn Sweeney of Fanwood — have their own unique, heartbreaking details. But there is an unmistakable connection between the two incidents: In each case, the burden of caring for an elderly, ailing spouse was apparently key in the decision to end a pair of lives.

In the first case, Robert Sessler's fall from the bleachers at a local hockey game left him a quadriplegic and dramatically altered the life he and his wife Ruth shared. In the second, the deteriorating medical condition of Carolyn Sweeney, who suffered from diabetes, a hip replacement and numerous other ailments, has been described as a key factor in her husband's action.

"He was completely overwhelmed with many concerns. My mother had recently broken her hip and she has an incredibly long history in and out of the hospital. They loved each other, and he didn't want her to suffer," the Sweeneys' daughter, Joanne Wolf, told the Courier-News.

There is no cure-all that could have solved the physical and emotional hardships confronted by the Sweeneys and Sesslers. But the cases underline a long-standing and growing problem: We must do more to support people with chronic illnesses and their caregivers.

The need for long-term home care is driven by the nation's changing demographics. More and more Americans are living long lives despite chronic medical conditions, and many of those people, either because of financial pressures or personal choice, will remain in their homes rather than moving to an assisted living facility. At the same time, social trends are weakening extended family bonds and forcing the adult children of the elderly to devote more time to work.

Union County is blessed with many church groups, clubs, support groups and volunteer organizations that do yeoman's work to help elderly residents in need of physical or emotional support. In addition, facilities such as Runnells Specialized Hospital in Berkeley Heights and SAGE Eldercare in Summit offer valuable respite programs for caregivers. And the county even boasts a unique program in which local artists will perform in the home of a caregiver.

All these efforts are vitally important — indeed, caregivers in the immediate area are better supported than most. But they still amount to a series of patches atop the hodge-podge mix that is our long-term care system. And the burden still falls disproportionately on family caregivers, who are often elderly themselves. A 1998 report from the American Council of Life Insurance found that 57 percent of frail elders who live in the community rely solely on family and friends for care.

Of course, in addition to the physical and emotional burdens of acting as caregiver, there are the financial costs. Respite care at Runnells for example, is sometimes covered by Medicaid but is most often paid for out-of-pocket. And though home health aides are notoriously poorly paid, the cost of help at home can be overwhelming to middle-class families. Among government programs, Medicare's fee-for-service model is ill-suited to chronic care, and Medicaid faces cutbacks (The Sweeneys' Medicare coverage maxed out a few weeks ago, Joanne Wolf told The Star-Ledger). As the Center for American Progress (CAP) writes in a report issued last week, "The nation lacks a policy that ensures people of all ages access to quality long-term care when they need it, without risk of impoverishment."

This is a difficult problem, but it's within our power to change it. Judith Feder, the author of the CAP report, recommends a new commitment of federal funding, which could be used to provide a core program of universal public insurance, an extension of Medicaid to provide a baseline of protection, or a more modest broadening of Medicaid to pay for home- and community-based care.

And because this is, in many ways, a social problem, we also need to find ways to allow adult children and extended family members to offer support to their loved ones. Improved family leave and flex-time programs would be a good start. Better awareness on the part of everyone in the medical community to the issue is important, too.

More ideas than these will be needed, of course. But it's a discussion we need to start having.

Codey's contract draws questions

To The Record-Press:
Robert Codey, the brother of acting Gov. Richard Codey, will be retiring Sept. 1 from his deputy attorney general's post. He will collect a \$98,000-a-year pension that was boosted by an unusual arrangement approved by the all-Democrat Union County freeholder board, which is led by an appointed county manager who is powerbroker State Senator Raymond Lesniak's (D-Union) nephew.

Although Codey, who's only 55, will collect an additional \$33,000 a year for life from the state pension under the arrangement, as well as automatic annual cost of living adjustments and state-paid health insurance throughout his retirement, Democrat-appointed Attorney General Peter Harvey's office defended the move as merely a technical maneuver that cost the state nothing since the raise was paid for by Union County.

The taxpayers know of this arrangement only

because The Star-Ledger obtained documents relating to the transaction and inquired about the officials' actions and then reported them. Acting Gov. Codey, through a spokeswoman, said he hoped his brother's scheduled retirement would end the spate of news articles that have appeared about the arrangement.

I find this comment to be in direct contrast to his January State of the State address, at which Gov. Codey, a Democrat who stepped in to replace disgraced Democrat Governor James McGreevey, stated regarding the \$25 billion underfunding of the pension system, "This is a problem we can no longer ignore."

As a society, this sort of political dealing, in the many ugly ways it rears its head, is a problem we can no longer ignore — therefore, remember to vote all Democrats out in November.

Consider organic lawn treatments

To The Record-Press:
Most of us no longer earn our living from working the soil. But even though we've taken "the boy out of the farm," a quick look around New Jersey's suburbs will confirm that you can't take "the farm out of the boy."

We're still attached to our land, even if it's just a suburban lot. We plant, mow, clip and fertilize to create beautiful environments on our plots of land. Unfortunately, our green thumbs can turn our water brown.


You don't need a chemistry degree to figure out that synthetic lawn fertilizers and pesticides can be toxic. Just read the labels.

The use, and often over use, of these chemicals can change soil and water chemistry. Ironically, excess application of chemicals can actually weaken lawns by killing off microorganisms that help the grass resist drought and invasion by weeds. Chemicals also leech into drinking water. Lawns increase stormwater run off which gets into streams faster than nature intended. The resulting brown, muddy fast flowing creeks and rivers can kill fish and other small aquatic species.

Fortunately, there are lots of easy ways to do better. Try organic lawn care — a combination of environmentally friendly lawn care practices and natural products without nasty side effects.

Here's what you can do:
Use a mulching mower with a sharp blade to cut off one-third or less of the height of the grass. The resulting clippings are small enough to act as natural fertilizers for your lawn.
If you're feeling ambitious, mix your own fertilizer, or buy one of the many natural, pre-mixed fertilizers available on the market.
At a minimum, *always* following the directions on chemical fertilizers will lessen their impact on soil and water.
If your lawn is big enough for a riding mower, it may be time to plant vegetative buffers and decrease your lawn care time. Plant native trees and plants to return the fringes of your property to a more "forested" state.

Learn county's role in revolution

UNION — "The American Revolution: Its Legacy in Union County" will be the subject of a conference on June 17 in Downs Hall at Kean University, 1000 Morris Avenue in Union Township.

The program, which runs from 9 a.m. to noon. An optional box lunch is available at noon and will be followed by tours of Liberty Hall Museum located across Morris Avenue from Kean University.

The period farmhouses, white-clapboard churches, stone bridges and granite monuments scattered from Elizabeth and Rahway to Springfield and Scotch Plains are visible reminders of the crucial role that Union County played in the American Revolution.

Two hundred twenty-five years ago, the Battle of Springfield changed the course of the War for Independence. It was the last major engagement fought in the northern states during the American Revolution and it ended with the retreat of the British forces.

Mark E. Lender, chairman of Kean

University's history department, will describe how the terrain and local resources affected the movement and sustenance of both colonial and British troops. Steven Hardegen, senior historic preservation specialist for the Historic Preservation Office in the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, with the aid of a short video, will talk about the structures and features that still exist.

Marguerite Chandler, president of the Crossroads of the American Revolution Association, will speak about the Union County sites that are included in the proposed Crossroads National Heritage Area. Marc Mappen, executive director of the New Jersey Historical Commission, will discuss the economic impact of public history.

Registration to attend is \$10 per person; \$5 for students with school ID. A box lunch is available for \$8.



Safety = Savings

How Smarter Cars and Drivers Can Lead to More Money in Your Pocket

(ARA) - The number of auto accidents is decreasing -- and that's a trend both drivers and auto insurance companies are happy about.

During the last year, auto claims at General Casualty and Unigard Insurance have dropped more than 10 percent, a trend occurring across the property and casualty insurance industry.

The Insurance Information Institute predicts auto insurance rates will rise only 1.5 percent in 2005, just one half the inflation rate and the smallest increase in five years. Auto owners with good driving records and safer cars could notice a decrease in their auto insurance premiums. How much savings will vary by state, insurance company and individual driver. In 2005, General Casualty auto insurance rates could decrease up to 8 percent. Unigard policyholders could save even more, thanks to decreased claims and a new policy pricing system available later this summer.

John Blodnick of Unigard and Charles Valinotti of General Casualty explain several factors contributing to this decrease, including safer and smarter vehicles and drivers.

"Driving safely protects not only you and your passengers, but others out on the road. A clean driving record can also affect your insurance rates," Valinotti said.

Valinotti recommends consumers purchase safer automobiles to help prevent accidents and protect their pocketbooks.

He notes that upcoming safety innovations could lead to even fewer accidents while saving consumers money on their auto insurance:

* Smart cars: Auto manufacturers are upgrading new vehicle models with safety devices such as radar, digital cameras and navigational systems to detect objects in drivers' blind spots and avoid heavy traffic or collisions. While some models already contain sensors that warn drivers when they're too close to objects, Toyota, Lexus, Honda and Nissan will begin incorporating other advanced technology soon.

* Smart highways: Future highway technology could help better manage traffic flow and improve safety. Controlled steering, electronic brakes and other devices would help maneuver smart cars on specially engineered highways, helping avoid collisions.

* Breakaway engines: Some vehicles include engines designed to drop down under the vehicle's floor instead of being pushed into the front passenger area during a frontal collision, helping reduce leg injuries.

* Redesigned vehicles: Auto manufacturers are continually building safer cars. GM's Uplander minivan model was rated "good" in recent frontal crash tests by the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety (IIHS). The rating is a vast improvement over its predecessor, GM's Chevrolet Venture and Pontiac Transport/Montana, rated one of the worst performing vehicles in the history of IIHS's frontal crash tests. Small pickup trucks including the Toyota Tacoma, Chevrolet Colorado and Dodge Dakota also scored better in the tests.

"Safer, smarter cars only offer so much protection," said Blodnick. "Safety starts with being an intelligent driver. Pay attention to others on the road and drive appropriately for the weather and traffic conditions."

To encourage safe driving, Unigard policyholders can accumulate up to 16 percent in savings credits for being accident-free. This credit is reduced if they're involved in any "at fault" auto accidents, but they may continue receiving a savings for having a safe driving history.

In addition, Blodnick points to the increase in states with graduated driver licensing programs. As more states implement the program to gradually phase new drivers to full driving privileges, the number of teen driving accidents is decreasing. According to the IIHS, since states began enacting graduated licensing laws in the 1990s, the fatal crash rate for 16-year old drivers has dropped 26 percent (from 1993 to 2003).

Valinotti notes families may have more vehicles than drivers, meaning an insured vehicle spends more time sitting in the driveway or garage and is less likely to be
